### SECTION I

## THE GENEALOGY OF THE WILLIAM H. AND SUSAN (YOUNG) BUSSEY FAMILY FROM 1710 to 1966.

This is not a genealogy of the Bussey family in America for a true genealogy traces all branches back to a common ancestor through those males carrying the family name. This is rather the genealogical report of one branch of that family, giving as much information as is available concerning the ancestry and the members and their families.

As early as 1900 William H. Bussey, father of the compiler of this report began collecting data on the genealogy of his branch of the Bussey family going back to William Bussey who came to this country from England as an immigrant and settled in Massachusetts between 1710 and 1728.

With the help of his son, William H. Bussey, Jr. who was attending Harvard at that time, the direct line was traced to William and Olive (Jordan) Bussey. Information was obtained from records of wills, probate files, deeds, marriages and war service. With this material and letters written by the sisters of William H. Bussey, the history of this branch of the family was quite complete down to 1925 but it was not organized and published.

In 1925 William H. Bussey died and all of the records, letters, and miscellaneous documents were taken by the writer and saved. To this material has been added many letters from living relatives which have added valuable information concerning the history of the family. As a result the genealogy has been brought down to date and printed for the use of present and future generations.

Of the many descendants included in this report that now have the surname Bussey there are only five who can pass the name down to the next generation; William and George Bussey, sons of James A. and Eleanor Bussey; Michael and Lawrence Bussey, sons of David A. and Mary Bussey and Donald S. Bussey, Jr. son of Donald S. and Anne Bussey. These five are great-grandsons of William H. and Carrie Bussey, and great-great-grandsons of William and Susan Bussey the subject of this report.

In the writing of this report the compiler wishes to express sincere thanks to Dr. M. B. Barnes of Iowa City whose inspiration and help have made it possible. He

has written several genealogies and his general outline and his code system have been followed here.

Of this code system he writes: "To avoid confusion caused by the repetition of similar names in the various branches of the family a code number has been assigned to each descendant named. Each digit in the code number indicates the actual or assumed order of birth of that individual in the family concerned. By careful attention to these code numbers, a given individual can be identified no matter how many others may have an identical name."

Since this report covers in part nine generations, the code system applied to all individuals would be too cumbersome; therefore, no numbers are given to the ancestors of William and Susan (Young) Bussey but only to the descendants. The code number of the first-born of William and Susan is 1 for Carrie Bussey. Her son then has the code number 1-1 and the second-born has number 1-2, etc.

Since much work has gone into the compiling of this report copies are being filed in the genealogical sections of Library of Congress; libraries in Phoenix, Arizona; Minneapolis, Minnesota; and in the State Historical Society of Iowa Library.

### SECTION II: ANCESTRY

The following excerpt is from "History of Canton, Massachusetts" in the England Historic Genealogical Society, in Boston, Mass.

\*''<u>William Bussey</u> the first of the name was an early immigrant. Here he found his sweetheart in the person of <u>Olive Jordan</u> and on the 6th day of June 1728 they were married. We hear no more of him for several years. He probably followed the sea. He conveyed land near the present turnpike in 1731. In 1756 he built the little house now standing near the Reservoir Park which he sold to Mr. Crosman in 1763.'' William Bussey was born about 1710. Olive Jordan was the daughter of Thomas Jordan of Dorchester, Mass. She died before 1763. Children: 9.

At the close of his article he wrote "I have felt a great desire to promote the cause of agriculture and manufactures and trust I shall be considered hereafter to have been a useful friend as well as a good wisher." William Bussey, the fifth-born of Isaiah and Nabby (Read) Bussey was born in Canton, Massachusetts on Feb. 6, 1808. He lived in Reading, N.Y. for many years. Several of his children were born there. Reading was at that time in Steuben County but later the county lines were changed and it was in Schuyler Co. From New York the family moved to St. Charles, Ill. There William died in 1854.

He married Susan Young, Feb. 6, 1836, in Reading, N.Y. She was born Feb. 6, 1815. She died in May 1893 in Jessup, Iowa.

