INTRODUCTION

In 1918 when the world was upset by the First World War and people were being shifted from one hemisphere to another and occasionally you met a relative whom you did not know existed, my genealogical curiosity became aroused. author at that time was only eleven years of age (born April 15, 1907.) My father was forty-five years of age and volunteered for military service but was rejected and advised to devote full time sawing timber to build ships. was a lumber merchant and skilled carpenter and it was necessary for him to be away much of the time. eight children then and kept the two oldest boys with him. My mother's education was very limited (about sixty per cent of adult population then did not have an elementary education in rural areas.) Consequently it became necessary for the author to act as secretary for his mother and five younger brothers and sisters. I was only in the fourth grade but read each issue of the "Wadesboro M and I" to mother and the children and answered her letters for her. I also subscribed to the "Twin-City-Sentinel" (a news paper arriving three times weekly form Winston-Salem, N.C.) In these two news papers I found much history not only about the world but much concerning my relatives. Therefore I began clipping articles; one set on world history and another set on my relatives so that I might write the STATON HISTORY. Many of these papers were burned accidently while I was in Jr. College at Wingate, N.C.; yet I was still collecting. In 1942 I started again and still collect.

PREFACE

During the Second World War, seventeen years ago (1942), the author read Daniel Webster's statement, "Those who do not look upon themselves as a link connecting the past to the future, do not perform their duty to the world." It was September and the author was principal of Herring High School, age 35, and in good health and coaching athletics. He volunteered for military service, but not having a specific training useful to the service at his age, he was advised to continue teaching high school boys in obstical courses and train younger boys for service. All spare time from then on has been spent collecting more material of every available source to write the STATON HISTORY. I am much indebted to several people for their generous help: Hon. George Walter Staton of Houston, Texas, worked on the history from 1914 to 1945, dying broken hearted there because people would not fill out and return his nine page questionnaires. He died before I knew of his work, so I only have a limited amount of it. Frank Castex of Goldsboro, N. C., tried this history, but became discouraged and sent me his nine pages. Dr. Hilliard Vincent Staton (M.D.) of Washington, D. C., sent me his research; he tried to prove the Statons to be Dutch and connected with Staten Island, N. Y., and from Holland, but failed to find any connections. Joseph Lewis Staton of Eugene, Oregon, collected much material and might have written the history, but lost his health working on it. Many others helped: Dr. Roy Staton of Monroe, N. C.; Mr. & Mrs. Avery Staton of Salisbury, Md.; Mrs. Ruth Staton Carpenter of Marshville, N. C.; Admiral Staton of Washington, D. C.; Miss Sally Staton of Tarboro, N. C.; Dr. Mary Lois Staton of E.C.T.C., and her sister, Janie Bradford of Davidson, N. C.; Katherine and William Staton of London, England.


The Author

John Samuel Staton born April 15, 1907 at Burnsville School in Anson County, North Carolina, United States of America. (U.S. flag then only had 45 stars, the Panama Canal was not open, the model T Ford was not on the market, and Theodore Roosevelt was president of the United States.) In 1911 My father, Uriah Charlie Staton, sold our place and moved near Cedar Grove Baptist Church in Anson County. In November of 1914 I entered Diamond Hill School; ran away three times the first day (had not learned to defend myself.) August 1919, I walked four miles east to Red Hill Baptist Church; joined this church and was baptized in Lanes Creek at Ramsey Mill (old Staton Mill.) As a child my favorites were fruits, (we grew lots of fruit) flowers, fishing, history, and swimming. (Wilson Flake, now U.S. Ambassador to Ghana, occasionally went swimming with us.) Game was plentiful. During the winter I caught a rabbit in a box almost every second night. Many times I have seen wild geese fly over our home in various formations (usually V shaped.) I often saw wild turkey and fox walking through our wheat and corn fields. Timber was plentiful; we often cut large pine trees and burned them in order to clear more land for farming. My mother who was Nannie Adale Hall from Badin (daughter of Thomas Hawkins Hall, a civil war veteran C.S.A.) helped the nine children farm while my father worked away as a skilled carpenter. A rag doll named Betsy, a tricycle, a small wagon, and a pet cat were my earlist playthings. Among my first school teachers were: Miss Bauna Thomas (Now in Washington, D.C.), Miss Alto Lee Thomas (Now Mrs. Claude Albea of Charlotte, N.C.) a Mr. Hambert from Penn. and Polkton, N.C.; (many adults thought the world was flat until he proved they were in error.) Pansy Staton of Wadesboro; J.Boyd Griffin of Unionville, N.C.; Walter Davis of Peachland, N.C.; Isa Martin of Burnsville (blind; great math teacher), Miss Hessie Seabrook, of Charleston, S.C. (excellent seventh grade teacher), and others.

In March of 1920 I helped dig graves at old Cedar Grove Church because of the influenza epidemic. Diamond Hill school was converted into a hospital, and many of my class mates died there.

In 1920 my father moved us to a farm of about 100 acres in Anson County near Fountain Hill Methodist Church (about 4 miles north of Peachland, N.C.) father died there in 1932 and my mother in 1956. From 1924 through May 1930 I was in boarding school at Wingate high school and Junior College. (1921-2-3 at Cribbs Creek school; and 1924 at Burnsville school-drove a horse that year.) I played left tackle on the football team the six years at Wingate and never had time called, and was never knocked out; won two medals there; called to the Baptist ministery there in 1929 and have done supply work since then. Some of my teachers at Wingate were: C.C. Burris (still there), J. B. Huff of Mars Hill, R.L. Poplin, C.M. Beach of Leaksville; Dr. A.F. Hendricks (still there); Rev. Coy Muckle, Carter Preslar and C.E. Lancaster-coaches, and others. In the summer of 1929 I worked in General Motors plant in Detroit Michigan with Harry E. Love of Davidson, N.C.; and boarded with Henry Rushing (city of Detroit policeman; Rural policeman in Ansonville, N. C.) In the summer of 1930 I worked as assistant steward in the Cliff House Hotel in Manitou Springs, Colorado and set the second worlds record climbing Pikes Peak on the night of July 23, 1930, snow seven inches deep and I lost 25 pounds on the climb. November 1, 1930 I became principal of Beasleys Grove school at Berson, N.C. and married Allene Beasley there March 21, 1931: our only child, Betty Ann, died in infancy August 20, 1943 and is intombed in the Sharon Memorial Mausoleum in Charlotte, N.C. I attented Appalachian Teachers College at Boone, N.C. from 1932 through 1934, graduated in May 1934 with B.S. degree in History and Education. Taught, coached athletics, mostly as Rural Principal for fifteen years. part of three summers at U.N.C. working toward M.A. and P.H.D. in history, and American Diplomacy but stopped in 1948 to go into insurance business which paid much more than the teaching profession. Some schools where I was principal: Beasleys Grove in Johnston County at Benson, N.C.: Stephenson School at Monroe, N.C.; Weddington School at Monroe, N.C.; Jackson High School at Monroe, N.C.; Beulah School at Monroe, N.C.; Herring

High School at Clinton, N. C.; taught and coached at Angier High School three years (managed the Semi-Professional baseball team there and started Tommy Bryne). Coached Alexander Graham, school of Charlotte, N. C., to a perfect season in 1945. Traveled about four million miles for Atlantic Greyhound and other bus companies. Was agent at Carolina Motor Club in Charlotte, N. C., for six years. Have been in insurance work for the past ten years, and still do much supply work in various churches. Hold membership in: American Camellia Society: Charlotte Men's Camellia Society: North Carolina Camellia Society: American Orchid Society; Knights Templar; Prelate and Chaplain seven years in Charlotte York Rite Bodies; Shriner in Oasis Temple: Member of Phalanx Masonic Lodge: Member of Azusa Grotto: Historian for Mecklenburg Historical Association; Member of Union County Historical Association; Secretary for Mecklenburg Unit of Wingate College Alumna Association; Past Sec .- Treasurer for the Angier Lyons International; Member of American Automobile Association: National Association of Mutual Insurance Agents; and a Member of Wingate Missionary Baptist Church where I am also an ordained Minister, and do supply work in that area.

CHAPTER 1

ETYMOLOGY (beginning) OF THE NAME STATON

The name Staton is derived from STAUNTON and dates back to the early Middle Ages. According to tradition we are told they are of Teutonic or Norman origin and served in the armies of Charlemagne, the worlds greatest ruler from the 5th to the 15th century, who lived from April 2, 742 or 743 until January 28, 814, (according Encyclopæedia Britannica 1947 edition pages 256 and 259.) Charlemagne ruled over Western Germany, Northern Italy, Northern Spain, Austria, Holland, Switzerland, France, Belgium, part of Jugoslavia, and part of Czecho-Slovakia. After 814 A.D. there was a change in the Coat of Arms and apparently the Stauntons returned to the Northern part of present day France known as Normandy near the present city of CAEN. This year I was informed by AIR-FRANCE officials there were Staton and Staunton families still living in and near Caen France. referred me to the Lord Mayor of Caen for more details. According to letters in 1957 from the American Embassy there were no one by name Staton in Paris but six families lived in London England. In August of 1957 I visited the studio of the late W. E. Hennessee in Salisbury, N. C. (he died since then) and he had sketched the Staton Coat of Arms for our family about twenty years earlier. He was well informed and his work was approved by many Heraldic societies in England, and America, Historical societies, book companies and map companies. I purchased several sets of books and maps from him including a five volum "History of England" by Macculay, a fifteen volum set of VTHE ANCESTOR printed in 1902 by Archibald Constable and Company LTD of Westminster S.W., Whitehall Gardens.

As Mr. Hennessee was in the process of retiring, I purchased many other valuable Heldric materials and received helpful advice from him, because he had visited all the countries of the world many times; early as a merchant seman and many times later gathering historic material. When we first observe the written name Staunton

the family only used the last name and no first names, but many years later it became necessary to also use from one to four first names. (I know a family of Statons in Saluda, N. C., who have all used four first names for five generations on all written records; which may prove valuable some day.)

According to the Old French the name Staunton was composed of two parts "staunt," meaning firm or strong; and "ton" meaning a low hill. Consequently the name perhaps refers to some ancient family stronghold upon a hill before coming to England. The name may be found in DOMESDAY and in RAGMAN'S ROLL which are the books containing the earliest census of England. DOMESDAY was written in French in two volumes under the direction of William The Conqueror in the year 1086 containing every item every Englishman had and has never been fully translated. It also contained every thing given to the Normans and all names of every family living in or just arriving in England; they all were required to pay tax.

The Staunton family went to England in the army of William The Conqueror. This is proven by various sources of which some are listed in the bibliography at the end of this chapter. They had their coat of arms (listed elsewhere in this book) and the two mottos the first in French (under the shield) "EN DIEU MA FOY" meaning, "my faith is in God." This shows French origin. The second motto "MODERATA DURANT" in Latin, meaning "Moderation Is Difficult," written above the shield was not added until 1451 in England.

Please permit me to pause here and pay tribute to William Henry Stanton of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who wrote the Stanton history in 1922, called OUR ANCESTORS THE STANTONS and printed by Innes and Sons of Philadelphia containing 592 pages, well illustrated. I did not know about the book until this year (1959), I read part of it in the North Carolina State Library (not Archives) in Raleigh, N. C., (wish I could purchase a copy). It has a different coat of arms, but has the same mottos as the Staton coat of arms, and the writer suggested that it is possible they also originated from Staunton; he gives a long discussion on the various possibilities of different origins. Consequently Staton and Stanton perhaps both originated from STAUNTON; I believe they did, but the two names seem

never to have been confused in America. However, Staton, Staten, and Stayton have always been confused here. Over three hundred times I have found Staten used for Staton when they were my direct ancestors in North Carolina; often on monuments; and three of my third cousins in Tennessee (Johnson City) used Staten almost fifty years, but recently discovered the error and changed back to Staton. A book of research could be written on etomology of the name Staton.

CHAPTER II

FROM NORMANDY TO ENGLAND

The stage of Europe appeared to be well set for the Normans to conquer England. Edward the Confessor spoke French and employed many Frenchmen to serve in various places in England because the Normans appeared to be well civilized and a distinguished people. Edward was brought up in Normandy, but married Edith who was the daughter of Godwin (an earl and minister for Edward). Godwin and his family became jealous of the large number of Frenchmen entering the royal service of England and caused trouble. He and his sons Swegen, Tostig, and Harold left England. Harold was shipwrecked in 1063 near the French coast, captured by the Normans and forced to swear support for William of Normandy in his designs to rule England. During the confusion William visited Edward in England. and perhaps Edward made an oral promise for William to become King of England when Edward's reign ended. Perhaps they discussed the fact that William's great-aunt Emma was Edward's mother. England was weak and William was twentyfour years of age, strong, and becoming well established in Normandy. After much confusion Godwin worked and tricked his way back to England, and influenced the last fifteen years of Edward's rule. During this time Edward's son, Tostig, had gone to Norway and arranged for Hardrada to help him get control of England. In January of 1066 Edward died and named his son, Harold, as his successor; he was crowned.

Harold knew his brother Tostig and Harold Hardrad of Norway might attack from the north and William of Normandy might attack from the east. So, Harold kept many English farmers out of their fields in training and waiting until August.

William of Normandy, 1028 - 1087 A.D. was the son of Arletta (daughter of a tanner of Falaise), and the late Robert, Duke of Normandy. Robert went on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in 1034. "Having no legitimate son, he induced the Norman barons to acknowledge William as his successor. They kept their engagement when Robert died on his journey (1035), though the young duke-elect was a mere boy." Encyclopaedia Britannica 1947, P. 609. Later William married Matilda whose father was Baldwin V, of present day Belgium. Matilda traces her female line to Alfred the Great.

"By way of penance William and his wife founded the abbeys of St. Stephen and the Holy Trinity of Caen," Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1947, P. 609. William soon corrected some rebellious problems in his French Province and made formal application for the British Crown, while he prepared an invasion force to take it. received neutral approval of Henry IV, and Pope Alexander II, and arranged for Tostig and an army from Norway to hit England from the north while English farmers were at home gathering their crops; so the Normans could land on the eastern shore (by sail boats) and strike England near Hastings. The plan worked. Harold of England killed his brother Tostig, and Harold Hardrada of Norway at Stamford Bridge, and defeated their armies the last week in September of 1066. Two days later Harold received news that William of Normandy with a large, well trained army had landed at Pevensey near Hastings and were taking England from the east. Immediately Harold marched the English Army over 200 miles to London and enlisted every person they could get to march against William of Normandy who was approaching near Hastings. two earls Marcar and his brother Edwin with their followers refused to cooperate. Therefore, Harold left them in haste and marched the English Army against the Norman Army on the hill of Senlac, October 14, 1066, about seven miles from Hastings. I have read over thirty books about the Battle of Hastings and perhaps there have been more than a hundred written on the subject; each one differing. There were perhaps many Englishmen in the Norman Army who had been banished from England or left of their own accord, but we cannot prove their names. According to the records the Stauntons were heading a batallion of mounted knights in the battle, and were promised a stone castle and some land if the Normans won. If the entire DOMESDAY BOOK is ever translated, we may know the names of nearly all those who were with The Conqueror. There were about fifty thousand in his army of which five thousand were knights. The English were foot-soldiers armed with javelins and battle-axes, while the Normans were archers and mounted knights on horseback. Both

armies used shields. At nine o'clock on the morning October 14, 1066, the Norman Army about one mile long struck the English, and at three o'clock in the afternoon the English lines were still solid. During this time William of Normandy had three horses killed while he rode in the attack, and he had slain with his hands Gyrth, who was an earl and brother to King Harold of England. At one point William was reported slain and his troops became desperate, but William removed his helmet and convinced them he was not hurt. William ordered a fake retreat. This set the English at ease and many of the freemen broke rank. Normans immediately returned and took the center of the flank in the stockade, but the earls still held their flanks. William's supplies were limited while the English had a supply line all the way to London (about 42 miles). At six o'clock on the same day William of Normandy ordered his strong archers to shoot their arrows at a high geometric angle over the English lines so the arrows would have a long fall straight down and pierce the heads of the English leaders. This worked and all the English leaders were soon killed: Harold himself being struck and killed at sun down. The Normans won the battle and William The Conqueror of Normandy was crowned William I, King of England on Christmas day. William I was accidently killed in 1087 at Nantes, France when his horse stumbled and fell on hot ashes as the town burned and he died September 9, and buried in St. Stephens at Caen, France, but his influence lasted over four hundred years in England and The Stauntons received large tracts of land for their services, located in Warmickshire, Nottingham (including Staunton Castle which is now Belvoir Castle and home for the Duke of Rutland pictured elsewhere in this history). They also received estates in Lincolnshire, Kentshire, and one branch moved to Scotland. Each family who received a castle passed the ownership of it to the oldest male child to keep the family name However, many years later the male line occasionally died out and the castles changed names.



CHAPTER III

STAUNTON to STATON

Very little is knownin America of the Stauntons from 1066 until 1451. According to our information here the Stauntons had been given Belvoir Castle near the south-east corner of Nottinghamshire (believed built by Robert de Todeni in the eleventh century). (Soon after 1700 this castle became the mansion of the Duke of Rutland). The Stauntons continued to pass ownership of Belvoir Castle down to the oldest boy in each family until 1451. On that year the present Staunton owner died and his oldest son and heir Sir Robert was in the English Navy. There were no steam ships or telegraph at that time. Consequently, it was several weeks before Sir Robert Staunton was informed that he was to assume ownership of Belvoir. During this time Sir Robert's sisters and brother Henry decided to take over the ownership of the castle. This was not according to custom because if a lady should gain possession of the castle and marry some one of a different name then the name of the castle might be changed. When Sir Robert returned from sea he again explained this condition, but the explanation was not accepted. Sir Robert, after much pleading and reasoning, took the UN out of the center of his name and became Staton. We are informed he kept ownership of the castle. (Although it is out of the name today.) Sir Robert Staton then changed the coat of arms by placing a bordure (wavy vine or sea shape) wavy on the right and left side of the coat, to represent the sea because he was an admiral in the fleet. He also placed a motto above the coat in Latin "Moderata Durant" meaning "Moderation is difficult" or it is hard to force yourself to do right even if it hurts. The French (original) motto is under the shield and reads "En Dieu Ma Foy" meaning my faith is in God. The colors: CREST is a fox statant proper (natural grey color). ESCUTCHEON argent (silver) two chevrons sable (black within a bordure engrailled (with wayy edges) of the last (black). Silver was the color faithfulness.

The fox is the symbol of intelligence. Black was the color of sobriety. The Chevron was shaped on a saddle and represents the mounted knight and two Chevrons represented a batallion of knights.

There are many Stauntons in England today and in France who hold important positions and are very highly respected, and we have many in the United States whom I believe organized Staunton, Illinois, Staunton, Indiana, and Staunton, Virginia. I am in correspondence with several prominent Statons in other countries and the United States today.

CHAPTER IV

FROM ENGLAND TO AMERICA

John Staton married Anne Matthews, daughter of John Matthews, at Stratford-On-Avon in Warwickshire England in the year 1665 A.D. In 1666 John and Anne moved to Pennsylvania near the head waters of the Mispillion River which is now about four miles southwest of the present city of Milford, Delaware. after the Revolutionary, War, Delaware was formed from the three southern counties of Pennsylvania and part of Maryland.) It appears John brought his two brothers Joseph and Simion Staton with him, and Anne Matthew's family: and perhaps other friends and relatives, but we cannot at present be sure of their names. called their community Statonville (later Nehemiah) Staton changed it to Staytonville, as it appears on Delaware maps today). The reason for the change in spelling was to prevent Scotchmen and Irishmen from calling them Stattan. The Y worked so well the northern Statons left it in their names, but the southern group did not need it and consequently left it out.

Please permit me to pause here and give credit to Mrs. Avery John (Naomia) Staton of 139 Louise Avenue, Salisbury, Maryland, who spent all her spare time (and more) in the last two years doing research in Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, and Eastern Shore, Virginia, where Stayton and Staton were confused.

Many times I have seen the name Staton spelled three or four ways on one deed. Therefore, some of this Staton History will have a variety of spelling. However, they are the same people. Perhaps the early Statons found life difficult and short in America. For that reason, I believe, they used the same first names too often in order to continue their first name in future years. John, Joseph, James, Thomas, and other names were repeated so often before 1790, it has become impossible to know which John a document had reference to when three or more were living then and no date of birth, or wife's last name was known.

