CARTER OF TENNESSEE

The Carter Family of Tennessee is one of the most distinguished in the history of the State. Many Governors and Senators are in the descending line from Colonel John Carter the Founder of the Family in Tennessee, and almost innumerable members have occupied other high offices, while many have achieved distinction as musicians, artists and orators.

COLONEL JOHN CARTER

Colonel John Carter, Founder of the Family in Tennessee, was a leader in pioneer days. He was born in Virginia in 1737. He came into what we now know as Tennessee at a very early date and soon attained leadership in the community in which he lived. He was settled on Boone's Creek as early as 1769. He was one of the famous Thirteen Commissioners of Watauga in 1772 and was chairman of the Watauga Court which consisted of himself and four others. It is said that he drafted the Articles of Association of Watauga. He was chairman of the first court in Washington County. He signed the Watauga Petition and when North Carolina accepted the Petition and created Washington District, John Carter, John Sevier and Charles Robertson were its first representatives in the North Carolina Legislature. One year later Gov. Martin of North Carolina appointed John Carter Colonel Commanding the County. Carter's Valley is called for him and

Carter County was named for his son. When he first came into the country he was a merchant with William Parker. The store of Parker and Carter was robbed by Indians who later made reparation by granting an enormous body of land to them, the entire valley called "Carter's Valley" running from Cloud's Creek to Chimney Top Mountain.

Col. Carter married while he was still in Virginia, about 1758, Elizabeth Taylor and from that time the Carters and Taylors have intermarried until a bewildering maze of kinship exists in all branches of the two families.

He died in or before the year 1781 in Washington County, Tennessee, as his estate was administered in that year by his son Landon Carter. The estate was the largest west of the Alleghany at that period and for many years thereafter.

COLONEL LANDON CARTER

So far as the records show Col. John Carter had but one child: Landon Carter of Tennessee. He is so designated to distinguish him from the several Landon Carters of Virginia who were his kinsmen. He was born in Virginia Jan. 29, 1760. He was educated at Liberty Hall, N. C. (now Davidson College). He died January 5, 1808.

He participated with his father in all the activities of Watauga, and was prominent in the Revolution. He served as a Captain under Col. John Sevier and Col. Arthur Campbell. He signed the Watauga Petition to have that settlement annexed to North Carolina. He was in the battles of King's Mountain and Boyd's Creek. On the death of his father in 1781

he was made administrator of his estate which was the largest in North Carolina west of the Alleghany Mountains. In 1782 at the age of twenty-two he was appointed by the legislature of North Carolina, auditor of Washington District. In 1781 he was made trustee of Martin Academy (later Washington College). He was in command of a company under John Sevier in the South Carolina campaign in 1781 and fought under Gen. Francis Marion until January 1782. In 1784 he represented Washington County in the lower house of the North Carolina Legislature. He was a strong supporter of John Sevier and the State of Franklin. He was secretary of the first Franklin Convention at Jonesboro; speaker of the first Franklin Senate; member of the first Council of State and later Secretary of State and entrytaker.

Gov. William Blount of the Territory South of the Ohio River among his first acts appointed him Lieutenant Colonel Commandant of the Washington District Militia. Later he was elected treasurer of Washington and Hamilton Districts of the Territory which place he held until the creation of the State of Tennessee.

He represented Washington County in the first Constitutional Convention of the State of Tennessee. In 1834 his son, William Blount Carter, was president of the second state constitutional Convention of Tennessee. His grandson William B. Carter, Jr., was a member of the convention of 1870. Thus the family name is connected with the fundamental law of Tennessee from the Articles of the Watauga Association and the State of Franklin down to the latest Constitutional Convention, that of 1870.

CARTER

The first legislature of Tennessee created the county of Carter and named it for Landon Carter and the county seat for his wife Elizabeth. He died January 5, 1808 and is buried in the old Carter cemetery near Elizabethton and in sight of the home of his father.

He married February 26, 1784, Elizabeth Maclin.

I. Alfred M. Carter, son of Landon and Elizabeth Maclin Carter married twice, first Matilda M. Wendel of Murfreesboro, Tenn., November 15, 1810 and married second, Evalina B. Parry of Staunton, Virginia.

(2) James William Carter, eldest son of D. W. Carter, I., and Eliza Jane Hale, married Mary Sue Tindall of Aberdeen, Miss. He was a lieutenant in the 63rd Tenn. Regiment and served through the War Between the States. He was in battles around Richmond, Va., and later served under Gen. Longstreet in Tennessee. He was in a charge made by his command on Fort Saunders Knoxville, Tennessee, and told the writer that when he ran up the embankment of the Fort with his men he saw his uncle, Gen. Samuel P. Carter, inside the Federal fort which he commanded.

