### Preface

HE object of this genealogy is to preserve the history of the ancestors and descendants of the DeTurk, DeTurck and allied families so that future generations may have full information concerning the early begin-

nings of this thrifty and industrious family, of which Isaac DeTurk, the progenitor of the DeTurk family in America, settled in the beautiful Oley Valley; together with information of the growth in numbers and in the sharing of community life and interests which followed in the development of ten generations of DeTurks.

This task should have been undertaken years ago before so much of the interesting material, handed down from generation to generation by tradition, was lost. Many of the interesting tales of grandparents and great grandparents have been laid away forever in their graves, a real and irreparable loss to this work. Not all such material, however, was lost; fortunately the memories of the older living descendants were able to relive incidents of the past and to retell tales of their elders, thus bringing traditions out of obscurity and helping to preserve what in a few short years would have been lost forever.

Originally this work was begun solely for the personal satisfaction of having a record, as complete as possible, of the Philip DeTurk branch, of which the writer is a descendant. This was shortly after the publication of Morton L. Montgomery's "Historical and Biographical Annals of Berks County" in 1909. Inquiries were made from many sources. Lawrence A. DeTurk, son of the historian, joined him in this interest, and in 1914 and 1915 he spent considerable time going over old records and documents from which valuable information was secured. Material thus unearthed awoke a desire to make a complete and up-to-date record of the descendants of all branches of the DeTurk family.

After ten years of consistent labor, it is felt that the work is sufficiently complete for publication. It represents hundreds of visits to families and graveyards, hours of delving into the genealogies of inter-related families, the sending out of nearly 2000 letters of inquiry all over the United States, gathering and assimilating information from newspapers, Court House records, documents, family Bibles, etc., etc.

In presenting this record to the reader, it is to be regretted that some parts are not as complete as they should be. This is due to a great extent to failure of hearing from many of the descendants to whom inquiries were sent relative to their families. It was impossible to make personal visits to all of the hundreds thus unavoidably omitted since they were scattered through twenty-four States of the United States, Cuba, Porto Rico, China and Africa.

It is not implied that all statements in this work are correct, since much information is family tradition handed down by word of mouth. Great effort has been expended in verifying various points and reasonable certainty is felt that the general accuracy is as good as it is possible to secure under the circumstances. Members of the family will find points to criticize, especially when they note certain statements differing from their reports. In such cases the changes were due to further research which revealed errors, making it necessary to record the facts as they were finally found to be.

Whatever success has been attained in this compilation has been due to the splendid cooperation given by members of the family. The writer wishes to express his appreciation to each of the following persons who has contributed his or her share to make this work a reality: Lawrence A. DeTurk, Mrs. David Sweigart (son and daughter of the historian, respectively), Dr. John Baer Stoudt, Morris H. DeTurk, Myron R. DeTurk, Chester L. DeTurck, Mrs. Kate DeTurck Loose, Miss Minna D. DeTurck, Mrs. Ella Baer, Eli R. DeTurk, John D. DeTurk and Alvin J. DeTurk.

This genealogical record portrays a family which has contributed its share to the present high standing of the State of Pennsylvania. It is a history of a sturdy, industrious, upright, Christian people of whom the community may justly be proud. It is with the thought of this truth in mind that the hope is expressed that future generations may so live and share in worthy causes that the fine traits of the DeTurk forbears may be carried on for many more generations. ### Explanatory Notes

Because of the large number of descendants of the various branches of the DeTurk family, it is necessary to use a system of numbering in order to trace the descendants of the various heads of families. It would be impossible to show graphically the 10 generations in consecutive order on a page. Therefore, whenever a head of a family has a number of children and grandchildren, he is given a number which is later carried out on another page where he and his children are listed fully. It should be easy to trace a member of the family when it is remembered that Isaac DeTurk, the progenitor, had two children—Esther and John. John had eight children, who grew up and had families—Daniel, John, Samuel, Abraham, Philip, Susanna, Maria and Deborah. These eight children, together with Esther DeTurk and Catharine Weimer (the stepdaughter of Isaac DeTurk) constitute the heads of the ten branches of the family. On the page of contents will be seen the various chapter headings each of which covers the genealogy of one of these branches.

The following example shows how a person may be traced through the generations: Henry B. DeTurk is found on page 109 thus:

"(9) HENRY BECKER DETURK (5), (Abraham 4, John 3, John 2, Isaac 1)."

The figure 9 in brackets indicates that his name was carried forward from the listing of his father's family which can be found by locating the figure 9 on the left hand margin of the page in heavy type (without brackets) before Henry DeTurk's name (page 108). The figure (5) following his name indicates the generation in which he was born, and his parentage through all the generations follows in the parenthetical listing of his father, grandfather, etc., always ending with Isaac DeTurk as the first generation.

On page 109 under the listing of Henry B. DeTurk's family is found:

#### "29 3. SOPHIA DETURK, married Alexander Barthold."

The figure "29" on the margin indicates that Sophia DeTurk's family is given in full on another page which can be found by following consecutively the numbers in brackets until (29) is reached, (in this case page 126), where her family is carried out.

Each branch begins again at the beginning, using Isaac DeTurk as No. 1.

Attention is called to the fact that in some of the very old records, particularly those from the Refugee Congregation of Frankenthal, Germany, spelling of the same name is frequently varied when used in different entries. For instance, John is spelled Johannes, Johan and Hans. All these refer to the same person. It appears that people spelled largely by sound and that there was little consistency in names. This even applied to many words as will be seen in the copies of correspondence of Queen Anne's secretary with Joshua Kocherthal.

Different families use various spellings of the name DeTurk. A number residing mostly in and about Oley, Penna., include the letter "c", spelling it DeTurck. The most common spelling is DeTurk. Others in use are DeTuerk, Deturk, Deturk, deTurk, and in some very old records it is found de Tirque.

It will be of interest to all members of the DeTurk family to know that the ancestral burial ground on the original DeTurk homestead in Oley Township, where five generations of DeTurks are buried, was recently restored through the efforts of a committee, appointed Mar. 15, 1933, consisting of Eugene P. DeTurk, Morris H. DeTurk and Chester L. DeTurck. They secured permission from Mr. Edward E. Rhoads, the present owner, for going ahead with the project. The cemetery was enclosed with a concrete wall or coping and a concrete pavement was laid over the entire plot. The original tombstones were imbedded in the concrete wall, facing inwards like a panel, thus preserving them permanently and making a very neat appearance. See cut, opp. page 289. The financing of this project was assumed by the DeTurk Family Association.

### CHAPTER I

### DeTurk Family in Europe

The DeTurk family, or rather the name of DeTurk, may be traced by history and tradition to the year 1105 A. D. and is said to be of oriental origin. From a letter, written in German, and the coat of arms of the DeTurk family in the possession of Mrs. Ella Baer, Kutztown, Penna. (a granddaughter of Elijah DeTurk, No. 11, page 215), is found the following data of the family DeTurk, their origin and dispersion, which according to the letter, is from the records in the libraries of Versailles and Paris. Through the courtesy of Mrs. Baer, it is possible to give here a copy of the letter as translated by Dr. John Baer Stoudt, who, while going over some old papers of Mrs. Baer's, found this rare document and the Coat of Arms.

The letter reads as follows: "The DeTurk family is of oriental origin. The progenitor of this family was brought to France by Count Kaimund of Toulouse from Palestine, where he was taken prisoner in the year 1105 A.D. He was a Turkish Emir, that is a prince, and his name was Hayraddin Silodin. In France, however, he assumed the name of Arnulph Le Turk, that is Arnulph, the Turk. He was knigted and admitted into the nobility. He bore on his shield as well as on his helmet a lion holding the sun, the sun signifying the diety of the Turks, the lion valor or strength. The present coat of arms of the family is made up of this shield and helmet bearing. King Francis I renewed the grant to Reginald LeTurk. The copy of this grant at Nismes of 1529 is still to be found in the archives of Paris. Reginald was then the only one of the family. He married Louison de Foix. He was the Mayor of Nismes and at his death in 1554 was survived by two sons. Their names were Victor and Hugo LeTurk. The descendant of Victor remained in the province of Languedoc where the name finally died away. Hugo on the other hand settled at Rochelle in the northwestern part of France where he became a master mechanic. He married Margat de Privas. He died in 1601 and was survived by four sons, Michael, Harman, Robert and Sancred DeTurk. Instead of the former name, LeTurk, they called themselves DeTurk. The family name is lost in the province of Guyenne, but spread itself to other parts of Elsass and Lothringen (Alsace and Lorraine). There is no data at hand concerning the more recent history of this family. See 'European Heraldric and Family Data' in Library at Versailles and Paris, VIII, 192."

Owing to religious strife in France during the latter part of the sixteenth century, many of the church records were destroyed, and trace of the family is lost for some years. Turning now to the Ecclesiastical records of the Refugee Congregation at Frankenthal, Germany, it is noted that owing to the religious contentions among the Huguenots and Papists, Jacob DeTurk evidently crossed the border line between France and Germany before 1609.\* This is supported by the following record of baptisms and marriages found in the register of the Refugee Congregation at Frankenthal in which is found that Isaac DeTurk, son of Johannes DeTurk, was baptized Januray 17th, 1685. The records of this congregation further show that Johannes DeTurk, the father of Isaac, was married to Hester Kip, a daughter of Hans Pieter Kip and his wife, Rachel du Four. Hans Pieter Kip was Burgomeister of Frankenthal in 1671. The said Johannes DeTurk was baptized on July 30th, 1650. He was the son of Johannes DeTurk and his wife, Gertrude de Brier. The senior Johannes DeTurk was the son of Jacob DeTurk and his wife, Jacquemine Rickenbasche, and was baptized on November 1st, 1618. The name Jacob DeTurk first appears on the church register at Frankenthal in the year 1609. This date helps to approximately fix the time when Jacob DeTurk fled from the ancestral home of the DeTurk family in the north of France to the vicinity of Frankenthal. Jacob DeTurk was twice married. His first wife was Jacquemine Verrisel, and his

<sup>\*</sup> Although there is no authentic record of the fact, it is evident that Jacob DeTurk was a grandson of Hugo DeTurk, who died in northern France in 1601.

second wife was Jacquemine Rickenbasche. The list of DeTurk baptisms and marriages as found in the register of the Refugee Congregation is as follows:

#### CHILDREN OF JACOB DETURK

- 1609, July 30—Jacob DeTurk, parents Jacob and Jacquemine DeTurk, sponsors Peter van Ixem, Sara vanCostonobel.
- 1612, Jan. 19—Isaac DeTurk, parents Jacob and Jacomyne DeTurk, sponsors Francois Enten Jacomyne, daughter Bernhards vanVlamertingh.
- 1614, Oct. 23—Abraham DeTurk, parents Jacques DeTurk and Jacomine Verrisel, sponsors Francois deBeust, Jennekin deVrier, widow of Hals Balden.
- 1616, Nov. 10—Elizabeth DeTurk, parents Jacob DeTurk and Jacquemine Rickenbosche, sponsors Henrick Rickenbosche, Elizabeth Kuckeliers.
- 1618, Nov. 1—Johannes DeTurk, parents Jacob DeTurk and Jacquemine Rickenbosche, sponsors Hans Courhasen, Maria Louioix, single.
- 1620, Dec. 5—Dina DeTurk, parents Jacob DeTurk and Jacquemine Rickenboss.
- 1623, Mar. 30—Susana DeTurk, parents Jacob DeTurk and Jacquemine Rickebosch, sponsors Isaac Kukelier, Susanna Zum Broeck, wife of Alexander Eduwaerts.
- 1625, July 2—Henrick DeTurk, parents Jacob DeTurk and Jacquemine Rickenbosch, sponsors Henrick van der Borcht, Barara Rickenbosch, single.

Evidently Jacomine Verrisel, Jacob DeTurk's first wife, died about 1614, as the entry of his second marriage is recorded at Frankenthal thus:

"Married November 7, 1615 — Jacob DeTurk, widower, a citizen of this place, and Jacquemin Rickenbosche, legitimate daughter of Henrick Rickenbosche, a citizen here."

Evidently Jacob DeTurk died before 1633 since the following entry records the marriage of his widow:

"Married May 29, 1633—Christian Leicht, surviving son of the late Johannis Leicht of Staffel, and Jacobea Reickebuss, widow of Jacob DeTurk. Witnesses—Alexander de Wachter, Captain of the citizens here and Theogald Acker, burgomaster."

1647, Sept. 23 — Janneken DeTurk, parents Hans DeTurk and Geertruyt deBrier, sponsors Jacob Balder, Coopman tot Amsterdam and his wife, Janneken de Brier, in place of Jacob Breda and wife, Elisabeth Keuckelier.

1650, July 30—Johannes DeTurk, parents Johannes DeTurk and Geertruid deBrier, sponsors Matthews Hans Mattheus, Janneken Dathen, in place of Jenneken deBrier, wife of Jacob Balde of Amsterdam.

