PREFACE.

THE desire to know something of the origin, character and work of their ancestors, led the three compilers of this book, independently of each other, to gather such information concerning their immediate line as was available. Research of public and private records, begun some twenty years ago, was carried on as a pleasant recreation, occupying the leisure moments of active business life. A few years ago, becoming acquainted with each other's work, the compilers decided to combine the results of their investigations, with a view of eventual publication.

By extensive inquiry and correspondence throughout the country with members of the family, wherever located, much the larger part of the record has been obtained. Careful examination of town and other public records has been made in places where the families have long been located, and the results have verified and confirmed the individual record, which makes a continuous and fairly complete history of the family from the time that Thomas Boyden, one of the founders of New England, landed in 1634 to the present day.

His associates think it is but fair to say that the final arrangement of the material, its preparation for the press and the supervision of the printing have been the willing labor of Mr. Merrill N. Boyden.

The large number of Boyden ancestors who were Revolutionary soldiers, and the re-enlistment into the Continental army "for the war" by many of them, is notable, and attests their patriotic spirit.

The detail of service rendered by them may be found in "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War," Vol. II, published by the State. Certificates of a soldier's record may be obtained at the Archives in the State House, Boston.

The records are arranged by consecutive generations, of which the emigrant ancestor is the first, his children the second, and so on. The small figures at the right of the names designate the generation; the large figure at the left of the name is the distinctive number of that person, whose further record will appear in the next generation; the absence of a figure indicates that nothing more is known. Towns and cities, when the State is not mentioned, are to be understood as being in Massachusetts, except as governed by the context.

Discrepancies between dates as here given, and those in certain family records, may perhaps be discovered; it has often been difficult to decide which of the conflicting reports received should be accepted; it is proper to say, however, that nothing has been given except on authority believed to be reliable. Corrections or information which will aid in perfecting the record will be gladly received by Mr. Wallace C. Boyden, Newtonville, Mass., or by Mr. Merrill N. Boyden, Old State House, Boston, Mass. A few errors, discovered since the pages on which they occur were printed, are noted on page 237.

THOMAS BOYDEN

AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

THOMAS BOYDEN is the ancestor of all who by birth have borne the name in America, with a few exceptions occurring during the last fifty years. He embarked for New England in the ship 'Francis' from Ipswich, Suffolk County, England, in April, 1634, having taken the oath of allegiance and supremacy before His Majesty's officers according to the order of the Lords of his Privy Council. He was then twenty-one years of age, as stated in the list of passengers.

Everything known clearly indicates that the family was long established in England. James Guilt, in his Encyclopedia of Architecture in a list of famous early Architects, gives the name of William Boyden as Architect of the Chapel of the Virgin at St. Alban's Abbey in the 13th century. The surname has frequently been found in English records during the past three centuries, and there is a village in Suffolk called Boyden, where are located certain estates enumerated in the will of an English nobleman.

Of the parentage, birthplace, or history of Thomas previous to embarkation, nothing has been found. No mention of that period of his life has appeared in any existing records of the several towns where he resided, viz.: Scituate, Watertown, Boston, Groton, and Medfield. From histories of those

places, and from private, town, and other public records, the following facts have been gleaned:—

In 1635 he was in the service of William Gilson, of Scituate (Plymouth Colony), who was a large tax-payer in 1633, one of the founders of the church there in January, 1635, and builder of the first windmill in the Colony for grinding corn, which before that time was pounded. As William Gilson located in that place about 1631, it is not an improbable conjecture that some previous acquaintance existed, and induced Thomas to emigrate and engage in his employ.

The admission of Thomas to the church in Scituate, May 17, 1635, is found in the church records. Just how long he remained there, and when or where he was married to Frances—, his first wife, is unknown. He next appears as living in Watertown, where the birth of a son Thomas, Sept. 26, 1639, is recorded in the town records. He transferred his church membership to the First Church in Watertown, and was made a Freeman May 23, 1647. Three other children are recorded as having been born in Watertown.

