#### INTRODUCTION

The genealogy here presented is an attempt to trace in both the male and female lines the descendants of Joseph and Mary (Waite) Bartlett, of whom our first knowledge is the record of their marriage on Oct. 27, 1668, in that part of Cambridge, Mass., that was known as Cambridge Village and later became Newton, Mass.

The present volume has been confined to the first seven generations of their descendants although some information of later generations is available. This has been done for the reason that it is hoped that the present volume will stimulate sufficient interest to produce more adequate information concerning the later generations and provide opportunity for corrections and additions to the present volume in the event that a supplement is published.

The burden of supplying this information must rest with the readers of these pages who have the necessary information, and they are requested to send such information to the writer.

Attention is called to the fact that there were over twenty Bartlett families in New England prior to the year 1700 (see "The Bartlett Family of Weymouth" by Edward Everett Bartlett), and there is little or no information indicating any relationship between these early families. Furthermore the 1790 Census contains the names of over 380 "Bartlett" heads of families, with a total count of over 2,100 members. This is some evidence of the difficulties encountered in compiling this genealogy, and indicates the possibility for errors.

The foregoing facts are cited in order to correct what seems to be a more or less prevalent impression, that all persons of the name "Bartlett" originate from a common ancestor, either in America or England. That this is probably far from the truth is further evidenced by a communication by George Grazebrook, Esq., F.S.A., entitled "Bookplate and Seal of Bartlett of Marldon,

St. Mary's Church, Devon," which was published in Miscellanea Genealogica et Heraldica, London, 1888, Vol. 2, Second Series, p. 294, from which the following extract is taken:

The surname "Bartlett," being a diminutive of Bartholomew, could not have originated earlier than towards the end of the fourteenth century, and such a name would lead to just what we find, viz., many families in different districts bearing the name but in no way connected, they having arisen from so many separate individual ancestors, who happened at that date to bear the name Bartholomew. The Barttelots of Stopham must have acquired their surname from some other source, as Walter Barttelot and Adam Barttelot are mentioned in Subsidy Rolls so early as 1295.

As appears to have been the case with many of the colonists, we do not know anything about the parents of Joseph Bartlett. It would appear that he probably came to this country as a lone immigrant. If one were to speculate on the subject of his origin, however, it is noticed that his wife, Mary Waite, appears to have been a native of Rhode Island. There was a John Bartlett, who was residing in Weymouth, Mass., in 1666, and who removed to Mendon, where in 1670, he sold his home lot to John Sprague, and then removed to Cumberland, R. I. James Sprague, great grandson of John Sprague, married Mary Bartlett of Newton, Mass. (52). The Spragues were related to a Bartlett family of Fordington St. George, Dorset Co., Eng. (see "The Spragues of Malden" by George Walter Chamberlain).

Furthermore, the Bartlett, Ballou, Jenks and Sprague families of Cumberland and vicinity were connected by marriage and later generations removed to Brookfield, Mass., and to Winchester and Richmond, N. H., where we find later generations of the Bartlett family of Newton, Mass. These circumstances are probably nothing more than a coincidence, but they give rise to the possibility of a relationship between John Bartlett of Cumberland, R. I., and Joseph Bartlett of Newton, Mass., as well as a possible connection with the Bartlett family of Fordington, St. George.

The information from which this compilation has been prepared is found almost exclusively in published vital records, local histories and genealogies. It is regretted that lack of published records of some of the towns has made it impossible to complete the information of some of the families. It is hoped that this deficiency can be supplied by some of the readers of these pages and the information published at some time in the future.

Acknowledgment is made of the helpful and efficient service rendered the writer by the New England Historic Genealogical Society in supplying the sources of information not available in the library of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania.

#### FIRST GENERATION

1 Joseph Bartlett, was born about 1630, as appears from his deposition, dated Dec., 1681, taken in Middlesex County, Mass., Court. He died Dec. 26, 1702. The first recorded information found is his marriage to Mary Waite, on Oct. 27, 1668, in the Cambridge and Newton, Mass., Vital Records. He resided in that part of Cambridge, Mass., that later was known as Newton, Mass. His wife died Dec. 21, 1721. I have been unable to establish her parentage. The Magazine of American Genealogy No. 24, p. 197, says she is the daughter of Richard and Elizabeth Waite of Boston, but testimony in Supreme Court files No. 4565, given by Hannah Bartlett, wife of Joseph Bartlett, Jr., in 1697, indicates that her home was in Rhode Island.

With respect to the life of Joseph Bartlett, Francis Jackson in his History of Newton, Mass. (1854), says, "The cellar hole of his dwelling house is still visible upon the side of the hill occupied by the Baptist Theological Seminary and about ninety rods south-east of the new railroad station at Newton Center."

The early married life of our ancestor seems to have had its rough spots for the Middlesex County Court files disclose the following document:

25 Dec. 1671, Bartlett for Aprill Court. 1672.

Joseph Barlet 25.10.71, appearing before mee and by his owne confession convicted of uncivil & rude cariages towards his—wife (——?) & living out of his family day & night to ye great disgrace thereof, both by testimony ye informed, & his own confession with promise of admendment, is ordered to appeare at next Court at Cambr and to bring testimony of his performance of his promise (——?).

In the published Cambridge Town Records the following appears under date of Mar. 3, 1673:

the Information given by those heere under written of the pore and low Condition of Joseph bartlit

thease are to Certific our honored Captaine and the Rest of the selectmen of Cambrigd that according to your order wee have bine with Joseph bartlit and doe finde him in very poore Condition having noe house and very bad in Respect of foode and Rayment and thearfor if you would be pleased to Allow five pounds It may be a Comfortable supply to helpe to build him A house and A helpe to supply his presents wants.

A Coppy of the Request of the selectmen sent to the Reverent Elder wiswall and Mr Nehamiah hubbard preacher at the second Church at Cambrigd.

Upon Information of the pore and low Condition of Joseph bartlit and his family whoe is an Inhabitant of this towne and particularly hath his Residence among you wee thought It expendiente: heereby to desire and move you to speake to the Congregation upon the saboth day about his condition and to move them to make a Contribution towards his Releefe the saboth day folling wee shall alsoe move our pasture to speake to our Congregation to doe the like, and the Reason of our proceding in this way is because theare is nothing to be spared out of the towne Rate for his Releefe; and wee finde this way most feasable to accomplish the end having latly made a probation thearof for the Releefe of one John Coller, a poore family on this side soe committing you to God, wee Remaine your loving friends and Neighbours.

dated at Cambrigd Mar. th12, 1673.

It is interesting to note that a granddaughter of the John Coller, mentioned in the foregoing letter, Sybilla Coller, married Joseph Bartlett, a grandson of the foregoing Joseph Bartlitt.

The answer to the foregoing petition of the selectmen is found in the Town Records under date of May 12, 1673, which contain the following entry:

our breatheren and Neighbours have subscribed to give to Joseph bartlit for his Releefe fower pound one shilling on the south side of the River.

It is apparent from the following document found in the Middlesex County Court files, that Joseph Bartlett made immediate use of the money provided by his fellow townsmen.

To the Constable of Muddy River (Brookline)

you are hereby required in his maiesties name to Attach the goods, or for want ther of, the body of John

Clarke, living within your Precincts, & the Bond of him wth sureties to the vallew of thirty pounds for his appearance before the next county court holden at Cambridge the first teusday in Apprill next & there to Answer the Complaint of Joseph Bartlett of Cambrin an action of the Case for pulling down—taking away ye timber thereof, & carying—a load of Barke all done upon the land—said Bartlett lying with in Cambridge Bounds, Bounded upon Hugh Clarke east Noah wiswall south & the highway west & Hugh Clarke afforsaid north; and for dammage thereby Sustaigned to the vallew of Sixtine pounds; herof faile not at your perill, & you are to mak Returne herof under your hand at the Said Court datted this 25th day of the 1st month 1673.

The County Court records also contain summons to Jonathan Hide, Samuel Hide, Job Hide, Daniel Mackey, Sarah Gates, of Cambridge and Susannah Woodward of Boston, issued 31 March, 1673, to appear at the next county court held in Cambridge, "in a case depending Between Joseph Bartlett of Cambridge and John Clarke of Muddy River."

Among the papers in the case are found the following depositions:

I being an very pore man and have not skill nor abillaty to plead my owne case nor have no body to plead for me: and am senseble of being much impovereshed by being molested upon the land which I bought of widow Smith of Watertown: as will apeer by evidence and have sufered much wrong: I doe humbly bechech this honred corte and Jurey that you wod consider my case.

The court evidently held a hearing of this case on April 1, 1673, for the records contain depositions by Jonathan Hides, Noeah Wiswall, Daniel Neall, Job Hides, Uriah Clark, James Prentice, Daniel Smith, Thomas Wilson, Henry Seager, Thomas Boylson, Job Croft, John Alexander, and Henry Steavens. The deposition of Henry Seager is given as follows:

Henery seager 24 years of age or tharabouts and Rosemon Drew aged 22 yeers or thar abouts these deponents testifieth that when they were agitting timber for Joseph bartlits house that John Clarke brought Noah Wiswall and Goodman Elexander and did ful warne them of coming upon the land or for medling up anything upon it; for sayd John Clarke if you set up a house I will pull it downe and sed Goodman elesandre fech away the timber if he had wood of it; or wheather you have wood of it or no fech it away; and further sayeth not.

Another document in the case is as follows:

We whose name are heareunto Subscribed being desired to judge: what damage Joseph Bartlet of Cambridge; Sustained by haveing his frame pulled downe; and his barke caried away; together with his being put oute of his busines, and haveing his prsent troubel; as also being disapoynted aboute his barke in paicing ye shoomaker; and runing up and downe in August last For to get warrants and ye like for ye receiving his right which he suposed was shaken by this Disturbance; and by his transporting his hay being two load; upon ye same acount as allso lost in ye title; which he had; all being considered we doe adjudge ye damage to amount to ye value of ten pounds; and have subscribed this first of Aprill 1673.

