The earliest record of a Crosby Family which I have found is in "Simon Crosby the Emigrant," by Eleanor Davis Crosby, Boston, Ellis Co., 1914. The record there goes back to John Crosby who was born in England in 1440. The compilation of early Crosbys was made by a professional genealogist, so it may be correct.

We will follow the record of Eleanor Davis Crosby in numbering the generations up from John 1 Crosby, 1440-1502.

Miles 2 Crosby about 1483-

Thomas 3 Crosby " 1510-1558

Anthony 4 Crosby " 1545-1599

Thomas 5 Crosby " 1575-May 6, 1661. Born at Holme-on-Spalding, England; died at Rowley, Mass. He came to New England in 1640, five years after his son, Simon 6 Crosby.

Simon 6 Crosby, 1608-Sept. 1639/40. born at Holme-on-Spalding Moor, County York, England; died at Cambridge, Mass. Usually spoken of as Simon Crosby, the Emigrant. Sailed from London in the ship, Susan and Ellyn, Apr. 18, 1635, and landed in Boston in July, 1635. With him came his wife, Anne Brigham, 1606-Oct. 11, 1675, whom he had married at Holme-on-Spalding Moor, Apr. 21, 1634, and the first of his three children, Thomas 7 Crosby, born at

Holme-on-Spalding Feb. 23, 1635, died June 11, 1702, at Boston, Mass. This Thomas 7 is the ancestor of our Crosby line, having left England at the age of eight weeks. Two other children of Simon 6 Crosby and Anne Brigham, Simon 7 Crosby, 1637-1725/6, and Joseph 7 Crosby, 1638/9-1695, do not concern us in this record. Their genealogies have been published, "A Crosby Family: Josiah Crosby, Sarah Firch, and Their Descendants," by their grandson, Nathan Crosby, of Lowell, Mass. Lowell, Mass., Stone, Huse & Co., 1877, and "The Crosby Family of New York," by Ernest Howard Crosby, published in The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record, October, 1898, and January, April and July, 1899.

Thomas 7 Crosby, born at Holme-on-Spalding, Feb. 23, 1635, was brought to Boston in 1635, and graduated from Harvard College in 1653. Two years later he was engaged by the church in Eastham, Mass. to conduct public services on Lord's Day. He was a "religious teacher," not a pastor; this difference carries a nice distinction. He filled the position for fifteen years, although he never was ordained as a minister. Subsequently he became a merchant in Harwich, Mass. and wrote several religious books. He died at Boston, Mass. on June 11, 1702. Thomas 7 Crosby and his wife, Sarah(Maiden name unknown) were the parents of

twelve children. Their first born, Thomas 8 Crosby, is the ancestor of this Crosby line.

Thomas 8 Crosby, born at Brewster, Mass. on Apr. 7, 1663, died May 21, 1731, married about 1700, to Hannah(Maiden name unknown), born 1671, and died Jan. 8, 1728/9. They had five children, the third child, Thomas 9 Crosby, being our ancestor. "The Barnstable Probate," vol. 5, p. 377, vol. 5, p. 187, says, in regard to a settlement of the Estate of Thomas Crosby, who had made no will, "Agreement 21 May, 1731, between Thomas Crosby and Edward Crosby, yeomen and Sarah, Hannah and Abigail Crosby, spinsters, all of Harwich being all the children of Thomas Crosby late of Harwich, yeoman, deceased, decide agreeable.....to give Thomas and Edward Crosby all the Real Estate both lands and meadows to be divided equally between them,together with all goods and chatels except such as belonged to our late mother, (whose) wearing apparell is to be divided between the three daughters."

Thomas 9 Crosby, born at Brewster, Mass., baptised Aug. 19, 1705, immigrated with relatives to Putnam County, N. Y., where he died at North East, on Dec. 13, 1781. "The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record," vol. 18, says, "Between the years 1740 and 1755, quite an extensive

colony of families from Cape Cod settled in the eastern part of what is now Putnam County (formerly Dutchess), New York. Among these settlers was Thomas Crosby who came from Barnstable Co., Mass., in 1753, and settled on a farm in the present village of Carmel. The Drew Female Seminary and the old Gilead Burying Ground are on this farm. The fact that Mr. Crosby from a state of comparative affluence became suddenly reduced to poverty may be thus explained. Many of the first settlers took up farms under title from the Indians, and did not recognize the claims of the Philipse family, who were the owners of the patent granted to Adolph Philipse in 1697. Such settlers were afterwards ejected from their farms, and Thomas Crosby was probably one of them. In 1766, this same farm was granted by a perpetual lease by Frederick Philipse to James Dickerson, and it is described as 'formerly in possession of Thomas Crosby.'

