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INTRODUCTION.

The united Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake was organized in 1796. Its bounds embraced the territory on both sides of Owasco Lake, generally within the old towns of Aurelius and Scipio. In 1807 the inhabitants of the west and north east part of the congregation took steps to erect a church edifice in their part of the congregation. A meeting house was built at Sand Beach, in the summer of 1810; the edifice was thirty six by forty feet in dimensions. The sale of pews in the completed church took place on Nov. 17 and 24, 1810. The sale price of the thirty pews on the lower floor was \$1781.50; of the eighteen pews in the gallery, \$537.00. The territory embraced within the bounds of the Aurelius congregation, as it appears to have been called, included the southern part of the town of Brutus (now Sennet and Throop), Aurelius (including Auburn City, Fleming and Springport), and the present town of Scipio (west of Owasco Lake). Sand Beach, or Owasco Outlet, is in the north eastern part of the present town of Fleming.

On July 5, 1854, a contract was concluded with Messers William Furness and Leonard Chatterton for the erection of a new church edifice. The building was forty by sixty feet in dimensions, surmounted by a tower fourteen feet square and eighty two feet high. It was erected on the site of the old church, which was moved a short distance away on the church land, and was still occupied by the congregation, during building operations. The new church was dedicated on Thursday July 26, 1855. In the spring of 1856, the old church was sold at public auction and pulled down.

Until the town of Fleming was set off from Aurelius, March 28, 1823, the church is sometimes mentioned as the congregation in Aurelius. This has led such writers as the Revs. H. T. Corwin and N. N. P. Bailey to assume that there was an Aurelius church separate and distinct from Owasco Outlet, whereas it was the same church. The error was caused because in the statistical report of the Classis of Montgomery for the year 1813, Conrad Ten Eyck is given as pastor of Aurelius and Owasco. On Sept. 14, 1811, the Consistories of Owasco and Aurelius met together for the purpose of receiving members; the Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck presided at the meeting.

DEED FOR CHURCH LAND.

On Mar. 10, 1807, Asa Jackson agreed to give the land for the site of the church. An abstract of the deed follows:

Indenture, dated July 6, 1810, between Asa Jackson of the town of Aurelius and the Consistory of the west and north east part of the united Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake. Conveys part of Lot No. 67 in the town of Aurelius "for the sole purpose of building a Meeting house for Publick Worship and a Yard for said Meeting house,..... Begining where the Roads leading from David Irish's and Christopher Post's leading to the Owasco Bridge intersect and runing thence South fifty nine degrees west three Chains and ninety seven links, thence south thirty one degrees east two chains and sixty links to a stone for a corner, thence east two chains fifteen Links to the aforesaid road leading from the above named Christopher Post's, thence along said Road North twenty four degrees East to the place of beginning, containing one acre of Land". Consideration, \$1.00. Acknowledged, May 17, 1816; recorded, Aug. 23, 1887, Cayuga County Deeds, Book 170, page 265.

RECORD OF INCORPORATION.

In 1810, the church was called the "Reformed Dutch Church in the Town of Aurelius", though still a part of the United Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake. The original incorporation certificate is indorsed "Reformed Protestant Dutch Church in Aurelius"; this of course was because the spot known as "Sand Beach" was then in the town of Aurelius. When the Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck commenced the Minutes of the Consistory, he did not know the correct name of the church, for he called it "The Ref. Prot. Dutch Church of Sand Beach". The church was always known by the name of "Sand Beach" until after the beginning of the pastorate of the Rev. Samuel N. Brown. On June 7, 1853, the church bought 24 acres of land adjoining the church lot and burying ground, to prevent its becoming the property of the Roman Catholic Church of Auburn. It was sold by James H. Wallace to "The Trustees of the Sand Beach Church in the town of Fleming". On Apr. 22, 1854, in the minutes of the Consistory, the correct title "The Reformed Protestant Dutch Church at the Owasco Outlet", appears for the first time. On Feb. 1, 1856, a contract of sale was made, to sell most of the 24 acre lot to Americus V. Pulsifer, the church being designated as The Trustees of the Sand Beach Church in the town of Fleming. When a deed was executed on Feb. 4, 1856, the grantors were designated as The Consistory of the Reformed Dutch Church at the Owasco Outlet in the County of Cayuga. The contract was broken and the deed was never passed. On Apr. 1, 1862, they took title to the new parsonage lot under the name of "The Consistory of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church of the Owasco Outlet", a mistake that was finally corrected by a Quit Claim deed dated Apr. 1, 1880.

