

#### PREFACE

Traditionally this space is reserved for the author's explanation of what he has intended to do add why he has failed to do it. This work is nowhere as complete as the complier could wish - the research facilities afforded in this locality are much more limited than in the areas where one can consult in person the really large collections in libraries such as the Newberry in Chicago and the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston. Also, some of the best and most detailed references of allied family genealogy were published over sixty years ago and a considerable gap is represented down to boday.

Two principal reasons dictated the bringing out of this volume at this time rather than waiting for a number of years with resultant greater wealth of detail: First, the compiler has been active in the United States Army Reserve for several years, and it is likely that he may be recalled to active duty in a few months. As considerable time and effort has been expended in assembling this data, it was considered better to publish this in its present form than to run the possible chance of the data being lost or "buried" in the event that matters prevented the compiler from giving his personal attention to the work again; Second, the publication and distribution of this volume will bring the data contained herein to a wider audience of the family and other researchers with the hoped for corrections, additions and extensions of the material.

Where genealogical encyclopedias and other lineage volumes are shown as references it must be considered that these sources are sometimes suspect and should be verified wherever possible by independent data. Such is the case also with information coming through correspondence and family tradition. While such latter data is given to the compiler in every spirit of helpfulness, recollection by the donor may at times be faulty or incomplete.

There is available in scattered obscure historical sources and "buried" genealogies quite a good deal of the early family history, however, the tedium of these dry records has been condensed to essential biographical and genealogical material and running source notes in the text and a bibliography in the appendix will point out full original sources. It is that period between 1700 and 1900 which is most obscure. In the early days America was new and big. Considerations and preservation of family history were very secondary to the necessity of bare existence in some cases, and pioneering instincts further extended the lines of communication between the separate families. Seaboard colonies were extended into the wilderness, the Revolutionary War was fought and won, and further explorations and settlements made in the rehabilitation of personal fortune.

This history in its present form is the compiler's master-copy of notes to date and it is hoped that a revised edition with a great deal more data may be brought out a number of years from now when the material is complete.

The late Frederick William Gookin of Chicago published in 1912 a limited edition of an excellent biography of Major General Daniel Gookin (1612-1687) from which work the following historical section is mainly drawn. He had contemplated a four volume genealogy of the Family but died before this could be accomplished. He carried on a portion of the work begun over a century ago by John Wingate Thornton (1818-1878). This compiler is picking up the threads where more scholarly men have left off, but as this is, to the best of his knowledge, the only Gookin genealogy published, it is hoped that the four and a half centuries represented herein in the genealogical sections may be of as much interest to the reader as it was to the compiler. In answer to several correspondents who have pointed out Fall. Cockin's Daniel Gookin as an exception to the above statement, it is suggested that the mentioned work is a biography rather than a genealogy, and was so classified by FWG himself. It does not follow the family down more recently than to the children of Daniel, the eldest of whom was born more than three hundred years ago. There is a reference in the U.S. Catalog of books to a Nunsell publication of a Gookin genealogy over sixty years ago, however, contact with several of the largest genealogical libraries, Americana booksellers, and the Library of Congress has failed to find any trace of this book. Also evidently lost or uncompleted is "Cutts Genealogy of the Gookin Family" listed some sixty four years ago as in preparation.

### FAMILY COAT OF ARMS

Although the origin of heraldry may be traced back to the paintings or tatooed tribal backs of primitive peoples, and the warriors of ancient Greece and Rome inscribed hereditary ensigns on their shields, in the sense of a systematized science of hereditary armorial bearings, dates from the carry twelfth contury.

"Three factors contributed to the rise of heraldry first, man's natural desire to enhance his personal appearance, which found expression in the crementation of his military configurant; second, the need, among warriors who covered their bedien and heads with armor, for itentifying marks easily recognized in the press of battle; and thind, the need; in an age when few bould write and personal seals served instead of signatures on official and private papers, for seals of clearly identifiable design. Heraldry was the enswer to these requirements of the times and with remarkable swiftness came into general use. From the beginning of the thirteenth century, princes, nobles, knights and gentry adopted the custom. From the practice of embroidering the family device on the surcost, worn over the cost of mail, comes the expression, Coat of Arms.

In the earliest days of heraldry arms were chosen by the bearer to suit his fancy, and in many cases the charge was chosen as a pun on the bearer's name. (Coats of Arms, Media).

The bearing of the GCCKIN Family belongs to whis classification for the etumology of the name is from the form COCK or COCKIN, doubtless a commentary on the "cocky" behaviour of some militant ancestor in the dark period of ancient English history.

The complete composition of a coat of arms includes the shield of arms, the helmet, the crest, the wreath, the mantling and the motto. The shield, on which is displayed the armorial device, is the most important part of the composition. It represents the old knightly shield and may vary in shape according to the taste of the artist. The helmet, derived like the shield from the defensive armor of the knight, is placed above the shield. It may be used even if the coat of arms includes no crest. The crest, principal accessory of the shield of arms, surpounts the helmet. Like the shield and helmet, it has its origin in the accoutrement of the knight, who were on his helmet, as a special mark of distinction, an ornament of painted wood, metal or leather. A wreath of twisted silk, us ally of two colors, was commonly worn on the knight's helmet, surrounding the base of the crest. In heraldry the wreath appears between the helmet and the creet as a support for the crest. The mantling, originally two pennantlike strips of silk attached to the top of the helmet, has in heraldry taken the form of an intricate conventionalized acrellwork flowing

down the sides of the shield. The motto, which is inscribed on a scroll placed either above or below the shield, is not an essential part of the composition, is not necessarily hereditary, and may be changed at will. Many of the oldest coats of arms do not include mottoes." (Coats of Arms, Media)

Of the antiquity of the Gookin coat of arms the compile? has been able to discover only one short reference. Nelson Osgood Rhoades gives for COCK or GOOKIN, "Arms granted 13.99, (Colonial Families vii: 77) one of the earliest legitimate armorial bearings in ancient England if his authority is correct. In a biography of Major General Daniel Gookin of the Massachusetts Bay Colony there is illustrated the armorial bearings granted to John Gookin, Esq., of Ripple Court, county Kent. (Gookin, Daniel Gookin ... facing p. 12). He bore for his arms: Gules, a chevron ermine between three Cocks, or. Crest, on a mural crown gules, a cock or, crested, barbed, beaked and membered gules. This coat was granted to him in 1609 by Sir William Segar, Garter King of Arms. The records of the College of Arms in London, however, show the chevron Cr, instead of ermine. In one of the books of the College there is a sketch of the coat with the tinctures indicated in trick, and accompanying it the following inscriptions in English, Latin and French:

- E. G. a chevron bet. 3 cocks. O.
- L. In Scute sangineo trabem acumination deflexam (quam Cheverum vccant) auream inter tres Gallos ejusdem coloris incestum.
- F. De Gucules au Chevron d'Or acompagne de trois Coqs d'Or To John Gookeine, son of Arnold Cokeine alias Gookeine of Ickham in Kent ... of ye abovesaid Arms and crest, viz: On a Crowne mural a Cock O. crested, baru'd beaqued and memb. G ... Ano Regni Jac I VII Ano Dom 1609.

"Colors are representative of the personal characteristics of the original bearer, and are granted only upon merit. Gold (Or) signifies generosity and elevation of mind: red (gules) courage and magnanimity ... The mural crown originated with the Romans and was granted to him who 'first mounted the breach in the walls of a besieged town or fortress, it is also applicable to the defender of a fortress, or as a token of civic honor. (Keech, "At the Sign of The Crest", Hobbies Magazine, Nov 1949).

It is evident that the record of the College of Arms was only a project drawn up before the grant was embossed and that in the grant as issued to John Gookin, the chevron was ermine. Certainly

it is that as borne by the members of the family in the seventeenth century, it was ermine, not or. It so appears upon the hatchment used at the funeral of John's eldest son. Thomas Gookin of Ripple Court, who died in January of 1624/5 1; upon the monument in St Nicholas Church, Ringwold, Kent to the memory of Jane Edolph, wife of John Gookin's grandson Thomas Gookin, of Harble. down; and upon the seal used by another grandson, Major General Daniel Gookin of Cambridge, Massachusetts. Hasted confirms this usage (Kent ix:567) as does Gwillim who says, "Gules, a chevron ermine, between three Cooks, Or, is borne by the name of Gookeyn; and was the coat of John Gockeyn, son of Arnold Gookeyn, anno 1609, attested by John Philpot, Somerset Herald. (Gwillim, Heraldry, p. 233). Although Gwillim must have made the statement about John Gookin's parentage from the memorandum preserved by the College of Arms, it is significant that he did not accept the description of the arms as there recited. Moreover in Stowe MS 618, "John Philpot's Visitation of Kent, 1619," the drawing of the Gookin coat shows the chevron ermine and the mural crown in the crest, gules, as they appear in Thomas Gookin's hatchment. Further confirmation of both of these differences from the College of Arms memorandum is afforded by Harleian MS 5507. "Philpot's Visitation of Kent, 1619, with the additions by Hasted", and Harleian MS 6138, a copy of the 1619 Visitation by Henry Lily.

It is of interest to note that Crozier erroneously gives "crosses or" for Cocks Or in the description of the Gookin arms in Virginia. (Crozier's Armory, p. 64). Another erroneous entry may be found on page 166 of America Heraldica, also "crosses or". However the illustrated plate of the bearing, opposite page 80 in Heraldica, correctly shows Cocks Or.

