PREFACE.

An individual number is given to every descendant, male and female, mentioned in this book. In correspondence or conversation descendants or others can identify individuals and avoid confusion by using these numbers when referring to any individual. By these numbers any individual noticed further on may be traced back to his or her proper family wherever mentioned.

The name of every child whose descendants are traced further is preceded by the number of page on which his or her own family appears, while the page number above each family is a reference back to the page where the head of that family appears as a child in his or her parents family. The character \mathbf{X} ("Page \mathbf{X} ") preceding the name of a child means that no further record is given of that individual or his or her descendants.

Records of this kind will always be incomplete and in this case it is my judgment that it is the safest and most advisable course to publish what I have already obtained rather than await the slow and uncertain process of accumulation of some of the data which will be found wanting.

In publishing this volume, I have three purposes in view: First: to verify and have errors corrected in those records I have compiled. Second: To show interested persons just what has been done and what information is needed. Third: To interest those who might give assistance if they were brought in touch with this work and their interest aroused.

It is my desire to trace the ancestry of George Darby back to their European home and to trace all the descendants of George Darby up to and including the present generations.

I wish to acknowledge my special indebtedness to Mrs. E. H. Darby, Germantown, Md., Miss Grace Darby, Dawsonville, Md., Mrs. Alice Darby, Washington, Kansas, Mr. C. C. Lomasson, Topeka, Kans., and Mrs. Ella Proudfit, of Kansas City, Kans., as well as all others who have aided in the work.

The author is working on a more complete genealogy and asks that all persons having additional information, corrections or criticisms send same to Rufus C. Darby, 127 Central Ave., Atlanta, Ga.

HISTORY OF DARBY FAMILY.

The earliest known progenitor of this Darby family was Joseph¹ Darby, who in 1686, was living in Ann Arundel Co., Maryland. Who were his parents and where they came from into Maryland are as yet unanswered questions.

We find mention at earlier dates of a number of Darbys in Maryland, any one of whom may have been the father or brothers of this **Joseph**¹. There was a Francis Darby who came into the province in 1654; a John and Elizabeth Darby in 1684; a James Darby and John Darby came in 1654 and another John Darby in 1664; a Thomas Darby in 1669; a John Darby in 1671, a Samuel Darby in 1678 and a Peter Darby in 1679.

The **Samuel Darby**, who was evidently a well off man, to have brought over 19 men in 1678, may have been **Joseph's¹** father. His land evidently was in Ann Arundel County, and it will be noted that **Joseph¹** names his second son **Samuel²**. The first, **Joseph²**, naturally was for himself, as in the olden times a man almost invariably named his first son for himself, and others for his own or his wife's father. No name, as a rule, were given as in our times, without a family significance.

Joseph Darby¹ may have come into Maryland from England or Virginia or some of the other older colonies. We know that about 1671 a John Darby came into Maryland from Virginia.

It is also interesting to note that at early dates a number of grants of land in Maryland were called "Darby."

In Land Records at Ann Arundel County Court House, Liber W. L. 2, page 237, dated 1702 to 1708 is found the following deed:—

At the request of JOSEPH DARBY and REBECCA, his wife, of Ann Arundel County, 1705, it is recorded that the said JOSEPH and REBECCA, have given and do give unto their son, SAMUEL DARBY one young bay mare branded on the near buttock with an horse shoe, one sow ear marked with a cross; etc: and also to their son JOSIAS one white fly bitten mare and a sow with the same ear marks, etc.

Josias², son of Joseph¹, was only born in 1695, thus being about ten at the time of his fathers gift, he got the "old fly bitten mare" that could not possibly hurt him, while Samuel², then a young man of about sixteen, gets a young mare, as he could manage her. Now George³, son of Josias², was born 1726, thus his father Josias², if born 1695, was 31 years old, a perfectly suitable time for him to have children.

JOSIAH² DARBY CHOOSES HIS GUARDIAN.

(From T. B.². A. A. Co., an old book of court proceedings found in cellar of Land Record office, Annapolis.)

"At a court of our Sovereigne Lady, Queene Ann of Great Brittaine exc, held at the City of Annapolis for Ann Arundell County, the Ninth day of August, in the Eighth Year of her Matyes reigne, ex Anno Drie, 1709.

Josiah Darby, comes into court and by consent thereof chuses Benjamine Gaither his guardian.

Josiah Darby by consent of his mother Rebecca Jones, binds himself to Benjamin Gaither till he attaine the age of twenty years, he being now fifteene years of age, and the said Benjamin Gaither to teach him to build tobacco houses and sett up tobacco hhds, and learne or cause the said Josiah Darby to read in the bible and at the expiration of the aforesaid terme to give him clothes according to Act of Assembly in such cases made provided"—(August Court, page 76).

Thus we find that the record of All Hallows A. A. Co. which gives the marriage of Stephen Jones and Rebekah Darby, October 26, 1707, applies to the widow of Joseph¹, who from this must have died before 1707, and as he deeded a horse to Samuel² in 1705, he must have died about 1706-7.

Another important item found in this Note, is the added pro of that Josias², son of Joseph¹ and Rebecca, and Josiah² were the same person.

As the orphan son Josiah² was then made to choose a guardian it would seem Joseph¹ died intestate, as otherwise he would have appointed his child's guardian. It also looks as if the other sons had married and gone from this county, or otherwise one of them would have been appointed.

These entries, added to the fact that Joseph¹ and Rebecca of Ann Arundel had a son Josias², born 1695, prove quite conclusively that Josias², father of George³, was this son of Joseph¹ and Rebecca, for whom he names a son and a daughter. In his will Josias² names both Benjamin³ and Josiah³ whose births are not given in the Queen Ann Parish Register Record, and as Josiah³ is given the home place, he was probably the oldest. On the other hand neither Joseph³ or Rebecca³ are named in the will, so they must have died before their father. He may have been still in Ann Arundel County and not have gone to Prince George until just before George's³ birth. Possibly Josias, Joseph and Josiah are all the same name.

JOSIAH² DARBY'S WILL.

At Annapolis, Capital of Maryland, can be found a small number of original wills, priceless naturally, to the descendants of the men who made them. Many of these are dilapidated from time, dampness, etc., but no matter what their condition they are absolutely priceless.

Among these wills, the descendants of **Josiah**² **Darby** have much to congratulate themselves upon in the fact that his has been found, with a personal seal attached, too mutilated to show what it is, unfortunately, but proving that it was his own, and not an official state seal, by the smallness of its size.

It should be distinctly understood that "making his mark" to a document in the early colonial days, meant absolutely nothing illiterate in the maker of it. The clerk of the court would write as his client dictated, even down to the signature in many cases, the latter merely making his mark to legalize the transaction. Genealogists and searchers generally in the old state records constantly find a man "making his mark" who they knew from history held the highest kind of position, social, political or monetary.

Note that John Gaither was one of his witnesses and Benjamin Gaither had been his guardian. Notice that the name (Darby) is spelled both with and without an "e". Both Ridgely and Gaither are among the oldest and most distinguished names in Maryland. The two families are closely related and connected in many ways and one of their family names is "Rezin" which we also find later in George Darby's descendants. This name is often found in the Ann Arundel County families.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JOSIAH DARBEY OF ANN ARUNDEL COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF MARYLAND.

(Found at Annapolis, Md., L. 36, page 116).

I devise to my Son GEORGE DARBY fifty-five acres of land (it being part of a tract of land called DARBY'S DELIGHT containing one hundred twenty and five acres laying in Frederick County).

I devise the said fifty-five acres of land to my son GEORGE his heirs and assigns forever to be laid out convenient to the plantation whereon my son GEORGE now lives.

I devise to my son BENJAMIN DARBY fifty-five acres of land (it being part of the above mentioned tract.) I devise the said fifty-five acres of land to my son BENJAMIN, his heirs and assigns forever to be laid out convenient

to the plantation whereon my son BENJAMIN now lives.

I devise to my son JOSIAH DARBY fifteen acres of land (it being the remaining part of the above said tract) to be laid out on the River commonly called SNOWDEN'S RIVER and next to the plantation whereon I now live. And also I devise to my said son JOSIAH fifty acres of land it being a tract of land called "DARBEY'S DESIRE" whereon I now live, lying in Ann Arundel County, that is to say, I devise both these parcels of land, after my decease and after my wife, HENRIETTA DARBEY'S, decease to my son JOSIAH DARBEY his heirs and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my loving wife HENRIETTA DARBEY all my personal estate of what nature or kind soever to her and her assigns forever. My desire is that my said wife shall be possessed unmolested with the said tract of land called "DARBYS DESIRE" whereon I now live during her natural life and after her decease to go to my son JOSIAH as before expressed. I appoint my wife, HENRIETTA DARBEY, my executrix and my sons GEORGE DARBEY and BENJAMIN DARBY my executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of February Anno

Domini, 1759.

Signed, sealed, published and de-clared by JOSIAH DARBY to be his last will and testament in presence of us $HENRY\ LEEKE$. WILLIAM RICHARDSON, JOHN GAITHER, JOSHUA RIDGELY.

JOSIAH X DARBY, (Seal)

On the back of the foregoing will is written

Ann Arundel County, November 3, 1767.

Came WILLIAM RICHARDSON, one of the subscribing evidence to the within will and made oath on the Holy Evangels of Almighty God, that he saw the testator herein named sign and seal this will, and that he heard him publish, pronounce and declare the same to be his last will and testament and that at the time of his so doing he was to the best of his apprehension of sound and disposing mind and memory and that he subscribed his name to said will in the presence and at the request of the said testator, and also that he saw HENRY LEEKE one other of the subscribing evidences sign his name thereto in the presence and at the request of the testator and in the presence of each other.

MARYLAND SST.

