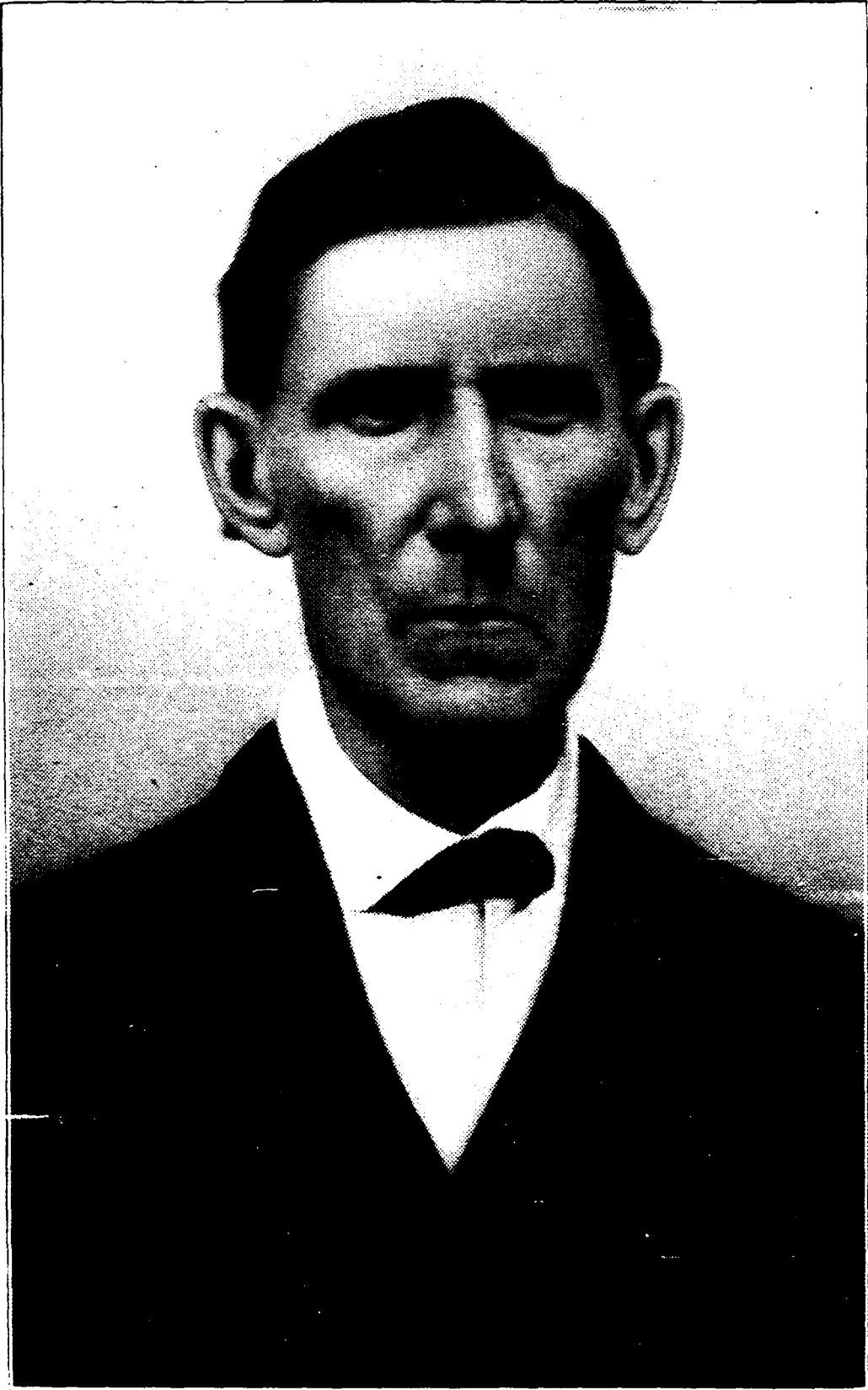

INTRODUCTION

Dear Cousins All :—

It is with pleasure that we present to you this little book. We have tried to make it a complete record of the grandchildren of Rheuben Courtright, but have not quite reached the mark. We have written many letters, hired work done by a genealogist, and searched thru the records in the genealogical department of the State Library at Des Moines, but still we have not obtained all the information we had hoped to get.

