HERB GRAFFIS Tale Of Your Tribe

Have you casually thought that your family's story was just another of the "simple annals of the humble poor?" Well, I've thought that about my folks.

Those of my relatives whom I happen to know or have known are people who span a gap of many years of history from a grandfather born in the 1820s to a granddaughter born five months ago. They are part of history in just the same way your folks are. Why you or I ever should be interested in our

families beyond this scope of personalities and time probably is a matter to which we've given very little—if any—attention.

If our forebears, as far as we know, were decent, sensible people, properly handling their responsibilities to their families, the neighbors and their nation, that's enough reason for pride and interest. Outside of that our ancestors are on their own and so are we.

But something I read in the Indiana History Bullctin gave me a different idea of family history. I began to appreciate

what my ancestors had done by taking a long chance and leaving Europe years ago to come to a wild new country, to which they contributed their lives and where they earned their reward in liberty, opportunity and some cash.

AS I READ THE BULLETIN piece it struck me that I was greatly indebted to these forgotten ones.

The Hoosier communique that stirred me to taking a look at the family record was written to Caroline Dunn, librarian of the William Henry Smith Memorial Library. It read, in part:

"The other day I was busy writing up the pedigree of my latest litter of English springer spaniels. This brood was the result of considerable planning and study of antecedents, and while the actual typing of 62 names was a bore, I looked upon the 30 names of champions in their six-generation genealogy with some pride.

"ALL OF A SUDDEN I THOUGHT—this pedigree blank is a useful piece of paper. Supposing I substituted the name of one of my children for the name of one of my dogs. Could I possibly trace our ancestry for six generations? And it seemed suddenly rather dreadful, that I could turn out animals whose background was carefully documented, and yet not provide the same record for my own children.

"When I thought of all the 62 people who composed a sixgeneration background, how they had fallen in love, married, had had children, struggled to bring them up to the best of their ability, from pre-Revolutionary times—only to be so completely forgotten that even their descendants didn't recognize their names—it was heartbreaking. Result: I went to the cupboard containing all the material donated by relatives; I fished out an official Spratt's pedigree blank, and went to work!"

To my relatives throughout the country:

I am hale, hearty and happy and at the age of 93 years on March 21, 1963, am as active as ever with lively interest in local, national and world events, as well as the world to come.

In order to increase the interest of my relatives in the Curtis family history and having a record of the names, locations and addresses of many descendants, I wish to share this information with those who are a part of the line.

So, I am furnishing you with this information to enable you to locate your relatives and contact them and visit or write them on occasion when living nearby or when traveling.

Also to furnish a family record for any who now or in later years, care to compile further family records and add to those I have previously furnished to many of the closer members throughout the country who now have them.

Our Curtis line began in England with Thomas Curtis, born in 1598 at Stratford-on-Avon. He came to America and first lived in Westerfield,

Connecticut.
