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## INTRODUCTION

In the latter I have given my authority wherever I had it preserved and I trust that sometime these isolated individuals may be brought into the great Frost family.

Letters from Egbert Heustis of North Clove, N. Y., Feb. 12, 1880. "My grand-mother Roseanna's Bible is in Illinois. She went west to Cayuga County, N. Y., to live with her daughter, Roseanna and d. and was buried there. Aunt Roseanna had one child. She moved to Illinois and had the Bible."

April 5, 1880. "The old Bible gives children of Benjamin and Rose as Zopher, Lott, Benjamin, Henry, Roseanna. Zopher's marriage as in 1764."

March 8, 1880. "The Bible is very much to pieces and some leaves lost. On one is 'Lott Frost, b. Feb. 4, 1744; Henry Frost, b. June 6, 1755; Roseanna Frost, b. Dec. 9th day, 1758.' On another leaf is David Frost, b. 176-(?) (torn off); Hannah, b. 1769; Sarah, b. 1771; Benjamin, b. 1774.