I cannot prove this, but I believe our original John Staton, who married Anne Matthews in England 1665 and came to America in 1666, died early because we do not find his will or other mention of him, unless he was the John who signed a few deeds as witness much later.

However, the John who signed these later records is believed to be the son of the original John Staton who married in 1665. Example: This John Staton (perhaps son of original) made his will in Kent County, Pennsylvania, on December 25, 1772. If this were the original John Staton who married in 1665 (age about 21), he would be 128 years of age when this will was made. A photostat of this will is located elsewhere in this book.

The original John had one son whose Will appears here - James Staton:

WILL OF JAMES STATON - 1742

Being the twenty seventh day of July 1742, James Staton of Dorchester County in the province aforesaid being sick of Body but of good and perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same therefore calling to mind the mortality of my Body I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following:

Impremis: I constitute my well beloved wife Ester Staton my sole executor of all my moveables.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my oldest son Joseph Staton one tract of land called Hazard containing sixty acres likewise one called Good Will containing fifty acres Likeways one tract called Statons Folly containing twenty-four acres and likewise one tract called Addition to Hazard containing twenty-three acres to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my second son James Staton one tract of land called Statons Lott containing one hundred and fifty-seven acres to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my third son Thomas Staton one tract of land called Chance containing ninety acres to him and his heirs forever but it is my will and desire that if the said Thomas dies without issue that my first son John should have the above ninety acres of land to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my fourth son Nehemiah one tract of land called Lott, containing forty-one acres and likewise one tract called hog grade containing sixty seven acres to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son John, one negro girl called? and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my sixth son Charles Staton one negro girl called Plesont and her increase to him and his heirs forever. Item: I give my well beloved wife Ester Staton her full dowery that is to say the third of all my land and moveables the remainder to be equally divided amongst my sons and daughters, constituting my above said wife Ester Staton my whole and sole executrix of this my last will and testament. Revoking, renouncing and disanulling of all other former wills or testaments heretofore by me made. Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this day and year above written.

An account of James Stayton and Esther Stayton his wife. Liber 20 Page 204

The account of Esther Stayton Executrix of James Stayton Late of Dorchester County, Deceased: This accountant charges herself with the deceased estate etc. Representatives of the accountants: Joseph, James, Thomas, Mary, Nehemiah, Anne, Bevins, Jehu, Rebecca, Charles, Sarah, - children of the deceased.

Jacob Stayton 1786 of Dorchester County bought all of that parcel of land called Mary's Adventure lying in Somerset County, Maryland in Vienna Marsh.

Therefore we believe James Staton whose will was made in Dorchester County Maryland in 1742 and perhaps John Staton (whose will was made December 25, 1772, in Kent County, Pennsylvania) and perhaps Warrington Staton, Sr. (whose will was proved March 31, 1761) are the only children of the original John Staton and Anne Matthews who survived and had descendants. However, we have one descendent who believes Warrington Staton (Will 1761 Accomack County, Virginia) is a grandson of Joseph Staton (of land ownership deed 1687 in Somersett County, Maryland). This Joseph and the original John were brothers. Hon. George Walter Staton, late, of Houston, Texas, who made several trips to Maryland and Pennsylvania, and Joseph Lewis Staton (now living at 570 West 10th Avenue in Eugene, Oregon), both agree with my original idea of the three sons of the original John Staton. They both worked on this history. The attorney, George Walter, worked on it from 1914 until death in 1945. We list here a deed of Joseph Staton which I have a photostat copy elsewhere in this history.

DEED OF JOSEPH STATON 1687

This Indenture made the ninth day of November in the XIIth year of the Rt. Honorable Charles absolute Lord & Prop. of the Provinces of Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore and in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred eighty seven between Joseph Staton of Pocomoke in Somersett County in the Province of Maryland, planter, and Jane his wife on the one part and Samuel Collins of the same place, County and Province, bricklayer on the other part Wittnesseth that the above said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife for the consideration of six thousand pounds of

Tobacco paid by the above named Samuel Collins before the ensealing and delivery hereof whereof and wherewith the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife do acknowledge themselves fully and wholly satisfied and paid and do of and for every part and parcel thereof acquitt and discharge the said Samuell Collins his heirs executors and admrs. forever by these presents have given granted bargained sold enfeofed and confirmed and doe by these presents absolutely give graunt allienate bargaine sell enfeofe and confirme unto the said Samuell Collins and to his heires and assignes forever one parcell of land scituate lieing and being on the east side of Chesepeake Bay on the North side of Pocomoke river bounded as followeth beginning at a marked dead pine standing on the edge of a marsh from thence with a line drawne North one hundred perches from thence with a line drawne West three hundred and twenty perches from thence with a line drawne South one hundred perches and from thence with a line drawne East to the first bounder containing two hundred acres being part of three hundred acres of land formerly graunted unto Jenkin Price and then called the Kings Neck under the great Seale used in the said Province of Maryland for granting of lands there bearing date at the City of St. Maries the 24th day of February Anno Dom. one thousand six hundred sixty five and also one other parcel of land joining to former bounder as followeth beginning at the above said marked pine and from thence running east by south thirty five perches to a cedar post marked with sixteene notches from thence with a line drawne Northeast a quarter of a point Northerly by side of a marsh now in the tenure of the aforesaid Samuel Collins one hundred and fourteen perches to a small gutt from thence with a line drawne South eighty one degrees Westerly bounded by the said gutt one hundred and twelve perches to a marked gum standing in a slash at the head of the said gutt and from thence with a line drawne to the first bounder containing thirty acres being part of a parcell of land called the late discovery granted to John Robins of Somersett County under the Great Seale used in the said Province of Maryland as above said for six

hundred acres bearing date at the City of St. Maries the 15th day of February Anno Dom 1685 which said two parcells of land containing two hundred and thirty acres the above named Joseph Staton became possessed of by virtue of a certain deed of Indenture made unto him by Hugh Marnix late of Somersett County in the Province above said duly executed and enrolled. have and to hold the said two parcells of land containing two hundred and thirty acres as above said called the "Rich Neck" together with all the buildings houses orchards fences rights proffitts priviledges writings comodities hereditaments to the said parcells of land or any part or parcell thereof in any wise belonging or appertaining unto him the said Samuell Collins and to his heires and assignes forever to the only proper use and behoofe of the said Samuell Collins and his heires and assignes forever without any mortgage redemption or limitation to recall or alter change or determine the same to be holden of the said Lord Propey for and under such rents and services limitations and exceptions as by the severall respective originall deeds of grant reserved for the said lands is excepted and reserved; and the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife doe forever acquitt and discharge the same parcells of land above said before by these presents bargained and sold unto him the said Samuell Collins with theire and either of their right members and appurtenances of and from all manner of other and former bargaines grants sales forfeitures dowries joyntures surrenders and of and from all other titles incumbrances claimes and demands of the said Joseph Staton or Jane his wife or theire heires or assignes and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever the above named Joseph Staton and Jane his wife will forever warrant and defend by these presents alsoe the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife for themselves theire heires executors and admrs. do covenant graunt and promise from time to time and at all times during the space of five years next ensueing the date hereof at and upon the request and at the cost and charges in lawe of the said Samuell Collins his heires and assignes to make doe performe acknowledge suffer or cause to be made done performed or acknow-

ledged all and every such further lawfull and reasonable act and acts assurances and conveyances in the law for the better and more perfect sure makeing and conveying all and singular the before hereby granted or mentioned to be granted premisses with theire and every of theire rights members and appurtenances to the onely proper use and behoofe of the said Samuell Collins his heires and assignes forever as the said Samuell Collins or his heires or their councell learned in the law shall be devised advised or required. In Confirmacon and full assurance of the truth above written the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife have to these presents set theire hands and fixed there seales giving deed and state with full and peaceable possession by livery of seizing of and in the above mentioned premisses with the appurtenances thereunto belonging as the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife theire subscripcons fixeing theire seales and the wittnisses subscripcons as testimoneys doe manifest the day and year first above written. Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of John Ffreeman Joseph Staton (Seale) Edmund Howard Jane Staton (Seale)

Memorandum that this day to witt the ninth day of November in the XIIth year of the Dominion of the Rt. honeble Charles Lord Baltimore &c over Maryland Anno Dom. one thousand six hundred eighty seaven before Coll William Coulbourne & Mr. William Brereton two of his (Lopps) Justices for Somesett County in the Province of Maryland came Joseph Staton and Jane his wife in theire proper persons and ye said Jane being by said Justices alone and secretly examined according to the forme of a certain act of Assembly in y case made and provided did acknowledge the lands mentioned in the within written Indenture conteining two hundred and thirty acres called the Rich Neck to be the right of him the within named Samuell Collins as those which the said Samuell Collins hath of the guift of them the said Joseph Staton and Jane his wife and for them and theire heires and the heires of y SAID Jane have remised and

and made quitt claime thereof to the said Samuell Collins and his heires forever and further the said Joseph Staton and Jane have granted for them and theire heires and all and every the heires of the said Jane that the said land within mentioned unto him the said Samuell and his heires against them the said Joseph Staton and Jane and theire heires will warrant forever and for this acknowledgment quitt claime and agreement the said Samuell Collins hath given them the said Joseph Staton and Jane six thousand pounds of Tobacco.

We have found new evidence since writing the first part of this chapter which may prove Joseph Staton and the original John Staton were not brothers, but Joseph was the son of John (the original), and Joseph had a son Joseph, and the second Joseph had a son Warrington whose will was made in 1760 and proven in 1761.

The first Joseph could have been born to the original John in 1666, and married in 1687 (age 21), and died in 1710 (his son, Joseph, settled his estate that year).

The Virginia Historical Society published in 1951 a two volume book, called VIRGINIA'S EASTERN SHORE, a History of Northampton and Accomack Counties by Ralph Whitelaw and edited by George Corrington Mason in which he identifies the lands grants on the Eastern Shore by number on a map and traces the ownership from the original patent to the present day.

On page 1264 he lists the first Staton deed and its subsequent ownership among the Statons thus: "Richard Lee sold to Joseph Staton in 1715, 200 acres of A 147. A 147 land that was located on the Chesapeake Bay side of the Peninsula between Temperanceville and Hallwood. No disposition by him was found, but it is believed that a son, Warrington, inherited it. His wife (Catherine) left to a son, Joseph. In 1789 Joseph and Scarburgh Staten sold the 200 acres to Jabez Pitt, Attorney." This is verified by Accomack County Wills and Deeds. The first Accomack County Staton whose estate appears in the record is Joseph Staton's estate administered to his son, Joseph, March 6th, 1710, Accomack County, Virginia, Court Orders Book 1710 - 14, page 16.

There were no State Land Grants to Statons in Accomack County, Virginia, or in Northampton County, Virginia. Therefore, the Statons (Joseph, Warrington, and others) there came from Pennsylvania (later Delaware) and Maryland. Joseph Staton and his wife, Jane, are the first Statons that we have a written record of there, proving they were in Accomack County, Virginia.

John Staton was named as one of the executors of Thomas Stockley's Will made on May 1, 1719, Accomack County Wills, Deed, etc., Book 1715-1729, Volume 1, page 244. If this is the original John Staton, he is then age 75 years old.

According to WILLS AND ADMINISTRATIONS, ACCOMACK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, 1663-1800 by Statton Nottingham (2 Vol. in 1931) a Thomas Welbourne, (and perhaps Daniel Welbourne also) were perhaps ship owners and often brought many passengers from England. A John Staton and forty-eight others were brought to America March 18, 1690. (This is not the original John Staton.) The above account does not tell us much more; it appeared that Welbourne and each passenger received some land for the trip. was advised in Richmond Research the passengers got 200 acres each. A Will made May 18, 1733, by Daniel Welbourne of Accomack County, Virginia, refers to a moiety (usually $\frac{1}{2}$) between Thomas Stayton and wife, Elizabeth, and Welbourne's sons concerning ownership of Asateague Island; Will Book 1729-1737, page 299. Thomas Staton had

had several other land deals with the Welbournes.

We often read of two brothers coming to America and each taking a different Westerly exodus. The two Statons did not do this. They stayed on the Eastern Shore, but their descendants went in all directions, some are still there. The following chapters explain this.

CHAPTER V

PENNSYLVANIA TO NORTH CAROLINA

(John Staton of 1644 to John Staton of 1959) 315 YEARS

It seems best to outline the Staton families from the first in America to the author, in order for others to more easily trace their connections. After this is done we will go back to the Eastern Shore and trace out other lines.

John Staton (Born in England about 1644)

I have become sympathetic with our original John Staton. Perhaps born near Shakespeare's home in Warwickshire England, at Stratford-On-Avon about 1644. Married Anne Matthews in Warwickshire in 1665. John was then perhaps age 21. The next year they moved to what is now Staytonville, Delaware. This area had been ruled (earliest) by a tribe of the Aborigines Indians (Leni-Lenape) stock; much later called Delaware Indians.

In 1609 Henry Hudson explored this area for the Dutch. The next year Lord De la Warr came there and England named the area for him. Then came the Dutch West India Company about 1631. Then about this time came people from Sweden. In 1633 Germans were arriving Soon after 1640 those from Sweden bought out the Dutch members. The Finns were arriving in 1641. About 1654 the Swedes took over from the Dutch. In 1655 the Dutch took over from the Swedes. In 1663 the city of Amsterdam took over. In 1664 the English took over. In 1673 the Dutch took over. In 1674 the English took over through the Duke of York (becoming James II later).

In 1682 the Duke of York leased this area (most of present Delaware) to William Penn (on a debt to Penn's late father) for a period of 10,000 years (correct number). Later Maryland protested this short lease and tried to claim Delaware, but Penn appointed a Deputy Governor for most of the area in 1691. It was again united with Pennsylvania in 1693. In 1710 the lower counties had a separate council and legislature in 1704. During this time the Governor of Pennsylvania was chief executive and continued until 1776, when the name Delaware State was accepted.

I suppose John Staton was confused. We are told he owned rich land, but we do not find the deeds or wills. Perhaps they were worn out by so many governments changing the registrations so often.

James Staton (Born perhaps in 1666)

James Staton whose wife was named Ester (last name unknown), perhaps did not have to endure the confusion of his father and mother, John Staton and Anne Matthews. James was too early for the Revolutionary War. He did leave a Will (copy on page 11), and six sons and perhaps some daughters; they were not mentioned in his Will (daughters); they might have been well-married. A Will of one Esther Staton is listed following the Will of James, but we cannot be sure whether she was widow of this or another James Staton, since there were others near this time. had a son, James, (this widow does give names of girls and boys in her will). The first James here made his will in Dorchester County, Maryland (boundries have changed) in 1742. Perhaps he was age 75 and died four months later. The will was made March 7, and recorded July 27, 1742. It appears his son, Nehemiah, went to, or remained at Johnstown (St. Johns Town Methodist Church), which is about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles southwest of Staytonville, Delaware. This is at intersection of Delaware highways 16 and 36; or in sight of U.S. Highway # 13 (east side) and opposite of the city of Greenwood, Delaware. I have been there several times recently, and believe the readers of this history will desire to see it. The church is in good condition, and much in use. There is a large cemetary and most of the graves are carefully marked. I photographed some of

the graves (pictures elsewhere in this history).

These were found in Archives in Dover, Delaware: RODNEY'S DIARY AND OTHER DELAWARE RECORDS by C. H. B. Turner, page 51. Lewes, Delaware published ALLEN, LANE, AND SCOTT Philadelphia in 1911, and quotes from BOOK OF JAMES STAYTON dated 1810.

"An ancient account of births of the Morriss family, the first mentioned Sarah Morriss was my grandmother, Nehemiah Stayton's wife. He was my grandfather. He named me after his father, old James Stayton, one of the first settlers about Saint Johns Town and they are buried near there on the old farm called "Staytons Conclusion" east side of the branch near where Thomas Curry now lives.

(The great grandson of the above Thomas Curry now lives on this farm, October 7, 1908 - added by C. H. B. Turner.)

Sarah Morriss, daughter of Beavens Morriss and Eliza, his wife, was born May 1, 1723 near Indian River with eight brothers and sisters - William, Rebecca, Elizabeth, Hannah, Biavans, Ann, Mary, Sidney - all born near Indian River.

Sarah Stayton, the aforesaid Sarah Morriss died September 8, 1796.

James Stayton, son of William Stayton and Sally,* his wife, was married to the amiable Miss Rachel Hays, daughter of Nathaniel Hays, Esq., and Rachel his wife on January 15, 1800.

James Stayton aforesaid was married to his second wife Elizabeth Peake,* daughter of Captain Louis Peake from old England and Elizabeth his wife on November 4, 1807. ("Neice to my first wife" - James Stayton)

William Hays Stayton, son of aforesaid James and Rachel his first wife, was married to Miss Nancy Griffith, October 17, 1822, daughter of Mr. Isaac Griffith and Eliza his wife.

BIRTHS: William Stayton, son of Nehemiah Stayton and Sarah his wife was born January 18, 1752, the year the style was altered.

Sarah Stayton, (called Sally above - N.R.S.)* wife of said William and daughter of Ephraim and Betty Vaughn, was born February 3, 1759.

My mother, the aforesaid Sarah Stayton, was born near Laurel or Broad Creek Wading place and was buried one (1) mile from Baltimore Town, but in 1811 I was in Baltimore Town and then the town extended nearly two hundred yards further out than where she was buried, the Union Bank now stands near the place. Doctor Elisha Perkins now lives on the premises and carries on a Starch factory at the springs.

DEATHS: Rachel Hays (presumably his first wife's mother - N.R.S.) aforesaid departed this life on September 10, 1831 and is buried beside her husband at Tea Town, which is now called Staytonville.

William Stayton aforesaid departed this life on Sunday, November 28, 1802, and is buried near the head of Nanticoke River near Middle-ford at his late dwelling place as was his last wish and their two last children which were twins. William died father of James (writer).

Sarah (called Sally) Stayton (Vaughn) aforesaid departed this life March 23, 1782. She is buried in Spicers Burying Ground near Baltimore Town, State of Maryland, under an apple tree eastward of the graveyard and westward of the springs. The land now belongs to the heirs of Capt. Iceland. She died full of faith and of the love of God.

BIRTHS: James Stayton, first son of William Stayton and Sarah Stayton his wife, was born October 30, 1775 near Saint John's Town.

Rachel Stayton, wife of said James and daughter of Nathaniel Hays and Rachel his wife, was born October 9, 1781 at Tea Town now called Staytonville. They were born 5 miles apart.

Sally Vaughn Stayton, first child of said James and Rachel Stayton, was born November 2, 1800, near Saint Johns Town in the same house and room where her father, said James, was born and where his great grandfather lived and died.

William Hays Stayton, second child of said James and Rachel was born October 3, 1802. John Collins, son of Andrew and Martha Collins, was born same night." Summary of James Staton's Book:

James Staton (lived at "Stayton's Conclusion" near Saint John's Town - buried there) was born about 1666 and died July 25, 1742, married Ester (last kame unknown).

Nehemiah Staton (son of James Staton) was born about 1710 and died about 1786 (age about 76) married Sarah Morriss, daughter of Beavens and Eliza Morriss, she was born May 1, 1723, and died September 8, 1796 (age 73). Nehemiah willed all to wife Sarah on August 25, 1786. (Nehemiah added a Y to Staton.)

William Stayton (son of Nehemiah and Sarah Morriss Stayton) was born January 18, 1752, and died November 28, 1802 (age 50), married Sarah (called Sally) Vaughn who was born February 3, 1759, died March 23, 1782. She was buried in Baltimore where Union Bank is. Dr. Elisha Perkins now lives and ownes Starch factory. Buried in Springs Spicers Burying Ground. William Stayton was a merchant who moved to Baltimore, Maryland, and sold his land to Cyrus Mitchell of Dorchester County, Maryland.

James B. Stayton (first son of William Stayton) was born October 30, 1775, and died May 22, 1851 (age 76). James was the writer of the book. He was in Kentucky, when William Stayton gave him deed in Dorchester County, Maryland, on June 13, 1798. He married Rachel Hays (first wife) born October 9, 1781, and died June 15, 1807. He married Elizabeth Peake (second wife, niece of his first wife) on November 4, 1807, she was the daughter of Capt. Louis Peake (of old England) and his wife, Elizabeth.

