INTRODUCTION.

IT is but natural that an individual should be more interested in, and more attached to, those who bear his name and share his blood, than he is in the general homogeneity. That preference has its origin, and nurture, in the family relation, and is cherished as sacred, by all nations and tribes of men according to the degree of their enlightenment.

Home is the heart and shelter wherein all those inborn ties of family kinship are woven into the soul, and no word or name hath greater potency than that of Father, Mother, Brother or Sister.

It is the object of family record to preserve the entirety—the order—the genesis and increase, of that miniature world. Ordinarily, that record has no significance beyond those who have a birthright therein; to all such, it becomes a relic of great interest. As the family name multiplies, and other homes are created, whatever pertains to the older homesteads—the "roof-tree of our fathers," becomes venerable and more prized as the years go by.

To all who have been properly instructed in the obligations and amenities of human relationship, ancestry becomes a subject of special interest and eager inquiry. It may be safely assumed that only those who have no regard for *filiation*, no reverence for their paternity, will not be attracted to the virtue and annals of their progenitors, near or remote, but remain satisfied, in a degree, with the primitive indifference of Topsey, who said, "I 'spects I growed."

The amicable assurances in life growing out of the bonds of consanguinity, or pledged and ratified by the equally confiding interests of affinity, have in all ages had a marked control over the acts, ambition, and happiness of our race.

If there is any one contingency or event over which we have no supervision, and of which we have a natural right to be modestly proud, it is this: that our forefathers "were good men and true." A knowledge of that fact is both a moral and mental stimulus to industrious endeavor in the affairs of life, as well as dissuasive of improprieties and wrong.

Pride of family is no unimportant factor in the moulding of individual character. To be as good,—as high and honorable, in the esteem of our contemporaries—as were our kin before us, and even more so, if possible, to add a new lustre to the name, is the natural and imperative voice of ambition, which comes up through a lineage of honored men and women. Though dead, their virtues admonish; though silent, their achievements and good name speak with startling emphasis—"Preserve the good repute and integrity of your family name!"

But few, if any, pedigrees are so fortunate as not to present, occasionally a blemish, or a blot, which may cause a blush, or excite regret; still, the truth of history should be verified, and such unhappy delinquencies held up as danger signals, over the rock or shoal whereon a kindred voyager was wrecked. Negative examples have often an effective influence for good, and such fidelity is abundantly conceded in Scriptural narrative.

In the early settlement of our country, genealogies are greatly obscured by the emigrants neglecting to keep a full and complete family record. People came here from every part of Europe and retained for a time, the language, habits and customs, of their former residence. Everything was new. Enterprise and enthusiasm in the new world absorbed the time and minds of these new-comers. Old relationships gradually gave place to new attachments. These sturdy pioneers had come to carve out of the forests, homes for themselves and families. Servility to caste—a cringing deference to titles, and the dominant idea that the accidental conditions of birth made the man and gentleman, were largely supplemented by broader and more consistent views of natural

rights. The legendary glamor of inherited distinctions and superiority, soon lost its hold upon the popular mind, and was finally superceded by the recognized equality of mankind. During this provident transition of society,—the biography, history, and traditions of families were, perhaps, inadverdently lost sight of, or lightly esteemed, and instead of linking the genealogies of the old, with the new world, the drift of personal ambition was towards constituting every man his own ancestry.

In the rather nomadic period of colonial times, families became widely separated, and in the evolution of language which followed, their names, in many instances, were so changed by varying orthography, that the original names were lost. Thus, the change in spelling the family name, broke the lineal continuity, and worked injustice to rightful heirs to estates. The Estabrook name has also been slightly corrupted, or mutilated in its primitive orthography, and is now spelled in several different ways.

Among the better educated classes, these innovations have not so largely obtained, and the line of descent is less frequently broken, or obscured.

It is safe to say that, a majority of the American born, now living, cannot present a direct ancestral line extending beyond the Atlantic ocean—and the most diligent research hopelessly ends with the ambiguous landing of the mythical "three brothers."

The legal importance of preserving a correct family record is clearly apodictic, especially, as this country grows older, incurring a long chain of titles to real estate; and as heirs become widely separated in the settlement of our vast domain—the East, having notably, populated the West by pioneer emigration. To provide then, for the legal questions, which may arise about the identity of heirs-at-law and next of kin, is a matter of significant prudence.

Questions of that nature often cannot be settled by verbal testimony which is frequently not procurable by reason of death, etc., therefore, any evidence of record is legitimate and conclusive. This contingency is by no means confined to the United States. Millions of money in Europe have long been withheld from the rightful heir residing here, for the lack of direct proof of kinship. The record in the family Bible is valid, and admitted in all courts of law as *prima facie* evidence of the truth of the facts set forth.

Instances of estates awaiting satisfactory proof of kinship are not wanting even in our comparatively young nationality, and such cases will increase as time goes on.

Indeed, would it not be wise legislation to make it compulsory upon the heads of families to keep such records, in a specifically prescribed form?

Although the research for ancestral relations is a dry, laborious pursuit, yet one feature of it has a rather weird fascination, and that is the etymology of names. The old nomenclators seem to have had crude ideas of propriety and appropriateness in the exercise of their prerogative. Namemaking according to modern taste, has been of slow growth, and may be facetiously styled the "romance of genealogies."

It is not proposed to occupy much space under this head. An amusing chapter could be readily compiled on Nameology, from the materials at hand; such a review is not called for in the history of one name as is the design of this book, nor would it have any special relevancy to the following pages. The sources of information are so abundant and well known, that nothing new to a student of the past could be expected, yet a few lines relating thereto, may not be altogether devoid of interest.

The Hebrews were painstaking genealogists, and have preserved the most wonderful tables of parentage through tradition and history, that are known. Moses has opened up the mysteries of the "Beginning," and the process of christening "every living thing" when the world was young.

Adam, though an inexperienced nomenclator, was a success for he has given entire satisfaction in naming "all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field, and whatsoever he called every living creature that was the name thereof."

As far as known, Adam has the credit of introducing the usage of naming children from some circumstance, sentiment, or emotion connected with their birth or parentage. That custom has largely obtained among all nations; and every name of the higher classes, as well as of the common people, had a specific significance, as will be seen in the tables of Hebrew, and other proper names where the definitions are given. They are too well known to be repeated here. The Hebrews, usually, used but one word for a personal name, and that custom prevailed in Egypt, Syria, Persia, Greece, Italy, and the Celtic and Germanic nations.

In the course of time the Jews accumulated a large supply of names, and began to repeat them. But few new names are seen in the New Testament. It was not until the Middle Ages that this peculiar people adopted surnames which became a necessity, owing to the confusiou caused by the repetition of those in use.

The Egyptians and Greeks were the first to introduce the use of surnames; with the latter, the father selected the name of his children ten days after birth. In doing this, special reference was had to a word expressive of a noble sentiment—dignified and euphonious. This grew out of the doctrines of the Pythagoreans, who taught that the minds, actions, and success of men were according to their names, genius and fate. That this theory governed the nomenclature of families is quite apparent from the definitions of the words used.

