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PREFACE

In the writing of a preface to any work, it is at once an explanation and an apology. If the reader is critical, the reading of the prefatory remarks is of course, a very necessary part of the work. If, on the other hand, the reader reads the contents of the work and ignores the preface, he may at the conclusion of the perusal have found enough of interest to cause him to feel enough curiosity about the writing of the book to turn back and read the writer's apology at the last.

This book is the result of many hours nay, months of concentrated effort on the part of one whose interest in her subject has led to many hours of work, many miles of travel and countless interviews with people who could answer the questions concerning the subject in which she was interested.

In the compiling of any history of a given family, it is necessary to interview members of that family, read records, go to see persons who are familiar with the family, visit scenes where in times past the family home was located and then, feeling that enough information has been collected, try to put the whole in orderly form and prepare the whole record for publication. It is not at all strange to find, upon completion of the preparation of the copy, to learn that some member or members of the identical family upon which so much labor has been spent to amass the information, has been completely overlooked. That in itself is both unfortunate and embarrassing.

The person most responsible and therefore most to merit the thanks of the Aldridge family for the information and the writing of the material for this history is Miss Daisy Aldridge, of Miami, Florida. She was named by her parents, Angela Josephine, and later came to be called by the name she prefers now, Daisy.

Miss Daisy started the work many years ago. She interviewed, she traveled, she found records, old Bibles and other family heirlooms and gathering it into a whole, finally felt that she had gotten enough material assembled to make a fairly clear history of the Aldridge family insofar as was possible with the source available. It is apparent to the reader that the work is incomplete. This is inevitable because of the fact that the Aldridge family has become scattered far and wide. If more information were available, if more of those who lived in the past had kept more complete records of their respective families, this effort to compile the information into a complete history would, of course have been far easier to complete.

Beginning this work one is confronted with the fact that of necessity one must start with a given ancestor. In this instance the progenitors are: Jesse Alldridge, Rachel Cobb and Andrew Saltzgeber. This, then is the beginning for this genealogy.

THE NAME AND FAMILY OF ALDRIDGE

It is stated by some writers that the name of ALDRIDGE or ALDRICH was taken from the residence of its first bearers at a place named Aldridge, in England, and that the two forms of the name were originally used interchangeably. Other family historians, however, hold that the name Aldrich was first used as a personal name and was later adopted by the sons of one so called as their surname. In early American records the names of Aldrich and Aldridge are used interchangeable and, in some cases, are even confused with the name of Eldridge or Eldredge, which seems to sustain the first theory, but this point cannot be definitely determined. The name is found in ancient English and early American records in the various spellings of Aldriche, Aldritch, Aldrige, Aldrigge, Aldretch, Aldrech, Aldredge, Aldridgh, Aldrigh, Aldridge, Aldrich, and others, of which the form last mentioned is that most generally used in America today, while the one immediately preceding it is also frequently found.

Families bearing this name were to be found at early dates in the English Counties of Suffolk, Norfolk, Oxford, Derby, Surrey, Hants, Stafford, and London. Records indicate that they were, for the most part, of the landed gentry and yeomanry of Great Britain.

One of the earliest known lines of the family in England was that of William Aldrich, who was Bailiff of Yarmouth, County Norfolk, as early as the year 1468 and possibly before. William was the father of another William, who was the father of Thomas, who married Elizabeth Wood and was the father by her of William, Thomas, a son whose name is not known, and Michell. Of these last-mentioned sons of Thomas and Elizabeth of County Norfolk, William (who is called "Gregory" by some writers) married a daughter of William Halsey or Hayles and was the father by her of William, Augustine (died young), Augustine, John, Thomas, and Lucy; Thomas married Scisselly Bishop, by whom he was the father of Richard, Thomas, John, Augustine, Christian (died young), Scisselly, Joane, Jane, Elizabeth,

Anne, and Christian of whom the first was the father by his wife, Elizabeth Steward, of Thomas, Augustine, Richard, Christian, Anne, and Mary; and the son whose name is not known (although some family historians believe it to have been "John") married Elizabeth Sotherton (another writer says her name was "Faith Steward") and was the father by her of John (died young), Timothy, John, Anne, Elizabeth, Mary, Hester, Faith, and Elizabeth, of whom the second John was the father by his wife, Anne Bacon, of Thomas, John, and Henry.

Another early branch of the family in England was that of Robert Aldriche or Aldrich, who resided in Staffordshire before the beginning of the seventeenth century, having been born about 1575. Robert married Anne Horobin, by whom he was the father of Henry, Jonah, Robert, George, and Rowland, all of whom probably left numerous issue.

While it is not definitely known from which of the several lines of the family in England the first emigrants of the name to America were descended, it is generally believed that most, if not all, of the Aldrichs (and possibly the Aldridges as well) derive from a common ancestor of a remote period.

The first of the name in America was George Aldrich of Derbyshire, England, who came to America in 1631, bringing with him his wife Katherine or Catharine Seald, whom he had married in 1629. He settled first at Dorchester, Mass., whence he later removed to Braintree, in the same colony, probably about 1644, and thence to Mendon, Mass., in 1663.

Sometime before the year 1643 Henry Aldrich or Aldridge made his home at Dedham, Mass., where he was the father by his wife Mary of Thomas, Mary, and Samuel. The son Samuel probably died without issue, as no further record has been found concerning his descendants.

Thomas, who is believed to have been the elder son of the immigrant Henry, was married at Dedham in 1675 to Elizabeth Prentice, who died shortly afterward without issue. In 1678 he married Hannah Colburn, by whom he was the father of Hannah, John, Mary, and Thomas.

Others of the name who emigrated to America at early dates but left few records of their immediate families or

descendants include Francis or Frances Aldridge of James City County, Va., in 1636; William and Thomas Aldridge of Virginia in 1650; Robert Aldrich or Aldridge of Braintree, Mass., in 1656; and George Aldrich of Swanzey, Mass., in 1669.

According to some family historians, three brothers of the name of Aldrich were early settled at Oxford, Mass., and it is considered possible that one of these was that Edward Aldrich who was living there in 1740 and who was the father of Calvin and others. From this branch is said to have been descended one Silas Aldrich, who went to Bradford, Vt., about 1759 and was the father of Phebe, Betsey, Richard, Abigail, Elsy, Silas, Asa, and Ephraim. It seems quite probable, however, that these were descendants of the earlier immigrant George or of one of the other early New England lines.

Some family historians state that one Aldrich (Christian name unknown) came from England to Mendon, Mass., in the latter half of the eighteenth century and was the father there of a son named Nathan. It is, however, also probable in this case that the descent was actually from the earlier Mendon family.

The offspring of these and possibly of later lines of the family in America have spread to all parts of the United States and have aided as much in the development of the nation as their ancestors did in its establishment upon this continent. The family in America may be described as an energetic, ambitious, self-reliant, and resourceful race. Characterized also by considerable intellectual ability and determination of purpose, they have been outstanding in almost every field of endeavor.

Among those of the name who fought in the War of the Revolution were Captain George, of New Hampshire; Lieutenant Levi, of Massachusetts; Lieutenant William, of Rhode Island; and numerous others from the various New England and southern states.

Thomas, William, George, Richard, Robert, Joseph, Peter, Samuel, Jacob, David, Jonathan, Moses, Ephraim, and John are some of the Christian names preferred by the family for its male progeny.

A few of the many members of the family who have distinguished themselves in America in more recent times are:

Thomas Bailey Aldrich (1836-1907), of New Hampshire and Massachusetts, author and editor.

Nelson Wilmarth Aldrich (1841-1915), of Rhode Island, legislator.

Chester Holmes Aldrich (b. 1871), of Rhode Island and New York, architect.

Richard S. Aldrich (b. 1884), of Washington, D.C., and Rhode Island, member of the Rhode Island House of Representatives and Senate and Congressman.

William Truman Aldrich (b. 1880), of Washington, D.C., and Massachusetts, architect.

Winthrop Williams Aldrich (b. 1885), of Rhode Island and New York, banker.

Walter Hull Aldridge (b. 1867), of New York, mining engineer.

One of the most ancient and best-known of the coats of arms of the English family of Aldrich, from which the American families of Aldrich and Aldridge are descended, is described as follows (Burke, General Armory, 1884):

Arms.--"Or (another, argent), on a fesse vert a bull passant argent."

