HISTORY

Received an academic education and learned the trade of carpenter and builder. Organized the "Rochester Cadets" and was one of the officers. Remained in Rochester until 21 years old. Then went to Painesville, Ohio, for a few months, and thence to Milwaukee, Wis., by stage-coach and sailing vessel. Was one of the earliest settlers there. When it became a city he was elected Alderman and was later connected with the city government in various ways for years. Before 1861-5 he was a prime mover in and second lieutenant of the "Milwaukee Life Guards," of which (Gen.) John C. Starkweather was commander and (Gen.) Rufus King (father of the novelist, Gen. Charles King) was 1st lieutenant.

Before 1861-5 he was also prominent in the "Underground Railway." Once he personally headed a mob which broke open the jail, rescued a captured slave, drove him 25 miles in his own carriage and took him safely to Canada. For this he was arrested and imprisoned for a short time.

Run and later served out his time. Upon return to Milwaukee he re-enlisted and was Major, Lieut. Col. and Col. of the 1st Wis. Vol. Mustered out Oct. 18, 1864.

In a letter of April 13, 1876, to Waiter F. Bingham (442-525), Gen. J. D. Bingham said that his grandfather was Luther (41409), b. May 20, 1782, at Canterbury, Conn., and this grandfather Luther used to say that his father was Col. Luther (4191).

Gen. J. D. Bingham therefore thinks that his own great grandfather was a Luther, Col. of militia during the Revolutionary War, kept tavern in Canterbury, Conn., and twice married. Gen J. D. B. thinks this was the same Luther, son of William (471), who was b. May 16, 1760, and m. Abigail Johnson, May 10, 1786.

A son of Col. Luther (4191) lived at Canton, St. Lawrence Co., N. Y., and some of his descendants lived at Watertown, Jefferson Co., N. Y.

In another letter to Walter F. Bingham (442525), dated May 25, 1876, Gen. J. D. Bingham thinks that the above Col. Luther (4191), who moved from Canterbury, Conn., to Lewis Co., N. Y., was his own great grandfather.

The above would seem to identify "Col. Luther" as (4191), but 1. I have no record of "tavern"—that is a small matter; and 2. I have no record that "Col. Luther" (4191)) had a son, Luther, b. 1782, at Canterbury, Conn., though there is nothing to prevent this and it would fit into this record perfectly.

Other members of the family say, however, that the Luther corresponding to "Col. Luther" had a last wife named ———? Evans. This will not fit into this record because Abigail Johnson did not die until 1848, and at Canton, N. Y., where it seems probable her son lived. But, so far as this record is concerned, ———? Evans could have been a first wife and mother of the Luther born at Canterbury, Conn., in 1782.

Also instead of William (471) as father of Col. Luther (4191), other members of the family say it was Calvin or perhaps Gideon, which will not fit this record.

HISTORY

In 1819 emigrated with his father from Va. to Saline Co., Mo. About 1830 left the home farm and moved to Boonville, Cooper Co., Mo., a short distance down the Missouri River. There he apprenticed himself to a cabinet maker and learned that trade. While he was there, Gilbert Stuart, the celebrated portrait painter, came to Boonville to paint the portraits of some of the wealthy residents. Stuart discovered that young George had undeveloped artistic talent and advised him to study. So he studied for a time in St. Louis and soon became sufficiently proficient to earn his way.

Later he studied and painted in Phila. and Washington and spent 1858-9 studying in Düsseldorf, Germany. He became well known as an artist in Missouri. Some of his work was engraved and published. He himself writes that his best known engravings are "Jolly Flat-boatmen," "Stump Speaking," and "The County Election."

He was also prominent in public life. He was originally an old time Whig and represented Saline Co. in the Missouri State Legislature before the war (1861-5). Though strongly attached

to the South for family and other reasons, he was an uncompromising opponent of Secession and a staunch Union man.

He was a Capt. of U. S. Volunteers, 1861-2.

He was Treasurer of the State of Missouri in 1862, during Lincoln's administration.

