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The Pedigree of the Family of Biscoe.

ARMS.—The earliest instance that I have noticed of the use of arms by this family is to be found on the seal to the Will of John Biscoe, 1687 (see page 16). The coat which he bore was, *Three greyhounds in pale, courant*. Crest: *A greyhound, courant, seizing a hare*. These arms also appear on the monument of Vincent John Biscoe, 1770 (see page 9), the field being *argent*, and the charges *sable*. Under the grant of 1830 (see page 8), the Biscoe Family of Holton bore until 1866, Quarterly—1 and 4 (BISCOE), *Paly of six, or and vert, three greyhounds current, in pale ermine, each gorged with a collar gold*; 2 and 3 (EARLE), *Quarterly gules and argent, three escallops, two and one, within a bordure engrailed, counterchanged*. Crest: *On a mount, vert, in front of an oak-tree, a greyhound current, proper, collared or, seizing a hare, also proper*. At the last-mentioned date, the representative of this branch of the family, on assuming by Royal Licence the name of Biscoe, in place of his patronymic Tyndale, was allowed to bear the arms of BISCOE as in the previous grant, quartering TYNDALE: *Argent, on a fesse gules between three garbs sable, a martlet or*.

OTHER BISCOES.—There was another family of this name living in Colchester from about the beginning of the seventeenth century, and a somewhat extensive family of Biscoes reside in the North-Eastern suburbs of London, whither they came from Hertfordshire. I have made no attempt to trace the history of these two lines.

NEW ENGLAND.—I believe that in the United States of America there are still some Biscoes who descend from Nathaniel, the emigrant (see page 5). Bond's 'History of Watertown' gives, in narrative form, some account of this the senior branch of the family.