In 1650 he was of Boston, as appears in a deed dated 27. I. 1650, granting and conveying a certain lot of land in Watertown, of thirty acres more or less, to Wm. Clarke of Watertown, recorded in Suffolk Deeds, Lib. I. He continued to live in Boston for several years, and two children were born there and baptized in the First Church, as appears in the church and town records. The death of his wife Frances stands in Boston records as occurring March 17, 1658, and is also found in the Medfield records. On Nov. 3, 1658, he was married in Boston by Gov. Bellingham to Hannah (Phillips) Morse, widow of Joseph Morse. The Boston records also show that "at a general town meeting, upon public notice from house to house, town officers were chosen 12. 1. 1659/60." Thomas Boyden was at that time chosen one of the Highway Surveyors. This is the only public service rendered by him, of which any record has been found.

By a deed dated Feb. 14, 1659, Thomas Boyden, of Boston, and Hannah, his wife, granted and conveyed unto Joshua

Scottow, seven acres of upland and meadow in Muddy River (now Brookline) in Boston, entered and recorded Aug. 22, 1660, in Suffolk Deeds, Lib. III, p. 390.

In 1660 there was a settlement of the Morse estate, and the eldest son having received his portion, the Court allowed Thomas Boyden to improve the estates of the rest of his wife's children till they should be of age. It was afterwards agreed that he should have all the lands and houses, and pay to each of the children, when of age, the sum of £26. 13. 4, and he was to see that the "sonnes" were taught to read and write. For the execution of this obligation he, "late of Boston, now of Medfield," gave a bond to the Judge of Probate in the sum of £180, dated June 27, 1665.

On the 12th of Sept., 1662, Thomas Boyden of Medfield and Hannah, his wife, sold "their dwelling house, barn, garden, and orchard ground thereto belonging, and lately dwelt in, situate at the entrance of Sudbury Lane, Boston, to Simon Lynde of Boston, Merchant," and conveyed the premises by a deed recorded in Suffolk Deeds, Lib. IV, p. 61. He removed at some unknown date to Groton, where he had an original proprietor's right of seven acres of land, and was living there Sept. 21, 1666, when he bought of Benjamin Crispé of Watertown, a dwelling house, etc., with seven acres, and several other parcels of land amounting to ninetytwo acres. July 25, 1670, he, then of Watertown, sold to Martin Townsend for £60, the house and land he bought of Benj. Crispé; also two other lots containing seventy-three acres. The house in Medfield, which originally belonged to the Morse heirs, and which became the Boyden homestead, was on what is now Pound Street. The town records show that in 1678 he subscribed "one bushel of wheat to the new brick college" (Harvard), joining many other citizens contributing similar commodities in aid of a building partly completed. In 1682 he was chosen tithing-man* in Medfield.

[•] The tithing man of Massachusetts was, primarily, the head man of a neighborhood of ten families, at least; elected by the inhabitants in their several precincts, as was provided for by the Act of the General Court in 1679. He

after which nothing more is said of him. His wife Hannah died Oct. 3, 1676. No record of his death has been found, nor any settlement of his estate. Their children—the first four born in Watertown, the last two in Boston—were:

was not a collector of the tithes, it seems, as the name might imply, but a conservator of the peace, having an oversight of his particular families, in general, of their delinquencies and ill-behavior. The duties of this official appear to have been distinguished from that of a constable in that it had a more intimate control and oversight of families and the morals of their respective neighborhoods, having a greater home power, more of the character of a fatherly inspection and guidance.

The births of the first five children were obtained from the Woburn town records, against which the following entry also appears:—"These five children of Thomas and Martha Boyden were entered here, by their mother's request, because of their moving to and fro in the Indian War. Some of them were never recorded anywhere else, and the rest of the records were lost." The birth of the last child, Benjamin, is taken from the Charlestown records, and it is probable that he died young. In the Registry of Deeds, Middlesex Co., the following records appear:—"Jan. 12, 1714/15, Thomas Boyden of Groton, to son John Boyden, now residing in Dedham, Co. of Suffolk, parcel of land in Groton." "May 29, 1714, Thomas Boyden of Groton, a parcel of land to Jonathan Boyden of same town."