Greek surnames arose in distinguished acts and achievements, and ran thus, as: Nicator, conquerer; Energetes, benefactor; Philopater, lover of his father; Philometer, lover of his mother; Strato was surnamed Physicus, from his deep study of nature; Aristides was called the Just; Phocian the Good; Plato, the Athenian Bee; Xenophon, the Attic Muse; Democritus, the Laughing Philosopher; Virgil, the Mantaun Swain, etc.

The Romans had less regard for sentiment, their tastes were of a lower order, and they selected names from common occupations and objects, as: *Porcius*, swineherd; *Naso*, long-

nose, etc. But they subsequently devised a complete system of names. The commonwealth was divided into four classes called *gentes*, each of these being subdivided into families. Each citizen bore three names: the *pronomen*, marking the individual; the *nomen*, answering to the christian name of to-day, and distinguishing the *gens* or class to which he belonged; and the *cognomen*, being the family or surname. Agnomen was an additional name, conferred in honor of some distinguished act or victory in war, etc.

The more uncivilized population of northern Europe still used single-word names, after the tradition of their nationality, and but few surnames existed in England, at the time of the Norman conquest, A. D., 1066.

The Norman invasion caused great confusion in the usages and language of the English. Old names had been repeated until some further distinction was necessary,—the supply did not equal the demand.

The spread of Christianity introduced new names from the Bible, and old pagan names were gradually displaced. About the middle of the 12th century, it was decided that persons of rank should take surnames, and after the Reformation this practice was aided by the introduction of parish registers. But the use of hereditary surnames was not established by law until the 14th century. From this fact it is evident that genealogies cannot be traced, with any certainty, back of that date. The general European custom that the son bears the father's name, still has exceptions. The present reigning family of England has not taken a surname, and the same is true of many noble houses, as Saxe, Nassau, Bourbon, Orleans, etc.

In the struggle to obtain family names, every known object has been largely utilized,—on land, in sea, and sky,—everything, animate and inanimate—even the beasts of the forest, the birds of the air, and even heaven itself was invaded for that purpose, giving us Godman, Angel, Lord, etc.

Even names have not escaped the dictation of fashion or favoritism, and those once popular, as Patience, Prudence, Thankful, etc., are no longer in vogue.

Coincident with the advance of Christianity, Bible names gained the ascendency with both sexes. There are, however, only about fifty-three names of men that can be used without indicating bad taste and singularity; thirty-two of these are taken from the Bible. The number of surnames in England is about 40,000; in Scotland, according to population, there are far less, so many having taken the name of their chiefs.

The historical part of the above paragraphs has been compiled from reliable sources. Those who may be curious in this subject will find it ably discussed in Fergerson's "English Surnames," London (1858), also, "Teutonic Name System," (1864).

Plato recommended it to parents to give happy names to their children, such as they would be proud of, and be disposed to honor. That advice is sensible. Long, harsh, and ill-sounding names grate upon the ear of the child, as much as upon the adult, perhaps are really more mortifying. Parents are not excusable for encumbering their offspring with a name of difficult speech or destitute of significance—it should be euphonious, and mean something that will at every mention appeal to his ambition and self-respect.

Frivolous names are in equally bad taste with Mehitable, Mikaja, etc. By frivolous, I mean fancy names which have no origin but in the brain of the novelist, made up for a purpose, destitute of any relevancy or meaning. Purely fanciful or poetical appelations, as Dewdrop, Iris, etc., are too effeminate,—those and the whole list of pet names are all objectionable in adult life. In infancy they may be tolerated in compliment to parental tenderness, but are as ill-assorted with mature years, as are the prattlings of the nursery with the gravity of age.

It may be inferred that the writer has attached undue importance to the influence of ancestry. That is not intended. That, what has been said, may excite a degree of family pride in all who read these pages, and induce them to keep a correct registry of their genealogy, and above all that it

be adorned with sterling virtues and noble deeds of honorable men and women, is the prime motive, and only compensation in view.

It is by no means intended to discourage the ambition of anyone who aspires to ascend the mythological ladder of fame, all unguided by the phosphorescent glimmer of a long entombed ancestry. The world, however, recognizes the fact, that when genius, talent and distinguishing qualities have once appeared in a family line, they are likely to appear again, though generations may sleep between. Many of the brightest minds in our country have cropped out of obscurity,—or as it is complacently called, self-made. That is greatly to their credit, and in such instances it is a satisfaction to know their history and descent; for examples of this kind are the most efficient teachers. It is true that one's fame and fortune depends largely upon himself, yet it has a bracing effect on the aspirant to know that he is not an accidantal numeral on the struggling stage of life.

A cardinal thought runs through genealogical researches, which is, attachment to kindred,—the strength and depth of family ties! So far as that sentiment can be understood from circumstances and personal notes, it is the index to the degree of civilization of a people. It may well be admitted to the list of verified "sayings" that, he who possesses strong affection for his parents, is never a bad man—as one's attachments are, so is his character, either good or bad. If the natural obligation to "honor thy father and thy mother" is deeply rooted in a child's heart, it remains as an ever present monitor to do right, and a voice of warning against the impulse or temptation to do wrong.

The sum of human love, affection and all those ties of bloodship which make life enjoyable are never more fervently exercised or assert a more absolute control of kindred hearts, than at the time when death is about to separate them. And, as this article began with reference to initial life, therefore, to notice the consentient desire of all, as expressed at its close, viz: "Bury me with my kindred in the

land of my fathers," is a pertinent sentiment for the ending of this subject. That most tonching and pathetic story of Jacob making known his "last request" to Joseph and Benjamin, so simply told, illustrates what is stated above. Jacob was not satisfied with the mere promise of his sons to do as he requested, but he said "swear unto me, and he charged them, and said unto them—bury me with my fathers." The reason given for this preference is: "There are buried Abraham and Sarah his wife; there they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife; and there I buried Leah."

The preparation of this volume has involved much time, patient research, and painstaking labor. It is hoped that it may bring the Estabrook family nearer together and strengthen their mutual attachment; that it may link together memories and friendships, and rescue from tradition the virtues of their ancestors,—forming a nucleus around which shall be gathered those who may live after us.

That this memorial shall be hospitably received and appreciated by those for whom it is written, is the sincere desire of

ESTABROOK GENEALOGY.

The Estabrook family seems to have been a ministerial one, for many of the members of the first few generations in this country were ministers. We also find priests of the name of Estebrok as far back as the year 1413, at Okehampton, County of Devon, and diocese of Exeter, England. A copy of the will of one of these priests will be found in the appendix. It shows that he owned only personal property, which he divided among his family and servants.

The pioneer Estabrooks in this country were Puritans and came over from England in 1660. The family must have been of some consequence, for the two, Joseph and Thomas, who came over at that time, had received a preparatory education for college, and in those days only the higher classes were educated.

It is said that there was another brother who came with them and settled in Connecticut, but the compiler is unable to substantiate this.

It is not, perhaps, inappropriate to give a very brief outline of the state of affairs in England at the time of their leaving there, and which probably caused them to withdraw from a country where there was no religious tolerance.