THE NAME OF THE FAMILY OF ALDRIDGE

Aldridge is a name which has had a number of orthographies; Aldrich, Alritch, Alderidge, Aldishe, Aldrage, Aldriche, Aldridg, Aldridge, Aldrige, Aldritch, Alldridge, Alldredge, Allderidge, Alrick, Alridge, Oldage, Oldrege, Oldridge and many others. The name comes from a Saxon word---"Aldred" meaning old or ancient---also "Ald" and "Eld" means old. According to one writer the first surnames are found in the tenth century. The population had so increased that it became necessary to designate people other than by their Christian names. Surnames were originated by the people from a trade, some trait of character, or from the place where they lived. Tradition has it that the Aldridge people were Welsh, from which our ancestors immigrated to America. Our forefathers did not have the advantage of education we have today, and each spelled the name as he thought it should be, there being only a small percentage of people who could even write their own names. The records show that in the Mayflower, out of more than a hundred people, there were only three who could read or write. The first syllable of the name, Aldridge, viz: "Ald" is a corruption of the English word "Auld" meaning old. The old English word of "Eld" means the same thing. The last syllable is from a word meaning "point of land or ridge". The Welsh pronuciation is "redge", sometimes sounding nearly like "retch". When our ancient people decided to have a surname, they were living in a primitive manner in the hills of Wales as free men. To designate themselves, they were known as the people from the "Auld Ridge," this being the designation of their chain of hills, which was known far and wide as "The Auld Ridge." There is no record of an Aldridge being of nobility, but the descendants have always been industrious people and good citizens of the countries where they have resided.

It is well known that centuries ago the great majority of our Ancestors had only one name--commonly called the Christian name--but afterward, in the course of their lives, either at quite an early stage of their manhood or subsequently, they adopted or were given another name, which, in the course of time, became the surname. This second name was derived from many different sources, such as

occupation, estate, business, personal appearance, or some particular thing or event relating to the person. Thus John, the Smith, became John Smith; Karl Von New Burg became Charles Newbury; Tom-O-Lincoln, became Thomas Lincoln. Edmund Ironsides was so called either on account of his great strength or the armor which he wore. It was not until the fifteenth century that surnames became general in England.

ALDRIDGE OR ALDRICH ARMS

ARMS: "Ermine, on a chevon engrailed Argent, between three griffins, heads raised, as many lozenges."

CREST: "A Grafin Segerant," (No Motto Given). Except the name means old or ancient.

The heraldic colors are silver (argent); ermine, the fur, symbolizes rank and dignity; the griffins are "proper", or in national coloring. "Segreant", means with outspread wings. A chevon, means "protection"; "Engrailed", the possession of land; the griffin denotes vigilance and also protection.

This is the Coat of Arms ascribed to Frances Aldridge or Aldrich, of Boston, Massachusetts in 1752.

The Aldridge's were some of the first to come to America. Robert Aldridge appears to be the first, just what year he came over is not known. He died at James Town in 1624, (Immigrants to America-Hotten). This is in the reign of James I of England, the Stuart Line. Muster of inhabitants across the water at Virginia, 1624/25. Those that live in ye Treasurers Plantation at James Citty..... on the dead list "at these Plantations" in the name of Robert Aldridge (Ref: Adventurs of Paurse & Persons. Page 41 If this Robert left a wife and children no record has been found of them.

The next immigrant seem to have been George Aldrich, he came from England to Massachusetts in the year 1631. His wife was Catherine Seald. Twelve children were born to this union.

Henry Aldridge and wife Mary, Dedham, Massachusetts,

probably came to this country about 1644. It is said he is the son of Thomas and Mary (Checkering) Alred, of Brampton, Suffolk, England. Three of their children were Mary, born 1643; Samuel, born 1645; Thomas, perhaps 1647. (Early Records of Boston Vol. 4, P. 360-Vol. 8, P. 280).

There are many more, with intensive research and hard work, one should be able to establish his or her immigrant ancestor. This requires the fullest co-operation from members of the family far and wide, who is willing to share any old record they may possess. Bible records and etc. are invaluable. Many of the old court records were destroyed by fire when the Court Houses burned to the ground and never can be replaced.

Clement Aldridge of Worstead, Norfolk, England, settled in Northumberland County, Virginia in the 1650's. His wife was Susan Boswell. They seem to have several sons and daughters who also came over at different intervals.

Thomas Aldridge left port of London February 1774. He was from Meddlesex, sailed on ship Letitia, to Maryland, age 24. (New Eng. Hist. Gen. Reg. Vol 63).

Thomas Aldridge left port of London April 1774. He was from Essex, sailed on ship Lousia, to Maryland, age 21. (New Eng. Hist. Gen. Reg. Vol. 63).

Christopher Aldridge left port of London 13 February 1775. He was from London, sailed on ship Maryland Planter, to Maryland, age 24. (Emmigrants to America from England 1773-1776. Vol. E187.5 P. 53).

The Aldridge's came to this country early and all through the years following the first permanent settlement at Jamestown. By 1790 when the first federal census was taken over eighty-six families of Aldridge's were living in the various states.

Jesse Aldridge, our common progenitor in this family of Aldridge's was born in the state of Georgia. His birth date has not been definitely established. He married Rachel Cobb in Amite County, Mississippi, 12 June 1813, and on the 24 December 1814 he enlisted in the war of 1812 as a private in Captain Moses Odam's Company, Ten and Twenty Consolidated Regiment Louisiana Militia, commanded by Lieutenant Colonel William Willis; served 3 months and 7 days and was discharged 31 March 1815. No record of his participation in any battle has been found. He gave his residence as Clinton, Louisiana. (War Dept. Adjutant General's Office, Washington, D. C.). His son Benjamin Franklin told that his father was in the famous battle of January 8, 1815 called the Battle of New Orleans which was fought after peace treaty was signed, but news too slow reaching there. So we may assume that he was a grown man at this time and was perhaps born in the 1790's, or before 1796.

Georgia became a royal province in 1752. The Colony claimed all the land between North Carolina and Florida, and the Atlantic, and the Mississippi. The first counties were formed in 1777. Georgia ratified the federal constitution on January 2, 1788, and thus became the fourth state in the union. In 1790 there were eleven counties from north to south as follows: Franklin, Wilkes, Greene, Richmond, Burke, Washington, Effingham, Chatham, Liberty, Glynn and Camden.

In 1798 the territory of Mississippi was created from the western half of Georgia. Later that territory was formed into the state of Mississippi and Alabama.

There is no 1790 census of Georgia, but many court records give the names of the inhabitants.

This brief sketch about the early history of Georgia and all the land that once belonged to it, is to try to let you know that Jesse Aldridge could have been born in most any spot from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River. He could have been born in what is now, either of the three states, Mississippi, Alabama or Georgia.

Any of the following persons could have been his parents.

George Aldridge of Adams County, Mississippi.
 William Aldridge of Wilkes County, Georgia.
 Absalom Aldridge of Fayette County, Georgia.
 James Aldredge of Richmond and Columbia County,
 Georgia.

George Aldridge was listed as living in the Natchez district when the French and Spanish were there in 1792. (Inhabitants of Natchez district 1792-Jorge Aldrige) He died October 1823 in Adams County. In the settlement of his estate, Alfred Millard was the administrator, Sylvester Aldridge and Peter Black as his securities. Simpson Holmes was granted guardianship of James Aldridge a minor over the age of 14. Simpson Holmes and Anna Aldridge were witnesses of the account against the estate. An account against Lewis Aldridge for \$22.50 was presented. Perhaps these were some of the children of George Aldridge. Jesse Aldridge did not die until the last of 1825 or the first of 1826 and his name is not mentioned in the estate settlement and is perhaps not his son.

William Aldridge of Wilkes County, Georgia was a Revolutionary soldier and pensioner, was born 2 January 1754 in Rowan County, North Carolina, after the war he moved to Ninety-sixth District, Spartanburg County, South Carolina, and from there to Columbia County, Georgia, in 1792, then later to Wilkes County, where he died in 1835. He was perhaps the son of Nicholas Aldredge, who died in Columbia County, in 1792, for he only mentions in his will the name of his wife Rebecca and son William who would have been 38 years old at this time. In the four years from 1792 to 1796, our Jesse could have been born, makes William a potentiality, but no proof has been found to make them father and son.

Absalom Aldridge, who was probably the brother of William and called Abner for short, first appears in the 1790 census of Edgefield County, ninety-sixth district, South Carolina. He is listed as having one male child under sixteen and one female child. He also left South Carolina and went into Georgia to live. We find him first in Columbia County, where he was a witness to a deed of 330 acres of land sold by Benjamin Grubbs to James Aldredge on a branch of Uchee Creek, September 24, 1798 (Deed Bk. M. pg. 30, Rec. 11 Oct. 1803, Columbia County, Ga.) He moved on to Oglethorpe County

and in the 1805 Land Lottery he had two draws. In the land Lottery of 1827 while living in Houston County, he drew a lot in Cherokee County. In 1830 he was living in Fayette County. The census gives him as being between 70 and 80, thus born in the 1750's, perhaps North Carolina. His wife's age is between 50 to 60, thus born in the 1770's. One female age 20 to 30 is living with him at this time. Absalom Aldredge perhaps died in Fayette County, but no Will or an estate settlement has been found and the names of his children are unknown.