Thomas 9 Crosby, 1705-1781, married on Aug. 9, 1733, Elizabeth Hopkins, born Apr. 21, 1711, died Aug. 6, 1801. Elizabeth was a daughter of Nathaniel Hopkins and Nancy Mayo. Nathaniel Hopkins was a son of Stephen Hopkins, a grandson of Gyles Hopkins, and a great-grandson of Stephen Hopkins who landed at Plymouth from "The Mayflower" in 1620. The Mayflower line was been established and accepted, so

all the descendants from Thomas 9 Crosby and Elizabeth Hopkins are potential members of the Mayflower Society.

Children of Thomas 9 Crosby, 1705-1781, and Elizabeth Hopkins, 1711-1801.

Of these eight children, Enoch 10 Crosby is famous. His history is briefly told in "A History of Danbury, Conn., 1684-1896," by J. M. Bailey. New York, Burr Printing House, 1896. Page 103 is titled "A Danbury Spy." "Enoch Crosby, who is generally believed to have been the original of "Harvey Birch," the hero of Cooper's famous novel, "The Spy," was born in Harwich, Mass., on Jan. 4, 1750. He was the son of Thomas and Elizabeth Crosby, who moved to Putnam Co., N. Y., when Enoch was three years old. About 1766 the family by misfortune was reduced from comfort to poverty and Enoch left home to depend upon his own exertions for

support, with a scanty supply of clothes, a few shillings in money, and a small Bible. He became apprentice to a shoemaker in Kent, and faithfully served his term of service, which ended Jan. 4, 1771, his twenty-first birthday."

Page 56, "Danbury in the Revolution." "Noble Benedict, a resident of the town, aglow with patriotic fervor, started to raise a company of soldiers. Many enlisted and the company was organized with Mr. Benedict as captain. The first man to respond to his call was Enoch Crosby, a shoemaker. He subsequently became locally famous as a spy, operating in Putnam and Dutchess Co., N. Y., where were a number of Tory organizations. He was instrumental in the capture of several companies of these enemies of the government."

Page 115, "After the Revolution Enoch Crosby and his brother Benjamin purchased from the Commissioners of Fortfeiture a farm of 256 acres in the village of Southeast, where he lived during the remainder of his life. For many years he was Justice of the Peace, was one of the Associated Judges of Common Pleas in 1812-13, and supervisor of Southeast during those years. He was a deacon in the old Gilead Church and a worthy member till the day of his death. In person he was tall, being six feet in heighth and rather slender. His tombstone, near the northeast corner of the

old Gilead burying-ground, bears the following inscription:

In Memory of
Enoch Crosby
who died
June 26, 1835
age 85 y, 5 m,
21 d.

Thomas LO Crosby, born Feb. 3, 1752, in Brewster, Mass., was taken at the age of one year by his parents to Putnam Co., N. Y. In 1766 the family lost its farm, as previously explained. About the time of the outbreak of the American Revolution, Thomas and his wife, Rebecca Bishop, according to family tradition, settled near Meridan Conn. Within a short time they immigrated to the eastern section of Delaware County, N. Y., Town of Middletown, near the present hamlet of Kelly's Corners. The reason for this move can only be conjectured. A fire destroyed the town hall at Brewster, Putnam Co., N. Y., sometime before 1773, and all the early records of the town were destroyed. Perhaps Thomas decided to settle in new territory where his land was not likely to be taken from him. Perhaps he was a pacifist or a Tory sympathizer. Rather than take part in the bloody struggle, he secreted himself away in the Catskill

Mountains, away from his brother, Enoch Crosby, "The Spy." There, in that almost uninhabited section, he was harmless and safe from war as he farmed the stony hillsides and fathered thirteen children.

Will of Thomas 10 Crosby, 1826.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Thomas Crosby, of the Town of Middletown, County of Delaware and State of New York, being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, (that is to say):

First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rebecca one cow, two beds, one table, six chairs, also necessary cooking utensils, and other necessary household furniture for her comfort. I do also give and devise unto my wife one third of my real estate lands, and tenaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, until her decease.

I order firstly that all my debts be paid out of my personal property. I do give and bequeath unto my two sons, Hopkins and Charles, the sum of one dollar each. I do also give and bequeath unto my six other sons, Elisha, Parker, Thomas, Jeremiah, James, and Benjamin L. Crosby, and also give and bequeath unto my four daughters, Lucinia Fuller, Sabre Jones, Rebecca Ellis, and Betsy Jewett, all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal estate, goods, chattels of whatsoever kind, or nature, to be divided equally between them, that is each one to have one tenth. I do further give and devise unto my six sons, Elisha, Parker, Thomas, Jeremiah, James and Benjamin L. Crosby,

and also give and devise unto my four daughters, Lucinia Fuller, Sabre Jones, Rebecca Ellis and Betsy Fuller, all my messuages, lands or tenaments, with all the appurtenances belonging thereunto to be equally divided between them, that is each one to have one tenth, to their assigns forever.

