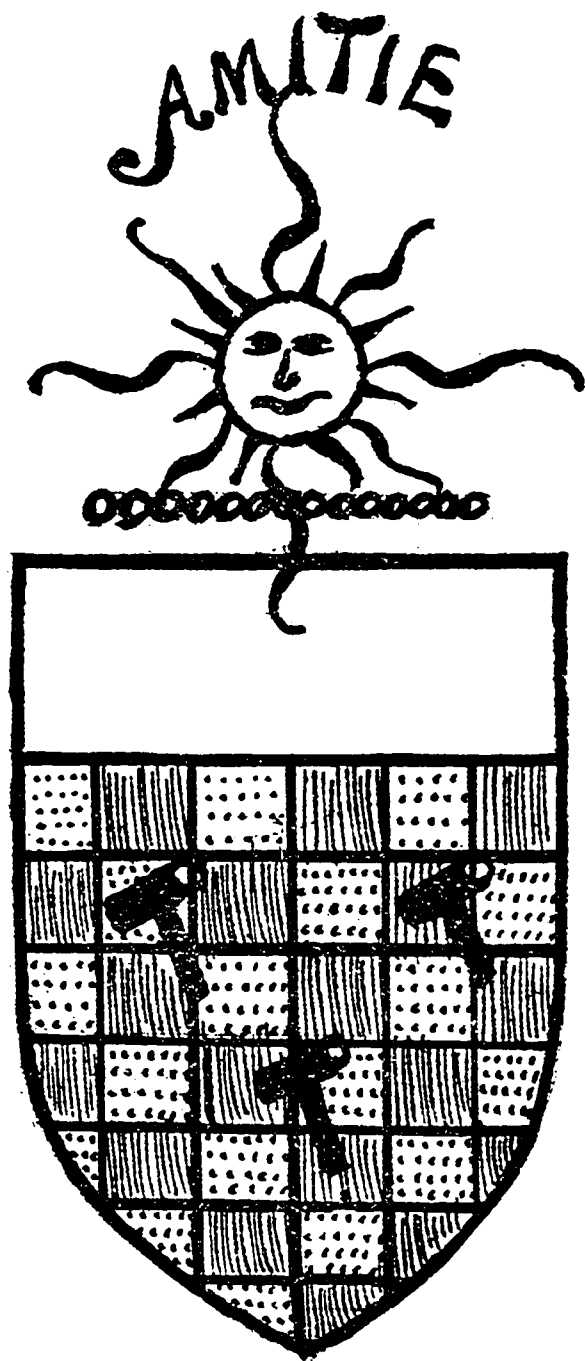

At Bingen on the Rhine a fortress occupies the site of the ruins of the chateau Klopp (called Drusus Castle), destroyed by the French in 1689.

From the ruins of the old chateau Klopp (or Castle of Drusus) which overlooks the town the prospect is magnificent.

The name Klopp seems to be an abbreviated form of Klopper or Clopper, who early settled in Bucquoy, France, and afterward emigrated to Holland.

CLOPPER.

The name Clopper signifies a knocker or beater.

Cornelius Jansen Clopper was living in New York as early as 1652. De Smiths Valley, or "The Smiths Valley," the origin of this name is ascribed to the circumstances that Cornelius Jansen Clopper, a blacksmith, established himself on the present corner of Maiden Lane and Pearl Street. Here he intercepted the country people from Long Island and pursued a profitable business.

Cornelius Jansen Clopper resided on Maiden Lane, or Fly, in 1664.

Valentine, speaking of that date, says:

"He had long resided on the corner of Maiden Lane and was considered in his day one of the wealthy citizens. He owned 33 acres, where he lived, now in the heart of New York. In 1655 I find his name as contributing \$600.00 to defray the debt for constructing the city defences."

He was of Dutch descent and estimated in 1674 to be worth \$10,000. At that time there were only ten men in New York worth that amount.

His wife's name was Heyltje Pieters. He died before 1686, leaving two sons and four daughters.