# CHILDREN OF JOHANNES DETURK AND HESTER KIP

1671, March 1—John Pieter DeTurk, parents Johan and Hester Kip, sponsors Johan Pieter Kipp, burgermeister at this place, and his wife, Rachel Roier.

1677, Dec. 18 — Jacomina DeTurk, parents Johannes and Hester Kip, sponsors Hans Pieter Kip, Jacoba Jacquetyn, widow of Johannes DeTurk, of this place.

1680, Jan. 8—Sarah DeTurk, parents Johannes DeTurk and Hester Kip, sponsors Isac dePundere, Coopman tot Francfort, and Sara Vlamerting, his wife, in place of her parents, Hans Kip and Rachel Royers.

1684, Feb. 21—Maria Elisabeth DeTurk, parents Johannes DeTurk and Hester Kip, sponsors Johannes Petrus Kip and wife, Maria Elisabeth Göz.

1685, Jan. 17—Isack DeTurk, parents Johannes DeTurk and Hester Kip, sponsors Isaac Balde and his daughter, Sara Balde,

of this place, and Maria Elisabeth Goz, wife of Hans Pieter Kip, Jr.

1687, Aug. 17—Esther Cornelia DeTurk, parents Johannes DeTurk and Esther Kip, sponsors dom. Burcardus Muller, minister of the French congregation here, and his wife, Cornelia Royers.

The name Kip appears in the church register as early as 1608, and that of deBrier in 1573. Hester Kip's baptism is recorded as follows:

1656, Aug. 28—Hester Kip, parents Hans Pieter Kip and Rachel du Four, sponsors Francois Geldorp, burgomeister, and Hester Kip.

The title of the Huguenot Refugee Congregation at Frankenthal, from whose register the above records were taken, was "I'Eglise Reformee Needlandaise de Frankenthal au Palatinat", The Netherland Reformed Church in the Palatinate. The congregation was established in 1560 by Frederick the Elector, of Germany, who in 1563 authorized the issuing of the Heidelberg catechism for the Reformed refugees, fleeing from France. He gave them a church and permitted them to use the French language in their worship and in their school. The French pastor of the congregation was driven away by the soldiers of King Louis XIV in 1688. The following year the town was destroyed and the members of the congregation scattered.

According to the above records, it is established that Jacob DeTurk was among the French Huguenots who fled from France early in the seventeenth century; also that for three generations or approximately one hundred years, he and his descendants made Germany their adopted home and were therefore temporary German citizens, hence the German spelling of the DeTurk name and the German language among the early settlers. A letter, written in German by Abraham DeTurk (great grandson of Isaac, the immigrant), to Professor I. Daniel Rupp, dated March, 1844, further authenticates the name and place in the Palatinate in Germany from which Isaac DeTurk, the progenitor of the DeTurk

family in America, set out on the great adventure to the new world. The letter, as translated, is as follows:

"My ancestors lived in France and belonged to the so-called Huguenots. On account of religious persecution they fled to Frankenthal in the Palatinate, from whence Isaac DeTurk and his wife emigrated to America during the reign of Queen Anne of England. They settled temporarily at Esopus on Quassick Creek, Duchess County, New York, and removed to Oley between the years 1704 and 1712. The date of the patent deed of my farm is 1712."

In connection with the fleeing from France of Jacob DeTurk, it is interesting to make note of a summarized history of the Huguenots and their persecutions in France. The Huguenots were a religious sect following the teachings of John Calvin (born 1509), who had been driven from France and who later taught his doctrines in Italy. Before his banishment he gained many followers in France-lords, noblemen and people of all classes, and their churches sprang up with wonderful quickness during the middle of the sixteenth century. They were then called Calvinists, but later came to be called Huguenots. They were strictly a religious people and it is said that the name Huguenots was given them as a term of reproach. Some say it was given to them because of their secret meetings at night in the subterranean vaults near the gate of Hugon in the city of Laurs, and what gives countenance to this opinion is that they were first called Huguenots in this city where they soon became numerous. There is another more illustrious origin assigned to this name. It was said to have been given to the Reformed Calvinists because they were for keeping the crown upon the head of the descendants of Hugh Capet, whereas the Catholics were for giving it to the House of Guise as descendants of Charles the Great.

Growth of the new sect was rapid. Members included people of all classes. Because of their growing strength they were feared and persecuted during the reign of Henry II and his three sons, Francis, Charles and Henry (1559-1589). Henry II's wife, Catherine de Medici, practically ruled France during the time her three

sons were on the throne and to her is attributed the terrible persecutions which have scarcely any parallel in the history of religion.

After the rule of Henry III the nearest heir to the throne was the Huguenot chief, Henry of Navarre. The Protestant Huguenots rallied to him and had great faith in his integrity even though he professed the Catholic religion in the interests of peace. In 1598 he issued the famous Edict of Nantes which gave the Huguenots freedom to worship God as they pleased. Scattered families returned to industry and agriculture. Prosperity began to come back to the Huguenots.

The Protestants continued to increase in numbers under the protection of the Edict of Nantes until 1685 when Louis XIV revoked it. Persecutions began in a form worse than their previous depredations. Every right as citizens was taken from the Huguenots. When they attempted flight they were persecuted, plundered and killed. The most terrible persecutions were carried out in minute detail, extending to every city, town and hamlet throughout France. Those that sought to flee were threatened with confiscation of effects and perpetual imprisonment. To inflict the most barbarous cruelty upon them became honorable, and any commission of crime against them a virtue. Many were able to leave the country, but their departure was not one general exodus. It was in stealth, singly or in small companies, and they stole away by night as best they could. Many found their way to the Palatinate and among these was Jacob DeTurk. The number who died in these wars of persecutions, as galley slaves (among which the name DeTurk appears), in prisons, or who were executed, has been estimated as 200,000. The number who fled to England, Holland, Germany and Switzerland is believed to have exceeded a million.

France little realized then what fine blood her country was losing in driving these zealous people from her borders. "The Huguenots," says Froude, the historian, "were possessed of all those qualities which give nobility and grandeur to human nature—men whose lives were as upright as their intellect was commanding and their public aims untainted with selfishness, unalterably

just where duty required them to be stern, but with the tenderness of a woman in their hearts; frank, true, cheerful, humorous, as unlike sour fanatics as is possible to imagine anyone, and able in some way to sound the keynote to which every brave and faithful heart in Europe instinctively vibrated."

"As honest as a Huguenot" became a proverb in the lands to which they fled. A beautiful illustration of their reputation for honesty is told in connection with the Great Elector of Brandenburg. The Elector one day surprised his wife in the act of giving the crown jewels to a stranger. In astonishment he asked who the man was. She replied, "I do not know his name, but I know that he is a Huguenot." That was enough. A Huguenot's word was as good as his bond.

Many of them or their descendants finally settled in America. "The Huguenot emigrants as a class, we may safely say without fear of contradiction," writes the Hon. W. E. Egle, in the introduction of The Memorials of the Huguenots in America, by Rev. A. Stapleton, "have furnished a larger number of men of eminence, in proportion to their numbers, than any other religious and political group. So strongly marked were their characteristics that neither time nor amalgamation with other groups has as yet extinguished the traces of their high moral sentiments and love of liberty from the character of their descendants. This character is still a dominating force in our national life. In the fire of the pulpit, in the eloquence of the legislative hall, in the various fields of learning and research, the Huguenot spirit still leads the van. On the field of battle and on trackless seas, they have not only maintained our nation's honor, but have opened new eras in the world's history. The naval glories of Stephen Decatur, the epochmaking achievements of Admiral Dewey at Manila, and of Commodore Schley at Santiago, are compliments to the Huguenot erigin of their heroes.

It is an interesting fact that some of the first white residents of Pennsylvania were Huguenots. G. Henry Baird in his work, Huguenot Emigration to America, says "There were no emigrants whom William Penn desired more ardently for his plantations on the Delaware and Susquehanna than the persecuted Huguenots.

### CHAPTER II

### The Joshua Kocherthal Colony

The year following the invasion of 1703, Rev. Joshua Kocherthal, a Lutheran Minister from Frankenthal, visited England for the purpose of obtaining definite data relative to settling in America. Upon his return he embodied in a pamphlet the information obtained. The first edition was published in 1706 and the second in 1709. The title of the brochure was "Full and Circumstantial Report Concerning the Renowned District of Caroline in English America." As the title indicates, this little volume sets forth the claims of South Carolina in preference to those of Pennsylvania as a place for settlement.

Ten chapters were devoted to the land in general, the government, the fertility of the soil, the climate, the voyage, etc. Although the ordinary assignment of land was fifty acres to every head of a family, Kocherthal stated that he had been promised 150 or even 200 acres to each in case the colony should be considerably large. The terms provided that the land should be free the first three years, and afterwards a nominal rental of a penny per acre should be paid annually. The soil, he declared, was adapted for raising wheat, rye, oats, barley, corn, tobacco, grapes, olives, etc., and the forests were full of valuable timber and minerals were abundant. The climate was salubrious; the winters were no more rigorous than April or October in the Palatinate.

It is not hard to understand how the book was the subject of much discussion among the distressed people of the Palatinate, and how it enkindled in them a desire to emigrate to this new land of hope and promise. As to Pennsylvania, the pamphlet stated that the winters were severe, cattle had to be housed in barns; the most desirable lands were alreday taken, and that therefore it would be necessary to purchase grounds from the first

owners at a much higher rate of ground rent. The pamphlet concludes "Pennsylvania, however, has some advantages. It has German settlers who will aid their countrymen. Its fruits and grains more nearly correspond to those of Germany."

The following extract is taken from the report of a committee appointed by authority of Queen Anne of England to inquire why so many people came to London with the hope of being transported to America, and to what extent Kocherthal's pamphlet had influenced these persons wishing to be settled in the new world:

"Upon the instruction given to the Committee they have endeavored as far as they could to find out upon what encouragement the Palatines came into England, and upon examination of several of them as to what were the motives which induced them to leave their native country, it appeared to the Committee that there were books and papers dispersed in the Palatinate, with the Queen's picture before the book and the title pages in letters of gold (which from thence were called the Golden Book) to encourage them to come to England, in order to be sent to Carolina, or other of her Majesty's Plantations to be settled there. The Book is chiefly a commendation of that country.

"What further encouraged them to leave their native country was the ravages the French had made and the damages the hard frost had done to their vines." After describing the atrocities of the armies of King Louis XIV in various sections of the Palatinate to which many Huguenot families had fled, concludes the report with the following (quoted from a representative of the domain in the Rhine country):

"It would be an endless labour, Sir, to reckon and describe all the particular places in the Palatinate, that are laid waste, and therefore I shall content myself, and I hope you, and many others to say that their native country has suffered more during the late and present war, than any other, by the frequent invasions, inroads, and repeated conquests of the French, whose incendiaries have burned down to the ground and made almost a desert of more than 2000 of their greatest cities, market towns and villages, destroyed their vines and in many places rooted them up, with design to make so fatal a waste that their country might never be peopled or inhabited again.

"Vast numbers of these people have perished in the woods and caves among wild beasts, through hunger, cold and nakedness.

"These poor Refugees are the survivors of them, that during a short interval of peace had built up a few cottages, and began to cultivate their desolated country, in hopes of some means of subsistence; but by reason of the late irruptions of the French are reduced to greater extremities than before, for the French not content with their former cruelties, have again ruined their country and beggar's the inhabitants by carrying away their cattle, robbing them of the fruits of their labors, and yet continue to this day to exact vast contributions from them. To which if we add the many heavy taxes imposed on them by their own government which strips them of all that the common enemy leaves who will wonder, that seeing themselves in a manner famishing and starving, destitute of all conveniences for human Life, that they should throw themselves into the arms of Great Britain's charity?"

The German Hanoverian historian, Frederick Kohlrausch, thus epitomizes the events of this war:

"The French Cavalry, in January 1688, scoured the country around Heidelberg and set fire to the towns of Rohrbach, Nuszloch, Misloch, Kirchhein, Eppenheim, Neckerhausen, Heidelberg, Mamhein, Offenburg, Creuznach, Oppenheim, Bruchsal, Frankenthal, Baden, Rastadt, which were destroyed by fire.

"The inhabitants were stripped and hunted naked in the fields, then covered with snow, where many perished.

"The magnificent ancient free cities of the German Empire Spires and Worms after fearful suffering of seven months state of seige were reduced to ashes by order of the French King. The inhabitants were driven forth destitute and hungry.

"The French invaders even robbed the graves of the salic Emperors in the Cathedral at Spires. The silver coffins were stolen and the imperial bones scattered on the ground. "The Duke of Crequi, who had charge of these operations, produced a list of 1200 towns and villages which the French King's pleasure had ordered to be destroyed.

"The peace of Ryswick in Holland in 1697 which was supposed to terminate these devastating conflicts, served simply as a cessation of hostilities until the participants had sufficiently recovered to renew the struggle.