He opposed the reconstruction methods of the Republican Party after the Civil War and with Gen. Frank P. Blair and others, joined the Democratic Party.

In 1865 lived at Independence, Jackson Co., Mo.

In 1874-6 was Adjutant-General, State of Mo.

In 1879 (year of his death) was a member of the faculty of the Mo. State University and at the head of the Dept. of Art.

Suggestion for Search of Origin of Philadelphia Binghams.

The Annual Genealogical and Biographical Record says "In a list of persons who purchased land from John Fenwick or William Penn and settled on the tract of the West Jersey Society were the names of *John Bingham* and *Mary*, his wife, who came from London. This Bingham was a goldsmith."

PHILADELPHIA BINGHAMS OF REVOLUTIONARY TIMES

"The Historic Mansions and Buildings of Philadelphia" by Thompson Westcott, Phila., Porter & Coates, 1877, gives a very interesting history of this truly distinguished American family, from which the following main facts are taken:

p. 337—James Bingham died in 1714, leaving considerable landed property. He was a blacksmith (it is also said, a saddler) p. 349, and was buried at Christ Church, Phila., Dec. 22, 1714.

James, his son, added to the possessions of the family by marrying a daughter of William Budd, of Burlington, N. J.

William, his son (3d gen.), added still more by marrying, in 1745, Mary, daughter of Alderman and Mayor John Stamper. (Living kinsfolk say this William had only one brother who died unmarried, March, 1900.)

William, of Lansdowne, his son (4th gen.), had two brothers who both died unmarried, according to kinsfolk living in March, 1900. This William was born at Phila., April 8, 1752. Graduated at the College of Philadelphia in 1768. Was British consul at St. Pierre Myzern in the West Indies, where he amassed great wealth. Later he was agent of the Continental Congress at Martinique for some years.

In 1786 he was elected member of the Congress of the Confederation and served until 1789.

In 1789 he was captain of a troop of dragoons and escorted Mrs. Washington on her journey to New York to join her husband, then President-elect.

In 1790 he was elected member of the General Assembly of Penna, and chosen Speaker.

In 1795 he was U. S. Senator from Penna, and held that office until 1801.

Ben Perley Poore, in his "Official Register and Congressional Directory," 1776-1878, says he was born in 1751. Was elected President-pro-tem. of the U. S. Senate, Feb. 16, 1797. Published in 1784 "A letter from an American on the Subject of

the Restraining Proclamation" and in 1793 "A Description of Certain Tracts of Land in Maine" from which it may be inferred that he was the owner of the great "Bingham Grant" of, it is said, one million acres in that State.

The compiler of this book was personally informed, in 1900, by U. S. Senator Eugene Hale of Maine, that this grant of one million acres was made and that his (Hale's) law firm had then only recently sold off the last of it for the family, then practically represented by Baring Bros., bankers, of London. There is a town of Bingham, Me., on this grant.

It is also a fact that Binghamton, N. Y., was founded on land belonging to this William Bingham and named after him.

Resuming Westcott's story:

Upon his return from the West Indies, William Bingham married the beautiful Ann Willing, daughter of Thomas W. Willing, Oct. 26, 1780. They made a visit to Europe and were accorded special distinction at various Courts, where they were intimate friends of the American Ministers, 1784-86. Mrs. Bingham is specially and frequently mentioned in letters from Mrs. (John) Adams and others as admired for her brilliant social qualities.

This Mr. and Mrs. Bingham were very intimate with all the leaders of the new American Republic, including the Washingtons. It was they who persuaded Washington to sit to Stuart, and they presented a Stuart portrait of Washington to the Marquis of Lansdowne, who was a friend of the Willing family.

They lived in a great deal of style outside of Philadelphia, at a place called "Lansdowne," now part of Fairmount Park. The historic house has, however, been torn down and its site is no longer known.

