INTRODUCTION

There is no family, 'tis said, however distinguished, that can trace any one line of its ancestors beyond the eleventh century. Indeed, but few who have lived in America for six generations—unless descended from an ancestor who was conspicuous in some historic event—can trace their lineage to the Colonial period, a little more than one hundred years ago. We may then well ask, What jester inscribed on yonders tombstone those proud words, "Gone but Not Forgotten."?

Everyone must be glad to know something of those men and women who gave him his thread of life, and it is a natural instinct to love the place of one's birth and the chief circumstances in the lives one one's progenitors. Research may therefore be made with the most profound reverence and respect for the memory of those who lived and died in the dim and fading past.

But the task of the genealogist is not an easy one. He needs all the help that records may give or tongues may tell, and even then the trace will end not far from where he begins. It is with this thought in mind that the few simple facts of dates and places of births, marriages, etc., are recorded in the following pages, and with the high hope that the reading of them will awaken in each and all a renewed interest not only in those who have gone, but in the living who are bound by the ties of kinship.

EXPLANATION OF NUMBERS

The number of digits assigned to each person represents the number of generations he or she is removed from the ancestor (A.B.Cole) and each particular digit the order of birth in the preceeding families, thus no two persons have the same number and a direct line of ascendancy is easily prepared.

For example, the whole number assigned to Gloria Juneve Cole is 2-1-3-1, representing the fourth generation, and meaning that she is the first child of a third child of a first child of a second child. When listed in their regular order the direct line is built up in the following manners

BRIEF SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF CAPTAIN ARMSTEAD BERESFORD COLE.

Family history found no place among the papers left by Captain Armstead B, Cole, and no effort was made to learn anything of his ancestry until recently. Fortunately, he preserved a copy of his father's will, and a letter written later by the administrators of the estate. These papers recorded the name of his father as Samuel Cole and the name of his mother as Lucy Cole. The will also gave the names of two brothers and five sisters.

For several years this was all that could be learned of the family of his parents. The writer tried in vain to learn from relatives the birthplace of Armstead B. Cole or where his father Samuel Cole had lived prior to moving to Texas. No one seemed to know. In 1924 a letter was received from the War Department giving a statement of Captain Cole's services in the Confederate Army and saying that he was born in Alabama. With this meagre information a search was made through the census records at Washington. These records brought to light a few new facts, and with the papers above referred to constitute all that is known of his ancestry.

Ancestors of Armstead Beresford Cole

Samuel Cole, father of Armstead B. Cole, was born in Virginia in 1799. His mother, Iway Cole, was born about 1803, either in Georgia or South Carolina. At the time this article was written (1927) no records have been found that give any information concerning earlier ancestors than these. There were many Coles living in Virginia in the latter part of the Eighteenth century, but the absence of the given name of Samuel Cole's father makes it very difficult to connect him with any particular family.

In 1830, Samuel Cole is shown in the census records as living in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, with his wife, whose age was given as between 20 and 30 years, and six children described in the manner of the early censuses, as follows:

- I female between 10 and 15
- i male between 5 and 10
- 2 females between 5 and 10
- 2 females between 0 and 5

In 1840, the census showed him to be living in Pontotoc County, Mississippi, and it recorded four later children as follows:

- 1 female between 5 and 10
- 1 male between 5 and 10
- I female between 0 and 5
- i male between 0 and 5

Prior to 1850 the census records gave only the name of the heads of families with the number of males and females in the family and their ages after the manner above indicated. The next ceusus in 1850, however, listed the names of all children living with the family, recorded all ages, and gave the birthplace (State) of each person,

In 1850, Samuel Cole was still living in Pontotoc County, Mississippi, and three additional children (making 13 in all) were named, as follows:

Susanah W. Cole, Age 9 Thomas J. Cole, Age 7 James Cole, Age 2

The census of 1850 was the first to reveal that Samuel Cole was born in Virginia, and it confirmed the War Department's report that Armstead B. Cole was born in Alabama. His wife, Lucy Cole, was here recorded as having been born in Georgia.