Joyned issue in the Case, and after full hearing of their pleas & evidences as they were by them presented in Court, the Jury brought in their verdict finding for the pt Damages nine pounds, & costs of Court, one pound fourten shillings & two pents

The defendt Appealed to ye next Court of Assists

& put in Security to execute ye same as followeth

John Clarke as Principal & Hugh Clarke as Surety do acknowledge themselves to stand bound Joyntly & Severally to the Clerk of ye Court, in ten pounds pd by them to be forfeited & pd

The Condition of this Recognizance is that the

said John Clark shall execute this his appeale.

What appears to be the final disposition of the case appears in the Court of Assistants Second Book, begun 3 Mar. 1673, as follows:

John Clarke plantiffe against Joseph Bartlet deffendant in an action of Appeale from the Judgement of the County Court at Cambridge in october last declaring his bond to be forfeited.

The Attachments Courts Judgments Reasons of Appeales & Ansrs wth the evidences in the cases produced being read & heard in these 4 actions both plaintiffs & deffendant Agred & Consented in open Court one wth another that the merrit of the whole Case that should have binn heard & tryed at the last Court of assistants in September should now be heard & as it fell so the costs & Damages should be and so the Case was Comitted to the jury who brought in their verdict they found for the plantiffs on the whole merrit of the Case reversion of the former Judgement & Costs of Courts five pounds fowerteen shillings & eight pence—1st Jr.

Time seems to be a great healer of such differences as the foregoing court records reveal, for Ebenezer Bartlett, a grandson of Joseph Bartlett, married Ann Clarke, a great great grand-daughter of the Hugh Clarke mentioned above.

The financial condition of Joseph Bartlett does not seem to have improved much in the next two years, as the following mortgage bears witness:

This Witnesseth that I Joseph Bartlet of Cambridge—Plantr do owe—Thomas Prentice Senr of the same Towne Ten pound Sterl. to be paid—At or before the last of May in the yeare—One thousand six hundred Seaventy and Seaven; and for further—Security I do mortgage—my now dwelling house and all land adjoining thereto,—foure acres—31 Mar. 1675.

In 1678, Joseph Bartlett signed a petition for the separation of Cambridge Village from Cambridge. The petition was granted in 1679, at which time there were sixty-five freemen in the town. In 1691, the name of the town was changed from Cambridge Village to New Town.

The next bit of information concerning Joseph Bartlett is ten years later, when the following appears in the Cambridge Town Records:

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of Cambridge the 21 May 1688.

It was then put to Vott whether the Inhabitants would sell a peece of land on ye south side ye river of about five accer on the south side ye River neere Joseph Bartlitts & John Clarks and it was votted on the affirmitive and the Inhabitants made Choyce of the selectmen, with Samuel Chamne and Daniel Chamne as a Committe to sell & set a price upon ye said land to those that buy the same: This 21 May 1688.

Wee the Comitte above Mentioned in pursuance of the above Written Vott, have bargained & sould, the above mentioned land unto the above adjacent Joseph Bartlet his heires and assignes, for foure pound tenn shillings in money, a high way excepted of foure rode wide whose westerly side bounds upon Capt. Noah wiswells land, which when the Country high way is

taken out the presell of land sould him will Containe about foure accer be it more or less, and being bounded on the East with John Clark and Joseph Bartlets lands, about south east with Cap Wiswell to a white Oake, and from that white oake it is bounded about South west, and the rest of the Country high way about west, and the rest of the peece of land is bounded with a highway & Cap. Thomas Prentice about northerly, we the aforesaid Comittee, have also agreed with the said Joseph Bartlet, that in Case the Adjacent Clarke will fence the one side of a rode wide highway thorow the tract of Land bought of the aforesaid Comitte then the said Bartlet is hereby ingaged to set him out one where may sut them both best, right Cross the land, from Clarks highway to the Country highway, and to the performance of the aforesaid premises we the comitte aforesaid in the behalf of the Town have set to our hands this Second day of March: 1690 the foure pound tenn shillings being first pd unto Mr Samuel Chamne.

This real estate venture does not seem to have been very successful, for under date of July 26, 1695, the town records state:

The Same time and day It was voted by the Inhabitants then Assembled, to Return unto Joseph Bartlett of Newtown the Sum of Money that the Town received of him about five yeares a gone, for a small percell of Land that was Sold him att that time about five yeares Since, and he makeing complaint that he Could not enjoy it quietly, the Inhabitants now met Voted on the Affirmative to return him his money again, and the Land to remain as before he bought it.

The transaction in this real estate deal seems to have been closed a little later for the Proprietors Records under date of Feb. 10, 16956, have the following entry:

The Selectmen then payd unto Joseph Bartlett of Newton for a preel of Land formerly Sold unto him, that he never was possessed of and he formerly payd for, the Sume of four pounds and ten Shillings in money to his Satisfaction, and for which he gave a Receipt, this Same day, as may appeare by his Receipt: under his hand.

In the New England Register, Vol. 31, p. 306, we find:

Little Cambridge Rates s d
Joseph Bartlett, one per:& estate 01 10
Sept. 5, 1688.

Jan. 1, 1700, the Selectmen and Inhabitants "Voted that the schoolhouse be set in the highway near to Joseph Bartlett's and that it be finished by the first of October, and agreed with John Staples to keep school one month, four days in a week for £1 4s."

The last bit of information that I have been able to find concerning Joseph Bartlett appears in the Probate Court files under date of Jan. 8, 1702/3. It is a letter of administration granted to "Joseph Bartlett eldest son of Joseph Bartlett, late of Newton."

I have been unable to find any clue to the parentage of Joseph Bartlett. His deposition in the Clark case given above would indicate that he came as a lone immigrant and was unrelated to any of the other Bartlett families who were residents of the country.



#### SECOND GENERATION

In the Middlesex County Court records, indexed under "Bartlett" was found the following settlement between Joseph and John Bartlett, with respect to their father's estate:

Joseph Barclet of Newton—Husbandman Son of Joseph Barclet of the Same place deceased—Know Ye That I—for—Eight pounds in money—paid—by my brother John Barclet of Newton—do—discharge the Sd Jno Barclet—and—do Sell—quit claim—unto the Sd Jno Barclet—all the Estate Right—Inheritance—which I—ever had now have or—ought to have—of in & to—the housing building Lands Orchards—which my father Joseph Barclet dyed Seizd'—of—being in Newton—also Half an acre of Upland on which the said Jno Barclet now dwells adjacent to the above granted premises."—24 Jan. 1716/7.

His wife Hannah releases her right dowry in the property.

Wit: Jonas Bond Thomas Learned Signed. Recorded 1722.

It is noted that the amount of the settlement is about onehalf of the appraised value of the estate as previously given and that the deed was not recorded until after the death of John Bartlett.

In the History of Bethel, Me., p. 21, it is stated that Joseph Bartlett "on his own right" appears on a list of petitioners for an allotment of land at Sudbury, now Bethel, Me. It will appear later that his son, Ebenezer, made a claim and received an allotment. The claim was on the basis of service in the "Expedition to Canada" in the year 1690.

3 SARAH BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., after 1676; died Oct. 29, 1767; married Dec. 20, 1708, Jonathan Willard. He was born about 1678; died Aug. 22, 1772, age 95. He was the son of Jacob and Mary (White) Willard of Watertown, Mass. According to the Willard Genealogy, Jacob Willard is believed to have been the son of George Willard, brother of the famous Simeon Willard. Jonathan Willard's mother, Mary White, was the daughter of Anthony and Grace (Hall) White. Her father, age 27, embarked at Ipswich, England, for New England, in April, 1634, and was a proprietor in Sudbury, Mass., in 1640.

Jonathan Willard was the pioneer Baptist of Newton. He joined the Baptist Church in Boston, Dec. 7, 1729, and his daughter Esther was baptised and joined the same church, May 7, 1732.

In 1722, Jonathan Willard purchased of Nathaniel Hubbard, of Dorchester, part of a tract of land with a smith's shop, "Now in possession of said Willard" for £140. The property included two fire hearths, hammer wheel, dam, head wares, water courses, running and going gear. He had occupied the shop as a tenant several years previous to his purchase.

In the History of Newton, he is described as an ingenuous, upright and conscientious man and the first Baptist of the town. The principal man of the iron works and the village for near half a century. His property was at the Lower Falls.

He was a soldier in the Revolution and received £24 bounty and his family was supplied by the town from Jan. to July, 1778.

- 4 JOHN BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., after 1676; died Dec. 9, 1721; married Patience ——. His widow Patience was administrator of his estate. In an undated report made by Edward C. Bartlett of No. 83 Pearl St., Cambridgeport, Mass., to Mr. Thomas Bartlett Hall (773) her name is given as Patience Cady, but I have been unable to find any record in substantiation.

On Jan. 24, 1716/7, he purchased from his brother Joseph, the interest in his father's estate (see No. 2).

The house of John Bartlett is mentioned in connection with the staking out of a highway in 1726.

5 HANNAH BARTLETT, born Sherborn, Mass., Feb. 17, 1694/5; died Brookfield, Mass., June 30, 1754; married Brookfield, Mass., June 17, 1720, Azariah Rice. He was born Marlboro, Mass., Aug. 13, 1693; died Brookfield, of cancer, 1779. He was son of Benjamin and Mary (Graves) Rice of Marlboro, Mass., and a descendant of Edmund Rice, who came from England, and settled in Sudbury, Mass., in 1639; later removing to Marlboro, Mass.

Circumstances indicate that she went to Brookfield, Mass., when quite young, with her brothers, Thomas (No. 6) and Benjamin (No. 7) and her cousin, Nathaniel (No. 17). Her name is the only one recorded in the Sherborn Vital Records.

Azeriah Rice had a grant of sixty acres in 1714. His sisters, Lydia, who married Cyprian Rice, and Priscilla, who married Josiah Partridge, also settled in Brookfield. He was assessed, April 22, 1717, £1-4s-6d, "for the paying the Minister of Brookfield & the Meeting-house and other Necessary charges in sd place."