Mrs. Ann (Willing) Bingham died in Bermuda May 11, 1801, aged 37. (Providence, R. I., Gazette, says she died Jan. 6, 1801.) Mr. Bingham went to Europe shortly afterwards and died at Bath, England, in 1804. He is buried in Bath Cathedral where there is a tablet to his memory. This was

copied June 2, 1899, by Mary V. H——— for Mrs. Marie (Bingham) Wasson, as follows:

To The Honorable William Bingham a Native and Senator of The United States of America where

His knowledge of the interests of his country
And his zeal for their advancement
The marks of patriotism

Will be long and gratefully

This couple had three children:

- 1. Ann Louisa, who married Hon. Alex. Baring, son of Sir Francis, at Belleview, N. J., Aug. 23, or Sept. 8, 1798.
- 2. Marie Matilda, who eloped April 11, 1799, with James Alex., Count de Tilly, and was married April 27, 1799. She m. 2d, Henry Baring, and 3d, Marquis de Blaisell.
- 3. William, who had a grandson, also named William, born in 1858. The family had a home at Oceanic, N. J., called "Bingham Place" where Lord Ashburton "courted" Miss Bingham. (Authority, Dr. John E. Parmly, Oceanic, N. J., 1900, and Dr. Thos. E. Ridgway, Washington, D. C.)

Nothing appears to be known, or at least published, regarding the antecedents of the progenitor of this family, James Bingham, the blacksmith or saddler or goldsmith, who died in 1714, and was buried in Christ Church, Phila. Search in the Penna. Hist. Society at Philadelphia revealed nothing.

For pedigree of Gen. Henry H. Bingham, of Phila., see under Irish descent.

Extract from "Lippincott's Magazine" for July, 1899, p. 92,

"The Salon in Old Philadelphia," by Anne Hollingsworth Wharton.

A salon, less distinctly intellectual than than of Mrs. Ferguson, but full of grace and charm, was later held in the elegant drawing-room of Mrs. William Bingham. Young, beautiful, highly connected and possessed of large wealth, Mrs. Bingham entertained in her fine mansion on Third Street above Spruce, or at her country-seat, Lansdowne, in a style which had never been equalled in Philadelphia or perhaps in the Colonies. Mrs. Bingham was a daughter of Mr. Thomas Willing, of the firm of Willing and Morris, who, in connection with his partner, Robert Morris, did good service to the patriot cause by advancing money for the use of the army and in inspiring others with confidence to follow their example. William Bingham, Mr. Willing's son-in-law, upon one occasion subscribed five thousand pounds to the Bank of Pennsylvania for the purpose of supplying the army of the United States with provisions for two months; and this in one of the darkest hours of the struggle for liberty. This subscription was made near the time of Mr. Bingham's marriage and may have been given as a thank-offering in consequence of his great happiness in having won for his bride lovely sixteen-year-old Anne Willing.

In 1784 Mr. and Mrs. Bingham visited London and Paris, in both of which cities the American beauty was greatly admired; and Mr. Bingham, being possessed of social tastes as well as distinguished ability, made many friends abroad, some of whom visited the Binghams in their own home. Among their English friends was the Marquis of Lansdowne, after whom the Binghams named their beautiful country-seat upon the west bank of the Schuylkill; and for him Mrs. Bingham had a full-length portrait of President Washington painted by Stuart.

Of Mrs. Bingham herself Gilbert Stuart painted more than one portrait. An attractive, girlish picture of the young wife and mother, with her children around her, is to be found upon a huge unfinished canvas of Stuart's which was probably in-

tended to adorn a large wall-space at Lansdowne. Mr. Bingham's horse has been brought to the door and he stands ready to mount it, while his wife playfully holds her infant son upon the horse's back. An older child, probably Anne Louisa, who married the Hon. Alex. Baring, stands at one side watching the group. This picture was for many years in the possession of Miss Mary Clymer in Trenton, N. J., and at her death became the property of Countess de Bryas, a great-niece of Mrs. Bingham.

President Washington was a frequent visitor at the Binghams', his official and unofficial relations with Mr. Bingham, who was United States Senator, being of the most friendly nature.