James Aldredge, first of Richmond County, is the most likely father of Jesse, since he seems to be the first one to have a permanent residence in Georgia. He bought 100 acres of land from John and Margaret Grubbs, in St. Paul's Parish (Richmond County, Georgia), on September 10, 1776 (Bk. G.I., Pg. 223. Richmond County). No other Aldredge according to the records lived in Georgia until after 1790, so if Jesse was born before 1791, James would be the most likely father. In the 1790 census of South Carolina, fourteen families of Aldridge's, of the various spelling of the name were living there at this time, viz:

James Aldredge of Richmond and Columbia County, Georgia, wife's name was Rosanna and was called Roza. Only one of their children's name is known. This was James. In 1784 James Aldred gives power of attorney to James Aldridge, to call on the Governor for certificate on 250 acres of bounty land he was entitled. This indicates father and son. The father being old or ill at this date, having his son to make the trip. No Will or settlement of his estate has been found. Perhaps it was destroyed during the Civil War, or burned along with some Courthouse. All the Aldridge's of Georgia and South Carolina perhaps migrated from Maryland via. North Carolina, and all are related in some way.

The first record found of Jesse Alldridge is where he received a license to marry Rachel Cobb in Amite County, Mississippi. William Furlow was his bondsman. If he ever owned any land no record has been found. He may have worked on William Furlow's Plantation as a share-cropper. Some of their children are supposed to have been born in Louisiana. In 1820 he was living in Jefferson County, Mississippi, and it is traditionally said he died in Adams County, in or near Natchez. The story is that he was living near the river in the fall or winter of 1825-26, becoming ill during the time the river was flooding the land, and while lying in bed saw a deer passing by his window aroused from his feeding place by the expanding waters of the Mississippi. His gun was handed to him and he shot through the window and killed the deer. The mighty Mississippi kept rising and expanding until it became necessary to take his family and move to higher ground. The exposure involved during this crucial time became fatal, pneumonia was the result and he died. Just where he is buried is not known. A search in Jefferson, Adams and Amite Counties in many Cemeteries and Graveyards failed in finding a marker where he may have been buried. Rachel, his wife, is buried in the Humphries Graveyard, Trigg County, Kentucky, along with two of her daughters, Lourena and Loucada. Two sons William J. and James W. are buried in Texas, the other son Benjamin F. is buried in the Ruggles Graveyard in Marshall County, Kentucky.

A search for many years was made of records in many states and counties to try and establish who were the parents of Jesse and Rachel by Miss Daisy Aldridge, a granddaughter, and later a great-grandson, F. R. Aldridge made an extensive search in most of the southern states, but all was in vain and no authentic proof was found. Many such needed records were destroyed by fire when Courthouses burned. Rachel's mother is said to have been a MAY. Miss Daisy Aldridge in her childhood heard her father Benjamin F., quote many times about how a letter was addressed to his aunt Sophia May who was then living at Clinton, Louisiana. It was addressed with a verse. "Swift as the train pursue your way, Stop not for flag nor banner, Until you reach Miss Sophia May in Clinton, Louisiana". One James Cobb of Warren County, Georgia, wife was Susannah May, who migrated to Mississippi and Louisiana. They may have been the parents but no proof of this has been found. Rachel after the death of Jesse married in the fall of 1826 Andrew Saltzgiver. Three children were born to this union. Sometime in the 1830's they made the journey to Trigg County, Kentucky, where a great many of their descendants now live.

JAMES WASHINGTON ALDRIDGE, SR.

2. James Washington Aldridge born 1815 in Louisiana, came to Trigg County, Kentucky, about the year 1834 along with his mother, stepfather, brothers and sisters. He married 24 December 1841 Judith Ann Humphries. The daughter of Col. John and Elizabeth (Husk) Humphries. He was a farmer and lived on Sinking Fork Creek, five miles east of Cadiz near the old Humphries Graveyard. During the Civil War one day he heard the big guns at Fort Donelson, Tennessee, he went to the home of a neighbor and kinsman, Charles Humphries, and he and one of the Humphries boys, a son of Charles, took their old flintlock guns on their shoulders and walked to Fort Donelson, about thirty miles over the Cumberland River and joined with the Confederate forces there.

A letter from the War Department dated 4 January 1944 to Miss Daisy Aldridge, of Miami, Florida, in which she requested the military record of James Alldridge is as follows:

"Union Prisoner of War records show that James Alldridge, not found as James W. Aldridge, private Company D, 8th Kentucky Infantry, Confederate States Army, was captured 16 February 1862 at Fort Donelson, and was imprisoned at Camp Morton, Indiana, his name appears on an undated roll of Prisoners of War at Camp Morton, Indiana, who have taken the oath of allegiance to the United States, which bears the following remark: Trigg County, Kentucky. No later record of him has been found.

The name James W. Alldridge (Aldridge) has not been found on the Muster rolls on file in the office of Company D. 8th Kentucky Mounted Infantry, Confederate States Army, which covers the period from October 13 1861 to 31 December 1862, and no record has been found of the date and place of his entry into service.

The collection of Confederate States Army records on file in this office is incomplete and failure to find them complete, or any record of a person therein is by no means conclusive proof that such person did not serve during some period not covered by the records on file.

(Signed) J. A. Ulie, Major General; The Adjutant General, by: HMF."

According to Mrs. Rowena (Aldridge) Payne, the place of imprisonment was Smithland, Kentucky. She had heard her father mention many times that James W. Aldridge, Jim as he was called, could hear the guns at Fort Donelson, and being a sympathizer for the southern cause, walked to Fort Donelson with his gun to enter the fighting. He entered a trench near the place where one of his neighbors, a Mr. Turner was. He made the remark to Mr. Turner and the boys around, "By jolly boys I have come to die with you." After the surrender he was taken to Smithland, Kentucky, as a prisoner of war. They kept him in prison for four years as he refused to take the oath of allegiance of the federal government. After returning home his wife soon died. After a short while he moved to Texas where he died in a few years. He is believed to be buried at Fort Worth.

To this union was born seven children three boys and four girls. Later in years it must have been in the 1870's, he and his daughter, Margaret, went to Texas to visit his son Valverta, who lived at that time at Chico, Wize County, while there he took sick with fever and died. He was buried there in Wize County. His seven children were:

WILLIAM J. ALLDREDGE

3. William J. Alldredge is probably the 2nd son of Jesse and Rachel (Cobb) Alldridge. He was probably born in Louisiana also and came to Kentucky with his mother and stepfather about the year 1834. He married 16 November 1842 Ann E. Coen or Koen daughter of Albert Coen of Trigg County, Kentucky. Not much is known

about him as he was supposed to have gone to Texas a few years after he married. Wondering if some of his descendants may be still living there, this author sent letters of inquiry to persons by the same name in Texas. A letter received from Mrs. Lorine Brinley, of Houston, revealed that a great many descendants were living there. She, herself, a descendant of John Alldredge who was born about 1789 in Georgia, who was a uncle or great uncle of William J. The exact relationship has not been definitely established. Luck would have it that a grandson Llewlyn Thomas Alldredge born 22 December 1879 (age 77) was still living at Lufkin. From him and others after several months of correspondence we obtained the following story..... Llewlyn says his grandfather died in Tennessee and never got to Texas. After William J. and Anne E. married they lived in Trigg County, Kentucky, where their first two daughters were born, Alzadia September 1844 and Mary Luezer January 1846. One Sunday while sitting on his porch a man came by and shot him. It was not known if it was accidental or intentional. He lived about two years after being shot but his wife said his death was caused by the wound of this gunshot. Their third child William Francis was born 19 June 1849 in Tennessee, after his father died. If this is true William J. is buried some place in Tennessee, perhaps Stewart County. After this Anne with her three children and relatives went to Texas to live.

A daughter of Mary Luezer says her grandfather died after arriving in Texas. That her mother told her that they came to Texas from Kentucky. And that she was old enough to remember the boat ride down the Mississippi River, and that her sister and brother were large enough to remember, and that their daddy died about six months after arriving in Texas. Anne married Marion Redd soon after his death because both had lost their mates and had small children to rear. Her grandfather she was told, was a very religious man and was sitting on his porch reading his Bible when he was shot. The shot being fired by a stranger who was passing through the country and was spending the night in the home of the Alldredge's. She did not know if the shot was accidental or not. The shot hit him in the face on the right side of the jaw, and it was from this gun wound that he died, after arriving

in Texas. He took cold in his jaw and it became fatal. He settled on some land owned by John Alldredge. The land being on Jack's Creek, Angelina County, Texas.