The name "Sand Beach" has clung to this church even to the present day. The correct corporate name is, "The Minister Elders and Deacons of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church at the Owasco Outlet in the County of Cayuga"; the church never had any other. A copy of the articles of incorporation follow, from the original document.

"Whereas by Virtue of an act entitled an act making such alterations in the Act for incorporating Religious Societies as to render the same more convenient to the Reformed prodestant Dutch Congregations passed the seventh day of March One thousand seven hundred and Eighty eight. We the Subscribers Elders and Deacons of the Reformed protestant Dutch Church or Congregation formed and established at the Owasco outlet known by the name of the Aurelius Congregation in the County of Cayuga and State of New York having assembled together at the house of Abraham Degroff in the Town of Owasco on the eighth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, by virtue of the said Act Do by these presents certify that the Trustees of said Church and Congregation and their successors for ever shall as a body corporate be called distinguished and known by the name, stile and title of the Minister Elders and Deacons of the Reformed Prodestant Dutch Church at the Owasco Outlet in the County of Cayuga.

CHURCH RECORDS.

Following is a summary of the church records that have passed through my hands in the preparation of this work.

1. Vital Records. Bound with pasteboard covers, leather back and corners; one cover has been detached, but now repaired with a linen back; pages about 145, of which only 44 have been used; size 6 3/4 x 8 inches; condition good. Completely transcribed, on pages 1 to 28.
2. Minutes of the Consistory, Vol. 1, Nov. 7, 1812 to Apr. 10, 1854. Bound with pasteboard covers and calf skin back; pages about 360, of which about 280 have been used; size 6 3/4 x 8 inches; condition good. The minutes occupy 242 pages in the front part of the book; cf. abstracts from the minutes, on pages 29 to 40. Beginning from the other end of the book there are about 40 pages of membership records and lists of the families in the congregation; these have been completely transcribed, on pages 41 to 58.
3. Minutes of the Consistory, Vol. 2, Apr. 22, 1854 to Apr. 4, 1864. Handsomely bound in full natural morocco, with gold tooling on the sides and back; bears title in gold on back "RECORDS". The book contains 241 numbered pages; minutes occupy 191 pages, the rest blank; size 5 1/4 x 8 1/4 inches; condition excellent. Not abstracted or transcribed.

4. Minutes of the Consistory, Vol. 3, Sept. 11, 1865 to Sept. 1, 1919. Bound in full sheep skin, with tooled edges and back; bears red leather title "RECORD"; pages about 460; size 13 x 8 inches. The minutes are in the front of the book and end on page 228. The book also contains a record of Members, 1816 to 1918, giving dates of dismissal or death. This book is still in use in the church. Not abstracted or transcribed.
5. Book of Accounts. Bound with pasteboard covers and calf skin back; pages, now about 244; about 40 pages torn out from the back of the book; size 8 x 13 inches; condition good. The first 54 folios are numbered and are occupied by the accounts. The title written on the fly leaf follows:
 "Records of the Transactions and Accounts of the Committee For the building of a house of Public Worship for the West and Northeast part of the United Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake."
 Abstracted or transcribed, on pages 59 to 61.

The records of the Reformed Church at the Owasco Outlet were received from Mr. G. Herbert Peterson, of the Consistory, in September, 1919; they were returned to Mr. Peterson, in the month of November, 1919.

PASTORS OF THE CHURCH.

The dates that follow the pastor's names cover the periods that they served the Congregation at the Owasco Outlet. The data has been compiled almost entirely from the Vital Records and the Minutes of the Consistory of the church. The minutes of the Classis of Montgomery have not been examined for mention of this church. When the Classis of Cayuga was formed in 1826, the church became a member of that body; I do not know where the minutes of this defunct Classis are. Items marked with asterisks are copied from the Manual of the Reformed Dutch Church in America, 4th edition, for which no responsibility is assumed. The Rev. Artemus Dean published an historical discourse on the church in the "N. Y. Evang., July 22, 1875"¹ I believe the Rev. Charles Maar wrote a short history of the church in 1893.