9- Ella Bussey, ninth-born of William and Susan (Young) Bussey was born in St. Charles. Ill. December 6, 1851. She died in Phoenix, Arizona, January 27, 1920. On May 1, 1878 in Peru, Kansas, she married Milo Cone Webb who was born in Akron, Ohio on February 14, 1844. She was Milo's second wife. For a few years Milo had a store in Sedan, Kansas. Later he went into the cattle business. He drove cattle from Sedan Kansas to Arizona a trip which took five months. The family moved to Arizona where he continued in the cattle business but when the Roosevelt Dam was being constructed he bought a store and added this to his cattle business helped by his sons. After his retirement he moved to Phoenix where he died January 18, 1936. Of his army record he wrote, "I enlisted in Rockford, Ills., September 30th, 1861 for 3 years in Co. D. 11th Regiment Illinois Voluntary Infantry. Went to Camp at Binds Point, Mo. Our regiment was in the 3 months service and re-enlisted for 3 years August 1, 1861. I was a recruit and my first training was within the sound of the cannons at the battle of Grand Gulf down the Mississippi River. Our regiment was in active service in the front in many of the most prominent battles starting at Fort Henry, Tenn. to Ft. Donaldson, Shilo, Corinth. After three years service was discharged in September 3-, 1864 at White River, Arkansas." The above was taken from a letter written by Milo Webb to his wife's brother, William H. Bussey from Phoenix, Arizona on February 13, 1920.

An interesting account of the Webb family was written by Anderson Cone Webb. It was first published in three issues of the Arizona Cattlelog about 1948. In 1958, the articles were consolidated for the newspaper in Globe, Ariz.

### SECTION IX. REFERENCES

### Life of Benjamin Bussey written by himself at age of 84

"Deacon Joseph Hartwell of Stoughton (now Canton) was my grandfather. I was 1. born in his house March 1, 1757 and I am now 84 years old, March 1841. The house was burnt. Deacon Hartwell was one of the best farmers in the state. My father followed the sea for several years, and was absent when I was born.

My mother died at 39 years of age of small pox. My father lived to be over 80.

My father was born in Canton and was named Benjamin Bussey and his father was an Englishman and a farmer. After my father bought his estate he left off going to sea, and became a country merchant. I went to school in Stoughton. I went to school winters some years and worked on my father's land, and some times in the store. After my mother's death my father married a second wife, and still lived in Canton, but had no child by her.

The American Revolution commenced in 1775 when I was 18 years old. My father then gave me freedom. I went in a company to go to Squantum to take off cattle and sheep from the isle and to prevent the English from getting them. We succeeded in effecting the object. In 1776 I had the small pox and came near dying.

I recovered and enlisted in Dedham in a company under Captain Timothy Stow of that place to go to Ticonderoga. I bought a young horse and rode up to Charlestown No. 4 where our company was to assemble.

Our company was not one of the Continental army, but a draft from the militia to serve during the campaign. My time expired the latter part of December in 1776. While I was at Ticonderoga, Arnold was defeated on Lake Champlain and retreated. I left Ticonderoga in December and returned home and stayed there until 1777 when I was called to go with the Regiment and rode up to Bennington with several officers.'

With fifty dollars he bought tools and went into the goldsmith's business, in **Dedham** in 1778.

"My goldsmith's business was very good. A great demand for spurs, spoons. My rule never to adulterate my metal and never to sell silver wear inferior to dollars."

"I married my present wife Judith Gay of Dedham the 25th of August 1780. I then owed \$600 on my house. We resolved to refrain from all expense until we got clear of debt. I kept on the goldsmith's business two or three years."

Later he carried on a merchandise business and went into fur trade as well.

I give unto my son Isaiah Bussey the whole remainder of my estate both real and personal to hold to him and his heirs and assigns, he paying the legacies hereafter mentioned viz: To my son Elijah Bussey, \$30.00; to my granddaughters Olive Stone and Polly Bussey \$10.00 each; to my grandsons George Stone and John Bussey \$1.00 each.

I appoint my son, Isaiah Bussey executor of my will."