"In 1701 the war of the Spannish succession began and the work of fire and sword again devastated the valley of the Rhine, which continued till the peace of Urecht, 1713."

The first reference to Palatines who had determined to go to England with the hope of being transported to some plantation in her Majesty's domain in America, is found in the letter, dated February 18, 1708, by the English representative, Davenport, at Frankford to H. Boyle, secretary to Queen Anne of England. Mr. Davenport states that "one Joshua de Cochershall, a Lutheran Minister, with some other Palatines to the number of 61 persons" applied to him for passes, money, and recommendations. This, he says, he refused "for fear of disgusting the Elector Palatine." The following day Mr. Boyle replied: "that though the desire of those poor people to settle in the plantations is very acceptable, and would be for the public good, yet Her Majesty can by no means consent giving in any public way encouragement either by money or passes to the Elector Palatines subjects to leave their country without his consent."

This apparent discouragement was but the diplomatic way of saying: "You find your way to London and the Queen will be pleased to settle you on one of her plantations in America."

Kocherthal and 41 members of the colony left Frankenthal and reached London in the month of April. He apparently lost no time in presenting his petition for passage to Carolina to Secretary Boyle, who referred the request together with the testimonials of character and of church membership to the Board of Trade, who considered them at a meeting on April 22, 1708, and requested Rev. Kocherthal to appear before them on April 26th. An entry

in the minutes discloses that Kocherthal was accompanied at this audience before the Board by three Lutheran ministers in London, the most influential of whom was Anton Wilhelm Boehme, pastor of the German Court Chapel of St. James, and spiritual advisor of Prince George of Denmark, the consort of the Oueen.

Kocherthal was given a hearing by the Secretary to the Queen and by the Board of Trade. The minutes for April 26th contain this entry: "Mr. Joshua de Kocherthal with three Lutheran Ministers (settled here) attending in relation to the reference from Mr. Sec'r'y Boyle touching upon the settlement of Kocherthal and others in some of her Majesty's Plantations in America (mentioned in the minutes of the 22nd Instant). They said that they had read the Testimonials giving a good character of the said Minister and others and that they had no reason to doubt but the account of the behaviour of these people in the Places where they had lived was true; that fifteen of them were Lutheran and twenty-six Calvinists. Then the said Kocherthal presented to their Lordship a paper with the names and ages of the said persons which was read, and directions were given for preparing the Draught of a Representation thereupon for laying the same before Her Majesty."

In his request before the Board of Trade, Kocherthal makes no mention of Carolina, but merely asks for settlement in some of her Majesty's Plantations in America. The Board of Trade taking advantage of the circumstances, proposed to settle them "upon the Hudson's River in the Province of New York, where they may be useful to this Kingdom, particularly in the production of naval stores, and as a frontier against the French and their Indians."

Two days later, April 28, 1708, the Board of Trade made a lengthy report to the Queen, who on May 10th, 1708, issued an order of Council for naturalizing and sending Kocherthal and his colony to New York. This report of the Board and the orders in Council are so informing as to warrant publishing them in full.

# ORDER OF COUNCIL FOR NATURALIZING AND SENDING CERTAIN PALATINES TO NEW YORK

At the Court of Kensington ye 10th day of May 1708.

Present.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Councill.

Upon reading this at the Board a Report from the Lords Commissioners of Trade and Plantations dates the 28th of April last in the Words Following Vizt.

May it please your Majesty:-

Having in obedience to your Majesty's Commands Signified to us by the Right Honorable Mr. Secretary Boyle considered the Petition of Joshua Kockerthal the Evangelical Minister in behalf of himself and several poor Lutherans come hither from the Lower Palitinat in Germany praying to be transported to some of your Majesty's Plantations in America; we humbly take leave to represent to your Majesty that they are in number forty-one: Vizt. Ten Men, Ten Women and Twenty one Children, That they are very necessitous in the utmost want not having present anything (but what they get by Charity) to subsist themselves. That they have been reduced to this miserable Condition by the Ravages Committed by the French in the Lower Palitinat, where they lost all they had, That they have produced to us severall Testimonials from the Bayliffs or Principall Magistrates in the Villages where they dwelt, which by the assistance of the Ministers of the Lutheran Church here we have Examined and find that they give a good character of the said Minister and the others with him. Whereupon we would have offered that those People might be settled in Jamaica or Antego there being large Tracts of Land not taken up or Inhabited, and great want of white People but in regard that the Climate of those Islands is so much hotter than that part of Germany from whence they came It is to be feared it may not be agreeable to their Constitutions, and therefore We humbly propose that they be sent to Settle upon Hudson's River in the Province of New York, where they may be useful to this

Kingdom particularly in the production of naval stores and as a frontier against the French and their Indians. And this your Majesty be enabled to do by granting them the Usuall Number of Acres of Land if your Majesty shall please to Confirm the Act passed at New York the 2nd of March 1698/9 Entituled An Act for Vacating Breaking and annulling Severall Extravagant Grants of Land made by Coll. Fletcher late Governor of that Province, as we humbly offered to your Majesty by our Representation of the 29th of July last without which there is no land but what is Engrossed by the patentees of the said Extravagant Grants.

And in case your Majesty shall approve of their going to New York, we humbly represent to your Majesty that the Cheapest way of Transporting them will be in the Man of War and Transport Ship that shall be ordered to go with the Lord Lovelace, for we do not find that they can be carryed thither by any other way under Eight or Ten pounds per head for the Men and Women and proportionably for the Children.

And we do further humbly offer that they be suppleyed here with the necessary tools for agriculture to be sent with them, to Enable them to begin and make Settlements.

As these people are in the utmost Necessity they will not be able to Subsist there till they can reap the fruit of their Labour (which will not be till after one years Time) unless assisted by your Majesty's Bounty, or that the Province of New York contribute towards their Maintenance during that time, but as we are informed that Province is at present very poor and much in debt there will be no reason to expect any great supply from thence.

We further offer, That before their departure they may be made Denizens of this Kingdom for their greater Encouragement in the Enjoyment of the Priviledges accruing by such Letters of Denization. Which is most humbly submitted.

Her Majesty in Councill approving the said Report and taking into Consideration the great suffering and Poverty of the said poor Lutherans is graciously pleased to Order, that they be made Denizens of this Kingdom according to the above mentioned Report, and one of Her Majesty's Principall Secretarys of State is to prepare a Warrant for Her Majesty's Royal Signature Directing Mr. Sollicitor Generall to prepare a Bill in order to pass the great Seal for making the Petitioners free Denizens accordingly; and Her Majesty is further pleased to order that the Petitioners be not obliged to pay any Fees or other Charges for passing the said Letters of Denization.

Andreas Volck, husbandman, 30 years; Anna Catharine, wife, 27; Hieroneums 5, Maria Barbara 4, Anna Gertrude 1, children.

Michael Weigand, husbandman, 52 years; Anna Catharine, wife, 54; Tobias 17, George 5, Anna Maria 13, children.

Jacob Weber, husbandman, 30 years; Anna Elizabeth, wife, 25; Eva Maria 5, Eva Elizabeth 1, children.

Johannes Jacob Plettel, husbandman, 40 years; Anna Elizabeth, wife, 29; Margaret 10, Anne 8, Sarah, Catharine 3, children.

Of these, 15 are said to have been of the Lutheran faith and 27 of the Reformed faith. The families of Kocherthal, Volck and Weber, are known to have been Lutherans. Accordingly the

remaining members of the company with but a single exception were of the Reformed faith.

Before the document, ordered by the Queen, making the 41 members of the company free citizens of the Kingdom was executed, fourteen more persons arrived in London desirous to be settled in America. Three of these were from Holstein and eleven were from the Palatinate.

Rev. Kocherthal on June 22, 1708, presented a second petitiotn on their behalf to the Secretary of the Queen, praying that they might be included in the rights and privileges granted to the first group. The petition further states that the eleven from the Palatinate "suffered under the Calamity which happened last year in the Palatinate by the Invasion of the French." Among these eleven petitioners were Maria Wiemer and her daughter, Catherine.

### SECOND PETITION OF THE REVEREND JOSHUA KOCHERTHAL TO THE QUEEN (JUNE 22, 1708)

To the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Petition of Joshua de Kocherthal Minister, on behalf of himself and other Distressed Persons, lately arrived from Palatinate and Holstein.

Most humbly Sheweth That your sacred Majesty being pleased to receive the Petitioners late humble Petition with such great clemency and Royal Favour, he is thereby incouraged to prostrate himself once more before your Majesty, and to inform your Majesty with the utmost submission, that fourteen Persons more three whereof are natives of Holstein, are arrived here unexpectedly from the Palatinate who having suffered under the Calamity which happened last year in the Palatinate by the Invasion of the French, in this their Deplorable Condition are desirous to settle themselves in some of your Majesty's Plantation in America, but by reason of their extreme Poverty, they cannot Defray their charges for passage thither they humbly Implore your Royal Majesty, that they may be permitted to go thither in com-

pany with the forty one persons, to whom your Majesty has most graciously allowed a free passage thither; and that they may also enjoy the same Royal Mercy and Priviledges. And whereas your petitioner cannot hope for competent subsistence in America, after his arrival there, he most humbly entreats Your Majesty to grant him such Sallary, for the support of himself and family, as your Majesty in your great Clemency shall think fit.

And your Petitioners (as in Duty Bound) shall ever Pray, etc. — —

Mr. Boyle immediately acquainted the Queen of this second petition and Her Majesty, approving the same, ordered that it be submitted at once to the Lords Commissioners of Trade and Plantations for examination and recommendation. Their favorable report is of special interest:

# BOARD OF TRADE TO MR. SECRETARY BOYLE To the Right Honourable Mr. Secretary Boyle:

Sir: In Obedience to Her Majesty's Commands signified to us by Your letter of the 22nd Instant upon a second petition of Joshua de Kocherthal, to Her Majesty, in behalf of himself and fourteen other distressed Protestants lately arrived from the Palatinate and Holsteyn, praying that they may in Company of the forty one Lutherans already provided for, be transported to Her Majesty's Province of New York, and partake of the like allowance and Advantages the said Lutherans are to receive, as well during their stay here as at their Arrival in the said Province; We have considered the same and find that the Testimonials which they have produced under the hands and Seals of the Ministers Baylifs or Principal Magistrates in the Villages where they dwelt, do give a good character of the said Poor Protestants, and certify that they are reduced to the utmost want, having lost all they had by the frequent Incursions of the French and Germans near Landau, we find further that two of them have Entred themselves into the service of the Lord Lovelace, so that they are but twelve to be provided for.

Whereupon We Humbly Offer that the said twelve Poor Protestants are fit Objects for her Majesty's Bounty, and that if Her Majesty shall be graciously pleased to allow them the same as is already granted to the others, for their subsistence, and that they be transported with the rest to New York. We further humbly Offer that before their Departure they be likewise made free Denizens of this Kingdom, for their greater Incouragement in the Injoyment of the Privileges accruing by such letters of Denization. The letter of Denization making the members of the colony free citizens of the realm, was issued by the Queen August 21, 1708. The original document is in Latin. A translation of it was subsequently entered in the office of the Secretary of the Province of New York, on August 10, 1709.