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN ALDRIDGE

The third child born to Jesse and Rachel (Cobb) Aldridge. He was born 26 February 1821 in Amite County, Mississippi. Some say he was born in Amite City, Louisiana, what is now Tangipahoa Parish. The name Amite in both states could have caused this mix-up in place of birth. Being about four years old when his father died, very little he could remember about him. He and his two brothers and sisters lived with their mother until she married 14 September 1826 Andrew Saltzgiver. For the next several years they must have moved around to several places as three more children were born to Andrew and Rachel while living in Louisiana. About 1834 Andrew and Rachel with their eight children took a boat up the Mississippi River to the Ohio River and down the Cumberland River to Canton, where they debarked for the land trip five miles east of Cadiz to settle near where the Humphries lived. Being fortunate while growing up he was able to obtain enough education to teach school in his later years at different places in Trigg County. At age 28 he married 6 February 1849 Sarah C. Stokes. They moved to Tennessee where three of their children were born. In 1854 they moved to Ballard County, Ky., where five more children were born. Sarah died at the age of forty-eight perhaps in Trigg County after they left Ballard. Soon after Sarah died Benjamin Franklin met and married Elizabeth Susan Chambers. To this union four children were born. Elizabeth Susan died in 1885, and in 1888 he married the third time Mary S. Chambers, widow, Latham. To this union was born one child. The last place he is known to have lived is Trigg County on the Dave Mitchell place, three miles north of Egners Ferry, on the east side of Crooked Creek, near Pleasant Valley Baptist Church. He left there November 1899 and went to live in Marshall County, Kentucky, near Palma. He died the following year March 21, with Bronchial Pneumonia,

and is buried near where he lived last in the Ruggles Cemetery, a family burying ground. The inscription on his tombstone reads: Benjamin F. Aldridge born February 25, 1821; died March 21, 1900; age 79 years 24 days; His life was triumph of vertue, his death a triumph of faith.

MISS DAISY ALDRIDGE

459. Miss Daisy Aldridge, the eleventh child born to Benjamin Franklin Aldridge, and third child born to him by Elizabeth Susan Chambers, was born in Stewart County, Tennessee, near Fort Henry, Rural, near the Kentucky-Tennessee line and later moved across the line to Trigg County, Kentucky, on what was known as the Downs Place and near her Great-grandfather William Haynes place.

Next place of residence a few miles away at a place called "The Quarters" where her brother was born (R. R. Aldridge).... Next place was Woodville near Golden Pond, she was at this time about five years old.... There she spent her first day in school.... schoolmaster was Williams. However, her father was teaching in another district and she decided she wanted to go to school with her father. This she did. This school was called Walnut Grove (Trigg). About the year 1881 she moved to Calloway County and lived on the farm with her grandmother Mary "Polly" (Haynes) Chambers. The Grandfather, James Chambers was dead at this time. This farm was owned by Mary Chambers at this time. It was located near a place called Blood. (Blood P. O. Calloway County)She lived there a year, she left there and went back to Trigg County, to the same community she first

lived in at a place called "Mousie House", near Spicland here she lived to the first of 1882 and then moved to Christian County, near Bainbridge. On the way they stopped at the Humphries home, her relatives. (Boatwright lived joining farms to Mary Haynes in Calloway County in 1881).

She went back to Trigg County, in 1884 where her mother passed away January 2, 1885 near Golden Pond and was buried in the Long Creek Cemetery. Then she started to school at Cadiz, Kentucky, also in the year 1893 she joined the Baptist Church at Cadiz and was baptized in the Little River. The next year she started to teaching school at Cadiz, and for seven years she taught in Public Schools in Trigg County. In 1900 she took a business course in Bowling Green, Kentucky, and later went into business of her own as a Public Stenographer and Notary Public and remained in this business until 1918.

On October 1, 1918 she had joined the American Red Cross and went to Europe with the American Expeditionary Force, the Red Cross being an arm of our Government in World War I. She closed her office in Bowling Green and sailed from New York and was placed in the European Headquarters in Paris, France, where she worked in the Clerical Departments as Secretary under several different branches. Stayed in this work until July 1919, when she returned to the United States and was with the American National Red Cross in Washington, D. C. until the winter of 1921. She returned to Kentucky and established the same Service work as Public Stenographer and Notary Public in Hopkinsville, Christian County, Kentucky, where she remained until June 1925 when she went to Miami, Florida and became connected with the Jaudon Realty Company as secretary.

While in the office in Paris, France in World War I, she helped organize the business office of the Medical and Surgical Department, which was headquarters for all Europe. Hon. H. P. Davidson, Council for United States in American Red Cross Work, in Europe in World War I. Mr. Davidson presented to her a special book, after the war was over, which was only a special issue of records that she had helped to compile while in the Paris office. This book is now in the Kentucky Building Museum, Bowling Green Western State College, Bowling Green, Kentucky.

In her travels and experience she met many prominent and outstanding people; Mrs. Boardman Harriman; Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt, Sr.; Brigadier Roger D. Williams, of Lexington, Kentucky, and many other prominent officials in World War I, and also in Washington, D.C. A Women's patriotic organization was formed in 1921 in the United States of the women who served in World War I, Overseas, called the Women's Overseas Service League, of which she became a member and rendered much service in that organization; - during the years she was in Hopkinsville, Kentucky she had a great part in organizing the Dark Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association in 1922.

During her experience in Bowling Green, Kentucky she had the honor of taking two stenographic reports of readings of the famous clairvoyant, Edgar Cayce. She knew Mr. Cayce practically all his life.

During the 18 years in Bowling Green, Kentucky she had many varied and interesting experiences. She typed for the famous writer, Lyda Calvert Hall; and they were three years writing the famous book called the Old Fashioned Coverlet, which was published in England and now it is in the American Libraries. Also she wrote the Historical subjects for the Kentucky Magazine, published at Lexington, Kentucky under the director, Mr. Sterling Huntington, some years prior to World War I, and the same research work she did for the Southern Women's Magazine, published at Nashville, Tennessee under supervision of Mrs. Ann Rankin. Also she wrote short stories and Newspaper articles, one being on the National Highways which was published in the old Traveler's Protective Association.

In 1925 she left Hopkinsville, Kentucky and went to Miami, Florida and became connected with the Jaudon Realty Company - at that time the famous Tamiami Trail was in the beginning, this is the famous highway built across the Everglades of Florida, which was thought an impossible task. Captain J. F. Jaudon of the Jaudon Realty Company, was the outstanding leader in the building of this road which was not completed until 1928. The road was named by Captain Jaudon, the "Tamiami Trail" and dedication took place April 28, 1928. Captain Jaudon passed away

in 1938 and she started on the project of a marker for him and the 13 years work of the famous road. In 1953 she was interviewed by an official of the Southern Florida Historical Society, wherein her memory of the building of the Tamiami Trail was recorded, and that year she wrote a sketch of this project. Finally three markers were allowed by the Southern Florida Historical Society, and dedication took place on June 7, 1958 when a marker was placed, one at Miami, one at Everglades, Florida on the Gulf Coast and one at Fort Myers, Kentucky.

Another of her pet projects was homes for the Aged Citizens of our Nation. She started in about 1953 on this subject through The Women's Missionary Society of her church, the Southern Baptist Convention, and in November 1958 at a State Convention of the Florida Baptist, the project had the last and final hurdle or endorsement, and the State Convention adopted the plan for not only one home for the Retired Citizens, but several are to be located in the state. This work she extended also to the Welfare Department of the State of Florida through the Governor's Office at Tallahassee, Florida. This work is being extended into many states of the Convention at this time. The Southern Baptist Convention covers some 43 States at this time--January 1959.

She has been a devoted member of the Baptist Church all her life, - was an active worker in every place she lived, especially in Miami, Florida where she lived from June 1925, - Taught in Sunday School for many years, and in the Missionary Society.

She became a Notary Public in January 1907, and she placed a renewal year by year every four years, and in 1959 was still holding a Notary Commission,--52 years. In 1941 she started making Income Tax Reports for clients and has continued that work in her office at her home, where she does still much church work, and besides being Historian for the Women's Overseas Service League, Miami Unit, of which she is a Charter member. She has 12 scrapbooks. She presented in 1945 a historical scrapbook of 150 pages, to the above museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

At age 84 years at her Miami home she is still active in her every day chores, being still keen in memory of her long and useful life.

It is said that he was Dutch. Just when Andrew made his journey from Pennsylvania to Mississippi is not known, he may have made the trip in 1796 when a group of inventives, Pennsylvania Dutchmen, who built a queer craft near Pittsburgh, it took them down the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. They abandoned the craft at Natchez and some went back home on foot. (Lower Miss.- by Hadding Carteo - p. 214). The first record we find of Andrew is where he married in Amite County, Mississippi 18 May 1820 to Phoebe Welch, a widow, who was previously married in the same county, 5 September 1813 to James Welch. A great-granddaughter Mrs. Mabel Decker, of Salt Lake City, Utah, says the tradition in our family is that he married a lady whose husband had been killed in the war of 1812, so they thought. But after they had been married a while, the husband came home. Mr. Saltzgiver talked to the man and told him that he and the lady had no children, and he would just leave, and for him and her to take up where they had left off when he went to war. Their understanding was that he had been killed, so no one was to blame. The year that James Welch came back home is not known, in this interim he met Rachel with her five children, with five children to support after the death of Jesse was very serious and tradition it was said she was thinking of "binding" some of them out to the planters, but the marriage to Andrew kept this from happening. Andrew and Rachel with the children went to Louisiana to live and soon after 1830 they made the long journey up the Mississippi and Ohio Rivers, then down the Cumberland to Canton and Trigg County, Kentucky.