Charles Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon, Lord Baron of Baltimore, unto all persons to whom these presents shall come, Greeting for our Lord God Everlasting. Know ye that for and in consideration that JOSIAS DARBY of Ann Arundel County in our said Proince of Maryland hath due unto him 50 Acres of land within our said Province by virtue of a warrant for that quantity granted him the 27th day of April 1736, as appears in our Land Office and upon such conditions and terms as are expressed in our conditions of plantation of our said Province bearing date of 5th day of April 1684 and remaining upon record in our said Province together with such alterations as in them are made by our further conditions bearing date the 4th day of December 1696, together also with the alterations made by our instructions bearing dates * * * on the 12th day of September 1712 and registered in our secretary's office of our said Province and likewise together with our instructions bearing date at Annapolis the 14th day of June 1733, and registered in our Land Office:—We do therefore hereby grant unto him the said JOSIAS DARBY all that tract or parcel of land called "DARBY'S DESIRE," lying and being within Ann Arundel County and in the * * * of POTOMAC RIVER next adjoining that tract of land called HAMMOND AND GRIST: Beginning at a bounded Oak standing in the North 13 deg. East line of the said land and running from thence North 13 deg. East 172 perches then North 73 deg. West

* * perches then South 30 deg. West 72 perches then South 13 deg. West
106 perches then with a straight to the first beginning Tree, containing and now laid out for 50 Acres of land more or less according to the certificate of survey thereof taken and returned into our Land Office bearing date the 20th day of Oct. 1736, and there remaining together with all rights, profits, benefits and privileges there unto belonging (Royal Mines Excepted) as stated except the 10th clear parts of all other mines which shall'be found within the bounds of the said tract (which said 10th shall be Paid to our Office at the first month that is * * *). To Have And To Hold the same unto him the said JOSIAS DARBY his Heirs and assigns forever to be holden of us and our heirs as of our manner of Ann Arundel in free and common Sorcage falty onely for all manner of services yielding and paying therefore yearly unto us and our heirs at our * * *.

The city of St. Mary's at the * * viz: At the part of the annunciation

of the blessed Virgin Mary and Michael the Arch Angel by * * * and equal portions in the rent of five shillings sterling in silver or gold and for a fine upon every alienation of the land or any or parcel thereof one whole years rent in silver or gold or the full value thereof in such commodities as we and our heirs or such officer or officers as shall be appointed by us and our heirs from time to time to collect and receive the same shall accept in discharge thereof at the choice of us and our heirs or such officer or officers aforesaid provided that the said sum for a fine or alienation shall not be paid unto us and our heirs or such officer or officers before such alienation and the said alienation * * * county court * * * after such alienation then the said alienation shall be void and * * * and provided also that the said * * * DARBY or any other who shall have his estate in the promises hereby granted shall neglect or refuse to pay the rent herein recorded according to the tenor of these presents by the space of ten days after it shall and become due and the said Josias Darby or those who shall have his estate in the premises shall be requested by the receiver or other * * * who shall be appointed by us or our heirs from time to time to receive the same that * * * and in such case * * * shall be absolutely void and all the estate and title shall be

divided and claimed by virtue hereof shall lease and determine and us and our heirs * * * of the said land and of our former estate before this grant to any thing in this our grant * * * having given under our great seal of Md. our said province of Maryland this sixth day of Aug. in the 25th year of our Domain over our said province Anno Domini 1739 Witness our trusty and well beloved Samuel * * * adjutant General and Chief Governor of our said province of Maryland chancellor and * * * of the great seal thereof.

In tracing the piece of property "Darbys Desire" an interesting complication is found. In the Ann Arundell Co. Debt Books at Annapolis, Maryland, (the earliest being dated 1753) this property during years 1753 and 1754 is entered "Mr Joshua Darby to Darby's Desire-50 acres"; during 1755,1756,1757,1758,1759,1760,1761 it is entered "Mr. Josiah Darby to Darby's Desire-50 acres"; during 1762, 1763, 1764, 1765, 1766, 1767 it is entered "Mr. Joshua Darby to Darby's Desire-50 acres"; in 1768 is the entry "Josias Darby's widow to Darby's Desire-50 acres" and in 1769, 1770, 1771, 1774 (the last A. A. Co. Debt Book) is the entry "Henrietta Darby, widow of Josias, to Darby's Desire-50 acres".

In Ann Arundel Co. Rent Rolls at Annapolis, Volumn 4, page 172, dated 1753 is entry "Darby's Desire-50 acres-lying on the Fork of the Patuxent River neck, surveyed 1736 for Josias Darby who possesses it" (1753) and in Volumn 6, dated 1753, is entry "Darby's Desire-50 acressurveyed 1736 for Joshua Darby, possessed 1753 by Josias Darby".

The above notes are very important. First, Josias and Joshua were evidently the same man. This must be the fact, as only 50 acres are ever given and Josias did not inherit from Joshua for Joshua is still taxed after Josias is given, and the widow of Josias after Joshua, thus it must have been one of the numerous mistakes made by the clerks of those days. Also Josias and Josiah are given as the same. Henrietta's death must have been after 1774, the date of the last old debt book of Ann Arundel Co. at Annapolis.

A "Darby's Desire," 100 acres was surveyed 1714 for Darby Sheighane but disclaimed by Darby Sehand in 1736. (Rent Rolls of Kent and Cecil Counties at Annapolis).

DARBY'S DESIRE FROM JOSIAS DARBY TO GEORGE DARBY. (Ann Arundel Court House, N. H. 2, page 77, 1784-87.)

This deed made the 12th day of August one thousand seven hundred and eighty four, between JOSIAS DARBY of †Montgomery County, State of Maryland, of the one part, and GEORGE DARBY, of the County and State aforesaid, of the other part. Witnesseth that the said JOSIAS DARBY for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds specie in hand already paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by him the said JOSIAS DARBY, etc., hath granted, bargained, etc., to GEORGE DARBY, his heirs, etc., DARBY'S DESIRE, being in Ann Arundel County, etc.

This Josias³ is unquestionably the brother of George³ and son of Josias² who in his will 1759 wills part of Darbys Desire to son Josiah³. The wife of this Josias³ or Josiah³ Darby who sells "Darby's Desire" was named Drusilla and relinquished her dower rights to the property.

ADDITION TO DARBYS DELIGHT 137 4-10 ACRES.

(The original deed of these old tracts are kept in large envelopes, each numbered. In No. 9, unpatented, is found this deed).

The State of Maryland, Montgomery Co.

By virtue of a special warrant granted out of the office for the WESTERN SHORE, aforesaid, bearing date the 12th day of May, 1783, to resurvey a tract or parcel of land called DARBY'S DELIGHT lying and being in the County aforesaid, originally on the 3rd day of October 1748, granted JOSIAS DARBY for 125 acres; to correct and amend all errors and to add the contiguous vacancy.

I certify as surveyor of the County also that I have carefully resurveyed and laid out for and in the name of him the said GEORGE DARBY according to its ancient metes and bounds the aforesaid tract and parcel of land called DARBY'S DELIGHT and find it to contain one hundred and thirty two acres and nine tenths of an acre, etc.

The above deed places **Josiah's**² entry into the county before the year 1748.

In Debt Book of Prince George County at Maryland Historical Society, Baltimore, Md., on page 113, dated 1750 is entered "Mr. Josias. Darby to Darby's Delight-125 acres."

A "Darby's Delight" was surveyed 1742 or 1749 for Darby Ryon (Frederick Co. Rent Rolls, Vol. 1, page 91, at Annapolis). This Darby Ryon left no direct heirs and his will gives no clue to his antecedents.

George Darby and Benjamin Darby in May 1761, signed petition for a new chapel on the branch of the Patuxent known as Hawling's River, an Episcopal Church of Prince George Parish, in Frederick and Prince George County.—(Scharf's History of Western Maryland, page 745).

George Darby in 1777 was appointed overseer of road from bridge near †George Snell's to the fork of the road below Samuel Richardson's late dwelling plantation and from there to Coss Hawling's River, to intersect the road near Green's Bridge.—(Scharf's History of Western Maryland, page 697).

He was a farmer. In 1790, his widow owned eleven slaves. This family lived * * *. He died March 29, 1788, at * * *. She died February 11, 1818, at * * *.

On this tract are situated Sandy Spring and Ashton.—(Scharf's History of Western Maryland, page 773).

^{†-}Data regarding names and dates taken from an old manuscript in possession of Mrs. E. H. Darby of Germantown, Md., and supposed to have been written by Aden⁴ Darby about the year 1810. This manuscript gives date of George³ Darby's birth as January 12, 1726.

WILL OF GEORGE DARBY OF MONTGOMERY CO., MARYLAND.

(Found at Rockville, Montgomery Co., Maryland. Liber B, Folio 227, Probated May 5, 1788.)

I, GEORGE DARBY of Montgomery County and State of Maryland, being weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, do make and crdain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. Imprimis. I devise to my beloved wife, ANNA DARBY, my dwelling, plantation and all the land thereto belonging, also the personal property on my said dwelling plantation, during her widowhood, and at the time of her marriage or decease (which event takes place first) then my will is that my said dwelling plantation and all the land thereto belonging shall fall to my son REZIN DARBY and his heirs forever.

Item. I devise to my son BASIL DARBY and my son JOHN DARBY all that tract of land called "‡Amsterdam", containing two hundred eighty-four and a quarter acres likewise eighty eight and three-quarter acres conveyed to me by WILLIAM VEARS adjoining the above tract, to them and their heirs forever, to be equally divided between them.

Item. I devise to my son CALEB DARBY, all the tract of land called ''Dry Spring'' to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I devise to my son SAMUEL DARBY and my son ADEN DAR-BY and their heirs forever, part of a tract of land called "Called Ray's Adventure," which I purchased of GEORGE SNELL, to be equally divided between them.

Item. I devise to my son ZADOCK DARBY all that tract of land called "Hutchcrafts Range" to him and his heirs forever, but as my right to the said tract of land is likely to be disputed, if it should be taken from him, then my will is that he have the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds paid him out of my personal property, by my hereinafter named executor when he shall come of age.

