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INTRODUCTION.

The author of this Record, having for his own amusement and edification, collected from the Records, many dates relating to the Ancestors and Decendants of Holder Chace, of East Claridon, Ohio, and Clothier Hathaway, of Pompey, N. Y., was invited by some of the family to have it published. Not desirous of appearing as an author, yet being a member of the families (by marriage) he did not feel at liberty to refuse the request, though he well knew the task would subject him to much trouble and inconvenience. The work, such as it is, is submitted to the family in the confident belief that it will be found to contain records never before published, and that they can be relied upon as correct. The material has been chiefly obtained from family bibles and town records, of both Taunton and Freetown, Mass. The amount of labor both physical and mental, the work has cost, can be understood by those only who have themselves been engaged in some work of this kind.

In collecting some material, the author has been kindly assisted by several gentlemen, among whom he takes pleasure in mentioning Rev. William A. Eardeley, of Henderson, Me., historian of "The Chase-Chace Family Association," incorporated at Hartford, Conn., July 6th, 1899, and Mr. H. E. Hathaway, of Providence, R. I. To each of whom he is indebted for valuable information communicated and incorporated in this work.

WILLIAM CHASE.

“WILLIAM CHASE, he came wth the first company, 1630 he brought one child his son willia, a child of ill qualitys, & a sore affliction to his parents: he was much afflicted by the long & tedious affliction of his wife; after his wives recovery she bare him a daughter, W^{ch} they named mary borne aboute the middle of the 3rd month, 1637. he did after y^t remove intending to Situate, but after went wth a company who made a new plantation at Yarmouth.” “Mary Chase the wife of William Chase, she had a paralitik humor w^{ch} fell into her back bone so y^t she could not stir her body, but as she was lifted, and filled her wth great torture, & caused her back bone to goe out of joynt, & bunch out from the beginning to the end of w^{ch} infirmity she lay 4 years & a halfe, & a great P^t of the time a sad spectacle of misery: But it pleased God to raise her againe, & she bore children after it.” (N. E. H. G. R., 1881). Such is the language of the first church in Roxbury, now Boston Highlands, Mass.

William came over in the fleet which brought Governor Winthrop and his colony. He was one of Mr. Stephen Bachilor's company, who spent the winter of 1638 at Mat-tacheese (Yarmouth), and the only one who remained after that unfortunate enterprise was abandoned. October 9, 1630, he applied for admission as a freeman, and on May 14, 1634, he took the freeman's oath.

WILL OF WILLIAM CHASE,

(Vol. 2, part 2, p. 63, Plym. Records.)

I, William Chase, of Yarmouth, the elder, being aged and sick in body, but of perfect memory, thanks be to the Lord, do make my last will and testament, as followeth: First, I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin, after my decease,

one heifer calf and two steer calves, of a year old and upwards; also I give to my son William, who hath had of me already a good portion, the sum of five shillings, to be paid in any good pay, if he demand it. All the rest of my goods, cattle and chattels, I give and bequeath unto Mary, my wife, together with this my dwelling house, the land and all the appurtenances thereunto belonging; as also half of my lot of land at the Bass pond, which I bought of William Palmer, a middle line made, and that half part next to Darbey's I give unto her Mary, my wife aforesaid, as also my orchard and land I bought of Goodman White, now in my possession, all unto her use and disposing during her natural life, if she continues a widow, and when she dies, to dispose a third part of that estate God shall leave her, as she shall think good; the other two parts to our son Benjamin's part; but if it shall please God that she shall marry, my will is that she shall have a third part of that estate, and the other two parts to be to our son Benjamin aforesaid. Also I do make my wife Mary aforesaid, the executrix of this my last will and testament, and do appoint my neighbors Robert Dennis and Richard Taylor, tailor, overseers of this my last Will and Testament and have hereunto subscribed my hand this 4th day of May, 1659.