In 1860, Samuel and Lucy Cole are recorded in the census book as living at Homer, Angelina County, Texas, aged 61 and 58, respectively. Only one child was living with them at this time—that was Thomas, aged 16. In this census the birthplace of Lucy Cole is recorded as South Carolina, which is probably correct since Tuscaloosa County (where Samuel Cole was probably married) was settled principally by people from Virginia and South Carolina,

Of the above children the two daughters whose names are nowhere recorded Richard Cole, Lucy Cole, and James Cole, must have died in childhood as they are not named in the will of Samuel Cole.

An Uncle Mamed Armstead Cole

A brother of Samuel Cole, the census records reveal, lived near him in each place except in Texas in 1860. His name was Armstead Cole, born in Virginia in 1793. In similar manner his family was built up from the records. As will be observed, those whose names are not given evidently passed out of the family by death, marriage, or moving away before the census of 1850, when names were first recorded. The fragmentary record of this family is here recorded as follows:

The given names "James" and "Richard" appear among the sons of both Samuel Cole and his brother Armstead, which might be indicative of the fact that they were family names of the next preceding generation.

Armstead B. Cole Born in Alabama in 1822

The record of Armstead Beresford Cole's birth in Alabama (undoubtedly in Tuscaloosa County) is definitely established. His birthdate is recorded on the receipt covering the payment for his tombstome as October 19, 1822.

The large collection of papers which he left, more than 200 separate documents give not a single line of original composition from his pen, and his signature is contained on but few of them. While these papers fall into one general category, they are subject to somewhat more descriptive subdivisions: The largest group of papers consists of statements of sales or purchases of plantation products and general supplies; another class is tax receipts covering property and personal goods owned at the time; a few deeds received upon the purchase of lands in Anderson County, Alabama, Pontotoc and Itawamba counties, Mississippi, and Cherokee County, Texas;

promissory notes, mortgages, and miscellaneous memoranda with respect to accounts, each telling its own silent story of a pioneer struggling in a new country.

Military and Confederate Army Services

Most interesting of all the documents however, are his army commissions which in themselves show an almost complete history of his military experience. These commissions cover a period of time ranging from 1858 when he was a captain of the Chippawa dragoons, a volunteer company of the 48th Regiment of Mississippi militia, through the memorable years 1861-65 when he held various commissions in the Confederate States Army, down to the year 1871 when he served as a captain of Company D, 35th Regiment, Texas State militia -a spread of 13 years.

The collection of papers originally contained seven different commissions, but only five are now in existence and these are kept in a scrap-book by the writer. The description of each is given below:

Item 3.—Commission as captain of the Chiwappa dragoons, dated August 31, 1858, signed by William McWillie, Governor of Mississippi. This commission is written on paper with an oily finish and custom arily called "sheepskin."

Item 7.—Commission as 1st lieutenant of the Pontotoc dragoons, a company in the Army of Mississippi, dated April 1, 1861, and signed by John J. Pettus, Governor of Mississippi. This commission is also on "sheepskin"

Item 9.—Commission as 1st lieutenant of the Pontotoc minute men a cavalry company of Mississippi militia, dated September 25, 1862, and signed by John J. Pettus, Governor of Mississippi.

Item 10,-Commission as captain of Company "A", Harris battalion of Mississippi State troops, dated May 24, 1864, and signed by Charles Clarke, Governor of Mississippi.

Item 20.—Commission as captain of Company "D", 35th Regiment. Texas State militia dated October 21, 1871, and signed by Edmund J. Davis Governor of Texasa

The other two commissions including the final muster roll of Captain A. B. Cole's Company, were unfortunately lost in transmission through the mails. These three documents now missing were probably the most important of his Civil-war records. The commissions were those showing his election as Captain of the Pontotoc dragoons, June, 1861, and his election as Captain of Company E, 11th Mississippi cavalry Confederate States Army. The muster roll of Company E, his last command, was probably the only one in existence as the United States War Department report that they have no rolls of the latter named company on file. This roll contained the name of the writer's father, W. D. Cole, who enlisted in the Army just previous to the close of the war.

The muster roll of Company D, 35th Regiment of Texas State militia is shown in the scrap-book as Item No. 16. It includes the names of two of Armstead B. Cole's sons-namely, W. D. Cole, 1st sergeant, and R. T. Cole, private,

There is quoted herewith in full, through the courtesy of Major General Robert C. Davis, the Adjutant General of the War Department, Washington, D. C., the official Civil War record of Armstead B. Cole, as follows:

"WAR DEPARTMENT

The Adjutant General's Office

Washington

November 20, 1924.