In addition to the elegance of her entertainments and the grace and charm of her own personality, Mrs. Bingham's family connections placed her in a position to draw around her the best and brightest elements in the life of the republican capital, while all strangers of distinction found their way to Mrs. Bingham's drawing-room by natural attraction.

Major William Jackson, who was aide-de-camp and private secretary to President Washington, married Mrs. Bingham's sister, Elizabeth. The wedding of Elizabeth Willing in her father's house, at the south-west corner of Third Street and Willing's Alley, was one of the brilliant social functions of the Washington administration. Mrs. Bingham acted the part of a mother to her younger sister; and assisted her father in receiving such honored wedding guests as President and Lady Washington, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Morris, Alexander Hamilton, General Knox, General Lincoln, a warm personal friend of the groom, and the Vicomte de Noailles, the brother-in-law of Lafayette.

Major and Mrs. Jackson naturally added much to the attractions of Mrs. Bingham's entertainments, as did her sisters, Mrs. Henry Clymer and Dorothy and Abigail Willing. Abigail, the youngest of Mr. Willing's daughters, was greatly admired by Louis Philippe, Duke of Orleans and afterwards King of the French. This young nobleman, during his residence in

Philadelphia, was a frequent guest at the Willings' and Binghams', where he saw Miss Willing surrounded by all the charm of social and domestic life. It is said that when the Duke of Orleans made his request for the hand of the youngest daughter of the house, Mr. Willing replied, with true republicanism, yet with the tact and grace of a courtier: "Should you ever be restored to your hereditary position, you will be too great a match for her; if not, she is too great a match for you."

Instead of the questionable fortune of marrying a future King of France, there was reserved for Abigail Willing the more serene if less eventful career of becoming the wife of a Philadelphia lawyer. In 1804 Miss Willing married Richard Peters, who was for many years reporter to the U. S. Supreme Court.

In speaking of Mrs. Bingham as a social leader, Mr. Griswold said: "Her entertainments were distinguished not more for their superior style and frequency than for the happy and discreet selection of her guests." Grace, charm and refinement seem to have marked Mrs. Bingham's social career; and she was admired, fêted and caressed wherever she appeared. The Marquis de Chastellux, writing of an entertainment in Philadelphia, said: "The Count de Dumas had Mrs. Bingham for his partner; and the Vicomte de Noailles, Mrs. Shippen. Both of them, like true philosophers, testified a great respect for the manners of the country by not quitting their handsome partners the whole evening."

Flattered, admired and sought after, it is not strange that Mrs. Bingham should at times have been arbitrary and even captious. When Thomas Wignell opened the Chestnut Street Theatre, Mrs. Bingham offered to take one of the private boxes "at any price to be fixed by the manager"; and to decorate and furnish the box herself, provided she was to keep the key and no person be allowed to enter the box without her consent.

The proposition was certainly a complex one to a manager entering upon what then seemed a large financial venture. Mr. Wignell was sorely tempted. He recognized all the advantages to his theatre that would result from having one of his boxes

used by so great a social favorite and leader of fashion as Mrs. Bingham. But, on the other hand, he clearly realized, says Thomas Wood, that he must act "on the principles of his country's government and on the recognition of feelings deeply pervading the structure of its society; to hold all men free to come into his house and equal while they continued to be there and to behave themselves in it." In consideration of this democratic view of the situation Mr. Wignell, politely and with many expressions of gratitude for her consideration, declined Mrs. Bingham's offer and thus forfeited the patronage of the most influential woman in Philadelphia.

Mrs. Bingham, who was not used to denials, seldom, some persons say never, entered the Philadelphia Theatre. It is interesting to learn that its success justified its manager's policy; and that the haughty beauty in the end suffered more than the manager, as many interesting representations were given at this theatre, and by such stars as Mrs. Oldmixen, Mrs. Whitlock, Mrs. Morris, Mrs. Marshall, Mrs. Kemble, etc.

The Binghams in America of immediate Irish descent seem to come from two sources:

1. From near Belfast, County Down, in the northeastern part of Ireland. These seem to be all "Protestants" and some of them were rebels against the English government.

