I. BENJAMIN ATWELL, Constable, b. ——; d. 1683. Of New London, Conn. This is the earliest of our American ancestors of whom we have any record. When he came to New London is not known. His name appears in a grant of land from the New London Company, April 23, 1663. He sold a house to Lieut. John Stedman prior to 1672. He was constable of New London in 1675; m. Mary ———, date and surname unknown.

THOMAS, b. 1670. In the stocks and fined 10 s. for "night walking," Sabbath night, Sept. 17, 1693.

In 1710 Joseph, Richard, and Samuel settled upon the Indian lands of the North Parish, which in 1786 became Montville.

II. BENJAMIN ATWELL, Farmer, b. about 1668; d. 1723. Oldest son of Benjamin, the Constable. Named in Patent from New London Co., Oct. 14, 1704. Settled in North Parish about 1705. With his wife, Mary, united with the church at New London, June 29, 1711. After his death she married George Minard.

III. RICHARD ATWELL, b. 1679; d. 1727; sixth son of Benjamin, the Constable; m. Elizabeth Baker, Mar. 11, 1702, who was dau. of Joshua Baker and Hannah (Tongue) Mintern, b. May 9, 1676. Settled in the North Parish (Montville) of New London, Ct., near Oxoboxo Pond. He owned the farm. His wife died 1709 and he married Joanna. He appears as administrator of the estate of Walter Bodington, Jr., of Groton, in 1716, when his name was spelled Attwell.

- VIII. BENJAMIN ATWELL, Ensign, oldest son of Joseph Atwell, Farmer; b. 1735; d. May 12, 1806, Montville, Conn. Calls himself Benjamin second in his will. He was blacksmith and farmer. Appointed Ensign in Colonial train-band, New London, 1772. In 1775 marched under Arnold against Quebec; escaped capture but lost his gun. Appointed Ensign Nov., 1776, by the State assembly, in 4th battalion under Capt. Jonathan Calkins; resigned soon after. Left money, tenements and lands, the real estate going by will to two grandsons, George Benjamin and James. His snuff-box is (1896) in the keeping of Charles B. Atwell. m. Mary Ann Lee, dau. of Benjamin Lee of Lyme. She appears to have been related to the celebrated John Lee of Lyme, passing down to her posterity his famous dying charge.

Lucretia's 100th birthday was celebrated by the neighbors making a donation party. An immense mince-pie occupied the center of the table. "The aged mother enjoyed the feast like one who had renewed her youth." "The aged pilgrim had always led a quiet country life, living in a plain and frugal manner." She was esteemed by her neighbors for her kindness and her thankful spirit." She recalled vividly the events of the French and Indian war, particularly the return of her uncle Benjamin (born 1719) who had been absent a long time "soldiering agin the French in Canada."—Baker's manuscript.

## AN INTERESTING NOTE.

The Revolution Records of Connecticut Men show:—Thomas Atwell was a member of the Sixth Regiment, Connecticut Volunteers, Fifth Company, under Col. Parsons; enlisted May 6, 1775; discharged Dec. 10, 1775. Thomas Atwell was a member of the Fourth Regiment, recruited mainly from Windham and New London Counties, Conn. This company was at the battle of Germantown and wintered at Valley Forge. He enlisted Apr. 20, 1778, for eight months, and was discharged Nov. 18, 1778. Thomas Atwell was a member of the Eighth Regiment from Conn.; enlisted Sept. 10, 1780, and discharged Dec. 12, 1780. These were probably one and the same man and doubtless a descendant of Benjamin Atwell, the Constable, of New London. Miss Calkins says that Thomas Atwell, second son of Benjamin, the Constable, left descendants. The Thomas named above may have been one of them.

Since the publication of the "Genealogy of the Atwell Family, formerly of New London, Conn.," in June, 1896, facts have come to light which make it possible to present an outline of the history of two additional generations whose living representatives still reside in New England not far removed from the place of origin of the family.

GEORGE ATWELL,<sup>5</sup> (Benjamin,<sup>4</sup> Joseph,<sup>3</sup> Benjamin,<sup>2</sup> Benjamin.<sup>1</sup>) b. Sept. 8, 1766, Montville, Conn.; m. Esther Rogers, direct descendant of James Rogers who came to America from London, Eng., about 1660. While Baptists were subject to persecution and legal restraint George Atwell was ordained a Baptist evangelist. His life-work was given to promoting the interests of his denomination in Conn. and Mass. He organized the Baptist church now flourishing at East Long Meadow, Mass. He suffered much from poverty, persecution and i'l health but accomplished a great work. A quaint memoir of his life, including much of his personal diary, appeared in 1814 from the pen of E Terry. He was oldest son of (VIII) Benjamin Atwell, the Ensign.

GEORGE BENJAMIN ATWELL 6 (George, 5 Benjamin, 4 Joseph, 8 Benjamin, 2 Benjamin 1), b. July 9, 1793; d. April 23, 1879, Pleasant Valley, Conn.; m. Mary M. Tennant. He was a Baptist clergyman. His first pastorate was over the society organized by his father at East Long Meadow, Mass. He served pastorates in Woodstock, Middletown, Meriden, Canton, and Pleasant Valley, Conn. He was a man of unique character, exerting a wide and helpful influence. His writings appear in the denominational periodical literature of his day. An account of his life with extracts from his sermons and other writings appeared in 1880 under the title of "Memorial Sketches of Rev. Geo. B. Atwell," compiled by his daughter, Harriet.