I also further give and bequeath unto Emeline and Angeline Crosby, daughters of Charles Crosby, one hundred dollars, that is fifty dollars each, to be paid after the decease of my wife, out of the third part of the real estate. I do further give and devise unto my six sons, after the decease of my wife, Rebecca, that is my sons Elisha, Parker, Thomas, Jeremiah, James and Benjamin L. Crosby, the rest, residue and remainder of the estate of my wife, that is her third, after the one hundred dollars shall be paid to Emeline and Angeline Crosby, that is fifty dollars each, which I give and devise unto my six sons after the decease of my wife to be equally divided between them that is each one to have one sixth, their heirs and assigns forever.

I hereby appoint Thomas and Benjamin L. Crosby as Executors of this my last will and testament, thereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty six.

Thomas Crosby (L. S.)

Signed, sealed, published, and declared by the above named Thomas Crosby to be his last will and testament in presence of us, who have hereunto subscribed our names as the witnesses in the presence of the Testator.

Codicil

.....I do revoke and hereby make void so much of my said will as provides for giving to my son Jeremiah, any part or portion of my estate, both real and personal, and in lieu and instead thereof, I give and bequeath unto my said son, Jeremiah, one dollar. And further, all the part and portion of my said estate, which I had in my said will, given to my said son Jeremiah, I hereby give, bequeath and devise, both real and personal, to my son-in-law, David Jewett, of Adams in the State of Indiana and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In witness thereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the nineteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two.

What happened to Jeremiah? Why did the father, at the age of eighty, cut off a son who was only thirty-seven? Jeremiah had gone west to Indiana, perhaps against the

father's wishes, but there too had gone Elizabeth, married to David Jewett.

Thomas 10 Crosby died on Aug. 4, 1833, aged 81, and his wife, Rebecca Bishop, died on March 8, 1834, aged 79. They are buried in the "Dimick" cemetery at Arkville, Delaware Co., N. Y. Their stones are in the center of the cemetery, about three rows up from the highway.

In our records we have the names and dates of the children of Thomas 10 Crosby. Only those of our ancestor, Benjamin Lewis 11 Crosby will be given in detail. Brief mention will be made of the other children.

Elisha 11 Crosby, born Sept. 16, 1774. We have no record, although he was still living when his father made his will in 1826.

Lucinia 11 Crosby, Feb. 10, 1777-Jan. 3, 1857, married John Fuller, and had Cyrus 12, Elizabeth Marie 12, Lewis 12, Sally 12 and Susan 12. Elizabeth Marie 12, known as Betsy M. 12 Fuller, born Dec. 26, 1816, died Mar. 10, 1911, married Oct. 1838, John Theodore Bouton, born Feb. 19, 1817, and died June 18, 1886. They had Samantha 13, Ester 13, and Burrett Beebe 13 Bouton. The last named, born Dec. 4, 1847, died in 1891, married Elizabeth K. Frisbee, died June 1, 1931,

and had Arthur F. 14, Anna 14, and John Frisbee 14 Bouton. Arthur F. 14 Bouton, born July 1, 1872, a lawyer in Roxbury, was for many years a State Senator from Delaware County. John Frisbee 14 Bouton, born June 4, 1881, died Feb. 12, 1942, married Nov. 12, 1902 Minnie Hammond, and had Burrett B. 15 Bouton, who, in 1943, was Superintendent of the Howe School, at Cedar Lake, Howe, Indiana.

Sabrie 11 Crosby, Dec. 2, 1778-Dec. 2, 1868, married Jonathan Jones, and had Sally 12 Jones; Sally married Isaac Brown, and had Bethiah 13 Brown, May 16, 1840-Nov. 8, 1925. Bethiah 13 Brown married David 12 Crosby, July 4, 1828-July 15, 1907. David 12 was a son of Benjamin Lewis 11 Crosby, under whose record on the following pages complete data are given.

Parker 11 Crosby, Nov. 10, 1780-Jan. 15, 1867, married Rebecca Carroll of Roxbury, N. Y., Jan. 27, 1791-Sept. 17, 1871. They had five children, Pauline 12, Smith 12, Orin 12, Lucania 12, and Marila 12 Crosby, and many grandchildren.

Hopkins 11 Crosby, Mar. 3, 1783-Feb. 25, 1866, married Elizabeth Wood. They had twelve children, some born in New York State and some born after the family moved to Indiana. Descendants are the Pullings of Stamford, Conn., the Crosbys of Delhi, Pine Hill and Livingston, N. Y., Leon Meaker of

Chicago, the Woolhiser family of Freeport, Ill., Whitewater, Wis., and of Catskill, N. Y., and the Heath family of Windfall, Indiana.

Susanah 11 Crosby, born Jan. 18, 1785, apparently never married. We find no date of death, and she is not mentioned in her father's will of 1826.