In the time of the Red King, opposition to Rome had begun to manifest itself, and continued to increase until the time of Henry VIII, when the antagonism between Church and State became so great that the succession of measures which finally separated them and broke up the monastic system in England, met with little opposition. Henry VIII arranged in his will to perpetuate his system, which was to set himself up in place of the Pope as interpreter of the English Bible, and his principles were quite widely accepted,

but his will was broken, and his son made many changes in the doctrine. Under his daughter Mary, the nation swung back for a brief period to the old faith, but after the accession of Elizabeth, the new creed assumed definite shape, and the Church of England was separated forever from the Church of Rome, and became the State Church; but within it there was a small, growing opposition party—the later Puritans who advocated still further change. Elizabeth attempted to compel these Catholics and Puritans to conform to the established system. During the struggle between Elizabeth and Mary, the Puritans had increased in numbers and influence. They did not at first propose to go out of the established church, but remaining in it, to introduce a simple and in their view a purer form of worship. The government showed an uncompromising spirit, and the Puritans passed from outward forms, to attack the very basis of the established church. They denied the right of the State to coerce in matters of religion. They formed assemblies and at length organized separate churches, worshipping in their own way and growing apace in spite of the penal laws. They began to appear in the House of Commons, and their influence in that body was relatively all the greater because the Catholics had already been by law excluded from it. Since Henry VIII, the Commons had been gradually growing in importance, and the Puritan element added largely to their strength, for the Puritans believed in resisting the encroachments of arbitrary power. They often came into collision with Elizabeth, and stood ready to assert their rights as soon as the grave closed over her. They managed to hold their own against James; but in his son, Charles I, they found a man who was false in all his public acts, and they were forced to deprive him of those powers which a constitutional king ought to wield. And so, as the dispute drifted into civil war nearly half of the Parliament and of the nation had sided with the king, some being moved by pity for his defenceless condition and some were sincerely attached to the established church, whose very existence was threatened by

the Puritan party. On the Parliament side the war was, at first, conducted in a lame and spiritless way. The Presbyterians, who were the conservative wing of the Puritan party, predominated both in the House of Commons and in the army. They wished to oppose the king just enough to establish their own religious system, but in no case to depose The Independents, on the other hand, who were the radical Puritans, believed in religious toleration, and in the right of each separate congregation to organize itself in its own way, and they were ready in case of necessity to get rid of Charles, and of the monarchy as well. The wonderful success of their leader, Oliver Cromwell, and of his famous cavalry, the Ironsides, soon brought them to the front. They got control of the army, reorganized it under Fairfax and Cromwell, and practically ended the war by their great victory over the king's forces at Naseby in 1645. The king took refuge with the Scots (May, 1646), and they seeking to convert him to Presbyterianism, delivered him over to the English Presbyterians (Jan., 1647), and a little later he was seized by the army (June, 1647). The Presbyterians, who were still a majority in Parliament, thereupon attempted to get rid of the army, which refused to disband. The army then marched to London, and expelled from Parliament some of the obnoxious Presbyterian leaders, and thus destroyed the independence of Parliament. Cromwell now made an honest, but ineffectual, attempt to come to terms with the king. Charles intrigued with all parties, and was false to all, and this soon led to a combination between the Scots and the English Presbyterians and Royalists, against the Independent army, and the result was a renewal of the civil The combination was speedily crushed, and war. (1648). the army proceeded to weed out the Presbyterians from Parliament, leaving "The Rump," which was composed entirely of Independents. That body established an extraordinary tribunal, which tried and condemned the king, abolished the monarchy, and set up a republic or commonwealth in its place, of which Cromwell was the head. He used his power for the good of the people, but met with opposition on every side. He died in 1659, and for a few months after his death the different factions were held in by the influence of his name, then party spirit broke forth, and after a brief interval of chaos, the mass of the nation hastened to welcome back the returning Stuart, about May, 1660. In the earlier years of the reign of Charles II, the reaction against Puritan England was extreme. Upon his arrival it was quite a common thing in the streets of London to see the heads of Cromwell's followers stuck on top of a pole in the public parks; and it was so dangerous for a Puritan to show himin England, that they emigrated in large numbers to Holland and America.

FIRST GENERATION.

1. Joseph Estabrook, born about 1640 at Enfield, Middlesex, England; came to this country in 1660, after receiving a preparatory education for college. He entered Harvard College, from which he graduated in 1664. Three years afterward he was ordained as colleague of the Rev. Edward Bulkeley, minister of the church in Concord, Mass., and on Mr. Bulkeley's death, 1696, became pastor of the church, continuing in that office until his death, Sept. 16, 1711, at the age of 71 years, when he was succeeded by John Whiting, (H. C., 1661). He was made a freeman at Cambridge, Mass., May 3, 1665. May 20, 1668, he married at Watertown, Mass., Mary, daughter of Capt. Hugh and Esther Mason, of that place. She was born Dec. 18, 1640.

He was a man eminently fitted for his office. In his preaching he was plain, practical and persuasive. In his

intercourse with the people, grave, affectionate, communicative and solitary, earnestly desiring their happiness and religious welfare. His appearance carried with it so much patriotic dignity that people were induced to love him as a friend and reverence him as a father. These distinguished traits in his character obtained for him in the latter part of his life the name of "The Apostle." His judgment was highly esteemed, and his advice was sought for in all the neighboring churches. He was much admired wherever he preached and was invited to remove from Concord, "For," said his admirers, "he was too bright a star to be muffled up in the woods amongst the Indians, and ought to come to Boston where he could do more good." His only printed work which has come down to us is an Election Sermon preached in 1705. It is entitled "Abraham the preacher, his privilege and duty; described in Election Sermon at Boston, N. E., May 30, 1705, by Joseph Estabrook, A.M., and pastor of the church at Concord."*

His salary at Concord was £80, of which £40 was to be paid in money, and £40 in grain—wheat to be estimated at 5s., rye at 4s., and corn at 3s. per bushel. March 12, 1681, the town voted "that every householder that hath a team, shall carry yearly one load of wood to the minister; and every other householder or votable person shall cut wood one day for the minister; and that the wood be equally divided to the ministers as the selectmen shall appoint."

Of his death, the Boston News Letter of Sept. 18, 1711, says:

"This day was interred in Concord the Rev. Joseph Estabrook, minister of the gospel in said town for about 44 years (and for many of them was colleague of the famous Mr. Bulkeley). He was eminent for his skill in the Hebrew language, and a most orthodox, learned and worthy divine; of excellent principles in religion, indefatigably laborous in the ministery, and of holy life and conversation."

2. Thomas Estabrook, younger brother of Joseph, born in Enfield, Middlesex, England, and came to this country with him in 1660; married Sarah Temple at Concord, Mass., May 11, 1683. He died Jan. 28, 1720–1. She died Nov. 29, 1726.

He was made an inhabitant of Swanzey, Mass., Aug. 13, 1666; was elected selectman of Swanzey, June 7, 1681.* For children see 9–10.

SECOND GENERATION.

CHILDREN OF REV. JOSEPH AND MARY (Mason) ESTA-BROOK. (1)

3. Joseph, born at Concord, Mass., May 6th, 1669; married, (1st), Dec. 31, 1689, at Cambridge Farms, Mass., Melicent, daughter of Henry W. Woodis, of Conn.; she died at Concord, Mar. 26, 1692, and he married (2d), Aug. 25, 1693, Hannah, widow of Joseph Loring, daughter of John Leavitt, of Hingham, where he and his wife settled and united with the church, from which they were dismissed to the church in Lexington, in 1710. He was an active and influential member of the church at Lexington, and represented it on many public occasions. He was elected deacon in 1716, and remained in that office till his death, Sept. 23, 1733. He was highly respected as a townsman, and filled almost every office in their gift. He commanded a military company, and filled the office of town clerk, treasurer, assessor, selectman and representative to the General Court. He was a man of more than ordinary education for that day, was often employed as a surveyor, and was engaged to teach the first man's school in the town. I cannot state the precise time when he removed to Lexington, but, as he bought two hundred acres of land in the precinct in 1693, and was elected to office in 1696,

it is probable that he came into the place between those dates. He bought his farm of Edward Pelham, then of R. I., and it is described in the deed as being bounded northeasterly by the Cook farm, and S. W. by the Concord road till it comes to Vine Brook. This included the place now occupied by Mrs. L. Turner, extending to the brook in front, and back to or beyond the place owned by Mr. Hayes, under the hill. For children see 11–16.

- 4. Benjamin, born at Concord, Mass., Feb. 24th, 1670-1; (H. C. 1690,) began preaching at Lexington, Mass., in May, 1692, and was ordained first minister of that town Oct. 21, 1606. He was settled over the first church at Cambridge Farms, now Lexington, Oct. 6, 1606. But his ministry was of short duration. He married, Nov. 29 or 30, 1693, Abigail, daughter of Rev. Samuel Willard, of Old South Church, Boston; she was one of twenty children. On 22d July, 1697, he was removed from his earthly labors by death at Lexington, after a ministry of only nine months, and died greatly lamented by his people. His widow married Rev. Samuel Treat, of Eastham, a son of Gov. Treat, of Conn. She died Dec. 27th, 1745, aged eighty-two. By Mr. Treat she had three children, one of whom, Eunice, married Rev. Thomas Paine, of Wevmouth, who had, among other children, Robert Treat Paine, who was one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, Attorney General of Mass., and one of the Justices of the Supreme Court. - 5. Mary, born at Concord, Mass., Oct. 28th, 1672; married April 30th, 1700, Jonathan Green, of Newton, Mass. For child see 19.
- 6. Samuel, born at Concord, Mass., June 7th, 1674; was graduated at Harvard College in 1696. He taught the Grammar School in Concord from 1706 to 1710, at the same time "assisting his father in the work of the ministry." He was ordained, June 13th, 1711, as first pastor of the church at Canterbury, Conn., where he settled as a clergyman until his death, June 26th, 1727. He married March 23, 1713–4, Rebecca, daughter of Rev. Nehemiah and Sarah (Jackson) Hobart, of Newton, Mass.; she was a grand-daughter of

Rev. Peter Hobart, of Hingham, Mass. She died in Dec., 1727, six months after his death. He was a man of wisdom and learning and much respected throughout the colony.

May 8, 1718, he preached the annual election sermon to the Legislature, text, I Tim., 11, 2. In 1709, Canterbury raised £1,619, and with and out of this aid a house for the minister was built, and in 1711 the town received liberty from the Assembly "to gather a church and call a minister to office amongst them, according to the rules of the gospel and the order of discipline established by this government." The church was constituted June 13, 1711. He had been there some years preaching before that time. The election sermon was printed in 1718 by Timothy Green, printer to his Honor the Governor and Council, at New London, pp. 26, size 2½ by 5 inches.

He left land with buildings valued at £1,000, a library of over two hundred volumes, comprising many elaborate Latin works, and a bountiful supply of household furniture and wearing apparel. By his will, his son Nehemiah was bequeathed "the housing and estate." Hobart was "to be brought up to College," and to have "fifty pounds and ye books and papers." To his daughter Mary was left "twenty pounds and the movable goods."

He and she are buried at Canterbury, Conn., and upon his stone is the following: "Ye Reverend and Pious and Learned Mr. Samuel Estabrook, ye 3rd son of ye Reverend Mr. Joseph Estabrook, late pastor of ye church in Concord, who was ye first pastor of ye church in Canterbury, who departed this life to ye everlasting mercy of God, June 23rd, 1727, in the 53rd year of his age."

The following is an inventory of his wife's wearing apparel: Three black crape gowns and petticoats; one silk stuff gown and petticoat; one silk poplin gown and petticoat; one silk crape gown; one white flannel wrought petticoat; one linen and woolen (home) gown and petticoat; two new camblet riding hoods; one serge riding hood; one gauze hood; one black silk hood; two bonnets; one silk scarf; one pair stays;

one headdress; eleven night caps; fourteen linen aprons; three linen and woolen aprons; two calico aprons; two checkered aprons; nine speckled handkerchiefs; nine pairs gloves; two fans; four waist ribbons; amber beads; four pairs stockings; two pairs shoes.

John Fisk, pastor of church at Killingly, Conn., was married Nov. 26, 1717, to Abigail, daughter of Nehemiah Hobart, of Newton, Mass., and sister of Mrs. Samuel Estabrook. For children see 20–22.

1771, Elizabeth, daughter of Major John Slapp of Lebanon, Nehemiah, hearing of the battle of Lexington in the afternoon, by the sleepless energy of his wife, was ready at sunrise the next morning, to take leave of home and family, and shoulder his musket in defence of his country. He was nearly all the time under the immediate command of Washington, being one of his famous body-guard. turned poor, having received continental money for his pay, \$50 of which he paid for a breakfast on his way home. He was a soldier in the Revolutionary war: was in retreat with Washington, when he planted a battery after crossing the Delaware river, and getting behind the hill to hide from his enemies-by a curve in the road-they mowed down the Hessians like grass, who attempted to cross the same bridge in hot pursuit. He said this was the only time he saw Washing laugh during the entire seven years. The records show that he enlisted Sept. 22, and was discharged Oct. 24, 1774. In the battle of Saratoga-1777—he was in Col. Chase's regiment, and was discharged June 11, 1777, as sergeant. At the time the British captured Buffalo, twenty miles west of Alden, where he lived during the war of 1812, he got out his sword, ground off the rust, and determined to enlist again in defence of the flag under which he had fought for seven long years: he was finally dissuaded. He sold a farm when he went to Holland Purchase, in western New York in 1810, and took continental money—there was no other—and by the time he was ready to reinvest, the money was worthless, and his all was in his government's promise to pay, which it never fulfilled. He died at Alden, N. Y., in 1826. died there in 1824.* For children see 247-256.

willey, a relative of the Willey who was lost, (and his house that he had just left, saved,) in the slide in the White Mountains years ago. After her death he married Mary Stewart.

