THOMAS BANCROFT OF DEDHAM AND READING, MASS., AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDANTS

1. THOMAS BANCROFT, of Dedham and Reading, Mass., a native of England,* born about 1625,† died at Lynn, Mass., 19 Aug. 1691.‡ He married first at Dedham, 31: 1 mo. 1647, ALICE BACON, who died 29: 1 mo. 1648, daughter of Michael Bacon; § and secondly, at Dedham, 15: 7 mo. 1648, ELIZABETH METCALF, baptized at St. Benedict's, Norwich, England, 20 Sept. 1626, died at Reading 11 May 1711, aged 85 years, daughter of Michael and Sarah (Ellwyn) Metcalf. (See REGISTER, vol. 6, pp. 171–173; vol. 78, p. 64.)

The exact date of Thomas Bancroft's arrival in the Massachusetts Bay Colony is unknown. He may have come with his brother John Bancroft in 1632. He was made fatherless in England in 1627, but as his stepmother lived until 1639, it is probable that he remained in England rather than, when but ten years old, make the migration to America with his brother.

The death of his stepmother in 1639 in England would have left him free to follow his relatives to America in 1640. In his "History of Lynn" Newhall includes "Lieut. Thomas

In his "History of Lynn" Newhall includes "Lieut. Thomas Bancroft" among the newcomers in 1640. Thomas Bancroft, the subject of this article, was then but eighteen years old and could scarcely be correctly described as "lieutenant." However, he acquired this title later, and was thereafter always referred to as "Lieutenant Thomas Bancroft" or as "Ensign," so it is probable that he did come to Lynn among the newcomers in 1640. It would have been quite possible for Newhall to identify him by using the title by which he was later most frequently known.

Thomas Bancroft was admitted a townsman at the annual town meeting of Dedham, Mass., held in the spring of 1648, and at the meeting of the town, held on 12th of 10th month 1650, he was granted a parcel of land (not exceeding three acres) near the land of

I expect he was a prominent character, as he was buried in the most conspicuous place in the yard, within two rods of the meeting house. I looked very closely to find his wife's grave, but could not discover it."

This evidently was not the first grant of land to Thomas Bancroft, for four days later the selectmen "granted vnto Thomas Bancroft liberty to remove his fence so that he may have such an enlargement on the back side of his Barne as maye be necessary for the setting of a leanto against said barne, this enlargement to be such as shall be according to the direction of William Bullard and Eleazer Lusher. pyded that the said Thomas doe alowe so much land on the other side of the way right against the foresaid place as may continue the wave ther at the due breadth: & allso doe so much worke there in the waye, as the forenamed men shall judg needfull to make the waye convenient for passing through."

He was taxed at Dedham from 1648 until 1652, when his name disappears from the records of that town.

On 19th of 10th mo. 1649 Thomas Bancroft was adjudged behind in his highway work 6 sh. On the 12th of 12th mo. following, this 6 sh. was discharged "vpon condicion that he (and another man also in default) performe 2 sufficient dayes worke with 6 cattell and a cart and a man in fetching fencing stuffe at ye Town's appointment for the enclosing the high way thru John Bacon's lott.'

However, Thomas Bancroft had removed to Reading, Mass., by 1648, for he was a freeman there in 1648, and a member of the church of the First Parish of Reading as early as 29th Sept. 1648. His wife Elizabeth joined the Dedham church, 14th, 10th mo. 1651, and retained her membership until 16th, 4th mo. 1662, when she joined the Reading church. (Church records.)

He must have preceded his wife and children from Dedham, as his son Thomas was born in Dedham in 1649 and his daughter Elizabeth and son John were born and died there in 1650. In Eaton's "Genealogical History of Reading," p. 43, it is said he was spoken of as residing in Reading at the time of his second marriage in 1648.

He leased a house in 1655, and in 1670 he purchased 60 acres of land in what was Lynn and is now Lynnfield, near Beaver Dam. Here was the Bancroft homestead.