And, therefore, they shall and will be esteemed as natural born subjects and reputed as such by our heirs and successors of this our Kingdom of Great Britain, and their heirs respectively shall and will be esteemed as such by our heirs and successors; and their heirs shall and will be dealt with, reputed and governed as such as the rest of our faithful subjects of this our Kingdom of Great Britain, and they shall be so esteemed in every place and jurisdiction under this our crown of Great Britain, and it shall be lawful for them or their heirs respectively in all actions of what kindsoever they may be to pursue for and enter complaint in and about the same in whatsoever place or jurisdiction they may be in or under in this our Kingdom of Great Britain, and elsewhere, under our Government to have, exercise, use and enjoy the full privilege of making answer and defence in all matter or matters whatsoever as any others of these our natural born subjects of Great Britain, and moreover it shall be lawful for them or their heirs respectively to hold lands and the same to convey; and to hold places of trust anywhere under this our Crown of Great Britain, and the land purchased the same to enjoy and hold and possess to themselves and their heirs, or in any other manner to make clear titles or to alienate the same to any person or persons that they, at their own pleasure, may think proper and the same to be peaceably and honestly enjoyed as well as by any others of our faithful subjects of this our Kingdom of Great Britain, born within the same, and that it be lawful for themselves or their heirs respectively, to hold and enjoy the manor of lands and hereditaments whereby they may be to themselves or those whom they may think proper to convey them respectively, or to any person or persons whatsoever, him or them, the same to enjoy honestly and peaceably, as well as if they were originally born in this our Kingdom of Great Britain, and the same to hold, enjoy and possess

from any grievance whatever from any grievance from our heirs or successors or ministry, or any other whatsoever, nevertheless, it is our will that the persons and those to whom respectively, in the first place, and to whom their heirs respectively, relative shall make or cause to be made obeisance to us, our heirs or successors and shall contribute and pay as may seem just, them and their heirs respectively shall pay to our heirs and successors, our custom and subsidy on their merchandise as well as merchant strangers ought or should pay, and they or their heirs respectively, shall pay due regard to every ordination act, statute and proclamation of this our Kingdom of Great Britain, and shall be obedient as may appear just and formal, and shall render a due regard to magistrates and to our ships of war and shall be in subordination to our corporations mercantile of this our Kingdom of Great Britain, by any charters or letters patent of our, any others of our predecessors heretofore granted, and at any time hereafter, or any person or persons that are or will be master of ship or masters of ships or may follow merchandise, that then this shall be void and of none effect; provided, nevertheless, that we reserve for the time being to ourselves, our heirs and successors, our full power and authority from time to time of revoking and determining, by letters patent, under the Great Seal of Great Britain these Letters Dennizens to such person or persons, concerning whom we, our heirs, or our successors, in order, in private counsel to our heirs or successors will declare as may appear right to us, to our heirs or successors, in making Dennizens to those person or persons as may appear hurtfull or inconvenient to us our heirs or successors, yet giving and granting to persons, and any others, reasonable and sufficient time of selling, alienating, assigning or disposing of their manors, messuages, lands, so held hereditaments, and their merchandize, respectively, and likewise of removing their respective goods and effects of whatsoever kind or quality they may be before determination of these letters patent as appears. whereof we caused these letters patent to be made and done; witness myself at Westminster, this 21st day of August, 1708, in



John D. DeTurk of Kutztown, Penna., recalls his grandfather, John DeTurk, telling him that he had loaned to Dr. Peter Bertolet an important paper for use in his proposed history of the Oley Valley. The doctor died just before he was ready to publish it. His widow when approached on the subject, declared she had given the manuscript, the drawings for the illustrations, and the document to the Historical Society of Philadelphia, which society desired to publish it. In the manuscript division of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania is the original manuscript of Dr. Bertolet entitled "Fragments of the Past; Historical Sketches of Oley and Vicinity, 1861", bound in a volume with a number of illustrations made by the artist Devlin, and also two pieces of an old document. These two pieces upon close examination prove to be when placed side by side, the upper half of the original, or a copy of the original Letter of Denization by Queen Anne to the members of the colony in charge of Joshua Kocherthal, whose name appears first in the list of the fifty-four individuals mentioned therein. Among them are those of Isaac DeTurk, Maria Weimarin and Catharine Weimarin, her daughter. The letter is in Latin and

upon comparison with the translation and the other lists of the members of the colony not without errors in translation and in transcription. These errors can, however, be readily detected, and have no bearing on the subject in hand.

Evidently Isaac DeTurk was entrusted with the custodianship of the Letter by Queen Anne. He accordingly carried the important document on his person from London to New York, and finally to Oley, where it was treasured by him and his descendants for a period of 150 years. It is now and has been for more than 70 years in the custody of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania.

The newly appointed Governor of New York, Lord Lovelace, set out with a fleet for the province about the middle of October, 1708. He sailed in the ship, Kingdale, and Joshua Kocherthal's colony on the ship, Globe. In their passage the colonists experienced what Kocherthal had cautioned them about in his pamphlet: "Perils from storms, and even with the convoy, pirates must be faced." Lord Lovelace in a letter dated New York, Dec. 18, 1708, tells of the voyage:

#### My Lords:

I do myself the honor to acquaint your Lordships that I very happily arrived here this morning having been nine weeks and odd days in the passage. The Kingdale in which I came being separated from the fleet got into Buzzard Bay in New England and getting pilots their gained our passage through the Sound between Long Island and the main, landed at Flushing. I do not yet hear of the arrival of any other ship of our fleet except the Unity which struck on the bank at Sandy Hook. She was left by all her seamen, but has since got off and is gone to sea again, we have not since heard of her, but hope she is safe having two good pilots from hence on board.

Our winter set in very hard and ports and rivers are full of ice. I am in pain for the Germans and recruits on board the Globe, they wanting water and the weather not permitting us to assist them. This coast is so terrible in the winter I think no ship ought to be sent hither from England after August at fartherst.

Our poor seamen were so benumbed with the cold, that at last we had but 25 men fit to do any duty and the soldiers which we had on board assisted. The ship had been in great danger. I shall take care to send the despatches I have for the several Governors on the Continent and to conform myself to the several instructions I have received from your Lordships. Being with great respect,

Your Lordships most faithful humble servant,

LOVELACE.

The date of the landing of the ship, Globe, with the Kocherthal colony is usually given as December 31, 1708. If the date of the baptism of Johann Herman Weber, son of Jacob Weber and his wife, Anna Elisabeth, is correctly given in "The Kocherthal Records" in the magazine "Olde Ulster", vol. 3 (1907), page 53, then the ship, Globe, bearing the colony must have put to sea more than a month earlier than the Kingdale on which the Governor sailed. Or possibly the colonists were living in the ship for some time prior to the sailing. The record states that the child was born on board the ship "globus" and that he was baptized on board the ship by the minister, Rev. Joshua Korcherthal, September 14, 1708.

The next reference to the colony is found in a letter by Lord Lovelace, dated March 4, 1709:

"I have not yet been able to divide the lands among the poor German Protestants, the snow being upon the ground and no distinction can yet be made between profitable and unprofitable land. I have been forced to support them by my credit here though I have not any direction about that matter neither from your Lordships nor the Lords Commissioners of Trade, yet I hope your Lordships will please to order the payment of such bills which I must draw upon my agent Mr. Gough to answer the charge of their support."

As soon as the weather permitted the colony was taken up the Hudson River and settled at the mouth of the Quassick Creek, known as the Thanskamir (Dance Chamber) on the hill slope now occupied by the well-known Newburgh on the Hudson. Hardly were they seated here when there arose a division among them on matters pertaining to worship. Rev. Kocherthal was of the Lutheran faith and apparently a high churchman, while a majority of the colony were of the Reformed faith, some of whom were tinged with Pietism. The colony was reduced by this time to the number of 46 of which number 26 sided with the pastor and 19 refused to attend divine services.

Isaac DeTurk and Maria Weimer were among the latter group. It was apparently about this time that they were married and not being in the good graces of the pastor they were married elsewhere, for their marriage is not found in the church book. The strife became so bitter that Kocherthal and several others petitioned the Council to have their maintenance or bounty which was 9 pence per day per head, discontinued. Here undoubtedly are seen the circumstances which caused Isaac DeTurk and his bride to turn their eyes towards Pennsylvania, where some of their kinsmen had settled.

The minutes of Council contain the following entry relative to the petition of the settlers:

"Upon reading the Petition of Joshua Cocherthal the Minister & Herman Schuneman and other of the Germans that were sent over hither by her Majesty's Charity setting forth that by reason of the Death of My Lord Lovelace they and the rest of these Germans are in Great want of Provisions and necessarys for their Support being provided for by his Lordship in his life time but since his Decease have received no subsistence and upon reading a Copy of a Report from the Right Honorable ye Lords of Trade to her Majesty dated ye 28th of April, 1708 with relations to said Germans and upon Coll. Nicholsons informeing this Board that he believes it was intended they should be supported by her Majesty's Bounty for nine or twelve months after their arrival here and it being represented to this Board that nineteen Persons of the forty seven of the said Germans have changed their Religion become Pietists and withdrawn themselves from the Communion of the Minister and ve Rest of ye said Germans, being seven and twenty in all which this Board conceives not agreeable to the intentions of her Majesty and may prove distructive of the Ends of their being settled here and the Gentlemen of this Board having brought to their remembrance that My Lord Lovelace did say in Councill that he had orders in England to allow the said Germans a maintenance for Twelve months after their arrival here and this Board being of opinion that unless some speedy measures be taken for their immediate support they cannot be capable to make any settlement on the land whereon they are placed but must desert the same and betake themselves to some other manner of Providing a maintenance whereby the End of her Majesty's Bounty and Charity will be wholly frustrated. It is therefore their request to Coll. Thomas Wenham that he do provide a needful and necessary support for the said Minister and ye six and Twenty other Germans of his Congregation untill the expiration of the said Twelve months from their arrival here or untill her Majesty's pleasure be known herein because the Revenue of this Province is Expired and besides the Government is greatly in debt."

The petition of Rev. Kocherthal was considered at a meeting of the Council on June 18, 1709, when it was ordered:

"that Mr. Van Dam, Mr. Barbarie & Capt. Provost be a Committee to Inquire into the Disputes between ye Germans lately sent to this Province by her Majesty & that Mr. Vesey and Mr. DuBois assist them in their said Inquire concerning their Religious Disputes."

Three days later, June 21, Mr. Barbarie on behalf of the Committee reported:

"that they have Inquired into those relateing to their Religion assisted by Mr. Vesey and Mr. DuBois and that nothing of the alligations suggested against those called Piesists have been proved before them.

"Whereupon it is the request of this Board that Coll. Wenham do victuall them in like manner with the other Germans till the alligations be made out to this Board.

"And it is ordered that such of their Cloaths, Tools & Materials as they shall want for their present Occupation be delivered to them."

Kocherthal now returned to London to obtain supplies, and to bring to the Province more of the Palatines who were coming to England in large numbers, 3000 of whom were settled in the Province of New York. Many of them later emigrated to Pennsylvania.

The only reference to the settlement for the following year is the list of those who participated in common division of the two full sets of carpenter tools which had been given "by her Majesty's Boundy" to Melchior Gulch "carpenter and Joiner" who apparently removed from the colony. Maria Weimerin was given "a smoothing plane, a file, a hatchet, besides several pieces more." The name of Isaac DeTurk appears on the list but no designation as to what was allotted to him. The list is dated April 20, 1710.

### CHAPTER III

## The DeTurk Family in America

The progenitor of the DeTurk family in America was ISAAC DETURK. He was baptized, as is recorded in Chapter I, page 5, on January 17, 1685. His ancestors, according to the record of the Huguenot Refugee Congregation at Frankenthal, Germany, originally came from the vicinity of Picardy in northern France, where there was seated a wealthy and highly honorable family named DeTurk. Their estates embraced extensive vineyards; and peace and happiness, joined with wealth, justify the family tradition that the home of the DeTurk was an ideal one.

Over their bright home, however, the dark shadows of adversity soon fell. The family was Protestant, and by reason of the religious contentions of the 16th and 17th centuries, their homes were ravished by the relentless Dragonades and their property was confiscated by the government. This persecution was the cause of from 500,000 to 1,000,000 Protestants (many of them of the nobility and of the best citizens of France) seeking refuge among Protestant sovereigns, who issued proclamations welcoming the fleeing Huguenots to their realms. Among these persecuted families were the DeTurks, DeHarcourts, Bertolets, Keims and LeVans, who sought refuge in the Palatinate in Frankenthal, Germany.

After three generations of temporary citizenship in Frankenthal (as is recorded in the baptismal record of the Refugee Congregation), they saw no hope of returning to their ancestral home in France. It was then that Isaac DeTurk, a young man of 23 years, resolved to accept the gracious invitation of Queen Anne of England to come to her dominions in America together with many other Huguenots and Palatines. Coming to London, he joined the company of Rev. Joshua Kocherthal. This company landed at New York in the ship Globe on December 31, 1708. (See Chapter II.) In the spring of 1709 he was among the company which temporarily settled at Esopus on Quassick Creek in Duchess County, New York. In this company was an accomplished young widow, Maria (DeHarcourt) Weimer, and her daughter Catharine, two years of age. This lady was connected with a prominent family (DeHarcourt), see page 45.

Isaac DeTurk and Maria (DeHarcourt) Weimer were married evidently at Esopus in the fall of 1709.

Instead of finding peace and rest and congenial industry at Esopus, Isaac DeTurk was sadly disappointed in his expectations, for instead he found tumult and disagreement among the various groups on account of the arbitrary management of affairs of the government. Neither did he think that the colony was free from religious oppression and petty persecutions; besides the climate was more rigorous than he had expected or desired. He therefore decided to seek a more genial and more sunny region. He was one of the first to take advantage of the liberal inducements held out by William Penn and finally became located in the beautiful Oley Valley.

Though there is no definite date of Isaac DeTurk's arrival in Oley, a fairly accurate estimate may be made from the record in the land office of Pennsylvania and an entry in the church book of the French Reformed Congregation in New York City. On April 29, 1711, Isaac DeTurk and his wife presented their daughter, Esther, for baptism in the French Protestant Church in New York City. It is natural to conclude that the immigrant parents, on their way from Esopus to Oley, in passing through New York City, took advantage of the opportunity thus afforded them to have their daughter baptized according to the form and custom of the Huguenot Church. Her baptism is recorded in the register of births, marriages and deaths of the "Eglise Francoise a la Nouvelle York", the French Protestant Church in New York City, as follows:

"Bateme—Auriourdhuy dimanche 29 e d'Avril 1711, Monsier Louis Rou, Ministre a Batise Esther leTurque, nee le 30 e d'Aouse dernier fille de Isaac le Turque et Maria a femme presentee au St. Bateme par François Lucas et la mere due dit enfant parein et mareinne. L: Rou, Pasteur."