He was graduated at Dartmouth College in 1776, having received degree of D.D. He was a Congregational minister,

and labored a number of years in Western N. Y., and in 1778 and 1779 preached at Thornton and Francestown, N. H. Aug. 23, 1780, he was ordained at Thornton and was dismissed in the latter part of 1786; when, Dec. 26, he wrote a letter stating that he was willing "to give back to the town as much of what the town gave me as indifferent men shall judge I ought to give up." The town voted to dismiss him but not "to refer the above mentioned terms to indifferent men." June 6, 1787, as a member of the Londonderry presbytery he was installed first pastor of the Congregational church in Meriden, N. H., and dismissed May 7, 1792; but by a vote of the church Aug. 22, 1793, it appears that he continued to supply the pulpit and administer the ordinances for some time after his dismission. Lawrence's History of the N. H. Churches, page 570, says: "A good man of the name of Estabrook with a large family set down on a piece of land (in Bath, N. H.) with a view to farming and to receive what the people might be pleased to give him for preaching. Bowed down by sickness and poverty he only survived two or three years."

At Bath, N. H., Nov. 8, 1795, notice was given of a meeting on Nov. 24 "to see if the town will hire Rev. Mr. E. on probation for settlement for any term of time," which was decided in negative. He died at Bath, N. H., Feb. 1799.

Although but a boy on the memorable morning of the Lexington fight, April 19, 1775, upon receiving the news of the approach of the British troops, (Regulars,) and before light in the morning having assisted his father in carrying his mother with a young infant (Solomon) in her arms, in an arm chair, about a mile back from the scene of danger, he seized his father's musket and joined the citizens who braved the English troops on that day. The bloody bodies of several who fell on that occasion in defence of provincial rights, were carried to his father's house by the assistance of the boy who afterwards became for so many years the devoted pastor of his people. His early experience was a sad one. In the battle, two of his comrades were killed, one each side of him, and there were two bullets went through the skirts of his coat and one through his hat. He had a great many eccentricities and was often called upon to settle difficulties in the church, and possessed a rare knowledge of human nature. In his manner he was affable and courteous to all.

He was a man of uncommon worth, and one of nature's noblemen. He never let himself down below the proper standard of a minister and a christian, though he indulged in familiar conversation, often blended with humor, he had the talent of blending the wisdom of the serpent with the harmlessness of the dove. He seemed instinctively to read

human character, which enabled him to adapt himself to all classes, and to use caution, or repose confidence, as his discernment saw it to be expedient. He was everyone's friend, and this was the secret of his sharing so largely in the kind regard of others. He shared to an uncommon degree the confidence of his people, and was often let into many a family trial and difficulty which were studiously kept hid from the world. Thus he was able by soothing words and mild advice to plant the olive branch at the domestic fireside, which was the scene of discord and strife. Amusing anecdotes might be related of his success as a pacificator in such cases, as well as in healing difficulties in the church. one ever said aught against him, and all, if they had anything to say, were ready to speak in commendation of his prudence, kindness and moral worth. His character may have had blemishes, and if it had, they were like the spots on the sun—scarcely discernable amid the brightness of so many virtues. His mind was most happily balanced. Though not a great student nor deeply read in his profession. yet he was a very acceptable preacher. His sermons were evangelical in the correct sense of the term, and were replete with strong common sense. His services ever commanded attention, for their earnestness, simplicity and sincerity. There was ever a pertinency and directness that would be sure to make them remembered. He sought not popularity abroad, but to be useful among his own people. The fruits of his ministry were visible in his church and society, which were large and flourishing.

While nearly all the communities in New England had been rent by the great religious controversy between the Unitarians and Trinitarians, which had been in full blast for some years, the church in Athol was one of the last to suffer. So highly respected and esteemed was Mr. Estabrook, and so carefully had he guarded his flock from the controversies of the day, that the town had remained united until his death; but when he died, as George W. Horr relates in his history of Athol in the "History of Worcester County," "the par-

ish flew apart like one of those flowers called 'touch-me-not,' and have remained so until this day."

In his theological views his sympathies were more with the liberal portion of the clergy, yet he was disposed and desirous to cultivate ministerial intercourse with all his brethren. He disliked sectarian names and distinctions. ferred to be called a Biblical Christian, yet he used to say if he must be called by any name, he should prefer to be called "Baxterian." Baxter was a favorite with him, and when he sat for his portrait it was with a work of that pious author in his hand. Calvin was no favorite with him. His sermons never savored of the five points. In his views of Christ, he was probably a high Arian, yet he did not interest himself in the Unitarian controversy. He had no taste for controversy. He chose to breathe a more elevated atmosphere than that which is usually inhaled amid the strife of tongues and pens. It was at home that Mr. Estabrook's sterling excellences of character shone in all their loveliness. He was given to hospitality. Under his roof he made his friends welcome, and to feel that they were so. There, with his worthy partner by his side, was the center of attraction, and those who shared the radiant smiles of his benignant countenance, felt that they were enjoying a benediction. There the poor forgot their poverty, the afflicted their sorrows, and the rich their wealth. He made all, whatever might be their external condition, feel easy and happy in his presence. (Rev. Preserved Smith, 1850).



He gave almost his whole strength and attention to the work of his profession, rarely, if ever, turning aside to interest himself more than incidentally in other matters, though not wanting in puplic spirit, or altogether unknown even in the affairs of politics. It is said he was once a candidate for state senator though not elected to that position. He kept himself well informed respecting current events, and maintained a lively interest in all that concerned the general welfare of the community in which he lived, and of the country.

But he was known in his life and will be remembered as a physician. As such, he had an enviable reputation. Possessing a most sympathetic and kindly spirit, he was always ready to answer the calls of the sick, and never failed to do all in his power to relieve the sufferings of men.

As a man, Dr. E. was among the most worthy and best; as a citizen, he was honored and honorable; as a friend, true and faithful, and strongly attached to those whom he esteemed his friends; as a husband and father, loving and much loved; as a physician, eminent, highly esteemed both by the people in general and by his own profession, greatly honored among his brethren for his knowledge and skill, and for his kindly and courteous spirit as well.

After a long and exceptionally useful life of almost ninety years, he has gone to his rest. Honored, loved and trusted in his life, he will be pleasantly and gratefully remembered, not only by the surviving members of his own family, but by all those who yet remain of the vast multitude to whom

he has ministered in sickness, and with whom he has associated in health, while not a few to whom he has never ministered or even been personally known, will remember him and feel that they almost knew him, from the frequent mention of his name in their homes, as a man whom father and mother trusted, honored and loved. Deacon Adams resided in the old Adams mansion, which stood at least one hundred and thirty-five years before it was shot at by the armies of the mother country, and in which house all of Mr. E.'s children were born. The British riddled it with bullets, supposing the patriot Samuel Adams, a cousin of Deacon John, was secreted therein. Many bullets were taken out in after years from the 'door casings and other parts of the house, which the British had discharged at the house of this rebel (?) traitor, in the sharp conflict that took place when the British retreated from Concord towards Samuel was not secreted in the house as was supposed. He remained a patriot still.