BENJAMIN CHASE, m. in Dartmouth, Mass. about 1673 Philip (pe), b. Oct, 1st, 1652, dau. of Hon. Philip and Sarah (Odding) Sherman. He was made a Freeman, May,

1674, at Portsmouth, R. I. He and his wife Philip(pe), joined the first Sabbatarian Church, Newport, R. I., April 17, 1717. He was selectman of Freetown, Mass. in 1698-9, and 1705; assessor, 1691; March 6, 1705 he was appointed "guardian unto his grand-daughter, Sarah Makepeace." He was a cooper by trade. His will dated Sept. 6, 1730.

Extract from the early Bristol County, Mass. Probate Records.

July 25, 1731.—The will of Benjamin Chace, the cooper was proved in the Court of Probate:

"To sons Benjamin & Walter all my lands in Freetown purchase. To grandson Benjamin Grinnell one 40 acre lot of land in No. 23, and also the 7th, share in 3d lot, it being a cedar swamp lot in Middleboro'. To daughter Barthiah Dunham one half of the 14th, lot near Baiting Brook in Middleboro' and one cow. To son Benjamin the 5th share of the aforesaid third lot in Middleborough purchase. To sons Benjamin & Walter all the rest of my lands in Middleborough. To daughter Philip Hathaway, & son in law Jacob Hathaway, all my land from & adjoining the land that my son Jacob Hathaway bought of my son Benjamin Chase & shall be a quarter Share in breadth & extending in leangth down to the river, always excepting 3 rods square which is to be reserved for a burying place & is to be in the south-west corner. Also to daughter Philip 20 pounds, & all my moveable furniture that I have removed to my son Jacob Hathaway's house. To grand dau. Sarah the wife of Isaac Hathaway one cow. To grand child Daniel Grinnell 5 shillings. Son Walter, sole executor."

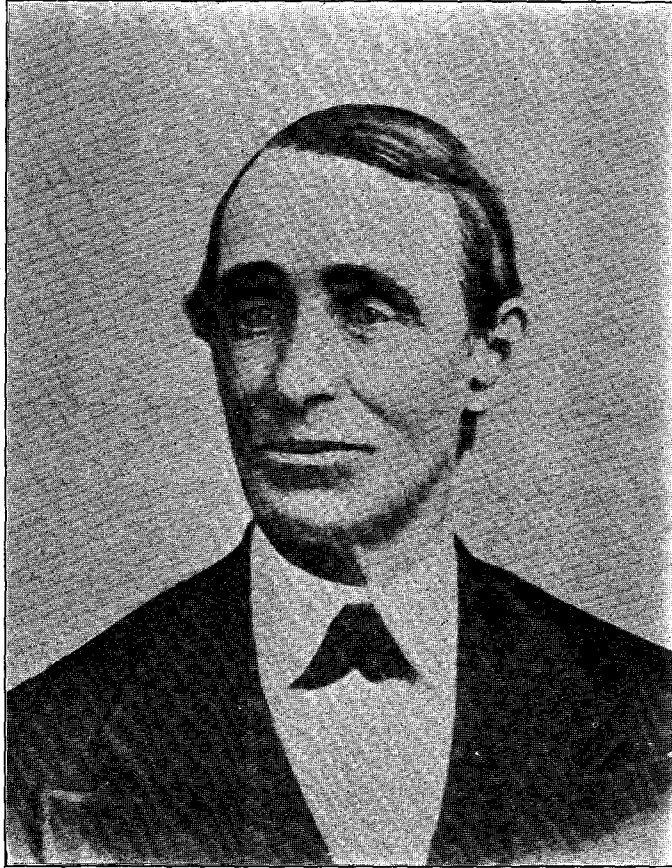

HOLDER CHACE, m. in Freetown, Mass. Dec. 18, 1811, Sarah, (No. 42 in Hathaway Record). They resided in Taunton, Mass., Capt. Chace's vocation being, sailing upon the ocean. In 1816 Mrs. Chace prevailed upon him to remove to Ohio, thinking to get him away from the water. He purchased a farm at what is now East Claridon, Geauga Co., Ohio. Mr. Chace could not content himself upon the land, so in the summer season, he sailed as captain of vessels on the Great Lakes. At one time while assisting in casting over the anchor out on Lake Erie he became entangled in the chain and was taken to the bottom, where he disengaged himself and came to the surface, much to the surprise of his crew. Capt. Chace was not born to be drowned but died Dec. 7, 1851, at his home at East Claridon, O., from the effects of the bite of a rat on his thumb.