Sally Vaughn Stayton (first child of James B. and Rachel Hays Stayton - first wife) was born on November 2, 1800.

William Hays Stayton (second child of James B. and Elizabeth Peake Stayton) was born October 3, 1802, and married Nancy Griffith on October 17, 1822, daughter of Isaac Griffith and Eliza, his wife.

WILL OF WARNER P. STATON APRIL 22, 1853

"In the name of God, Amen, I Warner P. Staton of Worcester County in the State of Maryland being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my Worldly Affairs and thereby be the better Prepared to leave this world when it shall Please God

to call me Hence do therefore make and Publish this my Last Will and testament in manner and form following that is to say:

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God I and my body to the Earth to be buried by my friends that I may Leave in this world, then I Devise and bequeath as follows:

- 1st. I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife All My
 estate both real and Personal during her life
 and at her death to be sold and divided in the
 following manner that is to say:
- lst. The three children of George W. Staton namely,
 Mary Elizabeth Staton, Georgiana Staton, and
 Alice Clare Staton I give and bequeath the one
 seventh Part of the estate both Real and Personal
 left at my wife's death to be equally divided
 between the three above named children, share
 and share about, to them and their heirs forever.
- 2nd. I give and bequeath up unto my daughter Elizabeth M. Sirmon one seventh part of my estate at the death of my wife to her and her heirs forever.
- 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my son John W. Staton the one seventh part of my estate that may be left at my wife's death to him and his heirs forever.
- 4th. I give and bequeath unto my son Robert T. Staton the one seventh part of my Estate left at my wife's death to him and his heirs forever.
- 5th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah A. Staton the one seventh part of my estate I left at my wife's death to her and her heirs forever.
- 6th. I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel J. Staton the one seventh part of my estate left at my wife's death to him and his heirs forever.
- 7th. I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph L. Staton the one seventh part of my estate left at my wife's death to him and his heirs forever.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the twenty-second day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and fifty-three."

This cut was made from an original painting by Florian Komorowski, of Staytonsville. The old edifice was recently form down and the graveyard adjacent cleaned up. The writer of this caption's mother attended the first service ever held at Lebanon in 1873 at the age of 7 years.

The will on the preceding page (p. 26) and following record is placed here to show the STAYTONS in Delaware were living during the continuation of STATONS in Maryland and parts of Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and North Carolina.

The Warner P. Staton, just mentioned in the will, apparently is the son of Thomas Staton; grandson of Warrington Staton whose will was made in 1760 on December 5, in Accomack County, Virginia.

Motive for above: Thomas Staton above had a sister, Sophia, who married (second) to ISACC WARNER. They died without heirs and left heir property to her brother Thomas (son of Warrington Staton). Perhaps, this was done to continue the WARNER name; their descendants on the EASTERN SHORE think this did happen. Since most of the Staton's in America started in this area, it seems wise here to show another line from origin to present day in Salisbury, Maryland.

"I. Thomas Staton of the County of Sufsex on Delaware yeoman being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament. This date, I resign my soul to God who gave it hopeing for Salvation through the merits of Jesus Christ I order my body to be decently interred and my Funeral charges and all other of my debts (Except what I gave to the Trustees of the Loan Officer of the Government.) to be paid out of my personal estate. I give unto my beloved wife one equal third part of all my lands and etc. to have, hold and enjoy during all her natural life. I give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife. I give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife to her and her heirs and assign forever my negro man named Daniel, as also beds, furniture etc. and my mare Lib, a bridle and a woman's saddle etc. give and bequeath unto my son, Hill Staton, to his heirs and assign forever all that parcel or tract of land, premises, whereon I now live situate in Broadkell Hundred in the said County of Sussex which I purchased of Amora Layadon of the estate etc. containing 227 acres more or less including all within the bounds mentioned in the said deed together with all the houses etc. I give and bequeath unto my son, Thomas Staton, and to his heirs forever all that parcel of land and premises containing two hundred forty acres joining North East on the above mentioned tract of land, that is to say all the lands, appurtenances with the houses, barns, edifice, fences, and etc. contained within the lines and boundaries mentioned in a deed of sale part of the said land from George Dodd to me etc. After my first

debts, segacies and funeral charges are paid as above said, I give and bequeath unto my five daughters (viz) Sabre, Hester, Anna, Tobitha, and Elizabeth and to their heirs and assign forever all the remainder of my personal estate to be equally divided between them. I appoint my two above said sons Hill and Thomas to be executors of this my last will and testament."

In the Dover Delaware Archives we find a will of Jehu Staton, December 25, 1772, Volume A 48, page 186, Liber L, Folio 125:

Exec.: Wife, Mary, and Jehu's brother, Nehemiah Heirs: Nephew, James Staton (son of my sister Rebecca Collings) said he; and Jehu Nowells (son of Jehu Staton's sister, Sarah Nowells.).

This above account proves that Jehu Staton was the son of the original James Staton and never put the Y in his last name, however, Jehu's brother "Nehemiah" did put the Y in his name. I visited the home of Mrs. William Caulk (formerly Miss Lula Marvel Staton, born in 1895) now living at 846 South State Street, Dover,

Delaware. She was the only Staton there not using a Y in last name, and I believe she was a descendent of Jehu Staton. Her father was Joseph Frank Staton (born March 4, 1861, died July 23, 1930) and he was the son of Rev. John Wesley Staton who lived around Harrington, Delaware: no dates. We write all this to prove the descendents of the original James Staton. Now we have accounted for two, namely Nehemiah and Jehu, and the next division of this book will concern their brother Thomas Staton who moved to North Carolina. (We are not sure what became of the other children of the original James Staton.) If the readers of this book find other connections from the originals on down, please mail the information to the author at the address in the front of this book (we own our home there), and we will try to write a supplement to this history very soon; I have tried so hard to find these links, but only this publication will show where they are.

CHAPTER VI

THOMAS STATON (IN NORTH CAROLINA)

Thomas Staton moved from Pennsylvania and Delaware, Maryland area to Halifax County, North Carolina. He was the son of James Staton (original) and grandson of John Staton and Anne Matthews, who came from Stratford-On-Avon England. Thomas received a Land Grant from the Earl of Granville on November 15, 1759 of 650 acres of land on Little Conneto Creek in Halifax County, North Carolina. The Grant is reproduced elsewhere in this history, and so is the Will made in 1769. In the Will he leaves over 1,500 acres of land. He is the great great great great grandfather of the author of this book and is also the great great great great grandfather of the author of this book. I am my own sixth cousin.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Ann Staton one hundred and forty acres of land joining my son Nehemiah Staton's line it being the lower part of that tract of land joining Mr. Jas. In. Williams line lying in the fork of Coneto to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Jesse Staton two hundred and twenty acres of land it being part of the land and plantation that I bought M. Henry Killin to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Sarah Staton one hundred and fifty acres of land joining my son Jesse Staton line Margaret Conoway & In. Joneses it being the remaining part of the said land that I had of Mr. Henry Killing to her and to her heirs forever.


William Almarine Staton was prosperous farmer of several hundred acres; well loved, born August 3, 1848 and died September 16, 1907, buried in private cemetery at Palmyra, N. C., near Scotland Neck, N. C. He was the son of Windfield D. Staton, Jr., and grandson of Winfield D. Staton, Sr., and great grandson of Col. Arthur Staton, great great grandson of Thomas Staton (Will 1769). Proof, will of Winfield D. Staton, Sr., Halifax County, N. C. July 6, 1854. William married Olivia -----, born March 27, 1854, died September 16, 1933. Descendants:

JAMES STATON (Son of EZEKIEL)

James Staton was the son of Ezekiel Staton, Sr. We are not sure of his wife's name. We do find James in the Will of Ezekiel probated November 12, 1815. We do not know all the children of James. We have letters from descendants in Martin County today, who say James had one son named McGilvery Moore Staton. His monument is photographed elsewhere in this book as follows:

There are many other graves in the "Staton and Biggs" cemetery located 2 miles west of Williamston on U. S. Highway # 17. The slaves were also buried there and the last pet dogs. It is the most beautiful cemetery I have seen, and covers several acres of land with beautiful camellias, roses, magnolias, and many other beautiful flowers. There is a large steel fence surrounding this park, and it is necessary to get permission from the Bank at Williamston to enter because \$30,000.00 was invested with them as a deed of trust for the up-keep of the property. I do not believe there is another male white Staton left in Martin County since the passing of James Grist Staton in 1946. He does have a nephew, Mr. Charles H. Godwin, Jr., who lives in Williamston and has much interest in the family. His mother was Louisa Staton, who married C. H. Godwin, Sr. She passed away May 3, 1906.

WILLIAM STATON (Son of EZEKIEL, SR.)

was low Baker had his slaves to take the carts and wagons and transfer the rich earth which had settled into the river. This was placed in furrows, as we place fertilizer in the fields today. It made the land productive and other people soon heard about it. From then on people did not desert their land as before. An account of this use is mentioned in the HISTORY OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY in 1919 by Turner and Bridgers. They mention H. L. Staton's work with marl in the fifties. Now we quote the message on Baker Staton's Monument:

"BAKER STATON
Son of
WILLIAM and ELIZABETH
STATON
Born May 25, 1804
Died May 26, 1866
Age 62 years and 1 day
Edgecombe is much indebted
to his skill and energy for
her advanced position in
improved agriculture.
He was a good man
a valuable citizen."

An abstract of Baker Staton's will or settlement was made at Tarboro, N. C. in 1959 by this author as follows: "Baker Staton to wife Jeanett Young and Baker's brother, Archabald. Dated in 1666 Book G, page 239. He also mentions niece Delah F. Mabrey (daughter of Charles Mabrey). Mentions land he owned in Lincoln County adjoining William Staton near Spring Hill Forge. Mentions nephew, William J. Staton. Mentions railroad stock, investments; hogs in Lincoln County etc. He had a good script. Was formerly a school teacher, and reared several nephews (one became a famous doctor, Dr. James McGill Staton)."

An old letter from Lucy Staton (sister of Dr. L. L. Staton) gives us some light on our record here. She tells of Bythel, Baker, Archibald, Annie and Jeanice being brothers and sisters. Baker was married, but never had children of his own. Bythel, Sr., married Elizabeth Cloman and some children were born and

Bythel died. Later his brother, Archibald, married Bythel's widow, and other children were born. Children listed were:

- 1. Bythel Staton, Jr.
- 2. John Staton (we believe this is William John Staton)
- 3. James McGill Staton (Baker reared and educated him)

We do not know what became of the girls Annie and Janice (I have tried so hard to locate them). I have just finished a long distance phone call to Greenville, N. C. to a granddaughter of Archibald Staton. Her name is Mrs. J. Roy Martin. She says Archibald Staton's wife (Elizabeth Cloman Staton) died, and he married Fannie Grimes. Two girls were born and one named Katie Baker Staton was the mother of this Mrs. J. R. Martin. Archibald Staton was 62 when Katie was born in 1878, and he died in 1880, and he and his first wife, Elizabeth are buried at Conahoe, N. C. in unmarked graves. Mrs. Martin has a sister which she will forward me news on at once. Katie Baker Staton married Joe Haislip from Hamilton, N. C., and they have six children all living. Mrs. J. Roy Martin (born April 28, 1908) now residing at 411 East 8th Street, Greenville, N. C. has two pieces of furniture from the old Archibald Staton family. They have three children whose names are:

I have written them two long letters and phoned.

The old letter from Lucy Staton of Tarboro, N. C., written about twenty-five years ago (she is sister to Dr. L. L. Staton) further states that her father was Henry Lafayette Staton and her grandfather was Redding Staton. We of course know that Redding Staton was the son of Ezekiel, and Ezekiel was the son of Thomas (Will 1769 at Halifax County).

This same letter said Kate Staton Parks, who was a Colonial Dame, was the granddaughter of Bythel.

Dr. James McGill Staton, son of Bythel, married Margaret Butler in 1866. James was born in 1827 at Tarboro, N. C., graduated from the University of New York at the age of 20, interned in Bellview Hospital in New York under Dr. Lawrence. Dr. James Staton and Margaret Butler, his wife, had the following ten children and grand-children:

We have written all the Statons we could find in directories in Texas trying to locate descendants of these above. We do not know where James McGill Staton went, but the old letter from Lucy, said the other Lucy (daughter of James McGill Staton lived in Texas). We are tempted to think all went to Houston, Texas, but we have not proven it. The last child in the above list

is George. We know from letters of several Statons in Houston and Fort Worth, that a George Staton graduated from the University of Kansas in 1914 and was a famous attorney and lecturer in Houston where he died single in 1945. His sister, Ida Estelle, died in Kansas about three years ago and a Ralph Slocum of Lincoln 8, Nebraska, (attorney) settled the estate since there were no heirs from George or his sister, Ida Estelle Staton. George had another sister: Etta Warden (wife of C. J. Warden of Lincoln Nebraska) who had a son named Carl Richard Eugene Warden, who was sought for three years as heir from his Aunt Ida Estelle Staton, but he was never found. So the estate was divided between nearest cousins of Ida Estelle Staton.

The same George Staton above visited Dr. L. L. Staton in Tarboro, N. C., and we have his picture made in front of the "Staton and Zoeller Drug Store" in 1920, one year before Dr. L. L. Staton died. Dr. L. L. Staton's daughter, Sallie B. Staton, still lives in Tarboro, N. C., and the Doctor's son retired, Admiral Adolphus Staton lives in Chevy Chase, Maryland (in edge of Washington, D. C.).

We know the George Walter Staton above was the son of George Harvey Staton and Sarah Elizabeth Hayes (an orphan). George Walter Staton had one uncle, Everett E. Staton, who has a grandson, E. E. Staton, now at 100 South 22nd Avenue, Hattiesburg, Mississippi, whom I have corresponded with recently. We believe there is (so does E. E.) a connection between the children of James McGill Staton born in Tarboro, N. C., and George Walter and E. E. Staton of Texas and Mississippi. Hope the readers of this history will write me in Charlotte (address in front of this history) and explain that connection.

We now turn to William John Staton (1777-1880), brother of James McGill Staton. William John moved from Tarboro to Morehead City, N. C., and reared thirteen children as follows:

By his first wife Gatsy A. Daniel who died October 5, 1857.

The first wife, Gatsy A. Daniel dies here in 1857. On March 18, 1858, William John Staton married Hulda Virginia STANTON (daughter of Washington Stanton), from La Grange. This name Stanton is not the usual Staton name. It is described in the early part of this history. The Statons and Stantons use the same motto their Coat of Arms, but seem never to be confused in America. Their history THE STANTONS OUR ANCESTORS is located in the State Library in Raleigh, N. C. They lived around Beaufort, N. C., Stantonsburg, N. C. and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where they wrote their history in 1919; they were Quakers. The Statons are mostly Baptist, Methodist, Episcopalians, and Presbyterians.

The children of William John Staton and Hulda Virginia Staton:

Dr. Alfred Frank Staton, a very prominent dentist, was born on January 19, 1873, and died December 28, 1933. He married Miss Jessie Moore of Morehead City, N. C., who was born November 1, 1888. She still resides at the same home in front of the hospital at Morehead City, N. C. Their Children:

John deserves much credit for his bravery in military service during World War II. I wish I had the details, but John does not enjoy relating them. He is now retired and owns a beautiful Florist at Beaufort, N.C. He loves flowers and fishing; hope to fish with him some day soon; he has two children:

We are still discussing descendants of Thomas Staton of Halifax County. We are proned to believe his brother, Joseph, from Delaware and Maryland, may have lived in Halifax during the seventeen-seventies and owned several farms in Martin County and Halifax County.

On February 7, 1782, Joseph Staton sells a plot of land in Martin County, N. C. to Ezekiel Staton; Book A, pages 378-379. On February 26, 1784, he sells Ezekiel 100 acres; Book A, page 437. On March 8, 1780, he sells John Rippen 100 acres; Book A, page 416. We did not find a will for Joseph Staton, but perhaps there is one in Martin County, N. C., unless he returned to Maryland.

BENJAMIN STATON - Edgecombe & Carteret County

Benjamin Staton appears to have been born and reared in Edgecombe County, N. C., served in the Mexican War in 1846 as a Lieutenant, perhaps a descendant of Thomas Staton. In 1869 he was elected Clerk of Court at Tarboro, N. C. We do not know his birth date or parents. The Williams and Griffin Abstracts do not mention him, except he is mentioned as a Second Lieutenant on page 246 in their book, BIBLE RECORDS OF EARLY EDGECOMBE. Benjamin is mentioned in a deed described below as going from the county of Edgecombe to Carteret. Two of his deeds at Beaufort follow:

DEED - BENJAMIN STATON - BEAUFORT, N. C. 1856

"This indenture made and entered into this the 20th day of February in year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifty six between J. P. Nevill of the County of Carteret & State of North Carolina of the one part & Benjamin Staton of the County of Edgecombe & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said J. P. Nevill for & in consideration of the sum of twenty-seven hundred dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given bargained sold & conveyed & by these presents doth give grant sell &

convey unto the said Benjamin Staton his heirs executors administrators & assigns in fee simple forever a certain tract or parcel of land situated lying & being in the County of Carteret aforesaid & on the west side of North River beginning on the west side of said River, then due west into the woods two hundred & forty six poles then south fifty five degrees, west one hundred & sixty eight poles then due East three hundred & ninety six poles to the said River then up said River to the first station which said tract of land was granted to Cornelius Kennedy by patent granted the 18th day of February 1738 afterwards sold by the Clerk & Master in Equity July 29th 1854 to the said J. P. Nevill also one other parcel or tract of land situated lying & being in the County of Carteret aforesaid being the eleven twelth part of Richard Hatckes patent patented the 18th day of December 1793 on the west side of North River beginning on the south side of the mouth of Norwoods Creek at the beginning corner of Anther Merrills land running up said Creek south eighty four degrees west ninety four poles to Benjamin Stanton's line then with said line south forty five degrees west three hundred & fifty poles to the corner then with another of his lines North forty five degrees west ninety four poles to the corner then with another of said Stantons lines North forty five degrees East two hundred & forty po. to Casnells line then with said line south eighty four degrees west two hundred & twenty poles to Jonathan Hellens line then with said line south two hundred & forty poles to the corner then south seventy degrees east one hundred & seventy poles two Wm. Thompson's north west corner, then with his line east three hundred & ninety five poles to North River, then up said River North twenty eight poles to Thomas Chews line, then with his said line west four hundred poles to the corner thence by another of said Chew's line & Arther Merills line north forty five degrees East to the beginning, being the lands sold by the Clerk & Master in Equity to the said J. P. Nevills containing six hundred acres more or less.

To have and to hold the premises herein mentioned to him the said Staton his heirs administrators & assigns in fee simple forever together with all the fixtures & appurtenances thereunto belonging. In witness whereof I hereunto affix my seal the day and date above written."

ORIGINAL LAND GRANTS TO N. C. - STATONS

The following "Land Grants" are listed here in order to understand where various Staton families settled. There may have been others with Staton spelled differently, but we tried to abide by the original as far as possible. The Secretary of State in Raleigh, N. C. keeps these in his office, which are available to the public by request. Occasionally a State continues to make Grants, but there is usually a small charge. Below are the oldest Grants: NORTH CAROLINA.

"THOMAS CHILD, Esquire, Special Agent and Commissioner of the Right Honorable THE EARL GRANVILLE, Sole Lord or Proprietor of a certain District, Territory, or Parcel of land, lying in the said Province.

Mr. In. Williams His Lordship Surveyor for the County of Halifax. Greeting:

You are forthwith to admeasure and lay out to Thomas Staton a Tract of vacant Land, containing six hundred and forty Acres, lying in the Halifax County, within the said District. Beginning on Col. Conners line, in the fork of little Conneto, and running to Include the Vacant Land between said Conners two tracts of land in south fork for compliment.