Andrew lived to be real old and died sometime in the 1860's. He is buried in the Humphries Graveyard. 10. Orlando Pool Saltzgiver md. 13 December 1856 Charity Hendon, daughter of James and Charity (Vinson) Hendon. She was born 29 January 1834 and died 14 August 1893. She and Orlando had seven children. After Charity died Orlando then married Sarah Hendon, a sister of Charity's who was previously married to Cephas Outland. There were no children by this marriage. In the Civil War Orlando was a private of Captain Weller's Company (Also called Captain Taylor's Company and Captain Stankiewics's Company), Tennessee Light Artillery, Confederate States Army, he enlisted November 27, 1861, at Fort Henry. Union prisoner of war records shows that he was captured at Fort Henry February 6, 1862; imprisoned at Alton, Illinois, and sent to Vicksburg, Mississippi, September 23, 1862, for exchange. The company muster roll for November and December, 1862, show him present and sick. He was retired to the Invalid Corps, Provisional Army, Confederates States, November 17, 1864, totally disabled. No later record of him has been found. The collection of Confederate States Army records on file in this Department is incomplete and the failure to find the complete or any record of any person thereon is by no means conclusive proof that such person did not serve at some period not covered by the records. (Signed: J. A. Ulic, Brigadier General, Acting The Adjutant General, By Good, Dated at Washington, D. C. April 18, 1941): He lost a leg in this war and is buried between his two wives in the Ruggles Graveyard in Marshall County, Kentucky.

THE HUMPHRIES FAMILY

DESCENDANTS OF CHARLES HUMPHRIES OF VIRGINIA

By John D. Humphries

(Additional data added by F. R. Aldridge)

The facts recorded here are supplementary to Descendants of Charles Humphries of Virginia by John D. Humphries and are based upon Colonists of Carolina by Mrs. Blanche Humphrey Abee, with whose consent they are used. Page references are to that work unless otherwise indicated.

1. Evan Humphreys came to Virginia as a colonist (pages 10, 36, 37; Surry County Order Book, 1679-1693, page 353). He was a "titheable" in 1679, tithes being levied upon the personal industry of the individual as well as upon the profits of real and personal property; a freeholder in 1687; a member of the Virginia Militia in 1687 (pages 10, 36; William and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 11, page 86); included in Quit Rent Roll in 1704; made deed in 1704; acquired land in 1710. He must have emigrated to America a few years before 1679 when not more than twenty-five or thirty years of age. Therefore he was born about 1645 or 1650. He married Jane Harris. Of him, Mrs. Abee says; "His wife was Jane, and apparently, Robert Humphrey was their son."

2. Robert Humphrey lived in Surry County, Virginia. The records disclose many transfers of lands in which he was interested. If he was the son of Evan Humphreys he was born about 1670 or 1675. He died in 1713 and his wife, Mary _____ administered his estate. Mrs. Abee (page 10) says: "It is thought that John Humphrey was the son of Robert and Mary."

3. John Humphries was born in Virginia about 1690 or 1695. He married Mary White (page 10). He died in the Parish of Saint Andrews, Brunswick County, Virginia in 1738. His will was dated April 19, 1738. It appears in full in Colonists of Carolina, page 234. The sons named in his will were William, John, Thomas, Charles, and Richard, all of whom, with the possible exception of Richard, were minors. He had a daughter named Elizabeth who married Thomas Wright (page 36). In view of the terms of the will it would seem that Richard and Elizabeth were adults in 1738. They may have been children by a former marriage.

The work of Mrs. Abee (Colonists of Carolina) is most valuable, because it is exhaustive of the early Virginia Records for the period covered. It not only supports the claim that Charles Humphries was the son of John Humphries, but excludes the idea of any other relationship. The statement in Dr. Frederick Humphreys' book, the Humphreys Family in America, and referred to in Descendants of Charles Humphries of Virginia (page 7) to the effect that Charles Humphries was born about 1710 or 1715, is erroneous. It does not purport to be definite. The dates of the marriage and birth of children of Charles Humphries support this conclusion. Charles Humphries was under 18 in 1738.

In his will (Book 2, page 2, Brunswick County Records) John Humphries bequeathed to his wife, Mary Humphries, "the tract of land and plantation whereon I now live" as an absolute and indefeasible estate. He bequeathed an "entry of land I have on Allen's Creek, containing 400 acres of land, to my four sons, to wit: one hundred acres of land to each son, only I will and bequeath that one hundred acres, part of said tract, being the part whereon I am now settling, shall be for the use and benefit, culture and occupation of my loving wife, Mary Humphries, during her natural life, and after her decease it is my desire that the same hundred acres be and remain to my son Charles Humphries as his part and proportion of said four hundred acres, and it is my will and desire that my son William have his first choice of the remaining three hundred, and so of the others according to their seniority."..."I give and bequeath to my son Richard Humphries a young grey mare together with all her increases,"..."it is my desire that my children may live and remain with my loving wife till they arrive to lawful age provided she remain a widow, and if she marries, then it is my desire they be for themselves and go free from her at the age of eighteen years each." The will contained other provisions. His wife was made executrix.

On September 8, 1728 (Land Book 13, page 39), John Humphries, of Brunswick County, acquired 541 acres on both sides of Little Creek. It appears that he acquired other lands by patent June 5, 1736 (page 236).

Mary (White) Humphries subsequently married Richard Wood, who died in 1746 and left by Will to Mary the land whereon he lived, which "came through her first husband, John Humphries" (page 236). Prior to March 18, 1750,

according to a deed of that date recorded in Book 5, page 66, of the Brunswick County Records, Mary Humphries Wood had married William White. Charles Humphries paid thirty pounds to "William and Mary his wife" for 124 acres which John Humphries patented on June 5, 1736, and devised to said "Mary relict of said John Humphries by his will dated 1738" (page 236), being the residue of 324 acres after deed of Mary Humphries, executrix, to Richard Blunt, dated January 6, 1739, (Book 1, page 533), for purpose of paying debts (original notes of Mrs. Abee).

On October 3, 1748 (Deed Book 1, page 356), William Humphrey of the Parish of Cumberland, Lunenburg County, conveyed 90 acres on Allen's Creek, part of tract granted by letters patent to William, John, Thomas and Charles Humphries, of the County of Lunenburg, Cumberland Parish.

On January 1, 1749 (Book 2, page 47), William, John, Thomas and Charles Humphries conveyed to Lewis Diloney for 40 pounds 91 acres, "one-half of which was one-fourth of land on Allen's Creek...granted to said Humphries on August 20, 1747...next to where a Dutchman did once live and where John Humphries now lives...Allen's Creek...To Dunkey's line" (page 237).

On October 2, 1750 (Book 2, page 168), John, William, Thomas, and Charles Humphries, of Lunenburg County, conveyed to James Tucker for 96 pounds 183 acres on Allen's Creek. The deed was signed, John Humphrey, William Humphrey, Thomas Humphrey and Charles Humphrey (pages 11, 237).

Lunenburg County was formed from Brunswick in 1748. "On the tax lists for that year, but not the following year, appears the names, John, William, Thomas, and Charles Humphreys, and the names William Wood, John Williams, Daniel Humphries, Richard Ward, John Ambrose, John Ellis, and other names often seen early in Onslow County, North Carolina" (page 11). About this time William, John, and Robert Humphrey went to Onslow County, North Carolina (page 234).

On January 29, 1753 (Book 5, page 406, Charles Humphries of Brunswick County, conveyed to John Pilkinton, of Nancemond County, for 20 pounds 150 acres, being that part of 324 acre tract granted to John Humphries by letters patent June 5, 1736, and conveyed to Charles Humphries by widow of John Humphries.

On November 8, 1758, (Book 6, page 360), John Adams of Lunenburg County conveyed to Charles Humphries of Lunenburg County for 20 pounds 200 acres in Brunswick County, north side of Teague Creek, joining Richard Wood's line...Howson's line...Wood's corner.

On May 24, 1762 (Book 7, page 149), Charles Humphries and wife, of Lunenburg County, conveyed to Thomas Colles Young, of Brunswick County for "good cause and 20 pounds 200 acres in Brunswick County, north side of Teague Creek, beginning at Woods upper corner, South...Howson's line... to Wood's corner...land granted by patent to Richard Wood 20th August, 1747, and bequeathed by Wood to his daughter, Susannah Wood, and by said Susannah Wood, her husband, David Ally Burton, conveyed to said Charles Humphries.