The armorial bearing illustrated on the title page of this genealogy and history is that of Major General Daniel Gookin. (See frontispiece of F.W. Gookin's, <u>Daniel Gookin</u>...). The sable, cross-crosslet quartering is that of the family of Durrant, brought together by the marriage of Amy Durrant to Thomas Gookin in 1538. (Bolton, American Armory, p. 69).

#### ANCIENT HISTORY OF THE FAMILY

Rhoades, who gives 1199 as the date of granting of arms to COCK; (Colonial Families, vii:77) connects these bearings with the family of CCCAIN in Newt. Of these ancient days a femiliar able fragments have once down to us.

Hasted, in his history of Kent, says that Cokyn's Hospital in Canterbury was founded in 1199-by, "william Cokyn, a citiera of Canterbury whose name in his posterity long survived him in this city ... This hospital was built on the soite of a nouse adjoining to the shove William Cokyn's dwelling, or else year aurosed into one by him. Afterwards by him charter, he united the two hospitals ("King's alias Fastbridge", and Cokyn's), and then by another charter entitled them to all his lands, possessions and chattles, and made them his beins. This union was confirmed by the built of Tope Unicaent III, anno 1205, in which it is called the Hospital of St. Thomas of Canterbury." (Hested, Kanterbury. "(Hested, Kanterbury." In the lower part of this atract (High Street) western of a ng's Bridge, called St. Feter's, is Colyn's Hospital founded by Mandon Cokyn in 1100". (Include, Kenter & 127).

In a list of the officers of the city of Canterbury, Harris'
Kent, p. 221, mertions under the title of Ballivi, (the Chief
Magistrate of a corporation was originally denoted by that title)
Willielmus Cockin in 1250 and in 1267, and Edmindus Cokym in 1358.

In the general index to the volume, but not citing any page, is
the following: Gooding: Guice a Cheyron between three Cocks,
or. hested says Edmind Cocym, also called Cockayne, was returned
as a citizen of Canterbury, Member of Parliament at Westminster
in the thirteenth year of Edward III, 1345, and again in 1345 and
1353 of the same reign. An aldermandry of Canterbury; including
the presidency of a ward mote, or ward court hold every three weeks,
was transmitted by inheritance in fee through several generations
of Cokymis. (Hasted, Kent, xi: 48, 78).

Nonington lies about the middle of the east part of Kent, about five miles southward from Sandwich, in the Baliwick of Eastry, Lath of St. Austin, East division of Canterbury. Among the places of note there, Harris mentions Fredville, in old writings called Froidville from its bleak and high situation. It was anciently belonging to the family of Co kin, or as commonly called, Cokin, who probably built the seat there. The Colkins came originally from Canterbury where they had a lane called Colkin's Lane, and were also the proprietors of Wortngate in that city. (Harris, Keat, p. 221).

"Under Edward I (12 2-1507) it was held ... by John Colkin, and remained in his line till the close of the reign of Richard II (circa 1599) when it went by sale to Thomas Charletor." (Iraland Kent. i: 595; compare Hasted, in: 257).

Another citizen of Canterbury named John Colkin built a seat known as "Colkins" at Boughton-under-Blean and died possessed of it in the tenth year of Edward III (1340): several of his poster-ity were buried in the church at Boughton and their arms, a griffin segreant, figured in brass on their tembstenes, all of which had been long since destroyed when Hasted wrote his book at the end of the eighteenth century, saye only one inscribed, "Orate pro anima Johannis Colkin, obi: 18 April, 1405." (Hasted, Kent, vii:11, 14, 15; Weaver's Funeral Monuments (1651) p. 274). Under Edward (1272-1307) the manor of Freitville at Monington was owned by John Colkin, and although Hasted says this family bore a different coat of arms from the Boughton family, he does not state what their bearings were.

In the county of Derby at Ashburne, circa Henry II (1154-1189) there was an Andreas (Andrew) Cockain (which later appears to be the same as Cock) from whom descended Charles Cockayne, baronet and viscount in 1642 (Edmundson's Feerage, (1785) p. 314). The interesting fact is that the coat of arms shows three cocks; crest a cock's head; motto Virtus in Andreas This was about a century after William the Conqueror landed in England, and shows the Tamily established with a coat of arms from the very beginning. In 1405, some 250 years afterwards, the Cockaynes were still living at Ashbourne, when John Cockayne married Agnes, daughter of Sir Richard Vornous (Va. Hist Mag v:394-5), and about 1600, the family having resided some 450 years at Ashbourne, Thomas Cockayne married Anne, daughter of Sir John Stenhope.

Comden mentions, "Ashburn (in Derbyshire) a town where the family of Cockains have long flourished." (Britannia) and Sylvanus Mergan gives, "Argent, three Cocks Gules, armed, created and jelloped sable, of Cokain" of Ashborne, and in the county Kent gives the name, Cokyn: another author assigns the same arms to Cockayn (Fox-Davies, Heraldry, p. 246).

The earliest complete account that we have of the Cocke Family in England is the pedigree of Walter Cokkes de Chelworth or Walter Le Cock of Caprings, Kent (near Dover) circa 1250. (See Collins & Brydges Peerage of England, London 1812, vol viii; also Harl Scc Publ xi:24). The name throughout the fifteen generations represented (see Va Hist Mag v:307) is spelled Le Cock, Cokkva and Cokkes, and may readily have passed into Cock, Cockes, Cox or Coxe.

The genealogy of the Gloucester Cockes is given in Collin's <u>Peerage</u>, vol viii. They were sected at Ospringe in Kent as early as the beginning of the reign of Edward I. It is stated that the Gloucester Cockes settled in that county from Kent about 1450.

The family was a videspread one in England. In the east there were branches in Hertford, Sufflok, Norfolk and Northumberland; and there were also Cockes in Kent, Surrey, Middlesex and Essex: in the west they had seats in Glovcester, Worcester, Hereford, Somerset, Devon and Cornwall.

found originally in Canterbury, county Kent in England. The name has undergone successive changes & ... The early New England settlers spelled it Goggin (Campbell's Hist of Va, p. 163). The arms of this family were: Quarterly, lst, Gules a chevron ermine between three cocks; 2d & 3d, sable, a cross-crosslet Ermine; 4th, or, a lion rampant. Crest, on a mural crown, gules, a cock, or, beaked and legged azure, combed and wattled gules. These are precisely the arms of the famous family of the Cockaynes in England and Ireland.

"These variations of the spelling of the name changed with the pronunciation. Harris distinctly mentions the change both of the pronunciation and writing, from Colkin to Cokin, and in his index as quoted we find Gooking; and while the name was spelled by the visiting herald as Gokin, Burke writes it Gookin (Commoners ...) This conjecture is strengthened by the affinity of the arms, for in heraldry, coat armor distinguishes families with nearly, if not

the certainty of surnames.

The Cokyn and Colkyn and all subsequent changes are, no doubt, mere contrivances to get rid of the uneuphoneous and objectionable title worn by the first soldier of the family whose vigilance and chivalric bravery in the rule days of early England set him down for a cockin by name, with three cocks in his shield, thus winning the name and insignia together. The instances in which armorial devices were borrowed from, or correspond with the names of the memory for whom they were intended are somewhat numerous. As the Bulklys, (i.e. Bullockleys) have three bullocks heads in their arms, the Dobells (i.e. Doe-Bells) have three does and a bell for theire, and Bellomont, Lord Coote, Governor of Massachusetts in 1699, had on his coat of arms, two or more coots.

"Gwillim calls, 'The cock the knight among birds, being of noble courage and prepared evermore to the battle; having his comb for a helmet, his sharp and hooked bill for a faucheon (falchion) or coutlax (cutlass) to flash and wound his enemies, and as a complete soldier armed cap-a-pie; he hath his legs armed with spurs, giving example to the valient soldier to expel danger by fight, and

not flight." (Thornton in NEH&GR ii:167)

In the secretary's record book of the William Gookins family of Indiana there is a clipping from the genealogical column of the Unidentified newspaper which illustrates the Gookin arms and olims

the derivation of the surname is from, "the Gaelic word Gugan meaning a bud ... sometimes applied to a flower of the daisy family. The compiler of this history is not in accord with this alleged derivation for the following reasons: first, considerable research has failed to note any form of the name taking the spelling or pronunciation gugan; second, ancient records localize the family history in county Kent, England under some variation of spelling or sound of the form Cokin, identified by the herildric insignia of cocks; third, the historically varifiable descendents from Arnold Gokin (Gookin) who was of Kent and presumably of some ancient family of Cokin, have as official coat of arms, "Gules, a chevron ermine between three cocks, or," an ancient Cocid tearing, rather than an emblem of heraldric flowers which would have been the case had the etymology of the surranc been from the Gaelic gugan. It is the considered opinion of this compiler that in the sources from which the newspaper intelligence was taken, an euphoneous connection between Gookin and gugan was sought with too. listle regard for the logical historical development syldensed in the preceeding paragraphs. (See Holmes, Directory Ancestral Heads, p. zovii; and Arthur, Etym Diet Fam & Christ Names, p. 145.