The Registry of Deeds of Essex County, at Salem, has records of several purchases of land by Thomas Bancroft, the earliest of which is recorded 6, 9, 1670. The record of the last transaction in real estate made by Thomas Bancroft is dated 29 Apr. 1691, a few months before he died, and is a deed transferring a part of the homestead to his son John. (Essex County Register of Deeds, vol. 9, pp. 58–59.)

The first military company of Reading (says Eaton) was formed probably at the time of the town's incorporation in 1644, and was called the Reading Infantry Company. Thomas Bancroft was at the head of this company early, as he was the seventh man who occupied that position. Later he occupied the position as ensign

of this company for many years. In the Massachusetts Military Archives there is a return dated 10 Dec. 1675, of men who had been impressed in the town of Reading, in which his name appears.

In the Massachusetts Military Archives, vol. 69, p. 245, the original of the following petition of Thomas Bancroft to the General Court is to be found.

In 1664 he was one of the appraisers of the estate of Willyam Stuard, and in 1679 of the estate of John Persson. (Essex County Probate Records.) He was given administration on the estate of his nephew Benjamin Bicknal, son of William and Martha (Metcalf) Bicknal of Charlestown, the inventory of which was dated 28 Jan. 1678/9. (Suffolk Probate Records.)

The records of the Essex County Quarterly Court contain a number of references to Thomas Bancroft, showing him to have been a trial juror at several sessions of the Court held at Salem from 1666 to 1680. He was also a constable for Lynn in June 1681, and the venire dated 18 Aug. 1681 was served by him and bears his autograph.

The record of the last transaction in real estate made by Thomas Bancroft is dated 28 Apr. 1691, a few months before he died, and is a deed transferring a part of the homestead to his son John. (Essex County Register of Deeds, vol. 9, pp. 58–59.)

In Book 303 of the Essex County Probate Court, Salem, is the following record of the disposition of the estate of Thomas Bancroft, he having died intestate. The index number is 1630, but the original inventory, agreement for the settlement of the estate, letters of administration, and bond, are missing. The only record, therefore, is as follows:

"Bancroft, Lt. Thomas, of Lynn, died August 19, 1691, and Ebenezer Bancroft his son was administrator. Some of the land was bought of Goodmen Collins and Basset of Lynn and of F. Skerry and Goodman Pickering of Salem. Some of his land was in Reading. The following heirs petition the court Nov. 24th, viz.: Elizabeth the widow Thomas the eldest son John and Ebenezer, sons Joseph Brown yt married Elizabeth John Woodward who married Sarah and Mary the youngest daughter who was then unmarried."

2. LIEUT. THOMAS² BANCROFT (*Thomas*¹), born at Dedham 14 July 1649 and baptized 28 Oct. 1651, died 12 July 1718 * and is buried in the burial ground around the First Congregational Church at Wakefield, Mass. He married at Reading, 10 Apr. 1673, SARAH POOLE, born at Reading 11 July 1656, died there 20 May 1723 † and is buried beside her husband, daughter of Capt. Jonathan and Judith (Jacobs) Poole.

Thomas² Bancroft "owned the covenant" 13-11-1670. and joined the First Parish Church 1 Sept. 1677.

Thomas Bancroft lived in the westerly part of Reading, his home having been the fourth house built in the west parish. A reference to his home is made in Mr. John M. Bancroft's letter of 30 July 1903, given in the account of Thomas Bancroft. Sr.

Like his father, Thomas was a military man, and in 1675/6was an officer in King Philip's War. Under date of 12 July 1689 he was chosen lieutenant in a Lynn company. On 30 Aug. 1689 he was appointed lieutenant of the soldiers of the lower Middlesex regiment, who had been impressed to march against the Indians.[‡].

As Thomas Bancroft was "a man of substance," he was a leading spirit in the community. He was drawn as a "juror of trials" in 1666, 1669, 1672, 1674, and 1681, and of the Essex grand jury in 1674, 1675, 1679, 1680, and in 1681. He was appointed constable for Lynn in 1681. These facts are found in the "Records and Files of the Quarterly Courts of Essex County, Mass." He acted also as appraiser of estates of deceased persons.