Allowing several weeks for making the journey from New York to Oley, one cannot be far wrong in assigning the middle or latter part of May in the year of 1711 as the time of the coming of Isaac DeTurk to Oley.

On March 11, 1712, there were issued warrants to John Lee Dee, Isaac DeTurk, and John Fredericksfull for 300 acres, 300 acres, and 500 acres, respectively, to be laid out at a place called Oley in the County of Philadelphia. This, by the way, is the earliest record of this prominent locality in the county. Here they were encouraged "to seat themselves sometime ago, for which land they have agreed to pay to the proprietary's use in 3 months after the date thereof at the rate of 10 pounds for every 100 acres surveyed." The records also state that this tract was "to be holden as of our Manor, or reputed Manor of Springetsbury, in the county of Philadelphia, in free and common soccage, yielding and paying every year, on the 1st of March, one English silver shilling for every hundred acres." Believing that the three pioneers mentioned above did not venture to "seat themselves" on the frontier in midwinter, or even late in the season, it is concluded again that they came to Oley late in the spring of 1711.

Upon his arrival in Oley, Isaac DeTurk could nowhere find a place more to his satisfaction for establishing his new home than where he did. It is remarkable that the homestead is still in possession of the direct descendants, an excellent testimony to their thrift, judgment and industry. The spot in which he settled was in the silent forests on the head waters of the Little Manatawny Creek. At the time of his occupation of this section, the Oley Hills were the frontier limits between Philadelphia and the hunting ground of the Indians which in this section were the Oleka of the Lenni Lenape tribe and their kindred.

The patent was issued to Isaac DeTurk on the 28th day of July in 1712 for 300 acres of land, for the consideration of 30 pounds. The land is situated on the Little Manatawny, a branch

of the Manatawny Creek, a short distance south of the present village of Friedensburg (now Oley Post Office, Berks County, Penna.). The quit rent was not paid annually as it fell due. Isaac DeTurk paid 21 shillings for seven years in 1719. The greater part of this tract to the present day remains in the name of his descendants. The present owner is Dr. Daniel H. DeTurk of the seventh generation of DeTurks in America. He is the great, great, great grandson of the immigrant. The original homestead, however, or that part of the plantation where Isaac DeTurk settled when he came to Oley, is now in the possession of the Edward E. Rhoads estate. Mr. Rhoads before he died made extensive improvements to the buildings and to the place in general. It is here also where the remains of Isaac DeTurk and four generations of DeTurk descendants are buried in the private cemetery which was recently improved and made permanent by the DeTurk Family Association.

In 1721 Isaac DeTurk purchased another tract of 138 acres adjoining his own. This later became the property of his daughter, Esther, who married Abraham Bertolet. It has to the present day remained in the name of the Bertolet family and is now the property of Israel M. Bertolet, a great, great grandson of Abraham and Esther (DeTurk) Bertolet.

The first task to which Isaac DeTurk set himself after having chosen the site for his future home, was to provide temporary shelter for his family; later he built a log cabin. This was followed by the erection of a barn. This was likewise built of logs. It had a large threshing floor in the center with stables on the sides for the horse's and cattle. It was in this barn that the interesting ceremony of the baptizing of the Indians took place. It was razed in 1843 when the present barn was built.

Having provided shelter for the cattle, the next step was the construction of a permanent house. Isaac DeTurk died before he could accomplish this desire of his heart, and it remained for his son, John, to fulfill this hope. The house he built is still standing, but it is not the so-called old DeTurk house standing

along the stream which has a log in the front with this legend incised: "Johan DeTurk, Deborah DeTurken, 1767", but it is the western end of the present main stone dwelling, 32 x 38 feet, built prior to 1742 when the third Moravian Synod met in it. This substantial and commodious stone farm house, well cared for against time and casualty, is preserved and used to the present day as the main dwelling on the farm. It is generally supposed that it was built in the year 1740, or about the time of the marriage of John DeTurk and Deborah Hoch.

John D. DeTurk, of Kutztown, Penna., who was born and raised on the original homestead, remembers that his father, Nathan K. DeTurk, told him that in 1844, his father, John DeTurk, in making the addition (21 x 32 feet) to the original dwelling, the eastern gable end of the main house was taken down, and that a date stone was found in it which was accidentally incorporated in the foundation of this new part. He also remembers that there were loopholes in the western gable end, resembling a fort, as a protection against hostile Indians, until in 1877 when it was remodelled and windows were placed there instead of the loopholes. At the same time the large center chimney with its enormous fireplace was taken down. Another fireplace was on the second floor. The kitchen extended along the entire east side of the house and had a wide entrance at each end.

The doors were double like those of a stable. John D. DeTurk also distinctly remembers his father riding into the kitchen on horseback one cold winter day dragging in a heavy log for use as a back log in the huge open fireplace. He recalls that a sixplate stove extended from the hearth over into the other room, that on the plates were some Biblical inscriptions and that one of the plates was broken into two pieces.

In 1914 Dr. John Baer Stoudt in company with Rev. Isaac Stahr, visited the DeTurk homestead in search of stove plates and found the upper half of a front plate face downward at the opening of the bake oven at the wash house along the creek. They informed Henry C. Mercer whose book on stove plates was then

in press, of the find. He held up the completion of the book entitled "The Bible in Iron" so as to include in it a picture and description of this interesting fragment. What became of this part plate is not known. Several plates, undoubtedly the side plates, were sold at public sale held on the premises later.

The first barn was razed in 1843 when the present spacious barn was constructed. A part of the foundation of the first barn is still visible. The new barn had a board on the front with the inscription:

John DeTurk

and

Susanna 1843

Early history shows that Isaac DeTurk took interest in the affairs of the Oley Valley during the few years he lived there before his death. On September 5, 1720, a petition bearing his signature was presented to court at Philadelphia for the erection of Oley Township. It stated that on account of the distance, it was too far from Philadelphia to do business, and that almost all of the signers were settled on lands adjoining Amity Township on a tract consisting of about 10,000 acres. This petition included the following well-known names among its signers.

This petition was not acted upon until 1740 when the boundary lines were run.

In relating the few facts available about the first difficult years of the DeTurk family in America, it is only fair to include the brave part played by the wife of Isaac DeTurk. Much credit is due Maria DeTurk for the capable manner in which she took care of her family, especially after the death of her husband, who died in the prime of life. Acting as father and mother, counselor and teacher, she raised her children in a pious and upright manner, inculcating the high ideals of noble parentage in the minds and souls; bringing them to manhood and womanhood ready to take their rightful places in the life of the community.

A bit of her history is fitting here.. She was the daughter. of Jean DeHarcourt of Mulhofen, a farm village about four miles distant from Landau. Daniel May Keim of Bristol, Penna., who was born in Reading in 1806, prepared (about 1860) a genealogical manuscript on the descendants of Nicholas Keim, the third son of Johannes Keim, the pioneer settler in Oley. In it he gives the following list of the children of Jean DeHarcourt:

Peter DeHarcourt.

Susan DeHarcourt, married to Jean Bertolet.

Paul DeHarcourt.

Anna Maria DeHarcourt, married to Isaac DeTurk.

Esther DeHarcourt, married to Jacob Steiner.

The family de Hericourt belonged to the ancient nobility of France and took its name from the estate (terre) de Hericourt in la Comte de Saint Pol (Dictionnaire de la Noblesse de France, Tome, VIII, a Paris, 1774). On page 64 of Memorials of the Huguenots by Stapleton, appears the following footnote: "Among the notable men of this name may be mentioned Henri DeHarcourt (1601-1666) who was a famous general, Duke Henri DeHarcourt (1653-1703) and Francois DeHarcourt (1786-1865) and also the Hon. Sir William Vernon DeHarcourt (1827) of England, the successor of Gladstone to the leadership of the Liberal party, who descends from Count Richard DeHarcourt, one of the Norman

Knights who accompanied William the Conquerer to England in A. D. 1066."\*

The self-confident Anna Maria (DeHarcourt) Weimer, a widowed daughter of Jean DeHarcourt, with her daughter, yet a child, also boldly set forth to London about the same time and was on the same ship bound for America with Isaac DeTurk to whom she was married probably in the fall of 1709 at Esopus, Duchess County, New York, where they had made temporary settlement before coming to Oley.

Working hand in hand with her husband, she was the typical pioneer mother, sharing in the dangers and hardships of the frontier. In a letter written (in German) to her family in Alsace she tells of the difficulty of establishing a home in the new country. This letter found its way back to Oley where it was copied by I. Daniel Rupp in 1842 and included in his history of Berks and Lebanon Counties. It was probably brought back to Oley by her sister, the wife of Jean Bertolet, when they came to settle in Oley in 1726. The letter reveals that some members of her family in Alsace had made inquiries relative to their settling in Pennsylvania. It is so full of interest as to warrant publishing it in full: Following is a translated copy:

Oley, May 14, 1718.

Brothers, sisters, relatives and friends:

I greet you all cordially. I have received your letter, from which I learn what you wish; but to answer which is a small matter. I will make my situation known to you—tell you how it is with me. I am now in a better state than I had been in

<sup>\*</sup> It was at Mulhaften (Germany) that Jean Bertolet married Susannah DeHartcourt prior to 1712, and in the latter year settled at Minnefeldten, near there, until he emigrated with his wife and five children to the New World. It was from Frankenthal, but a few miles distant, that Isaac DeTurk went to London during the reign of Queen Anne, on his way to the American colony. In the same section within a radius of twenty miles of Speier, and in that city, dwelt the family of Keim. It is an interesting fact that these families after years of hardships and bitter experiences, finally founded within a few miles of each other, free homes for themselves and their posterity at Oley in Pennsylvania, Johannes Keim in 1708 (who it is generally supposed was married to a sister of Isaac DeTurk), Isaac DeTurk in 1711, and Jean Bertolet in 1726.

Germany. Here God made me free from sin. I cannot sin any more, for which I now, and shall ever, praise God. I clave unto Him, and thus He drew nigh me and has taken His abode in me. If you desire to enjoy the new birth with me, withdraw your mind and thoughts from all worldly things—see God only—continue to pray, sigh day and night, that God would regenerate you. If you prove sincere, you will experience wonders. Men boast of being Christians who know not what the new birth is. The new birth is the new stone, which no one knows, only he that receives it.

To emigrate to Pennsylvania is vain, if you are sinners. Who knows whether you will arrive safely? Most persons have to endure sickness—many die. In Pennsylvania there is unrest, too, as well as in Germany. If it is not by reason of war, there is something else, which is disagreeable.

Men will never find rest in this world, go whither they will. With God only is there rest. If you see rest elsewhere, you will still be restless—thus it is in America. But if one is free from sin, he may go abroad, or remain in Germany, then he has the most precious treasure with him; he is contented where he is—is delighted with his treasure anywhere in the world.

Preachers and their hearers, all of them, are no Christians, they are sinners. Christ has come to abolish sin. He, then, that is not free from sin, for him Christ has not yet come into the world. All the preachers in the world that have not been made free from sin, and yet can sin—"Sündigen Köennen"—are false teachers, be they pious or impious. Naught but Christ is of any avail in His kingdom. He that hath not Christ is none of His; for where Christ is there is freedom from sin.

I again greet you all cordially. Think of what I have written; lay it to heart; it will be more precious to you than all else in the world.

Maria DeTurk (Geborhne DeHeroken (DeHarcourt)

This letter has been generally regarded as indicating that Mrs. DeTurk was at the time under the influence of Mathias Bauman.

the leader of the sect in Oley, known as the New Born. However, this does not necessarily follow. Although she does speak in the letter of enjoying a "new birth", she makes no mention of Bauman, and it is doubtful if he was even in Oley at the time of writing the letter. It rather reflects the outbreak of pietism of which Rev. Kocherthal complains in his petition to the authorities in New York when he states that nineteen of the members of the colony turned Pietists and separated from the rest of the company. It is known that both Isaac DeTurk and his wife were among this number.

Isaac DeTurk left a last will dated January 22, 1717, a copy of which is given here in full:

"In the name of God, Ame. I, Isaac DeTurk of Oley, in the County of Philadelphia, Yeoman, being at this time in Indifferent good health of body, and also of a sound and disposing Mind and Memory, Praised be the Lord for his Goodness towards me, But Considering the Frailty of this transitory Life, and the uncertainty thereof, do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say: First of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my Body I commit to the Earth, to be decently buried at the discretition of mine Executrix hereinafter named, And of my Worldly Estate I devise and dispose as hereafter followeth.