About the Teast of Easter, in the year of our Lord 1394, Henry van Pomeren - Godekin, Michael, Claysheld, Hans Howfoote, Peter Hawfoote, and many others with them of Wismer and of Rostok being of the Society of the Hans, tooks by rain force, a ship of New Castle upon Tyne called Casesmers, sailing upon the sea toward Prussia, belonging to Roger to Thornton and others. In the subsequent narrative the name Godekin scaus to be used as a christian name and a surmame indiscriminately. (Thornton in NEH&GR ii:167)

"New Castle upon Tyne, in the county of Northumberland; was the seat of a family of Cockes of whom Capt George Cocke in the middle of the 17th century was in the service of the Admiralty, and was a great friend of Pepys." (Va Hiet Mag, v:321).

#### THE GOOKIN FAMILY OF KENT

Although nothing has yet been discovered that throws light upon the parentage of Arnold Gokin of Ickham, County Kent, the surmise is that he was the descendant of one or the other of the families of Cokin or Colkin: it is in accord with all the circumstances with which we are familiar and appears to be well within the limits of probability. In the sixteenth century the spelling of proper names was so erratic that inferences drawn therefrom should be made with much caution. Nevertheless, it is worth noting that in the will of Jane Durrant, dated November 12, 1548, the earliest known document in which a member of the Gookin family is named, Arnold's son is described as "Thos. Golkyn", and as "Thos. Golkyne". In the will of his brother-in-law John Durrant, made in 1561, Thomas is called, "Thomas Golkyn" and his wife, "Amy Golkin". Five years later the name appears on the Bekesbourne Parrish register as "Goolkyn" and "Goolken", while in 1587 the Rector of Northbourne thought "Gowkin" the proper form. Upon the Parish Register of Ripple the name occurs eight times between 1571 and 1582, and in each instance it is spelled "Gookyn". In Thomas Gookin's will made in 1595 the spelling "Gookin" appears for the first time so far as we have been able to ascertain. His grandson Thomas Gookin wrote the name "Gokin", the only known variation from the normal spelling that has been made by a member of the family down to the middle of the eighteenth century when the form "Gookins" came into one branch.

As two of arnold Gookin's grandchildren were married in 1566, the date of his birth must have been sometime in the reign of King Henry VII (1457-1509). His only child of whom there is record was Thomas, born at least as early as 1518, and probably several years before that. Thomas Gookin lived at Bekesbourne, which lies three miles from Canterbury in an easterly direction, the parishes of Littlebourne and Ickham adjoining it to the north and northeast. His wife, whom he married about 1538, though perhaps some years earlier, was Amy Durrant. She was the daughter of John Durrant of Littlebourne, who, as appears from the churchwarden's accounts for that parish, was one of the tenants of the Court Lodge at the time of the Reformation. He bore for his arms: Sable, a cross-crosslet ermine, (Bolton, Amer Armory, p. 69). Amy's brother John died without issue and she inherited the Durrant arms, which thus became a part of the Gookin coat.

By Amy Durrant Thomas had John Gookin, only son and heir, and five daughters. John, who was presumably of legal age when he married, must have been born as early as 1545.

On October 28, 1566, the eighth of the reign of Queen Elizabeth, John married Catherine Denne, (Holmes, Ancestral Heads...p. xcvii) who was a daughter of William Denne of Kingston, Kent, Esquire, by

his wife Agnes, daughter of Nicholas Tufton of Northian Place in Sussex, Esquire, ancestor of the Earls of Thanet. The Denne family is one of the oldest of the Kentish gentry, claiming descent from Robert de Den, butler to King Edward the Confessor (d. 1066), (Burke's Commoners, iii:19-21). Johnwas already a rich man when, at the death of his father in 1599, his fortune was augmented by the inheritance of the Bekesbourne estate. In the following year or soon thereafter, by purchase from John Hales, Esq. of Tenterden he acquired the Manor of Ripple, otherwise known as Ripple Court, in the parish of Ripple. Hasted, giving its history, says, "The principal manor in this parish, which is called the Manor of Ripple, alias Ripple Court ... part of the antient possessions of the abbot and convent of St. Augustine. ... Henry VIII, in his 34th year (1543) granted this menor ... to Archbishop Cranmer, who not long afterwards reconveyed ... to the crown, where it remained until Queen Elizabeth in her 42nd year (1600) granted it to John Hales, Esq., of Tenterden, and he afterwards alienated it to John Gokin, Sent., the son of Thomas Gokin, Gent., of Bekesbourne. They bore for their arms: Gules, a chevron ermine between three Cocks Or. He resided at Ripple Court, as did his descendants afterwards down to Richard Gookin, for so he spelt his name, who about the latter and of William III's reign (1688-1702) passed it away by sale to bir Abraham Jacob of Dover. (Hasted's Kent, ix: 565-567; compare Ireland's Kent, 1:647).

When John and Catherine Gookin took possession of Ripple Court, only their four youngest children were still living under the parental roof. Altogether twelve children were born to them, although for the purposes of this history we are concerned mainly with Daniel, fourth son, who was baptized at Ripple on October 28, 1582. A short account of Vincent, the fifth son, whose grandson Colonel Charles Gookin came to America as Governor of Penn's Colony, will be found in the appendix of this volume.

An intensive research among the county and other local histories of England reveals the name of GCOKIN nowhere but in connection with the family of the county of Kent. The following pedigree is a literal copy taken from the original "Visitation" in the Herald's College in London, and is the only one of the name upon the records of that institution. (Berry's Kent Genealogies, p. 194; see also NEH&GR i:345).

The omission in this pedigree of the descendants of Daniel and Vincent, the sons of "Johes Gokin" of Ripple Court, who were both married in England, may be accounted for by the removal of Vincent and Daniel to the county of Cork in Ireland, and of Daniel from there to Virginia in the beginning of the seventeenth century.

### DANIEL GOOKIN OF CARRIGALINE

Of Daniel's early life little is known. He was still at Ripple in August 1601 when, with his brother John, he signed a marriage license bond for Thomas Gillowe of Walmer. Thereafter he disappears from view until January 20, 1603/9, when, by deed indented, his father conveyed to him several parcels of land near Ripple. This was in anticipation of his marriage which took place on the thirty-first of the same month in Canterbury Cathedral, to Mary Fyrd, daughter of Rev. Richard Byrd, D.D. one of the canons of the Cathedral. Where Daniel lived at the time of his marriage to Mary has not been ascertained. On October 24, 1610, he sold to his brother Thomas the lands given to him by his father, and on January 1610/11, he bought back from Thomas a parcel containing twenty-two acres of fresh marsh. No record of the birth or baptism of his cliest son Richard has yet come to light, but his second son Edward was baptized at Ripple June 23, 1611.

His brother Vincent, who spent several years on the continent before reaching his majority, engaged, it is probable, in the pile chard industry, made his way to Ireland in or about the year 1600 and settled at Courtmacherry in the county of Cork. Except that he was ever scrupulously upright in all his dealings with his fellowmen, Vincent Gockin was a typical adventurer of the age of adventure in which he lived Eager, forceful, clear-sighted, and self-reliant, he quickly laid the foundation of what grew to be a large fortune before he reached midule ago.

Munster, which had almost been depopulated after Desmond's rebellion, and again devastated during the strife that followed the revolt of "Red Hugh O'Neill", Earl of Tyrone, in 1598, was, in the earlier years of the seventeenth century, outside of a few walled towns, a wild and inhospitable place. It offered, however, unusual opportunities to the English gentlemen of hardy mould and determined spirit, mostly younger sons of good families, who soon flocked there in considerable numbers. Without doubt it was the representations as to these opportunities made by Vincent Gookin that led Daniel to follow his brother to the new place. How early the migration took place is not known, save that it was prior to 1616, for at that date Daniel was living in Goolmain, Parish of Ringrose. County Cork, on the opposite side of the bay from Vincent's residence at Courtmacesherry.

In 1619, on the 19th of June, Daniel Gookin sold to a Kentish man named Thomas Petley, for the sum of 430 pounds sterling, the 22 acres of fresh marsh in the parishes of Hope All Saints and St Mary's in Romney Marsh, Kent. This was part of a transaction by which Daniel bought from Petley, for 1600 pounds sterling, the castle and lands of Carrigaline, situated about seven miles southeast of the city of Cork, down the harbor, at the head of an arm of the sea called the Oonbuoy River. Carrigaline was in early times called Beauver, Beaver,

or Belvoir, from the huge limestone rock which rises abruptly from the river and slopes gradually toward the land.

In the year 1620 Daniel Gookin projected an enterprise of transporting cattle to the Colony of Virginia, and of founding a plantation there. The Virginia Company at this period was making a strong effort to secure colonists, and in April of the following year, Daniel Gookin's friend, Captain William Newce of Bandon, who had achieved some success in settling Englishman in Mumster, having built up a suburb of Bandon, known as Newce's Town, came forward with an offer, "to transport at his own costs and charges 1000 persons into Virginia betwixt this and midsomer 1625". This offer was received with enthusiasm; the Company granted him a patent, "as ample as any other," constituted him Marshal of the Colony, and the King conferred upon him the order of Knighthood. Sir William Newce preceded Daniel about a month, arriving at his destination in October 1621, accompanied by, "very few people, sicklie, ragged and altogether. without pivisione, (MSS Rec Vir Co i:501-2) and died suddenly a few days after landing.