6 Thomas Bartlett, born Newton, Mass., July 26, 1697; died Dec. 7, 1774, in his 78th year; married March 12, 1719, Mary Bartlett. She was born May 6, 1701; died Jan. 15, 1751. She was daughter of Benjamin and Mary Bartlett, and her birth is said to be the first birth recorded in the Brookfield records. Her father was probably the Benjamin Bartlett, who with his brother, Jehoida, was a new comer to Brookfield, in 1700; they were the sons of Benjamin and Deborah (Barnard) Bartlett, of

Windsor, Conn., and grandsons of John Bartlett, who was a resident of Windsor in 1649. I have not been able to find that there was any relationship between these two families of Bartletts.

Thomas Bartlett was a new comer to Brookfield, Mass., in 1716, and had a grant of sixty acres. He was taxed on April 22, 1717, £1-4s-6d, for the pay of the Minister and the meeting-house and necessary charges. On Dec. 5, 1748, he was one of the signers of a petition in which the signers "agree to go off as a distinct Precinct" and have agreed to build a Meeting-house upon the road Northeast from Mr. Jabez Ayres' between the brook and Mr. Daniel Potter's.

In 1753, the name of Thomas Bartlett appears upon a list of those who purchased pews in the church. On May 21, 1750, at an organization meeting of the church, he had been elected Precinct Treasurer.

It appears that he had a saw and grist mill on Five-mile River. In 1744, he conveyed land, "excepting a saw mill," to his son Joseph Bartlett; this was sold by Joseph in 1752 to Joseph Hatfield of Sturbridge, "excepting the Saw mill of Joseph Bartlett."

Benjamin Bartlett, father-in-law of Thomas, sold in 1726 to Henry Dwight, property granted him in 1721. This same property was sold in 1737, by Dwight, to Nathaniel Bartlett, wheel-wright. In 1737, Benjamin Bartlett sold to Joseph Bartlett two properties. It would appear that Benjamin Bartlett, the father-in-law of Thomas, left Brookfield about that time. He was twice married; his first wife being Mary, and his second wife, Rachel. The last child of Benjamin and Rachel Bartlett, recorded on the Brookfield records was born July 29, 1736.

7 Benjamin Bartlett, born Newton, Mass., May 24, 1699. He is probably the same Benjamin Bartlett who married at Brookfield, Mass., Jan. 1, 1727/8, Thanks Reed. The only definite information I have found of this family is an entry in the Hardwick, Mass., Vital Records, where it is stated that Philip, son of Benjamin and Thanks Bartlett, was baptized at Ware River, May 14, 1745. The History of Hardwick by Lucius Page (1883) also states, Benjamin Bartlett by wife Thanks had Philip, baptized May 14, 1745. The History of Ware, Mass., by Arthur Chase (1911) mentions Benjamin Bartlett, as being a lessee of lot No. 29, in 1755. Philip Bartlett, age 29, stature 6 feet. 3 inches, appears on a descriptive list of nine months men enlisted in June, 1778, Col. Porter's Regiment, Captain Brackinridge's Company; Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolution also gives the same description and has an additional item viz.: Philip Bartlett, Ware, Private, Lieut. Aaron Phelps's Company, Col. Elisha Porter's regiment, enlisted July 9, 1777, discharged Aug. 12, 1777, service 1 month, 9 days.

Benjamin Bartlett, Moses Bartlett, and David Bartlett, were on the muster roll of Capt. Jacob Cummin's Company for Col. Israel Williams Regiment that went "to ye relief of Fort William Henry when besieged by the enemy in Aug., 1757," marched from Ware River, so called, dated Jany. 5, 1758. The expedition was not a long one, the length of time for the greater portion of the men being 15½ days. The Company marched to Kenderhook with the following exceptions: Moses Smith and Benjamin Bartlett to Sheffield.

8 JOSEPH BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., April 8, 1703; died Nov. 16, 1786, age 86; married Feb. 11, 1731, Sybilla Coller.

Her name is given a variety of spellings in the records such as Zebia, Zabbiah, Zebiah, Zebiah. She was the daughter of John and Elizabeth Coller (see Temple's History of Framingham). Her grandfather was John Coller, and grandmother probably Hannah, daughter of James Cutler. He was a resident of Watertown, Mass., in 1657, and later resided in Cambridge, and Sudbury, Mass. He finally removed to Framingham, Mass.

Joseph Bartlett apparently lived in Brookfield, Mass., from about 1743 to 1747, for the last three or four children were born there. In 1763, he presented a petition to be relieved of paying ministerial taxes, presenting a certificate that he had joined the Baptist Church in Leicester. The petition was denied. I have found no evidence that he ever lived at that place.

She was daughter of John and Ann (Pierce) Clark, born Jan. 12, 1702. Her father was a selectman of Newton, Mass. She was a descendant of Hugh and Elizabeth Clark, who were residents of Watertown in 1640. These Clarks are the same family that gave so much trouble to the grandfather of Ebenezer in 1673, by pulling down the frame of his house. On the map of Newton, found in Jackson's History, Ebenezer Bartlett became the owner of a property formerly in the possession of Henry Seger, near the Lower Falls, and not far distant from Jonathan Willard, his uncle. This property later came into pos-

session in 1791 of Elisha Bartlett and Peregrine Bartlett, the sons of Ebenezer. Ebenezer is shown as the owner in 1736.

Ebènezer Bartlett married (2) in Boston, Aug. 29, 1745, Ann Ball. She was daughter of John Ball, of Watertown, Mass., by his first wife, Abigail Harrington. John Ball died in Worcester, Mass., Jan. 11, 1756, age 58. In his will, dated Jan. 9, proved Feb. 3, 1756, he mentions his daughter Anna, wife of Eben Bartlett, of Newton (Bond's Watertown Gen.).

In the History of Bethel, Me., p. 20, appears the following affidavit of Ebenezer Bartlett:

We the subscribers whose names are hereto written, do testify and say that neither we nor our Ancestors ever had any grant of land made to us on account of our Ancestors being in the Expedition to Canada in the year 1690.

Witness our hands this 23d of May 1768.

(Signed) Nathaniel Eames on the right of Nathaniel Eames and on the right of John Jaquith

Ebenezer Bartlett Norman Clark

The petition for a grant must have been successful for at p. 392, of the History of Bethel, Me., we find:

Aug. 29, 1774, Ebenezer Bartlett of Newton sold toson Elisha, of same place, lot number five in the first division and interval lot number 13, in the fifth range, land in Sudbury, Canada.

Apr. 16, 1782, Elisha Bartlett, of Newton, sold to brother Thaddeus, of Sudbury, Canada, the foregoing property. Consideration one shilling.

Nearly all of Ebenezer's children went to Bethel, Me., where they were among the earliest settlers.

In August, 1774, Ebenezer Bartlett with several others produced their certificates to the town, stating that they were chosen a committee by the Society of the people called Antipedo-Baptists, who meet together for religious worship on the Lord's Day, in Newton, and they verily believe are, with respect to the ordinance of baptism, of the same religious sentiments with us, and asked to be excused from paying ministerial taxes in Newton. Their request was refused.

Nicholas Bartlett died March 16, 1743/4, at Shirley, Mass. Ethel Stanwood Bolton, in her book "Shirley Uplands and Intervales," says Nicholas Bartlett, of Newtowne, purchased in 1729, of Benjamin Prescott, the farm next west of the Brooks tavern. Nicholas was a settler and built his house just south west of where Mr. Boutilier now (1914) lives, near a corner in the stone wall, where a great chestnut tree recently stood. There he lived and died, and there his widow Elizabeth also remained for the rest of her life, twelve acres and the house being reserved as her dower.

Nicholas Bartlett was admitted to the church in Groton, March 30, 1735.

In the "Journal of the House of Representatives" as published, Vol. 13, p. 226, under date of Jan. 9, 1735, is found the following:

A petition of Nicholas Bartlett now of Groton, shewing that one Nathanael M'ckee was one of the company in the Engagement with Lieut. Gershom Flagg and others against the Indian Enemy at Lamprey River, that he was omitted and not named in the Grant lately made those Officers and Soldiers, that the Petitioner has given the said M'ckee a valuable consideration for what he might or should obtain from the bounty of this Government, praying that a Grant may be made him as assign to said M'ckee equal to his fellow Soldiers in said Engagement, for the reasons mentioned.

Read, and in answer to this Petition, Voted, That the Petitioner have leave by a Surveyor and Chain men on Oath to survey and lay out one hundred and fifty acres of the unappropriated Lands of the Province where it may not prejudice a Township and return Plat thereof to this Court within twelve months for confirmation to the Petitioner (as Assigns of the said Nathanael M'ckee) his heirs and assigns forever. Sent up for

Concurrence.

In 1747, Caleb Bartlett, brother of Nicholas, signed the petition for the separation of Shirley from Groton, Mass. He is shown in "Shirley Uplands and Intervales," as owning property in 1742. The third brother, William, who came to Shirley, Mass., is shown as owning property in 1738.

The estate of Nicholas Bartlett was administered by his son, John Bartlett, of Boston, who sold all except the widow's dower, to the husband of his sister, James Dogharty.

Ethel Stanwood Bolton says that five years after the death of her father, this pair came to Shirley and bought of John Bartlett all but the widow's dower of her father's estate. The town records and the people all called him Dehorte or Dehorty, but he always in the deeds signed himself Dougherty. He owned besides the Bartlett land, ninety acres on Centre Road, then known as the Solendine Meadows. Almost immediately Dougherty began to mortgage his property, for what purpose it is hard to say. He was a sea captain, and it may have been for trading purposes. His mortgages were mostly to Boston men, like William Coffin, Martin Gay, Francis Johomot the Huguenot, and John Lucas. Strangely one mortgage passed into the hands of Barlow Trecothick, the London banker. In 1769 and 1770, the house and barn were mortgaged and when seized by the mortgagees for debt, Dougherty passed out of our knowledge.