3 Alfred Moore Carter, II., the second son of D. W. Carter and Eliza Jane Hale was a soldier in the same command with his brother, Lieut. J. W. Carter. He was badly wounded at the battle of Drury's Bluff near Richmond, Virginia. After the War he studied medicine. He married twice, first, Chassie L. King Nov. 25, 1869. She was a daughter of Cyrus King and granddaughter of Rev. James King, the founder of King College and one of the founders of the city of Bristol. Their three children were: Alice Maude, Cyrus Carter, died young and Claude Carter died young.

Alice Maude Carter married Ellis K. Crymble and had children: Alfred Carter Crymble of Bristol, Tenn., and Ellis K. Crymble, Jr., died July 1923.

Dr. Alfred Moore Carter married for his second wife Nannie Buchanon Zimmerman daughter of Martha Buchanon Zimmerman and Dr. Benjamin F. Zimmerman who was a son of Abraham and Mary Montgomery Zimmerman.

(5) David Wendel Carter, II., fourth son of D. W. Carter, I., and Eliza Jane Hale, was educated at King College, Bristol, Tenn., and entered the Methodist Ministry in 1871. In 1882 he was sent as a missionary to Mexico where he labored for many years as Presiding Elder, property agent, editor and treasurer. After the Spanish-American war he was Superintend-

ent to the new mission in Cuba which he served for nearly seven years. He returned to the United States and is still preaching in Texas. He has served continuously in the ministry for fifty years. Oct. 20, 1884 he married Corniela Stanley Keith, daughter of Col. Alexander Hume Keith of Athens, Tenn. Their children are:

All four of the sons of D. W. Carter, II., and his wife, Cornelia Keith Carter, were in the World War. Keith was second Lt. in the Aviation service; David W. III., was a first Lt. in the Medical Corps; Hugh S. was a second Lt. in Field Artillery and served in France. Stanley was in the Navy. Their daughter Anne F. was in the War Service Board at Washington and later went to France and Germany in the service of the War Y. M. C. A. and then to Italy with the Y. W. C. A. where she was later joined by her sister Cornelia.

Hugh married Isabel Gordon, daughter of Dr. Charles H. Gordon of the University of Tennessee.

Stanley married Nannie Lee Hill, of Waco Texas.

(7) Frank Alexander Carter, sixth son of D. W. Carter, I., and Eliza Jane Carter, married, first, Annie Laird of Indiana and had David.

He married, second, Mrs. Ivey of Nashville, Tenn., and had two sons, Robert and David. Robert was in the Navy during the World War.

(8) Ella Douglas Carter, daughter of D. W. and his wife, Eliza Jane Carter, married Dr. Samuel Williams Rhea, a dentist of Bristol, Tenn., and once mayor of the City, Feb. 15, 1882 and had Janie, died in infancy; Joe Carter, born Jan. 29, 1886; James Wendel, born Jan. 31, 1888.

Gen. Samuel P. Carter

Alfred Moore Carter, I., married second, Evalina B. Parry of Stanton, Va., and had (1) Samuel Parry Carter, who changed his middle name to Powhattan. He was educated at the U. S. Naval Academy. He served in the Navy practically all his life except the period of the War Between the States, during which he was transferred to the army with the rank of Brig. General. In the Navy he reached the rank of Rear Admiral; the only man on record who has held these two positions. He was Provost Marshall General of East Tennessee, after it was occupied by the Federal troops.

He married Carrie Potts, of Washington, D. C. and had Alfred Moore, who died soon after reaching young manhood; Samuel Powhattan II., never married and died in Washington, D. C., in 1925. With him this line was extinguished.

2. William Blount Carter II., second son of A. M. Carter and Evalina B. Parry was born Sept. 11, 1820. He was educated at Princeton, N. J., for the Ministry of the Presbyterian Church. He held one short pastorate at Rogersville, Tenn. His first wife was Mary Hill Fowler, of N. Y., who died in

1846 without children. Failing health caused him to retire to his farm at Elizabethton. He was a supporter of the Union and during the War Between the States went North. Returning after its close he became active in politics. He was a candidate for Congress on the Democratic ticket but he was defeated. He was a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1870.

His second wife was Elizabeth J. Brown of North Carolina whom he married May 7, 1850. She died Feb. 27, 1882. Their children were:
