- ge 13. (1) David des Marest. Middelburg Records. Correction: Francoise, not Francois, Sohier. At baptism of David in 1649, the witnesses were Quintin de Castre, Matthieu Hone, Ester Carton. Also appears record of a Marie earlier than the two named: "Marie desmaree, fille de David. bp. Oct. 21, 1646; temoins Mathieu Hobierne (Hone?) and Magdaleine Desmaree." (Reference: Mrs. Helen Love Scranton, 190 Everet St., New Haven, Conn., descendant of Maria (Marie) or Mynno des Marest and Abraham De Veaux, (7) pg. 17. "How fortunate it is that all these Demarest records from Middelburg are preserved in your book as I suppose they are now utterly destroyed. When I was there in the summer of 1927, working with the original records, they were all kept in that beautiful old town hall, one of the loveliest buildings in Holland and now completely wrecked, I understand.")
- ge 13. (2.4.5.) Jean, David, Samuel. Descendant: Mrs. Mabel Boyce Spell, genealogist, 46 Commerce St., New York City. Her great, great grandfather Peter Banta, ppg. 211, 212. His wife was Rachel Banta. Three of their children married Demarests.
- ge 17. (7) Marie des Marest. A descendant of Marie (Maria) De Veaux and Henry Bancker married Alexander T. Stewart; another married Henry Hilton; the distinguished merchants of past time New York. The Bancker home, old English Manor House, was a Staten Island landmark for many years. (Ref. Miss Ida Dudley Dale, Randall Manor, Staten Island, N. Y., descendant of Marie (Mynno) des Marest and Abram De Veaux).
- ge 22. (16) Descendant of Rachel Brower and Hendrick Banta: Miss Lela Martha Van Arsdale of Welch, Oklahoma.
- ge 22, 66 (18) (144) Descendant: Professor Frederick E. Volk, mechanical engineering, University of Wisconsin. (Ref. Cora Morse (Mrs. F. E.) Volk, 4227 Mandan Crescent, Madison 5, Wisconsin.)
- ge 28. (27) Mary Demarest and Wiert Banta. Descendant: Mrs. A. E. Van Gieson, 121 E. 31st St., New York City, of David Banta and Antjen Ackerman; also of (30) Magdalena Demarest and Cornelius Epke Banta.
- ye 30. (32) Jacomina Demarest and Cornelius Van Hoorn, Jr. Descendant: Miss Mattie M. Bowman, genealogist. 28 Buena Vista Ave., Hawthorne, N. J.
- ge 33. (39) Benjamin Van Boskerck (bap. Oct. 28, 1705) probably the grandson (not son) of Laurens Andries Van Boskerck, member of the Governor's Council 1672-3, and son of Laurens II and Hendrickje Van der Linde. Laurens III, son of Benjamin Van Boskerck and Susanna Demarest, m. Maria Klauw April 25, 1760. (Ref. Mrs. J. R. Spraker, 64 Dorchester Road, Buffalo, N. Y.)
- e 36. (53) Marie Demaree and Willem Rutan apparently had also a son David not mentioned here. Also, marriage of Lea Rutan to Samuel F. Morse probably a mistake: she was, it appears, wife of John Mabie. (Ref. Benjamin F. Wilborn, Little Compton, R. I.)
- e 39. (58) Sarah Demarest and Cornelius Van Houten. Insert three earlier children: Roelof, bap. May 2, 1741: Petrus, bap. Nov. 1742; Marya, bap. Nov. 24, 1745. All at Pompton Plains. Cornelius was a member of that church Feb. 29, 1743. (Ref.: Herbert S. Ackerman, Ridgewood, N. J.)
- e 52. (92) Maria Demarest and Albert Terhune. Marriages of the children perhaps not all accurate or a complete list. Or possibly they are of a dif-

- ferent family. Johannes m. Elizabeth Berry; Albert m. Rachel Terhune; Elizabeth m. John F. Spier. (Ref.: Herbert S. Ackerman.)
- Page 78. (177) In the Westwood Cemetery (Old Hook) is a stone, "Maria Demarest, wife of Isaac A. Sip, died March 17, 1871, age 80-10-16". A Sip marriage does not appear in the Demarest book. Schraalenburg Church record has a Maria Demarest b. March 1, bap. March 28, 1790, daughter of Rev. John Demarest and Sarah Christie. The identity is not clear. A Maria Sip, probably daughter of Isaac A. Sip and Marie Demarest, b. Jan. 16, 1827, d. Aug. 23, 1902, m. John Tuers, buried in the same plot, Westwood. (Ref.: Howard I. Durie.)
- Pages 81, 385. (188)-(2905) The Shuart family. Reference and inquiry from Miss Anna B. Stocking, 600 Country Club Lane, Upper Darby, Pa.
- Page 85. (552) Catrina d. young, apparently a mistake. (553) Katrina, apparently a mistake. See pg. 141 (552) and (553).
- Page 88. (222) Jacobus D. Demarest (d. Nov. 27, 1805), tentatively identified, wife Sarah Peek (?), had children: Margaret, Susanna, David, John, and Abraham. Administration of estate granted Feb. 24, 1806, to John J. and Abraham Demarest, the widow renouncing right and claim as administrativis Feb. 19; these two sons divided the homestead between them in 1807. Jacobus lived at Old Hook, later at Montvale. John had five children, among them a James. Abraham had a daughter and a son. (Ref.: Howard I. Durie; family Bible in his possession.)
- Page 92. (254) Casparus Demarest. (2943) C. Agnew Demarest, 156 Fifth Avenue, New York, writes: "My Casparus Demarest Bible printed in Amsterdam in 1686 and containing family records, the earliest of which is 1704, is available for the Museum when safety from fire and theft is provided."
- Page 96. (291) David Demarest and Maria Terhune had ten children; nine are mentioned in his will. His second marriage, Antje Kip, is said to be not verified. (Ref.: Herbert S. Ackerman.)
- Page 123. (435) Forseur family. (Ref.: Ruth (Mrs. William H.) Winters, 303 Walthery Ave., Ridgewood, N. J.

Page 136. (520) Correction: John Van Houten, son of Peter Van Houten and Winche Tallman, grandson of Resolvert Van Houten and Elizabeth Hogencamp. (Ref.: H. S. Ackerman.)

Page 140. (545) Lucas Demaree and (193) Maria Demarest. Extended and finely detailed record of descent comes from Alice Elizabeth Demorest, 604 Parkwood, Grand Rapids, Mich. Exact copy is given of record in family Dutch Bible sent about 1900 by Margaret Bowers, daughter of Gertrude Demarest Bowers, of Sandusky, Ohio, to Clara A. Demarest. In the Dutch language it gives birth of Lucas Demaree July 19, 1763, birth of Maria Demarest, his wife, Dec. 13, 1765, of their marriage, Aug. 26, 1789. It gives the dates of birth of their children, making accurate and complete the record on pg. 140. Lena, July 14, 1791; Wilimina, Dec. 21, 1792: David, Aug. 16, 1794; Samuel, Jan. 1, 1796; Cornelius, Dec. 25, 1797; Catherine, Mch. 22, 1799; Peter, Aug. 13, 1800; Charity, Aug. 14, 1803; Gerty, 1805; Sarah Anna Maria, Aug. 13, 1808.

Notes as to some of the children differ from the ppg. 208-9 record: David, unm., remained near home; Cornelius moved to Michigan, later to Florida, had three children; Catherine m. James Mitchell (Children: Robert, Lucas D., L. Addison); Peter m. Olive E. Parsons (Children: Lucas, James, David, Edwin, Charity, Gertrude m. —— Bowers). Helen (1086) is not mentioned. Sally Ann (1091) and Maria (1092) are revised to be (1091) Sarah Anna Maria. She, well educated, taught in seminaries

and colleges, was vice-principal of school in Brooklyn.

(1084) Samuel Demorest, b. Jan. 1, 1796, at Broadalbin, Montgomery Co., N. Y., was a drummer boy in the War of 1812. m. Anna Clark, daughter of Asa and Debby (Perkins) Clark, Jan. 20, 1818. They moved to Steuben Co., all their children born there; then to Michigan, 1837, to Otisco Township, Ionia Co., 1841, his home near Flat River, his children marrying there and living near; went to California, 1849, having met a gold-rush party at Grand Rapids when he was with wagon-load of wheat for the mill there; sent word home and joined the party westward; two years later returned by way of the Isthmus; his son Lyman sailed around Cape Horn to California. Samuel Demorest in 1869 moved to Audrain Co., Missouri; he died there; his widow with son, Valentine, 'returned to Michigan.

Page 172. (783) Samuel Demarest and Grietje Martin. Their settlement in Canada, with interesting details of descent, is told by a descendant of their son, David (name of his wife unknown), Mrs. Edna Demaray Cox, 205 Friel St., Ottawa. She is active in family research, in study of sources in Canada and abroad, especially aided by familiar contact with members of the government, archivists and others, some of Huguenot connection. She writes: "Samuel, his wife and four children (he had twelve) appear to have left the United States after 1782 and before 1800. They settled at Sutton or Sutton Station, Province of Quebec. Marriages there were with the Porter and Varnum families. In 1816-17, Samuel and the sons with their families set out on long trek, 400 miles, to Whitby (then York), Ontario, 35 miles east of Toronto. They are supposed to have been given a very beautiful island, Scucog Island, in lake of that name north of Whitby as a grant from the King. At what point the spelling of the name changed I do not know. The Demarests still at Whitby spell it deMara. My great grandfather, Samuel, son of David, spelled the name Demaray. Benjamin Varnum Demaray, son of Richard Demarest, with others moved in 1850 nearly 200 miles west to North Dorchester. There they found themselves once again in the deep woods, cleared the land which was good, built log cabins which have long since become comfortable farmhouses of stone or brick." Great tribute at his funeral service by patriotic societies and people. He wrote a record of the Demaree family. Many source records were lost in the burning of the family house in Missouri, 1890.