Thomas Bancroft was claimant of land due the soldier

wrote as follows concerning these appointments:

"The early colonial records are very meagre in the matter of personal facts, and it is not possible for us here to determine which of the references appearing in the military series belong to Thomas¹ Bancroft, the first settler, and which belong to his son, Thomas² Bancroft. The early records do not furnish any proof that the first Thomas Bancroft was either chosen as a Lieutenant for Reading or Lynn or served in any such capacity. The Thomas Bancroft who made the return of men impressed in Reading in 1675, and the Thomas Bancroft who sent in his resignation as an Ensign in 1679 may have been the first Thomas Bancroft, but his son Dea. Thomas Bancroft, born in 1649, who is stated in the History of Reading to have been an officer in King Philip's War, may have been the man to whom these references belong.

"Bodge's 'Soldiers of King Philip's War' does not furnish any proof that either the first Thomas or the second Thomas was an officer in 1675, although a Thomas Bancroft is credited with ten shillings, ten pence, presumably for service in garrison at Groton.

"The Thomas Bancroft, Sr., named as having been chosen Lieutenant of a Lynn company in 1689, could hardly have been the first Thomas Bancroft, as the latter would have been sixty-seven years of age, somewhat beyond the period of active service. As he in turn had a son Thomas, who was born in 1673, it is possible that the suffix 'Sr.' was applied to him for that reason. The Thomas Bancroft, Jr., of Reading, who was appointed Lieutenant in August 1689, could not have been the first Thomas by reason of the suffix given him, and certainly could not have been the third Thomas Bancroft.'

grantee Nicholas Lum (Lunn), which was drawn by Samuel Lampson. (Bodge, "King Philip's War," p. 424.)

In the desperate attacks made by the Indians upon the settlements north, west, and east of Old Dunstable, Lieut. Bancroft and his men did heroic and telling service. In "Magnalia Christi Americana" (vol. 2, p. 605), Rev. Cotton Mather states that on 5 July 1690 the Indians set upon Capt. Hilton's garrison in Exeter, and Lieut. Bancroft, then posted at Exeter, with the loss of a few of his men, relieved them. He led such a vicious charge upon the Indians that they fled without scalping the fallen.

Other service of a different character was given by him. On 11 May 1691 Lieut. Thomas Bancroft was appointed guardian of Abigail Stimpson, and John Bancroft, his brother, was made guardian of Jonathan Stimpson. (Middlesex County Probate Records.)

He acquired land in Reading, as the many transactions recorded in the Middlesex County deeds show. Some of this land he later gave to his son Thomas³ Bancroft.

The will of Thomas² Bancroft, dated 15 Jan. 1713 and entered for probate 8 July 1718, bequeaths: To his wife Sarah the western half of his dwelling, use of garden, 30 shillings, three cords of "good sizable firewood ready cut," his son Thomas to deliver it annually, fifty shillings and two cords of wood to be delivered by his son Raham annually, five pounds sterling and four cords of wood annually to be delivered by his son Samuel, said Samuel constantly to provide a suitable horse to his mother "to ride to meeting on" or for other occasional use, his household stuff and goods (not especially bequeathed to others) until her decease, when they are to go to three daughters, Sarah Briant, Judith Parker, and Elizabeth Lampson. To his son Thomas all his upland, meadow land, and swamp, northerly from his lower lot. To daughter Judith Parker six pounds sterling; to son-in-law Jonathan Parker seven (?) shillings. To son Raham fourteen acres of land originally purchased from Samuel Parker, eight acres of his upper lot, Raham to pay his sister Sarah Briant nine pounds sterling, and to Mehitable Briant 30 shillings. To son Samuel all the farming utensils, his homestead in Reading, with its meadows, plow-lands and pasture lands, a certain wood lot, he to pay to his sister Elizabeth Lampson 14 pounds, and to pay to "grandson Jonathan Bancroft" 30 shillings. His history books to be divided equally by his sons Thomas, Raham, and Samuel. His wearing apparel, "excepting my best cloak," equally to the sons, his divinity books, "not including my Bible with Clark's annotations," equally to be divided among his six children, his neat cattle, horses, and "other dumb creatures," money and Provincial bills of credit to be used to pay his debts, funeral charges for himself and his

wife, his sons to make up any lack. To his son Thomas his best cloak and his Bible with Clark's annotations. The will was witnessed by John Goadwin, Jonathan Poole, John Wesson and Ebenezer Bancroft. (Middlesex Probate Records, vol. 15, pp. 206–210.)