There was at Belfast, about 1650, a certain Col. Nicolas Bingham, of whom Cromwell wrote to Ireton, "it is a pity one of that name should be a Malignant." I think he must have belonged to the Sutton (Somerset) line and he was evidently a royalist. (See "Memoirs of the Binghams," London, 1915, Spottiswoode.)

2. From County Mayo, in the northwestern part of Ireland.

These belong to the Sutton-Somerset and Bingham-Melcombe (Dorset) lines.



It appears that several brothers came to the United States, in or about 1793, from County Down, Ireland. Col. Robert Bingham, Principal of the celebrated "Bingham School" at Asheville, N. C. (whose brother, William, wrote "Bingham's Latin Grammar"), says that one of these brothers settled in New York, another in Tennessee, and another, his own ancestor, in Wilmington, N. C., where he established the now famous school, since removed to Asheville.

One of the Alabama Binghams says (Jan., 1899) that some or all of these brothers settled in N. Y. City, in the carriage business, in which they failed. That Samuel remained in New York; but that two, at least, of the brothers went to Phila.

The names of these brothers appear to have been, order of age unknown:

A-William, B-Thomas, C-Samuel, D-Joseph.

The following would make it appear that three of the names should be:

James, Jr., John and Robert.

Major W. B. Lynch, son of (A1), living in Sanford, Fla., in March, 1893, says:

"My great-grandfather, James Bingham, was Scotch-Irish and lived near Londonderry in North Ireland. His eldest son succeeded to his estate.

"My grandfather, Rev. William Bingham (A), was born about 1753, and emigrated to America soon after the American Revolution. His brothers, except the eldest, were taught trades and had difficulty in leaving King George's realm, on account of a law forbidding any tradesman from leaving the country. One of them, James, Jr., was barreled up and shipped on board an American bound vessel as hardware and released from his confinement after the vessel had reached the three-league limit

from the shore. The other brothers—three, I think, though I recall only John and Robert—soon followed. There were others of the same family, children of the brother of my great-grandfather James, who also came. One family settled in New York, a second in Penna., and a third in East Tennessee."

The Binghams of "Bingham School," Asheville, N. C.

BINGHAMS IN THE UNITED STATES FROM COUNTY MAYO, IRELAND INCLUDING

HON. JOHN A. BINGHAM, OF CADIZ, OHIO

There seems to be little doubt that two brothers, named Hugh and Robert, did come from County Mayo, Ireland, to America in or about 1736; and that they probably first settled in Adams Co., Penna.

Mrs. Marie (Bingham) Wasson, of Cranford, N. J. in 1916, dau. of Hon. John A. Bingham, of Cadiz, Ohio, gives the following account of their origin.

This account is believed to be correct in the main, but there are serious errors of detail.

Reference should be made to "Memoirs of the Binghams" by Rose McCalmont, Spottiswoode, London, 1915.

Hutchin's History of Dorset, Vol. IV, p. 374, gives pedigree of the Melcombe-Bingham family of Dorset, England. There will be found Sir Henry Bingham, b. 1573, of Castlebar, Co. Mayo (in Northwest of Ireland), created baronet, 1596, when 23 years of age; was ancestor of the Earls of Lucan.

Mrs. Wasson says this Sir Henry was appointed in the 17th century, Governor General of the province of Connaught and Lord of the Barony of Erris. Also that there is, in Co. Mayo, a village named Binghamton, near which is Bingham Castle, a seat of this Sir Henry, who, she says, was distinguished at Cromwell's siege of Londonderry. She also says

The family of Richard Bingham, descendant of Sir Henry (requires proof), became separated in the 18th century; the eldest son succeeding to the family estates, while the younger sons, Hugh and Robert (requires proof), went to America about 1736 and settled on the historical (where?) plantation Manor of Maske, along Marsh Creek, in "Old York," now Adams Co., Penna., in the valley of the Susquehanna. This was the ground on which the second line was formed (Union) at the battle of Gettysburg.

Here the descendants of *Hugh and Robert* lived for more than 150 years (1736-1886?).