In marked contrast to this ill fated expedition is that of Daniel Gookin as told by Governor Wyatt and his council in a letter written in January 1622/3 to the company in London. There arrived heere about the 22th of November a shipp from Mr. Gookin out of Ireland wholy vppon his own Adventure, (the Flying Hart, NEH&GR 30:417) ... wch was so well durnished with all sorts of p'visione, as well as with Cattle as wee could wyshe all men would follow theire example, hee hath also brought with him about 50 men on that Aduenture, besides some 30 other Passengers, wee have Accordingly to their desire seated them at Newport's news." (Neill's Vir Co, pp. 285-6) Daniel's arrival was also chronicled by Captain John Smith in his, Generall Historie of Virginia, (London, 1624, p. 140; see also Virginia, Cxford U. Pr. N.Y., 1940, p. 260). "1621- the 22d of November arrived Master Gookin out of Ireland, with fiftie men of his owne and thirtie passengers, exceedingly well furnished with all sorts of Provision and cattle and planted himself at Nupors-Newes." This was the first settlement at this place. "The name is either derived from that of Captain Newport, or it means New Port Newce, if, as it is sometimes said, Daniel Gookin came from Newceston in Ireland. (Tyler, Narratives of Early Vir; see also Hotten's Original Lists ..., p. 243).

On March 22, 1622, just four months to the day that Daniel landed, the great massacre by the savages took place, when out of a total of about 4000 settlers then in the colony, 347 were slain. This lamentable and so unexpected disaster, says Capt John Smith, drave them all to their wits end. It was concluded all the petty Plantations should be abandoned, and drawn only to make good five or six places. Now for want of boats it was impossible on such a sudden to bring also their cattle and many other things which they had then in possession, all of which for the most part at their departure, was burnt,

ruined and destroyed by the Salvages. Only Master Gookin at Nupor's news would not obey the Commissioner's command in that, although he had scarce five and thirty of all sorts with him, yet he thought himself sufficient against what could happen, and so did, to his great credit, and the content of his adventurers. (General! Hist, p. 150; the same account is given by Purchas Pilgrims). This indication of Gookin's character renders it probable that he was one of those referred to by Sir William Keith, who had their own private gain more in view than any regular settlement of the colony. (Keith, Hist of Wir, London, 1728, p. 140).

Presumably Daniel and his people had not wasted their time during the four month since they landed, but had built habitations of some sort, which for security were surrounded by palisades. In the Virginia Planter's answer to "Captain Butler's Informacon concerning the Colony", written only a year later, it is stated, "ther is as yett no other Artificial Fortifications than Pallisadoes whereof allmost eurie Plantation hath one and divers of them hath Trenches... As for great Ordinance, ... there are likewise at Newporte

Newes three, all of them serviceable.

At the end of this month, or early in May, Daniel Gookin left the new plantation in the charge of servants and embarked for England in the "Sea Flower", carrying to the Company in London the first intelligence of the disaster that had overtaken the colonists. His first business in London was to secure a patent to his plantation. On July 21, 1622 he took out a patent from the Crown to the 500 acres in county Longford which he had sold to Francis Edgeworth three years before. After that, he was at last free to return to his home and family in Ireland. (Dict Natl Biog, viii:152).

After his return to Ireland, Daniel set about dispatching another ship with planters and cattle for Virginia. There is no evidence that he made a second trip himself. His second venture was the sending of the Providence - perhaps owned by him - in charge of Captain John Clarke, who, three years before, had piloted the Mayrlower on her memorable voyage. (Brown, Genesis of the U.S., ii:365; also NEH&GR 30:418). So far as we know, this second ship was the last that Daniel sent to Virginia. The venture could hardly have been profitable and further, because of the difficulties in which the Virginia Company was involved in the latter part of 1623, and which resulted in the abrogation of its charter, June 16, 1624, the patent for the land to which Daniel was entitled could not be issued. This, as may be imagined, was a grievious disappointment. Not until Febrwary 25, 1634/5 - two years after Daniel's death - did the Council of State for Virginia authorize the issuance of the patent, and it was almost three years later that it was actually executed and delivered to his son.

Daniel and John, the third and fourth sons of Daniel Gookin of Carrigaline were probably away from home at the time of their father's death in February or March 1632/3. We know that Daniel the younger was at the Maries Mount (Virginia) Plantation as ealy as 1631, when he was only eighteen, and not unlikely, John may have been there with him.

John's career was a short one. On October 17, 1636, he was granted 500 acres of land on the Nansemond River in Virginia for transporting ten persons to the colony, (Va Hist Mag, v:458) and in the course of the next five years he had additional grants aggregating 1490 acres more. In 1637 or 1638 he was appointed one of the Commissioners for keeping monthly accounts in Lower Norfolk, and in 1639 was a Burgese for Upper Norfolk. (Va Hist Mag, 11:99, v:435; also Jour Hs of Bur of Va 1619-1658/9, p. xv).

See line of JOHN GOOKIN in appendix following.

The third son and namesake of Daniel Gookin of Carrigaline was born in the latter part of the year 1612. His place of nativity remains a matter of conjecture. When he was less than four years old his father was living in Ireland, so it may be assumed that Daniel's boyhood was spent in Carrigaline and that later he was sent to England for schooling. The earliest glimse of him that we have reveals him in Virginia, at his father's plantation, shortly after his eighteenth birthday. Among the records of the General Court is an indenture executed Fobruary 1, 1650/1, between, Daniel Gooking of Newport Newes in Virginia, Gent. and Thomas addison, second manager of Maries Mount, in which at Addison's retirement, he was rewarded for his faithful service by a gift of 150 acres in the behalf of Daniel's father, Daniel Gookin of Carrigaline.

De Vries, the Dutch captain, wrote that on March 20, 1633, he "anchored at evening, before Newport Newes, where lived a gentleman of the name of Goegen." (Neill, Vir Carolorum, p. 83).

The next we see of Daniel he is in London. A license was greated by the Bishop of London, November 11, 1639, for the marriage of Daniel Gookin, gent., of the parish of Et. Sepulchre, London, a widower, aged about 27, and Mary Bolling, of the parish of St. Dunstan in the West, London, a spinster, aged about 21, whose parents were dead. (Publ Harl., Soc xxvi;246; N.Y. Gen Bio Soc Reg. Pedig, 1:69) They were to marry at St. Sepulchre's, but, as the records of that place were destroyed in the great fire of 1665, the precise date of the wedding cannot be determined. No record of Daniel's previous marriage has yet some to light.

In the interval between his two visits to Virginia there is reason to suppose that Daniel was, for a time, engaged in military service, possibly in England, but more likely in the Netherlands. Captain Edward Johnson in his "Wonder Working Providence", calls him a "Kentish souldier", an appelation which would hardly have been bestowed upon him because of his command of the trained bands in Virginia and Massachusetts.

Early in 1641, Daniel and Mary Gookin; with their infant son, set sail for Virginia to make their home in the new world. Opening before Daniel there was the alluring prospect of territorial lord—ship made possible by the grant of land obtained three years before; whereas, being a younger son and possessed of only moderate means, the hope of acquiring a considerable landed estate in England must have seemed far away. On his arrival in Virginia, Daniel proceeded to the Mansemend plantation and took up his residency there. His fellow colonists were not long in recognizing him as a man of ability. He was made a Burgess and represented the Upper Norfolk county in the Grand Assembly which met in Jamestown, January 12, 1641/2. (Va Hist Mag.ix:51). A grant of 2500 acres in the upper county of Norfolk, upon the northwest of Nansemond River had been issued to him the 29th of December 1637, and a further grant of 1400 acres on the Rappahanock River, about 35 miles upon the north side was made to "Captain Daniel"

Gookin", November 4, 1642.

Among his neighbors in the Upper Norfolk county, Daniel found a considerable number of Puritan families. Services of some sort were held on the Sabbath, but the lack of the preaching, which was the chief solace and intellectual diversion of the early Puritans, was keenly felt. Accordingly, on May 24, 1642 a letter was addressed to the elders of the Church at Boston in the colony of Massachusetts Bay, calling for ministers. Upon consideration, the elders sent Rev. William Tompson of Braintree, Rev. John Knowles from Emanuel College, and Rev. Thomas James of New Haven. Eleven weeks were consumed in the trip to Virginia. "Here," says Winthrop, "they found very loving and liberal entertainment, and were bestowed in several places, not by the governor, but by some well disposed persons who desired their company." (Winthrop, Hist of New Engl, ii:115)

Daniel Gookin was easily the most prominent of these well dispesed persons. By Governor Berkeley, a zealous and bigoted adherent to the Church of England, though they brought letters to him from Governor Winthrop, their reception was frigid. At the next meeting of the Assembly, in March 1642/3, the following act was passed: "For the preservation of the purities of doctrine and unitie of the church. It is enacted that all ministers whatsoever which shall reside in the collony are to be conformable to the orders and constitution of the Church of England, and the laws therein established, and not otherwise to be admitted to teach or preach publickly or privatly, And that the Gov. and council do take care that all nonconformists upon notice of them shall be compelled to depart the collony with all convenience." (Henning's Statutes at Large, 1:277). The Governor was not long in getting rid of Knowles and James who left for New England in April, telling the elders of Boston of the work of the missionaries.

Tompson was closely associated with Daniel at this time, so we learn from the testimony of Cotton Mather's doggeral:

"A constellation of great converts there,
Shone round him, and his heavenly glory were
GOCKINS was one of these; by Tompson's pains,
CHRIST and NEW ENGLAND a dear GOCKINS gains."