John Bancroft joined the church at Reading 1 Sept. 1677, his first wife, Elizabeth Eaton, joined 21 Apr. 1678, and his second wife, Hannah (Wayte) (Buckman) (Hasey) Bancroft was dismissed from the church at Malden, Mass., to the

First Parish Church at Reading, which she joined 14 Nov. 1714.

In the *Essex Antiquarian*, vol. 2, p. 56, is a reference to the organization of Lynnfield, and it is stated that on January 16, 1711, a meeting was held at Capt. John Bancroft's house of the inhabitants of Lyn Farms, so-called, and organized a precinct, and ordered a meeting house, and John Bancroft was one of the committee of three to set bounds of the precinct. (See also Wellman's Lynnfield, p. 61.)

John Bancroft bought 20 acres of land of Ann Collins and her son Henry on December 30, 1687, adjoining land of his father, Thomas¹ Bancroft, Sr. (Registry of Deeds, Salem, vol. 10, p. 118.)

Capt. Ebenezer Bancroft was a weaver and husbandman, and lived in Lynn. He owned a grist mill on Bates brook, purchased in 1713.

In Wellman's "History of Lynnfield," Mrs. Parsons states that among the papers which were in the original Thomas Bancroft homestead were 19 deeds bearing dates ranging from 1693 to 1714 and having the name of Ebeneezer, some times called Captain Ebeneezer, upon them. Twice his brother John's name is associated with his as joint purchaser.

He inherited the homestead of his father, but sold it and removed to Lynnfield.

He was the tenth man who commanded the Reading Infantry Company.

infant Republic. "My wife," Mr. Barron once said to the writer, "belongs to your real American aristocracy although her family has not lived in America for a hundred and thirty years." In Mrs. Barron he found an enthusiastic helper in his chosen studies. Mrs. Barron and one daughter, Yolande Wilmot Philipse Barron, survive him.

A more truly lovable man than Oswald Barron never existed, with the soul of a poet, the mind of a scholar, and the heart of a little child; his life was passed in the drab materialistic London of today, but his real self lived in an older and a better world. Each year in his short vacation he fled to what was left, of what to him, was reality—to Avignon, Avalon and Rocamadour—those relics of a colorful and a storied past, of an age when faith mattered more than money and honour more than material prosperity. The shock of the new world war killed him as truly as if he had been slain in action, and with his passing the writer has lost a friend, a man who loved truth and beauty and knowledge for themselves alone and whose sturdy honesty abhorred all false sham and pretense; and whose fine humanities adorned a great gentleman.

This sketch of Oswald Barron cannot be dosed better than by a quotation from an article of his on heraldry in *The Ancestor* which reveals the true soul of the writer:

"For us at least the study of the use of arms in its native age, an age which has passed utterly away, is all that remains for the student of armory. By such study we shall add in some measure to the knowledge of the history of our land and looking away from a grey and ordered time we shall delight our eyes with the fantastic beauty of that true armory, chief the tirewoman to those dead years which once went in scarlet with ornaments of gold on their apparel."

David Bancroft moved to Worcester, bought forty acres in County Gore on 25 Nov. 1742, and settled in that part of the town later set off as the town of Ward, and now the town of Auburn. He was ensign or second lieutenant in Colonel Chandler's company, which marched to Sheffield in August 1757, but was soon disbanded. Prominent in town affairs, he served as hog reeve, fence viewer, tithingman, constable, petit juror, school committeeman, surveyor of highways, collector of taxes, juror, warden, defender of a suit brought against the town, chairman in 1774 of a committee of the town to prepare instructions for representatives in the General Court and to the delegate to the Provincial Congress, member of the standing committee of the town in 1774, and of the committee on inspection in 1775, and delegate to the Provincial Congress which met at Watertown, Mass., 31 May 1775. (See Lincoln's "History of Worcester," pp. 100–101; Worcester Town Records, 1753–1783, pp. 203–306.) He was elected from Worcester a member of the Third Provincial Congress, 26 Jan. 1774.