ELNATHAN HOLDER CHACE, came in 1816, when but four years old, with his father to East Claridon, Ohio. Married in East Claridon, O., Oct. 13, 1833, Lucina, b. Oct. 1, 1811, dau. of Reuben and Phebe (Johnson) Kidder. Mr. and Mrs. Chace lived upon a farm situated on the banks of the East Cuyahoga river, one-half mile east of East Claridon, Ohio. His farm contained two hundred and fifty acres of land, which was under a good state of cultivation when he died, always kept a large number of cows, was one of the first in the Township to engage in the dairy business, also one of the first to erect a cheese factory in the County, which he built at East Claridon, O. in the year of 1861. He was largely interested in the building of the P. P. & F. R. R. a narrow gauge road that was built in 1873, was

engaged in securing the right of way from Chardon to Middlefield. In politics he was a Republican, and always took great interest in the issue of the day. Often heard him tell about going to Fort Meigs in 1840, time of the "Log Cabin and Hard Cider" campaign of Wm. H. Harrison. His last campaign, was for Jas. A. Garfield. Mr. Chace was highly esteemed as a citizen, being strictly a temperate and moral man, and of a social disposition.

They settled on a farm three-fourth miles north of East Claridon, lived there 14 years, thence removed to Rock Creek, Ashtabula county, O., where Mr. Ensign d. Dec. 23, 1855. Buried in Claridon, O. She removed with her family back to East Claridon, where she lived until her second marriage in 1860 with Jacob Gates, b. 1812, d. 1873 resided in Middlefield, Geauga Co., Ohio. She afterwards m. MELISSA CELESTIA CHACE, m. in East Claridon, Ohio, Apr 3, 1843, Burton, b. Jan. 12, 1822, son of Hiel and Elizabeth (Dow) Armstrong. They resided on a farm one mile north and east of East Claridon, O., until 1885, when they built upon the old Armstrong homestead, one mile north of East Claridon. Mr. Burton Armstrong enlisted as

private in Co. G, 41st Reg. O. V. I. Nov. 2, 1861, discharged a corporal July 11, 1862, by reason of disability and resultant Aphony, (loss of voice) which affliction he has at this present time. He has been connected with several cheese factories in Huntsburg and Claridon. He was with his brother-in-law Elnathan H. Chace in securing right of way for R.R. They always were shoulder to shoulder in politics, and were fast friends in every undertaking.

EDWIN RUTHVAN CHACE, m. in Hamden, Ohio, Nov. 30, 1851, Polly, b. June 6, 1830, dau. of Barney and Jane (McLean) Brady. They resided upon the old homestead in East Claridon, a few years. In 1861 he concluded to take Horace Greely's advice and "move west and grow up with the country," he settled on government land at Quasqueton, Buchanan Co. Iowa, where he tussled with the "Plain sod," improved his farm, dealt in cattle, and was fairly successful. Not of robust health, a man of literary taste, a great reader, with a good memory, he became one of the best posted men of his town, always strictly honorable in his dealings, making it a point to say something to those he came in contact with to make them feel good, he was universally respected and liked. A radical Republican, he took an active interest in the welfare of his party. After eight years residence in Iowa, he sought a milder climate and removed to Golden City, Barton Co. Mo. where land was cheap and most all unsettled prairie, engaged in farming and handling cattle extensively. In 1872 was elected as one of the three county judges, in 1882 was the Republican candidate for the legislature, but the large Democratic majority over-came his personal popularity and he was defeated. In 1883, the country having become settled, free range shut off for his cattle, land bringing a good price, he sold out, and with his family of four boys and three girls, nearly all grown moved to Wayne, Neb., where land was not only good but cheap. The advance in real estate, the prosperity which