We wish to say here, that much credit must be given to Mrs. Josephine Shively of Peoria, Illinois, and Mrs. Emma Bills of Sterling, Illinois, for help given us; if it had not been for their untiring zeal, we never would have been able to finish this record.

Of the twenty-one children of Rheuben Courtright, only three are now living; one never married and four died in infancy. Of the eighty grandchildren, twenty-six are now alive, seven never married, fourteen died young and six never had any children. We have the record of eight pairs of twins. Rheuben had one, one pair is among the grandchildren, three in the great grandchildren, and three among the great-great grandchildren.

We were not able to learn anything authentic in regard to the families of Rheuben Courtright's mother or his father's mother. We found the parents of several Margaret Westfalls and Elizabeth Kools, but, as their connection with the Courtright's could not be established for a certainty, we did not put them in, as we have nothing in this record we do not consider authentic.

We are not perfectly satisfied with the result of our six years' of work on this record, but hope it will please you and that you will prize it more and more as the years pass and remember that each and every one of you will always have a warm place in our hearts for the help you have given us in getting this book ready, as our main object was a selfish one; we wanted it for our own children, great-great grandchildren of Rheuben Courtright.

ORIGIN

In regard to the origin of the name Courtright, Samuel W. Courtright in his book (1907), History of the Courtright Family, claims that they are descended from a Spanish nobleman, Cortez, who was converted to Protestantism under John Calvin, and, on account of the persecutions in Spain, he, with many followers, emigrated to Flanders in Holland and settled on the river Lys, and there they builded a city and named it for their leader, Kortryk, the Dutch way of spelling and pronouncing Cortez. They lived there and prospered for a hundred years or more, then, tiring of the constant warfare on account of their religion, they emigrated to the New Harlaam in America.

On April 16, 1663, Jan or John Bastiansen Kortregt, his three sons and daughter, with their families, together with his brother Micheal and his family, with others, took passage in the good ship Brindled Cow, Jan Bergen, master, and set sail for America.

Altho an exhaustive search has been made, the connection between this first immigrant and Jan, the first ancestor of Rheuben that we have, has not been established.

In the last years of the eighteenth century the name Kortryk was so far Anglecized as to be spelled Kortright. Not much attention was paid to spelling in those days and we find it written in many different ways. After the Revolution it was changed to Courtright, but all Cortrights, Cutrights, Cartrights and Cartwrights are descended from the original Cortez or Kortryk.

HISTORY

In Orange County, New York, at one time the Protestant Dutch Reformed Church was powerful in political affairs. Only magistrates of the church could hold office and the Lutherans were not allowed to worship or even baptize their infants.

The ancestors of Rheuben Courtright evidently lived in this county, as the names of three children of Jan are found in the list of baptisms of the Kingston Reformed Church.

The Kingston church was organized under the name of the town of Orange, October 24, 1694. The center of the tract or township was Tappan, where a Glebe for the support of the minister was laid out.

The Minissink-Machackmack church, where the baptisms of the next generation are found, was established in 1737, near an Indian burying ground in what is now Port Jervis, New York. All that valley from Kingston, New York, to Warren, New Jersey, was called Minissink, the name being given it by the early Dutch traders, and it was occupied by the Indian tribe Minis, and composed the land drained by the upper waters of the Delaware.

The first white settler in the tract was William Teitsoort, his deed being dated April 10, 1708. He was a blacksmith and was welcomed by the Indians. Later the whites were harassed, because, as other early settlers did, they took advantage of the Indians when they bought the land. They were to have as much land as a man could walk around in a day, but he ran instead of walked; then the whites caused the Indians to become intoxicated and they did not pay the full price agreed upon.

SOLDIERS

None of the descendents of Rheuben Courtright now living know whether or not any of his ancestors served in the Revolution, (and as the records of New Jersey were burned at the sacking of Washington in the War of 1812, such information will never be obtainable.) *Erroneous*

Of the descendants of Rheuben Courtright, one son, six grandsons, one son-in-law and four grandsons-in-law served in the Civil War on the Northern side and one son on the side of the South.

