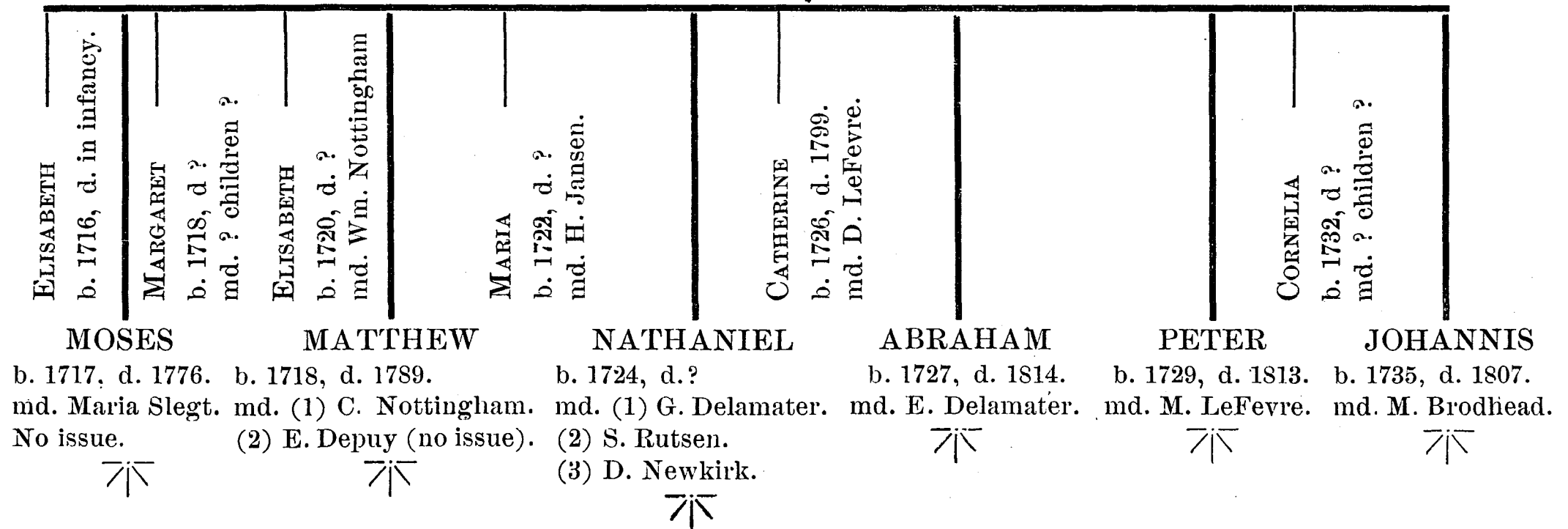

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The limited portion of the Genealogy of the Cantine Family here printed is issued for the purpose of drawing the attention of people who may have in their possession information which will be of service in the compilation of a fuller work which is now in preparation. There is much which is still required to be known, before full publication would be justified; although the work of compilation has already been carried on by the undersigned for more than twenty-five years. It was thought that if the *general* outline of the Family descent were known, it would aid in gathering the information yet required. The Genealogy is therefore given in the present publication in general outline as far as the point at which the various lines of descent begin to separate.

The intention of the Genealogy when completed is to comprise the names and dates of all persons descended from Moses Quantin the Huguenot Refugee who have borne, or do now bear, the name of CANTINE. The family, though not large in number, is quite widely scattered throughout the land. In certain parts of the country have been found persons of the name of Cantine whose knowledge of their descent is not sufficiently full and accurate to show just where their line touches the main line of the early generations. The brief genealogy now given may help to determine these hidden facts. At the end of this pamphlet will be given a list of names of persons, connected directly or indirectly with the Cantine family, concerning whom certain knowledge is necessary. The compiler is glad to be able to announce that when the required information is secured, the work will be put into print and ready for sale at a moderate charge as speedily as such a work can be published.

THE CANTINE GENEALOGY

MOSES CANTINE, the Huguenot Refugee, is the first member of the Family of Cantine. It is the tradition of the Family that he fled from Bordeaux, on the west coast of France, immediately after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes. This tradition seems to have a basis of fact. The Edict of Revocation was issued in the year 1685, and the fierce persecution under the form of the Dragonnades was renewed with an intensity that made endurance no longer possible. And it is shortly after this period that we find MOSES the Refugee in Ulster County, N. Y. I have reason also for believing that the place of his departure was the City of Bordeaux or its neighborhood: for his native village—or at least that of the Cantine Family—was ROYAN, a small town on the north side of the Gironde, the wide arm of the sea which reaches from the City of Bordeaux to the French coast, and into which the Garonne river empties itself. Even if—as seems most probable—the Refugee Moses left the land of his fathers in one of the smaller coasting vessels of his native village, and was taken on board of some one of the numerous English ships which, at that time, were making a business of transporting, for a remuneration, those Protestant Frenchmen who sought relief from persecution in flight, it confirms rather than contradicts the reliability of the general Family tradition concerning Bordeaux, as that city was the representative place of that district. In telling the story of their flight, the name of Bordeaux would be known where that of the little fishing village of ROYAN would be wholly unknown.