In the stirring, momentous times when the British and American bullets crossed each other there, with deadly aim, the British passed before the "Old Adams House," and fired many bullets into it. The family fled for their lives, and one man saved his life by climbing up into the big chimney, and standing on the cross-pole from which the kettles were hung. Deacon Adams responded to his country's call, being devoted to liberty and justice, ready to give his life if necessary, in the struggle for American independence, fearing none but the God whom he worshipped. Although his house was a target for the red coats, a British officer was carried there in a dving condition. When Mrs. Adams came back to her home, she was obliged to step over the dead body of a British soldier, in order to enter her back door, and in the front room lay another soldier mortally wounded, the whole sanded floor beneath him red with the blood which had flowed from his wounds.

When the good wife of the Deacon saw them bringing in the wounded man—the foe of her country—she felt she could not have him inside her dwelling, but seeing how utterly helpless he was in his extreme sufferings, she reprimanded herself and hastened to his relief, bathed his brow, and gave him cooling draughts of water for which he called. All animosity was forgotten, and in the kindness of her heart she laid his head upon her knee, and made his last moments as comfortable as possible. He endeavored to speak, but all she could distinguish was "Thank you!" as he faintly clasped her hand, trying to express his gratitude ere he closed his eyes forever. The silver knee-buckles he wore were taken off and given to her, and one is now in the possession of her grand-daughter, Mrs. Lizzie P. Evans, (820).

Deacon Adams was a large landowner in the center of the town, and his name is found in the early records of W. Cambridge—now Arlington. The depot now usurps the place of the venerable elms that stood before the door of the ancestral mansion, and the Lex. & W. C. R. R., passes over the garden where the old house stood, and where the children of Endor and Lydia (Adams) Estabrook were born. Mrs. Lydia Estabrook was a lady of rare qualities of mind and heart, kind and affectionate in all the relations of life, amiable and considerate of the feelings of others, diligent in the performance of every duty, and remarkable for those gentle virtues which make the sunshine of a home. The children watched her tenderly in her declining years, and her many virtues are ever held in endearing remembrance. Seven children survived her. For children see 813–820.

In 1820, for family reasons. he had his name changed by the Mass. Legislature, to John Brooks Russell. He learned the art of printing at the University Press, Cambridge, and established a printing office in Boston in 1826, when he purchased the N. E. Farmer with which paper he connected the largest seed store in New England. He was the first to print directions on the outside of seed packages. In 1832, he sold out both his "Farmer" and seed business for \$10,500, and started the publishing firm of Russell & Odiorne, where he published among other works, the "Life and Writings of Washington," edited by Jared Sparks, in twelve octavo volumes. But the financial troubles of those days were not propitious for such enterprises, so in 1838 he moved to Cincinnati, O., where he became part proprietor of the Daily Atlas, and was connected with the Gazette for sixteen years. In May, 1861, he was offered a position in the Pension Bureau at Washington, and remained there until 1869, when at his own request he was transferred to the Department of Agriculture, where he was the librarian until 1877, when the growing infirmities of age admonished him to retire. He has since resided chiefly with his daughter, Mrs. Secrest, at 25 Shelby st., Indianapolis, Ind.

A western daily of date of Feb. 19, 1856, speaking of him said: "Mr. R.'s reverses of fortune would have caused many persons to put on the habiliments of heavy laden care, or drown their sorrows in dissipation. Not so with him. There always appeared a bountiful supply of sunshine about the heart that never failed to show itself in a genial glow, through his ever beaming and benignant countenance. And of all the vices that oftimes beset the path of both the fortunate and unfortunate, Mr. Russell has happily steered clear."

To quote from one who knew him long and intimately: "He never used tobacco in any form, never drank a glass of spirits or beer as a beverage; never played a game of chance, or bet a dollar; never had a lawsuit or open quarrel with any man; never held an office, civil or military; never was sued, and never failed to pay a debt, either for himself or security for others when called upon to do so; never took a newspaper without paying the subscription in advance. A man of more than ordinary strength of mind and force of will. He made a success of every enterprise he undertook. Attending to all the details of business, he suffered very few losses and his success in business was such as caused a constant increase of property to the close of his life. Judging of the future with almost prophetical vision, his expectations rarely failed of being realized, and his knowledge and judgment of character were intuitive. Strictly honest and always truthful himself, he was intolerant of deception in others. Of deep religious convictions, he was a true Christian and ever ready to aid in sustaining religious institutions. He was brought up on the Arlington market garden of his father Warren Rawson, of which he took full charge when seventeen years old. At twenty-five he bought out his father's twenty acres, going in debt \$20,000 for it besides what he paid down. Since paying for the place more land has been purchased, until now he has one hundred acres in cultivation. He has also built a fine Queen Anne house, 55x72 feet, erected seven large hot houses each 160x24, one 300x26 feet, and also has 2,500 hotbed sashes. Over ten acres are covered with glass, two hundred and fifty tons of coal being consumed annually in heating the houses. of the one hundred acres cultivated produces two and three crops annually. He employs seventeen horses, and six market wagons are constantly carrying stuff into the Boston market, carrying in ten to fifteen tons of stuff daily. Fifty men are employed in summer and twenty-five in winter, two being required in Boston to sell the vegetables. The method of irrigation is so complete that in the dryest weather sufficient water can be had for that purpose. He has grown his own seeds and vegetable plants from the start. The reputation of his seeds and plants reaches far beyond Arlington, leading to such an increase in this profitable business that in Nov., 1884, he bought out the seed store, warehouse and business of Everett & Gleason, at 38 South Market St., Boston, where the trade has more than doubled, and he now has one of the largest seed stores in the city. Personally, Mr. Rawson is an active, positive, bluff man, quick to make up his mind and slow to change it. He was one of the founders of the Bay State Society and is vice president for Middlesex county, chief marshal of the Middlesex fair, and for seven years marshal at the New England fair. So he is peculiarily qualified in fair ethics. He is a member of the Massachusetts Grand Lodge of Odd Fellows, and a member of the Arlington school committee. He has had a good practical education, thorough culture in music and elocution, and the business training of a commercial college, which last he utilizes in keeping all the books of his market garden busi-He has issued a valuable brochure on celery and its cultivation, and also a volume on "Practical Market Gardening."

FIRST GENERATION.