The will of David Bancroft, dated 15 Dec. 1781, was allowed 6 May 1782, Timothy Bancroft, a son, being appointed executor. John Prentice and Jonas Nichols were sureties. 26. JOHN⁴ BANCROFT (*Timothy*,³ John,² Thomas¹), born at Lunenburg, Mass., 14 Nov. 1753 (Lunenburg Vital Records), died at Union, Broome Co., N. Y., 16 June 1822. He married at Lynn, Mass., 20 June 1776, MARY NEWHALL, who died at Union 26 Oct. 1833, daughter of Elijah and Mary (Cheever) Newhall.

At three years of age John Bancroft was taken to Lynn, where he lived with his uncle John Bancroft (No. 8), to whom he was afterwards bound out. (See "Lynn in the Revolution," by Howard Kendall Sanderson, 1909, vol. 1, p. 200.)

John Bancroft moved to Rindge, N. H., in 1777, according to Stearns' "History of Rindge," and in 1820 settled at Union.

EBENEZER⁴ BANCROFT (*Timothy*,³ Ebenezer,² Thomas¹), of Tyngsborough, Mass., farmer, justice of the peace, town clerk, selectman, and a member of important committees in the affairs of the town, born in that part of Dunstable now Tyngsborough 1 Apr. 1738, died 22 Sept. 1827, from the effects of a fall which broke a thigh bone, and was buried under arms in the Old South Cemetery at Nashua, N. H. He married, 5 May 1758, HANNAH FLETCHER, daughter of Dea. Joseph Fletcher of Dunstable (See Fletcher Genealogy).

He was chairman of a committee which, on 8 June 1776, reported to the town strong resolutions, unanimously adopted by the town, for declaring independence of Great Britain (Nason's Dunstable, pp. 119 and 290).

In 1755 Ebenezer Bancroft entered the Provincial Army at the time of the French War, participating in five campaigns.

He was appointed an ensign in Capt. John Alford Tyng's company, Col. Eleazar Tyng's regiment, on 16 Aug. 1757, a lieutenant in Capt. Silas Brown's company on 14 Feb. 1760, a captain of a company in Colonel Bridges' regiment on 19 May 1775 (commission signed by Joseph Warren, president *pro tem.*), and a captain of the same company under "the Congress of the United Colonies" on 1 July 1775 (commission

signed by John Hancock, President), major of the Seventh Regiment of Middlesex Militia, Colonel Spalding, on 14 Feb. 1776 (commission signed "by the major part of the Council"), and lieutenant colonel of the Seventh Regiment of Middlesex County, on 1 July 1781 (commission signed by John Hancock, Governor). Under this commission he was in command of the troops from Middlesex County stationed in Rhode Island in 1781.

On 16 June 1775 his company was ordered out with the detachment to take possession of the heights of Charlestown. A thrilling account of the Battle of Bunker Hill as narrated by Colonel Bancroft and printed in "Old Dunstable," J. B. Hill, pp. 58–66, is well worth reading.

A ball from the *Somerset* passed so close to the colonel that it caused the total loss of sight in his left eye, and a bullet cut off the forefinger of his left hand. For his injuries his name was placed on the pension roll by the following resolve:

"Resolve entitling Ebenezer Bancroft, Esq., to quarter pay: passed January 26, 1776, on the representation of John Lucas, Commissioner of Continental pensions, in behalf of Ebenezer Bancroft, Esq., late a captain in Col. Ebenezer Bridges Regiment, and who was wounded in the battle on the heights at Charlestown, on the 17th of June, 1775.

"Resolved, that the said Ebenezer Bancroft, Esq., is entitled to quarter pay beginning the first day of January, 1776."

The pension was paid to him by Massachusetts until Congress passed the law granting pensions to invalids, for wounds received in the service in the Revolutionary War. His name was then transferred to the Pension Roll of the United States and continued to the close of his life.

Ebenezer Bancroft was in the Battle of Bennington, and commanded the guard which conducted the Hessian troops taken prisoners in that battle to Cambridge; he was also a major in the regiment commanded by Colonel Brooks, afterwards Governor of Massachusetts, in the battle of White Plains, and continued in the service until the close of the war.