The tradition has it that he was a Tory and that therefore he fled.——"It is also said that after the Revolution "Two strangers came to town and dug for treasure said to have been buried by a departing Tory. After digging a certain time they took a sudden departure in such a way as to lead people to suspect that they were successful in their search. The place where they dug was not on the "Dehorte" farm, but on the farm where Seth Walker once lived on Centre

Road."

17 Nathaniel Bartlett, born Newton, Mass., Jan. 7, 1713; married (1) Jan. 12, 1733/4, at Brookfield, Mass., Sarah Thompson. She died Oct. 28, 1749. He married (2) July 5, 1750, Mrs. Dorothy (Hubbard) Harwood, widow of Ebenezer Harwood, who was killed June 17, 1745, at the first capture of the fortress at Louisberg. His wife is said to have walked all the way from Brookfield to Boston, to draw the bounty money due him. She was born at Concord, Mass., March 24, 1718/9, daughter of Daniel and Dorothy (Dakin) Hubbard. She was of Worcester at the time of her marriage to Nathaniel Bartlett, and was a sister of Capt. Jonas Hubbard, of Worcester, who was killed on the Quebec Expedition, and after whom one of her grandchildren was named.

In 1737, Nathaniel Bartlett, wheelwright, purchased property from Henry Dwight, originally granted to Benjamin Bartlett, in 1721. In 1757, Nathaniel Bartlett was a member of Capt. Nathaniel Woolcott's Company that marched Aug. 9, 1757, to the relief of Fort William Henry at the time it was captured by Gen. Montcalm. The company was out sixteen days. In the same company was Joseph Bartlett, No. 29, Aaron Bartlett, No. 30, Matthew Bartlett, No. 33, and Adoniram Bartlett, No. 37, all sons of Thomas Bartlett, No. 6, and cousins of Nathaniel.

I have found no record of the death of Nathaniel Bartlett or his wife, Dorothy, but his name appears in the 1790 Census with a family of 1-0-2.

18 WILLIAM BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., Jan. 28, 1714/5; died Shirley, Mass., Aug. 23, 1785, in his 71st year; married in Boston, Dec. 23, 1740, Silence Beals. She died Oct. 15, 1810, in her 93d year. Chandler, in his History of Shirley, gives her name as Silence Thwing. I believe this to be an error probably arising from the fact that two of William's sisters married the Thwing brothers, Thomas and Edward.

The children of William and Silence appear in the Shirley Vital Records with the statement that they were born in Cambridge, Mass., but they are not found in the Cambridge records. William Bartlett and his brothers, Nicholas and Caleb, owned adjoining farms in Shirley, Mass.

Chandler in his History of Shirley says that William Bartlett came to Shirley in 1749, but Ethel Stanwood Bolton in "Shirley Uplands and Intervales" says that William acquired by deed, 65 acres in 1738. This property went to his son in 1785, and then to his wife, Silence, and finally to Luther Longly, who married William's granddaughter, Mary Bartlett. It appears in his name as late as 1812.

The Diary of James Parker, published in the New England Register Vols. 69 and 70, contains several references to this family which I give as follows:

Aug. 1, 1770, Poled in a load of hay ye first that I got in, Egerton, (John) & Peabody (Thomas) Reaped my oats that grew at Cattacumenung farm. Hannah Bartlett came to work for my wife this day.

Jan. 19, 1771, Eleazer Bartlett & wife was Own'd ye Cov't.

Feb. 3, 1773, Lucy Bartlett came and watched this Night. (His wife was ill.)

Nov. 29, 1775, John Egerton & I sot out to go down with Mr. Bartlett, went with 2 loads of barrells, we stayed at Concord, from thence to roxbury & so round the Comp.

July 5, 1776, Was training in order to Enlist 15 men to go to Canada, viz John Egerton, Edmund Longley, John Davis, Silas Davis, Abel Parker, Jonathan Foster, Nathan Kingman, William Bartlett.

May 15, 1777, I went to Town meeting, we subscribed 28 Dollars a man, I gave 10 Dollars viz Jonathan Davis, Amos Dole, Ezra Smith, Wm. Bartlett, Jr.

Apr. 22, 1779, William Bartlett took away his Continental Horses.

Mar. 18, 1780, I sleaded wood, Elir Bartlett lost  ${\bf 2}$  sheep.

July 17, 1780, Abel Chase & wife Reaped for me and Isaac Bartlett and Eliazer.

Mar. 21, 1781, I helped Er Bartlett make me a sub for to Scald Hogs in.

Mar. 18, 1783, Ellis Bartlett went off to the Easterd ye 17 Day.

Aug. 12, 1801, I drawing stone between W. Bartlett.

Silence Bartlett, widow of William, is listed in the 1790 Census with a family of 0-0-2.

19 CALEB BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., Nov. 17, 1716. There is practically no information in the Shirley records concerning this family. He is listed as the owner and builder of a house in 1742, in "Shirley Uplands and Intervales." He also was one of the petitioners for the separation of Shirley from Groton in 1747.

It is my guess that this Caleb Bartlett is identical with the Caleb Bartlett mentioned in the Amherst, Mass., History by Carpenter and Morehouse. An extract from the Town Meeting as follows:

Att A Legal Preceinct Meeting Held in Hadley second preceinct March ye 22, 1754,

Voated 13, that the(y) Grant Caleb Bartlet seven pounds old tennor to Give the Signal and sweep the Meeting House for this year past.

In Judd's History of Hadley (1863) it is stated, "Caleb Bartlett came from Amherst in 1755, and had the care of the farm of the widow of Capt. Moses Porter a few years. He afterwards built the house which is still standing, a little north of that of Deacon Jason Stockbridge. David Stockbridge, an enterprising man, came in 1779, and lived in the house of his father-in-law, Caleb Bartlett. Deacon Jason Stockbridge was born 1780, in the house built by Caleb Bartlett.

Caleb Bartlett appears on a list of inhabitants with a valuation of £52-3, 2 persons, in 1770.

It appears from the History of Sunderland, Mass., that David Stockbridge married Patience Bartlett, and Caleb Stockbridge their son settled in Sunderland. The name of Nicholas Bartlett is found listed from Amherst, Mass., with a family of 1-1-3, in the 1790 Census.

The History of Whately, Mass., p. 585, says that David Stockbridge, born 1749, at Hanover, Mass.; died Feb. 11, 1832, age 82; married (1) Patience, daughter of Caleb Bartlett. She was born 1753; died Oct. 19, 1806, age 53. They settled in Hadley.

The foregoing fragments are given for what they are worth in the event that they may be a clue to further investigation.

20 PATIENCE BARTLETT, born Newton, Mass., Dec. 13, 1718; married Edward Thwing, int. pub. Oct. 16, 1747. He was born Cambridge, Mass., July 31, 1716; died Nov. 11, 1753, in his 37th year. He was son of Edward and Lydia (Smith) Thwing, and a descendant of Benjamin Thwing who came to America in the ship "Susan and Ellen" in 1635, at the age of sixteen.

Edward Thwing's brother Thomas married Mary Bartlett, sister of Patience. (See No. 16.)

He was a Captain, selectman and representative to the Massachusetts legislature for the years 1776, 77, 83 and 84. He was on the muster roll of Capt. Jabez Upham's Company, that marched Aug. 9, 1757, to the relief of Fort William Henry. They were out 17 days. He was listed as a Sergt.

He was on a committee which reported on Dec. 7, 1773, as follows:

.We think it our indespensible duty, in the most public manner to let the world know our utter abhorence of the last and most detestable scheme, in the introduction of Tea from Great Britian, to be peddled out amongst us, by which means we were to be made to swallow a poison more fatal in its effects to the national and political Rights and Priveledges of the People of this country, than rats bane would be to the natural body.

Therefore, Resolved, that we will not by any way or means, knowingly encourage or promote the sale or consumption of any Tea whatsoever, subject to duty payable in America, but all persons whoever they may be, who shall be concerned in a transaction so dangerous, shall be held by us in the utmost contempt, and be deemed enemies to the well being of this country.

He was on the muster roll of Capt. Nathaniel Woolcott's Company that marched Aug. 9, 1757, to the relief of Fort William Henry and was out 16 days. He was one of the signers to the petition for the separation of the North-east section of Brookfield as a distinct Precinct, on Dec. 5, 1748. The names of Joseph Bartlett, Jr., Thomas Bartlett and Noah Bartlett also appear as signers. Noah Bartlett is unidentified as a member of this family.

Joseph Bartlett purchased of Seth Hinds, a mill on Five Mile River. The mill had been built by John Hinds, father of Seth, as early as 1738. Joseph Bartlett sold the mill March 3, 1761, to Gen. Rufus Putnam.

In 1768, Bartlett sold his farm, the mill privilege excepted, to Zebulon Rice (father-in-law of Gen. Putnam), who sold it Jan. 4, 1775, to Putnam.

It would appear that Joseph Bartlett moved to Salem. Washington County, New York, as the 1790 Census has Joseph Bartlett, 2-0-2; Joseph Bartlett, Jr., 1-0-1; Aaron Bartlett, 1-3-4; Moses Bartlett, 1-0-1; Bartholomey Bartlett, 1-2-2; and Silas Esty, 1-2-2. The Salem Book mentions Bartholomew Bartlett as a revolutionary soldier. He was probably No. 31.

The New York Gen. and Biographical Record, Vol. 43, p. 10, gives an assessment roll of the early settlers of Salem from which the following is taken:

Silas Esty was the husband of Tryphenia Bartlett (No. 33). The early inhabitants of Salem kept no records for the first hundred years of its settlement.