Jonathan (3) Boyden's name, with that of his father, appears on the list of proprietors of Medfield in 1675. He

was the only one of the family who removed to Medfield with the father. There is no record of the settlement of his father's estate, but it seems to have been transferred to him in some way. He was prominent in town affairs, serving as Selectman four years, and chairman of the committee to protest against the division of the town in 1712. He was in full communion with the church prior to 1697; became Captain in the Militia in 1712, and was Representative to the General Court in 1715.

In the records of Groton, the marriage of Primus, Capt. Boyden's slave, to Margaret, mulatto, appears in the year 1741,—both of Groton.

Capt. Jonathan Boyden acquired considerable wealth, and was highly esteemed by his townsmen, serving them as Selectman for several years. He died in the year 1749, as the Probate Records give the appointment, on Dec. 26, 1749, of an Administrator "for the Estate of the late Jonathan Boyden, gentleman, of Groton."

Joseph Boyden (6) removed to that part of Dedham which later was set off as the town of Needham. In connection with his removal, the following letter to the Governor of

Massachusetts will be of interest, as he was mentioned in the list of "persons gone," sent with the letter: -

GROTON July 9, 1707.

May it please your Excellency, according to your Excellency's commands, we have sent an account of those who are actually removed, or are meditating of it. Our people are reduced to that degree, that they find themselves unable to subsist any longer, would pray your Excellency either to grant liberty for their remove, or that they may be reduced here entirely to garrison of the town militia for the preservation of the frontiers. We thankfully acknowledge your Excellency's great care of us hitherto, and would pray the continuance of your regards, without which we are an undone people. We take leave to subscribe

Joseph Boyden was chosen a selectman of Needham 1721. and also, the same year, one of three custodians of a fund of "Eaight score pounds" received by an Act of the General Court, for the "use of the Town and School,"

On August 12, 1735, he was a tavern keeper in Sutton, and in 1736 he and his wife were dismissed from the Church in Needham and recommended to the Church in Sutton. He removed to Worcester in 1738, where he had bought "a tract of land on the south side of said town," in a part known as "Bogachoge," of a hundred acres more or In the deed by the grantor, Abisha Rice, Joseph is styled Innholder, of Dedham. In 1740 he conveyed this land to his sons Daniel and John, "with buildings thereon where I now dwell," reserving a home and the support of himself and wife for life. This property has since been known as the "Old Boyden place."

Daniel (21) settled on a farm about 1740 in the south part of Worcester, removing thence from Dedham. His name first appeared in the tax and jury lists of Worcester in March, 1741. Later, he served the town as Selectman several years. He was a proprietor of the First Parish Church, from the time of settling until the section where he lived was made the "South Precinct," in 1776, when a new parish was created and a new church organized, which he actively promoted and sustained through life. In 1778 this parish and others became a township, named Ward, which in 1837 was changed to Auburn. Daniel and his brother John were among the original proprietors of Guilford, Vt., with other citizens of Worcester.

His son William was a pioneer settler in Dummerston, Vt., and became a man of affairs. He was a prosperous farmer, and influential in supporting school, church and civil matters. He left a valuable estate, and named his wife Joanna and nephew Asa as executors of his will. He had no children, but had adopted Asa, son of his brother Darius, when he was five years of age, and also adopted several orphan girls.

Joshua (26), after the death of his father, appears to have taken up his abode with his grandfather, Capt. Jonathan, upon whose death in 1732 he inherited the homestcad. It is certain that Joshua was living in Pound street, near South, in 1735. He was a housewright, and had perhaps assisted in building the house. He was Sealer of Weights and Measures in 1742, and Selectman in 1755, 1757 and 1758. In 1762 he deeded the homestead to his son Asa, and removed to "Rutland District," that part known as the town of Barre, Mass., where he was admitted to the church by letter from the Medfield church.