I. William Estabrook, (said to have been originally spelt Easterbrook), was born about 1765, and came from Tiverton, Devonshire, England, to Middletown, Conn., about 1706. in company with a Mr. Richards, leaving a bachelor brother, Richard, who was in the hardware business in Tiverton as late as 1830, and a sister Jane who married a Mr. Mortimer. Estabrook and Richards were ship carpenters or sawyers and were both employed by Jonas Wright, who about that time commenced building for the United States Navy, the 24-gun war frigate Connecticut, which was launched Thursday afternoon, June 6, 1799, and when ready for sea was placed in command of Captain Moses Tryon and ordered to the West Indies, in company with other armed vessels, to protect our merchantmen from the depredations of English and French privateers. During her cruise she captured three French vessels, the *Piege* with fifty men, the *Unite* with fifty men, and the Chou-Chou. She was sold by the government in 1801, with twenty-eight other gun-boats, to reduce the expenses of the Navy. Mr. Wright's ship-yard was at Chatham, (now Portland), on the east side of the Connecticut river, opposite Middletown, and was known as East Middletown until October, 1767, when it was made into a distinct town and called Chatham, from the importance of its shipbuilding, in allusion to Chatham a town in England, noted for its extensive system of dock-yards and facilities for shipbuilding. The name of Chatham has since been changed to Portland, for its extensive free-stone quarries. This name is derived from an English town, celebrated for its excellent building stone and the well known Portland cement. William Estabrook married Sarah, widow of James McCleve, and daughter of Jonas Wright, at her father's house in Middletown, Conn., January, 1797, and moved to Middle Haddam, not far from the ship-yard, and afterward moved to Middletown, Conn., and thence to Tarrytown, Red Hook and Lansingburgh, N. Y. His widow in 1812 married Frederick Schaefer and lived at Lansingburgh, N. Y., where two daughters were born: Catharine, born Dec. 19, 1803; married William C. White, April 11, 1837; and Mary, born 1816; married (1st), Oct. 28, 1843, Abraham Phillips; (2d), Evan Williams.

After the death of Frederick Schaefer, about 1820, she moved to Oswego, to live with her son, William Estabrook, and spent the rest of her life as a member of his family. She died at Newark, N. J., February 11, 1848. She had three brothers, Sandford, William and Joseph, and two sisters, Rhoda, who married a Clark, and Betsey, who married a Landon, who in 1868 was living with her son Frederick, at Kalamazoo, Mich. For children see 2–5.

SECOND GENERATION.

2. William, born at Middle Haddam, Conn., Nov. 27, 1797. Being deprived of a father's care in very early life, he and his brothers, John and Thomas were apprenticed to parties in Rhinebeck, who supposing "Esta" to be a middle name, taught them to write their names William E., John E., and Thomas E. Brooks. This continued until about 1840 when all the members of the family resumed the original name of Estabrook, except John's two sons, Fletcher and John S. Having completed his apprenticeship he moved

to Oswego about 1819 and in June, 1822, married Laura, daughter of John and Esther (Davis) Grav, of Redding, In 1823 he moved to Rochester and afterwards to Rhinebeck, N. Y., where he engaged in the shoe business. In 1828 he moved to Cherry street, New York, opposite the Brooklyn navy yard, where he lived when the steam ship Fulton was blown up. In the fall of 1829, he moved to Hyde Park and was living near the dry dock when Dr. Nott's steamer, Novelty, was launched. Soon after this he was employed by Elisha Hale at Hyde Park in the manufacture of Hale's rotary pumps, moved with Mr. Hale to Newburgh, N. Y., in 1835, and from there in 1844 to Newark, N. J., where he became Mr. Hale's successor in business, but meeting with a severe loss by fire he abandoned that business and afterwards engaged in other enterprises, and died at Brooklvn. N. Y., July 13, 1884, and was buried at Poughkeepsie. N. Y. John and Esther (Davis) Gray had Sarah, born 1791, who married Orin Boughton and had six children, Daniel. Joel, William, Eli, John, and Fanny. Laura, born 1794. Joel, born 1795, died Jan. 26, 1864; married Delia Meeker, who was born 1799, died June 3, 1844, leaving one daughter, Eleanor, who married Frederick Read, of Redding, After the death of his wife, Delia, he married Martha Meeker, who was born 1793. Died Dec. 3, 1873. Julia, born 1797, died April 9. 1839; married Thomas Estabrook (4). His wife, Laura, born April 24, 1794, died at Newark, N. J., Dec. 24, 1847, and he married (2d) Hester (Wyman) Taft, June 6, 1849. She died May 21, 1866, leaving two children, twins, born Dec. 11, 1851. He married (3d) Phebe A. (Nichols) Homan, March 3, 1869, who survives him. No children by this marriage.

Laura (Gray) Estabrook's father, John Gray, was born at Redding, Conn., in 1771; died at Newburgh, N. Y., while on a visit to his daughter, March 1, 1845. Her mother, Esther (Davis) Gray, daughter of John and Eunice Davis, was born at Redding, Conn., 1772, and died April 23, 1844. For William's children see 6–15.

- 3. John, born at Middletown, Conn., in 1800. Removed in very early life to Rhinebeck, N. Y. Was a cabinet maker by trade. He married in 1822, Orpha M. Buckbee of Chatham, N. Y. Removed to New York city in 1827, and opened a bookstore at 422 Broadway, afterwards kept the East River Garden, a popular place of resort opposite the Brooklyn Navy Yard. Moved to Rochester, and was drowned in the Genesee river, June 19, 1831. Was buried in Carthage, near where his body was found. His widow died at Rochester, N. Y., Oct. 27, 1861, and was buried at Mount Hope. For children see 16–18.
- 4. Thomas, born at Red Hook, N. Y., in 1802. Was a blacksmith by trade. Married in 1825, Julia, daughter of John and Esther (Davis) Gray, and sister of his brother William's wife, and she died April 9, 1839, and in 1844, he married (2d) Eunice Fisk. Moved to Clinton, N. Y., and from there to Hyde Park, and afterwards to Newburgh, N. Y., where he remained until 1849, when being attracted by the gold excitement, he removed to California. After living there ten years he returned and died suddenly, November 28, 1859, at the residence of his daughter Esther A. Webb, in Wilton, Conn., two days after reaching there. His widow Eunice, married a Greaves, and when last heard from was living at Sandwich, Ill. For children see 19–22.

One of these wounds was in the arm, and of such a nature that the rifle ball could not be safely removed, and as a result he was stricken with paralysis, in 1877, and died in New York, June 8, 1879, and was buried in Evergreen cemetery, Williamsburgh, L. I. He married Maria L. Seybolt. His widow died in New York, October 27, 1884, and was buried in the grave of her husband, agreeable to her request. They left no children.

Y., where he was at one time engaged in the upholstery business with his younger brother, Sandford, and afterwards in the book trade with his elder brother, Charles, and while there, Aug. 14, 1862, he enlisted with his brother Sandford, in Co. G, 124th regiment, Col. A. Van Horn Ellis. This company was recruited by Isaac Nicoll, of Blooming Grove, who was selected as its captain. He was assisted in recruiting by James O. Dennison and F. F. Wood, of Blooming Grove, and David Gibb, of Newburgh. It was often spoken of as the praying company. About fifty of its members were from Blooming Grove, fifteen from Newburgh, and the balance from New Windsor, Monroe and Chester. Horatio served until the close of the war. He was wounded May 3, 1863, at the battle of Chancellorsville, and taken prisoner with his brother Sandford, but being wounded and unable to walk as rapidly as his captors desired, he was sent into the Union lines. At the close of the war he returned to Newburgh and soon after opened a store on South steeet, where he remained until the spring of 1872, when he removed to Jersey City, N. J., where he now resides. He married Sarah Elizabeth, daughter of Daniel Tompkins and Ellzabeth Blake, Sept, 11, For children see 38-45.
- 12. Sandford T., born at Newburgh, N. Y., June 16, 1837, where he spent most of his life. In Dec., 1857, he commenced the upholstery business, but afterward sold out, and Aug. 14, 1862, enlisted with his brother, Horatio J., in Company G, 124th Regiment, N. Y. Vols. He was taken pris-

