DAME GENEALOGY.

"The family came from Cheshire, England, and were freeholders from the time of Edward IV., or thereabouts.

Where they formerly lived is now known as the "Parish of Leighton-Cain Minshal Vernon," in the town of Nantwick, in Cheshire.

The old farm is now called the "Red Hall Farm." A portion of it is known to this lay as "Dam's Crofts."

As near as could be found out the 7 mily mostly emigrated during the Puritan troubles in England in the seventeenth century, part going to Holland and a part to America. Whether the former became Van Dam or not could not be learned. One Christian, Tobias Dam, became quite eminent in Germany, during the latter half of the eighteenth century, as a theologian; and before that time Jan Dam was known as "a rebellious and troublesome subject" in New Amsterdam (now New York). There is nothing to connect these men with the English family except the name and the tradition (of the removal to Holland) spoken of.

One of the most interesting stories of the English family was about Thomas Dam, who lived to a very great age. He was born in the year 1494, died 1648, and was one hundred and fifty-four years old. He was buried in the church-yard of the Parish of Church Minshall, near Middlewick, in Cheshire (the place was famous for its old people). The register of Thomas Dam's death is still in existence, and is marked around with ink to call attention to the remarkable age. This is a copy of it:

Thomas Damme of Leiggton, buried ye 20th of flebbruarie being of the age of seven score and fourteen. 1648.

His wife is also buried in Church Minshall. He is said to have danced a hornpipe at the celebration of the opening of the present bridge over the river Weaver, at Church Minshall, he being then one hundred and four years old."

FIRST GENERATION IN AMERICA.

John Dam came from England in one of the parties with Captain Thomas Wiggans; settled in Dover, N. H., in 1633. He died January 27, 1690.

He, with Hall, were the first deacons of the First parish church, Dover, in 1675.

His will, dated May 19, 1687, was proved March 23, 1693 or 1694. His wife was Elizabeth, daughter of Lieutenaut William Pomfret.

In a petition to the Governor by the inhabitants of New Hampshire, 1689, John Dam and Nicholas Dam were signers. These two are mentioned by John Camden Holten in his list of Emigration of "Persons of Quality" to America between 1600 and 1700. No trace of Nicholas afterwards.

Deacon John! Dam had the first grant of land at the confluence of the Cocheco and Fresh Creek rivers, which was called Dame Point.

James Chadburn' Dame was a teacher at Barnstead, N. H., for many years, and died at Concord. His mother, Patience Chadburn, was daughter of Bridget Knight, daughter of Captain Knight, and granddaughter, by her mother, of ——— Shapley, who was taken captive by the Indians.

After the death of Joseph she (Patience C.) married, May 28, 1804, Captain Ephraim Chamberlin, who died February 14, 1814. Afterwards she married, August 20, 1818, Paul Hayes, who died September 3, 1821. She died November 30, 1836.

A portion of the will of Richard' Dame, Esq., is here copied:

"WILL OF RICHARD DAME, ESQ.

"I give to my son Jonathan all that land in Rochester which I purchased (in 1742) of Col. John Downing, Esq., which my son has now in his possession. I give to my son Benjamin all that land in said Kochester that I

purchased (1748) of Mary Gambling, and which he now improves by my permission. I give to my son Jabez all the land in Rochester which I purchased (1756) of Samuel Whitehouse, on which my son now dwells by my leave. I give to my son Timothy all of my real estate, of every kind, which I have in Newington and my new in the Meeting-house. I give to my son John all that land in Darham which I purchased (1764) of Benjamin Mathes. I give to my daughter Abigail Crommet all that right of land in the township Barnstead, which I had as original proprietor, and also onehalf of my movables within doors, and also fifty dollars, or equal thereto. to be paid by her brother Jonathan within three years after my decease, which, with what she has had already of me, is to be her portion. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Mathes all that right of land in Barnstead which I bought (1756) of my brother, John Dame; also one half of my provables within doors, and fifty dollars, or equal, to be paid by my son Timothy, which is to be, with what she has already, her full portion. I give to Richard Dam, son of my son Jonathan, the lot of laud I have in the fourth division of land in Rochester. I give to Richard Dam, the son of my son Benjamin, a lot of land in the third division in said Rochester."

"By deed (1769) Richard Dam, Esq., of Newington, gives to Weblard, minor son of Jabez, a lot of land containing one hundred and twenty acres, at Rochester."

(Rochester was incorporated May 10, 1722; first settlement 1728.)

Jonathan Dame was Town Clerk of Rochester from 1756 to 1771; also Selectman for some years. He married Mercy, daughter of Stephen and Mercy Hanson Varney, and granddaughter of Tobias Hanson.

Jabez' Dame, born August 14, 1732, at Newington, afterwards lived at Rochester, and died there. November 14, 1813. He was town clerk at Rochester from 1751 to 1753; selectman, 1770; representative, 1781. "He was senior member and also legal adviser of the old Town Council." He was in the expedition against Louisburg, Cape Breton, in 1758, and was said to have been complimented highly for his bravery and ability. He married Meribah, daughter of Simon and Martha Lord Emery, of Kittery, Me., a descendant of Anthony Emery, "whose family is noted for its distinguished jourists."