After the church was organized in 1810, it has been stated that it was supplied by the Rev. GEORGE G. BRINKERHOFF*.

1. CONRAD TEN EYCK, Sept. 14, 1811 to Jan. 15, 1826. I do not know the precise time when he gave up his charge at New Harlem (Broadalbin) and Mayfield, or when he was called by Owasco and Owasco Outlet. The year has been given as 1812*. He probably was in the Cayuga County field before his connection with his former charges was terminated. The final settlement on Dominie Ten Eyck's salary was effected on Mar. 5, 1827; the pastoral relation with Owasco Outlet

was dissolved by mutual consent, as of Jan. 15, 1826. He remained pastor at Owasco until Jan. 1, 1830, at least.

During the vacancy, the church was under the care of the Rev. Abraham Messler, of Ovid, commencing on Jan. 30, 1826. He was instrumental in securing the Candidate Benjamin B. Westfall, and exercised supervising care over the church until Westfall was ordained.

2. BENJAMIN B. WESTFALL, June 5, 1826 to Oct. 1, 1827. The Candidate Benjamin B. Westfall, was sent to Sand Beach by the Missionary Society as Missionary, for a term of three months, commencing June 5, 1827. He was a licentiate of the Classis of New Brunswick; by request of the Missionary Society he was ordained by the Classis of New Brunswick, in either September or October, 1826. He served the church at Sand Beach as pastor, for one year commencing Oct. 1, 1826.

During the next vacancy, the church was served by Revs. Henry Heermance and John Dunlap in the summer of 1828.

3. HENRY HEERMANCE, June 15, 1828 to Nov. 23, 1829. He commenced his labors under his call on the last Sabbath in November, 1828; and was installed the fourth Sabbath in March, 1829. When his year was up, on Nov. 23, 1829, he was given leave of absence until the sixty six dollars that was due him, could be raised!

4. JOHN G. TARBELL, Oct. 11, 1830 to Oct. 11, 1832. Commenced his labors under his call, Oct. 11, 1830; was probably dismissed at a meeting of the Classis of Cayuga, held in the Sand Beach church, on Sept. 6, 1832; last minutes, when he was present, Oct. 11, 1832.

5. LEONARD ROGERS, 1833* to 1834*. He kept no vital records. His minutes extend from May 21, 1833 to Aug. 1, 1833.

6. ROBERT KIRKWOOD, July 24, 1836 to May 4, 1839. Commenced his labors, July 24, 1836; call approved by Classis of Cayuga and accepted, Sept. 20, 1836; installed, Oct. 11, 1836. He gave notice that he intended to ask for a dissolution at the meeting held Apr. 1, 1839, and recommended the Rev. John Mole as a candidate. Consistory acted to dissolve the pastoral relation, Apr. 25th.

7. JOHN MOLE (or Moule), May 15, 1839 to May 15, 1841. Was present at the meeting May 4, 1839; commenced his services on May 15, 1839. On Feb. 8, 1841, he gave notice to the Consistory that he would terminate his services in the middle of May.

