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DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM AND BENJAMIN CODDINGTON OF MARYLAND.

1. WILLIAM CODDINGTON (perhaps son of William), (probably brother of Benjamin, Robert, Betsey and Samuel); b. 5 Feb., 1751, probably in New Jersey; d. ~~Oct., 1828~~. A farmer and lived in Cumberland Co., Maryland, where he owned plantation of 300 acres and some slaves. He was a revolutionary soldier. M. (1st) Hannah (perhaps Robison or Robinson), b. 26 Sept., 1754; d. about 1819. M. (2nd) a widow, by whom he had no children. Children:

Maxwell Potter married (2d) Sally, the widow of David, son of Ellis Squier, and had a daughter Sarah Anne Potter who married John Martin and had a son, Edwin Martin. Daniel Potter, 1st, lived at Connecticut Farms. His oldest child was born in 1723. Daniel's father was Samuel Potter, who came from Wales, in England, and was the ancestor of the New Jersey Potters."

BENJAMIN CODDINGTON (probably brother of William, Robert, Betsey and Samuel); b. 10 Nov., 1759; d. 40 Nov., 1834; m. 13 Nov., 1782, Annar Crane, b. 10 June, 1763, d. at age of 80, "of measles"; dau. of Joseph Crane and Ruth Miller. "Joseph Crane (brother of Isaac) came up from Westfield and purchased of Nathaniel Smith, in May, 1764, the farm of 154 acres lying north of Isaac Crane's and west of Benjamin Pettit's farm and extending to the river. He married Ruth Miller, sister of his brother Isaac's wife and had seven sons and four daughters." Benjamin was native of Essex Co., N. J.; was a soldier in Rev. War in Capt. Ogden's Co., First New Jersey Regiment, and wounded at the Battle of Trenton. About 1787 he moved to Monongahela Co., Maryland. Lived on the Braddock road in

MATTER OF RECORD — JULY 24TH, 1910

My grandfather, Benjamin Coddington, was born in the State of New Jersey, Nov. 10th, 1759. He enlisted in Capt. Ogden's Company first New Jersey Regiment during the Revolutionary War, was wounded in the ankle at the battle of Trenton, which wound never permanently healed, which caused him to be a cripple as long as he lived. He married my grandmother (Annar Crane) in October, 1782. Three or four years later he emigrated to Alleghany County, Maryland, where a family of sixteen children were born, (with the exception of the oldest, William, who was born before leaving New Jersey). My grandfather died November 10th, 1834. I think my grandmother about two years later.

My father, William Coddington, was born in the State of New Jersey, April 26th, 1784, and about two years later, with his parents, emigrated to Alleghany County, Maryland, where he grew to manhood. Some time in later part of 1807 he married Naomi Irvin, who lived just over the State line in Penna. In the early Spring of 1808, they emigrated by flatboat down the Monongahela and Ohio Rivers, landing at Cincinnati (then a village of a few log houses). The later part of April, 1808, being of an agricultural mind, he went up the Big Miami River to where the thriving City of Middletown (then an unbroken wilderness) now stands and entered 160 acres of government land. He, in the next four years cleared and got in cultivation about 60 acres. I failed to mention the first thing done after entering the land was to build a round log cabin 16 x 24 ft., with the help of a few neighbors (the nearest living five miles away). The house was completed in three days. He got about four acres in corn that year and that, with the wild game (which was plentiful) constituted the living for the next year. During the next five years three children were born, namely, sisters Annar, Mary and Sarah. In September of 1815, my father was compelled to go in the army. He served under Gen. W. H. H. Harrison, Colonel Finely's Regt., the regiment was mustered in to service at Fort Jefferson (now Dayton, Ohio), and made a campaign in the north part of the State to hold the Indians in check. They had a slight skirmish with them on the Maurnee river near old Fort Defiance. When we consider the difficulties the men

underwent in serving their country at that time, we should feel proud of the memories of such men. My father (and he was only one of many) left his family of wife and three small children, their nearest neighbor being five miles distant. It took stout hearts to undergo these trials. And when we behold the splendid civilization that has followed, we should feel grateful to a divine providence for giving us such fathers and mothers. In about the year 1820, my father sold his claim in Burler County, and bought a similar claim and moved over into Warren County. His land consisted of 160 acres where the town of Hopkinsville now stands. He cleared off 80 acres of this farm, and in a few years he sold again and bought in the same county near a small village called Rossburg. In 1828 his wife died, leaving him with a family of ten children. In about two years he married again, his second wife being Ann Smith of Clearmont County, Ohio. In a little over a year she died, leaving a babe but a few days old, who afterwards became the wife of Jefferson Ireland, who at that time lived in Shelby County, Indiana, but afterwards moved to Boynton Township, Taxewell County, Illinois. In 1831, my father married a third time, his wife being Nancy Price, and the mother of the writer of this sketch. Three children were born to this union, namely Jonathan, Ruth and myself, making in all thirteen children.

My father died, Nov. 11, 1861, while my mother died January 25th, 1877. And now, before closing this ketch, I wish to say of my father, he was a man of mild disposition and in all my recollection, he never had a controversy with any one, always advocated peace. My mother was a grand, good woman, not quite as mild disposition as my father, but a loving and loveable mother. My father and mother both died in the faith of the Baptist Church and now as I am approaching the shades of the evening of life, I fondly cherish the memory of my father and mother and expect to meet them in better land.