Item. I devise to each of my children now living with me, the sum of thirty five pounds apiece to be paid them as they come of age, to be raised out of the property, now in the hands of my son BASIL DARBY.

I do appoint and leave my beloved wife ANNA DARBY and my son BASIL DARBY and my son JOHN DARBY, my whole and sole Executrix and Executors of this my last will and testament and desire all things herein contained may be complied with according to the true intent and meaning.

Witness my hand and seal this 27th day of February, 1788.

t-In "Patented Tracts Montgomery Co.," the only one I find that is mentioned in George³ Darby's will is "Amsterdam." This I think from the cursory glance I gave was made up of several other tracts. In these patented tracts of Montgomery, I find the Index gives "Basils Discovery" for Basil Perry, No. 53. The name Basil, an unusual one, and Perry both being given to George's immediate descendants, the significance you will admit is very strong. I also find a Wm. Rezin with patent No. 119.—(Extracts from notes of Miss A. E. Hull, Baltimore, Md).

DEEDS CONVEYING "AMSTERDAM" AND 883 ACRES, CONVEYED TO GEORGE DARBY BY WILLIAM VEARS, WILLED BY GEORGE DARBY TO HIS SONS JOHN AND BASIL DARBY.

John Darby sells to Basil Darby September 20,1817, his part of "Amsterdam", 284½ acres, and also 88¾ acres conveyed over to the late George Darby by Wm. Vears, lying in Montgomery, which tract was devised by the late George Darby to John and Basil Darby. Basil pays John for this \$5,000. A large sum in those days.—(Liber U, page 19, Montgomery Co. Records.)

April 2, 1828. Basil Darby deeds Samuel and George Darby, (his sons) for \$6,000, "Amsterdam," also $88\frac{3}{4}$ acres conveyed to my father George Darby by William Vears, also $7\frac{1}{2}$ acres conveyed to me by Edward Vears, also about 1 acre conveyed to me by John B. Dyson.— (Liber BS-1-Page 610, Montgomery Co., Md).

George Darby of Montgomery Co., in 1845, buys from George W. Dawson of same county, (which Dawson had been appointed trustee by the High Court of Chancery to sell the real estate of Basil Darby) the following pieces of land lying in the same county: "Amsterdam" "The Resurvey on Noneaton" and part of the "The Mary" in consideration of \$6,212.64.—(Deed Book, Montgomery Co., Vol 12, page 88).

DEEDS CONVEYING "DRY SPRINGS" WILLED BY GEORGE DARBY TO HIS SON, CALEB DARBY.

Denton Darby, of Frederick County, Wm. C. Dawson and Mary, his wife, and Dathan Darby, of Montgomery Co., March 15, 1610, deed William Clingan (Whereas Caleb Darby died intestate and possessed the following land viz: "Dry Springs" granted Samuel Glaze in 1753, containing 168 acres and "Flax Patch" surveyed for Caleb Darby, November 4, 1793, containing 2½ acres and "Addition to Dry Springs" granted Caleb Darby July 12, 1790, containing 7 acres and part of a tract called the resurvey of Friends Advice, conveyed Caleb Darby by Williams Hoggins, containing 50 acres and the part of resurvey on Noneaton conveyed to Caleb Darby by Wm. Viers, Sr., et al. all these tracts containing 287 acres and the said Caleb left the following children neirs-at-law, viz: a daughter, Mary, now intermarried with Wm. C. Dawson, Denton Darby, Dathan Darby, John Darby, Perry(grine) Darby, Rebecca Darby, Caleb Darby and Benjamin Darby, (the last five of whom are minors) for \$820.77, their portion of Caleb Darby's real estate (Susanna Darby, wife of Dathan, acknowledge this deed)—(Liber, O, page 506, Montgomery Co., Md.)

October 28, 1815. **Perry Darby** of Frederick County deeds William Clingan for \$450.00 his \(\frac{1}{8} \) interest in following tracts or parts of tracts Dry Springs, 158 acres; Flax Patch 2\(\frac{1}{4} \) acres, Addition to Dry Springs, 7 acres; part of resurvey on Friends Advice, and part of resurvey on Noneaton, same land for which **Denton Darby**, **Dothan Darby** and others gave Wm. Clingan deed for \(\frac{3}{8} \) parts.—(Liber small S, page 20) Montgomery Co., Md.)

March 12, 1816 or 1812. **John Darby** of Frederick Co., deeds James M. Dawson his $\frac{1}{8}$ part of the undivided following tracts and parts of tracts, to-wit: Dry Springs, Flax Patch, Addition to Dry Springs, resurvey on Friends Advice, and the resurvey on Noneaton for \$400.00.— (Liber T, page 65, Montgomery Co., Md.)

December 24, 1821. **Benjamin Darby** deeds Benjamin White his interest in $\frac{1}{8}$ of the following tracts and parts of tracts: Dry Springs, Flax Patch, Addition to Dry Springs, resurvey on Friends Advice, resurvey on Noneaton.—(Liber W, page 21, Montgomery Co., Md.)

July 13, 1824. Caleb Darby and Ruth, his wife, of Logan County, Kentucky, appoint Samuel Darby and Joseph C. White their attorneys to deed Benjamin White of Ben their interest in same tracts of land described in deed to William Clingan from Denton Darby and others.—(Liber X, page 490, Montgomery Co., Md.)

John and Benjamin Darby, of Franklin County, Pa., sell to Benjamin White, son of Benjamin of Montgomery County, March 4, 1830, their rights in., $\frac{2}{7}$ of $\frac{1}{8}$ of "Dry Springs" "Addition to Dry Springs", "Friends Advice" and "Noneaton" and "Flax Patch".—(Extract of deeds of Montgomery Co., Vol., 10, page 134).

Perry Darby of Huron Co., Ohio, sells to Ben. White, of N. C., Nov. 5, 1832, $\frac{1}{7}$ of $\frac{1}{8}$ of "Dry Spring" etc.—(Extract of Deeds of Montgomery Co., Vol. 11, page 313.)

DEEDS CONVEYING "RAYS ADVENTURE" WILLED BY GEORGE DARBY TO HIS SONS, SAMUEL AND ADEN DARBY.

Samuel Darby deeds to John Darby September 7, 1790, for 500 pounds his share of tract of land called "Rays Adventure" (John and Joseph Ray owned part of this tract at this time) containing 325 acres, also deeds lots of live stock and household goods. (Liber D, page 429, 430, Montgomery Co., Md.)

From this deed it appears Samuel sold out complete.

On May 24, 1815, **John Darby** of Montgomery County sells "Rays Adventure" for \$484.00.—(Vol. 6, page 286, Extract of Deeds, Montgomery Co., Md.)

June 11, 1816, John Darby deeds Benjamin Willett his right in "Rays Adventure". (Ruth Darby, wife of John, acknowledges this deed).—(Liber T, page 54, Montgomery Co., Md.)

June 26, 1812, Aden Darby, Sarah Darby, Richard Green, Ann Green and Rebecca Candler, deed Philip Duvall for \$1,000.00 part of tract called "Ray's Adventure" containing 134½ acres. (Sarah, wife of Aden Darby, acknowledges this deed).—(Liber Q, page 117, Montgomery Co., Md.)

May 1, 1819, Aden Darby and Sarah, his wife, Samuel Leek and Rebekah, his wife, deed Richard Green part of tract called Addition to Rays Adventure containing $134\frac{1}{4}$ acres.—(Liber U, page 518, Montgomery Co., Md.)

May 1, 1819, Richard Green and Ann, his wife, Samuel Leeke, Jr., and Rebekah, his wife, deed **Aden Darby** and **Sarah**, his wife, part of tract called Addition to Rays Adventure containing 134½ acres.—(Liber U, page 578, Montgomery Co., Md.)

July 21, 1818, John Darby deeds Darius Darby his interest in Rays Adventure.—(Liber U, page 386, Montgomery Co., Md.)

February 19, 1821, Aden and Sarah Darby deed Lyde Griffith their interest in part of tract called Addition to Rays Adventure, 133\frac{1}{4} acres.—(Liber U, page 374, Montgomery Co., Md.)

DEED CONVEYING "HUTCHCRAFTS RANGE", WILLED BY GEORGE DARBY TO HIS SON, ZADOCK DARBY.

Thomas Beatty, Sheriff of Frederick County, deeds George Darby, of Montgomery County, "Hutchcrafts Range" situate in Montgomery County beginning on the west side of the southmost prong of Great Seneca, previously called "Thomas's Gift" containing 250 acres deeded to Abraham Shockolls by Thomas Hutchcraft in 1764, and sold at public sale for benefit of creditors of Abraham Shockolls and bid in by Ephraim Gaither who assigned his rights to George Darby.—(Liber C. page 584, 585, Montgomery Co., Md.)

September 9, 1796, **Zadock Darby**, of York Co., S. C., deeds Zachariah Thomas tract called Hutchcrafts Range beginning at west side of furthermost prong of Grate Seneca, 247 acres for 274 pounds.—(Liber G. page 629, Montgomery Co., Md.)

WILL OF ANN DARBY.

(Book L, page 78-79, Montgomery Co., Md.)