(Magnalia Christi Americana, 1:398)

Unquestionably it was Tompson's influence that induced Daniel to remove to Massachusetts. After the passage of the act of conformity, Virginia was no longer an agreeable place for Daniel to live, so accompanied by Tompson and others, he first emigrated, in the summer of 1643, to the neighboring colony of Maryland, where he conquired land in the vicinity of South and Severn Rivers, near the rate of Annapolis, (Neill, Terra Mariae, p. 79). Though Lord Baltimon and Governor Calvert were Papists, the newcomers were not looked upon as intruders, but were welcomed as most desirable. Notwithsuanding the welcome and toleration shown by Governor Calvert in protecting all settlers in their conscientious scruples, a short stay

convinced Daniel that Maryland, under papist rule, was not the place for him. The sudden death of his brother John at Lynn Haven early in November 1643 broke the strongest tie that bound him to Virginia, so in May 1644, leaving his three plantations in the charge of servants, with his wife and infant daughter, he set sail for Boston. Samuel, his first-born, had died before this time. Arriving in Boston May 20, 1644, his reception was most cordial. On May 26, six days after his landing, he was permitted membership in the first Church, and on May 29 was honored with the freedom of the colony, a favor rarely conferred upon persons of so short a residence. This was probably intended as an acknowledgement of his kindness to the missionaries in Virginia and his distinction in that colony.

The records of the First Church in Boston, of which Rev. John Cotton was the pastor, show that, "Mrs. Mary Gookin, or brother Captaine Gookin's wife," was admitted as a member on October 12, 1644. With this church Daniel and Mary continued their affiliation until their removal to Cambridge, nearly four years later. During most, if not all the intervening time, their residence was in Roxbury, where they were near neighbors of Rev. John Eliot, the famous pastor of the first church of that town, justly reknowned as the "Apostle" to the Indians of New England. Daniel's and Mary's children Elizabeth, baptized March 30, 1645, and Hannah, baptized May 23, 1646, were born in Roxbury. A man of education, Daniel was one of the founders of the free grammar school established there in 1645, (Ellis, Hist Rox., p. 37). It is also stated that Gookin was a scholar of Hebrew, (Worcester Mag, 1:383). Drake says he was a deputy from Roxbury to the General Court, (Drake, Town of Rox., p. 190). If so, the records of the Court fail to disclose that he attended any of the sessions of that body. This is accounted for perhaps by absence in Maryland and Virginia. The business of his plantations in the southern colonies appear to have occupied his attention for some time after his removal to Massachusetts. On April 6, 1648 he sold 500 acres of the plantation on the Rappahanock to Captain Thomas Burbage. How long he continued to own the remaining 900 acres and the larger plantation on the Nansemond has not been ascertained.

In July 1648 Daniel and Mary removed to Cambridge and he was soon appointed Captain of the trained band, a command he held for nearly forty years, being, as Captain Edward Johnson said of him, "a very forward man to advance Marshal disipline..." (Wonder Working Providence, ed Poole, p. 192). The practice then prevailed for a captain to retain command of his company however highly promoted, the immediate command being exercised by the Lieutenant. Thus, while in later years Daniel was Major General, he was still Captain of the Cambridge company.

In the spring of 1649 Daniel was chosen as Deputy from Cambridge to the General Court held in Boston May 2. In July of 1650 he was in London, partly on public business, and possibly visited some of his

cousins whom he had not seen for nine years. In the spring of 1651 Captain Gookin and Mr. Edward Jackson were returned as Deputies from Cambridge to the general court, and on May 7, Daniel was chosen speaker. At the election held May 26, 1652 he was chosen an Assistant, or one of the council of eighteen magistrates to whom, with the Governor and Deputy-Governor, the government of the colony was intrusted. To this office he was reelected continuously for a period of thirtyfive years, save only in 1676 when he suffered defeat because the populace, maddened by the Indian War then raging, misconstrued his care of the friendly Indians and included him with them in their unreasoning indignation.

Captain Gookin was for the third time elected Assistant on May 3, 1654 and was present at the meeting of the court held that day. Thereafter his movements are lost sight of for more than a year, the probability being that he sailed for England upon private business, which was apparently an effort to secure the property left by his elder brother Edward, of whose estate he was appointed administrator on July 3, 1655. The interval since Daniel's last visit to London had witnessed maby changes. Cromwell had been proclained Protector, and now, for the first time in fourteen years, an election had been held, and the first Protectorate Parliament was in session. Among the members was Daniel's cousin, Vincent Gookin, who, like himself, was a man of high aims and unswerving devotion to the path of duty.

The mind of Cromwell, at this period, was much occupied with his resolution to extend the power of England beyond the seas. Near Christmas he had dispatched Admiral Penn and General Venables on an expedition to wrest the West Indies from Spain. Failing miserably in their attack on San Domingo, they turned their attention to Jamaica. A landing was successfully made at Kingston on May 10, 1655, and the island became an English possession. The acquisition of Jamaica afforded small consolation for a foothold in the West Indies, but still as the island had been taken, Cromwell determined tochold 1t. The need was for planters , not disgruntled military colonists, but appeals were futile. It was in New England that Cronwell thought he saw the most immediate source of supply. Daniel Gookin, in England at the time, was sent for. Though he did not share Cromwell's enthusiasm, he was nevertheless commissioned to urge the New Englanders to transfer themselves to Jamaica, (Br Rec Off, Interreg. Entry Bk, civ: 304-6; Carlyle, Cromwell's Letters, ii: 197). It was not until January 20, 1655/6 that Gookin again landed at Boston, but the subsequent effort to gain colonists was a failure and his final report was made by letter on June 20, 1657, (Col State Papers John Thurlows, vi:362; also iv:6, 440, 449; v:509).

Daniel returned again to England about the time of the dissolution of the second Protectorate Parliament on February 4, 1657/8. Dissatisfaction with the ascendancy of the military party was becoming very general, and even in spite of the intensity of his puritanism

some echo must have reached Daniel of the growing reaction against excessive religious enturissm. In June came the news of the deleast of the Spanish forder by the English and French and the formel delivery of Dunkink into the hands of the English. Then in September the hopes of the Puritans received the blow of the death of the Lord Frotector.

Whatever the business that took Captain Gookin to England, its progress seems to have been slow, and other occupation was possible while waiting. Thus he was commissioned in March 1658/9 the collector or of customs at Dunkirk. This post was evidently retained until May 1660 when King Charles II landed at Dover, and then Daniel returned To New England on the same ship with the regicites General Whalley and Colonel Goffe who considered it prudent to flee to the new world. These two probably took up their residence in Cambridge, but were the subject of so much friction between the colonists and England that in 1664 the English government appointed a board of commissioners to visit New England and enforce subjection to arbitrary government. So shrewdly was the controversy managed by the General Court, that in the end the commissioners were discomfited and obliged to return without having accomplished their object. Credit for this is due in large measure to Daniel Gookin and Thomas Danforth.

The extent and variety of Daniel's public service was considerable. He was a faithful attendant at the sessions of the General Court and at the meetings of the Governor and council. He was engaged upon many committees; to audit the treasurer's accounts, to treat with the mint-master, to draw up orders concerning the militia, to visit Harvard College and examine the treasurer's accounts, to name a few. More important were designations to hold the County Courts, as for Norfolk in 1660, for Suffolk in 1663, and his appointment in 1668 as one of the commissioners of revenue from imposts. Also there was the routine business of magistrate to attend to besides which his farms and the trade with the Maryland and Virginia plantations had to be looked after. He still found time to do his full duty as Captain of the Cambridge trained band, to attend religious meetings with punctilious regularity, to serve the town as Selectman from 1660 to 1672. As first Superintendant of the Praying Indians he had to spend much of his time in journeys through the wilderness to their several settlements, besides listening to their appeals when they frequently called upon him in Cambridge, and accompanying Eliot when he went among them to preach. He wrote two books on the Indians; Historical Collections of the Indians in New England, completed 1674 (published 1792), and The Doings and Sufferings of the Christian Indians, finished 1677 (published 1836). Selections from the Historical Collection ... are published in, A Library of American Literature, 1:433-445.

As employment for his leisure hours he steadily worked upon a history of the colony, of which, unfortunately, but a small flagment has survived. The author was a man of great breadth of mind ard was not too deeply touched by the narrow ecclesiasticism of the day.

He was also in a position to know the public events of the time. His History of New England, had it been published, must have given us an important view of the subject." (Cambr Hist Amer Lit, 1:25-6; also NEH&GR iii:123-5).