OBSERVING my Instructions to you for running out Lands: THREE just and fair Plans whereof, certified under your Hand, with the Day of your making the same, you are to return to the Person mentioned in my said instructions for receiving the same, within Six Months from the Date of this Warrant; IN ORDER that the said Thomas Staton may, within Twelve Months ensuing the Day of such your Survey, so to be returned as aforesaid, take out a Grant for Lands therein contained, for completing his Title: OTHERWISE this Warrant to be void and of no Force; AND the said Lands to be deemed

free, and at Liberty to be taken up by any other Person that shall apply to me for that Purpose. DATED the 15th Day of November 1759."

DR. LYCURGUS LAFAYETTE STATON 1849-1921

Dr. Lycurgus Lafayette Staton, M.D., was born in Tarboro, N. C., February 1, 1849 and died July 1, 1921. Few people, if any, have ever become as great and useful as Dr. Staton. I quote from A TEXT BOOK ON SURGERY written in 1887 by Dr. John A. Wyeth of New York, who has enough titles to fill this page: "Liquid or semi-solid articles of food may be introduced directly into the stomach, or as practiced in the REMARKABLE case of DR. L. L. STATON of North Carolina, the food may be masticated and thus submitted to the action of the saliva, and may then be forced from the mouth into the stomach through a tube."

In the case above, Dr. Staton's daughter explained to me that Dr. Staton was either in John Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore or at Mount Sinia Hospital in New York, when word reached him that one of his colored farmers in Tarboro, N. C., had accidentally eaten some lye and consequently could not swallow. The local doctors had considered the case hopeless. Dr. Staton immediately went to Tarboro, N. C., and made small hole in the patient's stomach, inserted the end of a tube, closed the opening and made a cap so the tube could be covered when not in use. At meal time the patient would chew his food, as other people, then remove the tube cap and force the food

from his mouth into his stomach; by-passing the throat completely. We are told that Dr. Staton was advised by other famous Doctors not to do this, but his patient lived fifteen years; Dr. Staton knew what he was doing.

We have been informed Dr. Staton introduced BLOOD TRANSFUSING. He had another patient whom the other doctors had dismissed as helpless. Dr. Staton told them how he could inject blood from a chicken into the patients veins and add strength, but he was advised against the act, and reminded him that the blood counts might not be the same and consequently not mix. Dr. Staton told his associates the temperature and rate of injection were factors to consider, and the patient would die if they did not give him strength. The plan worked and the patient lived several years and overcame his condition. Dr. Staton introduced many other ideas in medicine which were at first considered UN-OR-THO-DOX, or not sound or safe.

At the point of greatest fame Dr. Staton left his surgery practice in Baltimore and New York (against the advice of his associates again) and returned to his home and friends in Tarboro, N. C. to give them a medical service which they could never have received elsewhere in the world.

Dr. L. L. Staton was a SURGEON of great renown, full of generosity to every class of people, never seeking fame, practical, disregarding out moded customs and formalities, reverent in his actions, humble to the distressed, better informed than his associates, never superstitious, at ease in the midst of royalty, and about forty years more advanced in knowledge than the average doctor of his day; he was a GENIUS.

I am beginning to realize how well informed he was, because I have recently read many of the books he read, visited the old home where his daughter, Sally, now lives, talked with many of his old friends, walked over the beautiful farm where he was reared a few miles north of Tarboro, read many of his letters and answers, and examined some of his chemical formulas. He was not guessing; he knew what he was doing. In Greenwood Cemetery stands a large monument with no fancy inscription on it reads:

LYCURGUS LAFAYETTE STATON, MD 1849-1921 KATE E. STATON 1850-1924 and beside these HENRY STATON 1872-1952

We know Henry was their son, and a famous well informed attorney and judge; and yet I have never met them. Perhaps, if we listen to Earl Knightengale we might in a meager way understand these great people of recent past.

Dr. L. L. Staton descended as follows from John Staton and Anne Matthews, who were born and reared at Stratford-On-Avon in Warwickshire, England; James Staton and Esther of Dorchester County, Maryland; Thomas Staton of Halifax and Edgecombe County, N.C.; Ezekiel Staton and Mary of Halifax, Martin, and Edgecombe County, N. C.; Redding Staton and wife, Isabella Clements of Edgecombe County, N. C.; and Henry Lafayette Staton and wife Margaret Batts of Edgecombe County, N. C. Dr. Staton's father, H. L., had a brother, Dr. James Adolphis, whom we will list later; he also had a brother named Albert (Albert married his own first cousin, Louisa Jones and her mother was Tobitha who was Ezekiel Staton's daughter).

MISS SALLY BAKER STATON

Miss Sally Staton is the daughter of the late Dr. L. L. Staton. She lives in the beautiful home in Tarboro, N. C., left by Dr. Staton. She graduated from Vassar College in New York. She taught school several years, and has done much travel and lecture work. She was born in Tarboro, N. C., June 17, 1875, and given most of her life to civic and community work in the development of that beautiful city.

REAR ADMIRAL ADOLPHUS STATON

Rear Admiral Adolphus Staton (retired) is the son of the late DR. IYCURGUS LAFAYETTE STATON.
Adolphus was named in honor of his great uncle, Dr. James Adolphus Staton, who moved to El Paso, Texas. The Rear Admiral now lives at 3807 Bradley Lane, Chevy Chase 15, Maryland, (in Greater Washington, D. C.). Two years ago I visited the Rear Admiral in his beautiful colonial home, and we watched the Duke - Carolina football game on his television.

I shall try to quote him: "My father had some information that there were two Staton brothers who came from England in Colonial days and one landed on Eastern Shore Maryland. There are a couple of dozen Statons in the local telephone book here. There was also a perfectly delightful Captain W. H. STAYTON, who graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy about 1880 who once told me that he and I had a common ancestor SEVEN generations ago, but that I belonged to the UNWISE Statons, as his branch had put the Y in the name to prevent people from pronouncing it STATTON." His statement proves my earlier statement about two Statons coming here and Nehemiah putting the Y in the name Staton which was seven generations ago. The Rear Admiral graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1902 and spent his life in service.

While reading some Virginia Military Institute records on World War I:

VIRGINIA MILITARY INSTITUTE -- WORLD WAR I RECORD "Commander ADOLPHUS STATON, Class 1900. From North Carolina. United States Navy, A. E. F. In 1902 he was graduated at the U. S. Naval Academy.

While Executive Officer of the U.S. Transport Mt. Vernon, in 1918, his ship was torpedoed, 200 miles from port, with a loss of thirty-seven sailors. But, through the heroic conduct of crew and officers, he was enabled to save his ship, for which act he was awarded the "Navy Cross."

At the conclusion of the War, he was Executive Officer on board the U.S.S. Leviathan. He is now serving on the U.S.S. Tennessee.

Commander Staton's father, Dr. L. L. Staton, a very prominent citizen of North Carolina, is an old V. M. I. "boy," and his brother, Henry Staton, a successful lawyer in New York City, was graduated in the Class of 1893."

Commander Adolphus Staton from North Carolina was graduated in 1900 from Virginia Military Institute and is now Executive Officer of the U.S.S. Tennessee.

A clipping from a newspaper in 1924 is quoted: TIENTSIN ROTARY CLUB GOOD STORIES BY "ASHEVILLE" COMMANDER

A MERRY GATHERING

"The Rotary Club's weekly tiffin gatherings at the Astor House are far from solemn, but yesterday's meeting was almost a record for merriment. Commander Staton, of the U.S.S. Asheville, who is a born raconteur, had been asked by the President of the Club (Mr. H. G. W. Woodhead) to keep the members and their guests merry, and right well did he succeed.

Commander Statton reeled off story after story. and told more in the 20 minutes allotted to him than we ever remember having heard in so short a time. His sidelights on the variety of types found in the American Navy during the war were interesting and amusing. He told his hearers of one doughty disciplinarian who dominated his section of the ship in the most primitive way until is authority was completely establish, rose in a short time to the highest non-commissioned rank, was advised against re-enlistment, and was next heard of as President of a Shipping Company. He wrote to Commander Statton inviting him to spend a week-end with him, and undertaking to send his limousine to the station to meet him. Another man who once served under the speaker, and of whom Commander Statton told a characteristic anecdote, is now one of the greatest electricians in the United States. Another man, who got into difficulties and a beautiful mess in the coal bunkers of his ship, confessed that he was unaccustomed to such labours. and revealed that he was the son of the President of one of America's greatest Banks. On one voyage the key of the paymaster's safe was missing, but as the result of a hint from a member of the crew, one of the latter's comrades was invited to try his hand at opening it, and he did the job. No enquiries were made as to his previous calling!

"During part of the war it was my pleasure to serve on board the U. S. S. Mount Vernon in the transport service. This vessel had been interned in Boston at the time of the entry of the United States into the war. She was fitted out with a crew from probably every walk of life in and around Boston. We had Harvard students, Boston Teck. students, society folk and probably some thugs among them.

"On one of our trips we took a load of Arkansas negroes; probably none of whom had been out of their home state before, and a few probably never before out of their native county. I was informed that upon their arrival in the Training Camp in the United States many of them thought they were in France. They spent most of their time on the trip across, praying, having revival meetings in true negro fashion, and all felt that they would never return. When they arrived in France, an attempt was made to make a combatant unit of them and after being instructed about going over the top, one negro was asked - what was the first thing that he would do when he got over the top - the negro replies - the first thing I would do, would be to say - "Good Morning, Jesus."

It seems that in April (21 - 22) of 1914 Rear Admiral was sent in charge of U. S. Battle-Ship SOUTH CAROLINA or (Tennessee), to VERA CRUZ, MEXICO to prevent the Mexicans from getting supplies from Germany - through CUBA - to Mexico. We are told it only took $1\frac{1}{2}$ days to capture and seize the city and supplies which otherwise might have been used against us by Mexico striking us from the south. According to the Navy Department, Adolphus received the CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR. He recently stated he did not especially appreciate this medal, because there had to be some innocent loss of life as in all wars.

Navy Department January 25, 1916

The medal most appreciated was the NAVY CROSS received for service in 1918 at BREST FRANCE. During World War I, Rear Admiral Staton was in command of the transport ship MT. VERNON sailing from France to Norfolk, Virginia, when it was struck by a German torpedo and twenty-six men killed. He had over 200 wounded American sailors and soldiers and about 3,000 civilians on board. More than half the boilers were knocked out and a large hole near the end was taking water faster than the pumps could handle. A German ship also had been hit. So, Adolphus sent over life boats and 29 Germans came over. They were given food, hot drinks and dry clothing, and invited to the office. They admitted their ship was going down. Staton reminded them the MT. VERNON was going down. He asked the Germans what they might have done to save the German ship if time permitted. At first they suggested dividing the switches and building bulk-heads from steel cut from other parts of the ship and pump out the water. Then the Rear Admiral reminded them it would be necessary to do the same thing if the MT. VERNON could be saved. They were reluctant at first, but soon offered cooperation. Some were welders and some electrical engineers. The engineers began dividing the wires on the American ship and the welders took boats and blow torches and went over and cut off a section from their ship; returned and welded bulk-heads back of the hole on the MT. VERNON. They were all returned to Norfolk, Virginia, by Rear Admiral Staton for which he received the Navy Cross he appreciates.

I have tried to get a good photograph of Adolphus which may be found elsewhere in this history, but if I fail I will admit he is short, blue eyed, handsome, and has a VOCABULARY equal to a dictionary, and appears to use a new word in every sentence.

It is an honor to know such a great leader

whose ingenuity must have been an inspiration beyond comparison to the Navy, when the moral was at a very low eb.

Adolphus married Edith Blair of Washington, D. C., July 28, 1917, and they have one daughter, Lucy. She married Professor Bernard McCabe of England and they have four children:

HON. HENRY STATON 1872-1952


The late Honorable Henry Staton was a brother of Rear Admiral Adolphus Staton. He was born in Tarboro, N. C., August 12, 1872, and died in New York March 24, 1952, where he operated a large law practice. His wife, Mrs. Margaret Staton, now lives in Daytona Beach, Florida, and they had one son, Henry Staton, Jr., also of Florida.

MAGGIE STATON, Aug. 10, 1859 - Dec. 11, 1893 and LUCY CLEMONT STATON, Jan. 10, 1855 - Nov. 23, 1943

Maggie Staton born August 10, 1859, died December 11, 1893, and Lucy Clemont Staton born January 10, 1855, died November 23, 1943, were sisters of Dr. L. L. Staton of Tarboro, N. C., and are buried near the yard of the Old Henry Lafayette Staton home a few miles north of Tarboro, N. C. They were well educated, faithful workers and were never married. Lucy operated the H. L. Staton farm about forty years until she died, age 88. Their graves are marked with large beautiful granite stones. I have a beautiful letter written by Lucy many years ago explaining the family connections to Miss Bass, and concerning relatives who moved to Texas.

DR. JAMES ADOLPHUS STATON 1818 N.C. - 1884 TEXAS

Dr. James Adolphus Staton, M.D., brother of HENRY LAFAYETTE STATON, was born near Tarboro, N. C., on March 1, 1818. He served as a medical doctor in the Civil War. Soon after the war, I believe, he was

inspired to seek the love of a lady he met in service. Mary Adair (Burleson) Maxwell in Desoto County. MISSISSIPPI (near Pleasant Hill). They were happily married on December 14, 1865, Groom age 47 and Bride age 30. Dr. Staton departed this life. April 26. 1884, at 12 o'clock A.M., age 66 years, 22 months. and 26 days. This information was sent to this author by Dr. Staton's granddaughter, Mrs. John D. Williams, of El Paso, Texas, (905 East College Avenue) as she copied it from Dr. Staton's old Bible in her home. Dr. Staton changed the last o in his last name to e. perhaps due to military records, because he was in a new location and alone and his new neighbors wanted his writing to match his credentials; this often happens if the service gets your name in error, they are reluctant to begin changing it because of the many departments it is filed in. Dr. James Adolphus Staten's family is as follows:

JAMES HENRY STATON - 1907

James Henry Staton born in Tarboro, N. C., November 17, 1907, is Vice President of the Board of Trade. He is unattached, well known and loved in Tarboro, N. C., New York, Georgia, Florida, and elsewhere. He descends from a long line of famous Statons as follows:

- 1. John Staton and Ann Matthews married 1665 in England.
- 2. James Staton and Esther, Will 1742, Cambridge, Maryland.
- 3. Thomas Staton and wife Kesiah of Halifax County, N. C., who willed over fifteen hundred acres of land to his descendents in 1769.

HON. MARSHALL C. STATON 1883-1955

Marshall C. Staton was born in Tarboro, N. C., on August 28, 1883 and died November 1, 1955. He was a famous U. S. Referee and Attorney for Bank Closings. He was the son of HENRY LOGAN STATON, and Henry Logan Staton was a brother of Dr. L. L. Staton. Marshall married Hazel Robbins; born June 20, 1907, she died February 18, 1956. Henry Logan Staton's wife was Miss Lalla Cobb, born May 5, 1862 and died January 9, 1941. Each person listed here is buried at Calvary Episcopal Church at Tarboro, N. C.

ELDER WILLIAM EMARIAH STATON 1870-1929

Elder (Rev.) William Emariah Staton (listed also on Page 44) was Pastor of the Primitive Baptist Church at Lawrence (Near Tarboro, N. C.) for many years until his death in 1929. The author has visited this church many times and the cemetery at the church where Elder Staton is buried is well-kept and carefully marked by beautiful stones.

His son, SYLVESTER HASSELL STATON, (who married Virginia Ruby Harrell was born in Martin County January 21, 1910) was also listed on Page 44, but his children (children of Sylvester) were accidentally left off; they are as follows:

Sylvester Hassell Staton lives in Tarboro, N. C. at Riverview Courts, Apt. # 29.

ANDREW STATON 1840-1920

Andrew Staton was buried at Greenwood Cemetery at Tarboro, N. C. I talked with his daughter-in-law (Mrs. Maggie Staton at 605 Chestnut Street) and believe Andrew was the son of William Wiley (Willie on 1950 census), and

grandson of Ezekiel, and great grandson of the Thomas Staton who made a will in 1769 in Halifax, N. C. In reading the 1950 U. S. Census for Halifax County, North Carolina, we find:

From the above there is a difference of seven years in Andrew's birth dates, but they are often misquoted on monuments and I find the U. S. Census to be usually reliable, (not perfect).

Andrew Staton married Barbie Alsbrook, who died September 22, 1917, age 69; their children and grandchildren:

The records in this history are not always complete, but we were forced to write what we could find, and the people some written information, or continue to search and perhaps never complete the work and leave no written record. What would you have done?

MARGARET HADLEY STATON

Miss Margaret Staton (Margie) broadcasts over WCEC at Rocky Mount, North Carolina, and is also a writer. She writes me as follows:

"All I know is that my grandfather, John Robert Staton, married Barbara Hadley of Wilson, and that my father was John Robert Staton who married Julia Baker MacNair, daughter of William A. Baker, of Tarboro, North Carolina, who married Julia Shirley. Their daughter was Margaret Ann Baker, my maternal grandmother.

"My mother and father, John Robert Staton and Julia Baker MacNair, had two daughters, my sister, Barbara Baker Staton, and myself Margaret Hadley Staton. My father died in 1888 and my mother married John Thomas Reid of Norfolk, Virginia, in 1900. She died March 12, 1959. My sister, Barbara died in 1935."

I believe Margie traces her HADLEY line to the Earl of Bute who was advisor to George III. That is of Quaker origin and for a lengthy discussion on it I will cite you to THE QUAKER FAMILY OF HADLEY IN AMERICA, by Chalmers Hadley, and printed by Carson-Harper Co., Denver, Colorado. A copy may be found in

the Rare Book Room, Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., and it is possible there may be a few others.

I wish I knew more about other children of Thomas not mentioned in this history, but that is the result of time without complete family records. Thomas Staton died in 1769 in Halifax County, North Carolina, and the U. S. Census did not start until 1790, and did not list any one except head of family until 1850 (81 years later), and perhaps most of the children were dead before then. We hope this history will inspire our Statons to keep up their Bible marriage and family REGISTERS, as well as reading. We deliberately did not discuss Jesse, last son of Thomas Staton in Chapter V. because he will head Chapter VI.

CHAPTER VII

JESSE STATON (about 1740)-1813

Jesse Staton, son of Thomas Staton, perhaps was born about 1740, and we know his will was probated in Edgecombe County, North Carolina, on May 1, 1813. It had been drawn up and signed on October 8, 1812. Perhaps he died the last week of April in 1813. His wife was his beloved REBEKAH, no last name mentioned; I have always thought it was EVERETT because she made HER will October 8, 1834, to Thomas Everett, son of Kinchen Everett. "Millie Magnolia Staton had married Simon Everett, IV," says Mrs. J. L. Rea, a descendent, who now lives at Route #2, Plymouth, North Carolina.

WILL OF JESSE STATON - 1813

Recorded in Wills 1758-1830, Vol. IX, Page 40, Edge-combe County, N. C. Recorded Book E, Page 58, Edge-combe County, N. C.

"In the name of God Amen, I Jesse Staton of Edge-combe County and State of North Carolina being in perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die and as touching the worldly goods that it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose of in the manner and form following (vis):

1st. I lend unto my well beloved wife Rebekah Staton one hundred and twenty acres of land and timber to support the same joining and taking the houses whereon I now live, one negro man by the name of Pompy, one negro woman by the name of Charlot and her son Stephen, her choice of horses, one feather bed and furniture, one table and bofet, one pair of fire dogs, one cart and wheels, two setting chairs, three cows and calves, her choice of my stock, five head of sheep, two sows and plow hoes, one loom and gear, one trunk, one looking glass, one woolen wheel and one flax wheel, ten choice cask, one riding chair to her. during her natural lifetime or widowhood. Also I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebekah Staton all the household and kitchen furniture that she brought with her and twenty dollars to her and her

heirs forever.

2nd. I give and bequeath unto my son Frederick Staton one negro man by the name of Rueben which he has already, one feather bed and furniture, and the whole of my wearing clothes of all sorts to him and his heirs forever.

3rd. I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Staton after the death of my wife one pair of firedogs to him and his heirs forever.

4th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Manning ten dollars to her and her heirs forever.