8. RICHARD WALLER KNIGHT, Nov. 1, 1841 to July 20, 1844. Stated Supply. His salary commenced Nov. 1, 1841. On Mar. 13, 1843, after a subscription list had been circulated to call him, the Great Consistory determined that the amount raised was insufficient; aid from the Missionary Society sought.
9. AARON B. WINFIELD, Nov. 1, 1844 (about) to Dec. 16, 1850. Called, July 31, 1844. Meeting held to dissolve the pastoral relation, by mutual request, Dec. 16, 1850.
10. SAMUEL ROBBINS BROWN, Apr. 15, 1851 to Apr. 9, 1859. Commenced his labors Apr. 15, 1851. Consistory acted to dissolve the pastoral relation at his request, on Mar. 16, 1859.
11. SETH P. M. HASTINGS, June 1, 1859 to Dec. 14, 1859. Stated Supply. He presided at a meeting of the Consistory, on May 21, 1859, when the following action was taken:
- "Resolved, That we welcome our christian Brother Rev. S. P. M. Hastings to our neighborhood and congregation and cordially invite him to perform the Pastoral duties of this church for the next six months from June 1st to Dec. 1st, promising for such services to pay him two hundred [dollars] with a view to aid him in establishing himself as Principal of the school at Springside and reserving to the consistory of the church the privilege during that time of inviting any other person who may be presented to preach as candidate for the vacancy created by the dismissal of our late beloved Pastor Rev. S. N. Brown."
- The Rev. Mr. Brown had conducted a select boarding school at Springside, his residence, on a small farm owned by him. It is evident that the Rev. Mr. Hastings intended to become his successor and acquire the school. The venture was not a success, because Mr. Hastings was called by Cossackie, Dec. 20, 1859, which call he accepted Jan. 2, 1860.
12. JOHN GARRETTSON, July 1, 1861 to Apr. 1, 1864 (about). Called, June 26, 1861; installed July 30, 1861. He applied for a dissolution of the pastoral relation, on Mar. 25, 1864, because of inadequate financial support; dissolution was probably approved by Classis, on Apr. 26, 1864; last minutes, Apr. 4, 1864.
13. JOHN VAN NESTE SCHENCK, Sept. 28, 1865* to Sept. 27, 1867.
14. SAMUEL ROBBINS BROWN, 1867* to 1869*. Stated Supply, while on a furlough from Japan. His vital records, from Jan. 8, 1868 to Oct. 10, 1868.
15. HENRY S. HUNTINGTON, 1870*. He kept no vital records.

16. WILLIAM A. RICE, Oct. 1870 to 1872*. Stated Supply. Kept no vital records.
17. ANTFMAS DEAN, 1873* to 1875*. Kept no vital records.
18. GEORGE A. MC KINLEY, 1876* to 1877*. Stated Supply. Kept no vital records.
19. EGBERT CHARLES LAWRENCE, 1877* to 1878*. Stated Supply.
20. CHARLES ANDERSON, 1879 to 1883*.
21. R. K. H. DEXTER, 1884* to ----? Kept no vital records.
22. ANSON DU BOIS, 1886. Stated Supply. Marriages, Sept. 25 and Nov. 3, 1886.

This ends the list of pastors for the period covered by the vital records which have been transcribed.

Note. Items marked "§" are written in pencil in the original record.

In the original record the list of communicants is near the middle of the book. This list of communicants was made out about the year 1837; it begins with only those members who were survivors at that date. The list is practically duplicated, by a list as of January 1838, which commences on page 47. Unfortunately, there is no complete list of communicants in this record. The earliest list of communicants, abstracted from the minutes of the Consistory, commences on page 29. READERS ARE WARNED THAT ALL THE LISTS OF COMMUNICANTS AND MEMBERS MUST BE EXAMINED, in order to obtain all the information there is in the record.

There are a certain number of discrepancies in the lists, as they have been compiled, due to carelessness on the part of the recorders. These will be revealed to the reader, who searches for individual names. For example, in the minutes of the Consistory, Catharine Van Auken was received on July 13, 1850, cf. page 33. In other places the name appears Martha Van Auken; cf. pages 53 and 56.

Extract from Annual Report to Classis, Apr. 17, 1847.

"..... on the 12th of March [1846] the excellent, devoted, lovely and most interesting family of John S. Van Nest was suddenly, in a moment, driven by the merderer's knife to the bar of God. The ties that bound them to us as neighbors, as friends, and as a church, were so quickly sundered, the shock was so great that the most fearless feared, the strongest nerves were unstrung. We have felt their loss as a church severely, for we are now deprived of their prayers, their counsels and their support. And I fear that instead of being humbled before God on account of this mysterious Prov. and our sins as a people, the effect has been only to excite unhallowed feelings toward the fiendish perpetrator of the horrid deed."

Note. The List of Communicants show that two persons, members of the church, were murdered; Mrs. Peter Wyckoff, cf. page 47; and Mrs. Sarah Van Nest, cf. page 50.

END OF ABSTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE CONSISTORY, VOLUME ONE.

ABSTRACTS FROM THE BOOK OF ACCOUNTS FOR BUILDING
THE FIRST CHURCH EDIFICE.

Mar. 10, 1807. "At a Meeting of the Inhabitants of the West and North East part of the united Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake, at the house of Asa Jackson, Agreeable to Vote of said Congregation and allowed by the great Consistory of said Congregation."

