PREFACE.

Chapman Ancestry, - Posterity.

The Anglo-Saxon name "CHAPMAN," means, merchant in origin and the Whitby Strain of Chapmans, bore Arms, and are entitled to heraldry as per their Coat of Arms, the Latin inscription translated reads "Virtue increases under affliction". There are 77 Chapmans on the roll of honor who fought in the Revolutionary War, with honor.

The Compiler hereby acknowledges his appreciation for the mutual assistance of his many kinfolks Especially grateful to Rev. Frederick W. Chapman for his book "The Chapman Family" published at Hartford, in 1854, by Case, Tiffany and Co. a copy of which the compiler was able to purchase at an extortionate price, but a copy is now on file at the Western Reserve Historical Society, Cleveland; this excellent Chapman genealogy gives four different branches, including four generations of John Chapman the settler pages 314 to 320, this work is a legacy to our tribe of the Chapman posterity.

Also much valuable information was obtained from the "New England Register" Volume 58 and 59, page 97, also from the Vernon County Records also Wheeler's History of Stonington, Connecticut, and other good works on file at the Cleveland Public Library, and much time spent in careful research in various ways, and the author will appreciate calling his attention to any errors, additions or suggestions that future publications may be more complete and accurate. Samuel Alden with whom John Chapman the first settler found succor was a descendant of the famous John Alden of the "Mayflower". "Some folks are proud of having descended from their ancestry and others boast of having risen above theirs". Anon.

They were men and women of undaunted courage and indomitable resolution, firm religious principle and all possessing, their superior mental cultivation, men from whom none of their posterity need be ashamed and from whom to have derived their origin, being well born from a human standpoint, and well qualified for the "New Spiritual birth".

Many of the family have distinguished themselves in the useful trades arts, sciences and professions, and most if not all, were men and women endowed with mental and moral character and integrity.

' The following items in regard to this family were furnished by Hon. Enoch Chapman, of Norwich, Conn., one of the descendants: "The Christian name of the Mr. Chapman, who was father of the above John Chapman the settler, I have not been able to learn. He lived some fifty miles from London, and married Johanna Sumner. Their son John was by trade a weaver, having served seven years to learn, and being on a visit to London was pressed on board a man-of-war. After some time, the ship visited at Boston and John availed himself of an opportunity to assume the liberty of which he had been deprived; he fled and found succor in the abode of Samuel Alden in now what is called Wakefield, R. I., where he worked at his trade and later we find him in what is now North Stonington, where he married Sarah Brown, according to town records, February 16th, 1710."

The author has his photograph taken in his last years. Fanny Clark came from near Buffalo, New York and was the first school teacher in 1809.

For a second wife Ephraim married Anne S. Goode, March 1846, no issue. The whole bunch settled together on the same highway as pioneer farmers.