5th. I lend unto my daughter Lovey Andrews (after my wife's death) one negro woman by the name of Charlot and her son Stephen and all her increases, and after her death to be equally divided among her lawful heirs, and if she dies without an heir the said Charlot and her son Stephen and her increase is to be equally divided among my three sons (vis) Frederick Staton, Thomas Staton, Bythel Staton to them and their heirs forever.

6th. I lend unto my son Bythel Staton to his disposal, the land and plantation I am now in possessed with (except my wife's part that I have lent to her) the remainder part of my plantation, and after the death of my wife the whole of the land and premises. Also after the death of my wife the bofet, table, and all my casks, only what I shall mention hereafter, two cows and calves, and if he dies without a lawful heir begotton of his body for the said property to be equally divided between Frederick Staton and Thomas Staton, but if Bythel Staton should have an heir to him and his heirs forever.

7th. I give unto my beloved wife Rebekah Staton two bee hives, and my will is that three men be chosen to fix on them together with provisions of all kinds for one year and that she have the fowls of all kinds to her and to her heirs forever.

It is my will and desire that all the residue of my estate after my just debts are paid that the residue of my property not already given away shall be equally divided between Frederick Staton and Thomas Staton to them and their heirs forever. Also I do nominate and appoint Miejah May and Thomas Staton and Bythel Staton my sons executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have

hereunto set my hand and caused my seal to be affixed this 8th day of October 1812."

Signed sealed in the presence of us whose names are assigned.

Test SIGNED: JESSE STATON (SEAL)

William Barfell James Staton

Edgecombe County May first 1813

The written last will and testament of Jesse Staton decease was exhibited into court for probate and was proven by the oath of William Barfell one of the subscribing witness thereto and Miejah May and Thomas Staton two of the executors named in the said will were at the same time qualified thereto, ordered that the same be certified and the will recorded.

BYTHEL STATON

Bythel Staton, son of Jesse Staton, perhaps was born about 1770 or 1775 in Edgecombe County, North Carolina. There were three Bithels. One was son of William and brother to Baker and Archibald, who had children named Dr. James McGill Staton, William John, and Bythel, Jr. The Bythel we speak of here is the son of Jesse and Rebekah. Little is known of this Bythel, since he made no will. He was the father of Robert W. Staton, who was born October 10, 1823; and Benjamin B. Staton described in Chapter V, who moved and owned much land in Carteret County, North Carolina (born February 7, 1825, wife Lizzie). Bythel also had a son, Simmons B. Staton who married Cecelia Knight. We list below the descendents of Bythel Staton and wife Cecelia:

THOMAS STATON

Thomas Staton, son of Jesse Staton, may have been

born about 1770 or 1775 (his brother Frederick was born in 1772). Jesse willed the home place to Bythel provided he lived and had heirs, but if not it would be divided between Frederick and Thomas. Since Jessie was dead in 1813 and Frederick was in Anson County, North Carolina (1796 we find in the Bible of his son Ennis), and Frederick purchased 235 acres of land in Anson on February 17, 1801; presume Thomas did live and kept the home place in Edgecombe County. Thomas also purchased land in Martin County.

On December 10, 1816, Book F, Page 375, Thomas Staton of Martin County sold land to James Howell (land which Thomas had purchased at a sheriff's sale there.).

On December 18, 1797, (Book C, Page 483) Thomas Staton purchased 314 acres of land in Martin County from Noah Leggitt of Edgecombe County. U. S. Census, 1800, Martin County, North Carolina: Thomas Staton, 1 white male under 10; one white male 16-26; one white male 26-45; one white female under 10; one white female 26-45. In 1810 U. S. Census: four white males under 10; one 10-16; one 26-45; one 45 and up; one white female 10-16; one white female 16-26; one 26-45.

We do not know what became of SARAH STATON (daughter of Jesse) who married a Manning. When Jesse made the will he called her Sarah Manning.

We, for the above reason, do not know what became of LOVEY STATON, who married some one by the name of Andrews.

We have never found a will for Thomas Staton, son of Jesse, but with the property he owned he must have had a will. As the U.S. Census 1800 and 1810 shows he had several children, but perhaps died before the 1850 census in Martin County which does not list him in either county. I believe he died in Martin County, because Martin, even though made from Halifax and Tyrrell in 1774 also took a small part of Edgecombe as I have been informed. Also, Thomas owned much land in Martin County where he perhaps died and we believe there are living descendants today. If any reader of this history should know more about this, please notify this author.

Frederick Staton, brother of Thomas, will be discussed in the next chapter, but before leaving Edgecombe County, with Frederick, we would like to explain where some of the Statons in this chapter are buried,

CHAPTER VIII

FREDERICK STATON, 1772 Edgecombe - 1864 Anson

Frederick Staton, son of Jesse, was born in Edgecombe County, North Carolina in 1772, and died in Anson County, North Carolina January 29, 1864, near Wadesboro, North Carolina. It is not hard to follow this man because he kept excellent records. He was born in Edgecombe County near the Tar River, where horses were wild and plentiful if you could catch them. were some horses left by Indians when the Spanish drove them out, many left by the Spanish from the south when the English drove them out, and later more Indian raids drove out some of the English causing them to leave quickly and not have time to round up their horses and other animals. As mentioned by Turner and Bridges, in the HISTORY OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY in 1919, the last Indians did not leave the Tar until 1732; just forty years before Frederick Staton was born there. No doubt, his ancestors had explained these things to little Frederick and he cashed in on this knowledge after finding a waiting and anxious market in Anson County many years later. Apparently he received a good education, perhaps by teachers who went from one large farm to another, and were paid by individual families who could afford this circuit instruction, as was the custom during that time. Frederick was strictly a business man. He was never a politican or outspoken, but we believe over thirty thousand acres of land passed through his hands. In Wadesboro alone, I believe he has three pages of index for the land handled in Anson County; he also had land in other counties. My father once told me Frederick's land reached from near Charlotte (a small place then) almost to Rockingham, North Carolina, and it took more than a day on horse back to travel it from east to west. Rev. Byron Shankle, a descendant from Staton on Shankle's mother's side, once told me about Byron's brother, Bruce, going to Tarboro, North Carolina, to check on their ancestors and found where Jesse (Frederick's father) said, Frederick was such a Roman Rider that he gave him the best Spanish horse money could purchase. Perhaps, he did enjoy riding, because he lived to be 92 and died

during the Civil War. My grandfather, John, lived with Frederick after his father, James Staton (Frederick's nephew and son-in-law), died in 1859 and John's mother, Maniza, died in 1859. John said, when he lived in the Old home four miles west of Ansonville, North Carolina, his grandfather would invite the large group of slaves into the large living room around a huge fire place, after the evening meal. and tell them of the beautiful counties of Edgecombe, Martin, and Halifax. (John's father) also came from Martin, and was an expert cabinet builder, finished carpenter, and also made violins and other stringed instruments. Consequently, John loved the violin and played so well he was always called "Little Fiddelin John." The slaves loved music and these gatherings furnished opportunity for recreation and happiness. They worked hard all day in order to buck-dance, sing, tell stories, play music, hear the Bible read, pray, and have a wonderful evening together. Frederick's son, Uriah, was a deacon at ROCKY RIVER BAPTIST CHURCH near by where both the white and colored then worshiped together. Frederick and family were members of that church and most of his slaves. This was not unusual for the people of that particular day and age. The following is a list of colored male members of that church in 1828 (about 131 years ago) by courtesy of Rev. Edgar Brook's HISTORY OF ROCKY RIVER BAPTIST CHURCH:

The author's Aunt Mary Staton Thredgill told me a few days ago what her father, John, said about Frederick's home when he lived there. "On Sunday after noons when the weather was good, Frederick's slaves would parade (at their pleasure) up and down the long hill from the house to Lanes Creek singing songs and making speeches about what a great man Frederick Staton was. That he was the best man in the world, richest man in the world, had more colored people than any one in the world and never hurt anybody in his life."

John said, since he was small about 5 feet tall, his grandfather Frederick made him a small chair to set next to the large fire place opposite him, so he might keep warm. When bed time came Frederick would start bumping his walking cane on the floor, going in a huge semi-circle around the fire and calling bedtime, and when he reached John's chair Frederick would say, John, I almost hit you; and John would say no grand dad, you never have hit me, you don't hit the slaves like other farmers do. Then Frederick would say, thats right John, they respect me.

John said they had plenty to eat.

THE U. S. AGRICULTURE CENSUS OF 1850, Book # 12, Page 701 shows Frederick Staton, (then age 78) had: 1500 acres of land (the other had been given to 60 pounds of beeswax the children) Farm Worth \$3000 \$500 Value of Farm Implements 4 Horses 2 Mules 4 Milk Cows 17 Oxen 67 Cattle 40 Swine \$850 Value of Livestock 130 Bushels of Wheat 750 Bushels of Indian Corn 60 Bushels of Oats 60 Bales of Ginned Cotton 50 Pounds of Wool 300 Bushels of Peas and Beans 20 Bushels of Irish Potatoes \$200 Value of Home Made Articles (Had Shops) \$250 Value of Fresh Meat 300 Pounds of Butter (He also had water mills, shops, factories, and

made most things used.)

Yes, he had his refrigeration system made by digging a large square hole in the ground, on the north side of the hill, lined with saw dust (he had a water saw mill) and pine straw, then a boarded wall, then ice cut out of vats containing (water left out from November - March) water. The ice was stored against the walls and board framed against it. This refrigerator was dug on the north side of the hill near the home, and the door opened from the side. The bottom had a grilled floor, with a drain for melting ice. Large trees kept the area shaded during the summer.

The last part of the house and chimney were pushed away by farm machinery about a year ago by the Sykes brothers, who own all the land except a two acre cemetery where Frederick, his first wife Piscilla Coburn, second wife, Sally Tomlinson, and last wife, Rhoda Shannon, and many other members of the family and slaves are buried. A complete list will be found elsewhere in this history. Frederick had too much land to list all deeds and records in this history. Many of the

deeds are recorded at Wadesboro, Monroe, and perhaps Rockingham, Mt. Gilead, North Carolina, and other places. He received four Land Grants in Anson County of about four hundred acres: dates - 1812, 1813, 1817, and 1826. He had moved to Anson in 1796, and deeds show he was purchasing land in Anson County February 17, 1801; 235 acres for 200 lbs (English Money). On December 1, 1801, he purchased 150 acres from John Segraves in Anson for \$150.00. On November 3, 1806, he purchased 280 acres from Burevell Segraves in Anson for 50 lbs. (English Money again). Most of the many other purchases were made in American money.

We believe James Ross, a Revoluntionary War soldier, the Coburns, Allens, Martins, Morris, Benton, Broadway, Turner, Waddell, Davis, and many others came to Anson with Frederick Staton, or arrived about the same time. They appear to always be near each other in the early days. We know James Ross is buried in the Ennis (son of Frederick) Staton Cemetery, and has D.A.R. marker with wife Lydia or Elizabeth Coburn, two miles north-east of Fairfield Baptist Church in Union County. Staton's second wife was Sarah Ross. Frederick Staton married Priscilla Coburn the first time. Francis Coburn was the person who received the land, where the cemetery is located then Anson County, now Union, in a Grant in 1779, then to John Cobb in 1806, then to Vamal Adams in 1814, then to Frederick Staton in 1819, then to Ennis Staton on May 3, 1832. The last ten children of Ennis Staton were by Sarah Ross.

When Frederick Staton came to Anson County in 1796 he had many fine horses which the people in Anson liked and tried to purchase. Most of the people then used oxen, but sometimes some one from Virginia brought a horse here which they did not care to sell. There was such a demand for horses that Frederick, decided to go occasionally back to the Tar River area and get plenty of them. Many were still wild there (see Lawson's HISTORY OF NORTH CAROLINA 1700-1710, and HISTORY OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, by Turner 1919). Frederick and his slaves would take a white horse (to lead with) and a few others and ride 200 miles to Edgecombe County and catch droves of horses and bring them to Anson where he had a large training area; apparently he visited relatives

and got new names on these trips. There he bred and trained horses.

Many people were moving west because they thought their land in Anson and Union was worn out. They sometimes paid Staton cash for his horses, but many traded him their land (which they thought useless) and Frederick always had the deeds properly recorded obtaining thousands of acres. After Frederick died in 1864 some of the people who went west became homesick, and fertilizer had been discovered and developed and wanted to return and get the land back FREE after their fine horses were dead or worn out. Ennis had to attend Supreme Court three times about this, but he did not give up the land.

Frederick Staton's wives were:

FREDERICK STATON'S WILL - 1859, DIED 1864

"I Frederick Staton of the County of Anson and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following that is to say: 1st. That my Executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relations, and pay all funeral expenses, together with any just debts, howsoever and to whomsoever owing, out of the money that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate. 2nd. I give and bequeath unto my son, Ennis Staton Seven Hundred Acres of land more or less, being all the tract of land I own on Niggerhead Creek and Gourd Vine Creek, also a negro woman named Pheoby her child named Mamie, also one negro named Vilet her increase, also one negro girl by the name of Ann.

3rd. I give and bequeath unto my son Uriah Staton, all the land I possess on the East side of Lanes Creek also a tract of land of three Hundred acres more or less known as the Yarbrough lands, also all my lands between Lanes Creek and Cribs Creek except one tract known as the Taylor Tract (which lies some three miles from my other lands). Also the following negros, Ellick, and Charles, Linda and her children together with her future increase. Uriah Staton shall well and truly pay four Hundred Dollars to the Lawful heirs of Temperance Smith to be paid at two payments of Two Hundred Dollars each, annually after my decease. 4th. I give and bequeath to my son, Reddin Staton all the lands I own, on Richardson Creek, known by the name of the Austin, Sharps and Thomas and Nance Land. Also five negros, named Willis, Tom and Ann, Jo and Sam.

5th. I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of the body of Temperance Smith one negro Boy named John one Girl named Jane, one negro Girl Caroline, with her children except the oldest named Frona. 6th. I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my daughter Maniza Staton, all the land whereon James Staton lived and died. Also a tract known as the Taylor land, lying on the waters of Lanes Creek. Also three negros named Nancy, Calvin, Laura, 7th. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Harriet Broadaway and the heirs of her body, a tract of land, adjoining John Broadaway, containing Two Hundred and Fifty acres more or less. Also one negro boy named George, if the said Harriet Broadaway should decease without a lawful heir of her body, then the said property to return to my surviving heirs.

8th. I give and bequeath to my grandaughter,
Theatus Staton one negro girl named Frona if the
said Theatus Staton should decease without a lawful
heir of her body said negro girl shall revert back
to my surviving heirs. My will is that all the
residue of my property not otherwise disposed of
shall be sold and after paying off all my just debts
to be equally divided among all my lawful heirs.
9th. I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Uriah
Staton and Miles W. Maske my lawful executors to this

my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the 9th day of July A.D. 1859.

10th. In addition to the above will, I will and bequeath to my wife Rhoda Staton a negro boy named Dick during her life time, after her death to my son Uriah Staton, A.D. 1860 June 19th."



ENNIS STATON 1798-1885

Ennis Staton born July 26, 1798, in Anson County, died March 23, 1885, in Union County, was the first Staton born in the Piedmont area of North Carolina. Received a Land Grant in Anson County, but owned about 6000 acres in Union County at different times. His last child, Jesse, died in 1957, and this author conducted his funeral. Ennis married (first) Annie Allen; she died May 23, 1850, age 48. Their seven children:



Please permit us to pause and explain why some of the Ennis Staton descendants are scattered. Mr. Stephen Parker, above, told this author many times about Emanuel Staton, Norfleet Staton, Malachia Staton, Nevel Staton, and Penelope Staton taking their fathers best mule and buggy and going to Union, Mississippi sometime between 1850 and 1856. Emanuel was the largest boy in the family and it appeared Ennis used him as an example so often that he threw Ennis in the fish pond and ran away, the other three boys decided to go along. Penelope tried to talk them into staying at home, but they insisted on leaving. Whereupon she decided to go along and cook, so they would not starve. They ended up in Union, Mississippi, 600 miles west. Emanuel was the only one to return, but that was after 1885 and his father, Ennis, was dead. The other children divided their land and gave Emanuel a home; he brought his wife and daughter, Lula, back and they are all buried at Fairfield Church.

Penelope went to Texas, married and reared a large family, but no one here has a record of the names.

Nevel and Malachia were killed in the Civil War, but we believe Malachia may have descendants, because we find an old letter date marked Albany, Georgia, on May 29, 1862, addressed to Dear Father, (apparently to Ennis Staton where we made copy from). A lady was asking about Staton (she called him) and later in the letter requested them to notify her as soon as they heard from Malachia; she signed: Susan E. Staton. She said she was afraid he was killed or taken prisoner. (He had been killed.)

Another letter from NORFLEET STATON, postmarked Union, Mississippi, dated August 10, 1856, telling how he recently married Elizabeth Bolar, in Union, and would like to come home after Christmas, if Ennis would make him a title to one of his farms. (He did not get the title and never came home.) He had just built a two story home for his father-in-law (Samuel Bolar). General Sherman spent the night in this home while Norfleet was in the Confederate Army; and would

not permit it to be burned because he thought Norfleet was in the Northern Army, and had named the town Union in honor of the U.S.A.; but it was Union County (where he was born). Bolar gave Staton 200 acres of the town.



Big Bee Staton was born February 6, 1857, and died July 10, 1915. He never married, was well educated, a politician, humorist, a mason, and well loved. The author knows him and visited his home beside RED HILL BAPTIST CHURCH. His hobby was going to Wadesboro, N. C., with this author's grandfather (Little Fiddlin John Staton) and their other first cousin. Lafavette Staton from Olive Branch (near Marshville, N. C.) and locking the sheriff in jail while they paraded the prisoners through the city to the tune of John's violin. Every one in town seemed to enjoy the occasions, because no one ever got hurt and Bee would make speeches, showing the jail key, while John played on and Lafayette Staton danced.

After the celebration, they returned each prisoner safely, paid the sheriff for the opportunity, and remained out of town for thirty days; that was complying with the law then.

XIII. BAKER EUGENE STATON - 1859-1922

Baker Eugene Staton was born August 19, 1859, and died May 14, 1922. He was a very modest and kindly gentleman, as I knew him. He was so calm and cool my father always called him "Shady Baker" to differentiate between him and several other Baker Statons of that day. He owned the home which his famous father, Uriah Staton, built

and had lots of farm machinery and land. He was handsome and wore a short mustache and a small bow-tie, and much taller than my father, Uriah Charlie.

He was buried with his father, Frederick Staton at the Old Frederick Staton Cemetery, just west of Lanes Creek between Ansonville and Burnsville in Anson County.

"I, Uriah Staton of the county of Anson and the State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows; this is to say viz; lst. That my Executors hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial such as my friends and family will be satisfied with. And pay all my just debts out of the money that shall first come into their hands as a parcel of my estate.

2nd. I give to my daughter Emeline Davis fifty four acres of land lying on the waters of Cribbs Creek adjoining the lands of William Ramsey and Hampton Davis surveyed by J. D. Nance 1883.

3rd. I give to my son W. C. Staton one lot of land at Ansonville known as the Parker lot lying near the Mineral Spring containing three acres and a fraction. 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Louisa Crump one hundred acres of land more or less on the East side of Cribbs Creek surveyed by Jas. D. Nance. See

Plat No. 1.

5th. I give and bequeath to Lucy Hendley (widow of Marshal L. Staton) and her four children by M. L. Staton, two hundred and forty acres of land on which they now live to be equally divided between them. The children to have their share when they arrive at the age of 21 years or when they shall marry. The said

Lucy Hendley to have her life time and then her share to go back to her four Staton children.

6th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Crump two hundred and twenty-five acres of land more or less on the waters of Cribbs Creek adjoining the land more or less on the waters of Cribbs Creek adjoining the lands of J. D. Hyatt and others, surveyed by Jas. D. Nance, see Plat no. 3.

7th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Virginia W. Hyatt three hundred and fifteen acres of land most of which has been conveyed by deed on which she now lives.

8th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Hettie R. Blaylock three hundred and fifteen acres of land on the waters of Cribbs Creek, known as the Brontley lands, whereon said Blaylock has built.

9th. I give to my son E. M. (Malley) Staton three hundred and forty-one acres of land more or less on the waters of Lanes Creek whereon he now lives, surveyed by J. D. Nance. See plat Feb. 19th, 1876. 10th. I give and bequeath to my son U. B. Staton two hundred and forty acres of land more or less lying on both sides of Lanes Creek, including the mills, barrels and boxes, the grain in the mill excepted. Also my big log wheels, one bed and furniture and one cow and calf.

llth. I give and bequeath to my son Baker E. Staton three hundred and sixty-four acres of land whereon I now live including my dwelling house, cotton gin and screw and appurtenances thereto belonging. 12th. I give to my daughter Lilly F. Shankle three hundred and ninety acres of land known as the Frederick Staton and Thomas Allen lands, excepting two acres for family grave yard to be hers during her life time, and then to her bodily heirs, surveyed by J. D. Nance April 25th, 1884.

16th. I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons E. M. Staton and U. B. Staton my lawful executors of this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I hereunto set my hands and affix my seal. This 30th day of October A D 1884.

WILL OF WILLIAM LEE (ROCKY RIVER BILL) 1846

(Reason for listing this will, Uriah Staton married the daughter of the above William Lee, and Uriah Staton's two children Emeline and William Canny shared in his will.)

"I, William Lee RR of the County of Anson and State of North Carolina do make this my last will and Testament

in manner and form as follows (to wit). Section 1st. I lend to my beloved wife Catharine Lee three negros (Amos, Arthur, and Mary) during her life or widowhood also two horses of her own choice, three cows and calves of her own choice, two beds and furniture and as much of the other household and kitchen furniture as she may think proper to keep and as much pork corn fodder and shucks as she may think sufficient for one years support and fifteen stock hogs of her own chosing, and if she should need anything more to support her than she may get from the three negros above named it must come from the land and mill that I shall give to my two sons Sheppherd Lee and William The above named property after the death or marriage of my wife I give to my three children. Sheppherd Lee, William Lee, and Nancy Crump. Section 2nd. I give to my son William Lee the tract of land I purchased from the heirs of Gardner High Dec'd, and as there is two shares in the land that I have not got a write to and in case I should fail in getting a write in my lifetime I give to my son William Lee two hundred dollars to procure a write to the said shares, I also give to my son William Lee two negros (Richmond and Meriah) with their future increase.

Section 3rd. I give to my son Sheppherd Lee two negros (George and Pleasant).

Section 4th. I give to my daughter Nancy Crump a negro woman named Sarah and her two children named Daniel and Lindy and their future increase also one negro boy named John, one bed and furniture.

Section 5th. I give to my Grand Daughter Emeline Catherine Staton twenty five dollars.

Section 6th. I give to my Grand Son William Canny Staton twenty five dollars.

Section 7th. I give to my two sons Sheppherd Lee and William Lee all my land including my Mill (that I have not given away by Deed or otherwise) to be divided between them as they may think proper, Sheppherd Lee is to have the Lower part and William Lee the upper part of land.

Section 8th. I will that all my property and effects of every description that I have not given away in this will and otherwise (be sold) to pay my debts, and the proceeds of such sale after paying my debts

be equally divided between my three children Sheppherd Lee, William Lee, John F. Crump, and David High. Executors to this my last will and testament. Given under my hand and seal this 7th day of October 1846."

REDDIN STATON 1820-1878

Reddin Staton was born February 14, 1820, and died July 29, 1878. He was a JUSTICE OF PEACE in UNION COUNTY, N. C. He perhaps settled more estates and performed more wedding ceremonies (including his father's marriage) than any man in Union County during his day. About 6000 acres of land passed through his possession. He traded 97 3/4 acres of land for a beautiful horse called "Charlie" his favorite. Last year I asked his granddaughter (Sara Frances) if the horse was worth that, because I knew she often rode that horse. She replied, "Charlie was worth ten times that." It has often been said no matter what Reddin did Charlie always brought him home; either on the buggy, wagon, or on back. Reddin is buried on the south side of the road, in front of the old home place (his family cemetery) on the road from Olive Branch, to the Old Jesse Parker Store. There must be graves

for forty slaves buried 200 yards west of him. Each slave had stone markers (rock) larger than Reddin's marker. I hope some one will get him a new marker; I am doing that for several of my direct line.

Reddin first married Harriet Matilda Flourney, who was a granddaughter of Gray and Molly Nance Allen. They had one daughter, Mary Jane; who died at age 6. (See HISTORY AND GENEOLOGY OF THE NANCES, page 30, by Davidson Nance, 1930)

Reddin Staton's second and last marriage Martha Jane Benton (sister of Rosana K. Benton, who married Uriah Staton).

These two Benton ladies were daughters of Col. James Benton, Jr., who owned what is now the McEwen Funeral Home in Monroe, N. C. James Benton, Jr., married Martha (Patsy) Morris, Junior's father was James Benton, Sr., Revolutionary War soldier, who married Sarah Davis; his father was Samuel Benton of Oxford, laid out and gave part of the town. Col. James Benton, Jr., was a first cousin of Thomas Hart Benton (U. S. Senator from Missouri) who tried so hard to hold the Union together without fighting during the Civil War.

Reddin Staton died sitting on the door steps of Old Dr. Bost at Olive Branch in Union County. This is proven by people living today. I checked with several of the oldest people; some now deceased, and some still living; James Thomas at Peachland, N. C., knew him and married his granddaughter, Hettie Staton; James or (Jim) is between 80 and 90 now. Redding owned water mills for grinding meal, flour, and saw mills for lumber, and shops for molding iron, making nails, and kept professional millers etc. in his home according to 1850 U. S. Census. HARRIET STATON 1815-1887

Harriet Staton, fourth child of Frederick Staton (1772-1864), was born June 25, 1815, and died May 25, 1887; married REV. JOHN BROADWAY who was born, January 30, 1811, and died December 30, 1870; one account from files in Wadesboro, N. C., state, he was the grandson of Old William and Martha Morris. We have been informed he had 9000 acres of land, obtained by Grant, which he willed to his adopted son (WILLIAM CANNY STATON). Canny was the first son of URIAH STATON and (first wife) ELIZABETH B. LEE (daughter of Rocky River Bill Lee). She died September 6, 1837 and is buried (good marker) at the Oldest Rocky River Baptist Church Cemetery, just south of the River toward Wightman Methodist Church, and near John Frank Gaddy Home. Rev. John Broadway and wife, Harriet Staton, are buried in front of Brown Creek Missionary Baptist Church about four miles N.W. of Wadesboro, N. C. (good markers). They never had children of their own, but listen to the next paragraph.

WILLIAM CANNY STATON 1837-1906

William Canny Staton, born September 4, 1837, and died October 10, 1906, was only two days old when his good mother Elizabeth B. Lee (wife of Uriah Staton), died near Rocky River Baptist Church in Anson County, at the Old Staton home. He had only one full kin sister who was EMELINE (later wife of Rev. John Davis) and grandmother of the beloved Viola Kiker of Wadesboro, N. C. The Frederick Staton Cemetery had not been started; therefore, Elizabeth was buried at the Old Rocky River Baptist Church Cemetery, and not with

Uriah Staton's family. Harriet Staton and husband, Rev. John Broadway were fortunately visiting in the home when Elizabeth died. They had no children, and begged Uriah Staton to give them William Canny Staton. Uriah had no boys and desired a male heir. Consequently he was reluctant to release the two-day-old-baby, and change its name from STATON TO BROADWAY. Harriet and John took oath on the Bible they would never change the babys name, and if he lived (it then appeared he might die) they would give him their 9,000 acre estate provided they had no other children, and if other children were born to them the estate would be equally divided. The baby lived. He received all of the estate, plus $3\frac{1}{11}$ acres of land and a Mineral Spring at Ansonville, N. C., from the Will of Uriah Staton, plus twenty-five dollars from his grandfather William (Rocky River Bill) Lee as tokens. So, Harriet wrapped little Canny up in a blanket and carried him on horseback, about 7 miles to her home near Brown Creek Baptist Church in September, he lived and served as a Lieutenant in the Civil War. His children, some still living, say he always enjoyed riding horses because his mother started him early in life. He married Roxana Huntley, born February 2, 1852, and died December 26, 1938. This author has traded at their store long after William Canny died. His wife was 15 years younger than he. This author was 31 years old when Roxana died. They were also buried in the front Church Yard at Brown Creek Baptist Church.

CHAPTER IX

MANIZA STATON 1812-1859 Husband JAMES A. STATON 1802-1858

Maniza Staton, daughter of Frederick Staton (1772-1864), was born in Anson County in 1812 according to 1850 U. S. Census.

Her husband, James A. Staton, came from Martin and Halifax Counties and was a nephew of Frederick and a cousin of Maniza. Therefore, since we have Maniza Staton's line established, we will begin there.



William (22) Staton was listed separately with Harriet (22) Austin, as they were already married; and so were Emeline and James Baucom, but I believe they were still at the James A. Staton home. Emeline's first child, Martha, was born in 1851.

James A. Staton was born in Martin County, N. C. in 1802, son of Thomas Staton; grandson of Jesse Staton. (Jesse was Frederick's father, and James's grandfather.)

Early in life James decided to go with his Uncle Frederick. He became Frederick's foreman, and married Frederick's daughter (James's first cousin). Due to the family living before 1850, we have never known much about James's father, Thomas Staton of Martin County. Very little is known of James, except he was not particularly interested in land. He let 200 acres go for \$12.25 tax in 1843. His interest was fancy wood work. He made cabinets (listed in 1840 U.S. Census as cabinet maker), and he made violins and stringed instruments. It seems he could make almost anything. The house he built and lived in about 138 years ago is still in excellent condition, and it is

occupied by Mrs. Clinnie Griffin on Highway 218, just west of the Union County line in North Carolina. He did everything by hand, including making the doors and joining them with pegs. They look modern today. The base-board in the front room is 32 inches broad. It was hewn out of a hart log with an axe. No saw mill was needed.

James and Maniza, C. C. Braswell and Uriah Staton gave the land where Red Hill Baptist Church is standing in Anson County; see Book 18, Page 489 in Deeds Office at Wadesboro, N. C. James and Maniza owned about five thousand acres of land. They died without a will, and Frederick takes care of the land until the children become of age. The land was divided and later in January of 1870 the estate was settled, the Commissioners: James D. Nance, Isah Beachum, and Edmund S. Kiker.

James and Maniza are buried under a large holly tree 150 yards west of the house. The cemetery needs repair and more markers erected.

They had a large orchard, many bee hives, and seven boys and one girl, born and died as follows:

All the boys except Brown served in the Civil War; he was too young, and so was John (my grandfather), but he got in at age 16.

Calvin went to Little Switzerland, N. C. with William, Emeline, and James Baucom, but he did not stay there. They say he went on to Tennessee. We have recently had letters from Staton's who believe they may have descended from Calvin, but we are not sure. This will be discussed again later. His picture will be in this history. We hope it can be identified by some descendant. He carried a high head, handsome, and wore a beard with a trimmed mustache.

WILLIAM (BILL) STATON 1828-1914

HARRIET AUSTIN 1828-1910

William Staton ("Bill"), oldest child of James and Maniza Staton (cousins), was born March 29, 1828, between Fountain Hill Church and Olive Branch, Union County, N. C. on Highway 218 (the house is still in good condition, owned by Clennie Griffin). Bill died in June of 1914, and his wife HARRIET AUSTIN are buried on top of a small mountain two miles north of Little Switzerland, N. C., and thence from Black Mountain Baptist Church east one mile in the large private cemetery of "STATON - BOYD - McGEE," a beautiful place, well marked with proper monuments, but very difficult to reach (extremely high).

"William Staton married HARRIET AUSTIN from Monroe, N. C., on January 24, 1850. She was born in 1828 and died in 1910. Harriet was the daughter of James E. Austin (1799-1875) and Winnie Thomas; granddaughter of James Allen Austin (1764-1849) and Fanny Snipes; and great granddaughter of Charles Austin born in England 1725 and wife Mary, who arrived in America before 1766." Credit for the above is due Mrs. Bonnie Austin Petteway of 708 Central Avenue, Charlotte, N. C., who is the Austin Historian.

I have never seen William Staton. He died when I was 7 years old, and my father often spoke of him. His baby brother "Brown" lived in our home and dug our first well, was mischievous, a hard worker and well loved, and often tossed me up and caught me. He wore a full beard and was bald on top. He said Bill favored him. Bill was my grandfather John's oldest brother, and his left arm was shot off at Chancellorsville in the Civil War; there were six of those brothers in there together. They said, Bill got some one to tie up the stub and he continued to move around and scout without taking treatment before the battle ended. His grand sons John and Jesse Staton say Bill knew who shot his arm, and they were neighbors after the war ended.

When the war ended William (Bill) and his brothers had about 800 acres of land each, and planned to remain in Union and Anson Counties, but during the "Reconstruction" period Col. Jones and a Company of

Federal Troops were sent to Monroe. N. C. to control and patrol that area. The white people who did not take the loyal oath were not allowed to vote or hold Many colored people were put into office. This situation lasted 3 years at Monroe, N. C., and 17 years at Columbia, S. C. (only 100 miles away). Many white people sold their land and went west. We are told William Staton, his wife Harriet Austin, and his brother Calvin, not married; and his sister Emeline Staton and her husband James Baucom from Olive Branch (near Marshville, N. C.) all sold their land (perhaps it was poor then and fertilizer had not been developed) and took the best horses, plants. seeds, and plenty of supplies and equipment (including guns and fishing equipment) and bade their friends "good-by" and started West. Whether they knew where they were going is not known. It is possible that some of the war duties had carried the men through Little Switzerland, and as many soldiers do, they took an interest in that area. Whatever their motive, they left Union County financially better off than their neighbors, and started straight toward Little Switzerland. They passed through Morganton. N. C., upper Pepers Creek, over Linvell Mountain and to a place between on what is now Highway 26. between Little Switzerland and Spruce Pine, on the west side of the highway, under what is now "WOODYS CHAIR FACTORY," under a very large overhanging rock. The place is still there, but the opening to the cave has been filled in by soil accidentally due to construction work above the large shelf rock. Here they unpack their wagons, made a home for about one year. There was a beautiful valley in front of the rock where the horses found plenty to eat. We are told the ladies had to help push the wagons up some of the mountains they crossed. Game was plentiful and the families grew a beautiful garden in the valley just outside the door. They were not forced to live this way, but we are told everyone enjoyed it, no tax, no court, no duties. It is thought that Indians had developed this huge cave many years before. The men went out at different times looking for places to settle permantely where they might build water mills. About one year later William Staton and

Harriet Austin (his wife) located a beautiful valley about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Little Switzerland, N. C., on the road toward Micaville, N. C., and about \frac{1}{2} mile north of Black Mountain Church. They cleared 100 acres of land, built a water mill, and reared eight children; giving each a home site in the same valley. In the center of the valley was the home and good strong flowing spring. The valley ran east to west. west of William (the father) was the home and excellent spring of James (Jim) Staton. Just east of William was the home and swift flowing spring of John William Staton (the youngest child of old Bill). As the six girls married they were given land and homes in a circle around the center. It was known as "Staton's Valley," well protected from a mountain on the north side.

Nothing is left today except the beautiful springs and chimney stones. A large pasture encloses most of the valley at the east end and entrance to the valley William Staton had built a large water powered grist mill. I believe it was 1890 when the hurricane washed the mill away, and James Baucom's mill.

Emeline Staton, sister of William above, and her husband James Baucom had been on the trip with the others, but they built their home and mill on Highway 26A two miles south of Little Switzerland, N. C. They were also washed out.

Emeline's picture hangs in this authors home. She was born October 1, 1830, died November 13, 1892. She was born in the home standing today, near Olive Branch (Union County, N. C.) where William Staton was born and all of her seven brothers were born in that home. She is the great grandmother of ERNEST SELVEY, Chief of Police in Charlotte, N. C.

Before we list the descendants of William Staton and James Baucom Pamilies, we would like to explain what happened to both families after the "Hurricane" of 1890. Both families sold their land and homes at Little Switzerland, including James Baucom's store. They moved to a farm four miles south of TROY, N. C. near Laurel Hill Baptist Church on the road to Candor, N. C.

(James Baucom, Emeline Staton, his wife, and son Ruffin Baucom are now buried there.) Both families farmed there two years, but when Emeline died and was buried there in 1892, they decided to return to Little Switzerland, N. C., and try mill work again. James built another mill and operated it untin 1901. Staton worked another mill until 1901, when the next "Hurricane" washed out both mills again. Baucom went back to Laurel Hill Church near Troy, N. C., and Biscoe, N. C.. where his daughter Frances had married Frank Brewer in 1893. Baucom stayed with them until about 1897. and returned to Little Switzerland, N. C., where he married Matilda Buchanon and reared four more children. Listed later.

During this time, William Staton had been invited by his daughter, Saphronia (Fronie) who married Jeff Hoover, to go to Kansas City, Kansas, and stay with them. They promised William and Harriet a new horse, because it was too far to carry his fine horse. So, William Staton and Harriet (Austin), his wife, took the train to Kansas City and stayed about eight years.

(Most people in the Staton families thought they never returned and so did this author, until he found their graves in 1957.) Yes, they came back in 1910, and Harriet died that year and was buried at the old home cemetery 2 miles north of Little Switzerland, N. C. Two years later William Staton died and is buried beside his wife on the little mountain top where they rest in peaceful sleep.

James Baucom had died in 1913 and is buried beside his first wife, Emeline Staton, at Laurel Hill Baptist Church 4 miles south of Troy, N. C. in unmarked graves. We believe when this history gets out the graves will soon be marked, because two sons at Gastonia, Robert and Rev. Harmon Baucom know where they are.

This James Baucom was the son of Henry Baucom of Olive Branch, near Marshville, N. C. Henry gave the timber to build the first Baptist Church there. Henry's father was Lewis Baucom, Lewis Baucom's father was Josiah Baucom buried in Union County at Fountain Hill. Josiah Baucom's father was John Baucom of Wake County, N. C. John Baucom's father was the original James Baucom who came to America about 1740, and sent money for his friend Frances Drake to come here on. They married and became the

ancestors of all the Baucoms we know. I visited James Baucom's and Emeline's graves recently. It is a beautiful church and cemetery. James Baucom's father and family (Henry Baucom) have a beautiful private cemetery located 300 yards south of Olive Branch Baptist Church in Union County, N. C. Henry Baucom's father, Lewis Baucom, and wife, Catherine Ellington, are buried at Fountain Hill Methodist Church 4 miles east of Olive Branch, N. C.



C., and wife Mary Dunn of famous Dunn Revolutionary days; gr. gr. granddaughter of Dennis McLendon, Sr. (1718-1790) of Perguimans and Anson Counties, N.C., and wife Mary Ingram (1728-1795), and gr. gr. granddaughter of Thomas McLendon of Scotland and Cumberland Counties, N.C. (1690-1760) and Elinor Bush (of Chowan County; father Wm., Sr., will 1716); gr. gr. gr. granddaughter of Dennis McLendon the emigrant who was born in Scotland in 1680, and came to America in 1696 with his wife Elizabeth.

I am particularly interested in the McLendon's, because Sarah Ann, my grandmother, had a sister SUSAN who stayed in our home when I was a very young child and read me stories, explained the names and positions of the stars, read and explained the Bible, and was a wonderful person. She is buried at Bethel Methodist Church between Wadesboro, N. C. and Mount Croghan, S. C., on Highway 109. I also knew very well the famous REV. BAXTER F. McLENDON, who operated large tent Evangelistic Meetings throughout the south when I was a small boy. He had almost super human strength and could run up and down the guy ropes like a mouse, dramatizing his sermons; I saw this many times. A professional wrestler pitched a tent near him in a near by South Carolina town; Mack tried to work out a non-conflicting schedule of programs; the wrestler refused and challenged Mack. Mack announced this to his congregation, and they went over and saw Mack whip the challenger at his trade very quickly. Mack said it was a choice between the Lord and the Devil. Mack was generally known as CYCLONE MACK, because he was so effective. He and my father often fox-hunted together, and they favored

very much; being cousins. Mack's grandson, Ronald, is Manager of Colonial Stores in Charlotte, N. C., and has Mack's collection of many imported guns.