Heyltj'e Clopper, in 1696, was one of the owners of the district taken into the city. She was married the 2nd time in 1697 to Suert Olpherts and died a few years later. Suert Olpherts was by trade a mason, he owned considerable property, resided on Broadway, 2nd door from Exchange Place. At an advanced age he married the venerable widow of Cornelius Clopper in 1697. She died a few years later.

Cornelius Jansen Clopper's autograph appears as early as 1661.

Jan Jansz, son of Jan Van Rotterdam is apprenticed to Cornelius Jansen Clopper for three years to learn the trade of blacksmith, for which he is to receive board and a new suit of clothes and 130 Carolus Guilders.

In 1664 Cornelius Jansen Clopper is mentioned as guardian of Annetje Jans Child Bruyn, a boy, as was also Uncle Dirck Jans. Age Bruyns was the child's father.

In the name of the Lord Amen Know all men by these presents that in the tenth of September in the evening about Eight O'Clock anno 1669, appeared in their own persons before me Nicholas Bayard, Secretary of the Mayors Court of New Yorke City and the under named witnesses, Mr. Cornelius Jansen Clopper, Mat Smith and his wife, Heyltie Peters lawfully joyned in matrimony living in this City known to me Secretarie and Witnesses under written, the said Cornelius Clopper being sickly in body and the said Heyltie Peters of an indifferent health lying in child bed but both making full use of their senses understanding and memory as sufficiently appeared who considering mortality of life of man certainty of death and the uncertaine hour thereof, therefore and for other reasons them thereunto moving did declare to be minded to dispose in manner and form following first and before the appearants doe recommend their souls when departed from their bodeys in the merciful hands of their Saviour and Maker and their corps to the earth to a Christian like burial coming now to dispose of their temporal Estate to be left by decease first revoking making null and void by their presents all and every such testamentall disposition as they joyntly and severally have made and past before the date hereof and disposing the(m) now the Testators do declare with mutual love which they bear each other to have reciproque ever and ever nominated and instituted as they doe nominate and institute by these presents each other the survivants of them both in all the goods movable and immovable accounts credits money gold, silver coined and without coin Jewills Cloaths linnen wolen household stuff wampum and all other things none Excepted now reserved like the same by the first deceased shall be left by decease to doe therewith his or her own free goods without contradiction of any, with condition that the survived

liberation and premeditation Dodge and to take no place, the appearants giving to their said respective child or children the said alimentacon and donacon for and in the room of the legitime portion belonging to them according to Law ordering further their said children to accomlish and perference the premises in all points clauselesse and contents, on penalty that who shall oppose this directly or indirectly shall be deprived of what is made to him by virtue of these presents and in case the survivant shall happen to dy without marriage the Testators doe declare to have nominated and instituted to their only and universal heir and heirs their said children along or with the children which may be propagated during this wedlock and that in all the goods movable or immovable accons creditts money gold, silver coined and not coined Jewells cloaths, linen, woollen, household stuff and all other none excepted or reserved as the same shall be relinquished by the survivant by decease to doe therewith as with their proper goods they could or might doe without contradiction of any all the premises the Testators doe declare to be their last Will and Testament desiring that the same also or as codicill gift under the living or by decease shall be in full power and virtue although all solemnitys required by Law were herein not fully observed, esteeming the same to be the best forms as before exprest, requiring from me secretarie to make and deliver hereof acts in Communa forma done and passed also at the house of the Testators in the presents of Mr. John Vinger and John Johnston van Brestede Burgers in this City, who have signed with their own hands to the Originall with the Testators in the record of me secretarie in New York on the Island, Manhattan, in America, the day and year above said Heyltie Clopper did swear upon the Evangelists to execute this will and to make a true and faithful inventory and exhibite the same according to law the 26th of June 1690.

In Testimony wehereof I have caused the seal of the prerogative Court to be hereunto affixed at ffort William Henry the four and twentyeth day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand six hundred and ninety-three.