Seth Boyden (27), the ancestor of the Foxborcugh Boydens, bought (May 25, 1737) 268\frac{3}{4} acres of the so-called "Dorchester Lands," being in the "Forty Fifth Lot," held in common, and lying in that part of Stoughton (then in Suffolk County) which was incorporated later, with parts of other towns, into the town of Foxborough, in Norfolk County, paying for the land £470 6s. 3d.

By this and subsequent purchases he acquired a controlling interest in about six hundred acres of land, which was, however, by allowance for "bad land," rated as about 437 acres. He appears to have been the local representative and active spirit of the "Proprietors of the Forty-fifth lot" from 1739 to 1758, and possibly later, in the development of its iron industry.

Hundreds of tons of the ore were dug from these "Lands" and sold by each of the several owners annually, under restrictions imposed and rights granted by the proprietors at their meetings. The records of these meetings are still in existence, and show Seth to have been a man of energy and purpose, careful and methodical in his habits, and possessing the confidence of his fellow proprietors, many of whom lived in Walpole, Medfield, or other adjoining towns.

In 1750 he was collector for the Second Ministerial Precinct of Stoughton, and his accounts and Rate-book covering the service rendered are to-day an evidence of his care in business matters entrusted to him. His name appears for the first time on the voting list of Stoughton in the year 1742, and it is probable that he removed to Stoughton at about that date, and built the house and cleared the ground to which in 1744 he brought his wife, Elizabeth Turner.

A family tradition says that he first built a small log cabin against the great rock on the old farm, and then planted an orchard and built his house near by, some of the stones of which still remain.

Josiah moved to Deerfield, probably in 1762. Jan. 12, 1767, a petition of the inhabitants of the South-west Division, to be set off into a township, was granted by vote of the

town of Deerfield; among the petitioners the names of Josiah and John Boyden appear. The new town was incorporated June 17, 1767, as Conway, and the first meeting held on Aug. 24, 1767, when the organization was completed and town officers chosen; among them was Josiah Boyden. He was probably the second man who settled there, and his son David was the first child born in the limits of what became Conway His daughter Mary (who married Medad Crittenden) was born on the day the first town meeting was held, and attended the Centennial Anniversary in 1867. The following is taken from the oration given that day: "The first settlers of Conway were men and women of sound minds. frugal and industrious habits, strict integrity of character, and sterling worth." Several farms belonging to the early Boydens are still cultivated by their descendants, notably that of Josiah (38), where the sixth of that name, Josiah Raymond, son of Josiah Dwight, is now living, 1000, aged six vears.

John (39) went from Andover to Deerfield in May, 1763, and settled in the part which was afterward set off as Conway. Col. Frye bought a farm there and gave it to his daughter Sarah. At her decease it went to her two eldest sons, John, Jr., and James, by deed which is in the possession of her great-grandson, James Dwight Boyden, of Conway (1898). John and Sarah, his wife, were admitted to the church in Conway, June 22, 1770, and their sons John, James, and Frederick were then baptized by Rev. John Emerson; he was the first minister in Conway, having been settled there in 1769. Referring to its rough condition at that time, he said he was literally "John preaching in the wilderness."

Jonathan (40) lived in Groton from his birth until after 1784, when he removed to Chester, Vt., where his three voungest children were born. His daughters, Eunice and Rebecca, were married in Chester. In January, 1703, he was dismissed by the Groton church, and recommended to a church in Cavendish, Vt., a town adjoining Chester. No evidence has appeared that he owned any home in Chester, nor any town record of the birth of his children. He removed to Shoreham. Vt., with his family (date not known). In 1807 Ionathan and Rebekah Boyden, of Shoreham, gave a mortgage, which was paid and discharged Jan. 17, 1811. This mortgage was witnessed by Jonathan Boyden, Jr. His sons. Ionathan and David, married girls born in Shoreham:the latter married Amy Waite about 1811, when he went to New York State, and his father with him, probably; finally, about 1820, they located in Washington County, Ind., in a village now called Campbellsburg, and remained there till after the father's death, about 1833.