I wish time and space permitted me to say more about Rev. Baxter F. McLendon, whom I believe was the greatest Evangelist I have ever known. I have seen him preach to the men only in Marshville, N. C. about 1917, and men surrendered a stack of pistols, bottles of whiskey, black-jacks, long knives, brass knuckles, etc., etc., and their souls; and their surrenders were permanent; I knew them, and still know them. I could write a large book about Mack.

All of John Sanders Staton's children were born by Sarah Ann McLendon, his first wife.

After she died some of the children were very small, and he married Miss Sallie Lee, born in 1849 and died November 15, 1913. She was the daughter of William Lee, II (I believe); and sister of Frank Lee, who was father of Brack and Tell Lee.







John Mack lives about 18 miles north of Spruce Pine, N. C., on Highway 19 E, up the mountain near the small village of Frank, N. C. He was born August 21, 1890 (still less than 70). ALFRED BROWN STATON 1848-1915

(Alfred) Brown Staton, eighth and youngest child of James and Maniza Staton, was born near (Olive Branch) Union County, N. C., in 1848. CHAPTER X

The next (23) pages are so important, that this author decided not to contaminate it with editorial notes in most places.

I have been corresponding with this good person about two years, and pray we may traverse the 3,000 miles between us and fellowship with him and family. As mentioned earlier in this history, Joe would have written the entire history had he maintained perfect health. (That reminds me I am only getting about four and one-half hours sleep per night - trying so hard to complete this history before January 1, 1960.) I may destroy my health in this attempt. I have a choice in doing this quickly and not perfect and complete in every detail, or delaying many years in research while many people NEVER get an opportunity to see ANY RECORD; perhaps I could accidentally be killed and the work would perhaps never be written. I have worked almost 18 years at spare time, and the last 8 months more than solid time $(19\frac{1}{2})$ hours per day) to make sure the Staton's get their first "HISTORY."

We now quote from my good friend and distant relative:

J. L. (JOSEPH LEWIS) STATON 570 W. TENTH AVENUE EUGENE, OREGON

"Besides my own personal knowledge and from tradition and information received from my father and other members of the family, I am indebted to the following for information contained in this brief history of the Staton family:

George Walter Staton
Los Angeles Heirs Reserach Bureau
The Des Moines Register
Family Bible of Joseph S. Staton
Family Bible of Charles W. Staton

Beginning with John Staton and Comfort Conquest Staton, the information is authentic. Before that

time, much of the information was received by George Walter Staton in England, Accomac County, Virginia and other parts of the United States. He went to England in 1912 and spent several months, and then returned to Virginia where he spent much time. His history of the Staton family was practically complete by 1917, when he entered the army as a 1st Lieutenant.

I secured from him in 1915 information concerning my immediate line from John and Anne Mathews Staton, who were married in Warwickshire, England, near Stratford-On-Avon in the year 1665.

George Walter Staton was a practicing attorneyat-law at Lawrence, Kansas, before he entered the army. A few years ago I visited the court house in Lawrence in an effort to secure some information regarding his immediate family, hoping to secure his records and complete the family history, but no one was able to help me.

Numbers in parenthesis (0) are used to identify persons whose names appear more than once.

ORIGIN AND EARLY TRADITIONS

From the best evidence attainable, the origin of the Staton family was Norman-French. According to tradition, one of our ancestors went to England from Normandy in 1066 A.D. with William the Conqueror, and fought in the battle of Hastings when King Harold was overthrown and William became the British sovereign. In payment for the services of our ancestor, he was given a grant of land in what is now Warwickshire near Warrington Hall, the residence of the Earl of Warrington. The Staton family became intermarried with the family of Warrington.

According to the "Origin of Surnames," there being no surnames until late in the 11th century, the root word of our surname is Stad, which is of Nordic origin and means "city." From this root word came the names of Staton, Staten, Stayton, Staden and others.

At that early date, the masses could neither read nor write. Even the Shire Reeves (Sheriff's) who

collected taxes had very little education. They would write the name on the tax record as they heard it. If they were a little deaf, or if the taxpayer did not speak plainly the spelling of the name was often changed. Thus the evolution of surnames.

Our first ancestor of which we have definite know-ledge was John Staton who lived on the west bank of the Avon River. He was a tanner of leather and married Ann Mathews, the daughter of John Mathews, in 1665. They migrated to Pennsylvania in 1666 and settled on the shores of Delaware Bay in Old Mispillion Forest where he set up a leather tannery. They had several children, but I was only furnished the name of my ancestor, Warrington Staton.

WARRINGTON STATON, married Catherine ? The maiden name of the wife was illegible on the yellowed records. They were married about 1718. Shortly after their marriage, they set their faces to the south and settled on a grant of land on the east shore of Virginia in Accomac County, near Cheaspeake Bay where oysters and sea foods were plentiful.

JOSEPH STATON, son of Warrington, Sr. and Catherine Staton, married Anne Custis about 1750. About this time the first Arlington, an eight gabled mansion was built at Mount Custis, on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean. Here was born Ann Custis. She was a sister of John Parke Custis, who married Martha Dandridge. After the death of John, MARTHA married GEORGE WASHINGTON. Joseph and Anne had several children, but I have no information regarding any of them except my ancestor, Thomas Staton, their sixth child.

THE EXODUS OF THE WILDERNESS OF THE WEST.

In the early spring of 1843 the two brothers, Jacob J. and Joseph S. Staton, decided to go west and seek their fortunes in Tennessee where their great Aunt Rachel Stokely Donelson and her husband John Donelson had gone at a much earlier date.

With their families which consisted of wife and four children each, their slaves and such other chattels as they carry with them they turned their backs forever on the land of their birth and sailed from Norfolk, Virginia, by clipper ship to New Orleans.

After a few pleasant days visit in the old French Quarter in New Orleans they again sailed by steamboat for Nashville in the heart of the new frontier. was in the roaring forties - the heyday of steamboating on the big river. White floating palaces with gilded pilot houses were ushering in a new day in a new country and were transporting pilgrims of every station of life to the newly opened wilderness of the west. The mottled crowd of travelers were bound for various points along the Mississippi and its tributaries.

Among their many new acquaintances was a family bound for the fertile river bottom land in the vicinity of the mouth of the Missouri River. family persuaded Jacob and Brunetta to go with them and file on a section of land.

At Cairo, Illinois, on a morning in early June 1843,

Jacob and Joseph who had been inseparable since child-hood parted, never to see each other again. Jacob and his family went north to Muscatine, Iowa, and Joseph and his family continued on to their original destination, Nashville, Tennessee.

In the War between the States, three of Jacob's boys fought under the Stars and Stripes and three of Joseph's boys fought under the Cross of St. Andrew. Rebel Charles W. captured Yankee Frank at Jackson, Tennessee, in February 1863. He took him into camp for a visit with his Rebel cousins, John T. and Joseph W. The following night the three Rebels visited the three Yankees at the Yankee camp. The following day Joseph W. was mortally wounded.

Dear John:

Your letter of August 20th came today. I wrote you on August 19th and I believe my letter answered your question regarding the source of my information regarding my direct line of ancestors and their offspring. Your will find below a more detailed account of my sources of information: (Please refer to the information sent to you on August 5th for names and numbers).

From John and Anne Mathews Staton, 1665, to John and Comfort Conquest Staton, information furnished by George Walter Staton, Lawrence, Kansas 1915.

Family Bible of (2) Joseph Stokely Staton states in his own handwriting, that he is the son of John and Comfort Conquest Staton.

In the search of the legal heirs of Wilber Staton, the last survivor of the family of (1) Jacob John and Burnetta Mathews Staton, it was found that Jacob John had only one brother and one sister, as listed in my report to you of August 5th. The names of the sons and daughters of Jacob John and Burnetta Staton were obtained from their family Bible and were used to prove to the Probate Court that there were no direct heirs of Jacob John Staton. The estate was therefore directed equally between the nearest of kin of Burnetta Mathews Staton and the direct heirs of Joseph Stokely Staton according to the list which I sent to you in May.

The record of the marriage of Joseph Stokely Staton and Clarissa Anne Beavans and the names and dates of birth of their children are written in his own handwriting. Dates of some of the deaths are in his handwriting and after his death, his daughter Mrs. Anna Staton Neblett completed the list of deaths except her own and this was written by her daughter, Mrs. Clara Neblett Moore. My cousin Clara gave me the Bible about five years ago.

After I first heard of you and that you were writing a family history, I wrote to Jesse E. Staton, Northern Bank Building, Clarksville, Tennessee, grandson of (3) John Thomas Staton and asked him to send me the information regarding his grandfather and his offspring, but I have had no reply. Therefore, the information regarding John Thomas Staton is from my personal knowledge.

The information regarding (4) Emma Ann Staton and her offspring was furnished by her grandson, Laurin Edmondson (31).

The information regarding my father, (5) Charles Wesley Staton, and his offspring was obtained from his family Bible and from my personal knowledge.

The information regarding (6) Anna Mary Staton and her offspring was obtained from her daughters (19) Clara Neblett Moore, (22) Anna Neblett Lyle and Nina Neblett, now deceased.

Information regarding (16) John Mac Neblett and his offspring was received from (41) Brenda Neblett Bass, 131 Alumni Avenue, Hopkinsville, Kentucky.

The address of both (31) Laurin Edmondson and (22) Mrs. Anna Lyle is R.F.D. # 1, Clarksville, Tennessee.

Some of the same information regarding the family of Jacob John Staton was received from the Los Angeles Heirs Research Bureau and a story about the family of Jacob John Staton at the time of his son Wilber's death appeared in the Des Moines, Iowa, Register, in the spring of 1934. The story also appeared in the Chicago Examiner. Both papers carried large headlines "Staton Estate Unclaimed." They stated that C. R. Stafford, Attorney at Law had been appointed by the State of Iowa as administrator. I wrote to him immediately,

stating that I was the grandson of Joseph Stokely Staton and that I had heard him tell many times of his brother Jacob who settled at Muscatine, Iowa, in the forties of last century. Stafford replied immediately that his records showed that Jacob John had a brother named Joseph Stokely and a sister named Leah. As a consequence, I received one sixteenth of the estate.

If you should need any further information regarding the offspring of (1) Jacob John and Burnetta Mathews Staton, I suggest that you write C. R. Stafford, Attorney at Law, 131 East 2nd Street, Muscatine, Iowa. This was his address in June 1942 when I received my last letter from him.

I thank you very much for the offer of the book and and the free printing of the pictures and biographies. I could not accept the book free, as I know the expense will be greater than you anticipate. If you really want a photograph of our family, I will have a copy made of our 50th anniversary picture."

CHAPTER XI BENJAMIN STATON 1755-1858

We believe Benjamin Staton was born in Amherst (or Buckingham) County, Virginia in 1755, and died at Hendersonville, N. C., in 1858. Perhaps he was buried at the Refuge Baptist Church at DANA, N. C. (about 5 miles S. E. of Hendersonville, N. C.) We know about the location of Samuel Gordon Staton (son of Benjamin) grave marked by a large unmarked rock and his slave buried at his feet. We think perhaps Benjamin was also buried in one unmarked grave beside his son, Samuel Gordon. I recently photographed the area; there are about 5 unmarked graves in one place; surrounded by well marked graves of Staton's only. We are told the unmarked graves were of the Oldest Staton's. Beginning with (John Walton 1833-1915) all graves for the Staton's are carefully marked by good monuments (some very large).

We believe Benjamin was in the Revolutionary War and saw this area about the time of the Battle of KINGS MOUNTAIN and BATTLE OF COWPENS. He perhaps liked the area and moved here later; exact date unknown; with other soldiers and their families.

I talked with Balus Walker Staton on October 14, 1959 (his 95th birthday). He is the son of Benjamin Allen Staton; grandson of Samuel Gordon Staton; and great grandson of Benjamin Staton of Amherst County, Virginia. Balus said, "the story had been carefully explained to him many times by his ancestors, how they came from Amherst County, Virginia, by ox and wagon. In the group were:

WATTIE WILLIAMS and wife MILLIE; ANDY MAXWELL and wife; L. L. KING; and SAMUEL GORDON STATON with his father, BENJAMIN STATON; WALTER STATON and others."

I immediately checked the U.S. Census for 1850 to see if any were living in 1850, because that was the first census that gave all names in each home. Bailus Staton was correct. If that census had been taken 15 years later, Bailus would have been on it because he was born October 14, 1864. The 1850 U.S. Census for Greenville County, South Carolina; just over the line from Henderson County, N.C.,

shows Samuel Gordon Staton, age 65; wife, Mary, age 64; and BENJAMIN STATON, age 94, living in the home with his son, Samuel Gordon. So, Balus Staton was accurate, Judge Hilliard Staton (deceased) was right, and so is his son Dr. Hilliard Vincent Staton (whom I have just phoned in Washington, D. C.). We have always wanted proof about these families; now we have it. Benjamin lived to be 103; he died in 1858; and not 1848 as some thought. His son, Samuel Gordon Staton, was born in 1798 and died in 1863; too old for the Civil War, but he had much property taken for war purpose as many others did; perhaps expediting his death. His sons Jesse, Benjamin Allen, and John Walton did serve in the Civil War.

We are told by the late Judge Hilliard and son Dr. Hilliard Vincent Staton that Old Benjamin had the following children:

It appears only one of the children remained in North Carolina; namely Samuel Gordon Staton.

John Walter Staton (apparently a brother of Benjamin; the original) made a will in Greenville County, S. C. in 1838; probated June 10, 1839; wife Mary, and 9 children: Evelina married Silas Pace; Benjamin; Joseph BJB; Reuben; Elijah Tom; John Allen; Truelove; Anderson; and Ambrose (Ant). The 1850 Census shows Reuben (son of John Walter) is back in Henderson County, North Carolina, age 26; and Mary (perhaps his mother) age 50, living in home with Reuben Staton.

John Staton, 1790, Spartanburg County, S. C., U. S. Census; 2 males over age 21; 4 females over age 16.

There was much shifting from one place to another; also some went west and never returned. Also, like eastern Carolina Staton's, the same names were repeated in brothers and sisters families. Therefore, it is wise to give a few census figures here to help understand who is who:

From pages 76 - 83 in this history, you will find a long list of original land grants to Staton's. Several Staton's in this Benjamin Staton's descendants received some of these grants. I spent a day in the capital at Columbia, S. C., trying to get a list of grants in South Carolina, but the records are not classified; therefore, I only found a few as follows:

Griffin Staton, 500 acres June 5, 1790, George Town section, north side of Bear Swamp, BK. E, P. 382.

Charles Statton, 200 acres, George Town, on July 8, 1789, for 4 lbs. and 13 shillings for survey, next to Griffin Staton.

There were perhaps many more grants in South Carolina, and some day we will find them, but not until their new office is complete and which they are in the process of building and organizing. Many of the Staton's owned and still own land on each side of the state line, between Greenville, S. C. and Hendersonville, N. C.

JOHN WALTER STATON - 1839

John Walter Staton, perhaps a brother (or son) of the original Benjamin Staton from Amherst County, Virginia. His wife was MARY; no other name known; mentioned in will at Greenville, S. C. 1838, recorded 1839.

The old people near Saluda say (John) WALTER, they called him, owned most of the land from near Mt. Page Baptist Church in North Carolina on to Greenville, S. C. He had nine children as follows:

ADGER M. PACE

A native of South Carolina, was educated in the public schools of that state and Georgia and the Georgia Normal College; studied music with some of the foremost teachers of the nation. He is a graduate and postgraduate of the late A. J. 



SAMUEL GORDON STATON 1798-1863

Samuel Gordon Staton, born in 1798, perhaps in Amherst County, Virginia, is the son of Benjamin Staton of 1755-1858. As stated earlier, the U. S. Census of Greenville County, S. C. for 1850 shows Samuel Gordon Staton in that area, age 65, wife, Mary, age 64, and Benjamin Staton (Sam's father) living in the home with them, age 94. Benjamin lived to be 103 and died there in 1858.

Our best research shows Samuel to be a man of wealth, wisdom, and worthiness. I spent much time in the Archives in Richmond, Virginia, seeking more light on this noble family, but many records have been destroyed. We hope this book will cause distant relatives to contact us and add a supplement.

Someone spoke to him and he forgot to give me the name Betty. This year when I carried him home from the birthday dinner, he asked me to repeat the names of his brothers and sisters. I did, but I had found Betty in the census record and added it without telling him. He immediately told me he did not give me that name a year earlier. I agreed he did not. That is how well he remembers. Balus (they call him BAIL) married Mary Jane Corn.

CHAPTER XII

NANCY JANE STATON, in Alabama, and husband, Thomas Duggan, Jr., had a daughter, MARGARET, who married the GOVERNOR OF ALABAMA, the HONORABLE BENJAMIN MEEK MILLER. We knew their line of Statons originated (as most others did) at the home of Shakespeare at Stratford-on-Avon, in Warwickshire, England, thence to: Pennsylvania, Delaware, Accomack County, Virginia; thence to Bedford County, Virginia: Buckingham County, Amherst County, Virginia, Tennessee, and into Alabama. We knew many other lines branched off from this long line, and many Staton's did not know their complete line. Consequently, we are listing this complete line to help others to tie on at various places known only to them. Therefore, in the future, we will have a better general understanding of the various branches. Earlier. Joseph Lewis Staton of Oregon branched from the early part of this line.

- I. Perhaps Joseph Staton was the son (or brother) of John Staton. John Staton married Anne Matthews in Stratford-on-Avon, Warwickshire, England, in 1665, and came to America in 1666. Proof is found by comparing deeds and wills and settlements. Joseph's estate was administrated in 1710 by his son, Joseph; Accomack Order Book, page 16, March 6, 1710. Apparently Joseph, Sr., died early at about age 45. Suppose the original John Staton and Ann Matthews married at age 21 or 22, in 1665. Their first child, Joseph, may have been born about 1666 in America, the year they arrived. That would put his age at about 44 or 45, when his estate was settled by his son, Joseph, in 1710 in Accomack County, Virginia.
- II. We do not know when the second Joseph Staton died, but according to Whitelaw's book, EASTERN SHORE, the second Joseph Staton purchased 200 acres of land in 1715 from Richard Lee.
- III. What became of this land? Perhaps it was inherited by WARRINGTON STATON (son of the last Joseph), because Warrington's son, Joseph, who

married Scarbrough Matthews, sold this same land in 1789 to Jabez Pitt. See will of John Matthews, Accomack County, Virginia. The difficult part of this research is due, in a way, to Virginia's changing Eastern Shore. For example, all of this area was Accomack County from 1634 to 1642. Then all was changed in 1642 to Northampton County, Virginia. In 1663 the area was divided, as we now have; Accomack in the upper area, and Northampton in the lower area. Therefore, you chase records to and from each county.

- IV. THOMAS STATON, son of Warrington, married Ann Matthews (Accomack County, Virginia, wills 1780-1784 in John Matthews' will, proved August 23, 1781). This Thomas Staton moved to Bedford County, Virginia, with his wife, Ann Matthews and reared their family. Thomas Staton MADE HIS WILL there in BEDFORD COUNTY in 1778. See Bedford County wills. We also find in Deed Book 5, page 143, in Bedford County, Virginia, this same Thomas Staton selling cattle for English money (pounds and shillings) on April 20, 1773.
 - V. JOHN STATON, son of Thomas Staton, moved from Bedford County, Virginia, to Buckingham with his wife, Mary. Albemarle County, one of the old large counties, was farmed in 1744. Amherst and Buckingham (side by side) were formed about 1761 from a part of old Albemarle. In 1788 John Staton pays the annual tithe tax for James Bethel, because John's daughter, Ann, (named for John's mother) had just married Bethel. I spent a lot of time in Virginia trying to get these records and found many records in Buckingham County had been burned (not by war), and it was necessary to use tax records sent to Richmond. So, in 1791, Mary pays the tax for the estate of her late husband, John, who died in 1790.
- VI. By 1795 GEORGE D. STATON (son of John above) was paying the tax at the same home. George D. Staton was born April 6, 1776, in Buckingham County, Virginia. In 1800 he married, Nancy

Wilkshire who was born in the adjoining County of Amherst in 1776. Her parents Thomas WILKSHIRE and Ann WILTSHIRE, moved to McMinnville, Tennessee, where they are buried. George and his wife, Nancy, had six children in Tennessee; moved to Blount County, Alabama, where three more children were born. George D. Staton died April 4, 1860. Nancy died about 1843.