In the name of God, Amen. I, Ann Darby, of Ann Arundle County and state of Maryland, being in perfect health of body and sound disposing mind and memory, considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs by will do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say, I give unto my son Samuel Darby, three negroes, that is Harry, Lila and Charlotte, during his life and after his death, my will is that Harry shall be the property of my grand-daughter Roda Darby and Lila the property of Drusilla Darby and Charlotte the property of Ann Darby, daughters of Samuel Darby. Then I give unto my son, John Darby, 4 negroes, that is to say Allen, Poll, Lige and Lucy, then I give unto my son Aden Darby 5 negroes, that is to say, Sam, Rachel, Nace, Ben and Harriot. Then I give unto my son Zadock Darby one negro boy named Simon. All the above named negroes are in the possession of my above named sons. Then I give to my 4 grandsons, James Ray, William Alford Ray, George Washington Ray, and Asa Ray, two negroes, Joshua and Jack, to be equally divided between them. The above named negroes in the possession of my daughter, Ann Blowers. Then I will my negro girl Leany and her child Lydda free from bondage. Then I will to my four grand-sons, forty dollars each, that is to say James Ray, William Alford Ray, George Washington Ray and Asa Ray. Then I give to my grand-daughter, Martha Ann Ray, ten dollars and all the rest and residue of my property to be equally divided amongst all my children and I do appoint my son John Darby whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and nine.

James B. Pleasants deeds **Reason Darby** November 6, 1789, part of a tract of land in Montgomery County called "Dickerson's Delight" for 12 pounds, 10 shillings, lying along Hawlings River containing 5 acres.—(Liber D, page 317, 318, Montgomery Co., Md.)

George Darby, gent, deeds William Knott, Planter, August 12, 1784, for 150£, a parcel of land called the Fox's Race Ground, in Montgomery Co., near a small branch called Buck Lodge, containing 50 acres.—(Liber B, page 249, Montgomery Co., Md.)

*OATH OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE NEW REPUBLIC.

In the year 1777-8, two proclamations were issued commanding all men over 18 years of age to declare their allegiance to the new govern-

ment by taking the following oath.

"I (Name) do swear that I do not hold myself bound to yield any allegiance or obedience to the King of Great Britain, his heirs or successors, and that I will be true and faithful to the State of Maryland, and will to the utmost of my power, support and maintain and defend the freedom and independence thereof and the government as now established against all open enemies and secret and traitorous conspiracies and will use my utmost endeavor to disclose and make known to the Governor or some one of the Judges or Justices thereof, all treasons, or traitorous conspiracies, attempts or combinations against the State or government thereof which may come to my knowledge".

At the D. A. R. Library in Washington, D. C., are three Volumns of "Unpublished Maryland Revolutionary Records" Volumn III gives returns of those taking this oath of Allegiance. In returns of Gerrard Briscoe is Josiah Darby (No. 22, page 1); in returns of Edward Burgess are George Darby (No. 230, page 19) and Basil Darby (No. 230, page 19); in returns of William Deakins, Jr., is Asa Darby (No. 4, page 39), and in returns of Elisha Williams is Benjamin Darby (No. 141, page 78).

For benefit of those descendants of George Darby who desire to join the D. A. R. the following correspondence is given in full:

would be entitled to membership in the D. A. R's.

I have your favor to City Clerk of this town in regard to Darby family, etc.

I enclose pencil sketch which will explain and give some information desired. The roads and rivers were traced from the U. S. Geodetic survey in 1907, residences were located from the "Annals of Sandy Spring by Wm. H. Farquhar, Historian and Surveyor" published 1884 and other positive data as follows, viz: Records of St. Bartholomews Parish, 1818, to date, and notes from the Chapel of Ease, 1761.

A list of lands with courses and distances owned by the Thomases; notes and records of lands surveyed by Wm. Grady, County Surveyor,

for 20 odd years, who lived and died near Sandy Spring.

The manuscript of an arithmetic written by Richard Thomas, also the names of slaves freed by the various Quaker families in the settle-

ment, 1788.

The ledger of a shoemaker, who boarded with Richard Thomas, also with Anna Beall, I think the widow of Charles, of the Manor. It contains work done for miles around from 1781 to 1788, also notes of personal matters of interest, for instance he bought his "liqure" from Samuel Thomas, a good old Quaker, a store keeper near or at Ashton. It would take quite a while for me to examine all the records I have, but so far I have been unable to find the tracts mentioned in the will, also any mention of **Josias Darby**. I find a **William Darby**, a geographer of note, living in the vicinity of Ashton. Taking for granted that ones neighbors would most likely be signer to will, and that he would be interested in road near him, etc. I should locate him between N. Boswell and Geo. Snell's.

The only way I can think of or advise to positively locate him would be to start with the transfer from Geo. Snell, mentioned in the will and trace the titles of adjoining lands, etc.

This County is filled with Darbys, most of whom I know, but am unable at this time to refer you to any of them who could give you the

desired information, etc.

§I am puzzled to know where **Geo. Darby** got his shoes, as I fail to find his name on the books of the only shoe-maker in the County for seven years or more, and you may be curious to know why I am replying to your favor to Clerk. I am one of the town Commissioners, I am register of St. John's Church, St. Bartholomews Parish, so have the Parish Records. I have done and do considerable surveying on the lands in question, so the papers were turned over to me as one most interested, etc.

The manuscript and book mentioned were found in the house of Roger B. Thomas, an old bachelor, after his death and recently given to me by one of our old citizens, who settled his estate.

^{§-}George Darby's family shoes, also Rezin's were made by a journeyman shoe maker who worked for families in their homes. My father mended all the family shoes when we lived in the country. He said he learned from the shoemaker who worked in the home of his grandfather and father.—Note by Susan Cookman Darby.

As George Darby lived in the Sandy Springs neighborhood and Richard Thomas, Jr., and Sr., were witnesses to his will these extracts from "the Annals of Sandy Springs by Wm. Henry Farquhar" are of interest.

"It appears from the earliest Land Records, that the first settlements (near Sandy Springs) were made soon after the beginning of the last century. The tract * * * "Snowden's Manor" * * *, was dated 1715; "Beall's Manor", adjoining it on the South, five years later. The "Charles and Benjamin", a tract of land beginning at a point not far from Hawling's River, and extending in a very meandering direction, nearly through the heart of the neighborhood * * * bears the date of 1718. In and among and around several of these tracts, an independent grant of near 2,000 acres was made to Major John Bradford, the 10th day of August 1716, and called "Charley Forrest", which must certainly be regarded as one of the chief "centres of settlement". (Page XV.)

It is time now to show that the true fathers of "Sandy Spring neighborhood" were not the first settlers. Neither Major Bradford, nor the Richardsons nor Charles Beall, nor Benjamin Berry had much to do with laying the foundation. Drawn to Maryland by the religious toleration denied them in the old world "The Friends" or "People Called Quakers" appeared in this colony in considerable numbers at quite an early period.—(Page XVIII) * * *. In the minutes of an ancient monthly meeting held at the Cliffs and Herring Creek is contained the first mention that I have seen of the "Meeting at Sandy Spring", presenting its report to the former meeting on "the 27th of the 7th month, 1753." The first members composing the meeting appear to have belonged to the Brookes, the Thomases and Snowdens. It was in 1742 that Richard Snowden conveyed 500 acres, part of his Manor to Philip Thomas. It is stated on the Genealogical Tree of the Brooke family * * that James Brooke settled at "Charley Forrest" in 1728, and founded in our country the well-known family of that name. (Page XIX.)

The Friends Meeting being thus organized principally by the Brooke and Thomas families * * *, these energetic colonists proceeded with the serious business of subduing the wilderness * * *. It was said by William Darby, (in 1830 William Darby published a sketch of the Sandy Springs neighborhood in a popular magazine of the period), the highest geographical authority ever domiciled among us, that when the house standing on "Charley Forrest" * * * was first erected, it was the only framed building between here and Canada.

I will now mention the families that then (1797) composed the Society of Sandy Spring Meetings. I begin with Evan Thomas and Mary Brooke. Then follow John Thomas and wife, Richard Thomas, Sr., and Richard Thomas, Jr., Basil Brooke, Gerard Brooke, James Brooke, Samuel Brooke, Thomas Moore, Bernard Gilpin, Caleb Bentley, George Chandlee, etc.—(Page 279)."

I, Asa Darby, of the District and State aforesaid, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make this my last Will and Testament, in manner following: that is to say, my will and desire is that I be decently buried and that all of my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease, as conveniently can be.

FIRST. I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife, Dorcas Darby, all of, or such part of my personal property as she may think proper to keep during the term of her natural life, and at her death to be divided and disposed of as

hereinafter described.

SECOND. It is my will and desire that after my decease, all that part of my personal property which my wife Dorcas may not think proper to keep for her support, be appraised and equally divided if practicable, if not, I desire it to be sold, and equally divided between my children, John Darby, Thomas Darby, James Darby, William J. Darby, Lydia Sanders and Mary Humphries, each a share and my grand children heirs of my son George Darby a share, and Thomas

LETTERS WRITTEN IRA COLUMBUS DARBY BY HIS MOTHER'S SISTER, ELIZABETH L. ALLNUTT.

Fairview, Nov. 26th, 1851.

My Dear Columbus:-

I received your letter on the 18th ins. announcing my sister death, which I was sorry to hear, though she lived to be a good old age. I want you to write to me immediately after you get this, and let me know how long she suffered. I saw her death announced in the Glasgow paper since I heard from you. I saw William a short time since, he was very much pleased with the Country and still talks of emigrating there. Franklin was also very much pleased. William brought the piece of gold to Aulda. She desired me to tell you she is very much obliged to you for it, and she has a very handsome ring made of it and yours and her name in it. William says you must pardon him for not writing to you, he wrote a letter but it did not please him and he would not send but he intends writing very soon.

We have had a very dry season, consequently there were short crops of corn and tobacco made, but very good wheat crops. It is quite cold today, and we have a right smart snow, fell on the 25th, but I am in hopes it will not last long. We are all well at present and our neighbors generally. I am sorry to hear that the children have the chills, they are very unpleasant, you must take care of them or they will have them all winter.