The son who served the South was Isaac Bedell Courtright (No. 21), having married a Southern woman and living in South Carolina. Not knowing how to learn the particulars of his service, we cannot tell anything of it. Little is known of him after he left Sterling, Illinois, in the early '60s, but it is that he is buried at Jacksonville, Florida.

Of those on the Northern side, the son Samuel (No. 31), served but a short time, as he gave his life for his country. He enlisted September 3, 1862, at Newark, New Jersey, in Co. A, 27th N. J. Inf., and died in Emory Hospital, Washington, D. C., November 17, 1862, and is buried in Arlington cemetery.

The son-in-law was William Howard (No. 37). He served four years and five months as Corp. of Co. G, 39th Ills. Inf. and as flag bearer; being wounded twice, once very severely, but escaped many times, although the men at his side received the bullet aimed at him.

Of the grandsons, four were the sons of Phoebe (No. 20), one of Catherine (No. 22), and one of Jane (No. 24). Of the grandsons-in-law, one was Phoebe's, two Jane's and one Margaret's (No. 26).

Phoebe Courtright Decker's four sons were: James Rheuben (No. 41), Peter (No. 44), Joshua (No. 45), and George M. (No. 46), and the son-in-law was Wesson Wilbur (No. 48). Peter was the only one who lost his life, being wounded at Dutch Gap; he died at Fort Monroe, October 19, 1864. Peter and his brother Joshua were privates in Co. H, 96th N. Y., and enrolled January 1, 1864. Joshua was mustered out at City Point, Virginia, February 6, 1866. George M. Decker was in the 109th N.Y., enlisting in August, 1862, serving two years and eleven months. James Rheuben

was in Co. K, 179th N. Y. The son-in-law, Wesson Wilbur, was in Co. C, 14th N. Y. Heavy Artillery.

Catherine Courtright Woolley's son, Miles T. Woolley (No. 57), and Jane Courtright Siddles' son-in-law, Warren Young (No. 63), were in the same company, the latter enlisting in August and the former in September, 1862 in Co. C, 75th Ills. Inf. Warren Young was killed in January, 1863, and Miles T. Woolley was wounded in November, 1862, in the left forearm and received an honorable discharge.

Jane Courtright Siddle's son James (No. 61) and son-in-law, Jabez W. Todd (No. 66) were together all thru the war in Co. K, 15th Ills. Inf. They enlisted at Mt. Carroll, Ills., April 27, 1861, and were mustered into service the following month at Freeport, Ills. They were under General Grant and were in seventeen battles, among them being Shiloh, Fort Donaldson, Vicksburg and the Siege of Jackson, Mississippi. Their captain was Adam Nase and commander Thomas J. Turner. They served their full time, three years, and were honorably discharged June 14, 1864.

Margaret Courtright Woolley's son-in-law, Jacob Ernst (No. 79), was also in the service, but we were not able to get any of his record.

EXPLANATIONS

Each person has a number. Wishing to find any one particular person, look in the index and that will tell you his number; then look for that number in the small type. If there is a — after the number, you will find more about him in the next generation; if there is no —, all that we know about him is there; b. means born, d. died, m. married, and dau. daughter.

SUPPLEMENT

The Genealogist of New York City, who gave us the ancestors of Reuben Courtright, said he could not establish the connection between our Jan and Jan, the first Immigrant, but while searching in the genealogical department of the state library at Des Moines, Iowa, in January 1916, we discovered the following in Vol. 5 of Colonial Families of United States by George Norbury Mackensie.

The first of this family (Courtright) of whom we have record was one Bastiaen or Sebastian of Kortryk, Flanders in 1586. He afterwards moved to Leerdam, Holland, where his two children were born.

Jan Bastiaensen Van Kortryk, of Leerdam, Holland, b. 1618, moved to the village of Beest farther up the Linge, where all his children were born. He came to America as stated in the Introduction. He bot a brewery on Staten Island, but soon sold it and purchased a piece of land at Kingsbridge. His wife's name is unknown.

Catherine Haws.~~ All their children were baptised in Reformed Dutch Church in New York City.