Imprimis, I give and bequeath to my wife Mary all & singular my Clear Estate Real and personal, and the profits thereof, during her Viduity or Widowhood, so nevertheless that her Daughter Catherine Wimur, and my two Children—Esther and John DeTurk shall be educated out of the sd. Mine Estate by my aforesd. wife Mary, their Mother, and Equally be provided for, as much as in her lies; But in Case she should marry again, then I only give and bequeath unto her the Third of my sd. Estate, according to the good Laws of this Province. And in this Case of her marrying again, my will is, that my aforesd. Estate both Real and personall shall be apprized or valued by Judicious and Impartial men, and two parts thereof secured for the above name Catharine,

Esther and John, unto them afterwards Equally to be Divided, share and share alike. And my will further is, that the sd. my son John DeTurk shall have and hold my Plantation lying and being in Oley aforesd. to him, his heirs and Assigns for Ever, he satisfying his two sisters for their two parts or shares, according to the afore Mentioned valuation of impartial Men. And whatever my sd. wife Mary (not marrying again) doth leave unconsumed I give and bequeath to the sd. Catherine, Esther and John to be divided among them in Equal shares, as above expresst, that is to say, One Just third part thereof to each of them.

Finally, I Constitute and appoint my aforesd. wife Mary whole and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament, during her lifetime, and after her Decease I make and ordain my Friends Philip Kuhlwein of Oley, Yeoman, and Dirk Jansen of Germantown, weaver, Executors of this my sd. Last Will and Testament, to whose care and Tuition I also commit the aforesd. three Children after their Mothers Decease or Marrying again, until they come to be of Age, Hereby utterly revoking and disannulling all and other former Will Legacies and Exects. by me in any ways heretofore made, given or ordained, Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the 22nd day of January, Anno Domini 1717.

The appraisement was made October 18, 1727 by Philip Kiehlwein, Arnold Huffnail and Samuel Guildin (residents of the vicinity) who directed John DeTurk to pay his sisters each twenty pounds. The quit claim deed to John DeTurk by his sisters and their husbands was executed December 30, 1761. It is probable that Maria DeTurk died shortly before that date. Isaac DeTurk, probably died shortly before his will was probated. He and his wife are buried in the private cemetery on the original homestead. There were three children:

- 1. Catherine Weimer, daughter of Mrs. DeTurk by her first marriage, married to Abraham Levan.

## CHAPTER IV

## John DeTurk and Deborah Hoch

JOHN DETURK, the only son of Isaac and Maria (DeHarcourt) DeTurk, was born on September 23, 1713, according to the records in the Oley Moravian Church Book. He was one of the first white children born in the Oley Valley, and in his twenty-eighth year was received in the Oley Congregation of God in the Spirit by the sacred rite of baptism. He died in February, 1781.

He lost his father at the tender age of fourteen years, but his mother who survived her husband for many years, by kind and judicious guidance reared her son through the early years of his youth and inculcated in his mind the principles of his father so that in many respects he became the counterpart of his father. He passed all his days on the plantation on which he was born, and left his impress upon the community, not only by his industry, benevolence and piety, but even more abundantly by his offspring in whom was fulfilled the proverb of old:

"Children's children are the crown of old men, And the glory of children are their fathers."

He was married to Deborah Hoch, born in 1721, daughter of John Hoch, of Oley, and granddaughter of Rudolph Hoch who, with his brother Melchior, emigrated from Alsace in 1717. The Hoch family were Mennonites, and are said to be of Swiss origin.

John DeTurk and his wife are buried in the private cemetery on the plantation.

The date of John DeTurk's marriage to Deborah Hoch has been ascertained by Morton L. Montgomery, who in 1884 visited the DeTurk homestead in Oley to learn the time and circumstances of the marriage, to be used in an article on the DeTurk family which later appeared in No. 2, Vol. II. Historical Register, Notes

and Queries, published by Dr. Wm. H. Egle of Harrisburg, Penna. At the time there was shown to him the marriage certificate of John DeTurk and Deborah Hoch. The document disclosed that they were married on May 13, 1740 "in ye presence of George Boone, one of the Justices of the Peace for ye city and county of Philadelphia." Montgomery states that the following witnessed the certificate in their own handwriting: Henry Leinbach, John Hoch, Samuel Hoch, Abraham Bartolet, Esther Bartolet, Abraham Levan, Catherine Levan, Elizabeth Yoder, Mary High, Samuel Hoch. Of the above, Esther Bartolet was a sister to John DeTurk, and Catherine Levan was his half sister. John Hoch was evidently the father of Deborah Hoch and Samuel Hoch, her brother. The other Samuel Hoch was most likely her uncle, and Mary High, his daughter.

It is generally supposed that the stone dwelling was erected about the time of this marriage (see Chapter III).

A few years after their marriage the most notable event in the early history of the Oley Valley took place on the DeTurk plantation. It was the Great Meeting of the Moravian Synod hold on February 10, 11 and 12, 1742. The first minister located in Oley was Rev. Andrew Eschenbach, a Moravian, who was sent there in 1740 to labor among the Pennsylvania Germans. Eschenbach's preaching made a deep impression upon the people. In the year following his arrival he is said to have had 51 followers including several Leinbachs who were Reformed, a number of Lutherans named Buerstler, John DeTurk, a French Huguenot, and others. It was in November, 1741, that Count Zinzendorf came to America and preached at the houses of John DeTurk and Jean Bertolet in Oley. In the meantime Henry Antes had extended an invitation to the several religious leaders among the German settlers in Pennsylvania to attend a conference in Germantown, "not for the purpose of disputing, but to confer in love on the most important articles of faith in order to ascertain how far they might all agree in the essential points." The conference met at the house of Theobalt Endt in Germantown on January 1, 1742, with Henry Antes presiding over the assembly. More than fifty persons took part in the deliberations, one of whom was John DeTurk. The second of the Pennsylvania conferences met at the home of George Huebner at Faulkner Swamp on January 15th and 16th at which time Count Zinzendorf was elected chairman. It was agreed to issue a call for a Synod the following month, and John DeTurk, who had become ardent in his support of the union movement under the name of the Congregation of God in the Spirit, offered the use of his house and barn in Oley for the next conference. Accordingly, the Third Synod opened at John DeTurk's farm in Oley on February 10, 1742, and continued three days.

At one of the sessions of this conference an interesting and unusual event occured. On account of the large number of people attending, they met in the huge barn. Three Indians from Shekomeko, New York, who had been converted by Rev. Christian Henry Rauch, appeared for baptism. "The appearance of the three Indian visitors, whose hearts were filled with the grace of Jesus Christ and the love of God, made a deep impression upon all present. Soon after their arrival, a party of Delaware Indians came to see them, to whom they immediately spoke of Jesus Christ, their God and Saviour. They likewise declared to their brethren how much they wished for baptism. Having received the gospel with a believing heart, been faithfully instructed in the doctrine of salvation, and earnestly desiring to obtain mercy and pardon in the blood of Jesus; the synod first declared them candidates for baptism, and then resolved, without delay, to administer holy baptism to them in the presence of this whole assembly."

"The greatest solemnity prevailed, and the spirit of God was sensibly felt, during the morning exercises, which consisted of prayer and praising the Father of all as in spiritual song. . . . While the humble believers were engaged in preparatory exercises to baptize the contrite Indians, some ill-disposed people coming from the neighborhood raised such disturbance that the whole company was upon the point of dispersing and postponing this transaction for the present. However, peace and quietness being

happily restored, there was a solemn meeting in the afternoon in which Christian Rauch and Gottlieb Buettner were ordained deacons by the two bishops, David Nitchman and Count Zinzendorf. After this act, preparations were made in the barn for the baptism. The whole assembly being met, the three catechumens were placed in the midst, and with fervent prayer and supplication, devoted to the Lord Jesus Christ, as his eternal property; upon which Rauch, with great emotion of heart, baptized these three firstlings of the North American Indians into the death of Jesus, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, calling Shabash, Abraham; Seim, Isaac; and Kiop, Jacob."

This baptism had a great influence upon those present and filled them with awe and joy to such an extent that it was followed by preaching by the various ministers, not only during that evening but during the whole night. This meeting made a deep impression in favor of the Moravians, and led to the erection of the church and school building. The exact date of the erection is not known, but it is certain that it occurred between 1743 and 1745. The land (about 15 acres) was donated but by whom it is not certain. Some authorities give this credit to John DeTurk.

In John DeTurk's Bible was found on a loose sheet of paper a register of his children in his own handwriting. The name of Deborah, the last child, is not given. This omission makes it possible to approximately fix the time of making this birthday register as 1760. The birth of Deborah was taken from a later register. A translation of the original record, which was made in German, is given in full:

# REGISTER OF THE BIRTHDAYS OF MY CHILDREN

My son, Isaac, was born August 25, 1741, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

My son, Daniel, was born September 18, 1742, at 2 o'clock.

My son, Johannes, was born January 28, 1747, at 6 o'clock.

My son, Johannes, was born January 28, 1747, at 6 o'clock in the afternoon.

- My son, SAMUEL, was born May 25, 1750, at half past five in the evening.
- My son, Abraham, was born March 3, 1752, at 10 o'clock in the evening.
- My son, Philip, was born April 30, 1757, at midday.
- My son, JACOB, was born November 24, 1759, at midday.
- My daughter, Susanna, was born March 27, 1745, at 4 o'clock.
- My daughter, Maria, was born July 16, 1748, at 1 o'clock in the morning.
- My daughter, ESTHER, was born February 19, 1753, at 10 o'clock in the morning.
- My unnamed daughter was born November 19, 1753, at 10 o'clock in the morning and died November 23, 1753, at 1 o'clock in the morning.

(Deborah was born June 15, 1761, at half past eleven at night.)

Of the above children, Isaac, Jacob and Esther died young. They and their unnamed sister were buried close by their parents in the family cemetery on the original plantation. Their graves, like those of their parents and grandparents, were marked by common field stones. These stones were still there as late as 1900.

John DeTurk is known to have had a slave. His life spans much of the Colonial period of Pennsylvania. He took a keen interest in the American Revolution in which he and his five sons gave service. After the adoption of the Declaration of Independence and the formation of a new state of government, he came forth and not only assumed the oath of allegiance, but also enlisted in the local company of militia. He died early in the year 1781, in the assurance that the country to which his father came to establish a home for himself and his descendants, would be a free and independent nation.

He left the following will in which he divided his estate among the children:

I, JOHN DETURK, of Oley Township in the County of Berks in Pennsylvania, Yeoman am weak and sick in Body but of a good sound mind memory and understanding thanks be to God for it

do make and publish this to be my Testament and last Will in manner and form following that is to say: Imprimis I recommend my immortal soul in the hand of Almighty God and my Body to be Buried in the earth in a decent & Christian like manner and that all my lawful debts, shall be paid by my Executors or the survivors of them.

Item. I give Devise and Bequeath to my son Abraham DeTurk and to his heirs and assigns for ever the following piece or Tract of Land with all the Building thereon Erected in the Township and County, aforesaid part of my Dwelling Plantation Beginning at an Ash Tree a Corner of Philip Reifs Land and from thence partly by P. Reifs Land and Daniel Hahs Land south west four hundred and twenty one perches to a post thence south East eighty four Perches to a post thence North East forty two and a half Degree East Three Hundred and Thirty four perches one quarter of Perch by the other post of my Land to a stone thence south seventy three degrees East three perches to a Spanish Oak thence to Cross a run or water stream four perches and a half to a stone south fifty Seven degrees East Seventeen Perches and a half to a stone thence North twenty eight Degrees and a half East Eighty one perches to a post thence North East fifty five Perches to the place of beginning containing one hundred and Eighty Seven Acres of Land it be the same more or less with this condition and Reservation that my son Philip DeTurk and his heirs and assigns for ever shall have free Liberty Priviledges to take all the water out of a certain dam on the land aforesaid and to lease in and through a certain Race or Water Course to water his adjoint meadow ground from the first day of April yearly and every year during the season from Monday evening at sun set until Wednesday evening at sun set and from Wednesday at sun set my son Abraham DeTurk is to begin and shall have the water until Friday evening at sun set and so to change successively every eight and forty hours according to the true intent, and meaning hereof and my son Abraham & his heirs and assigns and my son Philip & his heirs and assigns shall from time to time and at all times when occasion requires jointly repair uphold and maintain the said Dam which Land Plantation I do value to him for nine hundred pounds in gold or silver money or the value thereof, so that each Spanish silver dollar shall weigh seventeen penny weight and six grains.

Item. I give devise and bequeath to my son Philip DeTurk and to his heirs and assigns for ever the remaining part of my dwelling plantation in the township and county aforesaid with all the Buildings thereon erected containing one hundred and eighty seven acres of land it be the same more or less with all such liberty and priviledges as I had Reserved in the foregoing article to water his meadow ground which land I do value to him my son Philip DeTurk for one thousand and one hundred pounds in gold or silver money or the value thereof.

Item. I give and bequeath to my said son Philip DeTurk and to his heirs and assigns forever one undivided fourth part of and in a tract of fifteen acres of land in the township and county aforesaid which I hold in common with Jacob Schneider, Peter Schneider and Daniel High.