There will be a great time here Christmas I suppose. There are several weddings to come off, Margaret Allnutt, Lawrence Allnutt's eldest daughter, and Franklin White are to be married at Christmas, they will have a very large wedding which is very pleasing to the young folks about. They are all great hands for parties. I heard from your Aunt Jane Perry not long since. They were all well with the exception of Angelina's youngest child, that was quite sick when she wrote. Ann has two pretty children, a son and daughter; she had three but lost one some time ago. I received a letter from Jane Allnutt a short time ago, and

James one from Hawkins, they were quite well, and Verlinda is a member of the Baptist Church. They are living 10 miles North of Columbia, in Perchee township, the school district.

Avilda and myself spent two weeks in Fredric County this summer with your Aunt Polly and William, while we were there Catherine had twins, a boy and girl, so much for Williams going to Missouri. Gilmore Allnutt was here last Sunday, his mother and all were well, Ellen is not married yet and no prospect.

Write me how long sister Sallie was sick and where she and brother Hocken is buried. I feel a desire to know.

Give my best love to all my nephews and nieces and to Catherine and the children, and tell her that she might have written to me ere this. I would be pleased to receive a letter from her.

I have nothing more to write. James Allnutt unites with me in love to you all. Write soon and believe me to be your affectionate Aunt.

Fairview, June 23rd, 1856.

My Dear Columbus:-

We received yours 3rd and was very glad to hear from you and that you were well was a source of great comfort to me. At present we are tolerable well, my health still delicate, and I may never expect it otherwise as age advances, of course constitution gives way. Ann, Aulda, and the two little boys are as well as usual. Ann has a great charge on her, the whole family, everything is just as James left it. Had an appraisement, but no sale; his personal property amounted to nearly 30 thousand dollars, Sam is left free and is manager for Ann, the servants all go on well, if anything better than usual, all strive to do for the best and I hope it may continue so; their crop looks beautiful and a very large one out, 200 acres in corn, upward of 200 in wheat, 25 or 30 in oats, and all look well, fine gardens everywhere. Your Aunt Jane Perry lives at the old place, she and Eveline, they have a fine garden, plenty of poultry. Eveline is up at Ann's about 6 weeks. Jim will be over this evening to help harvest, they commenced this evening, run 8 cradles, 1 horse rake, old Ben and Leathy to gather, 1 to cook, with runners for water, make up the party. I hope no accident may occur, and all get on well, they got through with a large harvest last year in 8 days, and no trouble. Ann says you must come in this fall, and bring your family and we all send a name for the little boy, James N. Allnutt, after your Uncle James.

Of late years traveling is nothing, starting is all, if you can come we shall be glad to see you. Our neighbors are all tolerable. Your Aunt Polly died about three weeks ago with Erysipelas, sick but a few days. Aunt Henny, Ann's mother, died 30th day of March, with an Appoplexy or something like it, taken suddenly, lived two days, and expired with but little suffering, apparently. John Vier's wife was buried Whitsuntide, had a cancer. Polly White died two weeks after her. Susan Darby, Ben Gott's wife, died in Whitsuntide with consumption, left 2 children.

Your Uncle George is about to add to his house, build a room, a passage and raise the old one, directly after harvest. Lawrence and Sally Chiswell is to be married this fall. Thomas Darby keeps store in Dawsonville, doing well. Nathan Allnutt bought part of old Andrew Offutt farm yesterday, and its thought John Darby will buy the other part, where the building is. Sam Dyson bought Fiedler Darrell farm and croping there. Since guano came to notice, you would not know your Uncle Hawk's place. Joseph Dyson keeps school. Ben's health is delicate. James Dawson bought Levi Vier's farm and lives there, looks fine, an old bachelor, neither of his sisters are married, the old man is a widower and

looks well. Nancy D. died last August. Nick D. is round and fat as a pig, with 2 children, and a nice wife, Miss Prince. Becky Allnutt and Gilmore, its thought, will be married in July. Jim and Ellen are farming in Virginia. Old Mr. Wilson is dead. Mrs. Reese still living, they carry on as usual. Old Mr. Gilmore is to preach Polly's funeral in July if nothing happens. The old man begins to look feeble. Mr. Wates, the preacher, spent the day with us two weeks ago with Bennie A. He is fat as a jack and so is Lawrence, both doing well. Margaret married Frank White, have one child. Elisha Williams died last August, his widow lives at the home place. I will send you a paper now and then. George and Joseph's folks are all well, and doing well. Sally Dawson's family also, none married. Barbara A. Brown is to be married soon to Higgins, a very steady young man, so its said. They lost their only man last week. Joe and old Aunt Sal, old Aunt Lid. is still living, Milly and all the rest of George Darby's people are all well, old Hannah at Laurence is trying to be baptized. Lucy and Ben looks write smart, and wishes to be remembered to you. Charles has a wife and one son, great joy, they live at the old place as usual. James built a fine barn there before he died, poor fellow, although he has been gone 12 months, still the cavity is as fresh as but yesterday, oh that day, shall we ever forget it, but I trust he is reaping his reward in the mansions of bliss, far far from all trouble and cares. God did it for a wise purpose, and all is right, his two little boys, James N. and Robert Henry Clay, are fine little fellows, both out this evening in the harvest field, Bob. is very large for his age, James is delicate and looks like his papa, Bob is more of the Dawson, dark eyes and hair. They have not been to school yet, but learn a little at home. We have had a plenty of rain for the last 10 days, fine for corn and the greatest quantity of fruit. I think if you could come in you would like the change. Guano has made us look up with you western farmers. Mr. Darby, cousin to your Uncle George from Pennsylvania, has bought Senica Mills, built a fine house, and carry on the mills. Do you ever see Davis Perry? his mother would like to hear from him, and what he is a doing. it. I send a paper now perhaps you would like to see it. How does Sarah come on? Becky has 2 children, health not good. Becky has 2 children, health not good. I wrote you word old George Hager was dead, died last August. The wagon ran over Harry Noland this week and hurt him pretty smart. Dr. Vinson lives at Wash Peter place sold his farm to Nancy Vinson. Benonia Allnutt bought Jim Peter place and is farming it in common also Mrs. Vinson lower place.

Give my love to Kitty, and all my connections. Its a great pleasure to hear from you all, do write oftener, and more fully, your letters are too short, tell Kitty to hang up now she has had enough. Avilda love to you and Kitty, says come in this fall and she will tell you a secret. no doubt its worth a trip down the Mississippi.

Hawkins, lives in Boon County, Columbia. I wish you could go and see them, we had letters from Nell a few months ago, she tells she has a fine husband and doing well, has one child, they will come to Missouri this spring and bring plenty of gold.

Tuesday all well, rainy weather, for harvesting but looks a little like fair weather, we shall go to cutting after breakfast. I will now close by requesting you to write often. Ann and Avilda join with me in love to you and Kitty and all enquiring friends, farewell, be a good boy, don't let the Kansas fever rage to high in you. I also will my negro women, Sal and Allen, free from bondage at my decease, I will unto my nephew, John Washington Darby, the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, after paying all my just debts, out of the same which money is to be collected by my executor hereafter named, in January, 1819, from the money due me from Basil Darby. also give unto my nephew, Charles Alexander Darby, the sum of twentytwo hundred dollars to be paid to him out of the money due me from Basil Darby, to be collected by my executor as before directed, in January, 1820. I also give unto my niece, Rebeckah R. Darby, the sum of \$300 to be paid to her in January 1820, as before directed out of the money due me from Basil Darby and at the death of my wife, Ruth Darby, I give the plantation whereon I now live to my nephew, Nicholas R. Darby, to him and his heirs forever and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother, Aden Darby, to be my sole executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament, in witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 24th day of October, 1818.

Also all my stock including horses, black cattle, hogs, sheep and household and kitchen furniture, also all my implements of husbandry, including wagons, geers, and everything appertaining or made use of as implements of husbandry and the crop on my farm above mentioned and also my wearing apparel, provided, nevertheless, and my will is that she pays all my just debts, and reserves two hundred dollars to be hereafter disposed of in my will.
- 2nd. I give and bequeath to my daughter, **Delilah Darby**, alias Delilah Gingles, the plantation whereon she now lives during her life and at her death to be equally divided between her children. Note the two hundred dollars which as reserved or exacted of my wife, **Mary Darby**, is to be placed in the hands of my executors and by them put out to interest, the interest of which is to be paid annually to the said **Delilah** Gingles at their discression.
- 3rdly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, **Jahe Darby**, alias Jane Smith, the other half of the plantation I now live on during her life time and at her death to my grandson, Zadock D. Smith, to have and to hold the same forever, also to my daughter, Jane Smith, all the balance of my negroes, namely, Frederick, Carity and her youngest child, not yet named, and John and Hamilton to have and to hold the same forever.
- I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Mary Darby, William Campbell, of York District, S. C., and Isaac Price, of Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina, to be the executors of this, my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all and every other will and wills at any time heretobefore by me made, and do declare this to be my last will and testament. In testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 27th day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty four.

THE WAR OF 1812.

The war of 1812, coming as it did as an after clap of the Great Revolutionary storm, was met in Maryland by an unconquerable body of men; those who had grown middle-aged in the pride of their former hard won victories, and youths who had drawn military inspiration from their mothers breasts, and had come to manhood in the hearing of constantly repeated tales of their sires and grandsires valor.

The history of this famous war, which must ever stand for thin the annals of Maryland as a particularly vivid and interesting period, is too well known to be repeated in these pages; but it must always be a source of pride and deepest interest to those bearing the name of **Darby** to know that in the lists of officers and soldiers of that memorable time, three of their name appear, each holding a place of distinction.

Lower down this same page is entry: March 7, 1678. Warrants then granted to Col. T. Tailler of A. A. Co., 950 acres due by assignment from Samuel Darby, etc.

(Note.—It is very hard to give the exact copy of these old deeds, not only on account of the writing and bad spelling, but words are often left out. There is no reason why this **Samuel**, who was evidently a well off man, to have brought over 19 men, could not have been **Joseph's**

father. His land evidently was in A. A. Co., and it will be noted that **Joseph** names his second son **Samuel**. The first, **Joseph**, naturally was for himself, as in the olden times a man almost invariable named his first sons for himself, and his own or his wife's father. No name, as a rule, was given, as in our times, without a family significance).