"Voted, That the Church be built on the South West corner of an Acre of Land granted by Asa Jackson to the aforesaid part of said s^d Congregation and where said Committee have fixed their Site, and the said Asa Jackson agrees to give a Deed of said land, to said part of said Congregation for the purpose of building a Church & for no other purpose." Subscriptions to be circulated for building the church; Committee to return the lists by the 19th inst.

Mar. 19, 1807. The money subscribed for the church, under the following conditions: the subscriptions can be deducted from the cost of pews, when the sale of pews is held. That the edifice be 44 by 34 feet, with a gallery. Asa Jackson, Andrew V. Middlesworth and George Burnet, to be Managers. Subscriptions of grain to be delivered by Dec. 25th, next. Money, to be paid by Mar. 1, 1808, and the materials for building be on the spot at the same time.

Jan. 2, 1808. Building of the Meeting house to be postponed for one year.

Jan. 2, 1810. Voted, that the old subscriptions continue in full force.

Jan. 13, 1810. Voted, that the building of the Meeting house be undertaken on the present subscription. That it be 36 by 40 feet with a gallery on three sides. That the materials be delivered by May 1, 1810.

June 5, 1810. Voted, that the Managers can build the Meeting house on any part of the acre of land which is granted for said building, that they conceive most proper and convenient for the house and the inhabitants.

Nov. 17, 1810. Terms of sale, of pews. One half of price in "good merchantable wheat at the market price"; and the other half in current money of the State of New York. First payment to be made on or before Jan. 25, 1811; the balance by Jan. 25, 1812. Purchasers may deduct "for what they have paid towards building said house.

"An account of the number of the Pews sold on the 17th day of November A. D. 1810, in the Meeting house Aurelius and to whom."

INTRODUCTION.

Nearly all of the vital records of the Reformed Dutch Church of Owasco are lost. The Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake was divided in the year 1810, into two congregations:- Owasco and Owasco Outlet. I have transcribed what few records there are of the Owasco congregation, for the purpose of their preservation. Because most of the records are now lost, does not indicate to a certainty that they are destroyed. Still, I have no clues that might lead to their discovery; and rather than have all the records lost, I have transcribed those that I have been able to obtain. In a report to me concerning the records, Mr. Warren Giles, the Clerk of the Consistory, says:

"In view of the unsatisfactory condition of the church records, I will say that the Rev. John A. Rodgers prepared a historical address at the centennial of our church and he secured his material from the following sources, making acknowledgement in his address: Stocke's History of Cayuga County; Founding of the Reformed Church at Owasco Lake, by Rev. Charles Maar; and an historical article by John J. Brinkerhoff.

Apparently the records were very carelessly kept from about 1830 to about 1860. The fragments of the early records show painstaking care and some that have become scattered may yet come to light. I sincerely regret that we have so little that has any real historical value."

The Rev. John A. Rodgers article was entitled:- The Story of a Century, or a Brief History of the Reformed Church of Owasco. To these might be added, Historical Discourse at Auburn, 1869, by Rev. Charles Hawley, D. D.; The Family of Joris Dircksen Brinckerhoff; and the history of Montgomery Classis, by the Rev. W. N. P. Dailey, published in 1915.

FOUNDING OF THE CHURCH.

According to Dr. Hawley, the church was organized on Sept. 23, 1796. According to the Rev. Mr. Dailey the first consistory consisted of Jacob Brinckerhoff and Cornelius Van Auken, Elders; and Roeliff Brinckerhoff and Thomas Johnson, Deacons. The settlers came from Conewago, Pa. According to John J. Brinckerhoff¹: "As soon as they were fairly located they organized a religious society in connection with the Dutch Reformed Church, with my father [Jacob] and uncle [Roeliff] two of its officers. The society took its corporate form and title at a meeting held in the house of Col. John L. Hardenbergh, at Hardenbergh's Corners (now the city of Auburn)."