The death of Mrs. Anna (Whitaker) Heyward was announced in the Massachusetts Gazette for Sept. 27, 1764. (See New Eng. Reg. Vol. 13, p. 212.) The article reads as follows:

On the 8th Inst. died after a few Days illness, Mrs. Anna Heyward in the 74th year of her age, the wife of Oliver Heyward, Esq. She has left by a former Husband (John Hinds) 13 children, 82 grand-children, and 17 great-grand-children, in all 112. She was very useful as a mid wife and in her last sickness she had a most unshaken trust in the Mercy of God through the Redeemer. In her youth, when the Savages invaded Haverhill, she saved two children of the Rev. Mr. Rolfe's by hiding them in the cellar after the Indians had entered the House while they were glutting their Rage on the Parents: the two Indians followed her into the cellar, yet such was her presence of Mind, and Dexterity, that she concealed the children and herself that they escaped their notice; and they were the only members of the Family at Home who survived the bloody carnage.

Another version of this interesting story found in the New Eng. Reg. Vol. 2, p. 353 is given in connection with the Checkley Genealogy. The Rev. Samuel Checkley of Boston married Jan. 5, 1720/1, Elizabeth Rolfe, one of the surviving daughters. The story there given is substantially the same as that given in the Hist. of Haverhill, by Chase.

In the destruction of Haverhill in 1708, her father, mother and a sister were massacred.

When Mr. Rolfe heard the alarm he leaped from his bed, placed himself against the door, and called to the soldiers for assistance; but no assistance came, although there were several armed men placed in his

house to protect it.

The enemy shot through the door, and wounding Mr. Rolfe, he could not longer guard it. Retreating through his house he was followed and tomahawked near his well. The Indians then found Mrs. Rolfe and her youngest child Mehitable. One of them sunk his hatchet deep into the mother's head, while another took the infant from her dying grasp, and dashed its head against a stone near the door. Two other daughters were taken into the cellar by Hagar, a negro servant, and placed under two tubs. She then hid herself behind some barrels.

The enemy went into the cellar, passed and repassed the tubs, and even stepped upon a projecting foot of one of the children, took meat from the barrels behind which Hagar was hidden, drunk milk from the pans and then dashed them upon the bottom of the cellar, and finally left it without discovering the trembling girls. Another female who then lived in Mr. Rolfe's family, named Anna Whittaker, concealed herself in an apple-chest, under a flight of stairs, and was

not discovered.

Anna Whittaker, the mother of Sussanna Hinds, was born at Haverhill, Mass., Sept., 1691, and was therefore 17 years old at the time of the foregoing incident.

John Hinds, father of Sussanna, was born Lancaster, Mass., Jan. 19, 1683. He was the son of John and Mrs. Mary (Butler) Hinds. His mother was the widow of James Butler. He was originally from Woburn, Mass.

Matthew Bartlett was on the muster roll of Capt. Obediah Cooley's Company Sept. 20 to Nov. 24, 1756, the plan of campaign that year embraced the reduction of the forts at Crown Point, and Niagara; but through the incapacity of Gen. Abercrombie, the British commander, "the summer passed in fruitless labor."

He was also on the muster roll of Nathaniel Woolcott's Company that marched Aug. 9, 1757, to the relief of Fort William Henry and was out 16 days.

The Hist. of North Brookfield says, "he was born and died on the Hooker place."

Benjamin Adams settled first in Marlboro and removed to North Brookfield, Mass., about 1738. He was a cooper and was an Ensign in Capt. Nathaniel Woolcott's Company that marched Aug. 9, 1757, and was out 16 days.

Obediah Bartlett enlisted for six months on Nov. 14, 1774, in Capt. Gilbert's Company of Minute Men, with his son, Abner. He was also a Lieutenant in Capt. Jonathan Barns' Company, Col. Jonathan Warner's Regiment of Minute Men who responded to the Lexington alarm on April 19, 1775, and was out 7 days. The same company included John Bartlett, son of Nathaniel (No. 17); Wyman Bartlett (No. 120); and Abner Bartlett (No. 127), his son.

In the "Memorials of Robert Lawrence and Robert Bartlett" by Hiram Bartlett Lawrence (1888) will be found information concerning this family, but Adoniram is mistakenly supposed to be a descendant of the Newbury family of Bartletts.

Adoniram Bartlett moved from Brookfield, Mass., to Conway, Mass., about 1768. He is listed in the Census of 1790, with a family of 2-1-3.

In the 1790 Census, he is listed from East Sudbury, Mass., with a family of 1-0-2.

Nathaniel Segar in his "Narrative" (See Hist. of Newton), says that he went to Bethel, Me., in the spring of 1779, in company with Jonathan Bartlett of Newton, and carried kettles to make sugar. He also says that in 1781, there were ten families in the town, but the nearest was six miles away, and some ten miles away. As the Newton, Mass., records contain the names of only the first three children and the last of the three was born May 2, 1769, there is a gap of ten years before he appears at Bethel. This gap may be explained by the Weston, Mass., records, where we find that Enoch Bartlett was a taxpayer there from 1773 to 1781. He was elected Hogreave there on March 12, 1779, and at a town meeting, April 5, 1784, his taxes for the year 1780 were remitted.

The History of Bethel, Me., says that Enoch Bartlett had twenty one children, ten by his first wife and eleven by his second wife. A notice of his death was published in the Providence (R. I.) Journal, dated Oct. 23, 1825, and states that he had living at the time 17 children; 93 grandchildren; and 64 great grand children.

Enoch Bartlett settled on the Dr. Carter farm at Middle Interval, Bethel, Me., and after a few years moved to Newry, Me.

47 Jonathan Bartlett, born Newton, Mass., March 16, 1745/6; died April 14, 1798; married Feb. 14, 1785, Mary Shaw, of Fryeburg, Me. She was born Oct. 16, 1761, at Hampton, N. H., daughter of Josiah and Mary (Lamprey) Shaw, of Standish, Me. She was a descendant of Roger Shaw of Cambridge, Mass., and Hampton, N. H. She married (2) June, 1799, Nathan Adams, of Rumford, Me.

Jonathan Bartlett went to Bethel, Me., with Nathaniel Segar, in the spring of 1779 (see 46). The Segar "Narrative" states, "the next spring, Thaddeus Bartlett of Newton, and a boy named Aaron Barton (165) joined us at Bethel, and we employed ourselves making sugar, clearing the land and planting. The Indians appeared friendly; we gave them corn and sugar, and received in return wild meat, tallow and fur, and lived together on amicable terms. We had no roads; we went by marked trees, and hauled our necessaries on hand sleds. There were but few families in the place, and no neighbors near. We ground our corn with a hand mill."

Jonathan Bartlett was a private in Capt. Amariah Fuller's Company which marched to Cambridge on the alarm of April 19, 1775.

Oliver Fenno was a tythingman in 1797, surveyor of high-ways, 1798, and selectman in 1799. He was in service all through the Revolution, the latter part as sergeant. He is described as of light complexion, and five feet and eleven inches tall.

James Sprague's great grandfather, John Sprague, was born Hingham, Mass., April, 1638; died Mendon, Oct. 26, 1683. He purchased his home lot in Mendon from a "John Bartlett." This John Bartlett obtained the lot in 1670. John Bartlett was from Weymouth and after selling it he removed to Rehoboth, Mass. There is no evidence that he was in any way related to the Newton, Mass., family of Bartletts, but it is peculiar that the English family of Spragues were related in England to some family of Bartletts. (See "The Spragues of Malden," by George Walter Chamberlin; "The Bartletts" by Thomas Edward Bartlett.)

James Sprague married (2) Nancy Richards, of Bath, who was only 17 years old at the time of her marriage and he was 55. The History of Bethel, Me., says that after his death, she earned a precarious living by cultivating a small patch of ground, aided by her son, Elhanan, who was weak of intellect and very indolent. She also told fortunes and occasionally went out to wash.

James Sprague was on the muster rolls at Boston credited to Mendon as a three months man. He was also a private in the 4th Company of Minute Men, Capt. G. Nelson, at the battle of Lexington, April 19, 1775.

In 1781, he went to Greene, Me., where his older brother William had settled; he was accompanied by his aged father, who died there. In 1816, he moved to Bethel, Me., and resided there until his death.

It was square two-story frame house of familiar type with large chimney in the center."

"The nails used in its construction were made by hand in Bethel, by Peregrine Bartlett, Ezekiel Merrill's son-in-law. The great hall was often full of Indians, sleeping all across the floor with their heads to the fire, as is their custom, while white visitors were lodged in the guest chambers."

Peregrine Bartlett lived on the north side of the river at Bethel, Me., in the part of town that became Hanover, near "Bartlett's Ferry."

He was Surveyor of Highways in 1799, 1800, 1803, 1804 and on the school committee in 1815.

Jonathan Willard resided at Sturbridge, Sherborn, Charlton and Dudley, Mass. The records of the births of most of his children are to be found in the Charlton Vital Records, but he seems to have spent most of his later life in Dudley, Mass. He was "warned" from Dudley in a warrant to the Constable, Edward Davis, under date of Feb. 18, 1767. The "warning" evidently did not stick, as he was elected to be "hogg Rieves," on March 6, 1769. He was elected "fifth selectman" March 6, 1780. March 4, 1782, "Voted Lieut. Jonathan Willard, West end Constable," which he held until 1786, when he was elected second assessor. In 1791, he was elected Highway Surveyor, and put on the School Committee.

The "Willard Memorial" says that Jonathan Willard was of Sturbridge at the time of his marriage and is found there in 1755, when at the age of 17, he was a soldier in the old French war, in the expedition against Crown Point. He fell sick at Albany, and was brought home at the expense of his master, Samuel Freeman, and being unable to work until March, 1756, his master received an allowance from the General Court for the loss of the lad's services.

He served for a long period in the Revolutionary army and held the title of lieutenant. He enlisted in Capt. Healey's Company, Col. Leonard's Regiment, May 1, 1775, was a sergeant in 1777, commissioned 1st Lieutenant, Sept. 25, 1778, served at West Point in 1780.

His health failed and his faculties were impaired, so that his affairs were placed under a guardianship in 1830.

