In the early Massachusetts records William Cummings of Salem is the first man mentioned with a name similar to the name of Comins. He lived in that town in 1630, and is thought to be the ancestor of all the families of similar name in Massachusetts.

In 1720 he was one of a committee to secure a minister for the church, and the Church Society was organized at his house January 18, 1721.

Charles Wesson Comins, son of Erastus M. Comins and Mary Taylor, died in Brooklyn, N. Y., November 5, 1913, aged 73 years.

Mr. Comins was born in East Eddington village in 1840, his grandfather, Coolidge Comins, having settled there before 1810, coming from Charlton, Mass. He received his education in the district school and learned the carpenter's trade. During the war he moved to New York, where he acted as a special officer in the suppression of the draft riots. FROM ELIJAH COMINS MANUSCRIPT WRITTEN IN 1881 WHEN HE WAS 74 YEARS OLD.

"Coolidge Comins was born in Charlton, Mass., March 23, 1770, he was the fourth son of William Comins and Huldah Hammond.

There appears to have been some patriotism as well as military spirit in the family. The father and oldest brother Jonas served in the Revolutionary War; thus assisting in gaining our country's independence.

Subsequently when the younger brothers were still residents of their native town, and when the old miltia system was in its glory and popular and every town had its company these three brothers held the three offices of the Charlton company at the same time, William being captain, James lieutenandt and Coolidge, ensign.

In the last war with England, when they sent their troops up the Penobscot and men were called to repel them he volunteered and with musket in hand went as far as Hampden to meet the enemy. On the retreat as our men were crossing the river at Reed's Ferry, a barge filled with the British came in sight around a turn in the river. The enemy opened fire with a six pounder and the Eddington men beat a hasty retreat into the woods, where it was suggested by Comins that they stand and fire back, however as the enemy were in force, it was feared if their fire was returned, they might follow and devastrate the eastern side of the river so it was decided to return home.

Coolidge Comins married Margaret Mansfield, who was born in Boston, Mass., March 25, 1775, it was a time of great deprivation and suffering in consequence of the town's being garrisoned by the British troops under General Gage, in less than one month the memorable march to Concord and Lexington took place.

John Mansfield, the father of Margaret was killed at Bunker Hill, and her mother, Katherine Ryan of Leicester was left with her and an older sister Eleanor to care for. The family moved to Oxford, Mass., and subsequently Katherine Mansfield married Benjamin Vassal, a cabinet maker and possessed of a good hime. He had two sons and all the children grew up as one family. Margaret always spoke in high esteem of her step-father. Eleanor Mansfield married a Mr. Gulley and moved to Addison, Vermont. One of the Vassal brothers never married, but Benjamin Vassal, Jr. married an done grandson is now living (1881)."

"These ancestors Coolidge Comins and wife moved to a log house in Jarvis Gore, now East Eddington, Maine in June 1803, with three small children. Their nearest neighbor was two and one half miles distant, but others soon came in, their house contained one living room with two small living bed rooms at one end. The other end had a large stone fireplace with wooden mantel-piece and chimney, topped out with cat and clay (cat and clay means cedar slats split two inches wide and half an inch thick, laid cob-house fashion in clay mortar and plastered inside and out with the same kind of mortar). By untiring industry and perseverence they soon attained a comfortable home with a better house, which they were always ready to share with the needy.

There house was always a home for traveling ministers of all denominations; also for Indans who roamed through the native forests, many of whom were fed and sheltered under their hospitable roof. The greatest need was want of schools but this was in part remedied by the aptness of the mother who having taught school for a few terms in her native state, used her talent to instruct her own children; teaching them the rudiments of an education long before they were inside a school room. In after years they united with others and supported some private schools, but subsequently in 1823 they were annexed to Eddington, when they had town schools for the younger children.

Coolidge held several offices in town * * * and was ever known in all the vicinity for his strict integrity and honesty in speech and purpose.

A few circumstances have been remembered which will illustrate the generosity of his character. The year 1816 has since been known as the cold season, snow fell all day June 6th and many spring birds died from cold and hunger. And in the fall there was snow again and hard frosts in September. Corn was entirely cut off and other grain much damaged, except winter rye which was good, and was the main article for bread. But some the next spring had not that, and not anything to buy with. That was the case of a poor man with a large family, living four or five miles distant. He had a promising piece of winter rye that would be ready to cut early in August, but no bread or no prospects ahead but his rye field. Under these circumstances his wife who was quite energetic started with horse and boy, a lad of ten years, to borrow some rye offering five pecks for a bushel and pay as soon as they could get

some new rye threshed. They tried in various places without success, until they came to Coolidge Comins, he heard their request and having some rye, immediately measured up what the horse could carry and they went home rejoicing in their good luck. As soon as their new crop was off they sent the same boy with the rye to pay five pecks for the bushel, but Mr. Comins would only take the amount they had had.

At a later time one of his neighbors thought to better himself by changing his situation; there was a place for sale, and in order for him to secure it, it was necessary for him to hire \$100, he found a man who would let him the money, if he could get Mr. Comin's to sign with him He offered Mr. Comins if he would sign a Warantee deed of his old place, valued at \$300., as security. It was agreed that the deed was not to be recorded, unless Mr. Comin's had to pay the \$100., and if he did the place was to be his. The money was obtained, the place secured and the neighbor moved onto the new place; but the soil was not paid for, the man sickened and died without paying either the note or for the soil.

Mr. Comins had the note to pay to secure himself the deed recorded. But the widow with five children was liable to be turned out of the new home unless she raised \$300 a sum which she had no means of paying. Mr. Comins told her he would keep the old place and pay her \$200 more, making \$300 which was all her husband had asked for it. Thus the widow was enabled to pay up for the new place, get a deed and secure a place for herself and the children while they lived and their descdants are now on the place.

In religious belief Coolidge was trained in the old fashioned puritan Congregationalism and his wife was an Episcopalian. They however made no open profession of religion, until past middle life, when they both joined the Universalist Church, and lived and died firm believers in the doctrine of universal salvation."