"Mr. Robert F. Cole, 2225 Transportation Bldg., Chicago Illinois

"Sir:

"The records show that Armstead B. Cole, age 36 years, was enrolled February 22, 1861, at Pontotoc, Misso, as a 1st Lieutenant of Captain John H. Miller's Company (Pontotoc Dragoons) Mississippi Cavalry Confederate States Army. He was promoted to captain about June 1861, and the company was subsequently known as Captain A. B. Cole's Company, 1 Battalion (Miller's) Mississippi Cavalry. The batalion was disbanded about June, 1862, and he became Captain of Company I. 1 Regiment, Mississippi Cavalry but failed to be reelected when the regiment was reorganized.

"Armstead B. Cole, 1st Lieutenant, Company A. 2 Battalion (Harris's), Mississippi State Cavalry, Confederate States Army, was elected September 26, 1862, at Pontotoc, Miss., and was promoted to Captain December 16 1863, He was reported present on muster roll dated May 4, 1864, which is the last well of the company on file. He later record as a member of that organization has been found, but by order dated June 16 1884, the battalion became a part of the 11 (Ashcraft's) Regiment, Mississippi Cavalry; Confederate States Army, and Captain Armstead B Cole of Company B of that regiment was surrendered by Lieutenant-General R. Taylor, C. S. A., May 4, 1865, and was paroled at Columbus, Miss., May 16 1865. Residence Pontotoc County, Miss. Mo rolls of the latter mamed company are on file but there are rolls of the other companies mentioned.

"His personal description is stated as follows:

Blue eyes, fair hair height 5 feet llg inches, born in Alabama, occupation farmer.

That Armstead B. Cole should have fought for the South is but another proof—though none is needed that he possessed a fervent love for Mississippi the State of his adoption.

A Resident of Alabama Mississippi and Texas

Armstead B. Cole was at different periods a resident of three states—namely Alabama. Mississippi, and Texas—but it was in Pontotoc County. Mississippi, that he spent thirty-six of the most momentus years of his life, dwelling for more than one-quarter of a century amidst the primitive environments of the early settlers and living close to God and nature.

It was here at the maturity of youth that he wooed and won Sarah Jane Turner a charming girl with homespun virtues, whose love and companionship he kept and cherished to the end of his days. It was here too during the strength and vigor of young manhood that his children were born and hope wove its roses into the blue web of the future. It was here again when the plantation offered its coziest hours that the bu gle call of war summoned him from the farmstead to the battlefield in defense of the Southland. It was here also at the moontide of life that he bade good-bye to his friends and reighbors and set his face westward toward a new land, unmindful of the ventures and hardships which confronted him. These were the happiest and sunniest years of his life-years filled with love and honor and friendship and pride and hope.

If I could speak to the soul of Armstead B. Cole,

I would say: Alabama gave you the place of your birth, Texas claims the scene of your last waking moments, but Mississippi with her magnolia-covered fields reflects the finest splendor of your being and unfolds the greatest drama of your life—

"And memory greets with reverential kiss No spot in all thy circuit sweet as this."

A Respected And Honorable Man

Armstead B. Cole was a plain man of the people, born and reared in the South where the highest type of citizen is the man or woman who lives plainly and practices the simple, modest virtues of devotion to home, love of country, and reverence for God.

A little first-hand information was recently received from Mrs. Robert Turner Cole, of Hico, Texas, his oldest daughter-in-law and one of the few surviving persons who knew him and his wife personally. In a letter to the writer, she said: Armstead B. Cole was a good man and highly respected by all who knew him; he was always prosperous and had plenty. His middle name was "Beresford" but he always signed his name "A. B. Cole," and jokingly explained that the B in his name stood for "Bullsfoot." She also said that his wife Sarah Jane (Turner) Cole a descendant of the Dale Family of Tennessee, was an exceptionally kind and patient woman, especially so to her children whom she loved with much devotion. She was known to all by the affectionate name of "Mother" Cole, and everyone loved her.

