### THE ENDSLEY FAMILY

A Partial Record of the Descendants of

John Endsley, 1776 - 1835 and Jane(Blaine)Endsley, 1773 - 1848 Compiled June 1959 by Nathan Clark Shannon

In gathering material for a little History of the Shannon, Clark, McConnell and Skillman families, I came into possession of some other material that I did not use in those pages. There was quite a lot of information on the Endsley family, the family of my paternal great grandmother. I felt that this information should be recorded so that it will be available for those who may at some time or other wish to assemble a more complete history of the Endsley family.

I have therefore made an effort to get some additional information so as to make the record more complete. This has been assembled in a form I hope will be easily understood. Much of this has been furnished to me through Miss Antha Endsley of Charleston, Ill.

While I have never seen any books giving information on the Endsley family it is possible that such book or books may have been printed. I have a typed copy of a form filled out for a genealogist by a member of the family in 1908. Whether this was merely for a family record or was for inclusion in book form. I do not know.

The Shannon and Endsley families have been closely associated, in one way or another, since the early part of the 19th Century. The first our immodiate family became associated with the Endsley family was with the marriage of Nathan Shannon, son of Isaac Shannon and Jane(Porter)Shannon, to Martha Haggerty, daughter of Cornelius Haggerty and Isabel(Endsley)Haggerty. This was about 1818 or 1819.

After Martha's death, which occurred about a year after marri-

age, Nathan Shannon married Mary Endsley, a first cousin of his first wife, and daughter of John Endsley and Jane(Blaine)Endsley, his wife. This woman was the author's great grandmother.

After the death of Jane(Porter)Shannon, which occurred June 19, 1820, Isaac Shannon married Isabel(Endsley)Haggerty, widow of Cornelius Haggerty, and mother of his son's first wife. Sept. 27, 1821.

The first record we have of the Endsley (or Enslow) family was while they were living in the neighborhood of Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

A distant cousin, Antha Endsley of Charleston, Ill, has given me some records from a book belonging to her father, Thomas Lee Endsley, (1842-1927). Those are the best early records we have. I quote: "John Endsley, Sr. b. 1776. d. 1835. m. Jane Blaine, 11/7/1797. "James Endsley, b. 1778. d. 1886. m. Elizabeth Walker,3/12/1805. "David Endsley, b. 1781. "Andrew Endsley, b. 3/15/1784. m. Isabel Torrens. "Jane Jean Endsley, m. Peter Foreman. "Isabella Endsley, m. Cornelius Haggerty. "Mary Endsley, m. William Barnfeld. "Martha Endsley, m. Samuel Little." (There is no record of the names of the parents of this family.

In these records we have made no effort to trace the descendants of any of the above except those of John Endsley, my great, great grandfather.

In John A. Finafrock's Notes on Franklin County County History, printed in Kittochtinny Historical Society Records, Chambersburg, Penna. 1942, page 36, he refers to the massacre of a group of wheat harvesters about a mile and a half East of Upper Strasburg, Pa., on July 19, 1757. One of the settlers who was massacred on that date was Andrew Enslow, the grandfather of the family listed on this and the preceding page.

Miss Antha Endsley visited the Rocky Spring Presbyterian Church, 4 miles North of Chambersburg, in Letterkenny Township, Franklin Co. Penna. and there saw the names of John Endsley and James Endsley on the door of Pew #23. This was in 1955.

In the First Presbyterian Church of Carlisle, Penna., she also saw the "Wedding Book" and saw where John Endsley and Jane (or Jean) Blaine were married by Rev. Robert Davidson, D.D. It was recorded as follows:- "1797 - 7th Nov. - John Endsley to Jean Blaine."

JOHN ENDSLEY was born 1776 and died April 29, 1835. Records would indicate that he was born near Carlisle, Penna. Buried in Ridge Cemetery, Harrison County, Ohio.

JANE BLAINE was born at Ballynahinch, County Down, Ireland in 1773 and died Jan. 29, 1848 in Harrison County, Ohio. She came to America at the age of twelve years in company with her brother David who was two years her senior. They came to live with their uncle and aunt, David Reed and wife of Cumberland County, Penna. She was married to John Endsley, Nov. 7, 1797. They were the parents of six children:- Mary, Thomas, Sarah, James, Jane and John, Jr.

- MARY ENDSLEY was the oldest of the children of John and Jane (1)(Blaine)Endsley. She was born in Cumberland County, Penna., April 22. 1799. She was married to Nathan Shannon, April 22, 1820, on her twenty-first birthday. She died July 6, 1890 and is buried in the Presbyterian Cemetery, Keene, Ohio. I have written a fairly complete record of her descendants in the "Shannon" section of the records I completed some time ago. \* × ⊹ × × × × 쑸 ×
- (2) <u>THOMAS ENDSLEY</u>, second child of John and Jane(Blaine)Endsley, was born in Cumberland County, Penna., on August 23, 1801. He died in Coshocton County, Ohio, Sept, Sept. 8, 1894. He was married to Matilda Karr, (daughter of John Karr and Nancy(Welch) Karr), who was born January 14, 1806 and died Jan. 9, 1852. They were married in Harrison County, Ohio, on Feb. 26, 1824.