According to the Rev. W. N. P. Dailey:² "In 1796 Rev. Peter Labagh was sent to the western part of New York with Rev. Jacob Sickles. In Todd's Life of Dr. Labagh the latter is said to have organized Owasco in 1796." Rather vague! Let us cite the facts: Rev. Jacob Sickles was called to Schenectady, as assistant, on Oct. 2, 1795;³ he remained there two years and on Sept. 21, 1797, he announced to the Schenectady consistory that he had concluded to accept a call to Cossackie and Coeymans. In 1798, he made a missionary tour along the Susquehanna, by appointment of the General Synod.⁴ It has been generally recognized that the Rev. Peter Labagh went to Kentucky in the fall of 1796. I have failed to find mention of Owasco in the memoir of Rev. Dr. Peter Labagh, by the Rev. Dr. John Adams Todd; nor do I find the name Owasco in the index. Extracts from Dr. Todd's work follow:

"In the meantime, however, between the date of his acceptance of the Kentucky mission, and that of his departure, Mr. Labagh offered himself to the Classis of Albany as an agent or missionary to go on an exploring tour to western New York, in company with the Rev. Mr. Sickles, afterwards Dr. Sickles, of Schenectady. [p. 40]

Mr. Labagh, with his fellow explorer, set out on his journey in August, 1796, and after visiting a number of settlements in that region, and collecting the information desired, he returned to report the result, and arrived at Hackensack in the month of October following." [p. 44]

After his return, he remained two weeks at Hackensack and then set out for Kentucky. "Traveling on horseback he passed through Caughnawaga, Pennsylvania." [p. 57]

The bungling reference to "Dr. Sickles of Schenectady" does not inspire confidence. Dr. Sickles received his degree in 1832; he was pastor at Kinderhook from 1801 to 1835. One is tempted to ask if the "explorers" discovered "Caughnawaga, Pennsylvania" on the alleged trip. More facts follow, from the Minutes of the Particular Synod, May 3, 1796:⁵

"The committee appointed to propose the means of supplying those destitute settlements on the frontiers, that have made application to this body, report, that they have received information that the Rev. George Brinkerhoff is willing to visit the Genesee country, if his pulpit can be supplied in his absence, and also that the Classis of Hackensack is willing to supply it. They do therefore recommend that a commission be given to Mr. Brinkerhoff, to spend eight Sabbaths among those societies on the frontiers of this State, which have applied to this body for supplies, and that the Classis of Hackensack be enjoined to supply his pulpit in his absence. They also recommend, that the Rev. George G. Brinkerhoff be authorized to form congregations, when to him it shall appear expedient."

The remainder of the committee's report relates to the student of Divinity Mr. Peter Labagh and his proposed journey to the people in Salt River, Kentucky.

At the meeting of the Particular Synod, Oct. 5, 1796, it was reported, "that the Rev. George G. Brinkerhoff had gone upon his mission to the frontiers,"⁶ and that Mr. Peter Labagh had been ordained preparatory to departing for his mission to Kentucky. It may be that I am of a particularly skeptical nature, but the only thing that Dr. Todd has convinced me of, is that he does not know the difference between Conewago, Pa., and Caughnawaga, N. Y. I cannot pretend to say whether Brinkerhoff or Labagh organized the church at Owasco. I would suggest, however, to the person who desires to know who was present at the meeting on Sept. 23, 1796, when the Owasco church was incorporated, to examine the records of incorporation, in the county clerk's office in Syracuse, if such a book exists as Onondaga County Religious Incorporations. Usually a consistory was ordained before incorporation was effected. Common sense will lead most readers to believe that the ecclesiastical organization of the consistory was accomplished by the Rev. George G. Brinkerhoff, former pastor at Conewago, Pa., and the brother of Jacob and Roeliff Brinkerhoff. The church was called the United Congregation of the Reformed Low Dutch Church at the Owasco Lake; its bounds embraced the territory on both sides of Owasco Lake, generally within the old towns of Aurelius and Scipio. At the time of separation, the old congregation, being the "South and East" parts of the united congregation, took the name "The Reformed Dutch Church of Owasco;" its bounds embraced generally the territory within the present towns of Owasco, Skaneateles, Niles, Moravia and Sempronius.

THE FIRST EDIFICE.

Concerning the first church edifice, I quote from John J. Brinkerhoff:

⁷"My father [Jacob] and uncle Roeliff purchased and settled on what has ever since been called Brinkerhoff's Point, on the east side of the lake, and about two and a half miles from the foot. They took possession in the spring of 1795."