Colonel Bancroft's Revolutionary record is given in the Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War, as follows: "Captain, serving as volunteer, Captain Reuben Butterfield's Co., Col. David Green's Reg., which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775, to Cambridge; also Col. Ebenezer Bridges' (Middlesex Co.) Reg.; list of officers to be commissioned May 27, 1775; also receipt of commission dated Watertown, May 27, 1775; also muster roll dated August 1, 1775; enlisted April 24, 1775, service 3 mos., 15 days; also company return dated September 25, 1775; also second major, Col. Simeon Spalding's (7th Middlesex Co.) Reg.; official record of a ballot by the House of Representatives dated June 20, 1778; chosen and appointed June 20, 1777; also Lieut. Col., Col. Cyprian How's (Middlesex county) Reg.; served from June 28, 1780, to October 30, 1780, four months, eight days, at Rhode Island; marched to reinforce Continental Army; also pay abstract for rations dated Camp Buttshill, October 31, 1780."

One day while ploughing in a field directly opposite his house he several times struck what appeared to be a large rock. He dismissed his man and went to dinner. After dinner he went to the field with bar and shovel, and dug about the stone and finally raised it. Underneath was a pot of money in gold. How it came there is unknown and how much it contained is unknown; but it is known that he gave each of his daughters a large farm when she married.

Capt. James Bancroft was one of the earliest settlers of the tract known as Monadnock No. 6. He bought 416 acres of land from Benjamin French, paying therefor with one pair of steers. By 1774 he had twenty acres of land cleared, fourteen more cut over, and had erected a "board house."

He was a prominent man in the affairs of the town, his name

being found frequently in the records of the town proprietors. His service in the war of the American Revolution was loval and important. He was one of twenty-seven men from Packersfield who marched 21 Apr. 1775, under Lt. Abijah Brown, to Cambridge, Mass., on the Lexington Alarm: he signed the "Association Test" in April 1776; he was a member of the Committee of Safety elected 17 Sept. 1776, and as such arrested Maj. Breed Batchelder, the richest man in town, charged with dislovalty.

In 1776 Captain Bancroft was recruiting officer at Packersfield. He was sergeant in Capt. John Mellin's company. Col. Enoch Hale's regiment, which marched from Fitzwilliam and adjoining towns to reinforce the garrison at Ticonderoga on the alarm in June 1777; he was a member of the company of Capt. James Lewis, in Colonel Hale's regiment, which marched from New Hampshire and joined the Continental Army at Rhode Island in August 1777, marching 130 miles; he was chairman of a committee in 1777 to elect a representative to the General Court from Packersfield, Stoddard, Washington, and Gilsum.

When James Bancroft lived at Rockingham, Vt., he was certified as a member of the Protestant Episcopal Church.

I., and after remaining there a few days marched to Rhode Island (the island); that he was in the battle under General Sullivan, retreated to Providence after the battle, thence to Hudson river above New York, thence into New Jersey to Rahway and Woodbridge, where they were stationed during the winter guarding the line while the Continental troops were in winter guarters. The enemy lay at Perth Amboy and came out before he was dismissed, there was a battle, the enemy being driven back. Bancroft's reliability was vouched for by Rev. Gad Newell and Samuel Scripture, and the pension of $\pounds 23$ 33s. was granted 9 Jan. 1834, to be paid annually.

GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN ENGLAND

THE GURDON FAMILY

[Concluded from Volume 94, page 370]

At the commencement of the fifteenth century Simon Gurdon, Robert Gurdon, and John Gurdon were living at Dedham, co. Essex, England.

SIMON GURDON, of Dedham, perhaps a brother of Robert Gurdon, living 6 Oct. 1410, when, with his wife CHRISTIAN, he took up the north end of Dedham Hall with easement in the hall and garden below the hall on the north and west (REGISTER,† vol. 92, p. 383). As the name of Simon Gurdon disappears from the court rolls at this time, it is supposed that he died soon after 1410.