Jacob (66) removed with his family to Eastern Maine, where he was the pioneer settler of what is now the town of Robbinston. He began clearing the dense forest bordering a lake called by Indians "Nasaic" (meaning roily water) ever since known as Boyden Lake. Possessed of great physical strength and mechanical faculty, he and his sons felled the big trees for lumber, cleared the land for farming, and built a saw mill and blacksmith shop. Jacob hammered out on his anvil a gang-saw, which was successfully used for sawing logs. In the course of time he had a fine farm and a comfortable home. He was known as Deacon Boyden, and was ever active in good works, and highly esteemed by all that knew him. After the death of his father, Seth came into possession of the homestead and a large portion of the farm; his ten children were born there. His sons assisted him in the farm work during their minority. He was very ingenious, was his own blacksmith, and did the necessary iron work upon farming implements, beside much that was experimental in machinery. He invented a machine for splitting leather, constructed it in his blacksmith shop, and operated it successfully. In 1815 his sons Seth and Alexander bought of him an exclusive right to control the business in the State of New York. He was prominently active in the town business, and was chosen many times as Selectman, and Representative to the General Court. He held a commission as a Justice of the Peace.

The closing year of the Revolution found him, though but a youth, cruising in a privateer, captured by a British fleet, and thrown into a prison ship at New York, whence he with three companions from Foxboro were released at the close of the war.

Uriah A. Boyden was educated in the schools of Foxboro, and assisted his father in the work of the farm until his majority. He then joined his eldest brother Seth at Newark, N. J., and remained with him until about 1828, when he re-

turned to Massachusetts and engaged under James Hayward on the first surveys for the Boston & Providence Railroad; he was afterward employed, under Loammi Baldwin, in the construction of the stone dry dock in Charlestown Navy Yard, of several mills at Lowell, and of the Boston & Lowell Railroad. In 1836–8 the Nashua & Lowell Railroad was built by him as engineer. In 1837 he opened an office in Joy's Building, on Washington Street, Boston, as a civil engineer, and at the date of his death he occupied nine rooms for business purposes; his bachelor home was in Young's Hotel, across the court.

He invented and patented improvements on the turbine water-wheel, and in philosophical and electrical apparatus, which gave him a large income, and enabled him to devote much time to scientific pursuits for some years previous to his death.

He attained distinction as a mathematician, and was honored and esteemed by his professional brethren. Harvard College conferred upon him the honorary degree of A. M. in 1853.

His garments were always of Quaker color and style; he was a vegetarian in diet, never drank tea, coffee, wine or spirits, was an early riser, and daily took a long walk at a rapid gait, before breakfast, rain or shine. He bequeathed nearly his entire estate in trust for "scientific investigation of the properties of caloric and phenomena relating thereto." This has been invested as The Boyden Fund, which now amounts to \$240,000, — Harvard University being the trustee, — and the income is used, in accordance with the provisions of the will, largely in connection with Harvard's astronomical station in Peru.

Simeon (87) was a wool carder and cloth dresser in North-field, and a manufacturer of wool cards in Orange, previous to 1810. In that year he was keeping a tavern in Market Square, in Boston, where the Plymouth stages had their booking office for passengers. he perfected the first locomotive with the driving-rod outside the wheel, produced the first daguerreotype in America, invented the process of making spelter, discovered the art of making Russian sheet-iron, and patented a hat-body doming machine, used in all the hat manufactories in the United States."—Dicty. of Am. Biography.

A bronze statue of "Seth Boyden, Inventor," stands in Washington Park, Newark, N. J., erected by the mechanics and artisans of that city, in honor of a fellow-craftsman. He was a philosopher, acquired an excellent knowledge of optics, chemistry, electricity and botany, and worked to accomplish certain results beneficial to mankind, rather than for his own pecuniary gain. In his later life he undertook the cultivation of the strawberry, and succeeded in producing berries of the finest flavor and of enormous size, fifteen weighing a pound.