Elizabeth 11 Crosby, born Jan. 18, 1786, married David Jewett, moved to Adams, Indiana, and had Elizabeth 12 Jewett. She married Samuel Shelborn, and their descendants are still living in Indiana as the Shelborn, Rice, Luts, Selby, Evans, Deem, Towns, Deputy, Yoke, Allen, Roberts, Brown, Shouse, Hall, and Bond families.

James 11 Crosby, Mar. 10, 1789-July 20, 1843, married Lucretia Fuller, Dec. 1, 1799-Apr. 14, 1875. They had five children, of whom the fourth, Abel Adams 12 Crosby, Aug. 24, 1832-Feb. 28, 1913, married Abbie Church More, and had three children. Of these Sarah Adams 13 Crosby, Dec. 31, 1865-Feb. 8, 1924, was a noted violinist, and William Chauncey 13 Crosby, born Nov. 7, 1868, was President of the Questover Spring Water Co., of More's Mills, Dutchess Co., N. Y.

Charles 11 Crosby, Feb. 23, 1791-1871, married Emily Hendricks, and had two daughters, Emeline 12 and Angeline 12, who were mentioned in Thomas 10 Crosby's will in 1826. Their descendants by the names of Hendricks, Hammond, Dowles,

McCall, Austin, Morse, Knapp, Smith, and Woehlie still live in Delaware and Otsego Counties, N. Y.

Thomas 11 Crosby, born Apr. 25, 1793, married Amy Sanford and had nine children. Their descendants are the Travis family of Delaware Co., Dr. Earl Lyon of Bridgeton, N. J., Dr. Julian Lyon of Philadelphia, the Thompson, Youngdahl families of California and the Markey family of Miami, Florida.

Jeremiah 11 Crosby, born Sept. 18, 1795, married Rebecca Kelly, moved to Lawrence, Indiana, and had five children.

Rebecca 11 Crosby, born July 3, 1800, married Gustus Ellis, and lived in Wilder, Indiana.

Benjamin Lewis 11 Crosby

Born Dec. 8, 1797, died Apr. 2, 1893, married for his first wife on Jan. 6, 1818, Huldah Hull, a daughter of Elijah and Rebecca Stiltson Hull. She was born on Jan. 1, 1799, and died on Feb. 26, 1842. On March 5, 1830 the family moved from Hubble Hill, near Kelly's Corners, Delaware Co., N. Y. to Halcott Center, Greene Co., N. Y., a distance of about ten miles. The parents already had five children. and five more were to be born in their new home. The first house they occupied was about one-half mile east of the

Center, on a farm now, in 1954, owned by Myron Morse. Shortly thereafter the family moved about one-quarter of a mile nearer the Center, into a stone house which had been built in 1824. For many years the homestead was occupied by Benjamin L.'s grandson, Wallace 13 Crosby.

After the first wife died, the father of the ten children married in 1842 Elizabeth Dickson, of Arena, N. Y. There were no more children. You would think that Elizabeth must have had her hands full bringing up ten children, the oldest of which was twenty-two. But the compiler of this record has three woolen blankets, home dyed, spun and loomed, which Elizabeth made in her spare time.

Many stories are told about Benjamin Lewis 11 Crosby, the patriarch of Halcott Center. He owned and worked a farm of 999 acres. He was apparently a sharp observer. One day he found one of his fine horses had been barbered of mane and tail. He suspected one of his neighbors. On going to call on the man, Benjamin examined the suspect's clothing carefully and picked off the coat some horse hairs which had been cut from Benjamin's horse. The man was arrested, tried and convicted.

In his later years, he lived to the age of 96, he became childish, would run away from home whenever he had the opportunity, and start down the road for Griffin Corners.

about three miles away. One of his sons or grandsons would hitch up a horse and wagon, overtake him, and invite him to ride down to The Corners. The old man would not get into the wagon if it was headed toward home. But once in, the wagon and horse would be turned around and the runaway taken home.

Near the end of his days, his oldest daughter, Lavina 12 Crosby, went to call on him. She was then over seventy, and being the oldest daughter whose help was needed in bringing up the motherless children, she had never married. Her father said, "Lavina, isn't it about time you were getting married?" Lavina answered, "Father, are you getting in a hurry?"

When Benjamin Lewis 11 Crosby died at the age of 96, eight of his ten children were still living.

John B. died at the age of 29 of scarlet fever just before induction into the army during the Civil War. His widow ran a millinery shop at Griffin Corners, N. Y. for many years. The record, from its nature, is incomplete; too many descendants already have lost contact with their forefathers because of time and distance. They are scattered from coast to coast. To aid succeeding generations in knowing something of their past, this record has been

compiled. I hope it may aid and interest them in a
vanished period of America's growth.