MOSES CANTINE,—or, as he writes it, MOYSE QUANTAIN,—first appears in the Huguenot village of New Paltz, naturally seeking companionship among people of his own race and faith. His name appears in the Sheriff's list of the Inhabitants of Ulster County as early as 1689, and there is evidence of his presence there at a still earlier date. He appears as a resident of New Paltz as late as 1702. He married ELISABETH DEYO LE FEVRE, who was the daughter of Christian Deyo, a Huguenot Refugee and one of the "Douzaine" who were the directors of the Huguenot settlement. She was the widow of Simon Le Fevre the son of Isaac Le Fevre, another Refugee and member of the ruling Dozen, or the Twelve Patentees, as they are often called. By this marriage there was born one son, who was baptized in the French Church in New Paltz by the name of PETER, on the twenty-first of May, 1693. After the death of Elisabeth, the date of which I do not know, Moses married on the 20th of September, 1703,

Mary De Witt, who was the widow of Boudewyn De Witt, the sheriff of Ulster and Dutchess Counties in 1701. As there was no issue by this second marriage, we are concerned only with the children of Peter Cantine, the son of the Huguenot Refugee and his wife Elisabeth Deyo Le Fevre.

PETER CANTINE married Elisabeth Blanshan, the daughter of Mattys Blanshan, Jr., (son of Mattys Blanchan, a Huguenot Refugee from Artois, France) and his wife Margaret Schoonhoven, on the sixteenth of June, 1715. They had twelve children, one of whom died in infancy,—Elisabeth. From the eleven sons and daughters are descended all who have in their veins the blood of the Cantines. From five sons come all who bear the name of Cantine. While it is the purpose of this Genealogy to record the names of the children of those women who were themselves Cantines in name, yet with the statement of these facts their line is completed, the further descendants belonging rightly to other family genealogies.

The CHILDREN of PETER CANTINE and ELISABETH BLANSHAN were as follows:

ELISABETH, bpt. 29 Jan. 1716; died in infancy.

MOSES, bpt. 13 Jan. 1717; married Maria Slegt; died 1776 without issue.

MARGARET, born 23 July, 1718; bpt. 24 Aug. 1718. Have no further knowledge.

ELISABETH, bpt. 21 Feb. 1720; married William Nottingham 8th of March, 1746; died about 1751.

MATTHEW, bpt. 15 Oct. 1721; married (1) Catherine Nottingham, 9 Dec. 1744; (2) Elisabeth Depuy.

MARIA, bpt. 27 Jan. 1723; married Hendricus Jansen.

NATHANIEL, (his name often appears as Daniel in the early records), bpt. 25 Oct. 1724; married (1) Gertrude Delamater; (2) Sara Rutsen; (3) Dorothy Newkirk.

CATHERINE, bpt. 20 Mar. 1726; married Daniel Le Fevre of New Paltz, March, 1751; she died 28 Feb. 1799.

ABRAHAM, bpt. 14 Jan. 1728; married Elisabeth Delemater 19 Nov. 1756; he died 26 Dec. 1814.

PETER, bpt. 28 Dec. 1729; married Magdalene Le Fevre 14 Nov. 1760; he died 28 Nov. 1813.

CORNELIA, bpt. 2 April, 1732; born on the 20th of March. Further information concerning her is desired.

JOHANNIS, bpt. 16 Nov. 1735; married Maria Brodhead (the date of the marriage is greatly desired); he died in 1807.

It will be readily seen from the foregoing genealogy and from the summary drawn up in Chart form, that all persons bearing the name of Cantine and belonging to this Family, will be descendants from one of the following five sons of Peter (the son of the Refugee Moses), namely: Matthew, Nathaniel, Abraham, Peter, and Johannis (or John). The other children are eliminated either by the fact that, being females, their children carried other names than that of Cantine, or, in the case of Moses, for the reason that he died without issue. The five sons mentioned are the grandsons of the Huguenot Moses, the common ancestor of the CANTINE Family in America. At the beginning, all these five brothers were residents of the town of Marbletown in Ulster County, in the State of New York. That place is now known as *Stone Ridge*. Here many of the descendants of Matthew Cantine still reside. Nathaniel's descendants are found, some in Albany, some in Sullivan County, N. Y., and elsewhere. Abraham's descendants are found mainly in the neighborhood of Kingston, N. Y. Peter's descendants are residents further up the valley of the Rondout, in Napanoch and Leurenkill. And the more numerous descendants of Johannis are now very widely scattered, though some remain in the region about Ithaca where their ancestor spent the later years of his life. After the war of the Revolution the great movement westward of the populations of the States along the Atlantic coast, affected nearly all the American families. Many of the younger generation of the Cantines, and even some of the elder members of the Family, changed their residence to regions farther west. Of course at this period the "West" meant the remoter parts of the Middle States. But the same migration occurred at the time of the discovery of gold and afterwards of mineral oil. The young men travelled westward to make their fortunes in the world, and the older to renew the losses of an unlucky past. These and like movements served to disperse the members of the old Colonial Families of the Atlantic States. The Genealogist of today has to follow, as patiently as he can, the track of the multitude westward; with the caravan of the Forty-niner to the gold fields of California, and with the stream of travel to the oil wells of Pennsylvania. It is in this spirit that this little publication is sent out now. And it is the hope of the compiler that there will come in return to him the information sought for in regard to the persons mentioned in the list at the close of this pamphlet.