Thomas Endsley moved from Harrison Co., Ohio to Coshocton Co., O. and purchased the N-W Quarter Section of the Section of land lying in the S-E Corner of Clark Township. My father (Nathan Reid Shannon) purchased this farm from a lumber company about the turn of the century. It had been stripped of every piece of timber large enough to make a railroad switch tie. In those days, that meant the last saleable piece. I was then a small boy.



John Endsley, Jr., died Jan. 23, 1850. Barbara(Kenough)Endsley married George McPeck after the death of his first wife. Barbara died Dec. 1, 1855. There is no record of any children.

#### IN RETROSPECT.

It is doubtful if there are many of the living descendants,(1959) of Thomas Endsley and Matilda(Karr)Endsley, who have ever been on the farm that was their home in Coshocton County. It is also very doubtful if many of these descendants even know where the farm is located.

While the writer is not a descendant of Thomas Endsley, he is a descendant of Mary Endsley, the oldest sister of Thomas Endsley, and had occasion to become familiar with every part of that farm. It was during the period - 1900 to 1911, and some time after the farm had left the ownership of the Endsley family, that my father became the owner of this farm. However, we never lived on the land but did cultivate it.

At the time Thomas Endsley owned the farm, the farm directly West was owned by Wm. Darr who was married to Harriet Shannon, a niece. The farm directly North was owned by Isaac Shannon. The farm North of that by James Endsley, his brother. The second farm East by John P. Shannon, my grandfather who was a nephew.

I do not have the date when Thomas Endsley moved to Coshocton Co. He was married in Harrison Co.,Ohio in 1824 and probably moved soon after that as his daughter Nancy was born in Cosh.,Co., in April 1829.

The farm is along a little stream, Bucklew Run. This stream flowed through the eastern part of the farm, separating a triangular section of about 30 acres in the southeastern corner.

There was a valley extending from this little stream northwest to the northern border of the farm and cutting off about 40 acres.

When I first knew the farm there was a little used road extending along the entire North side. There was also a similar road extending along the South side but this road had been kept in better repair. It was also from this road that visitors to the farm entered the gate on the farm road. Both roads are now closed.

Their first home was a log cabin built along the South side of the second valley mentioned above. It was about half way between the East and West borders of the farm. As I now remember this spot (This was after 1900) there were some "rip-rap" stone foundations and a very few old rotten logs from one of the old buildings that had stood here. At that time the site was covered with a heavy growth of weeds and briars.

I well remember an incident that happened at this spot. My father and a hired hand were rebuilding a fence past the old foundation. As they lifted a hollow walnut log move for a ground rail, a large blacksnake crawled out. They dropped the log and two more real large ones came out. They then got a lever and moved it the rest of the way.

When the Endsley family grew larger a new home was built down where this valley started from Bucklew Run. This was much nearer the eastern boundry of the farm. The house was on a short steep bank and just above a wonderful spring with plenty of water the year-round.

In it's day this house was no doubt one of the very comfortable homes

in the neighborhood. It was built of sawed lumber and on a stone foundation. The first floor had two large rooms across the front, a large kitchen and I believe two small bedrooms across the back. Two large rooms on the second floor above the front rooms although at the sides these two rooms were not full height. A long porch extended across the front of the house. At the East end this porch was high off the ground.

Entrance to the porch(south end) and the kitchen was from steps from yard on south side. Entrance to two front rooms was from the porch. The only access to the basement, which was under only about half the house, was from an outside door under east end of the porch.

A wagon-shed and corn crib was in a lower corner of the yard. When we owned it this had been made into a stable. The large barn (about 36' x 56' with a lean-to stable built on south end) stood across the little valley to the North. There was no basement to this barn but it did have a threshing floor. Later my father had a basement foundation built and moved the barn onto it.

I think that I worked over every foot of tillable land on this farm. Memory takes me back to some of that work and it is not all pleasant memory either.

On the first trip I made to the farm after my father acquired it, as I opened the gate to the farm road, I recalled that as a smaller child I had accompanied my grandparents to this very place. I recalled my grandfather opening the gate and I remembered the large and very beautiful oak trees standing in the grove above the road. And of my grandfather calling attention to them. But now the trees were all gone. JustTree tops and stumps remaining. I have no idea who was living there at the time but it was some member of the Endsley family. My grandparents were going to spend the day. So it is just possible that I did meet Thomas Endsley. I was probably about 4 or 5 years old at the time and if I did meet him I have long since forgotten about it.

The farm road started at the buggy-shed, crossed the stream under a giant willow tree, climbed the hill along the stream and then on to the south road.

There was a small tree growing along this road that I was told was a "Sarvice tree." Late in June the small red berries were very good to eat. I have never seen another tree like it anywhere. I believe it is a "Service tree" or "Shadbush."

All that is changed now. The last I knew of the farm it was only being used for pasturing cattle. I understood that 400,000 feet of hardwood lumber was cut on the farm some years ago. A small portion had been strip-mined.

I wanted to take my son down there and spend a day when I lived in Cleveland but never got it done. It would have had to be in cold weather for those snakes get big there in the Summer. And if there is anything in this world that dislike more than a snake it is "two snakes".