It not being satisfactory, either to him, nor his family, they returned and purchased the Hall homestead in Huntsburg, O., where he now lives. 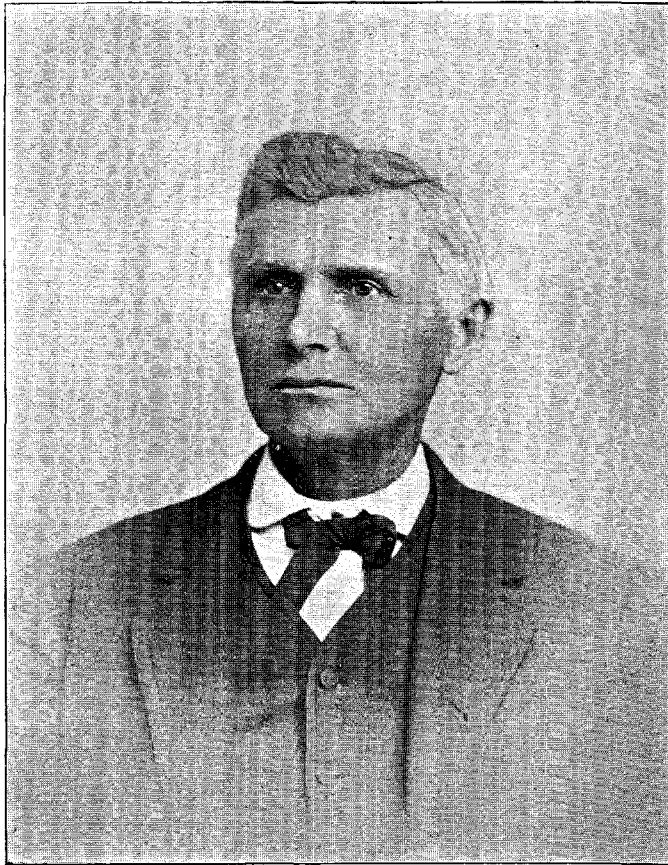

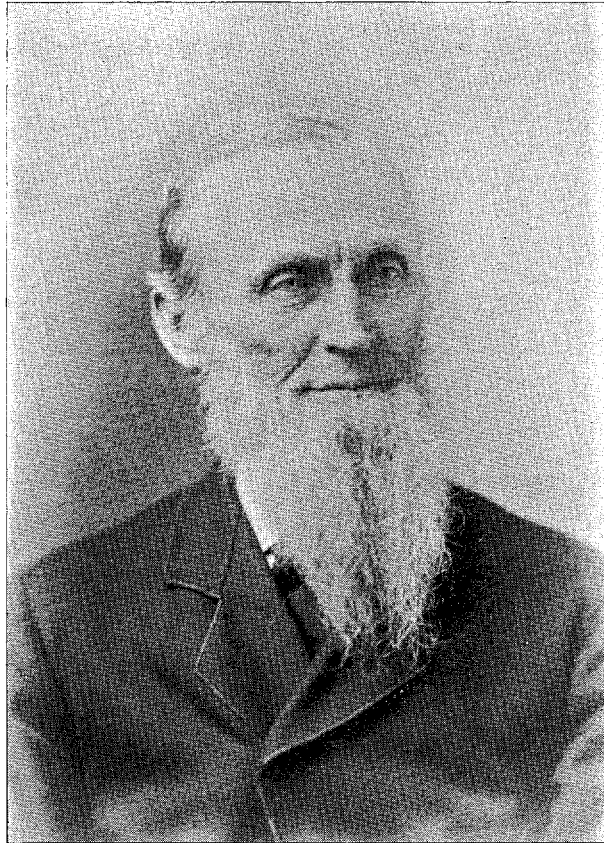