Alexander (152) was a veteran of the war of 1812, and a captain in the militia of New Jersey in 1816. He possessed inventive and mechanical faculties in a marked degree. His first business venture was in 1815, when the exclusive right for the State of New York to operate the leather splitting machine was granted to him and his brother Seth by their father, the inventor. In 1822 he made the first mallcable iron casting, and in 1826 established the manufacture of mallcable iron in Newark, N. J., with his brother Seth. In 1834 the Boyden Mallcable Iron Co., of which the brothers were the factors, built a furnace in East Boston. He patented a moulding flask called the match or snap flask, which is still used and considered to be the best. As a business man he was forceful and energetic.

Nathaniel (187) fitted for college by his own exertions, teaching school to obtain the necessary means; he entered Union College, at Schenectady, N. Y., and graduated in 1820; he then studied law with his uncle, Judge Hayden, of Penn Yan, N. Y.; about 1823 he removed to North Carolina, where he taught school, and made an especial study of

the statutes of the State. He began to practice law in 1825, in Stokes County, and by energy and devotion to the interests of his clients, he won distinction and a lucrative practice throughout that State. During the Civil War he represented his County in the Legislature; in 1865 he was elected President of the North Carolina Railroad Company, a member of the Constitutional Convention, again a member of Congress, and lastly was appointed a Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina, which position he held at the time of his death.

George Dwight Boyden was born in Conway, Mass. His family went West while he was young, and settled in Lincoln,

Ill., in 1857. In 1875, he decided that Chicago offered greater advantages for him and moved there in that year. He at once made a place for himself in the business world and soon gained an enviable reputation for honesty, ability, and good judgment. Until his death, he was an influential citizen, always generous and public spirited. He never sought any political preferment and avoided prominence. He even refused official connections with the Board of Trade. He was a modest and retiring man and objected to appearing in any way as a public character. His shrewdness and foresight were everywhere admired and acknowledged. He was said to have hardly a single enemy in the world. He is supposed to have left a large estate, but the major portion of his wealth consisted of personal property.

Dwight (194) had assisted his father, "the prince of land-lords," and "knew how to run a hotel." He became the first landlord of the Tremont House, Boston, which in elegance of appointments surpassed any hotel in the country. It was opened Oct. 16, 1829, by a grand banquet; among the gentlemen present were Judge Story, Daniel Webster, Edward Everett, Peter C. Brooks, and Josiah Quincy, Mayor of the city, presiding: Everett graced the occasion by a brilliant speech. Travellers were attracted from the first by the superior accommodations offered, and it continued to be the hotel of Boston par excellence for many years. In 1842 Charles Dickens was a guest of the house, and mentions it in his "American Notes," in these words:—"The hotel, a very excellent

one, is called the Tremont House; it has more galleries, colonnades, piazzas and passages than I can remember, or the reader will believe." In 1851 a book was published, entitled, "Rich Men of Massachusetts," in which Dwight Boyden was mentioned as having "begun poor; now worth \$150,000, mostly accumulated in the Tremont House."

Ebenezer (219), after graduation at Yale College, pursued a course in divinity in the Virginia Theological Seminary, and on May 18, 1828, he was ordained deacon in the Protestant Episcopal Church by Bishop R. C. Moore, at Petersburg, Va. He then returned to the Seminary, and for about eighteen months was the editor of *The Theological Repertory*, a monthly magazine previously edited by the professors. Late in 1829 he took charge of Trinity Church, in Staunton, Va. Near the close of 1832 he accepted a call to St. Paul's Church, Norfolk, Va., where he remained for about two and

a half years. Owing to failing health in the low country, he then left Norfolk, and took charge of Trinity Church, Cleveland, Ohio. He found the work here, however, too severe for a delicate constitution, and in November, 1838, he was forced to resign, and returned to Virginia. On June 1, 1839, he became rector of Grace Church, Walker's Parish, Albemarle Co., Va., in connection with St. Anne's Parish, also in Albemarle, but the latter charge he resigned in 1849, accepting in its stead the rectorship of St. John's Church, in Louisa County. These two parishes he served until 1879, when he resigned both charges, owing to increasing age and infirmities, and retired—not to a life of dependence and inactivity, but to continued usefulness, as far as strength permitted.

