THE BOLDING FAMILY.

We are informed in "Eyton's Shropshire" that a family of this name was living in Bridgnorth early in the 13th century. Several Boldings are mentioned as having successively occupied the highest positions in the government of that ancient Borough.

William Bolding was Provost of Bridgmorth in 1252, during that year he superintended the erection of a new turret to Bridgmorth Castle. He was also one of the twelve Jurors at Bridgmorth Assizes, held in January, 1256. He appears to have had the following sons:—

William Bolding, junr., who was Provost of Bridgnorth in 1273 and 1277.

Ralph Bolding, Provost of Bridgnorth—date not given.

Stephen Bolding, witness to a mortgage deed dated the Feast of the Annunciation, 49 Henry III. (1265), also to a mortgage deed dated the Feast of St. Andrew, 6 Edward I, 30th November 1277.

Walter Bolding, one of the twelve Jurors at Bridgmorth Assizes, held October 1292.

Andrew Bolding, Bailiff or Provost of Bridgnorth, 1292, and the first Member of Parliament for Bridgnorth, in the Parliament held at Westminster, 1295.

The Boldings do not appear at Bridgmorth (so far as published records disclose) later than the commencement of the 14th century, but the name is so singularly uncommon, that it is very probable the few Boldings there are in England at the present day, are descended from the Bridgnorth family.

Beyond mention in one of the Record Reports,* of a branch located at Buckley, Cheshire, in 1343, nothing further has been discovered relative to the family, till the time of Henry VIII, when the name of Thomas Bolding, of Sherborne, in the County of Warwick, appears on the Subsidy Roll for the year 1523—from this Thomas Bolding the pedigree is traceable to the present representatives.

I ordain and make Thomas Poors, Thomas Rogers, and Richard Hawkins [struck out] Homis, my overseers of this my last will and testament. Witness of this my last will Sir William Churchele, priest, Robert Ward and Richard Purdon, and others more.



NOTES AND REMARKS UPON THE PEDIGREE.

(1).—Dorothy was probably a grandaughter of Richard & Milicent Masters, (as under), Henry Rogers witnesses her will. Timothy Rogers and John Bolding appear as churchwardens of Sherborne in 1608.

- (2).—It has not been ascertained which of these daughters married John Hawkes, and which Philpotts, see their mother's will, 20 Sep. 1677.
- (3).—It is certain that John and Mary Bolding had a son Thomas living at the time of their deaths, though his baptism does not appear; it is equally certain that Susannah Bolding married a Thomas Bolding, but whether the son and husband are one and the same person must remain a question. Thomas the son of John, was born probably after 1692.
- (4).—The arms and pedigree of the Petty Family of Ilmington, Co. Warwick, may be found in the Visitation of 1619.
 - (5).—Perhaps a descendant of the Willmores of Sherborne, see note 1.