Item. I give and bequeath to my said son Philip DeTurk and to his heirs and assigns one undivided fourth part of and in three acres of land in the said Township and adjoining the aforesaid fifteen acres whereon a school House and Burying ground is erected which I hold by lease in common with the said Jacob Schneider, Peter Schneider and Daniel High During the time of the said lease.

Item. My Will is and I give and bequeath to each of my children Daniel, John, Samuel, Abraham and Philip and my daughter Susannah Sheafer, Maria Weiser and Deborah DeTurk Knabb the sum of Four Hundred Pounds and so much as each of them hath Received of me in my life time as may appear by my family Book shall be Deemed as part of the said sum if it was in money or other effects the horses and mares which I give to my son excepted.

Item. I give and bequeath to my grandson John Weiser the sum of two hundred pounds in gold or silver money as the value thereof and lastly I nominate constitute and appoint as and for Executors of this my Testament and last Will my son Daniel DeTurk and my loving Brother in law Samuel High of Alsace Township and my son John DeTurk and I give them and the survivor of them full Power to sell my personal Estate in such manner as they or the survivor of them shall think proper and if by reason of Word or other unavoidable Accident my personal Estate should suffer any loss or Damage my children shall bear all such loss or Damage and my Executors or the survivors of them shall be indemnified and if in case my Personal Estate should not amount by sale to so much money that my daughters can be paid their four hundred pounds as aforesaid with what they have received of me in my life time and to pay my grand son John Weiser his legacy then each of them shall stay with the remainder until the first payment of my son Samuel Abraham & Philip become due.

In Witness whereof I have set my hand seal dated the eleventh day of January 1781.

### CHAPTER V

# Catharine Weimer

CATHARINE WEIMER was a daughter of Isaac DeTurk's wife by a former marriage. As a child she accompanied her mother from London to America in the Kocherthal Company and shared in all the hardships of the first settlers. Though she has no blood relation to the DeTurk family, her record is given here because of her associations with the family throughout her life. Isaac DeTurk considered her as one of his children and gave her equal shares with his own children in his will.

Catharine Weimer was born on February 22, 1706, and died September 29, 1768. She was married to Abraham LeVan, one of the LeVan immigrant brothers. He was born September 20, 1698, and died April 21, 1779. Both are buried in the private cemetery on the original LeVan homestead in Oley, Berks County, Penna. The LeVan homestead is located about one and one-half miles east of the town of Friedensburg. The baptismal certificate of Abraham obtained from the clerk of the Walloon Congregation in Amsterdam, Holland, in 1751 has been preserved. It shows that he was a son of Daniel LeVan and Marie Beau and that he was baptized by H. Colviens in the presence of Abraham Fabre and Susana LeVan. He is said to have emigrated to Pennsylvania about 1717.

On September 26, 1761, Catharine LeVan of Oley, Berks County, appeared before the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania in session at Philadelphia and asked for naturalization. This is one of the few cases on record in the province of a woman receiving naturalization. No doubt, seeing the wilderness of Oley changed into a region of large and productive farms, and her children

grown up and having families of their own, she wished to identify herself as fully as possible with the state that offered to her parents a place of refuge and which promised peace, plenty and happiness for her children and her children's children.

### CHAPTER VI.

## Esther DeTurk Branch

ESTHER DeTURK was the first child born to Isaac and Maria (Harcourt) DeTurk while they were still at Esopus in Duchess County, New York. She was born September 29, 1710 and was baptized April 29, 1711 in the French Protestant Church in New York City. She was married in 1735 to Abraham Bertolet, born Dec. 12, 1712 in Minfield, Germany, died in July, 1766. They were first cousins, he being the son of Jean and Susanna (Harcourt) Bertolet. He was fourteen years old when he came with his parents to this country in 1726. She died May 17, 1798. Both are buried in Bertolet Union Cemetery, Oley, Penna.

The Bertolet homestead, now the property of Israel M. Bertolet (a great, great grandson of Abraham and Esther (DeTurk) Bertolet) was a gift to Esther DeTurk from her father and was in her own right, the original deed being drawn in her name on May 7, 1721 when she was only eleven years of age. This farm was formerly owned by Thomas Boone, who held title to much land in Oley; this title being dated June 7-8, 1682, which was prior to the arrival of William Penn in this country (October 12, 1692) indicates that this section must have attracted the attention of the English capitalists at an early date. The location of the farm is a beautiful one and presents many superior advantages as a site for a home. There is a gushing spring and running water abounds. It was this that induced this young woman to select this farm as her choice in preference to others. Close by the spring is a low knoll upon which was located at that time an Indian village. The place bears marks of it to the present day.

In 1736, soon after they were married, they built the substantial stone house which is still standing and is used as the family dwelling. The sum paid for the farm by Isaac DeTurk was eleven pounds. Before her death Mrs. Bertolet sold it to her son Daniel for eleven hundred dollars, indicating a decided increase in value. Even at that price it was far below market value.

Abraham Bertolet was a blacksmith by trade and from his account books which are still preserved, it appears that he did an extensive business. By the genealogical records it is seen that Mrs. Bertolet long survived her husband. She was an exemplary woman, endowed with an excellent memory and delighted in her declining years to relate many of her pioneer adventures.

In her youth she associated much with the red skinned children of the forest and learned to speak their dialect with ease. Many of these early associates paid her frequent visits after she was married and settled on the homestead. The old house was generally assigned for lodging these visitors. On one occasion it so happened that a company of Indians were quartered there for the night during which a flood occurred. The old house stood on a low level and was soon submerged. The Indians were nearly drowned and were only saved by the strenuous exertions of their host.

In the days of her childhood the lands of the farmer had to be guarded carefully against the ravages of wolves and other wild animals which abounded in great numbers to the annoyance of the settlers. This task of watching the stock was generally assigned to the women of the household since it was easier work than felling trees, making rails and clearing land. Consequently it frequently fell to Esther's lot to watch the growing herds and flocks. When thus engaged, the hungry wolves would howl around her and mingle their fierce howling with her faithful shepherd dogs. One day a she wolf had the audacity to bound in the midst of her flock, seize a sheep before her very face, throw it upon her back and bound away with her prize in spite of the brawny shepherd dogs and the consternation of the remainder of the flock.

Esther DeTurk Bertolet related an interesting instance of maternal affection on the part of an Indian woman who had

buried her child near the DeTurk dwelling. This came to Esther's notice while she was yet quite young and still living with her parents. The little grave was regularly visited every year by the fond mother who came to repair it and mourn for the departed child. She would kneel upon the ground by the side of the grave, bend over it as one laden with grief, while with both hands she repaired it allowing her disheveled hair to float in the breeze, weeping tears of anguish for the lost treasure of her heart, presenting a picture of pity and sorrow. She thus wept out her grief, yet thus ever remained that bitter sting which a true mother, regardless of race or color, alone can feel when bereft of the object of her love and affection. Such is affection.

She also remembered well the time when there was no heavy timber in Oley except along the borders of the creeks and in that portion of the valley in the direction of the spot where the Oley Furnace was later erected which was low and consequently inaccessible to fire. All the middle and lower part of the valley was nothing but one vast expanse of scrub oak over which the deer could be seen to leap from afar, a sport peculiar to this animal. This section was annually run over with fire by the Indians for hunting, she said. More than once she saw the lands on fire presenting a fearful and terrific sight. The deer and other animals would emerge from their hiding places and flee for other places of safety only to be entrapped by the wary Indian hunters.

## CHAPTER VII

## Daniel B. DeTurk Branch

(3) DANIEL B. DeTURK (3), (John 2, Isaac 1), born Sept. 18, 1742, died June 27, 1791, married in 1769 to Catherine LeVan (born June 18, 1746, died April 25, 1819). Daniel B. DeTurk was Captain of Company 3, Fourth Battalion of Berks County (known as the Flying Camp) in the War of the Revolution. There is a possibility that his company was with Washington late in 1776 and may have shared in the memorable events preceding Washington's victory at Trenton. The following letter from Col. Henry Haller to Captain DeTurk is taken from "Berks County in the Revolution" by Montgomery:

"By Henry Haller, Esq., Colonel of the Regiment raising in Berks County to compose part of the quota of the troops which is to be furnished by Pennsylvania for the Flying Camp.

"To Daniel Turk, Esq., Captain of a Company in the said Battalion:

"You are directed to march your company the nearest and best way to Amboy in the Jerseys with all expedition that lies in your power, where you are to join the Pennsylvania forces and then to apply to the Commander in Chief for the time being for further orders.

"You are to place guards over the baggage wagons, who are to be furnished with powder and ball, but must not load without necessity. The Guards always to be accountable and must deliver over the Ammunition which they have received to the succeeding guard.

"The men to be restrained as much as possible from drinking too much strong liquor or committing the least insult on the inhabitants of the places through which they march. "Given under my Hand and Seal at Reading ye 23rd of August, 1776.

Henry Haller."

In pursuance of this order, Capt. DeTurk proceeded with his company from Reading, Pa., on August 24, 1776. The Bethlehem, Penna., Diary notes that on August 26, 1776, that very significant year for the fortunes of America, two companies of soldiers who had marched from Reading, Pa., arrived at Bethlehem. One of these companies recruited in and about Oley, was under the command of Capt. Daniel B. DeTurk who had been a school boy in the Oley Moravian school. Is it not a fair inference that the training received by him had left an impression on the young officer of 33 years when it is next noted that these men that evening attended services in the Moravian house of worship in Bethlehem? This apparently is the last connection of the DeTurk family with the Moravians.

The monthly pay of the men of Capt. DeTurk's company is of sufficient interest to include in this record: Captain—15 pounds; lieutenant—10 pounds, 2 shilling, 6 pence; sergeants—3 pounds, corporals and fifers—2 pounds, 15 shillings; and privates—2 pounds 10 shillings. These amounts were taken from the original pay roll, entitled "A pay roll of Capt. Daniel B. DeTurk's company of militia of the Third Class of Berks County, Pa., commanded by Col. Michael Lindemuth." Col. Henry Spyker, the paymaster, paid the men in 1778. Capt. DeTurk is mentioned as of Oley, but he was from Alsace, an adjoining township.

Both Daniel DeTurk and his wife are buried in the DeTurk-Rothermel Private Cemetery near Tuckerton, Penna.







### CHAPTER XI

## Samuel DeTurk Branch

SAMUEL DETURK in 1785 purchased one half of the Esquire Boone homestead in Exeter Township and his brother, John DeTurk, obtained the other half of the 256 acre tract. The original Boone dwelling was on the part of the land acquired by Samuel DeTurk. He occupied it for a period of 27 years, when he built the stone house now standing, in the gable end of which is a date stone with the inscription: "Samuel and Catharine DeTurk, 1812."

The house in which Esquire Boone lived and in which Daniel Boone was born, was built of logs as was customary at that time. It had a large open fireplace with a mantle log six feet above the floor. Mrs. Samuel DeTurk in her declining years, delighted in telling her grandchildren how the famous hunter, Daniel Boone, on the occasion of his return to Exeter Township, to visit the scenes of his boyhood and to renew acquaintances, came to their house and standing beside the fireplace, placed his hand on the log of the mantle and said "Just so tall was my father. He was six feet tall."

Some time after the completion of the stone dwelling, the old Boone log house was dismantled and rebuilt against the east end of the farmhouse. The mantle of the fireplace was again six feet high. Benjamin G. DeTurk, grandson of Samuel DeTurk, to whom the property descended, was six feet tall and proud of his height. His son, Morris H. DeTurk, remembers how his father was wont to step under the mantle and repeat the words of Daniel Boone. "Just so tall was my father," and then would add "I am as tall as was Esquire Boone."

This part of the dwelling is weather boarded, but the logs may be seen from the inside, and the fireplace and mantle are still intact. It is located about a mile north of Baumstown and eight miles southeast of Reading, Penna.

SAMUEL DeTURK served in Capt. Joseph Sand's Company in the War of the American Revolution. He married Catherine Kerst and lived to be 65 years of age. He is buried in the private cemetery on the Boone farm, on the part which his brother, John DeTurk, bought in 1785. Morris H. DeTurk, a great-grandson of Samuel obtained title to the plot on which this cemetery is located and had it restored by enclosing it with a concrete wall or coping and by laying a concrete pavement over the whole plot, thus preserving it permanently.

He later married Maria (Moll) DeTurk, widow of Isaac DeTurk of Perry Township, and lived retired until his death. He was a member of the Reformed Church. ## CHAPTER XII

## Abraham DeTurk Branch

DANIEL DETURK tore down the house built by his grand-father, ABRAHAM DETURK, and his great grandfather, John DeTurk, on the part of the original DeTurk tract which John DeTurk later willed to his son Abraham. It was razed in 1858 for the purpose of rebuilding. Hidden coins were found under the hearth during this process of razing. DeB. Randolph Keim refers to these coins in an article entitled "DeTurk Reminiscences and Relics" in his book on "The Keim and Allied Families". In 1900 he had visited several of the DeTurk families in the vicinity for data for this article which includes the following:

"The workmen discovered under the hearth on the second story a number of gold, silver and copper coins. Some were round and others four and five-sided. One of these gold coins shown the editor by Jonas DeTurk was a Louis d'or, which had been restamped over the original die. Both impressions were distinct, but so confused as to be difficult to separate. On the obverse was 'Ludwig III D. G.', on the reverse, 1691, a Maltese cross, sceptre, sword and two crowns.