oner May 3, 1863, and exchanged Sept. 30, 1863. Was wounded at the battle of the Wilderness, May 6, 1864, by a rifle ball entering his head which remained there until it caused his death at David's Island Aug. 12, 1864. He was buried in St. George's Cemetery, Newburgh, N. Y. Was unmarried. Col. Charles H. Wevgant, the last commander of the 124th, Regiment, speaking of the battle of Chancellorsville in an address delivered July 22, 1877, made the following reference to Sanford T. and his brother, Horatio J.: "When at length the order to fall back was given all our able-bodied men save one, moved rapidly off towards a place of safety, followed by a terrific shower of bullets, shot and shell. Among the wounded left upon the lines where we stood lay the bleeding form of Sergeant Horatio J. Estabrook, and when we began to retire, his brother, Corporal Sandford T., instead of hastening back with the rest, out of the range of the death dealing messengers rushed to the side of the suffering sergeant resolved to save him if he could. and if not, to die by his side or go with him to the dreaded rebel prison pen. On hastening from the field, several who looked back toward the scene of our bloody contest saw one of the grandest sights ever witnessed. There amid falling shell and fire and smoke, loomed up the forms of these two brothers, the one carrying the other on his back. But the foe closed upon them and they were both captured. The wounded one was sent back into our lines, but the ablebodied one was sent into prison. But a year later at the opening of the Wilderness campaign, Sandford T. Estabrook having been exchanged was again with us and in the very first of the long series of bloody battles was shot in the head, which wound three months after caused his death.

APPENDIX.

The following are extracts from the records at Newtown, Wales:

Thomas Estbrok (sic) was ordained "accolytus" in the parish church of S. Mary Major in the city of Exeter, 18 September, 1395, by Henry, Bishop of Annaghdown (Per Fratrem Henricum Ennachdunensem Episcopum) under a commission from Edmund, Bishop of Exeter. (Fol. 249.)

Ordained "subdiaconus," on the title of the Priory of S. Nicholas in the city of Exeter, and styled "Magister," showing that he had taken his degree in one of the Universities, 22 December, 1397, by Henry Nony, Bishop of Ardagh [Ardakanensem, in Orig.] under a commission from Edmund, Bishop of Exeter. (Fol. 251.) The ordination was also in the church of S. Mary Major, Exeter.

Ordained "diaconus," on the title of the Priory of S. Nicholas, Exeter, in the parish church of S. Mary Major, Exeter, 21 September, 1398, by Henry, Bishop of Annaghdown, under a commission from Edmund, Bishop of Exeter.† (Fol. 252.)

Described as chaplain ("capellanus") and LL.B. was instituted to the Vicarage of Duloe in the county of Cornwall and diocese of Exeter, 5 August, 1400, on the presentation of John Coleshull, Lord of Tremethert and Thomas Lanrak, rector of Duloe. (II, 49.)

His successor, Robert Ansthorpe, was instituted 11 June 1412, on the resignation of Thomas Estbroke (sic). (II, 141.) Collated Dean of Crediton 22 April, 1412. (II, 141.)

^{*}Note.—"Accolytus" is one of the minor orders of the Church; it comes second, the first being "tonsuratus." Annaghdown is now a village in Ireland, in the diocese of Tuam.

 $[\]dagger$ NOTE.—His ordination as priest ("presbiter") does not occur in the register.

He resigned, and his successor, William Fylham was collated 20 Sept. 1417. (II, 137.)

Collated sub-Dean of the Cathedral Church of Exeter, and Penitentiary, 13 Sept. 1417. (II, 137.)

Thomas Estbrok, LL.B., was appointed Official Peculiar in Cornwall. (II, 230b.) The date is omitted, but it must have been between Feb. 1405-6, and Feb. 1407-8.

He received a commission as "Examinator in Consistorio Exonisuri generalis," 20 Sept. 1417. (II, 263.)

As sub-Dean he complained of the bad condition in which his predecessor, Thomas Noell, had left the mansion house, garden and buildings, and the Bishop, 24 Sept. 1417, commissioned Richard Penels, Canon of Exeter, to examine the premises and report. (II, 263.)

Richard Estebrok, Vicar of Okehampton in the County of Devon and diocese of Exeter.

Will dated 5 December, 1413. Commends his soul to God, and his body to ecclesiastical sepulture. To Walter Manston, to celebrate in Okehampton church for three years for the health of his soul, and for his exequies daily, thirteen pounds of silver; and to the principal store of the said church twenty shillings that his anniversary may be kept for ever. On the day of his burial the sum of forty shillings was to be given to the poor. To Walter Manston, chaplain, twenty shillings and his second best doublet. To Thomas Estebrok, his best girdle with silver clasp, a silver cup and cover, and his best doublet. To Joan Hore, his second best girdle with silver clasp. To Edith, wife of Robert Wyke, his two other girdles with silver clasps, and a quarter of wheat. Robert Wyke, the two cows already in his keeping. every priest taking part in his exequies, and present and celebrating for his soul on the day of his funeral, twelve pence, and to each priest only celebrating on the day of his burial, six pence. To Joan, daughter of William Hore, to Matilda, another daughter, to John, son of Robert Wyke, and to Walter Petheler, a cow each. To Adam Toker, a cow, and half a quarter of wheat. To John Row, his servant, a heifer. To John Gavet, his servant, six shillings and eight pence. To John Werying, chaplain, his third best doublet and six and eight pence. To Thomas Estebrok, Joan Hore, and Edith, wife of Robert Wyke, three brass pots and a saucepan, namely, to Thomas his best pot, to Joan his second best, and to Edith his third best and a saucepan, if the residue sufficed to pay his debts and legacies; if not, the articles were to be sold. To each executor who should act, twenty shillings. Executors: Thomas Estebrok and Walter Manston, who are to distribute forty measures of wheat among his poor parishioners.

Proved, II January, 1413-4, before William Hurden, Canon of Exeter and Commissary of the Bishop, in the Chapel of S. Gabriel at Clyst in the County of Devon. (I, 321.)

Richard Estebrok, the testator, was Penitentiary* in the Deanery of Okehampton. (I, 50.)

He must have died almost immediately after making his will, for John Newecum was instituted to the vicarage of Okehampton, on the death of Richard Yestebrok (sic), 17 December, 1413, the patron being King Henry V.

This will is one of sixty which, for some reason not now known, is entered in the Episcopal Register of Bishop Stafford, and not in the register of the Probate Court. They occupy folios 300–334 of the first of the two volumes. This is very interesting as showing how personal to the Bishop in those days was the right to grant probate of wills. Wherever he happened to be, these wills could be proved before him in person, or before his commissary. Bishop Edmund Stafford held the See of Exeter 1395–1419.

^{*} Penitentiary was the priest authorized to receive confessions within a specified district.