ROBERT GURDON, of Dedham, perhaps a brother of Simon Gurdon, died probably between 1440 and 1450. He married ALICE , who died in 1420-1 (*ibid.*, p. 385).

The name of Robert Gurdon appears in the court rolls as early as 1408 (*ibid.*, p. 382) and as late as November 1439 (*ibid.*, p. 385), but following the gap in these records from 1440 to 1457, it disappears.

1. JOHN GURDON (? Robert), of Dedham, whose hame appears in the court roll as early as 8 Nov. 1407 (*ibid.*, p. 382), and by inference as late as 1451/2, when John Gurdon, Jr., ‡ is mentioned (vol.

"Samuel^[6] Bancroft came here with his father and brothers and sisters, who all shortly afterwards returned to their old home in Massachusetts, except Hannah and Jeremiah. The former married John Starrett, of Granville, and the latter settled near Round Hill." ("History of the County of Annapolis," Calnek and Savary, p. 47.) Calnek states in his manuscript record (of which a copy is in the Library of the New England Historic Genealogical Society): "They were highly respected members of the communities in which they have domiciled, as they have always maintained a character for industry, honesty, loyalty and religious deportment."

He was cited in the New Hampshire Committee's report of men able to bear arms as being over 16 and not in the army.

On 26 Oct. 1813 Susannah Bancroft, widow, petitioned the probate court of Essex County to appoint her son James Bancroft administrator of the estate of her son Charles Bancroft of Amesbury, victualler, who had died intestate. In November following Caleb Bancroft of Reading, "gentleman," informed the Court that James Bancroft, veoman, late of Amesbury, and at that time a resident of South Hampton, Rockingham Co., N. H., was apparently a decided lunatic, and requested permission to bring suit against the bondsman.

The heirs to the estate of Charles⁶ Bancroft included Hannah Bancroft (a daughter), Susannah Bancroft (his mother), Thomas Bancroft (represented by Samuel Bancroft, his guardian), Betty Upton, wife of Elijah Upton, and Fanny, who had married Samuel S. Merrill. The estate was appraised at \$1829.41. The deceased had borrowed from his brothers Samuel and John. (Essex County Probate Records, file No. 1613.)

Edward Payson Bancroft moved with his family in 1834 to Michigan, where he studied medicine with Dr. B. G. Ellis at Clinton and attended medical lectures at the Michigan State University at Ann Arbor, from 1849 to 1851. After practicing medicine at Chelsea, Mich., until the fall of 1856, he moved to Emporia, Kans., in February 1857, and engaged in the real estate business.

He was elected Secretary of State in 1858 and State Senator in 1860. 61. DANIEL⁶ BANCROFT (Thomas,⁵ Thomas,⁴ Thomas,³ Thomas,² Thomas¹), of Reading, Worcester, and Salem, Mass., noted architect, born at Reading 15 Dec. 1745,* died of "typhus fever" 2 June 1818. He married at Salem, 14 Aug. 1770, HANNAH SYMONDS, born in 1749 and probably baptized 26 Mar. 1749, died 16 Aug. 1820 (Salem Vital Records), daughter of Benjamin and Hannah Symonds.

Daniel Bancroft was the leading architect of Salem, where he had settled as early as 1791, and examples of his work still command the admiration of students and others interested in architecture.

He designed the famous Derby Mansion, the house of Aaron Waite (built in 1789–1790), a description of which may be found in "The Colonial Architecture of Salem," 1919, Frank Cousins and Phil M. Riley, and the court house which was built in 1785 and torn down in 1839. (See "The Story of Essex County," Fuess, vol. 2, p. 1082, for a description.)

Daniel Bancroft died intestate and on 7 July 1818 his son Daniel was appointed administrator of the estate, by request of Hannah, the widow, who declined to accept the appointment as administratrix. The inventory of the estate showed that the mansion house and land on Lynn Street were valued at \$12,000; the dwelling and land on County Street, \$2,000: one-fifth of the land south of the burying vard at Northfield. \$40; and one pew in the Baptist church, \$50. The personal estate was placed at \$616.50, and included books on architecture, \$8.00; and books on divinity. \$2.00.