Paul Pratt was a Revolutionary soldier serving in Col. Cyprian Howe's Regiment, Capt. Abraham Andrew's Company. He enlisted July 7, 1780, discharged Oct. 30, 1780. He was also in Capt. John Miles's Company, Col. Joseph Vose's Regiment, enlisting for three years, April 6, 1781.

70 ALEXANDER SHEPARD, born Newton, Mass., Sept. 9, 1741; died 1788, age 47; married at King's Chapel, Boston, Mass., Elizabeth (Jackson) Greenwood, widow of John Greenwood, Oct. 25, 1765. She was his second wife. She was the daughter of Capt. John Jackson, born Nov. 20, 1728. Her father was one

of the richest men in Newton, Mass. He left her £400 in his will. She died at Hebron, Me., 1801.

Alexander Shepard died 1788, age 47. He was a surveyor. He built the house near Auburndale, Mass., which was owned in 1854, by a Mr. Craft.

He was employed by the Government of Massachusetts to survey the public lands in Maine, and he obtained a large grant of the lands for his services; which was called Shepardsfield, now Hebron. He removed and settled there, with John Greenwood, Jr., Dr. Goddard and other Newton men. His only son being dead, he adopted the son of his wife by her former marriage, Thomas J. Greenwood, and sent him to college, and by an act of Legislature, in 1781, his name was changed to Alexander Shepard, but he died when young in 1783, age 26.

72 John Bartlett, born June 15, 1736, in the part of Groton, Mass., that afterward became Shirley, Mass.; died Jan. 24, 1823, in Roxbury, Mass., age 86; married in Cambridge, Mass., May 31, 1759, Tabitha Kidder. She was baptized Aug. 29, 1736; died in Boston, May 20, 1812, age 76. She was the daughter of Thomas and Lydia (Prentice) Kidder of Cambridge, Mass., and a descendant of James and Anna (Moore) Kidder of Cambridge, Mass.

He was the executor of his father's estate, and in 1763, he deeded to James Dougherty, his brother-in-law, the property in Shirley, Mass., which was left by his father, excepting the widow's dower. He was a physician and resided in Boston and Roxbury, Mass. In 1769, he became a member of the "Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company of Massachusetts." The following facts concerning his life are taken from the history of that organization by Oliver Ayer Roberts:

Nov. 11, 1767, Mr. John Bartlett prayed of the selectmen, "leave to break ground in order to carry a drain from his house near the sign of the Lambinto the common sewer." He, therefore, lived near the present Adams House on Washington Street, Boston. He was chosen a scavenger for Ward II, March 14, 1768; a constable, Sept. 16, 1776, and March 11, 1777.

He was second sorgeant of the Artillery Company in 1772. Mr. Drake locates and describes the residence of Dr. John Bartlett in his History of the Town of Roxbury. He was drafted for service in the Continental Army, Dec. 19, 1776, and hired a substitute. Aug. 11, 1783, Dr. John Bartlett and Dr. John Warren petitioned the town of Boston "for Liberty to carry on the Business of Innoculation upon Apple Island it being a very safe and convenient situation." The petition was granted.

Oct. 25, 1786, Capt. Bartlett applied to the selectmen for "the use of the (Faneuil) Hall to exercise his company called the 'Volunteer Republican Company' on Thursday evenings."

After an affliction of blindness for several years, he died in 1823/4.

He is listed in the 1790 Census with a family of 1-0-2. The Boston records contain the record of the birth of his son Thomas, and from the other references it appears that he also was the father of Dr. John Bartlett of Roxbury. Gilbert Stuart the famous portrait painter painted pictures of his sons and their wives, also portraits of the daughters of his son Thomas. Reproductions of some of these portraits are found elsewhere in this volume.

She was the daughter of Peter and Sarah (Woodbury) Hill, of Brookfield, Mass. Her father was the son of John Hill. The History of North Brockfield says he was a farmer and wool merchant and came to Brookfield. Mass., from Rehoboth. Tradition says he was engaged to Hannah Turtlebee, daughter of a distinguished family in London. who were opposed to the marriage of their daughter with the son of a wool comber, and managed to get him appointed in the British navy and sent out of the country for the term of fifteen years, ten of which he served and was either discharged or deserted. However, a clandestine meeting was planned on board ship, where they were married and conveyed across the ocean to America. It is said he came to America about 1725-7. and to Brookfield about 1740, and died North Brookfield, 1775, age 102 years, 2 months.

85 Daniel Bartlett, born Brookfield, Mass., Dec. 21, 1755; died Dec. 25, 1819, age 64; married (1) pub. April 17, 1783, Martha Butler. She died 1796. He married (2) Jan. 14, 1797, Mrs. Abigail (Richardson) Harrington, widow of Jesse Harrington.

She was born Dec. 28, 1758; died March 21, 1830, age 72. She was insane during her later years. Her first husband, Jesse Harrington, was born May 8, 1756, son of Isaac and Sussanna (Allen) Harrington of Weston, Mass., and died 1782. A son, Jesse Harrington, born Nov. 3, 1782, at Amherst, N. H., was adopted by her father, William Richardson, Esq.

In the History of Westminster, we are told that Daniel Bartlett studied medicine and came to Westminster, Mass., to engage in the practice of his profession, probably in 1780, being first taxed there the following year. This does not seem consistent with the fact that he and his wife, Martha were warned from town in 1791.

Sept. 13, 1792, Dr. Daniel Bartlett asked his fellow citizens "leave to build a Hospital and Enoculate such persons as shall apply to him to have the Small Pox, he indemnifing the Town for any damage that shall be sustained by the spreading of the said Small Pox." His request was refused. Nine years later, May, 1801, a similar request was refused.

May 16, 1804, Daniel Bartlett was appointed the first Postmaster of Westminster and continued in that office until his death on Christmas Day, 1819.

It is stated that he was a man of great physical proportions. His practice was not large, but he supplemented it by having a store for the sale of drugs, N. E. rum and W. I. goods. His store was inherited by Oliver Estey who married his adopted daughter, Achsah (238).

He was a Surgeon's Mate in Col. Thomas Marshall's and Col. William Shepard's Regiments. Cont. Army pay accounts for service from Jan. 1, 1777, to Dec. 31, 1779; also Col. William Shepard's regiment order for clothing dated at Valley Forge, May 1, 1778; also on muster roll of Col. Marshall's regiment at West Point, dated Jan., 1779, and on the pay accounts of this regiment from Jan. 1, 1780, to Dec. 31, 1780. He was appointed Surgeon, Sept. 12, 1780.

121 REUBEN BARTLETT, born Brookfield, Mass., Nov. 5, 1755; died Aug. 21, 1830, probably at Glover, Vt. He married Nov. 23, 1781, at Brookfield, Mass., Amy Jenks. She was born about 1756, according to the pension records given below, but she may have been born a few years prior to that time. Information handed down in the family states that she was the daughter of Olney and Amey (Ballou) Jenks, of Smithfield, R. I. This seems to be substantiated by the Ballou Genealogy, p. 36. Amey Ballou was born Sept. 5, 1727, daughter of Peter and Rebecca (Esten) Ballou, and was a descendant of Maturin Ballou; her

father Peter Ballou, in his will dated April 18, 1754, and proved at Smithfield, R. I., June 17, 1754, leaves a bequest of five pounds to Olney Jenks but does not mention his daughter Amey, which leads one to the conclusion that she had died some time previous to that time, leaving a daughter Amey. It seems probable that this daughter may have been raised by her uncle Maturin Ballou, who resided at Providence, R. I., until 1759, when he removed to Scituate, and in 1767, removed to Richmond, N. H. It is also to be noted that Gideon, Nicholas and Jonathan Jenks, all sons of Jonathan and Freelove (Winsor) Jenks, settled at Brookfield. Mass., and Winchester, N. H., Nathaniel and Content (Carpenter) Jenks, settled in Brookfield, later removing to Lyndon, Vt. They were all descendants of Joseph Jenks (Jencks, Jenkes, Jenckes) of Lynn, Mass., who was a blacksmith and machinist and made the dies for the "Pine Tree" money and was granted the first patent in America, in 1646. His grandson, Joseph Jenks, was governor of Rhode Island, 1727 to 1732 (see Hist. N. Brookfield, Mass.).

Reuben and Amy (Jenks) Bartlett named one of their children "Welcome." Welcome Jenks, the son of Nathaniel and Content (Carpenter) Jenks, was a resident of Lyndon, Vt., and later removed to Vermillion County, Ind. (see Essex Hist. Coll., Vol. 6, p. 252; also Howland Gen.).

It is unfortunate that the parentage of Olney Jenks cannot be established. There is no record of the name in the New Hampshire records, so he may have died in Rhode Island shortly after his wife, leaving his daughter Amy in the family of her uncle Maturin Ballou, or in the family of Jonathan Jenks of Winchester, N. H.

The Revolutionary service of Reuben Bartlett, Pension File W-24622, is abstracted as follows:

May 25, 1818, Cheshire Co., N. H., Reuben Bartlett, aged about 67 years, deposed that he entered the service as private in Capt. Asa Danforth's Co., Col. Sheperd's Regt., on 1st Jan., 1776, for one year, and served in said Co. and Regt. for the full term. On 1st July, 1778, he again entered service as a private in place of a three year man, in Capt. Spear's Co., Col. Nixon's Regt. of Mass. line and served to May, 1780, when discharged. He enlisted in Brookfield, Mass.

July 12, 1820, Orleans Co., Vt., Reuben Bartlett, of Glover, aged 69, presented a schedule of property and family as required by a new Act of Congress. He owned no real estate; was a day laborer. Had self and wife Amey, aged 68, to support. Owed \$200 in consequence of illness, some six or seven years before. Requested that his pension be continued, and that he be transferred from the N. H. Roll to that of Vt., where he had removed.

1838, August 7 — Cheshire Co., N. H., Amy Bartlett of Winchester, aged 82 years, widow of Reuben Bartlett, the soldier and pensioner, who died Aug. 21, 1830. She was married to Reuben Bartlett, November 21 (or 22), 1781. Maiden name Amy Jenks. Had always been told that Reuben served a year before she became acquainted with him, and she personally knew of 15 months service afterward.