To prevent heresies and contentions, laws were passed abridging the liberty of the press, and for a time no printing was allowed in any town within the jurisdiction of Massachusetts except Cambridge. In 1662 Caniel Gookin and the Rev. Johnathan Mitchell were appointed as the first licensers of the press, but refused to act, the only declination of a public trust ever recorded of Daniel. This evidences an open mindedness of character very unusual in the time. (Thomas, Hist of Printing in U.S., i:207; Hutchinson's Hist Mass Bay, pp 257-8)

Soon after the restoration of Charles II to the Crown of England, s controversy began with the colonists over their charter priviledges, which continued with scarcely an intermission for more than twenty years. The men at the head of the colonial government showed themselves adept at clever fencing, and for a long time the crisis was averted. Gradually the tension became more acute. In the years following the Indian War much fuel was added to the flame by the machinations of that "evil genius of New England Edward Randolph. And when, in 1681, a royal mandate was received, directing that authorized agents be sent to London to represent the colony and answer to a land claimant, it was obvious that at last the issue had been forced. For several years, Major Gookin's (title conferred May 1675) popularity had been steadily growing. In his opposition to the artitrary measures proposed by the Crown, he displayed the same spirit of dogged determination with which he adhered to the cause of the Christian Indians in the face of popular delerium. To yeild to the King's demands he clearly saw would be a fatal mistake, so he atoutly stood for a strict construction of the charter and opposed sending the agents to England. The submission to the General Court, February 14, 1680, of a paper presenting his opinion (see Gookin, Daniel Gookin ... pp 172-77) not only won the day for his party but also gained for its author a measure of public approbation that must have seemed particularly welcome after the obloquy so unjustly visited upon him flyc years before during King Phillip's War. At the next general election, May 11, 1681, he was made Major-General, or commander-in-chief of all the military forces of the colony.

The five years that Daniel Gookin held the position of Major-General was a period of ever increasing distress in the affairs of the colony, until these troubles culminated, in 1686, with the abrogation of the charter government by James II. This was a blow that shattered the very foundation of their civil rights, and with a papiet on the throne of England the outlook for the colony seemed dark and cheerless. Major-General Gookin's last days were saddened by the tribulations that had befallen the colony with the loss of the charter. Though the greater power lay with the other side in the

long controversy, yet he had the satisfaction of having done all that was possible for anyone to do to avert the catastrophe, and his conscience was clear.

He died Saturday, March 19, 1686/7, "a right Good man," (Judge Sewall's <u>Diary</u>) and was buried March 22 in the cemetary of the First Church, opposite the gate of Harvard College. The grave is marked with a brick monument covered with a flat slab of brown sandstone bearing the inscription:

Here lyeth intered ye body of Major Genel DANIEL GOOKINS aged 75 yeares, who departed this life ye 19 of March 1687

From the inflexible firmness with which he stood for every specific right of the colonists Daniel has been called the "originator and prophet of that immortal dogma of our national greatness — no taxation without representation." (Tyler, Hist Amer Lit, i:154) It was he, by the cogent arguments and fearless resistance to any encroachment upon political or commercial liberty did more than any other to crystallize the spirit of opposition, and the doctrine that is the corner-stone of democratic government.

# NOTE

It will be noted that there occasionaly occurs in the following sections a "double date" in the recording of these records. However, this occurs only in the months of January, February and March prior to the year 1752.

This system arises as a result of a change made in the salendar in 1582. Previously the Julian Calendar exceeded the solar year by 11 minutes annually, 3 days every 400 years. Between AD 325 and AD 1582 the excess amounted to about 10 days. Pope Gregory XIII ordered this ten days dropped from the calendar, and further decreed change of the beginning of the new year from 25 March to 1 January. All catholic countries adopted this change, the Gregorian calendar, but England delayed until 1752. During this time (until 1752) the new year did not begin until 25 March, and by that date England was 11 days off with the rest of Europe. The custom of "double dating" arises from the fact that many people began to use the Gregorian system in spite of the difference in the official date of year, and the double entry indicates that it is officially one year, but considered by some to be the next. The dates in the period prior to 1752 in some later historical writings are sometimes referred to as Old Style (OS).

After the death of his wife Mary on Oct 27, 1683. (Rev Moadiah Russell's Diery, NEHEGR, vii), Major-General Daniel Gookin's household consisted only of himself, his son Nathaniel, then beginning the second year of his pastorate of the First Church, Cambridge, and his sixteen year old grandson, John Eliot, son of Elizabeth Gookin and Rev John Eliot, Jr.

About a year later, Daniel married Mrs. Hannah Savage, dau of Edward and Mary (Sears) Tyng, and widow of Habijah Savage. She died Oct 28, 1688 and was buried Oct 31, aged 48. (Cambr VR ii:575)

# NOTE .

The rest of the genealogy is divide d into five parts, each devoted to the descendants of Major General Daniel Gookin's by those of his children who carried on the line. A part each is taken by Mary, Elizabeth, Daniel, Samuel and Nathaniel. These are the Sixth generation of the family, but may be considered as the First American generation.

It appears from considerable research that all the Gookin and Gookins Families in the United States are descended from three of the sons of General Gookin, with the exception of some few of the surname descended from a Thomas Gookin who came to America in 1847 from Ireland. It is very likely that these individuals from the Irish Branch are of the lineage from Sir Vincent Gookin (p. 29 and APPENDIX) although present poverty of data of this line renders the supposition incapable of real proof. What material there is of this later Irish line may be found in the APPENDIX.

Little data has been found in the line of MARY GOCKIN, but ELIZABETH GCCKIN has some contemporary representatives.

VI. Samuel Gookin, seventh child of the Major-General, was born in Cambridge, Mass., Apr 22, 1652 and died there Sept 16, 1730. He inherited his father's military spirit, and was a Capta; as early as 1692, when he was commissioned to settle difficultipe existing at Little Compton, He was active also in raising troops for the expedition to C nada in 1711. Captain Gookin seems to have been more moderate than his father in opposition to arbitra y power; as in May 1687 he was appointed Sheriff of Middlesex by the andres administration. At the revolution, John Green was reinstated Marshal-General, and Gookin probably went out of office. Green died Mar 3, 1690/1, and two days afterwards Gookin was appointed Marshal-General, equivalent to High Sheriff of the Colony. After the form of government was changed by the new charter, this office was abolished, and High Sheriffs were appointed in each county. Gookin held this office for a time in Sufflok, and afterwards appointed, 1702; to the same office in Middlesex, which he held (except from Dec 1715 to July 1717) until July 27, 1729. (Paigo, Cambridge, p 564).

His first wife and mother of all his children was Mary (Larkin?). She died after Apr 29, 1707, and on Sept 23, 1708, he married Hannah, dau of Samuel and Hannah (Manning) Stearns, the widow of Thomas Biscoe of Watertown, (Cambr VR, ii:167).

Ho served as a Lt. in the expedition against Port Royal, 1710, and was afterwards a Capt, by which appelation he was generally known. He was appointed Deputy Sheriff by his father in 1702 when he was only 19 years old, which office he held for 64 years. He was also appointed Orier of the Courts in 1742, and remained in this office until Dec. 2, 1766, on which day is the last record of his appearance as Deputy Sheriff and Orier: Towards the close of his life; his financila affairs appear to have become embarrasse ed. Having disposed of sundry other lots of land, he sold the inherited homestead in 1754, reserving a life-estate therein to himself and his wife. His life-estate he sold to Rev East Apthorp in 1760, and purchased a house and lands at the Nil corner of Holyoke and South Sts, for the use of himself and wife during their lives, and then to descend one-half to their dau Mary, and one-half equally divided between Benjamin and Priscilla Hill, ch of Mrs. Gookin by a former marriage.

Samuel was twice married; 1st, to Susanna, dau of Capt Josiah Parker on Feb 28, 1711/2, (Camb VR ii:167) - when she d is unknown. He m. 2d, May 15, 1740 (2mb VR ii:167), Priscilla (Dana) Hill, widow of Joseph Hill, and dau of Daniel Dana. She was the great-aunt of the poet Richard Henry Dana. Priscilla d probably in apr 1785. There appear to have been no children by the 1st m.

Samuel registered intention to wed Hary Hullet, b 1742, of Charlestown, deu of John and Lydia Hullet, Dec 22, 1761, (Cambr VR ii:167; Tyman's Charlestown Geneal 3 Estates, p 694) but the exact date of the marriage is unknown. Faige's Cambridge, p 566, says that they removed to Suffield, Conn., and from there to Rupert, Vermont, but gives no dates. Rupert, Vt. was founded about 1767 and according to one reference, was at onetime called, "Gookin Falls", (BET Dec 29, 1920).

In the <u>Gookin</u> section of Sclisbury's <u>Family Memorials</u> the information is given that after the removal of <u>Samuel</u> and his family to Rupert, he added an <u>s</u> to his name, making the form <u>Gookins</u>, which change has survived to the present day in his descendants. This compiler has been unable to discover the reason for the change from the original form Gookin, and, as a matter of fact, has met with isolated cases of projudice against the terminal <u>s</u>.

Information of the career of Samuel is unobtainable, although an unreferenced statement in a history of Rupert, Vt. credits him with service in the French and Indian Jar. Unfortunately, the early records of Rupert town were lost or destroyed during a boundary dispute between Vermont and New York, so it is doubtful whether any data of that early time will over come to light.

Family tradition has it that the move to Rupert was made after the birth of all the children in Hassachusetts. It is certain, however, that the family was in Rupert, Yt. at the out-break of the Revolutionary War.

Samuel, the father, died at Rupert, .pr 2, 1812, and his wife, Dec 10, 1323.

Conn Man, p 642). He applied for pension, Apr 15, 1818, residence Livenia, N.Y. (Rec Fens Dept at Eash. Claim signed by J.C. Calhoun, Sec of Jar. NF 10064).

They moved to Switzerland Co. Indiana (NEHAGR 70:201), and while it is unknown when they moved to Ripley Co., they seem to have followed the lead of several married children who migrated there. Samuel and his wife lived in a house near their son isa.