To this splendid tribute from one who knew her so well, nothing need be added, but the beautiful lines of Edgar Allen Poe seem so fitting here that they are quoted:

"Because I feel that, in the Heavens above,
The angels, whispering to the another,
Can find, among their burning terms of love,
None so devotional as that of 'MOTHER'."

In the name of God, Amen, I, Samuel Cole of the town of Homer in the County of Angelina and State of Texas, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish, and declare this to be my last will and testament; that is to say, after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, bequeath, and dispose of as follows to wit:

For the love and affection I have for my children, I do give and bequeath to them as follows:

To my daughter OLIVE C. WOOD and the heirs of her body a certain negro man named "Sam" and a certain old negro woman named "Ruth."

To my daughter MARY M. HUDIBURGH and the heirs of her body I give and bequeath a certain negro man named "Aron."

To my daughter SUSANAH W. DUREN and the heirs of her body a certain negro man named "Peter."

Also I give and bequeath unto my son WILLIAM I COLE the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), provided, nevertheless, if I should not recover from the present bed of affliction, five hundred dollars in two notes made by Jesse Blackburn to the said William I, Cole shall be a part of the said one thousand dollars, and the balance of said sum to be paid out of the proceeds of other property

Also I give and bequeath unto my son THOMAS J. COLE a certain negro boy named "Richmond," and also the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) in cash to make said Thomas J. Cole equal with the other heirs.

Also I give and bequeath unto my son ARMSTEAD B. COLE the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Also I give and bequeath unto each one of the heirs of my daughter SARAH F. DUNCAN, deceased the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) a piece

Also I give and bequeath unto each one of the heirs of my daughter MARTHA S. BRAMLITT, deceased, the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) a piece.

Likewise, I make constitute and appoint my son-in-law Henry M. Wood, and also my son-in-law B. F. Duren, to be the EXECUTORS of my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. And at my decease it shall be the duty of my executors to take charge of and to sell the remainder of my estate not herein disposed of in this instrument, and after said sales the money is to be divided equally between my own living children.

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal—using scroll for seal—this the Fourth Day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty One

The above written instrument was subscribed to by the said Samuel Cole in our presence and acknow-ledged by him to each of us, and at the same time he published and declared the above instrument so subscribed to be his last will and testament; and we, at the testators request and in his presence have signed our names as witnesses hereto and have written opposite our names our respective places of residence.

AMCESTORS OF SARAH JAME (TURNER) COLE.

Sarah Jane (Turner) Cele was the third child of Dr. Rebert Turner and his wife Sephia Weedsen (Dale) Turner, and a granddaughter of Adam Dale. Beth of these men were sens of soldiers of the Revelutionary War. Adam Dale served in the Colonial forces and the War of 1812, and Dr. Rebert Turner was a surgeen's mate in the War of 1812. Some genealegical excerpts as well as brief accounts of their lives and military services fellow:

The Dale Family

DALE, JAMES. Bern about 1630 of an English family and sailed with his wife and children from Lendonberry, Ireland, to America, coming to Philadelphia in 1695. With him was his youngest son, John Dale, then seven years of age. John Dale died in 1698 at a place near the head of the Elk River. Maryland. The record of this family is incomplete, but among the children was the following named son:

John Dale, bo in 1688; do in 1778.

DALE JOHN. Bern in England in 1688; died in Wercester County, Maryland, in 1778. In 1703 or 1704 he married a Miss McKnight who was born in 1688 and died about 1876. They had five children but the record of their names is incomplete. The first child was a son named John Dale; the second, third, fourth and sixth children were girls; the fifth, or next to the last, was a son named as fellows:

DALE, THOMAS. Born in Worcester County, Maryland, on March 5, 1744; died at Liberty, Smith County, Tennessee, on January 6, 1812. He married Elizabeth Evans in Sussex County, Delaware; she was born there in 1749, and died at Liberty, Tennessee, some time following the death of her husband. Thomas Dale was an officer in the Revolutionary War, serving as a Captain. There were ten children in this family, and among them was the following named child:

DALE, ADAM. Born in Worcester County, Eastern Shore of Maryland, on July 14, 1768; died at Hazel Green, Alabama, on October 14, 1851, and is buried in Reschill Cemetery, Columbia, Tennessee. He married Mary Hall (1), youngest daughter of Jordan Hall, Esq., of Sussex County, Delaware, on February 24, 1790. Adam and Mary Dale had ten children, as follows:

Bern at Liberty, Smith County, Tennessee, on March 19, 1805; died at the home of her son, William Turner, at Verona, Mississippi, January 29, 1884. On April 15, 1818, at the age of 13 she married Dr. Rebert Turner at Liberty, Tennessee. They had eleven children, as follows: (See page 54 for identical family under the Turner line).