NOTE: This deed was signed by Charles Humphries and Mary Humphries. Therefore, Charles Humphries married Mary Bennett. (See page 7, Descendants of Charles Humphries of Virginia, by John K. Humphries).

On September 1, 1763 (Book 9, page 246), William White of Lunenburg County conveyed to Charles Humphries, of the same county, for 30 pounds a tract of land on Allen's Creek,...line on Allen's Creek...to Jones' corner... Bilbow's line.

On April 8, 1764 (Book 9, page 393), Charles Humphries, of Lunenburg County, conveyed to Joseph Freeman for 50 pounds current money of Virginia 50 acres of land in Lunenburg County, beginning on a red oak of Colonel Burwell's, of Jones' line, thence along Jones' line...Indian Camp fork ...to corner pine on Bilbow's line, thence on Bilbow's line to Burwell's line.

NOTE: The prededing five conveyances were taken from the original notes of Mrs. Abee.

Mecklenburg County was cut off from Lunenburg in 1764 and included Allen's Creek. No transfers of these Humphries appear of record in that county (page 237).

In the early records of Virginia the name was spelled interchangeably Humphrey, Humphreys, Humphries. It was sometimes spelled differently in the same document and by members of the same immediate family.

Of the four sons of John and Mary (White) Humphries, (William, John, Thomas, and Charles), William and John went to Onslow County, North Carolina, about the year 1750 (page 234). Mrs. Abee is descended from William Humphrey. Charles Humphries remained in Lunenburg County, Virginia, until 1764. On April 8, 1764, he sold 50 acres of land in that county, and soon afterwards, with his wife, Mary (Bennett) Humphries, and three sons, John, Charles and Bennett, removed to Wake County, North Carolina, from whence they soon removed to Chester District, South Carolina (see page 7, Descendants of Charles Humphries of Virginia, by John D. Humphries).

Charles Humphries died in Chester District, South Carolina, prior to April, 1803. In that month Thomas Humphries and Sarah, widow of the deceased, were appointed administrator and administratrix of his estate. In the division of the estate Sarah receipted for her one-third share and the shares of her three children, Amy, Charles, and Solomon, who must have been minors. It may seem odd, though complimentary to her husband that she, too, should have named a son Charles. The other named heirs were: Absalom, John, Bennett, Charles Humphries; Robert Smith for his wife's part; Richard Humphries; Thomas Veney; and Jeremiah Kingsley. The latter two signed receipts without further explanation. They were probably sons-in-law of the deceased. (Probate Office, Chester County, South Carolina).

Mary (Bennett) Humphries, wife of Charles, died after he removed to Chester County, South Carolina. His son, Richard, was born there (Descendants of Charles Humphries of Virginia, page 7). His second wife was probably Sarah Hughes. William Hughes by deed of December 19, 1831 (Book Y, page 411), gave and released unto his daughter, Sarah Humphries and her bodily heirs, one negro woman called Lydia, about 16 years of age, and her child called Moses, about two months old, "not subject to any debt, contract, or demand of any person or persons whatever."

Dr. Frederick Humphreys (page 1014) states that Charles Humphries had ten children, all of whom, except Richard, were born in Virginia. He named seven sons: John, Charles, Thomas, Absalom, James, Emmet, and Richard. The three daughters who married Robert Smith, Thomas Veney, and Jeremiah Kingsley would make ten children by the first marriage.

(1) John Humphries born in Virginia, died in South Carolina. He served in the Revolutionary War as horseman, in 1781, and as footman, in 1782, South Carolina militia. James T. Gore, Captain, approved his account for service, which was paid by South Carolina, November 21, 1785, in pounds, shillings, pence and farthings. (Ref: Georgia Descendants of Nathaniel Pope-John Humphries Allen Gay-By John D. Humphries).

(2) Thomas Humphries born 18 December 1756 in Virginia. He was commissioned, Captain, in the North Carolina troops, and was in the battle of the Guilford Court House, (N.C.) Eutaw Springs, (S.C.) and many other engagements. At the close of the war he returned to Chester District, S. C., from whence he removed to Wake County, N. C., where on 3 November 1786 he married Mary Wall, daughter of Jesse Wall, born 15 December 1765, near Raleigh, N. C.... Soon afterwards accompanied by his father-in-law he returned to Chester District, S. C., where on 20 August 1787, he and his wife executed a deed to Geo. Blisset (Bk. A. p. 357 Chester County, Records). He was a local preacher in the Methodist Episcopal Church, having his credentials to preach in S. C., about 1800. (History of Methodism in Georgia and Florida. By-Geo. G. Smith, Jr.)

In 1811 he removed to Christian (now Trigg) County, Kentucky, where Jesse Wall and Absalom Humphries were living. He died July 25, 1837 at home on Little River, four miles east of Cadiz...His wife died September 2, 1836 within three miles of the old homestead at the home of the daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Young.

(3) Charles Humphries born _____ in Virginia, a Revolutionary Soldier, he died in Chester District, S. C.

(4) Absalom Humphries born 1759 in Virginia. He was a Revolutionary Soldier and Officer. Married Berthena Wall, sister of Mary and daughter of Jesse and Susanna Wall. By deed of November 30, 1795 (Book E, page 60, Chester County, S. C. Records) Charles Humphries gave to Absalom Humphries 100 acres on the drafts of Sandy River. Deed of March 5, 1805, (Book O, page 23, Chester County, Records) from Thany (Berthena) Humphries, his wife to Joshua Roden. On January 4, 1800 Samuel Deason sold to Absalom Humphries 200 acres, mentions line Jesse Wall. Wit: John Templeton, Jesse Wall. Order for transfer of certificate instead of deed. (First

Deed Book A., page 206 Christian County, Kentucky). Deed of November 25, 1805 Samuel Deason to Jesse Wall for \$1,050.00, land on Sinking Fork of Little River, certificate 3576, in 1798 to Edward Deason, survey 1799, 200 acres, granted by Christopher Greenup to Samuel Deason, assignee of Edward Deason, March 11, 1798. Mentions Edward Deason's line. Wit: John Templeton, Absalom Humphries. (First Deed Book A. page 213 Christian County, Kentucky).....Jesse W. Wall died November 12, 1812, age 75, thus born 1737. His parents and place of birth are not known....His wife Susanna died May 15, 1821, age 78, both are buried in the Humphries Burying Ground where they first settled. Absalom Humphries died December 9, 1834 in his 75th year. His wife Berthena died _____ both are buried in the Humphries Graveyard. Jesse Wall and Absalom Humphries settled on Sinking Fork in 1806. Absalom and Berthena Humphries had 12 children.

- (5) James Humphries born _____ in Virginia. He was a Revolutionary Soldier, died of small-pox while a prisoner of war in South Carolina.
- (6) Bennett (Emmet) Humphries born _____ in Virginia, died in South Carolina.
- (7) Richard Humphries born _____. He went to Georgia to live and died there.
- (8) _____ Humphries born _____ married Robert Smith.
- (9) _____ Humphries born _____ married Thomas Reney.
- (10) Agnes Humphries born _____ married Jeremiah Kingsley in 1789.

Thomas Humphries, son of Charles and Mary (Bennett) Humphries married Mary Wall, daughter of Jesse and Susanna Wall. He moved from South Carolina to Kentucky in 1811 and settled on Little River in Christian County, Kentucky (now Trigg). They had five children:

- (1) Ally Humphries, this is perhaps a nickname, her name was Mary A.
- (2) Thomas J. Humphries.
- (3) Jesse Charles Humphries.
- (4) Elizabeth (Betsy) Humphries.
- (5) Susan (Sucky) Humphries.

Mary A(lley) Humphries. She married a Skinner.

Thomas J. Humphries was born about 1804, Chester District, South Carolina and died in 1877; married Mary Ann McCaughan

and moved to Mississippi in the early forties; his oldest son, George was a lawyer and settled at Murray, Kentucky, and died young. His next son, John Adair who was in the Confederate Army and accidentally met the beautiful and talented Miss Lucy Scales of Mississippi and they were married. He was also a lawyer, and died a few years after the war, leaving one daughter, Adair, and she and her widowed mother moved to Clarksville, Tennessee. Miss Hannah Humphries, the other daughter never married. The youngest child is Charles, who lived at Crystal Springs, Mississippi, he was born in 1844.

Jesse Charles Humphries never married. He got in trouble in Kentucky and went South. He joined the volunteers to fight against Mexico and was killed with Fannin's men by Santa Anna at Goliad, Texas in 1836.