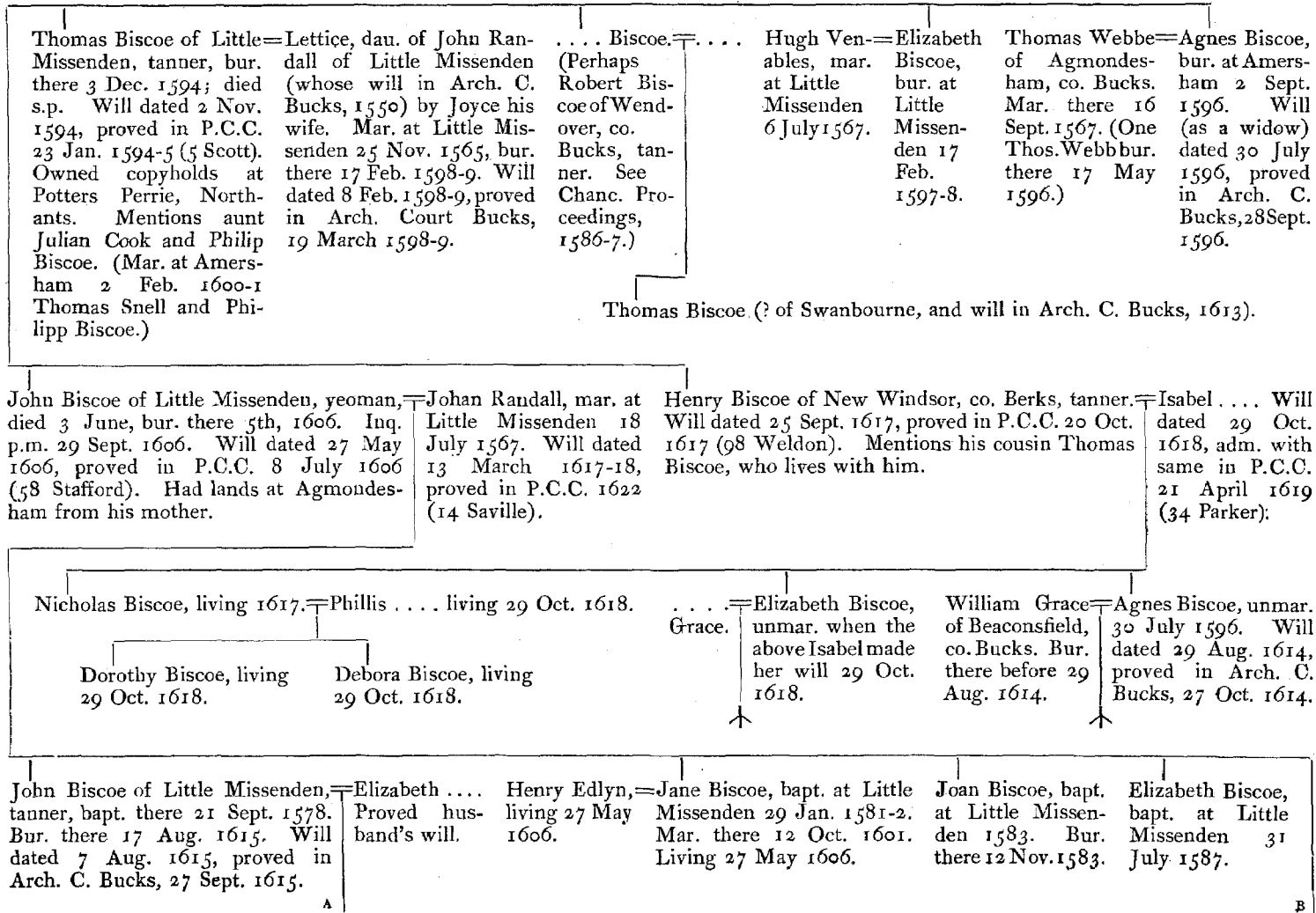

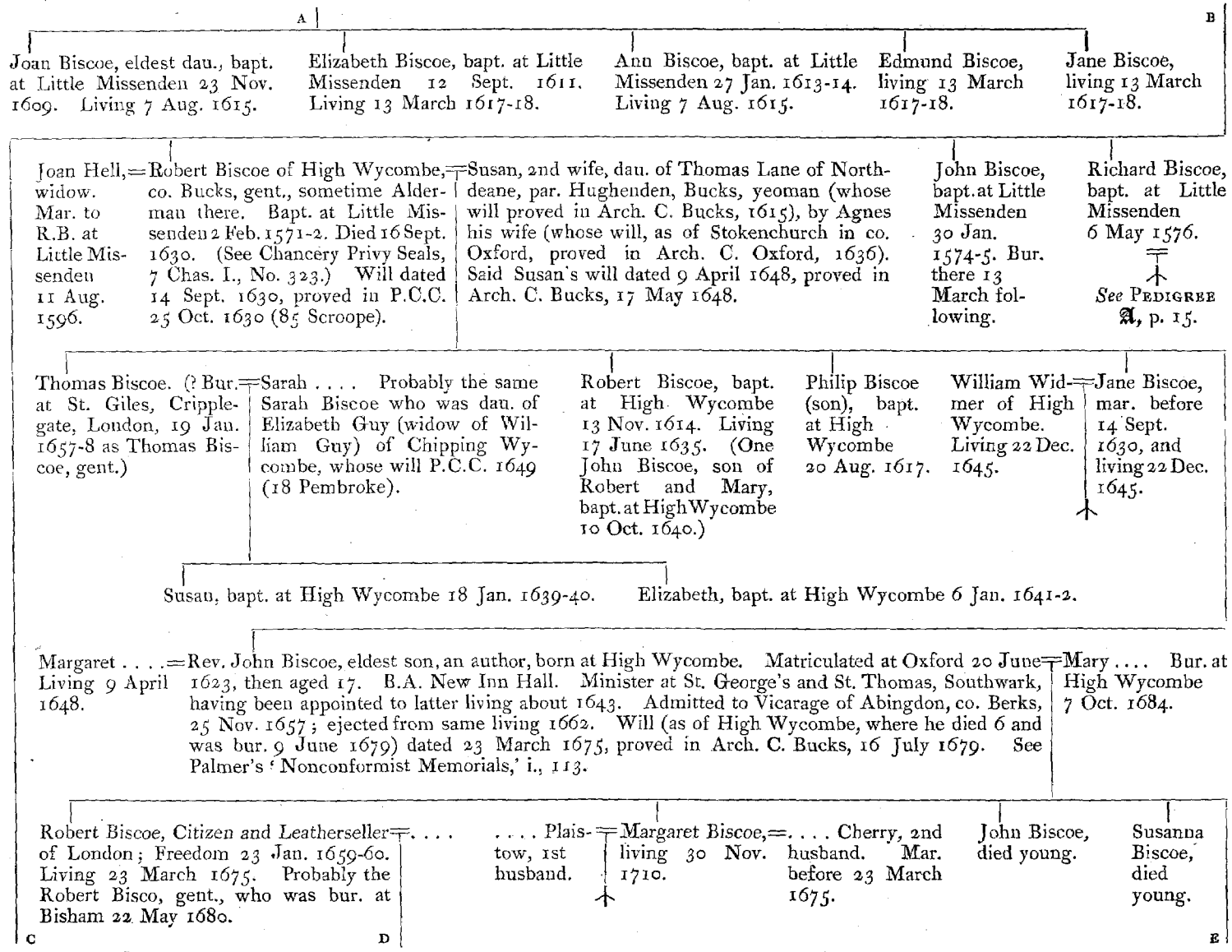

Pedigree of Biscoe of Little Missenden.

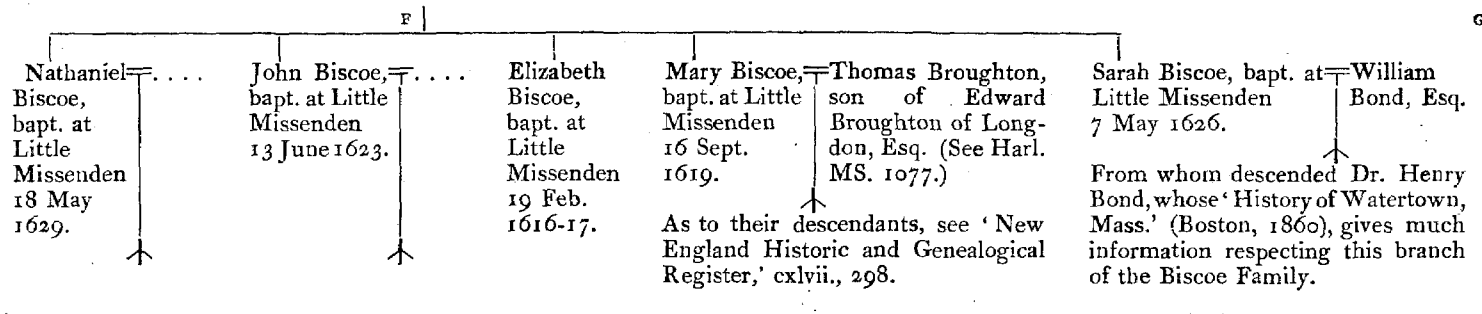