"Susanna DeTurk of Oley, Pa., showed the editor Vol. 1 of a three-volume Bible in German, brought to America by Isaac DeTurk the Founder, in 1708. It was octavo, 400 pages and covered from Genesis to Job. Each page was in five columns, giving as many versions of the Bible in parallel columns: 1. Roman Catholic; 2, German Lutheran; 3, German Reformed; 4. Israelite; 5. Dutch. It was printed very early in the seventeenth century.

"In the same family in Oley I have examined a spinning wheel of very ancient design. The large wheel below the spindle and the fork in which the flax was held was placed at the top of a long rod put together in sections like a fishing rod."

Abraham lived all his life on the original DeTurk farm at Oley, Penna. He served in the War of the American Revolution in Company 7, 1st Battalion, Eastern section (Capt. Daniel Reiff's Company). He married Anna Weiser, who bore him four children.

## CHAPTER XIII

# Philip DeTurk Branch

PHILIP DETURK, son of John and grandson of Isaac DeTurk, the immigrant, lived all his lifetime on the original DeTurk homestead at Oley, Penna. Margaret S. DeTurk of Oley, Penna., a great, great granddaughter of Philip, has in her possession a Bible printed in 1733 in which is found the family register of Philip DeTurk in his own handwriting as follows:

"I, Philip DeTurk, was born April 30, 1757, and when I reached the age of manhood, I married the daughter of Martin Shenkel, Jr., her name was Esther; she brought me a son, whom I named Philip, he was born May 30, 1782; my wife, Esther, died June 2, 1782; afterwards on May 30, 1786, I married Maria Hoch, a daughter of Daniel Hoch of Oley; she brought me eight children, five sons and three daughters."

The following is a translated copy of his family register of his children:

"My son Philip was born May 30, 1782

My son John was born Apr. 27, 1787 at ten o'clock in the morning

My son Isaac was born Oct. 9, 1788

My daughter Susanna was born July 15, 1790 at two o'clock in the morning

My son Daniel was born February 22, 1792, at 7 o'clock in the evening

My son Jacob was born January 13, 1794

My daughter Hanna was born March 31, 1796

My son Samuel was born May 20, 1798

My daughter Esther was born October 15, 1800, at 7 o'clock in the evening

My wife Esther died June 2, 1782

On May 30, 1786 I married my wife Maria."

The above registry list of births is on a separate sheet. It is reproduced below in the original handwriting, which is in German.

PHILIP DeTURK (3), (John 2, Isaac 1), born Apr. 30, 1757, at 10 o'clock in the morning, died Nov. 10, 1815, at half past nine in the evening, married first Esther Shenkel, a daughter of Martin and Maria (Kauffman) Shenkel. She died June 2, 1782, and is buried in the private cemetery on the Shenkel homestead, now known as the Ella Sassaman farm, Oley, Penna. He married second Maria Hoch (born Dec. 29, 1761, died Dec. 27, 1821, at 6 o'clock in the morning), daughter of No. 3, page 66. Philip and Maria are buried in the private cemetery on the original DeTurk homestead, Oley, Penna. He served in Capt. Daniel Reiff's Company, No. 7, First Battalion, during the War of the American Revolution.

The house on this farm is a good example of colonial or pre-revolutionary architecture. It is built of limestone and in the center of the front wall between the windows of the second story is a date stone with a legend inscribed, thus:

A literal translation of the German inscription is: "All that in this house go out and in, let them, O God, be blessed."

The old log barn also has a date stone: "M. S.-M. S. 1804".

Philip Shenkel DeTurk, after erecting a spacious barn, continued the custom of his grandfather, Martin Shenkel, from whom he inherited the homestead, of having his name and that of his wife inscribed on the cornerstone as follows: "Philip DeTurk and Maria DeTurk—1819". In 1910 this barn was destroyed by fire and was rebuilt by the present owner, a great granddaughter of Philip Shenkel DeTurk. She placed another cornerstone beside the original with the inscription: "Rebuilt by Ella Sassaman, 1910, Children of Philip Shenkel DeTurk, and his wife, Maria Yoder."

JOHN HOCH DETURK, like his father, Philip, and his grandfather, John, was born and lived all his lifetime on the original family homestead, died there, and with his wife and unmarried children, is buried in the private cemetery on the farm.

In John Hoch DeTurk's Bible (printed in 1765), was found a family register, written by himself in German, as follows:

"John DeTurk was born the 27th of April 1787.

The 25th of June 1820 a daughter was born and died unnamed.

Amos K. DeTurk was born the 16th day of September 1821 and was baptized the 11th of November 1821, the sponsors were Peter Knabb and his wife Susanna.

Nathan K. DeTurk was born the 13th of May 1823 and was baptized the 20th of July 1823, the sponsors were Jacob Knabb and his wife Sarah.

Charl DeTurk was born the 30th of November 1824 and died the 14th of February 1825, aged 2 months and 15 days.

Maria Anna DeTurk was born the 12th of June 1826 and was baptized the 16th of July 1826, the sponsors were Peter Knabb and his wife Susanna.

Joseph DeTurk was born the 9th of December 1827 and was baptized the 30th of March 1828, the sponsors were Isaac H. DeTurk and his wife Lydia, he died March 30th 1828, aged 3 months and 21 days.

William DeTurk was born the 18th of March 1829 and was baptized April 21, 1829, the sponsors were his parents.

Susanna DeTurk was born the 25th of September 1832 and was baptized the 20th of January 1833, the sponsors were William Knabb and his wife Margaret.

Sarah DeTurk was born the 16th of February 1834 and was baptized the 29th of June 1834."

In 1843 John H. DeTurk built the present barn and in 1844 he built an addition of 21 feet at the east end of the main dwelling with a brick wing or ell. This part he later bequeathed to his son, Amos, who with his sister, Sarah, occupied it as long as they lived; they were never married, died there and are also buried in the private cemetery with their ancestors.

Lydia DeTurk, wife of Isaac DeTurk, who departed from the shores of life on the 11th of June at 11 o'clock in the evening, in the year of our Lord, 1839.

William DeTurk, son of Isaac and Lydia DeTurk deceased and parted this life on the 28th day of May at 4 o'clock in the morning in the year 1847.

Isaac DeTurk departed this life on the 30th day of May in the year 1882, at 8:30 in the evening.

Charles DeTurk, son of Isaac and Lydia (Wagner) DeTurk died on the 18th day of September, 1848, at 4 o'clock in the evening."

ISAAC HOCH DETURK was possessed of more than ordinary intelligence and ability, and being of an adventurous nature and looking forward to improve his condition in life, he brought his family consisting of his wife and nine children from Berks County, Penna., to Martinsville, Ind. There he was one of the pioneers of Morgan County. The journey was made in covered wagons. On reaching Martinsville the family first settled on the ground on South Main Street, where the mother died shortly after their arrival. A short time later he settled east of the city where he built the brick house which has ever since remained in the family.

It is at present in possession of his granddaughter, Mrs. Smith Lewis, and is known as the Smith Lewis farm.



He has been a member of the Masonic Order since before the Civil War, a period of over sixty years. As a farmer he paid much attention to the raising of fine fruit and vegetable products and the DeTurk orchards and gardens have had a wide reputation for years."









#### CHAPTER XV

# DeTurk Family Association and Family Reunions

#### SUMMARY REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

For a number of years the historian of the DeTurk family in visiting the various cemeteries, public and private, noticed the dilapidated condition of many of them, and at various times the question was raised: "How can this condition be remedied?" The logical answer was: "Organize a family association; work together, and much can be accomplished."

Early in May, 1929, a preliminary meeting was held at the home of Clayton E. DeTurk, Reading, Penna., to devise ways and means of organizing a family association and of holding reunions of the DeTurk and allied families. The following were present: Minna D. DeTurck, Eugene P. DeTurk, Myron R. DeTurk, Herbert S. DeTurk, and Clayton E. DeTurk. After a general discussion, it was decided to call another meeting on June 4, 1929, in the Oley High School auditorium, Oley, Penna. Members of the DeTurk and allied families were invited to attend and to assist in making further arrangements for a family reunion.

## FIRST MEETING OF THE DETURK FAMILY ASSOCIATION

Oley, Penna., June 4, 1929.

In response to a notice sent out to members of the DeTurk family, a meeting was held in the Oley High School auditorium this evening. Thirty members were present: Martin DeTurk Hunter, Morris H. DeTurk, Eugene P. DeTurk, Herbert S. DeTurk, Chester L. DeTurck, Myron R. DeTurk, Morris G.

DeTurck, Ruth S. DeTurk, Minna D. DeTurck, Dr. Daniel H. DeTurck, Philip D. DeTurck, Ammon L. DeTurk, Elwood R. DeTurck, Clayton E. DeTurk, H. Clarence DeTurk, Lewis B. DeTurk, Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence A. DeTurk, John D. DeTurk, Mr. and Mrs. William R. DeTurk, Mrs. Anna DeTurk Hechler, Evan H. Manwiller, Ezra K. DeTurck, Frederica L. DeTurck, Charles S. DeTurk, Alvin J. DeTurk, Marks L. DeTurck, D. K. Hoch, Mrs. Kate DeTurk Loose.

It was unanimously decided to elect Martin DeTurk Hunter as president; Morris H. DeTurk, vice-president; Eugene P. DeTurk, treasurer and historian; Herbert S. DeTurk, recording secretary, and Chester L. DeTurck, corresponding secretary. After a general and lengthy discussion of the matter relative to the organization of an association for the purpose of holding reunions and with certain other objectives for the future, it was on motion resolved that the name of the organization shall be known as the "DeTurk Family Association", and that the purpose of the association shall be the collection of historical and genealogical records of the descendants of Isaac DeTurk and Maria (DeHarcourt) Weimer, the restoration and preservation of the ancestral burial plot and other property associated with the progenitors of the DeTurk family in America.

On motion it was decided to hold the first reunion of the DeTurk Family Association on August 18, 1929, in Dr. Daniel H. DeTurck's grove, known as the Oley Valley Park, at Oley, Penna.

## THE FIRST REUNION OF THE DETURK FAMILY ASSOCIATION

August 18, 1929.

The first reunion of the DeTurk Family Association was held in the Oley Valley Park, Oley, Penna. It was gratifying to have 385 members registered. An interesting program was arranged by the committee and was rendered in a satisfactory manner.

At the conclusion of the program a short business session was held and the following were elected to serve as the executive

committee of the Association for the ensuing year: Martin DeTurk Hunter, Eugene P. DeTurk, Raymond H. DeTurck, Ammon L. DeTurk, Mrs. Newton W. Geiss, John N. Kauffman, Morris H. DeTurk, Chester L. DeTurck, Mrs. Kate DeTurk Loose, Dr. Daniel H. DeTurck, Myron R. DeTurk, Elwood R. DeTurck, Lawrence A. DeTurk and Herbert S. DeTurk. The following officers were elected for the following year: Eugene P. DeTurk, president; Morris H. DeTurk, vice-president; John N. Kauffman, treasurer, and Chester L. DeTurck, secretary.

Subsequent annual reunions were held on Aug. 17, 1930, at Oley; Aug. 16, 1931, at Oley; Aug. 27, 1932, at Yellow House, and Aug. 20, 1933, at Oley.

A special meeting was held on Jan. 11, 1933, for the purpose of discussing ways and means for the restoration of the ancestral burial plot on the original DeTurk farm. A committee consisting of Eugene P. DeTurk, Morris H. DeTurk and Chester L. DeTurck was appointed to confer with Mr. Edward E. Rhoads, the owner, to find out if he would grant the DeTurk Family Association permission to restore the ancestral burial plot by building a permanent concrete wall around the outside and laying a concrete pavement over the whole.

Mr. Rhoads was very liberal and granted full permission to the committee to go ahead and make the desired improvement as requested and as they saw fit.

At a later meeting of the DeTurk Family Association held on Mar. 15, 1933, after the favorable report of the committee was heard, it was on motion, Resolved: To build a concrete wall as proposed by the committee, forty-two inches high around the outside, lay a concrete floor over the whole plot and set the original tembstone in the concrete wall facing inwards and flush with the wall, thus making a permanent job and presenting a very neat appearance.

It may be safely said that this and the private burial plot on the Boone farm in Exeter Township improved by Mr. Morris H. DeTurk, are now among the best preserved and most outstanding private cemeteries in this or surrounding counties. Anyone who can say "I helped to restore the ancestral DeTurk cemetery" can feel justly proud. It is hoped that this noble work will be continued until all the private burial plots of our ancestors are likewise restored.