On 20 Apr. 1787 an agreement between Benjamin Bancroft, father of Abel, and widow Sarah Bancroft, was accepted, containing the provision that Benjamin should make no demand upon her for any notes of hand Abel died possessed of and to indemnify her for all demands brought against the estate, contracted for the tanyard owned by Benjamin. Sarah agreed to release Benjamin from any claim for labor by Abel or for any stock then in the tanyard, and to make no demand for the tanyard books. The final report was made as of 21 Oct. 1794.

James Bancroft, AEt. 47. A man of a natural sound understanding he served with reputation in the American army during the revolutionary war, and has now left several depending orphan children and aged parents to deplore his loss, and that support to which he contributed more from duty and principle than from his scanty pecuniary abilities."

> James Bancroft was commissioned ensign in Colonel Bridges' regiment in May 1775, and was present at the Battle of Bunker Hill and the Siege of Boston; was commissioned lieutenant in M. Jackson's (Eighth) regiment 12 May 1780, and served through the War. He then settled in Boston and was a grocer in Back Street (Boston Directory for 1789), and for some years prior to his death was an inspector of customs in that city, being so listed in the Boston Directory in 1796 and 1798. it in 1301-under Sir Marmaduke de Thweng, one of the co-heirs to the barony of Kendal (Lancs. Final Concords [Rec. Soc. Lancs. and Cheshire,] vol. 1, p. 214), yet before Robert's death this Thweng overlordship had been eliminated: for in 1324 it is recorded that the property had then lately been held by "Robert de Wessington, tenant-in-chief, deceased," directly of the King in capite as of the earldom of Lancaster (Cal. Ings., vol. VI, p. 357). Possibly the explanation lies in the fact that Robert (as the writer's own researches prove) was closely associated throughout his life with Sir Marmaduke de Thweng, whom he attended with great gallantry as personal Esquire in the Scottish campaigns:⁷³ and Sir Marmaduke may well have released Robert and his descendants from the feudal obligations due from the manor of Carnforth, as a partial reward for these long and faithful services.

At three years of age, Carlos Bancroft lost both parents, and was brought up by Arthur Daggett of East Montpelier. iest man in his native town and at the time of his decease owned land not only in Danbury but in several towns of Litchfield Co." * By the slate stone still standing over his grave at Danbury he "departed this life May 11, 1763 ae 56 yrs. 6 m. 21 days". About five years after he sold the Abington land for £5,000 he gave to the First Church of Danbury a handsome solid silver baptismal bowl eleven inches in diameter of artistic design, and bearing the date of Aug. 25, 1753. Already his only child, Nathan Starr, who had graduated in 1750 at Yale College, had died, unmarried, 9 June, 1752, aged 19 years 9 months 3 days. By will dated 11 May 1763 Comfort Starr of Danbury, Conn., gave to his wife, Hannah Starr, among other property his "two negro children, Pegg and Fanny". She married again. After her death in 1791 his large estate went to near relatives, except £30 left by his will to Rev. Eleazer Wheelock's "Indian School" (which six years later in 1769 became Dartmouth College) and £800 for the support of a classical school teaching "Latin and Greek" at Danbury.

Moses Bancroft was born in the old homestead of Joseph Bancroft, his father, where he lived until about fourteen years old, when he went to learn the blacksmith's trade at Grassy Hill in Millbury. After the birth of his first child he moved to Millbury, where he lived with his father for about a year before settling in Vermont. The present investigation of the life of Seth⁵ Paine of Lebanon, Conn., and Paines Hollow, N. X., has disclosed many facts regarding him which were unknown to any one now living. This new material consisted of the ancestral line of Seth Payne, his record as a soldier in the response to the Lexington Alarm, and proof that his mother was Mary Brewster, a descendant of William¹ Brewster of the Mayflower, that Seth and his family were born in Lebanon, the names of his sixteen children, the correct parentage of his many grandchildren, the fact that his children married into families of Windham County and Tolland County, Conn., that Seth was descended from Moses¹ Paine of Braintree, Mass., although many of the Paine families in central and western New York State descended from Stephen¹ Paine of Rehoboth, Mass., and that Seth, at the age of 13, was one of the "heirs of Benjamin", his deceased father.