THE FAMILIES

Maria Vredenburg was the dau. of William Isaacson Vredenburg from The Hague, who married in New York, October 19, 1664, Appolonia Barentse, dau. of Barent Jacobson Cool. Vredenburg was a soldier in the service of the West Indies Company. He settled in Esopus, now Ulster County, New York, near Kingston, where two of his children were baptised: Abraham Vredenburg, January 27, 1682; Jannatje Vredenburg, April 6, 1684.

Samuel Cortright undoubtedly moved to Sussex Co., New

Jersey, before 1785, as there is a deed on file in that county, dated October 8, 1785, conveying a farm of 75 acres from Elizabeth Cortright to Samuel and Petrius Cortright, "said parties then occupying the land."

The names of the first three children were obtained from relatives now living and the other four from the baptismal records of the Minissink-Machackmack Dutch Reformed Church at what is now Port Jervis, New York, but the order is uncertain.

The search for the parentage of Deborah Bedell was without definite results, but the following, found in Genealogies by John Littel, may refer to her ancestors: Henry Bedell lived in the Passaic Valley, his first wife's name was Sutton, by whom he had two children, John, who married Deborah Mulford, dau. of Capt. John Mulford, and Henry, who went to Sussex Co., married and raised a family there. Deborah had a brother, John Bedell, who d. in the 1890s, and a sister Elizabeth, who d. February 29, 1900, and m. 1st Aaron Bennett; 2nd Abram Rosenkrans, by whom she had a dau., who m. Dr. T. H. Stetler, who lives at Paw Paw, Illinois.

Elizabeth Van Etten's father served in the Revolutionary Army. She had two brothers, John and James Van Etten,

and a sister, Sarah Van Etten, who was b. July 15, 1804. Elizabeth became a member of the Christian church in 1872 and lived ever after a consistent, religious life. She died of paralysis and was buried by the side of her husband in Hickory Grove cemetery.

Rheuben Cortright and his family lived in Sandyston twp., Sussex Co., New Jersey, and all his children were born there, on the farm which he owned. In the spring of 1855 he moved with part of his children to Whiteside Co., Illinois, where several of his children, being married, had preceded him, and settled on his own farm in New Genesee twp. and lived there the remainder of his life.

He had eleven children by his first wife and ten by the second, the baptism of the first three being recorded in the Dutch Reformed Church at what is now Port Jervis, New York.

William B. Woolley was raised in Madison Co., New York, but went to Sussex Co., New Jersey, to work at his trade, carpentering, and there met Catherine Cortright and married her. They lived in Sussex Co., New Jersey, until 1838 or '39, when they moved to DeRuyter, New York, living there until 1853, when they moved to Whiteside Co., Illinois, settling on a farm in Clyde twp. In 1886 they moved to Yankton, South Dakota, and both are buried there. After her husband's death, Catherine made her home with her daughter in Omaha, Nebraska.

She was buried by the side of her husband in Hickory Grove cemetery.

After his marriage William Courtright lived five years in Sussex Co., New Jersey, then moved to Lucerne Co., Pennsylvania, living there five years. In 1852 he moved with his family and his brother John and his family to Whiteside Co., Illinois. The two brothers bought a farm together, but later dissolved the partnership and William bought another farm, where he lived until he moved to the town of Morrison in the spring of 1890.

In politics William Courtright was a Republican until 1880, when he became a Prohibitionist, being very earnest in the work for temperance, holding political rallies on the lawn of his country home. He was prominent in the M. E. Church, of which he was a life-long member, being class leader and member of the church board for years, both in Morrison and in the Hickory Grove Church, which he helped materially to build in 1863, both with work and money. His wife was also prominent in the community in which they lived, being a midwife and neighborhood nurse.

Margaret Cortright lived with her parents in Sussex Co., New Jersey, and after her sister, Catherine Woolley, moved to Madison Co., New York, she went to visit her and met her sister's brother-in-law and married him. After their marriage they lived in Onandago Co., New York, until 1850, when they moved to Whiteside Co., Illinois, traveling from Chicago with an ox team. They were the first of the Courtrights or Woolleys to go to that locality and bought a farm from the government in New Genesee twp. and built a log house on it.