Phineas was reared on the farm and in the district school, and became an apprentice to the blacksmith in his native village at sixteen years of age. Soon after reaching his majority he purchased the stand of his employer and carried on the business in the same shop up to the time of his death.

He did a thriving business, employing many hands, in this manufacturing village, situated on the Boston and Providence turnpike road, midway between these two cities; here the stage coach company kept a relay of hundreds of horses which came to the blacksmith for their shoes, while the factory agents, farmers, and families came for various metal implements, etc. He was a man of sterling Christian character, and highly respected.

Elbridge (308) was but six months old when his parents removed to Orange, where he passed his boyhood and school days. At sixteen years of age he was apprenticed for three years to a carpenter in Athol; he applied himself to his work, studied thoroughly the principles of design and construction,



Albert G. Boyden (395) was the oldest of six children. His father was a man of sterling worth, and his mother a woman of fine character, who set before her children the ideal of a noble life. He attended the district school until the age of seventeen years. He had decided to be a teacher, and strongly desired to attend college, but was prevented by lack of funds. During his minority, he worked on his father's farm and in his blacksmith shop, in the meantime teaching school three winter terms, in Foxboro. On reaching his majority, with good health, good habits, and a trade,

he still preferred teaching, and immediately began earning money to pay for professional training. In 1848, he entered the State Normal School at Bridgewater: after graduation, he taught in Hingham, and in 1850 was appointed assistant in the school at which he graduated, and held the position for three years, under Nicholas Tillinghast, its distinguished founder. From 1850 to 1860, he was for three years principal of the Salem English High School, one year sub-master in Boston, and more than six years assistant in the Normal School. In 1860, he was appointed principal of the Bridgewater State Normal School, in which position he is still serving. During these forty years more than four thousand pupils have come under his tuition, and he has developed one of the strongest institutions of the kind in the country. The school plant, under his wise business management, has risen in value from a small building worth \$10,000 to a large establishment of seven buildings and many acres of land. worth half a million dollars. His unusual success is due to the fact that he has been not only an earnest student and an inspiring teacher, but a sympathetic, helpful friend to his pupils, and a wise and tactful administrator. He has been an officer and active worker in various educational organizations, both national and local, in church work and in all movements looking to the improvement of the community in which he lived. In all his work, he received the able and untiring assistance of his wife Isabella; and their home life, of which they were especially fond, was characterized by affection, wise guidance of their children, and high ideals.

William Cowper (460) was educated at the Beverly Academy and the Salem Latin School, but was prevented by ill-

health from a college course. He entered the employ of Joseph Burnett & Co., Boston, as book-keeper, and for more than twenty years held a position which developed into one of large responsibility; afterwards, in partnership with George H. Allen, of Lynn, he engaged successfully in the manufacture of paper boxes in Lynn and Beverly. He was for many years a trustee of the Beverly Public Library and a member of the school committee, and served in positions of responsibility in the Unitarian Church and the many charitable institutions of his native town; untiring in energy and public spirit, but hampered always by a delicate physique.

Mr. Boyden was courteous, even gentle, in bearing, but of keenly incisive mind and immovable purpose. Religious conviction was a vital motive power in his life. He sought no position, but did not shrink from any duty that was laid upon him. Appreciative of literature and music, he had unusual resources for a man of affairs,—read widely and was an admirer of Dickens, whose humorous sayings he often quoted. His count of years was few, but his activities were many and constant to the end of his life.