"The History of Washington Co., Md." says this Hugh was born in County Down, Ireland. But one of Hugh's descendants, George G. Bingham, who lived in 1901 at Weverton, Washington Co., Md., says that Hugh came from County Mayo.

Such history as I have been able to gather about this Hugh comes from (1) Mr. George G. Bingham, and (2) Mrs. Marie (Bingham) Wasson, as above said, and these accounts differ absolutely. I can only give them as they were given to me.

But my experience in these matters leads me to believe that any one interested can easily find out a great deal about this branch, by searching the records of Adams Co., Pa., and of Weverton and Baltimore, Md.

He was educated in the district school and village academy. Entered the village printing office and learned the business from "printer's devil" to assistant editor, remaining two years.

Entered Franklin College, O., but did not graduate, owing to ill health. Studied law. Admitted to the Ohio bar in 1840. District Attorney for Tuscarawas Co., O., 1846-9. Delegate to the national Whig conventions at Pittsburgh and Phila., Pa., in 1848.

Elected as a Republican to 34th Congress in 1854 and reelected to 35th, 36th and 37th Congress.

In 37th Cong. was chairman of the House managers in the impeachment of West W. Humphrey, U. S. District Judge in Tennessee, for high treason, May 22, 1862.

In 1862 failed of re-election to Congress and was appointed by Pres. Lincoln U. S. District Judge for the Southern District of Florida. Declined. Pres. Lincoln then appointed him Major and Judge Advocate in the army, and shortly after as Solicitor in the Court of Claims.

He was of counsel for the prosecution in the court-martial of Surgeon-General William A. Hammond, U. S. Army, in 1864.

Served as special judge advocate in the trial of Mrs. Surratt and others charged with conspiracy in the assassination of Lincoln, and made the argument in reply to counsel for the accused, June 27, 1865, at Washington.

In 1864 was re-elected to the 39th Cong. and later to the 40th, 41st and 42nd Cong.

In the 40th Cong. was chairman of the House managers in the impeachment of Pres. Andrew Johnson.

He wrote and introduced the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

May 3rd, 1873, appointed by Pres. Grant to be Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Japan. He held this position until April 2nd, 1885, having become, by twelve years service, Dean of the Diplomatic Corps.

Mrs. Wasson relates the following:

During the stormy days after the war (1861-5), while John A. Bingham was a member of Congress, the city of Washington was visited by certain distinguished Englishmen, among whom was Mr. Dunbar, a connection of Lord Bingham, head of the Irish family of that name. Lord Bingham had heard of Hon. John A. Bingham, the American, and of his career. He sent by Mr. Dunbar a copy of the ancient coat of arms of the Bingham family in Ireland, for presentation, with greeting to his American kinsman.

Mr. Dunbar visited the House of Representatives and came in while John A. Bingham was making his great speech on the reconstruction of the Union. Greatly attracted and interested, Mr. Dunbar naturally asked the name of the speaker and learned with surprise and pleasure that it was the very man for whom he had a message and gift from over the water.

When Mr. Dunbar returned and related his experience to Lord Bingham, the latter sent over an old autograph petition, with a printed copy of the same, made by their common ancestor, Sir Henry Bingham, to the Queen of England.

Mrs. Wasson also writes:

John A. Bingham is descended on the maternal side from the Scotch families of Duncan, Bailey, Stuart and Armor.

Margaret Duncan, his gr. grandmother (or grandmother), came from Scotland or Ireland to America in her youth. The ship was in great danger from a storm and if preserved she vowed to build a church. This was done and it still stands on Race St., near 16th, in old Phila. A marble tablet in the wall tells the story. It is known as the First United Presby. Church. She became later a friend of Washington and furnished supplies to the army at Valley Forge, the accounts for which were personally audited and approved by Washington.

John A. Bingham had a maternal grandfather, William Bailey, who was 2nd Lieut., Independent Light Inf., First Battalion, York Co., Pa., of the militia of Dec., 1775. The original constitution of this company is still on file in "Old York," Pa.