⁸"..... They made their settlement at and about the foot of Owasco Lake, about three miles south of the now city of Auburn. They organized a religious society in 1795, in connection with the Dutch Reformed Church. Immigrants soon came in rapidly and settled in the same locality, and in the summer of 1797, they erected the first church edifice in this county. It was built of logs, 25 by 30 feet, with a gallery on three sides. The logs were flattened with the broad axe, and the seats were made of nice slabs. The log meeting house mentioned above was on my father's farm about seventy rods from our house. It was in use until 1815, when a new frame edifice was built about two miles southeast from the old one at Owasco Village.

Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck.

I have not the means to present an authentic list of the pastors of the Owasco church. I have not examined the minutes of the Classis of Montgomery for data in relation to this church. The Classis of Cayuga was formed in 1826, and the church became a member of that body; I do not know where the minutes of this defunct Classis are.

I can, however, point out one error at least, made by the illustrious Dr. Corwin and others who derive their authority from secondary sources of information. The pastorate of the Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck did not close in 1826. His handwriting in the minutes of the Consistory extends from Sept. 14, 1811 to Jan. 28, 1830. The last subscription list was for salary for the year 1829; the Consistory agreed to pay him \$350.00, that year; cf. page 26. His salary probably terminated on Jan. 1, 1830. When Dominie Ten Eyck presided at the meeting of the Consistories of Owasco and Aurelius (Owasco Outlet) on Sept. 14, 1811, he was still pastor at New Harlem (Broadalbin) and Mayfield. The precise date that Ten Eyck came to Cayuga County as settled pastor has not been determined; it was about the year 1812. He continued, however, to make visits to his former congregation in Broadalbin and to record baptisms in the church record there, until some time in the year 1815.

CHURCH RECORDS.

The following documents have passed through my hands, in the preparation of this work.

1. One leaf from the original church record; for description cf. page 2.
2. Minutes of the Consistory, Sept. 14, 1811 to Aug. 28, 1834. Bound, pasteboard with calf back and corners; size 15 1/2 x 6 1/2 inches; pages 180, about 34 of which have writing upon them; condition good; abstracted on pages 5 to 17.
3. One packet, containing receipts for materials and money, in connection with building the second church edifice, 1812 to 1814; pages 12; size, 12 1/2 x 4 inches, stitched together; not abstracted or transcribed.
4. One mass of Documents, some of which have been abstracted or transcribed, pages 18 to 33.

The foregoing documents, etc. were received in the month of September, 1919, from Mr. Warren Giles, Clerk of the Consistory; they were returned to him in the month of November, 1919. The modern vital records begin about 1860; and the minutes of the Consistory, in 1884.

In the History of Montgomery Classis, published in 1915, on page 78, the following appears:

"Col. Hardenburgh married the same year Martina Brinckerhoff and the names of their two children, John Herring and Maria are on the Owasco register (1798-1800), Rev. Abram Brokaw, pastor."

I fail to find but one of the baptisms, in the fragment of the register, as it now appears: i. e. Maria, cf. entry No. 8, page 2. Personally, I believe that the Rev. W. N. P. Dailey secured his information from secondary sources and made a mistake as is usually the case. But if the fact was as he states it, there was more of the register in existence in 1915, than there is at present.

From a slip of paper, found among the church papers:

"John tasneur was born the year 1812, January 18th"

For a better spelling of "tasneur" see entry No. 2, page 6, and item No. 6, page 19.

DOCUMENTS.

Note. I have before me a mass of old papers, which were once kept in the church chest. There are cancelled notes, accounts of labor and materials used for the second church edifice, salary and subscription lists; the confession of faith and covenant for the Owasco church; papers relating to the Owasco Department of the Cayuga County Bible Society; constitution of the Owasco Temperance Society; subscriptions to employ S. Hine to conduct a singing school in the winter of 1834; salary receipts and other miscellaneous papers.

I have selected from these papers some, which I believe may in part compensate for the loss of the vital records of the church. At least, they will give some insight to the history of the church, from primary sources. The documents that have been copied verbatim et literatim appear within quotations; other documents have been abstracted.

1. Accounts for sawing and drawing timber, and labor, showing work was begun at the new Meeting house, on May 14, 1811. Names of persons engaged: Martin Kirkandal, Peter D'Wiet, Manson Benson, James Kirkandal, Bodowine Kirkandal, John Stevens, ----- Mock, Eliphalet Hoyt, Tom Price, Edmund Petty, Mager Vanhurter, Daniel Davis, Case Boveer, Enock Price, Eliphalet Burlingham and Dan Broadard.

