The Converse Family.

The origin of this family was in the Province of Navarre, France under the name of DeCoignieres. During the later part of the reign of William the Conqueror, Roger and Robert DeCoignieres emigrated to England and settled in Durham. Upon the rise of the Reformation in France, the De Coignieres became Huguenots and by a Allegence and religion adherents of Henry the 4th., of the massacre of St Bartholomew, Pierre De Coignieres with his wife and two children escaped and settled in Essex England. The English pronunciation became Conyers. Then when the Conyers came to America they changed the name to read Converse in the year 1735-37.

Lived in Wakerly England. He and his wife Sarah(Smith)Conyers and his sons James and Josiah and his daughter Mary boarded the Ship Arbella, which was one of the fleet under the command of Governor Winthrop, and this ship came ahead of the rest of the fleet and landed in Salem Mass., 6/12/1630. Settled first in Charleston Mass, where he owned and operated a ferry between Charleston and Boston Mass. They lived in Woburn Mass., in 1658 and Edward Converse died there 8/10/1663.

In those pioneer days when times were hard and money scarce, such a lost fell more heavily on the early settlers then many times its amount would to day. He spent the remainder of his life upon the homestead which he made for himself in Brookfield, Orange Co.Vt. He cast his first vote for President Washington. He social relations he was a Mason and became quite prominent in the circle of that fraternity. From this union there were six boys and six girls, of whom 9 grew to matured years.

Washington L.Converse-Born 3/24/1824-Warried first to Emily Hogan of Munson -Geauga Co.Ohio. lived at Fort Hill Ill. Married second time to Jane Hazen on 5/5/1854 also lived at Fort Hill Ill. He was readed reared in the usual manner of farmer lads. He may be truly called a self made man for his success is due to his own efforts. At the early age of nine years he was left an orphan and from that time has had to make his own way in the world the best he could. Begining at the bottom round of the ladder he has climed steadly upward, round by round, wntil at length he had attained a position of affluence. At the age of function nineteen he left the Green Mountain State determined to try his fortune about the prairie of the far west. He traveled by the way of the Erie Canal and then the Great Lakes to Petroit Mich., and from there on foot to Chicago Ill. There no railroads in those days, and it was no easy task to accomplish so long a journey. With ten dollars in his pocket, he arrive in Chicago, where he spent one season in the employe of Isaac Cook, one of the earilest settlers of that City, he having been sent out by the U.S.Government to oversee the building of the Canal. For two years following Mr Converse was engaged at work for E.B. ward, one of the prominent men in that early days. At length many like many others he determined to try his fortune in the Gold fields of California and started for the west, traveling by the way of New York City, down the Atlantic, across the Isthmus of Panama and up the Pacific Coast to San Francisco Cal. He at once began his labors in the gold mines of Dragoon Gulf or Poor Wans Creek and within three miles of Sonora Cal.

He experience the usual hardships and vicissitudes of the miners and after two years he returned to his old home, having met with excellen success in his undertakings. On his return ir Converse made his first pur purchase of land which consisted of a tract of 220 acres in the northwest part of Fremont Township. His first home was a log cabin and primitive structure still stands upon his farm, one of the few land marks which yet remains to tell of the progress and advancements made since pioneer days. Industrious and enterprasing he has made his land to bloom and blossom as the rose wind and the Converse homestead is now considered one of the finest farms in the locality. As his finincial resources were increased he also purchased other lands and has made many excellent improvements. In addition to general farming he has engaged quite extensively and successfully in stock raising. He is now the owner of a fine horse which was sired of St Lawrence breed and although he has nevered been trained, has a record of 2:38. He also has a high gradeof Holsteins and Jersey cattle and accommodations of his stock are most exe Excellent. after Mr Converse death, his wife married Jehiel Compton.