David Ball and Leonard Wise testified to acquaintance with Bartlett to his service, to his death, and to his widow, Amy.

1843, March 17, Cheshire Co., N. H., Amy Bartlett of Winchester, asked payment of pension under Act of March, 1843.

Amy Fleming and Sophronia Fleming testified death of Reuben Bartlett and the widowhood of Amy.

1848, June 28, Amy Bartlett applied for increase of pension, Act of 2 February, 1848. Augusta Fleming and Horace Chapin attest her signature.

It thus appears that Amy, the wife of Reuben, returned to Winchester, N. H., after the death of her husband. She died in 1853.

The Revolutionary service of Reuben Bartlett as given in the pension files agrees substantially with the record given in "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors," which is as follows:

Her great grandfather, John Hamilton, came to Brookfield from Concord, Mass., about 1701, and had grants of land amounting to 556 acres, part of which was "as an encouragement to set up the trade of Malster."

Circumstances indicate that he is the Joseph Bartlett from Brookfield, Mass., who was a corporal in Capt. Adam Bailey's Company, Col. John Bailey's (2d) regiment (commanded by Lieut. Col. Sprout, after Jan. 1, 1781). Muster roll dated Jan. 1, 1782, enlisted for 3 years, reported promoted from private Nov. 1, 1781. Another Joseph Bartlett of Brookfield, Mass., was also in the service, but he was probably the son of Joseph (29).

At any rate, he is the one who appears on the list of three year men age 21, who was to have £30 down, the rest in cattle, Sponsor, Eli Howe. All of which was the result of a committee appointed to agree with the men, "on the best terms they can," for service for three years.

Some time about 1784, Joseph Bartlett went to Danville, Vt., and in 1796, he became the first settler of Barnston, Stanstead County, Canada. The following story of his experiences is taken from the History of Stanstead County, Canada, by B. F. Hubbard (1874).

The first opening of the forest in Barnston, Can., was made by Capt. Joseph Bartlett, in 1796. Mr. Bartlett had previously resided in Danville, Vt. He started off on foot, late in the summer of 1796, and

after spending two or three days in the country around Stanstead Plain, pitched No. 12 Range of Barnston. His nearest neighbours being families of Mr. Taplin at Stanstead Plain and of Capt. Ebenezer Hovey at West Hatley. After felling two or three acres of trees and putting up a log shanty covered with bark and without a floor, he returned to his family in Vermont.

In the spring of 1797, he again set out for Barnston, accompanied by his second daughter and two elder sons. On their arrival at Stanstead, they sent back their hired team; loaded hand sleds they had fitted up, with such articles of furniture and clothing as they could carry, and started off through the woods on snow shoes. The snow was nearly four feet deep. Sally, the daughter, donned a pair of snow shoes and fitted a pack, which in more modern days would have been ample load for the strongest young man, and in this manner they succeeded in reaching their future house.

Mr. Bartlett and his sons began their operations by clearing off the timber he had previously fallen, and succeeded in getting in a small crop in the course of the spring. He was poor and having no provisions in prospect until their crop could be harvested, was under the necessity of returning to Vermont and "hiring out" to get a present supply.

In the meantime he had arranged with a man in Derby for a temporary supply for the children, and had paid him for carrying the provisions through to Barnston, but for dishonesty or carelessness they were not forwarded. In the meantime, the children were reduced almost to starvation. For several weeks they had to subsist entirely upon leeks or wild onions, scraped birch bark, and such fish as they could take from the brook, and eat without salt.

The return of Mr. Bartlett, in August, with a plentiful supply of provisions, was hailed with joy by his famished children. It is needless to say that the family was never again reduced to similar straits. Their little crop afforded an abundant harvest and they were soon enabled by patient and persevering industry to have a comfortable home and a plentiful table in the wilderness. Previous to the return of Mr. Bartlett, the boys and their sister had succeeded in making some three or four hundred weight of salts of lye, which afterwards was exchanged for provisions.

The father and children remained together until the following winter, extending their clearing and improving the premises. In January, 1798, he again returned to Vermont, and moved in the remainder of his family. They stopped a short time at Stanstead, sent back their hired team, and again set out for their new home, carrying their goods on hand sleds. They were two or three days in effecting this last removal. Mrs. Bartlett was placed on a hand sled, with her babe of four months, tucked carefully with bed clothes, and lashed on the sled to prevent being shaken off in going over the rough road. Mr. Bartlett and a son returned the next day to take in the two girls and some furniture. He put the two girls and some furniture on one sled, and the young man took the remainder.

The weather was intensely cold, and before they had reached their home, the lad had become so chilled and tired that he entreated his father to let him lie down and rest a while in the snow. Knowing that to lie down and sleep under these circumstances was death, the father deposited a part of their load in the woods—made the girls as comfortable as he could on his sled, and with a beech switch, drove his son before him until they reached home.

It was a fearful ordeal, but the life of the boy was saved. When he reached the house he dropped down senseless. Several weeks elapsed before he recovered his usual strength and health.

The place where Joseph Bartlett settled was later known as Bickford Corner. He early received appointment as captain of militia. He died March, 1840. His wife died Feb. 16, 1840. Two of the children settled in Barnston.

Called by them at an early age to the responsible and arduous duties of conducting the business of the town as Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, and representing them in the Legislature, he never neglected or betrayed the trust reposed in him, but ever served them faithfully. He was elected town clerk and first selectman, in 1798, one or both of which offices he filled until

his death in 1809. He was chosen representative and probably no other man was thought to hold that office during his life.

In his private and domestic character, he was all that could During the great revival in 1786, he became a member of Rev. Mr. Farrar's church, being then in his 18th year. He was a man of few words, but a strong vigorous writer and deep thinker and of truly righteous deeds. He was appointed deacon of the church April 30, 1807, and his death, which took place two years later was a great bereavement to them, followed as it did, soon after by their beloved Pastor.

James Wilson of Philadelphia, whose first wife, Rachel Bird of Bucks County, Penn., died in 1786. James Wilson was one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence and an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. He was a member of Congress, and in 1797 he was appointed the first professor of law in the University of Pennsylvania. He died in 1798.

Thomas Bartlett became a member of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company of Massachusetts in 1793. The History of that company by Oliver Ayer Roberts states, "He kept the sign of the 'Good Samaritan' in old Cornhill (Washington near State), which originally was painted with a priest passing by on the other side. This was soon erased because the painter had copied the portrait and costume of Rev. Dr. Walter of Christ Church, with his full wig, so exactly that travellers were

wont to recognize the likeness, probably too near a resemblance in another point of view. He resided in Hanover Street."

Thomas Bartlett retired from business early in life. He is described as a man of distinguished appearance over six feet in height and having white hair from the age of thirty. He was a benevolent, upright and greatly respected citizen.

After his second marriage, he and his wife went abroad, leaving their young daughter ,Caroline, with the grand-parents, Dr. John and Tabitha (Kidder) Bartlett of Roxbury. Maria and Ann Bartlett, daughters by his first wife, were sent to boarding school and Alice Wyer, daughter of his first wife was sent to the Wilsons in Philadelphia.

It is said that while in Paris Mr. Bartlett attended a review of troops, and his striking appearance attracted the attention of Napoleon, who was much impressed when told that he was an American.

After the death of his wife in England, he returned to Boston and lived with his daughters on Tremont Street, next door but one from St. Paul's Church, where he died.

The portrait of Thomas Bartlett, painted by Gilbert Stuart, about 1805, is illustrated in the frontispiece. It is also found illustrated in the work on Gilbert Stuart by Lawrence Park. As is the portrait of his second wife, Hannah Gray.

The characteristic of the disease is the inability of the blood to clot, resulting in the death of the person, even from the slightest injury. It is my understanding that this disease is responsible for the former King Alphonso of Spain prohibiting the marriage of his daughters and was a disease affecting the son of the former Czar of Russia. The peculiar part of the disease is the fact that it does not affect the females although they are the transmitters of the disease. It sometimes skips a generation, and has been traced in a family through several hundred years.

It is interesting to note that the Appleton family appeared in this history in connection with Samuel Bartlett (40) and that branch of the family appears to have become extinct, just as in the present case.

The Batcheller Genealogy tells us that soon after the birth of their first son, they moved to Arlington, Vt., where he set up a forge and began to work at his trade. In 1835, he moved to Wallingford, Vt., purchased a small water power, and resumed his blacksmithing, with the help of the older boys. In 1847, the first shop was burned, but a new stone shop was built and the firm of Batcheller & Sons was formed, consisting of Lyman Batcheller, and his sons John C. and Lyman, Jr. His son Isaac went in business alone.

Batcheller & Sons began the manufacture of hay and manure forks in a small way and continued the business, gradually increasing under the firm name until 1878, when it became a stock company, incorporated as Batcheller & Sons Co.

Lyman Batcheller was a member of the Baptist church, while his wife was an Episcopalian. He was a strong abolitionist and his home was often used as a station of the "underground railroad."



H. records contain the record of the birth of a Fanny Evans born in Winchester, N. H., May 23, 1788, but the names of her parents are not given.

Sylvanus Jenks Bartlett appears to have settled in Winchester, N. H., as the records state that his first two children were born there, but the other children, although reported from Winchester, are stated to have been born in Northfield, Mass., which was originally a part of Winchester.

He was fitted for college but did not enter. He was by trade a carpenter, an ingenious workman, and taught school winters during his early manhood. He finally decided on farming as his life business and purchased the farm, consisting of intervale and upland, which Gideon and Silas Powers had previously occupied.

He commenced at once to bring his land into higher state of cultivation, in which he succeeded. He was a man of superior judgment and intellect, and of a scientific cast of mind. He studied out methods for changing coarse material to dressing, and had practiced it for years before Bomer patented his process, which was identical with that of Mr. Foster's.