Elizabeth (Betsy) Humphries married William Young who lived about two miles east of Cadiz, on Little River. They had seven children William, Thomas, Jesse, Susan who married Mr. Watkins; Nellie who married Isaac Husk, Louisa Ann who married R. M. Pursley and lived and died in Cadiz, and was the mother of Miss Sue and Ellen Pursley. William Young, Jr. married Miss Nooner and moved to Hempstead, Texas in the early 50's, she died there about the close of the war. It is thought he left two sons, John Rand and William. In 1883 the writer (Ottawa Tart) met the beautiful and interesting daughter of John Rand Young in Belleville, Texas, she was a child about ten years of age. Her father died about 1890.

Susan (Sucky) Humphries married Ambrose Mills.

Absalom Humphries married Berthena Wall. They had eleven children:

- (1) John H. Humphries born 15 March 1793 in Georgia. Died 1869.
- (2) Absalom Humphries born _____ 1797 died 1872.
- (3) Jesse W. Humphries born 6 April 1800 died 5 October 1835.
- (4) Mary (Polly) Humphries born _____ 1802 died about 1845 in Illinois.
- (5) Charles Humphries born 4 July 1805 died July 1878.
- (6) Thomas Humphries born about 1807 died 30 July 1851.
- (7) Richard Humphries born about 1810 died February 1870.
- (8) James Mathew Humphries born 10 May 1813 died 20 April 1855.

- (9) Susan Ship Humphries born 23 May 1816, died 25 January 1894
- (10) Misarene Humphries born 28 September 1818 died 19 July 1882.
- (11) William S. Humphries born 1821 died 1883.

John H. Humphries (1) married Elizabeth Husk. She was born 21 December 1797 died 1 January 1852. John was Colonel in the State Militia; was Magistrate; was sent to the House of Representatives at Frankfort, Kentucky twice, sometime near the year 1861, was a candidate against R. K. Tyler, Tyler being a Republican and Humphries a Democrat. Miss Husk was a Methodist Minister's daughter, who was a man of much note and wealth, and owned a large number of slaves. Seven children:

- (1) Jesse Wall Humphries born 16 January 1817 died 10 June 1907, married 30 March 1842 Lourena Susanna Aldridge (see No. 6 Aldridge Family).
- (2) Misaniah Humphries born 1819, married Basel B. Mart.
- (3) Judith Ann Humphries born 29 December 1822, died 20 January 1878, married 24 December 1841 James Washington Aldridge (see No. 2 Aldridge Family).
- (4) William Husk Humphries born 24 February 1826, died 19 February 1893, married Lucinda Davenport. She was born 1 January 1826, died 12 January 1894, both are buried in the Humphries Graveyard.
- (5) America M. Humphries born about 1827, married George Elliott.
- (6) Absalom Jackson Humphries, born 24 August 1831, died 26 April 1899, married first Susanna Shelton, no children, married second Lourena Melvina Tompkins (see 499 Saltzgiver Family).
- (7) Thomas Jefferson Humphries, born 1833, died 1899, married first, Katherine Alexander, no children, married second, Mary Jane Hopson. She was born about 1833 in North Carolina. Some of his children were: Henry H., born about 1854; Lucy A., born about 1855; Jesse T., born about 1856; William E., born about 1857 and Mary S., born about 1859.

Absalom Humphries (2) born 1797, married 27 September 1842, Mildred Guire, Trigg County, Kentucky.

Jesse W. Humphries (3) born 6 April 1800, married a

Miss Gray. At his request he was buried in the horse lot at the old Homestead near Montgomery, Kentucky. He built the house that is now standing there (present 1959) and is being used for a Homestead by the descendants of Jesse Wall Humphries, his nephew. If he had any children this author does not have any record of them.

Mary (Polly) Humphries (4) married Archibald Gray and died in Illinois.

Charles Humphries (5) married first Mary Wimberly, second, Fannie Garnett Carless. There is a Mary Charlotte, wife of Charles Humphries buried in the Humphries Graveyard, this was perhaps his son Charles wife. Some of his children were: Absalom (?), John Lock, Warren, Carl, Charles, Mary C., Richard and Sally A.....He served two terms in the House of Representatives. Warren and John Lock was in the Confederate Army. They came home on a furlough and were at a party at the Jesse Humphries home. Federal soldiers of the Union Army by some unknown tattler came looking for them. They first went to the house of William H. Humphries, which was about three-fourths of a mile away. William and his wife entertained and delayed the soldiers until Anne (Loucada) Aldridge went through the corn fields and waded a creek to warn them, but the soldiers arrived before they could make good their getaway. Lock hid under the hoop skirts of a lady of uncertain age. Warren climbed out from a second floor window into a small cedar tree which the children had planted several years before in the chimney corner. By these means they were concealed until the soldiers searched the house, and finding nothing departed.

Thomas Humphries (6) married a McCaughn we believe. He died in New Orleans; was Sheriff of Trigg County at one time. His children's names if he had any are unknown.

Richard B. Humphries (7) married Nancy Wilson. His children's names are unknown.

James Mathew Humphries (8) married Jane_____. She was born about 1812 in Ireland. James born 1835 and Susan J. born 1836 were two of their children.

Susan Ship Humphries (9) married Lodwick Tart, born about 1807 in North Carolina, some of their children were: (1) Thomas B., born 15 January 1835, died 7 November 1853; (2) Josephine, born about 1837; (3) Susan E. born about

1839; (4) Charles A., born 2 February 1842, died 14 April 1895, married 4 September 1872 Alice Cobb, daughter of Abithel G. Cobb and sister of Geneva Cobb who was the mother of Cora Lee (Turner) Aldridge (See No. 460); (5) Otaway, born 17 October 1844, died 21 May 1921; (6) boy born about 1849; (7) John W., born 9 April 1854.

Missarina Humphries (10) married a Wilson, and then an O'Bryan. She had two children, Ed. Wilson of Texas and William (Bill) Wilson who was killed in the Civil War.

William Husk Humphries son of John H. and Elizabeth (Husk) Humphries, and wife Lucinda Davenport, had nine children: (1) William Marcellus, born about 1847, never married; (2) Maranda, who married Richard T. Ellis, they lived on U. S. Highway 68 near King Chapel Church; (3) Ann, who married John Broadbent, brother of James A., whose wife was Cordelia Aldridge (see No. 15 Aldridge Family); (4) America, who married Mr. Vance; (5) Betty, born 29 October 1854, died 2 September 1911 married M. Andrew Pilkinton born 9 May 1849, died 13 March 1911. They had two children Pleas and Della Pilkinton. Della married David D. Creekmur. Her daughter Lizzie, married a Mitchell and was the mother of Mildred Mitchell, the first wife of James Robert Alldridge (see No. 216 Aldridge Family); (6) Olive, who married Zachary Taylor Tompkins (see No. 701 Saltzgiver Family); (7) Jennie, who married John B. Goode, the parents of Mattie who married John Henry Aldridge (see No. 34 Aldridge Family); (8) Fannie, married a Spurlin, they were the parents of Lindsey Spurlin the Minister; (9) Ella, who married Willie Stewart, their children were Nora who married Thomas Ballard, Harry and William Stewart.

A Letter Written By T(homas) J. Humphries of Mississippi To John Lock Humphries in 1876:

John Lock, I am a stickler for an admirer of family character. Don't be startled to say, "Old Gentleman," you will make an exhibition of your personal pride and vanity.

If I stand strong upon family character, and is not family character sustained, maintained and built up of individual character,- and when I reflect upon the traditional history of our family running back now nearly or quite two centuries, since our forefathers came from Wales and settled in Virginia. They came to this country in the

troublesome times of the Stewarts of England or during the protectorate of Cromwell and though some branches of the family spell their name differently, some ending eys, some ies and some ey.

My grandfather, your great-grandfather, Charles Humphries, whose wife was a Miss Bennett, moved from Virginia a few years before the commencement of the Revolutionary War and settled in Wake County, North Carolina, near Raleigh, the seat of government of that state.

His oldest son, John nearly or quite grown, his son Charles nearly grown. My father Thomas and your grandfather, Absalom and James from 12 to 14 years of age.

When the war commenced, all the sons went into the service. That is; John, Charles, Thomas, Absalom and James. Shortly after, my father told me he was 16 years of age, and perhaps Absalom who was 2 years younger, did not join the army for a year or two and so of James. My father and Absalom remained in the service continuously until the close of the war, and James died a prisoner with smallpox in South Carolina, toward the last of the war. My father was a Captain in the service and was associated with John Adair who afterwards was governor of Kentucky.

They were hard fighters and brave men and what is better their private characters are above reproach, men of truth, morality and high integrity generally well to do.

At the close of the war just before grandfather Charles Humphries settled in Chester District, South Carolina, where all the family settled after the war.

My father and Absalom after the war returned to North Carolina and married sisters, the daughters of Jesse Wall, a man remarkable for his exactitude, probity, good sense and success. He died on Sinking Fork, at the place where John Humphries lived and, I suppose, died.