In will of Wm. Grose of Kent Co., 1709, Elizabeth Darby is one of executors. (Vol. 3, page 173, Maryland Calendar of Wills). As Kent Co. touches Talbot Co., Dorchester Co., being a part of the latter until 1668, it is to be presumed that Elizabeth belonged to the Talbot line of Darbys.

Laurance Grose, of Kent Co., in will dated October 31, 1709, probated May 29, 1710, appoints as executors Renatus Smith jointly with Eliza Darby, Spinster. (Maryland Calendar of Wills, Vol. 111).

Of the only two inventories of the **Darby** family at Annapolis through 1777, at which period the countries were no longer obliged to send in their records, the first at a very early date, October 5, 1717, is that of **William Darby** of Kent Co., one of the earliest formed counties in the State. (Inventories and Accounts at Annapolis, Md., 39-A, page 5.)

Wm. Darby, of Kent Co., wife Susanna, who afterwards married Robert Meeks, or Meek. (Testimentary Proceedings, Annapolis, Book 23, 1718-19).

CALVERT COUNTY, MARYLAND.

Calvert County Rent Rolls. (Maryland Historica! Society 1651-1723)

(These dates mean that the earliest record was made in 1651, and the last survey in 1723. When the words "possessed by" follows an extract it signifies "now in possession of").

600 acres 12 shillings quit rent. "Theobus Manning" surveyed October 2, 1651, adjioning the land of John Norwood, this land was patented in the name of Thomas Manning and *Edward Darby but afterwards patented in the said Manning's name only. Thos. Manning possesses 300 acres, Richard Dallam 100 acres, Daniel Philips 170 acres and James Roberts 30 acres. (Page 11).

200 acres 8 shillings. "Darby" surveyed March 22, 1679, for Francis Buxton, on East side of Patuxant River at the head of Parkers Creek, beginning at a Red Oak at the line of Nicholas Turner, possessor, Richard Jones. (Page 7).

BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND.

"Nathaniel Darby married to Elizabeth Demitt, widow, April 10th, 1712". (Page 146) "son Nathaniel born February 16, 1722". (Vol 1, page 4, Parish Register, Maryland Historical Society, St. Pauls, Baltimore, Md.)

"Darby" surveyed January 2, 1724, on east side of Back River, for Nathaniel Darby, later possessed by the widow Darby and Philip Jones. (Baltimore Co. Rent Rolls, also on A. A. Co. Rent Rolls at Annapolis, Vol. 2, page 541).

Note.—The Baltimore branch of the family evidently had its beginning in one Nathaniel Darby who owned a tract of land called "Darby" in Baltimore Co. (see patented and unpatented tracts No. 1344, Baltimore Co., Annapolis.)

In "Testamentary Proceedings, Annapolis, L. 26, page 11, 1722 **Nathaniel Darby** is found going security for the executor of one Wm. Farrfarr.

In one Baltimore Co. Debt Book, the only one examined at Annapolis, 1762, page 25, is entered "The widow **Darby** to part of Dodd's Range and to part of **Darby**". (She is taxed through 1769; 1770 does not appear. She was probably widow of **Nathaniel Darby**.)

"Darby's Fancy" 100 acres surveyed February 27, 1717 (or February 7, 1707) for Nathaniel Darby (A. A. Co., Rent Rolls at Annapolis, Vol. 2, page 483 and Vol. 5, page 202), possessed 1753 by Ebenezer Pumphrey. (Vol. 4, A. A. Co. Rent Rolls).

Luke Darby, son of Nathaniel in 1739 gives deed for "Darby's Fancy" to Ebenezer Pumphrey. (Land Records at A. A. Court House, R. D. 2, page 191).

Luke Darby of Baltimore Co. 1742, in his will recorded at Annapolis L. 23, page 25, names Philip Jones, Jr., to whom he bequeaths "Darby" in Baltimore Co., and speaks of "my wife".

^{*-}This grant was made to Edward Darcy (progenitor of the Hockly Branch of the Dorseys of Maryland) but incorrectly entered on Calvert Co. Rent Rolls as belonging to **Edward Darby**. (Side Lights on Maryland History by H. D. Richardson. Page 88).

"February 4, 1799, John Gillnor married to Rachel Darley, or Darby." (Parish Register, Maryland Historical Society, St. Paul's, Baltimore, Md. Page 368, Vol. 2).

Elizabeth Darby, daughter of John Barry and Elizabeth Darby, born January 22, 1800. (Page 56, St. James Parish Register).

Marriage Licenses, Baltimore Court House, Beginning 1777 up to 1812.

Michael Darley and Carolina Miller, September 16, 1788. Darby Lux, and Mary Nicholson, February 20, 1798.

John Darby and Harriet Milbourne, January 19, 1799, by Richards (minister).

The Maryland Magazine was begun by the Maryland Historical Society, in 1906. In this through the year 1911, is found in Vol. 4, page 19-21. "In Baltimore yearly meeting, held * * *, 12th day of tenth month to the 16th day, 1795 * * * Deborah Darby and Rebecca Young produced certificates to the yearly meeting, both from the monthly meeting held at Coalbrookdale, Shropshire, England, * * *, 1793, endorsed by the yearly meeting for Wales held at Hermarthen, the 25th of 4th month, 1793, * * *. Also certificates from the yearly meeting of ministers and elders * * *, in London * * *, 1793. The Company and labors of love of those friends from Great Brittain are acknowledged to have been satisfactory to Baltimore yearly meeting * * *. (This note is particularly interesting as possibly placing a branch of the Darby family in Shropshire, England).

In an interesting article, in Volume 4, page 373 of the Maryland Magazine, under date of December 3, 1774, among the names of the Baltimore Independent Cadets is that of **Moses Darley**.

Testimentary Proceedings, Annapolis.

These began in the year 1657 and cover 1777, the end of the Colonial Period. These books were examined through 1749. A number of entries in connection with the settling up of the estate of **John Darby** of Somerset Co. whose widow, **Rebecca** (?), had married John Whaley, are in book 30, 1734, to 38.

1732. Walter Darby in Somerset Co. (Testimentary Proceedings, Annapolis, book 23.)

Will of Walter Darby of Cecil Co., is recorded at Annapolis, L. 31, page 993.

An inventory of property of Walter Darby of Somerset Co. dated 1763, as "the nearest of kin" names Levin Moor (husband of Mary Darby) and William Darby. Sarah Darby is executrix. (Inventories and Accounts book 81, page 308, and in Provincial Court Proceedings, Vol. 37, 1762-3, at Annapolis, Md.)

"Darby's Addition" 146 acres, surveyed for Walter Darby, 1747, lying by "Batchellors Chance" originally belonging to Walter Darby (Somerset Co. Rent Rolls, at Annapolis, Vol. 3, page 161). Volume 4 states this same property was surveyed for William Darby in 1762. "Batchellors Chance" was surveyed in 1696 for William Steven, and later possessed by Wm. Thompson.

April 18, 1823, William G. Penn, of Montgomery Co., Walter Darby and Sarah his wife, of Frederick Co., deed Greenbury Penn part of tract of land called "Owen's Resurvey", 100 acres. (Liber X, page 106, Montgomery Co., Md.)

March 7, 1826, Elisha Nelson and Walter Darby of Frederick Co. are endorsing notes for Wm. G. Penn of Montgomery Co., so he conveys them certain land in trust as indemnity against loss by their endorsing his notes. (Liber Y, page 279, Montgomery Co., Md.)

SOMERSET COUNTY, MARYLAND.—Continued.

Sarah Darby of Frederick Co. sells to Wm. H. Penn of Montgomery Co., December 29, 1845, part of Resurvey of "Owens Resurvey", part of "Additions to Rays Adventure" which was conveyed by Charles Penn, Sr. to Betsey Penn., Wm. G. Penn., Sarah Penn, and Caleb Penn, March 22, 1792. (Extract of Deeds of Montgomery Co., Vol. 12, page 101). (This Sarah Darby was Sarah Ann Penn, or a descendant of this Charles Penn. Notice also the unusual name of Caleb appearing here).

This Walter and Sarah Ann Penn Darby had a son, Darius Darby, who married Catherine Mantz. Mrs. John A. Roller, of Luray, Va., is a daughter of this Darius Darby.

Levin Moore was married to **Mary Darby**, September 4, 1757. (Parish Register, Maryland Historical Society, Stepney Parish, Somerset Co., page 103).

Levin Wright was married to **Elizabeth Darby** the twenty fourth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and sixty (1760). (Parish Register Maryland Historical Society, Stepney Parish, Somerset Co., page 110).

John Wilfare Darby, son of Thomas Darby and Sally, his wife, was born March 27, 1808. (Parish Register, Maryland Historical Society, Stepney Parish, Somerset Co., page 210).

Funeral of Mrs. Maria Darby, wife of Capt. Darby, held May 7, 1854. (Coventry Parish Register, Vol. 2, page 315).

CECIL'COUNTY, MARYLAND.

"Darby" surveyed for James Spencer 1730. (Kent and Cecil Co. Rent Rolls, at Annapolis, page 122).

John Hodgson, of Cecil Co., willed his eldest daughter, **Elizabeth Darby**, personalty, November 10, 1699. (Vol. 11, page 195, Maryland Calendar of Wills).

"Danby"-500 acres, surveyed September 13, 1682, for George Spencer. (Side Lights on Md. History by H. D. Richardson.)

WASHINGTON COUNTY, MARYLAND.

Henry Darby granted "Mt. Pleasant" July 25, 1762, and John Darby granted the same in 1788. (Scharf's History, Washington Co., page 983).

Henry Darby (probably of Prince George or Frederick Co.), is on muster roll of Capt. John White as due 1 £ 10 s. August 13, 1757. (Mms. Book at Maryland History of Society, page 21).