2. Form of subscription for building the Meeting house.

"For Value Rec^d I promise to pay the Consistory of the Owasco Congregation or their Successors, Nine dollars and Fifty five Cents. To be in Neat Stock or Wheat to be applied towards building a Meeting-house for said Congregation, by the first day of May Anno domini Eighteen hundred and thirteen, as witness my hand this second day of January eighteen hundred and Eleven."

"Jas. Mc kee"

Also a note from Jas. Mc kee, same as above, for \$9.55, payable in cash, May 1, 1814.

3. Articles for sale of pews, dated Sept. 21, 1811. Conditions: The highest bidder to be the purchaser. Purchasers may give notes, not to exceed \$23.00 each; payable, one third, May 1, 1812, in cash; one third May 1, 1813, in wheat or neat stock; and one third, May 1, 1814, in cash.

"4. The Subscribers Obligate themselves to finish said building represented by the draught in three years from the first of May last, provided a sum sufficient be raised to finish the same, and than to furnish each purchaser, with a sufficient title to hold thereby the purchase he Now Makes, subject to those rules and Regulations mentioned in the articles of the Church."

Signed by, James Brinkerhoof, Samuel Depuy, Corn^s D. Dewitt, Jacob Brinkerhof [probably Elders] Levi Bodley, Samuel Hoornbeek [probably Deacons]

Indorsed: - "no pews sold under this Article."

4. Meeting of heads of families of the Congregation "at the New Meeting house" on Sept. 8, 1813. Resolved that the sum of \$1300, be taxed on the pews, sold and unsold, in order to finish the Meeting house; that \$500.00 of said sum be paid by January 1st, next; that the whole of the house be lathed and plastered; that the remainder of the pews be sold at vandue, on Sept. 21st, instant, at the Meeting house.

8. Note. On Oct. 7, 1823, two subscription lists were circulated simultaneously. The first, to raise a deficiency in the salary list which terminated on Jan. 1, 1824, amounting to \$41.39 and 42 bushels of wheat; the deficiency arose in consequence of the secession to the True Reformed Dutch Church; payments on this subscription were due, Jan. 1, 1824. The second list was to make up the deficiencies arising from deaths, removals and the secession, in order to continue Rev. C. Ten Eyck's services for one half of his time; and if more can be raised, to secure in addition one fourth of his services at Sand Beach. The subscriptions were to be in addition to the amounts subscribed on the original subscription; and were payable on Jan. 1, 1825, and annually thereafter. The two lists have been consolidated for this abstract.

9. The service of the Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck terminated at Owasco Outlet on Jan. 15, 1826. The fact that it was to end must have been known some months in advance, because on Nov. 30, 1825, new subscription lists were circulated in the Owasco congregation, to pay for his preaching on every Sabbath. The new subscription was for two years (1826 and 1827); and the old subscription list was cancelled. Subscriptions were made payable to Isaac Selover, Thomas Reed, Richard Parsel, Elijah De Voe, John M. Vanfleet, Philip Conklin, Simeon Westfall and Peter De Witt, the present Consistory and their successors in office. Three of the original subscription lists have been preserved. They are not all of the lists for 1826 and 1827, as Dominie Ten Eyck's whole salary was probably over \$300.00, which was paid by Owasco, alone.

10. When Rev. Conrad Ten Eyck's service under the two year subscription was drawing to a close, new subscriptions were circulated for two years more (1828 and 1829). The lists were dated Dec. 12, 1827; all old subscriptions were declared void. Two of the lists have been preserved: that of John Van fleet and Geo. H. Brinkerhoff, and that of David Wilson and Peter Tallman. The latter list has indorsed upon it:
 "He agreed to [pay] Mr. Ten Eyck three hundred and fifty dollars for the year Eighteen hund. and twenty nine in -----"

There are about forty collection lists, from the years 1831 to 1837. They show the individual annual subscriptions collected by each collector; they are of value because they indicate the various "wards" or regional groups in the congregation. By no means all of the lists have been preserved; some years there are more than others. Most of them have indorsements upon them, signed by the Rev. Israel Hammond, showing that he received the money collected. The collection lists for 1832 have been copied, as they appear to be complete. Collectors' memoranda are not included in the transcript.