Degree, LLB at University of Alabama; served in Alabama State Legislature; Judge of 4th Judicial Circuit of Alabama; Associate Justice of Alabama Supreme Court; and GOVERNOR OF ALABAMA 1931-1935. He died February 6, 1944 at Selma, Alabama, and is buried in the Camden Cemetery with his wife Margaret, who died February 6, 1934; both are buried in Camden, Alabama.

We have one GEORGE E. STATON, born in 1923; now lives at ROUTE 2, BOX 325, CREVE COEUR, Missouri (ST. LOUIS), whom we CANNOT CONNECT YET. He says, his great grandfather (George D. Staton, born in 1841) came from N. C. to Blunt County, Alabama. George D. Staton's brothers were Ellis and Flin. Ellis had children: Willie and Henry. George D. also had a son, George E. Staton, born in 1862; who was the father of Abram Frances Staton, born in 1897. A. F. Staton, above, is the father of: Albert E., born 1926; Abram Forney, born 1936, who is the father of Terry W., born 1957; A. F. is also father of George E. (the writer), born 1923, and he is the father of Gary G., born 1923 and Danny C. born 1953.

We listed on page 62 a George Staton, who perhaps went with his father and nine brothers and sisters to Texas (we in the east thought they all went to Beeville, Texas, Houston, Texas, and places in Ala.)

No one living today seems to have any record of them any more. A Miss Bass at Tarboro, N. C., permitted me to copy an old letter written apparently by Lucy Staton (a niece of Dr. James Adolphus Staton); he went to El Pase, Texas, about 1867. They are both dead, but Dr. Staton has a granddaughter now living, "Mrs. John D. Williams, 905 E. College Avenue, El Paso, Texas," described on page 92 and 93.

The first group above who went from North Carolina to BEEVILLE, TEXAS, also included Walter Staton (son of William John Staton) and grandson of Bythel Staton of Tarboro, N. C.

We believe there were many others in the group, including Dr. James McGill Staton (reared by Baker Staton of Tarboro, N. C.) and the doctor's ten children: James Archabald, Margaret Elizabeth, Thomas Green, Emma, Mina, Jeanette, Willie, Bythel, George, and Lucy. We know that Lucy once lived in Houston, Texas, and married a Mr. Weis and had children named Leonard, Jewel, and Mildred.

I believe the CALVIN STATON who was father of Everett, and George Harvey Staton of Houston, Texas, and grand-father of Hon. George Walter Staton (who tried to write STATON history) was my grandfather's brother, who may have left here before the Civil War. (Born in 1837, Union County, N. C.)

During the past two years, we have received many letters from Houston and Bonham, Texas, from Staton's who say their grandfather, Calvin Staton, came from N.C. and married in Tennessee. They do not know anymore about him, therefore, we have reason to believe he is this author's grandfather's brother, because we now know he was born in 1837 and left Union County, N.C., before the Civil War.

CHAPTER XIII

This is the Jacob Staton line: He was born April 13, 1745 in Accomack County, Virginia, the son of Warrington Staton. Warrington, as shown twice before made his (and his wife, Catherine) will in 1760. Warrington was the son of Joseph, Jr., he the son of Joseph, Sr., he the son of John Staton, who married Anne Matthews. (Some think John and Joseph, Sr., were brothers.) John and Anne came from Warwickshire, England to America in 1666.

According to these descendants of Jacob (son of Warrington), Jacob was about 16 when his father died. Jacob went back to Dorchester County, Maryland, and married Hannah Bonwell, raised nine children, and died in Dorchester County, Maryland. They added a Y to the name, because so many did not pronounce it correctly. His grandchildren later removed the "Y".

After Jacob Staton died, his widow and nine children in 1796 moved to Augusta County, Kentucky, and she married a Mr. Stinson. He may have suggested they use the Y in the name. One of Jacob's sons (Jacob, Jr.) brought the cattle and wagons, while his mother and others traveled by boat.

Mr. Isaac Williams (grandson of Jacob, Jr.) said Jr. married Mary Wise (a relative of Governor Wise of Virginia) and they came to Clermont County, Ohio, where Mary died in 1851, and Jacob, Jr., in 1863.

CHAPTER XIV

THOMAS STATON 1836-1918 - CYMANTHIA JANE KEENAN

After carefully comparing all our records, we believe John Thomas Staton was born in May of 1836 in Kentucky, and died December 11, 1918, in Pleasanton, Kansas; buried in Fairmount Cemetery, 8 miles S.E. of Pleasanton, Kan.

CHAPTER XV

SIMEON STATON - IRELAND-KY.-TEXAS

We have a record left by Rev. James Woodson Staton, Sr., (1850-1933) concerning his great great grandfather and copied by James' granddaughter, EDA PEARL STATON, of 505 West Simmons, Weatherford, Texas; and MRS. TESSIE OMA STATON (wife of Milton D. Shirley) of 903 6th Street, Brownwood, Texas:

Simeon Staton came from Ireland. (Perhaps with John Staton and Anne Matthews; or before or after them, but this author has reason to believe they were closely related by using the same names and living in the same general areas, and was a member of a Baptist Church. Nothing more is known about his ancestors. I believe, as stated earlier in Chapter IV, he might have been a brother of John; even he had lived in Ireland, and John in Warwickshire, England.) The family said Simeon lived to be 106 years old. He fought seven years in the Revolutionary War against England for our independence. He first lived some place in Virginia.

Simeon married Sallie Roberson, and reared six children; only GEORGE is listed. They moved to Kentucky about 12 miles from Louisville, near GOOD HOPE MEETING HOUSE, where he owned a large tract of land. He was a member of a Baptist Church, and lived with his children in later years near Racoon Creek, Indiana. Simeon was buried in Louisville, Kentucky with military honors at the age of 106. Nothing more known.

- I. GEORGE STATON, son of Simeon (only name given) lived in Kentucky, thence to Indiana with his son THOMAS STATON about 1830; thence to Illinois and Missouri. They died in Monroe County, Illinois, about twenty-five miles below St. Louis. They are buried there.

In 1871 they moved to Grant County, Arkansas, where Eda (first wife) died. They had two children (listed later).

In 1874 he married Sarah Glover of Grant County, Arkansas. He was ordained this year by Shilo Missionary Baptist Church, Presbytery composed of: H. W. Wilkinson, E. D. Taylor, and C. A. Gertman of Grant County, Arkansas. In 1876 he served as Missionary Rehebeth Association in Texas, and later, Pastor of Pilgrim Baptist Church. In 1878 he moved to Irdell, Texas where he served several churches, and was moderator of the Basque River Association.

In 1885 he organized Rockwood Baptist Church in Coleman County, Texas. Then to Santa Anna, Texas, as pastor, and under his ministry the First Baptist Church was built there. In 1891 was called as pastor of Big Springs Baptist Church, and the same year organized the Sterling City Baptist Church in Texas.

He moved to White Wright, Texas; thence to Sherman, Texas in 1893, where he became owner of the BAPTIST OBSERVER, and clerk of the Greyson County Baptist Association. He also organized the East Sherman Baptist Church and served as its pastor. From 1893 to 1898 he was pastor of and organized churches in northern Texas at: Luella, Savoy, Kingston, Emory, Meadow View, and others.

In 1898 he became Financial Secretary for Ministerial Education in Baylor University. He moved to Waco, Texas, and was pastor of China Springs Baptist Church.

In 1900 he moved to Brownwood, Texas, where he served as pastor of Milburn, Indian Creek, Mt. Zion, Alexander, and other churches. In 1904 he was called as pastor of the Baptist Church, Eldorado, Texas; and the First Baptist Church was built under his ministry.

Later he returned to Brownwood, Texas and became one of the founders of Howard Payne College. He remained here 32 years, and was a member of the First Baptist Church, when he died on March 5, 1933, at 900 Melwood Avenue. Children of Rev. Joseph:

CHAPTER XVI

CANNIE (REDEN) STATON 1842-1907

Cannie Reden Staton was born in 1842, according to the 1850 U. S. Census, in Union County, North Carolina; (between Fountain Hill Methodist Church and Olive Branch Baptist Church) on Highway 218, in the house now owned by Mrs. Clennie Griffin. He was the son of James Staton who married Maniza (dau. of Frederick Staton). We could not prove this until Christmas Eve (December 24, 1959); yet we had suspected it for several months.

A re-check of 1850 U. S. Census proved it, after getting hundreds of letters from Texas confirming it; I had contended it was Cannie, the son of Uriah, but proved I was in error and Cannie's daughter (born in 1877) now living in Bonham, Texas, was correct. Her address is "TEXE ADA (STATON) FERGUSON, 809 WEST 12th STREET, BONHAM, TEXAS." I am so happy she was correct. I had tried to convince Texie that her father might have been my grandfather's brother named CALVIN, and changed his name to CANNIE. We knew Calvin went west and we lost trace of him before I was born. The oldest people here only knew he went to Tennessee; nothing more.

Now I have phoned Texie Staton Ferguson in Bonham, Texas, December 24, 1959, and we are sure Calvin was born in 1837, Tom born in 1840, and Cannie born in 1842, and the three brothers left North Carolina in 1858, when their father James died; or 1859 after January 22, 1859, when their mother, Maniza Staton, died. The parents are buried about 150 yards west of the house where they lived and all the children were born. There are only two graves under a large holly tree. This author has seen the grave yard for the past forty years every time he visits in the community of Olive Branch (Union County), North Carolina. Thomas Staton came back and lived in Anson County near Ansonville, N. C., and is buried at Red Hill Baptist Church where my father Charlie and grandfather John Sanders Staton are buried.

Apparently Calvin and Cannie, his brother, married in Salisbury, Tennessee. Cannie married Elenner Beard (from South Carolina, I believe). Nothing more is known of her at the present. They reared a large family. Cannie's ancestors descends as follows:







GEORGE HARVEY STATON

George Harvey Staton, son of CALVIN from N. C., and brother of Everett E. Staton of Tennessee, Illinois, and Texas. George Harvey Staton married Sarah Elizabeth Hayes (an orphan). We do not know much about George Harvey, except he was BORN IN CAIRO, ILLINOIS, and lived in Kentucky and operated a large merchantile store. Here they reared three children which they sent to college.

 George Walter Staton died of lukemia in June of 1945 at his home in Houston, Texas; never married. George had a large private library when he died, and was a very well qualified attorney. He was perhaps the greatest civic worker in Houston, and much in demand for lectures on various subjects as he had a broad education and could lecture freely on any subject.

This author did not know about George until a few years ago, when I found the nine page question-naire he left in homes of nearly all Statons throughout the United States. Most of them

were never filled out and returned to him. homes still had letters and cards from George. begging them to please fill out as much as possible and send to him immediately, so he could write the first STATON history. I asked each family why they did not do this. They replied they did not know all the answers and did not wish to return the questionnaire incomplete. Each family said George visited them starting in 1914, they liked him and wished he had written the history, however, they thought he could get the information through some of their friends or relatives. Therefore, I think George died broken hearted because his own Staton relatives did not send the information which he felt sure they could and should have sent. I picked up some of his questionnaires with a few answers completed, and many letters he had written. We did not know he was dead then. His address was plainly shown on some as, "GEORGE WALTER STATON, Compiler and Historian-in-Chief, LAWRENCE, KANSAS, U.S.A." Therefore, these early Statons could have had a history if they had only cooperated by sending in the answers George requested. The U.S.A. at the end of the address shows he sought information from other countries. Joseph Lewis Staton, page 231, Chapter X, in this history, at one time corresponded with George, and knew about his trip to Europe in search of material; even going to Stratford-on-Avon.

It took this author two years to locate the family of George; yet, CALVIN, his grandfather (and, JOHN, mine) were brothers. Each time I wrote George in Lawrence, Kansas, the letter was returned for better address. Then I wrote the University of Kansas and found George and his sister Ida Estelle graduated in 1915 with B.A. degrees, but they lost touch with them in 1930. Then I wrote the Alumni Association in 1957 and received a letter from Mildred Clodfelter, secretary, on September 21, 1957, saying they corresponded until 1930. Last address of George was Lamar, Colorado. Last address of Ida Estelle Staton was 602 N. Kentucky Avenue, Roswell, New Mexico; and the last parent of the two was Sarah Staton formerly a resident of

Lawrence, Kansas. They also said George was born in 1888 at Columbus, Kansas, graduated from Cherokee High School at Columbus, Kansas in 1907 (the year this author was born), and came to Kansas University in 1909 with credits from Kansas normal. I believe he took off time to work on the STATON history before he graduated. He may have worked on Master and Doctor's degree. We know he later was an attorney.

Failing to locate George through the Alumni Association, I wrote Dolph Simons, editor of "The Lawrence Daily Journal World" who tried to locate George. He had known him and family between 1912 and 1915, and gave the Lamar, Colorado address as last known.

I did not stop. I visited Rear Admiral Adolphus Staton in Washington, D. C. He and his sister, Mrs. Sally B. Staton at Tarboro, N. C., put me in touch with cousins of George in Houston, Texas. He had visited in their home and gathered quite a lot of information, but needed and expected much more from other families. Many of his questionnaires were on the Eastern Shore. I wish he had written the history, because I know how hard he tried. Therefore, I try to get the information on a family while in their homes. I never located the manuscripts of George; only some letters written to Joseph Lewis Staton, listed on pages 231-254.

CHAPTER XVIII

(JAMES) FLEMING STATON - VIRGINIA-1791 - GA.-1880

The records show Warrington Staton (Will 1760 Accomack County, Va.) had a son, James Staton; James went to Buckingham County, Virginia, and in 1796 was paying tax on 870 acres of land. We believe his son, James Fleming, left that county and state in 1811 and came to Buncombe County with other Staton's who later went to South Carolina. Fleming did not use the first part of his name because there were several other James Statons. He was on a trip to Charleston, S. C., and spent the night at an Inn in S. C. where he met and later married Nancy Whitmire at the present town of Whitmire, S. C.

Please read NEWBERRY COUNTY, S. C. HISTORICAL & GENEALOGICAL by LELAND SUMMER, SR., WRITTEN IN 1950, for more information.

There is evidence that Fleming had relatives WHO MOVED ON TO BLOUNT COUNTY, ALABAMA (See Chapt. XII), and we find in U. S. Census there in 1850 a boy, 16 years of age, named FLEMING STATON, born in Alabama, son of Matilda (widow).

The 1850 U.S. Census of Hall County, Georgia, shows Fleming Staton living in Hall County, Ga., and his age was 59 years, a farmer owning \$1,200.00 worth of real estate. His wife, Nancy, was age 58 years, born in South Carolina in the same home was R. (Ruben) Staton, age 28; B. (Becky) Staton, age 19; P. (Polly) Staton, age 16 (female).

The head of the next home was Willis Staton (whom we know was the son of Fleming Staton). Willis Staton was born in Georgia, as was all his brothers and sisters above. The 1850 Census of Hall County, Ga. shows Willis Staton, age 31, farmer; wife, Amy Plemons, age 30; J. F. Staton, male, age 11; W. K. Staton, age 9, (male); M. M. Staton, female, age 9; G. Staton, female, age 4; G. T. Staton, male, age 3; S. Staton, age 1, (female).



CHAPTER XIX

STATONS IN MARYLAND TODAY

This chapter outlines most branches of Statons, who are now in Maryland and Delaware. We hope it may help others connect their lines back to the original John. It was compiled by Mr. & Mrs. Avery John Staton who have always lived in Salisbury, Maryland. Present address is 139 Louise Avenue.

Rev. Warner P. Staton; son of Thomas; grandson of Warrington Staton of Accomack County, Virginia, married Mary Givens. Warner was pastor of Nasiongo Primative Baptist Church for many years. He and his wife are buried about a mile south of the Church. The Church is located about 3 miles south of Salisbury, Maryland, on Hwy. #12. Mary Givens was born August 1, 1798, and died June 21, 1874. Warner was born January 29, 1798, and died May 24, 1851. His wife was called "Polly." They came to Worcester County, Maryland, from Accomack County, Virginia.

Warner owned part of the land which he purchased from Jesse Fooks, and part which he received from Thomas Staton (his father). On January 15, 1835, he paid Fooks \$275.00 for most of the land lying on the N.E. side of the road from Snow Hill to Salisbury, Maryland. This land was known by tracts called "Conclusion," "Gails Supply," "Miller's Supply," and "Confirmation."

The records in Worcester County, Maryland, show that most of this land was earlier received in a GRANT from Lord Baltimore to the original James Staton. Thomas signed his name STATON, but the clerk wrote the record STAYTON.

Joseph Staton had received part of this in a GRANT from Lord Baltimore.

Nehemiah Staton had at one time owned part of this land, and we believe he is the person putting a Y in the name Staton. However, the Clerk could have made all the errors and required the TITLE to be spelled with a Y from that day until several years later.

Warner Staton signed his name without the Y. At one time when the power of attorney was used the Y got back into the name again. I really do not believe the Y was ever officially a part of the name. I photographed monuments of this same Warner P. Staton, his wife, and son Rev. Daniel J. Staton at Nasiongo Primative Baptist Church, and also a field about a mile further south, and none of them used a Y in their names. The church, as stated earlier, is about 3 miles south of Salisbury, Maryland, on Highway 12.

Rev. Warner P. Staton lived near that church, and sold the land on which the church is situated to their trustees for 5 dollars on March 6, 1842.

Warner also owned land at Berlin, Maryland, and sold and gave his son, George W. Staton, land there. The clerk at one time spelled George Staton's last name STATEN (which was an error).

Warner also held some political appointments, I believe, such as County Commissioner when he

died in 1851. I believe he was also a Justice of the Peace in 1848.

There is much more material in Worcester County about Rev. Warner P. (Promise) Staton, and his son, John W., who owned a store in Berlin, Maryland, which occupied a city block. This store is still standing. Also the mansion of John W. Staton in West Berlin, Maryland, is in good condition and is pictured elsewhere in this history. His house and lot also covered a city block.

Many Staton families are in England today. We have only contacted a few. Among those are merchants, music instructors, printers, barbers, news editors, and others near London.



He believes the original Samuel Staton came from Manchester. He believes the Statons. Stauntons, Staintons, and Stantons descended from the same name. He said several members of his Staton line had! moved to America and he had lost tract of them, but he is interested in them and especially the history which this author is publishing on Jan. 1, 1960. Having taught school 15 years in America, this author would enjoy meeting this family and all the Staton's in England and over the world.

OUR CLOSING PRAYER

The birth of a book requires much confinement and SACRIFICE.

I have never heard or read of any author making the above statement, but believe every author had reason to make that statement.

For 18 years I have traveled, collected, visited luring my spare time, and begged for the information to compose the first STATON HISTORY. Many times my wife and I have driven most of Sunday night in order to get back from a research trip and be on duty in Charlotte, I. C., at eight in the morning on Monday.

We have often shed tears and tried to smile when we sould not determine a family connection to the original line.

We have sacrificed time needed for many other things and forced ourselves to do this research, which no one has ever found time to do. Five others tried and failed. Therefore, we did not relax for fear we might also go lown in the sea of defeat and let the Staton record remain a mystery forever.

Our telephone bill for one month in this research was \$145.66. I do not know how much gasoline was burned. We have worn out three automobiles, in addition to many repairs made on these cars in tires, parts, labor, and all the necessary costs of operating automobiles.

Thousands of pictures were made for this purpose. Many of them could not be used. We photographed nearly every Staton monument for proof of dates for the record.

Many times we have not read a newspaper or watched television, because the time was not available.

During these 18 years we watched every mail box we bassed to see if a Staton lived there; we found many, and always took time to try to get their family record.

The author has conducted many Staton funerals during is life and never accepted pay. He has assisted with many other funerals, and many times took time off of his work in the middle of the week and driven over two nundred miles without any compensation; and each time he paid some one to substitute to do his regular work.

Much more could be said about the sacrifice and confinement required in publishing this history.

Did we enjoy it? We always tried, but many times it was dreadful and painful.

Why did we do this history? Because no one else would do it, and it was necessary to preserve something of the past. Many records are lost, burned, and destroyed every year. If this could have been done a hundred years earlier, it would have included much information not available today.

Our prayer is that this history may be used, preserved, enlarged, and appreciated.