Henry Darby living in Washington Co., Md. (United States Census of 1790).

Henry Darby. On Frederick Co., Md., Debt Book, at Maryland Historical Society 1768-9, West Shore Box is note by County Clerk "Not on County Levy, No. 77" showing there must have been a Henry Darby in this County before.

*ST. MARY'S COUNTY, MARYLAND.

"Den(r?)by"-250 acres, surveyed May 2, 1666, for Thomas Wynne. (Side Lights of Md. History by H. D. Richardson.)

St. Mary's and Charles Counties Rent Rolls (Indexed Together) at Annapolis.

Darbyshire, 130 acres, page 104, surveyed for Isaac Shamwell, 1744.

Joshua Doyne, of St. Mary's Co., March 10, 1697, willed to wife "Derby's Plantation". (Vol 2, page 159, Maryland Calendar of Wills).

PRINCE GEORGE COUNTY, MARYLAND.

Rent Rolls, Maryland Historical Society.

"Darby", 60 acres surveyed October 4, 1721, for Christopher Thompson, lying in Prince George Co., beginning at a bound read oak standing on a tract of land called Perrywood, in ye possession of Colonel Haddock and Capt. John Murdoch. (Page 208, 1650-1723.) Note—The combination of the two pieces of property one Darby the other Perrywood is suggestive. This also shows the Darby name was in this County before 1721.

ANN ARUNDEL COUNTY, MARYLAND.

June __, 1720, was married Sam'll Harvey to **Eliza Darby**. (Parish Register, Maryland Historical Society, St. Anne's, Anne Arundel Co., page 412).

Ann Arundel County Debt Book, 1750, Volume 150 (Maryland Historical Society).

Page 31, Vol. 150, dated 1750, Mr. Joshua Darby to Darby's Choice 50 acres-0-5-0.

Page 64, Vol. 150, dated 1750, To Mr. Hugh Darby, Piney Grove, 500 acres-1-0-0.

Page __, Vol. ___, 1753 to 1761, To Francis Darby, Piney Grove, 300 acres.

Hugh Darby in 1734 buys "Piney Grove". (Land Records at A. A. Court House, R. D. 2, page 115).

In a census of Ann Arundel Co., 1776 at Maryland Historical Society, much of which is gone from age, no **Darbys** are found, which would indicate they had all before left the County, but of course the name may have been in the part of this book that is missing.

A Hugh Darby was living in Cecil Co., Md., by U.S. Census of 1790.

Ann Arundel County Rent Rolls, at Annapolis.

"Darby's Chance" 100 acres, surveyed June 14, 1706, for Thomas Lynthycomb; adjoining a tract of land called Roper Gray, patented 1714. (Vol. 1, page 131) possessed 1753 by Henry Hall. (Vol. 6).

"Darby Hall" surveyed June 12, 1696, 300 acres, for John Culton, (or Cotton, or Oulton, impossible to make out). (Vol. 2, page 345, also in Baltimore Co. Rent Rolls.)

TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND.

*Edward Mann, of Talbot Co., March 29, 1689, willed his daughter, Ann Darby, part of land bought of John Pitts. (Vol. 11, page 121, Maryland Calendar of Wills).

Ann Darby appears in codicil of her father, Edward Mann's will, of Talbot Co., 1701-2. She is to rewin his land "in England" in case of the death of her brother. (Vol. 24, page 277-8-9. Maryland Archives).

"Pitts Chance" possessed by John Needles for **Ann Darby** in England, daughter of Edward Mann, etc. (Talbot Co. Rent. Rolls. 1722, page 28).

"The 19th of April, 1671, came **John Darby** of the County of Talbot and proved right unto fifty acres of land it being due for transporting himself with the promise to inhabit which he assigns as followeth: Know all men by these presents that I, **John Darby**, do assign over unto Mr. Richard Tighman (?) all my right of land for transporting myself out of Virginia, as witness my hand and seal this 19th day of April, 1671. **John Darby** (Sealed.) Witness Robert Ridgely. (Early settlers Book 16, page 112, at Annapolis).

(This is peculiarly interesting as taking one line of the **Darby** family into Virginia where so many of England's best names are to be found at a very early period. This man may have been **Joseph's¹** father. Many men came to the province alone at first, and after getting their homes ready went back for wife and children. Each man who came to Maryland was entitled to 50 acrs of land for bringing himself, or any one else into the province "to inhabit" and many a young man of highest English or Irish blood, wishing to come to the new country for political reasons or adventures, was "brought in" or "transported" by some one richer than himself who would receive 50 acres in return for so doing. Many bound themselves to work for a certain period for this transportation, and one finds often as "serving" in this manner men bearing names familiar to all historians of America or the old country.)

Important marriages found in Frederick County Court House, of which there are two large volumes, commencing 1778. The volume of "male" examined up to 1863. The "female" book not yet examined.

Sally Churchill (nuncupative) willed October 11, 1799, to * * * niece, Eliz. Churchill Darby and her mother, Lucy Darby, and John Darby, her father. (Va. County Records, Vol. III, Williamsburg Wills).

John Darby and Lucy B. Churchill married December 15, 1807.— (Page 304, Register of Christ Church, Middlesex Co., Va.) This Lucy B. Churchill was dughter of Armistead and Hannah Churchill, born January 17, 1738-9. (Register of Christ Church, Middlesex Co., Va.)

DARBY ENROUGHTY.

In 1707 **Darby Enroughty** married Mary, daughter of Joseph Tanner.—(History of Henrico Parish Va., page 228.)

Henrico Co. Court, December, 1735, appointed **Darby Enroughty** and others to go in procession and renew the bounds of all lands and return an account of all lands by them processioned and the person present at the same.—(History of Henrico Parish, Va., page 23).

We venture the highly probable conjecture that the individual above was the progentor of this humble, honest and simple family. His neighbors and succeeding generations with a wayward ruthlessness which is constantly repeating itself in matters of popular designation, adopting the cognomen which least taxed their linguistic skill.—(History of Henrico Parish, Va., page 170).

Darby Enroughty—The locality, Darbytown, situated a few miles below Richmond, owes its designation to its having been at one time almost exclusively peopled by those bearing the name Darby or Enroughty. It being a remarkable fact that the two names, in common parlance among them, are regarded as synonymous and interchangeable. The first, Darby, obtaining prevalence because of its brevity and easier pronunciation. It is claimed, and with apparent reason, that the name was originally Derby, which among the lower English classes is even now pronounced, as by these simple people. Those of them, however, who are able to write their names, generally use Enroughty, which name indeed a majority of them affix to legal instruments.— (History of Henrico Parish, Va., page 170, Note 12).

Hannah Darby married Benjamin Singletary, son of Joseph and Hannah Dunham Singletary. Mary Darby married Elias Bonneau, October 30, 1746. (St. Thomas, St. Dennis and St. Marks Parish Registers, S. C.)

Soldiers belonging to the Prison Guard who did duty to January 8, 1771, and an account of the monies paid each person Isaac Darby £0, shillings 2, pence 8.—(The State Records of North Carolina, Vol. 22, page 422).

James Darby married Margaret Elliott, daughter of Artemas Elliott, May 10, 1773.—(Marriage Notices in the S. Carolina Gazette 1732-1801, by A. S. Salley, Jr.)

William Darby married Margaret Evans, Friday, August 18, 1797, by Rev. Bishop Smith.—(Marriage Notices in the South Carolina Gazette, by A. S. Sally, Jr).

Robert A. Darby married on Thursday evening last by the Rev. Mr. Frost to Rebecca Sinkler, both of this city (Charlestown).—(The S. C. Gazette of Saturday, October 25, 1800, by A. S. Sally, Jr.)

John Fletcher Darby, born in Person Co., N. C., December 10, 1803, in 1818 removed to Missouri.—(Biographic Annals of the Civil Govt. of the U. S. by Chas. Lanman, 1876, page 108).

Capt. James Lewis married **Sarah Darby** in 1813 in Spartanburg District, S. C., and few years later moved to Georgia.—(Genealogy of Lewis family, page 211).

DARBY LUX.

(From Notes by Miss A. E. Hull).

I have in my search found this name a number of times and my impression is that one of the **Darbys** married a Lux, presumably William Lux.

There are a number of Lux wills at Annapolis, that of John Lux, Kent Co., 1732, L. 20, page 762, **Darby Lux**, Baltimore County, 1750, L. 27, page 403, Wm. Lux, Ann Arundel County, L. 38, page 923. I examined the latter which speaks of "Kinsman **Darby Lux** of Baltimore".

In list of persons who stand "charged" with land in Frederick County Rent Rolls, March 1768-9 "which can't be collected" (Maryland Historical Society), page 160—: "To Darby Lux's hrs. (heirs) "Content". Lays on Basil Dorseys lands, etc.

"Long Bottom" surveyed for Wm. Lux, 1752, May 19. The resurvey on part of †Lecks Lot, resurveyed for Stephen Gaterell, 1751. This last was probably Lux lot, and the combination of the "Gaterell" name adds significance.—(West Shore Rent Roll 1754, Frederick County, Maryland Historical Society).

The South River Club is the oldest Club in Maryland, its founders no longer known, but there is on record still an old deed dated 1740, confirming a previous transaction between the "Society" or Company called the South River Club (Ann Arundel County, First District). A new club house was built in 1742 and from that date a list of members has been preserved. * * * In this list are names of men whose descendents are scattered all over the State and who have had much to do with shaping affairs in Maryland. Among the names given as members prior to 1742 is that of Darby Lux. Full account of club, club house, etc., is given in "Founders of Ann Arundel county" by Warfield, page 199.