He was a great reader, and well acquainted with history, both ancient and modern. He employed a large number of men to carry on his farm and its various branches of farming, including stock-raising. He did a larger business than any one in his section of the state. He raised large crops of grain and grass, and delighted in a large yield of yellow corn. He attended personally to all the details of his business, rarely leaving the farm unless called away on urgent business.

He was one of the board of selectmen in Hanover, Me., and served one or more terms in the Legislature.

His wife was an amiable woman, and a model farmer's wife.

Mr. Foster's education was somewhat limited, but he had a natural ability of a high order. His wife was a helpmate indeed. She was skillful in all the domestic arts for which settlers' wives were distinguished, carding, spinning, and weaving, both flax and wool. She furnished clothing for the household, beginning with the raw material and ending with the made-up and finished garment.

In the evening after the household duties had been carefully attended to, she would sit with knitting work in hand, and it was marvelous to witness the numerous pairs of hose, linen for summer, woolen for winter wear, and mittens, she could produce in a year.

Mr. Foster was chosen Deacon of the Baptist Church and was filling that position at the time of his death.

His wife survived him many years and divided her time between the old homestead, occupied by her only son, and the homestead of her eldest daughter, Mrs. Ira Cushman, of South Bethel.

Asa Barton was the pioneer newspaper man of Paris, Me. He kept a store in Livermore, Me., for a few years, and about

1820 removed to Paris and then to Portland, Me., but came back to Paris and started the Oxford County bookstore. In 1824, he started the first paper ever printed in Paris, called the Oxford Observer. In 1826, he moved the paper to Norway, Me., in the night time, and it is said, without the knowledge of the people of Paris. In 1828, William P. Phelps was associated with him, but in 1830, Mr. Goodenow purchased Barton's interest and the paper was then published by Goodenow & Phelps.

In 1830, Mr. Barton started the Village Spy, at Norway, Me., but it was short-lived, and in the summer of 1833, Mr. Barton commenced publication, at Norway, of the Oxford Oracle; after issuing seven numbers he sold out to Millett & King, and moved to Bangor. He was there in trade with Emory Livermore. He then studied law and settled in Garland. In 1844, he returned to Norway where he remained until his death.

This volume included the poem "Rock Me To Sleep, Mother," which has been set to music as a popular song by several composers. A dispute arose regarding the authorship of the words, which attracted wide attention. Mrs. Allen wrote them in Portland, Me., early in 1859, and sent them from Rome, in May, 1860, to the Saturday Evening Post at Philadelphia. The validity of her claim was presumable not only from the fact that she had placed the piece in her volume before the discussion arose, but also because she was the only claimant that had written poems equal or superior to the disputed one.

That she was the real author was demonstrated by William D. O'Connor, in a long article in the New York

Times, of May 27, 1867.

Mrs. Allen was for several years literary editor of the Portland, Me., Advertiser, and was a frequent contributor to periodical literature (Appleton's Ency. of American Biography).

He was fitted for college in Gould's Academy and graduated from Bowdoin College in 1842. After teaching school for a year in Brunswick and Gould's Academy, in Bethel, he commenced the study of law, in the office of William Frye, Esq., and settled in Bethel, until 1848, when he removed to Norway, Me. He is mentioned in the History of Norway (1852), which states that he was doing a decent business and bid fair to become a useful and eminent member of the legal profession. In July, 1851, he established in Norway, a new paper under the old name of the Norway Advertiser, which he sold later to George W. Millett.

He was a Justice of Peace, in Norway, in 1852. The History of Norway also informs us that late in the evening of April 29, 1852, the house of Moses B. Bartlett was discovered to be on fire. The house was saved.

He removed to Waterford, Me., about 1854, and was Moderator there, in that year. He had been Moderator in Bethel, in 1845 and 1847.

In 1857, he removed to Wyandotte, now a part of Kansas City, Kan., where he was one of the first settlers. The Kansas Hist. Coll., Vol. 7, p. 118, contains an article regarding the early history of Wyandotte, and states, "A. B. Bartlett had built (1857) a small one-story residence away back in the brush, on the corner of Fifth and Nebraska."

It appears from an article in the Kansas Hist. Coll., Vol. 9, p. 468, that he was a member of the Railroad Convention, which convened at Topeka, Kan., Oct. 17, 1860. He appears to have also been a member of the territorial house of Representatives, in 1857.

The Kansas Hist. Coll., Vol. 2, p. 536, contains an article entitled "Early Days on the Union Pacific." The article states:

The first ground was broken at Kansas City, Sept. 7, 1863; among those present were. . . A. B. Bartlett, a lawyer. . . . Sawyer handed an ax to both Bartlett and Armstrong, asking each to fell a tree, saying that the honor of doing the first work on the right of way would fall to him whose tree fell first. Armstrong's tree first fell, but it remained attached to the stump, Bartlett's fell a few seconds later, clean-cut. At one time the contestants threatened a friendly law-suit to decide to whom the honor belonged.

The History of Bowdoin College says he remained in active practice in Kansas for nineteen years, and in 1876, in consequence of ill health, he removed to Georgetown, Putnam County, Fla., where he died on Nov. 9, 1885. His family consisted of two sons and a daughter, but I have not been able to obtain their names.

Edwin Wallace Bartlett was born Bethel, Me., Sept., 1826. He gave himself to teaching, one term in Phillips and a year or more in Woburn, Mass., as principal of the grammar school, and then in Roxbury, Mass., having been invited to the charge of the ladies' department of the Eliot School, where he remained until the fall of 1853, when his health compelled him to ask leave of absence. He went to Cuba and in a few

weeks returned to New Orleans, for improvement of his health. On his return homeward, exposure brought on a cold and cough with fever, from the effects of which he never recovered. He reached Bethel, June, 1854, and resumed his place at the opening of school, but only to occupy it until his successor could be secured. He returned to his home and after a long painful illness died Feb. 20, 1855.

He exhibited, we are informed, valuable qualities as a teacher and manager of schools and was a model

of untiring, self-sacrificing faithfulness.

After the birth of his first child, he returned and took charge of his father's farm in Westminster, Mass., where he remained until after the birth of four more children.

At the death of his father in 1822, he became the owner of the farm, and in 1829, sold it and removed to Ipswich and established himself as a house painter. His last child was born there. In 1833, he removed to Cohoes, N. Y., where he made needles for the machines of the first knitting factory started in America, by Egberts & Bailey. He owned an estate at the corner of Ontario and Factory streets.

In boyhood, he lived with Mr. Dowse, in Dedham. The Mudge Memorial quotes the following letter written by his son-in-law, Elbridge C. Muzzy, "Mr. Mudge was naturally a very strong-minded man, a man of genius as well as a man of talent, filling places of responsibility and trust throughout life. He was a man of education and could speak several languages fluently. He invented a system of stenography and but for an impediment in his speech would have arisen to some notoriety in the world. He was truly a self-made man, of excellent disposition, and best loved where best known. In religion a member of the Methodist Episcopal church and held various offices in the same."

The Thwing Genealogy says that the old homestead in West Newton, Mass., where Thomas Thwing spent his boyhood, was still standing at the corner of Homer and Chestnut streets, in 1868. With his mother he was rather a favorite, though there were occasional collisions. He attended school but a small part of the year, nor was his school attractive to him, even for that brief period, yet there was something about him even in boyhood which induced some of his friends to call him the "Little Minister."

At the age of nine years he went at their special request, to reside with his grandparents, with whom he passed six years. When about fifteen years old, he went to learn the trade of cabinet-maker, in Roxbury. In Feb., 1813, he found employment in Boston. He became a member of the Park Street choir. In Sept., 1814, during the war with England, he was called to do military duty one Sabbath, on Boston Common. Before night he and his fellow soldiers were taken down the harbor to Fort Warren. A British vessel of war was then in sight below the light house.

In Jan., 1815, he went to reside in what is now called West Brookfield, Mass. He became a member of the Congregational church there on May 28, 1815. In Oct., 1819, he offered his services to the American Board to be employed, if thought best, in the work of Foreign Missions. He was accepted in 1820. In April, 1824, he removed to the village of Ware, Mass. In 1837, he moved to Boston, in order to engage in missionary work. He established his home at the North End, that part of the city, which was his field of endeavor for the remainder of his life.

At six o'clock on July 23, 1842, he went to Copp's Hill, where with the help of a spy glass, he saw the top stone of Bunker Hill Monument raised from the ground, and in less than forty minutes it was fixed in its place where it probably will remain for ages to come.

He was naturally of a robust constitution, and never had occasion for the services of a physician until the autumn of 1882. He was respected by everyone with whom he had business or social dealings, and ever had a pleasant word and cheerful smile for all.

The following account of his life is taken from the Hist. of Royalston, by Lilley B. Caswell (1917):

He received his education in the public schools of Royalston. Soon after attaining the age of twenty-one, he purchased a farm, from his mother and the heirs of the family, and turned his attention to farming, of which he made a success, and from which he accumulated quite a property.

About 1870, he gave up farming to a certain extent, and turned his attention to probate work and conveyancing, in which he had a large practice, both in Royalston and adjoining towns. He also took a great interest in town affairs, and held nearly all the town offices, such as Selectman, Assessor, Treasurer and Tax Collector. He was one of the Committee of fifteen to make arrangements for celebrating the Hundredth Anniversary of the incorporation of the town of Royalston, and was also chosen Secretary of the Historical Committee.

About 1873, he gave up the home farm and went to live with one of his neighbours, Mr. John W. Stockwell, with whom he remained until 1877, when he was

married and moved to South Royalston.

In the spring of 1887, he returned to his former home at Mr. Stockwell's, where he lived until his death. In the fall of 1894, he was stricken with a paralytic shock which prevented him from taking any active part in business or town affairs.

March 6, 1899, he established a trust fund of \$20,000, to be known as the John N. Bartlett Fund, for the benefit of the poor. The terms of the agreement were presented to the Town Meeting by his nephew, Edward E. Bartlett (512).