Grandfather Wall and Uncle Absalom moved to Kentucky about the year of 1804 or 1805. Your father was born in Caldwell County in 1805 before they settled on Sinking Fork in then Christian County. (Trigg now). My father settled on Little River in 1811 on the place you know as Ben Carlos place. I was born in Chester District, South Carolina in

1804. My grandfather had two other sons Bennett and Richard. His sons, John, Charles, and Bennett all lived to be old men and died in South Carolina. Richard moved to Georgia where he died and left two sons of respectability and influence, whilst we do not boast of high civil position, we can justly claim to belong to a long line of ancestry who were noted in their day and generation as brave, generous, honorable, upright and faithful in every relation of life. It is for the younger members of the family to keep the good name pure and burning brightly for all times to come and we may justly claim to belong to and inherit the best blood of the Revolution.

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A LITTLE ANCIENT HISTORY

The name HUMPHREY means the support of peace--The family intermarried with Ulysses S. Grant and John Brown families--Heman Humphries, president of Amherst College for twenty-two years--An aid to George Washington, a Tory member of the Continental Congress, and the father of the American Navy all bore this honorable name--different branches of the family.

The name Humphrey, or Humphreys is a very old and honorable English name, derived from the first name Humphrey. This is one of several names of Germanic origin beginning with a syllable hun, or hum, supposed by some to be derived from the old race of Huns. The fact seems to be, however, that it was taken from the old word "hun", meaning stake, which was used as a weapon or support. The compound Hunifred, which was the earliest form of Humphrey, means support of peace.

The French affected this name at an early date as Onfroi, and it came into England and was speedily adopted as Humphrey or Humfrey. Some of the families who bear it as a last name doubtless came from France or other parts of the continent already possessed of a family name; but in England the name was adopted as a last name from the first name, just as Willias was taken from William when the habit of using last names became general.

Although at the present time there seems to be somewhat careful differentiation between the name Humphrey and Humphreys, the distinction was not drawn in this country until a recent date, and many times different sons of the same father would use the two forms.

The most extensive branch of the family in the new world look to one Michael Humphrey for the origin of their name on these shores. He came here sometime before 1643; not for religious motives--for he styled himself a "member of the Church of England"--but for motives of self-betterment. His home in England was Lyme, Dorstershire, where his father Samuel, and his mother Susannah, long hoped and prayed for this son's return. Michael settled in Massaco now known as Simsbury, Massachusetts and married Susannah Grant. Her father was a man of property of Simsbury, of whom Ulysses S. Grant the General was the seventh descent. Michael and

Susannah's seven children all married, the five daughters uniting with the families of Lewis, Burnham, Shipman, Graham and Bull. The sons, Sergeant John, who was born in 1650 and Lieutenant Samuel who was born in 1656 married Hannah Griffin and Mary Mills, respectfully.

The descendants of Lieutenant Samuel Humphreys and Hannah Griffin were ancestors through the Jonathan-Solomon-Solomon branch of Heman Humphries, whose mother Hannah Brown was aunt of John Brown of Ossawatimie. Heman was born in 1779 in West Simsbury, Connecticut and mainly by his own efforts he secured the education which fitted him for the presidency of Amherst College. He held the position for twenty-two years after 1823, with distinguished devotion to the college.

Herman married Sophia Proctor, of Farmington. Their two sons Edward Proctor, born 1809, and James, born in 1811, inherited their father's ability to a marked degree. Edward P. was Professor at the Theological Seminary in Danville, Kentucky, and pastor of a Presbyterian Church in Louisville. He married first Caroline Prather and then Martha Pope, of Louisville and established his family in Kentucky. James who married Urania Battell, of Connecticut, was a Republican Congressman and practiced law with distinction in Louisville and New York.

Another distinguished lawyer descended through Lieutenant Samuel and Michael, was Herman Loin Humphreys, who was born at Candor, New York in 1830, and was a Republican Congressman from Wisconsin in 1877.

Sergeant John, brother of Lieutenant Samuel, was the great-grandfather of David Humphreys, distinguished poet and patriot. He was born in 1752 in Darby, Connecticut. He served in 1780 as aide-de-camp to General Washington, and during this service received the inspiration for his stirring patriotic lyrics. He married Ann Frances Bulkeley, a young English woman of great wealth whom he met at Lisbon, during his stay there as United States Minister to Portugal. David Humphrey had no children, but he is remembered with great pride by the members of the so-called Connecticut Humphreys family.

In Pennsylvania the family was established by the two sons of Samuel and Elizabeth Humphreys, of Protheven Parish, Morionethshire, Wales. Daniel, the oldest son, married

Hannah Wynn, and Benjamin married Mary Llewellyn, and settled near Philadelphia. Daniel who was in Haverford, Pennsylvania in 1682, and an active member of the Society of Friends, returned to England and brought his mother, his three sisters, Lydia, Amy and Gobella, and his brother, Benjamin, home with him to the new world. Daniel's sons were Joshua, Charles, Edward and Samuel. Joshua the eldest, married Sarah Williams, and had Clement, Joshua, Daniel and Jane. Charles, the second son was a member of the Continental Congress, and though not an active Tory, voted against the Declaration of Independence.

Joshua, the son of Joshua, and therefore grandson of Daniel, is known as the father of the American Army. He was born in 1751, and married Mary Davis. His two sons were Clement and Samuel. Samuel inherited his father's ability as a ship builder. It is a fact--and a tribute, likewise, to his patriotism--that the Emperor of Russia, Alexander, offered Samuel a salary of \$60,000.00 a year if he would undertake the construction of a Russian Navy. To this offer Samuel replied that what merits he possessed he owed to his own country.

His son was Major General Andrew Atkinson Humphrey, born in 1810, whose devotion to his country was as great as that of his father.

An entirely different branch of the family was established by Jonas Humphrey--at, as it is also spelled, Humphres or Humphries--in Massachusetts. John was a tanner from Wendover, Brecks County, England, where he had been constable. He was in Dorchester, Massachusetts in 1634, and in two years he was carrying on his trade in Humphrey Street, where in the very same spot, his family, for seven generations carried on his trade of tanning. In the inventory of Jonas Humphrey it is interesting to note that, although he was a man of considerable property his money is set down as amounting to eighteen shillings, nine pence. But Jonas lived in the days when wealth was not measured by money, but in cattle, houses, lands, tools, and implements. Jonas married Jane Weeks, and had two sons who were born in England. They were James who married Mary, and Jonas, who married Martha. Jonas who lived in Weymouth, was born in 1620, and had Jonas, John and James. The descendants of this family were active Puritans of Boston, and are sometimes known as the Dorchester Humphreys.

The ARMS of this family are blazoned: Sable, three ostrich feathers argent. The crest is a demi griffin, wings, endorsed holding between claws, ducal crown.

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RELATIONSHIPS

There are at least two accepted ways of figuring relationships. One is called the Common or Canon Law method, and the other the Civil Law method. Both agree when figuring the direct or lineal descent. They differ only in figuring the collateral relationships. As the Common or Canon Law method is now in general use and gives a more accurate description of "cousin relationship," we will not consider the Civil Law method.

HOW TO USE RELATIONSHIP CHART

You will note that the two upper columns are outlined in heavy lines. These are the common progenitor and his descendants. "CP" stands for common progenitor, the one who is the head of the two lines of descendants. "S" is his son or daughter as the case may be; "GS" his grandson or granddaughter; "GGS" his great grandson or granddaughter; "2 GGS" his second great grandson or granddaughter, and so on down to his eighth great grandson or granddaughter.

All the diamonds inside these heavy lines show the relationship between his descendants. By following columns "1" from both sides of the chart we find they cross on the "B" diamond, showing that the sons of the common progenitor are brothers. By following columns "2" to the center we find they cross at the "1C" diamond indicating that grandsons of the common progenitor are first cousins to each other. And so on down: his great grandsons are second cousins; his second great-grandsons are third cousins; his third great-grandsons are fourth cousins, etc.

To this point few people have trouble in figuring relationships. It is when they start to figure the "cousinship" and "times removed" that they have difficulty. But with this chart you will find no trouble with any combination up to the tenth generation, and by following the pattern set by this chart you can go as many generations as you desire. Say you want to figure your relationship to a distant cousin. You are eight generations removed from the common progenitor, or his sixth great grandson. Your "distant cousin" is six generations removed or his fourth great-grandson on another line. To figure your exact relationship simply follow columns "8" on the one side and "6" on the other to where they cross and you find "5C 2R" indicating you are fifth cousins twice removed.

If you want to find your relationship to the son of your fifth great-grandfather, follow columns "1" and "7" which show you are his fourth great-grandnephew (4 GGN). Likewise, you are a first cousin six times removed (1C 6R) to the grandson of your sixth great-grandfather.