OLD ENGLISH CHURCH RECORDS, MARYLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

Name given **Derby** also **Darbyshire**. Some 40 volumns of church records of London, etc., were examined at the Maryland Historical Society. A great number of **Darbys** are registered in: St. Helen's, Bishopgate; St. Anthony's, London; St. James, Clerkenwell; Canterbury Catherdal; St. Diovis Backchurch, London; St. Mildred, Bread St., St. Margaret Moses, Friday St., London; St. Benet and St. Peters, Pauls Wharf; Registers of Stourton, Wilts; St. George, Hanover Square; Christ Church, Newgate; Bath Abby; Durham Cathedral; St. Vedast and St. Michael, Le Queen, London; St. Martin in the Fields; St. Pauls Cathedral; St. Martin Outwich, London; St. Pauls, Covent Garden; etc.,

In all of these are **Darby's** with family names corresponding with those of the early Maryland colonists, viz: **John Darby**, **Ann and Elizabeth Darby**, **Joseph** a number of times; **Sarah**, **Robert**, **Samuel**, **Thomas**, etc., and **George** several times.

Several registers gave items that were peculiarly significant.

Joseph, son of John and Rachel, born December 2, 1729. (St. James, Clerkenwell, Vol. 2, page 184).

Robert and Samuel, sons of Joseph and Jane Darby in Bread St., born February 8, 1737. (St. Mildred, Bread St., page 13).

Died December 2, 1759. Joseph Darby, page 87.

Married, Josia Darby of St. Margaret Loathbury and Hannah Berrisford of the Parish of St. Gregory, both of the City of London, September 1, 1692.

Many others show the names, but the period does not fit in, unless they were brothers or relatives of **Joseph** of Maryland, or possibly one of these could have been his father. The following however is very significant:

Joseph (minister) Darby and Esther Hollingsworth with licence by Mr. Stacy, September 16, 1686. (Page 57, St. Pauls, Covent Garden, Volume of Marriages). This is exactly the period of Joseph of Maryland who must have married Rebecca about 1685.

THE EARLDOM OF DERBY.

According to Burke, the lineage of the present Earl of Derby is very ancient. The first of this family on record was Adam de Aldithley who attended Duke William to England and was accompanied by his son Lyndulph and Adam de Aldithley, and had large posessions conferred on him by the Conqueror.

From this follower of William came the present Earl of Derby in direct descent. Sir Edward George Villiers Stanley, P.C., G.C.V.O., C.B., etc., Commander in Chief S. Africa 1900, etc., A.D.C. to Gov. Gen. of Canada, Junior Lord of Treasury 1895-1900, etc., succeeded his father in 1908 as 17th Earl of Derby and in January 1889 married Lady Alice Maude Olivia Montagu, Lady of the bedchamber of Queen Alexandra, who was the youngest daughter of the 7th Duke of Manchester.

A BRIEF SKETCH OF EARLY MARYLAND HISTORY.

The first settlement in Maryland was made by Capt. William Clay borne with a party of men from Virginia on Kent Island, Chesapeake Bay, in 1631. But the charter under which the colony was permanently established was granted to Cecilius Calvert, second Lord Balitmore, by Charles I., and was dated June 20, 1632. The province covered by this grant had been partially explored by Sir George Calvert, father of the grantee, four years before. The name first intended for the colony was Crescentia, but in the charter it was styled Terra Mariae, "Mary's Land," in honor of Queen Henrietta Maria. The expedition designed to commence the settlement sailed from the Isle of Wight November 22, 1633, in two vessels named the Ark and the Dove. The emigrants numbered 200, and were nearly all Roman Catholics and gentlemen of fortune and respectability. On March 27, 1634, they commenced a settlement at St. Mary's, near the entrance of the Potomac into Chesapeake Bay, within the present limits of St. Mary's County. Leonard Calvert, brother of the lord proprietary, who had conducted the colony from England, became its first governor. A year or two after landing he turned his attention toward Clayborne's settlement; but Clayborne refused to acknowledge himself subject to the new government, and was at length expelled along with his most active adherents. Under the charter Lord Baltimore had the power of enacting all necessary laws, with "the advice, consent, and approbation of the freemen of the province", or their representatives convened in general assembly. The first assembly met in the beginning of 1635, and submitted certain laws to the approval of the proprietary. A dispute thereupon arose respecting the right of initiative in legislation, which was settled in 1638 by Lord Baltimore's yielding the right to the assembly. In the following year the first statutes of Maryland were enacted. In 1642 a company of Puritans, who had been expelled from Virginia for nonconformity, settled in Maryland, and soon began to manifest a spirit of resistance to the authority of the proprietary. Clayborne also had returned from his exile and regained possession of Kent Island. The efforts of the governor to dispossess him not only failed, but Clayborne and his partisans, with the Puritan party, made themselves complete masters of the province, and compelled the governor in his turn to fly into Virginia. This event occurred in 1645. In 1647 the governor returned at the head of a military force and recovered possession. In 1649 the assembly passed an act by which Christians of all sects were secured in the public profession of their faith, and allowed to worship God according to the dictates of their own conscience. The Puritans, whose arrival in the colony has already been noticed, settled at Providence, which at a later period received the name of Annapolis and became the seat of government. They still proved turbulent, and as a means of conciliating them their settlement was erected in 1650 into a separate county under the name of Anne Arundel; and still additional members of this denomination arriving from England, Charles County was organized for them a short time afterward. From this time they began to exercise a controlling influence in public affairs. On the overthrow of the royal government and the establishment of the commonwealth, in England, their party insisted upon an immediate recognition

of the new order of things; but the authorities proceeded to proclaim Charles II. In the next assembly it was found that the Puritans had a majority; and in 1652 commissioners from England visited Maryland, with whom were associated Clayborne, the old opponent of the proprietary government, and Bennett, the leader of the Puritans of Anne Arundel County. They removed Gov. Stone, who was subsequently reinstated by them, and completely established the authority of the commonwealth. Kent Island was once more delivered up to Clayborne, and he acquired also Palmer Island at the mouth of the Susquehanna. In 1654 Lord Baltimore made a determined effort to regain possession of the province, and directed Gov. Stone to require all persons to take the oath of fidelity, and to reestablish the proprietary government; but Bennett and Clayborne, the former of whom was now governor of Virginia, again interfered, and reversed all that Lord Baltimore had accomplished. They established a commission for the government of the colony, and placed Capt. Fuller at its head. Hereupon a civil contest ensued, and hostilities were carried on by land and water. Providence was attacked by the proprietary party, but the Puritans were victorious, and killed or captured the whole invading force. Many of the captives, among whom was Gov Stone, were condemned to death, and at least four of them were executed. This decisive action was fought March 25, 1655. Three years later the power of the proprietary was completely restored. In 1662 the Hon. Charles Calvert, son of the lord proprietary, was appointed governor, and so continued till 1676, when on the death of his father he succeeded to his rights, and appointed Thomas Notely his representative. After the revolution of 1688 the government was assumed by King William, and in 1691 Sir Lionel Copley was sent out as governoy. Among the first acts of importance under the new government was the removal of the capital from St. Mary's to Providence, thenceforth known as Annapolis. In 1714 Benedict Leonard Calvert succeeded on the death of his father to his hereditary rights, and dying the following year was succeeded by his son Charles, a Protestant. The principal obstacle to the recognition of the claim of this family being thus removed, the authority of the proprietary was restored throughout the colony after a suspension of 24 years. Hart, the last of the royal governors, was continued in office. In January, 1730, Baltimore was laid out. In 1745 the "Maryland Gazette." the first newspaper printed in Maryland was established at Annapolis, and continued to be issued by the descendants of Thomas Green, its founder, until 1839. Frederick City was founded in 1745, and was so named after the son and successor of the then proprietary. Georgetown, now in the District of Columbia, was laid out in 1751, and, being at the head of the navigation of the Potomac, grew rapidly in population and trade.

THE GENESIS OF THE COUNTIES OF MARYLAND.

Previous to 1650 it does not appear that there was any erection of counties in an express and formal way, yet in reality the Western Shore was treated as one county, called St. Mary's, and the Eastern Shore was treated as another county, called Kent.—(Narratives of Early Maryland. C. C. Hall).

Ann Arundel taken from St. Marys and erected a county in 1650, was sometimes known as Severne or Providence. A petition of the inhabitants of Maryland dated January 30, 1653, is headed "The humble petition of the Commissioners and Inhabitants of Severne, alias Ann Arundel County."

Old Charles erected in 1650 and abolished in 1654.

Calvert erected in 1654.

Charles County was formed, or erected, in 1658.

Baltimore County erected in 1659.

Talbot County erected in 1661. The Talbot-Kent line changed before 1671.

Somerset County erected in 1666.

Dorchester County erected in 1668. The Dorchester-Somerset line changed in 1684.

Durham County erected in 1669.

Old Worcester County erected in 1669. The limits of Worcester were changed in 1672.

Oecil County erected from Baltimore in 1674.

Delaware given to Pennsylvania in 1685.

Prince George County erected in 1695. Prince George County was originally part of Charles and Calvert Counties. The Charles-Prince George line changed in 1748.

Queen Ann County erected in 1706. Worcester County erected in 1742.

Frederick County erected in 1748, embraced present counties of Montgomery, Washington, Allegany, Garrett and part of Carroll. Frederick was originally part of Charles County, created in 1658.

Caroline County erected in 1773. Harford County erected in 1773.

Montgomery County erected in 1776, being taken from Frederick County. The earliest settlement within the limits of the present Montgomery County, then called Charles County, commenced in the year 1650, by Robert Brooke, who founded a Protestant settlement of 40 persons (including his wife and ten children) at Della Brooke, on the Patuxent River. Later he located at Brooke Place upon Battle Creek about 40 miles from the mouth of the Patuxent River.

Washington County erected in 1776, being taken from Frederick

County.

Allegany County erected in 1776, being taken from Frederick County.

District of Columbia was created in 1791.

Carroll County erected in 1836.

Howard District of Ann Arundel County, created in 1838.