Samuel died Dec 4, 1842, a few months over 80 years of age, (tembstone, fam cen), and is buried in the family cometary in Delaware teamship, Ripley Co. Indiana. His name is on a bronze tablet in Verscilles Court House, His wife Hary (Polly) died July 13, 1848, (Tembstone).

Ifter the War William came back to Rupert with the intention of purchasing a farm with the money seved during service in the

rmy. However, the depreciation of the Continental currency put an end to these hopes. He was a brickmaker by trade, following that occupation in the summer and teaching music during the winter. The girls taught school senetimes.

In the fall of 1808, William and sons Milliam and Elisha went to Jefferson Co., N.Y. The brothers obtained work there and the father returned to Vt. at the beginning of the sleighing season. They moved to the "Black River" country where he bought a small firm.

Then the par of 1812 came on, illiem (1765) was over the age for military service, but joined a company of old men, the "Silver Grays" who considered themselves "minute-men" and who took a small part in the active field operations. The Gookins family then lived about 10 miles from lake Ontario, the boundary between the United States and Canada, and the scene of a good deal of hostility. The family shortly there for moved to Rodman, M.Y.

In 1813 a disc so, so-called "cold-plague", provailed in opidemic proportions, in many cases proving fatal. Nour the end of the seige, hrs. Rhode Gookins was attacked by it but recovered. the next year, Apr 5, 1814, filliam Senior died of the disease, aged 49. The less to the family was very great. Thin a year of his doubt, the daughter Rhode had the measles, went into a slow decline and died nearly 3 years later at the home of an uncle of the mether. She is buried in Hanover, Oneida Co., N.Y.

In April 1823, Mrs. Rhoda Gookins and her sons Samuel Barnes and Hilo determied to move to Indiana, following the lead of several other of her children. They embarked at Sachets Harbor and landed at Lauriston, May 7, 1823. Rhoda went to Buffalo, N.Y. by stage, the goods coming by wagon above the falls and by small boats to Buffalo where all shipped on a sailing vessel to Detroit. The trippup Lake Eric was tedious and at one time dangerously stormy. Landing safely at Detroit they waited 3 days and then went up the Maunee River and down the Jabash in a cance, to Terro Haute, where the landing was made June 23. It is said that this was only the second party to come into the territory by this reute. From Ft. The type there were no white settlements until they reached Fountain Co.

The daughter Clive and son filling had been found 2 miles SE of Terre Haute, and Mrs. Gookins remained there the remaining year and a half of her life. Typhoid fever and the ague finally led to her death, Jan 22, 1825. She was bur in a mound on Ft. Harrison Praire about 10 miles SE of Terre H utc. Some years later her sen Mile, then at Clinton, had a rough sandstone put up at her grave. (Mile Gookins' ltr to day Mary Matilda, 1863).

In the fall of 1821 he came with his family to Indiana, coming down the river on a raft, they landed at Cincinnati, Ohio after many hardships, then overland to Ripley Co. Indiana where he spont the remainder of his life.

In 1824 Orinda died, leaving Samuel with 4 small children.

Struggling alone for 4 years, Samuel married Parthona Chamberlain, who died in a little less than a year leaving Milliam, a baby of about 2 weeks. William's grandmother Chamberlain cared for him for about 4 years, until Samuel again married. In 1833 Theodocia Swift became Samuel's third wife.

Then he came to Indiana, Samuel was a poor man, but by rigid economy and good management, accumulated a good estate. Though principally a farmer, in 1857 he built and operated the first steam flour mill in southeastern Indiana. His son Villiam was installed as miller and continued until he entered the Civil Tare. After operating the mill until 1865, Samuel sold it and became a large land-owner in Indiana and Iowa.

Retiring from active business, he lived a quiet life on his home farm, one mile north of old Delaware station, and died hug 10, 1873, aged 76 (tembstone) after a lingering illness with concer of the face.

22. James Farrington Gobkins, b in Torre Haute, Ind., Dec 30, 1840, d at Hotel Navarre, New York city, May 23, 1904. He was educated at Wabash College, Crawfordsville, Ind., and received IM. degree, 1877. He enlisted, Apr 1861, in Col Lew Wallace's lith Indiana Regt, and was assigned staff duty in General Wallace's Hq. Apr 1862. He was artist correspondent for Harper's Weekly at various times from 1861 to 1874 in this country and abroad.

James F. studied art at the Royal Academy, Munich, Bavaria as a pupil of Raab Magner and Carl von Piloty, 1870-74, and also in Paris, London and Vicana. He was asst-commissioner of the Vicana Exposition in 1873.

A charter member of the Chicago academy of Design, he was Director 1875-78 and again 1881-83. He was founder of the Indiana School of Art in Indianapolis and director of it, 1877-80. He authored the Lake-front plan for the Torld's Fair in Chicago and promoted legislation therefor from 1882 to 1892. He acted as secretary of the Indiana State Soldier's and Sailor's Monument com-

mission at Indianapolis from 1887 to 1889. From time to time he contributed articles on art and kindred subjects to many imerican and European newspapers and periodicals.

From 1893 to his death in 1904 his time was largely spont in preliminary work in the formulation and financing of the enterprises of the Chicago Subway Areado and Traction Co. of which he was general manager. The claim has been made that the 53 miles of subway in place in 1926 was the result of a theft of his original plans for a freight subway in Chicago.

He has been said by crities of art to have been one of the world's greatest painters of flowers, though trained as a figure and portrait painter. He took great delight in painting flora and the illustration of legends of fairy mythology. With Valter Shirlaw, he made two trips from Chicago to the Rocky mountains after the Civil Mar, for the purposes of study. He was the first to paint a picture of the mountain of the Holy Cross, and was noted for his landscapes of the Rockies, and of the Swiss and Italian Alps.

Among civic interests he was instrumental in securing adoption of logislation to build the Indiana State House; induced Stuyesant Fish, president of the Illineis Central RR, to build a sea wall which made possible the creation of Chicage's lakefront park; and he gave Marshall Field the idea of the great Field museum on the Lake-front.

From 1861 to his death he was afflicted with partial lack of hearing and chronic neuralgia arising from Civil War injuries.

On June 14, 1870 at the First Congregational Church at Terre Haute, he m. Cora Donnelly, day of Peter Metz and Matilda Donnelly. VI. Nathaniel Gookin, minth child of the Major-Goneral, was born in Cambridge, Oct 22, 1656 and died Aug 7, 1692. He graduated from Harvard College in 1675 and was ordained Nov 15, 1682 as successor of Urian Oakes, minister of First Church Cambridge.

He married Aug 3, 1685, Hannah Savage (b Aug 27, 1667, d Hay 14, 1702 at the age of 35.) (Cambr VR 11:575; NEH&GR 4:188).

Hannah Savage at the time of the marriage, also the step-dau of Nathaniel's father the Major-General. Daniel had married Mrs. Hannah Savage, mether of the above Hannah, about 1684. Hannah Savage's father was Habijah Savage, b Aug 1, 1638, grad Harvard 1659 - m. May 8, 1661 Hannah Tyng, b May 7, 1640, d Oct 28, 1688, (she m. 2d Major General Daniel Gookin). Hannah Tyng's father was Edward Tyng, Boston Merchant, b 1610, d Dec 28, 1681, m. about 1636, Mary Sears.

Habijah's father was Thomas, son of Villiam Savage, b 1604, came from London in the "Plenter", 1635, d Feb 14, 1682. His mother was Faith Hutchinson, dau of Jilliam H. and Ann Marbury, bpt at Alford, Lincoln Co. England, Aug 14, 1617. Ann Hutchinson was a preacher and refermer. Driven from Boston, she took refuge in Providence, R.I., then went to New York where she was murdered by the Indians. There is a statue to her in Boston. He left railroading in 1854 and went to Shirley Village, Nass., manufacturing horseshoe nails from a process of his own patent. His partner died and the factory burned, so he returned to the P.W & B. railroad and moved to Wilmington, Sept 9, 1862.

An engineer until the Civil War, he became the first station master and train dispatcher. Although drafted twice, he was considered to be of greater service on the railroad. During his experience as engineer, he had charge of the engine "Daniel Webster", the first successful coal-burning locomotive on the P.W & B. Coal at that time was very dirty as engine fuel, so he developed a system of wetting which was successful and became widely adopted. His last trip as engineer was on Apr 19, 1861, on a noth bound run from Baltimore where he courageously defied the anti-federal riots in that city.

#### SIR VINCENT GOOKIN OF IRELAND

IV. GENERATION Vincent Gookin, tenth child and fifth son of John Gookin and Catherine Denne, was born probably in 1585. (See pages 14 and 15). Little is known of his early years although he spent some time on the continent, engaged, it is probable in the pilchard industry. About the year 1606 he moved to Ireland, settling at Courtmacherry, in the county of Cork. He evidently maintained contact with his parents at home in Kent, for we find that upon the death of his fater on June 23, 1623, in a will made during John Gookin's last hours that Vincent was constituted executor, the key to John's chest was bequeathed to him, and the distribution of the estate was left to Vincent's discretion. Vincent served some time as High Sheriff of the County of Cork, in which post he acquitted himself so well that on February 13, 1630/1, Lord Cork knighted him in the Council Chamber at Dublin. At the death of his brother Daniel, in an inventory of the estate, he was named one of the trustees for the children of Daniel. He died at Highfield, County Gloucestershire in England, February 5, 1637 and is buried in the parish church of Bitton in that county. (Funeral entries in office of Ulster King of Arms, Dublin Castle, vii:234).