The following short sketch of Adam Dale's life was taken from the "History of DeKalb County, Tennessee," written by Will T. Hale and published by Paul Hunter, Nashville, Tennessee, The book contains a picture of Adam Dale made a short time prior to his death.

The first settlement was made at Liberty, Smith (now DeKalb) County, Tennessee, by Adam Dale about 1797. The earliest mill in the county was no doubt Adam Dale's at Liberty, erected about 1800 and patronized by the Dale and other settlements.

On his arrival at the site of Liberty from Maryland in 1797, Adam Dale, who came by way of East Tennessee and over the Cumberland Mountains, must have been impressed with the country, for he sent back in some way a report to his friends which induced the coming of a colony consisting of about 40 people including John and William Dale, the Bethels, and many others. It is not certain that he had a companion during the something like three years before the arrival of the immigrants. If he was alone, he must have been lonely at times. Doubtless game and fish abounded, and these occupied Dale's mind by day; but the snarl of the bobcat or other noises of the night, together with the solemnity of the great woods were necessarily spirit-depressing, even if he had no fear of the Indians.

We are told that he passed his first months in a rude shack built on the bluff overlooking the creek on the North side of the town, about where the Whaley lime kiln was for a number of years. After his friends came he erected a small dwelling on the West side of the turnpike beyond the bridge going North. This writer (Will T. Hale) saw the building carried off by the flood near the beginning of the War between the States, at which time the small mill Dale erected was wrecked.

Adam Dale was born in Worcester County, Maryland, July 14, 1768. He was a boy volunteer of the Revolution. In 1781 this company of boys from fourteen to sixteen years was raised in Snow Hill, Maryland, to oppose the progress of Cornwallis through Virginia.

Receiving land grants with his father, Thos. Dale, for service, he settled in Liberty, Tennessee, in 1797, after having married Mary Hall on February 24, 1790. He raised, equipped, and commanded a company of volunteers from Smith (now DeKalb) County and fought under General Andrew Jackson at Horseshoe Bend and other battles of the War of 1812. Removing to Columbia, Tennessee, in 1829, he died at Hazel Green, Alabama, October 14, 1851. His wife died in 1859 in Columbia, Tennessee. When the surviving children of Adam Dale had his body removed from Alabama to Columbia after his wife's death, his body was found to be absolutely perfect, that is petrified.

Thomas Dale, who was a Revolutionary soldier, enlisted in General Charles Smallwood's command, soon became a captain of a company of the Maryland line. He owned a great deal of land around Liberty in which village he erected a house. In the family graveyard in the rear is a limestone slab with this legend: "In memory of Thomas Dale, born March 5, 1744; died January 6, 1812." It is possible that the mountain between Liberty and Smithville was named Snow Hill by him in memory of the place where he enlisted for American Independence.

Adam and William Dale were sons of the Thomas Dale who came to Liberty with the Marylanders. Josiah Duncan married a daughter of Thomas Dale; while another Sophia was the wife of William Givan. There are many descendants of these Dales in Tennessee and other states. Rev. William Dale said; in a letter to his grandson Riley Dale written February 28, 1844, that he was born on May 4, 1783; that his father was Thomas Dale, of John Dale, of James Dale, both of Londonberry, Ireland; that his mother's name was Elizabeth Evans, of John Evans, of William Evans of Wales.

Sophia E. Dale, sister of Adam Dale, married William Givans June 26, 1802, and had eight children as follows: Nancy, bern January 11, 1804; George, bern September 21, 1806; Elizabeth, bern May 1, 1810; Sarah, bern April 11, 1812; Thomas, bern March 20, 1814; Mary Ann, bern June 23, 1816; Robert Johnson, bern August 9, 1818; and Martha Laws Dale, bern November 5, 1820.