He married lst, Mary Wood of Waldon in England (Salisbury, ii:396) and had:

His will was made February 17, 1629 and proved May 7, 1630, naming his dau Judith as wife of "Vincent Gooken, Esq." (Geneal Gleanings in Engl, i:325). Vincent and Judith had: Thomas, Barles, Elizabeth, Katherine, Judith, Frances and perhaps others who died young.

### V. GENERATION

1. Vincent Gookin II was nominated by Oliver Oromwell one of the six representatives of Ireland in the first Protectorate Parliament, and he was returned for Bandon and Kinsale in each of the three subsequent Cromwellian Parliaments. Vincent was a strong opponent to the Irish transplanting and his pamphlet, "The Great Case of Transplantation in Ireland Discussed," published January 3, 1655, awakened a storm of opposition from popular clamour. During Cromwell's tenure, Vincent held variously the positions of Commissioner of the Admiralty, Commissioner General for the Revenues of Ireland, and Surveyor General of Ireland, as Cromwell's personal choice. He died March 29, 1692, his son Robert and Dorothy Clayton being his executors. He married Mary Salmon of Glandore, County Cork.

Research on this branch of the Gookin Family is hampered at present by the inaccessibility of the Original Irish records and the expense of hiring it done, however the following pedigree is presented. This data was taken from a MS genealogical chart in the copy of the biography of Major-General Daniel Gookin which is in the Cleveland, Ohio public library reference room, and has not been elsewhere verified.

Colonel Charles Gookin, son of Thomas, was born about 1662, as appears from the following extract from a letter in which William Penn speaks of having selected him to be acting governor of the Proprietary colony of Pennsylvannia.

"Wm. Penn to James Logan, sec of Pennsylvannia Province:

London, 3d of 3d mo 1708 L'd Treas'rs,

... so that I have been forced to think, much against my desire, of

looking out for another to put in his (Gov. Evan's) place; and at last I have found one of whose morals, experience and fidelity I have some knowledge, and of his family forty years, also a recommending character from persons of great rank. And he assures me he intends to centre with us, and end his days in that country, being forty-six years of age, and has sold his estate in Europe, to lay out his money there, and be a good freeholder among you.

Highly recommended by Lieutenant General Earle and Major General Cadogan, and the Ingoldsby family, as well as Major Morris, my steward, and some friends in Ireland. (Janney, Life of William Penn)

On Gookin's arrival in the province in March 1709, he presented a letter from Penn of which the following is an extract:

"Now my dear friends, as to outward things, I have sent a new Governor of years and experience; of quiet easy temper; that, I hope, will give offence to none; nor too easily put up any, if offered him without hope of Amendment. The Queen very graciously approved of him, at first offer, and gave him her hand to kiss; and at last, being introduced by the Earl of Godolphin, Lord High Treasurer of Great Britian, at Windsor, she added: "Sir, I wish you a good journey, and shall be ready to serve you." He is sober, understands to command and obey, moderate in his temper, and of what they call a good family; his grandfather, Sir Vincent Gookin having been an early great planter in Ireland, in King James the first and the first Charles days; and he intends, if not ill-treated, to lay his bones as well as substance amongst you; and, as he is not voluptuos, so, I hope, he will . be an example of thriftiness. In short, he has instructions as much as to the virtue, justice and peace of the country as I can express myself, or you desire for your comfortable living ... ". (Proud, Hist of Fenna., ii:4, note \*).

No sconer had he taken office, however, than he was beset by complaints of the Assembly against his predecessor, and against the Treasurer of the province. Governor Gookin made conciliatory efforts but the general tenor of complaints seemed to be a question of the Proprietory rights against a more popular government. When Queen Anne called upon the several American colonies for their quota of troops to be used for the conquest of Canada, the Quaker principles were offended and their loyalty impugned. In 1712 Penn was entering into an agreement with the English government for the sale of his proprietory rights, and Gov. Gookin believed that he should not be continued Governor under the Grown.

In October 1715, the proprietory government not having been surrendered, Charles Gookin in his speech to the Assembly expressed his intention to go home for twelve months. This trip, however, appears not to have been made. After the accession of George I, the governor and people began to differ widely in opinion and Penn was

in too ill health to permit active guidance. There was now aroused a jealousy of royal encroachment upon chartered priviledges. Finally, in March 1716/7, Gookin took his last leave of the colony, being superseded by Sir William Keith. (extracts of Proud's, Hist of Penna., ii:3-94).

Charles Gookin married Mary, daughter of John Wallis of Kilgrohane (or Kilygrohan) County Cork, the marriage settlement being dated bept 20, 1698, and had a son, Charles, who married, about February 11, 1726, Ann, daughter of Arthur Bernard of Palace Anne by Anne, daughter and heiress of Roger Le Poer of Mt. Eglantine. The will of this Ann (Bernard) Gookin, proved Nov 7, 1768, is still extant.

A short biography of Governor Charles Gookin is given in NEH&GR 26:424.

#### PEDIGREE FROM CATHERINE GOOKIN

In the Heraldric Visitations of Kent in 1574 and 1619 are the pedigrees of the Warrens, who settled at Dover in the latter part of Henry VII's reign, remaining until the latter part of Queen Elizabeth's reign, when they moved to Ripple. Their arms were: Azure, a cross Or between a martlet in 1st and 4th quarter, and a chaplet in 2d and third, Or. (Hasted's Kent, ix:570)

The original of this pedigree was furnished by Mrs. Horatio Ford of Cleveland, Ohio. It represents that furnished her by the Colonial society of Americans of Royal Descent, Phila., and comprised that portion following, from Charlemagne to Catherine Denne, wife of John Gookin, he of the third Gookin generation. It will be noted that in the lineage as given by the Society, names only were listed, no dates and no references. Any data other than bare names from generation XII (Charlemagne) to LII (Catherine Denne) has been added by this compiler, as has generations I through XII, from sources noted. This entire lineage is presented to the reader for possible interest but must be viewed with suspicion where unsupported by references.

Charles had married a daughter of this monarch but repudiated her because she bore no offspring, afterwards uniting himself with Hildegarde, an Alemannian princess.

Charles crossed the Alps with two armies and conquered the Lombard kingdom, 774, which he added to his possessions. During the years following, he was constantly at war. He won a victory over the Saxons who acknowledged him as their king; was called to Spain, 778, as intermediary between Moors and Arabs, where he secured considerable territory, but lost Roland and Oliver and other knights in the famous fight at the Pass of Roncesvalles.

On Christmas day, 800, Charles was crowned Emperor by Pope Leo III. The remaining years of his life were chiefly devoted to the consolidation of his empire, and an attempt to revive Roman civilization, encouraging Alcuin in establishing schools, and commencing codification of the laws in the famous Capitularies. He was buried at his capital, Aachen. Soon after his death the empire was dismembered.

# LINEAGE FROM JOHN GOOKIN ( '-1643)

V. John Gookin was a brother of Major General Daniel. John's career was a short one (see p. 19).

A few days prior to Feb 4, 1640/1, he married Sarah (Offley) Thorowgood, widow of Capt Adam Thorowgood of Lynn Haven, Lower Norfolk Co, one of the principal men of the colony, and the day of Robt Offley of London whose wife Ann was day of Sir Edward Osborne, Kt, Lord Mayor of London, 1583. Sarah was bpt at St. Benets \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_16, 1609 and m Capt Thorowgood at St. Anne's Blackfriars, July 8, 1627. She bore him: i. In 1642 John Gookin held the title of Capt and on March 29, 1643, he was commander at a ccurt held for Lower Norfolk, (L Nor Co Antiq, 1:144). He died on Nov 2, 1643, being then only about thirty years of age. Four years later, Nov 20, 1647, his widow m her third husband, Col. Francis Yardley, son of Gov. Sir George Yardley, (Waters, Geneal Gleaning ... 1:31; NEH&GR 38:70; Amer Mar Rec, p. 110). She d in Aug 1657, and is bur beside John Gookin at Church Point, Lynn Haven, (Va Hist Mag, v:435).

John and Sarah appear to have had only one child, a dau Mary, for we find recorded in a deed Aug 15, 1672 the fact that Mary was heir, (Va Hist Mag, v:435; vi:297; see Col Fam, vii:77).


The information on the chart on page 152 has been furnished to the compiler by Rev. Vincent A. Gookin, S.J. and his brother, James A. Gookin, both of Boston, Mass. Rev. Gookin spent 35 years abroad, most of which was teaching school in Baghdad. He studied in an English Seminary in 1932 and 1933, and for a time was assigned to Jamaica.

Vincent Gookin, third son of Sylvester, Jr. was in command of the Berlin airfield during the famous airlift of two or three years ago. He

is currently, 1952, assigned in Washington, D.C.

Rev. Vincent A. Gookin, in a short visit to Ireland in 1932, obtained two postcards of an old manor house which had belonged to a Robert Gookin. The manor has been turned into a hotel, the Esplanade in Courtmacherry, Co. Cork. Still visible in the stonework of the fireplace there is a carved "G".

Rev Gookin sent the following data also, but did not identify the Jeremiah Gookin. Presumably he was one of the brothers of the Thomas Gookin who came to America from Ireland.
