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P R E F A C E .

When the Genealogy of the Fishback Family went to press in 1914, it could not be conclusively shown that John and Harman were brothers, although they were always supposed to have been so related. Not until the ninth day of September, 1925, was this fact indubitably established.

Originally it was the writer's intention to prepare and publish a history of Harman Fishback and his descendants independently, but upon consultation with Mr. Willis M. Kemper and Dr. Thomas M. Taylor, author and publisher respectively of the book mentioned above, it was decided to combine the two works. This arrangement seems to be especially happy since it puts into the hands of those directly interested in Harman's family the valuable Historical Sketch Mr. Kemper presented in the older book, which applies equally as well to Harman as to John; and at the same time affords the descendants of John additional data regarding their Old World antecedents that for various reasons were not available in 1914.

At all events paragraph one on page 65 of the first part of this volume has been entirely cleared of doubt as to who the two Harmans were. "Harman the Elder" was "Harman the Emigrant" and "Harman the Son" was the son of "Harman the Elder" and the father of John, Benjamin and Thomas our grandfathers. "Harman the Son" was therefore the "Missing Link."

No attempt has been made to locate the descendants of Harman Fishback other than those of his son Harman and Harman's sons, John, Benjamin and Thomas. Unfortunately

there are breaks even in this record. The search presented in the following pages was undertaken primarily to identify an ancestor rather than to list all the descendants of his offspring. The Taylors, Hoffmans, Wilhoits and Robinsons, representing the female lines of his issue, are numerous.


The name Fischbach, composed of two German words meaning fish and brook, we find with an award of merit (arms) in 1170 A.D. This was during the reign of Frederick Barbarosa, a period of the world's history when civilization was just emerging from the gloom of the Dark Ages. Seven and a half centuries is a long lapse of time to cover, and twenty-five generations of the name is indeed a just cause of pride for those bearing it.

The generations from which our emigrant ancestors sprang lived in the villages of Ober and Nieder Fischbach, Seelbach and Truppbach near Siegen, a city in the Prussian Province of Westphalia, Germany. (See map in front of this volume.) It will also be noted that one of the eminences north of Siegen is known as Fischbacherberg. These permanent implantations of the name conclusively prove the ability of our family to leave its impress upon the sands of time.

The last report from Siegen under date of 21 April, 1926, bearing the seal of the Church and countersigned by the pastor, says that the name of Philip Fischbach's mother was Cathrina and the name of Johan Fischbach's mother was Lisbeth, thus completing the generations both male and female back to 1623.

FISCHBACH

FISCHBACH (VISCHBACH) OF FISCHBACH (Table 21).

Coat of arms: A fish horizontal upon a round pillow.
(Seal upon a document of March 24, 1359, named below.)

In Upper or Lower Fischbach of the parish of Rohrbach in the milling quarter there was a family of the lesser nobility, from which first came Albrant de Visbach about the year 1170. Einicus de Vischpach is met with, 1185 and 1190, Ainvicus de Vischpach with his son Conrad in 1209, Heinrich Fischback, Ulricus and Albertus de Fischbach, 1261. Wernhard Vispech is witness to a document of the Schlägl foundation August 24, 1302. In 1303 he held in fee Vischpach and various estates at Hohnperrig, Mairhof Putrischperig and Schererseodel from Ruger von Haichenbach. Irmfried, Charl, and Stephan die vischpechken, 24, 3, 1359, sold a fief at Hochenperg, Rohrbach parish, to Chunrat den Grozhaupt.

Hans der Vischpeck died about 1396 and was the last of this branch of the family. His wife Margret lived until 1397; his daughter Elsbet was married to Jakob dem Hautzenberger.

The foregoing has been translated from Siebmacher's Wappenbuch, Volume IV, part 5, page 46; and the coat of arms photographed and enlarged from table 21 of the same volume and part. This selection has been made because it appears to be the oldest among the ten or more arms granted to the Fischbachs or those bearing names that were variants of that patronymic.

Siebmacher's and Riechtop's Heraldries alone have been consulted, but in them it is shown that the family during the last seven centuries has been represented in five of the principal countries of Europe. In every instant a fish or fishes have been featured in the arms they bore, some of which were most elaborate. This fact clearly indicates a relationship among the branches of this widely dispersed family; but so far as we know all attempts to confirm these ties of blood have failed to surmount the difficulties inherent in a search of this kind—difficulties of language, of locating lost or unknown court and church records and of arousing the interest of those who may possess family documents of value. Therefore, it has been impossible to connect those who reached Virginia in 1714 and their forebears in the vicinity of Siegen with these earlier lines.

To a future generation the further investigation of this fascinating problem must be commended.

WINTERHAGER PFARRER

Translated into English it reads as follows:

Research of the birth and baptismal record of the Evangelical Community, of Siegen, 1693, Sunday, Laetore, (Mid-Lent), is born to Philip Fischbach, of Truppbach, and his wife Elizabeth, a son and is sponsored by Herman Grim, and named Herman. Born March 21, 1693.

HARMAN FISHBACK.

As the preceding documents have shown Hermann Fischbach was born at Truppbach near Siegen in Westphalia, Germany, on the 21st day of March 1693, and in honor of his god-father, Hermann Grim, he was baptized Hermann Fischbach in the Reformed Church at Siegen. His brother John had also been baptized in the same church less than two years before. In the autumn of 1713 the two brothers joined the colony which went to London in expectation of sailing immediately for Virginia, but were delayed until the winter was

almost past. The reader is referred to Mr. Kemper's Historical Sketch in the fore part of this volume.

On the arrival of the Colony in Virginia in April, 1714, Harman Fishback, as his name was then anglicized, was only a month past his majority, yet he seems already to have been married. Between the date of his arrival in Virginia, 1714, and 1775 when he must have been an octogenarian Harman Fishback left only a few records of his activities; but fortunately they are enough to identify him beyond question and to distinguish him from his son and namesake, born in 1741, with whom certain casual searchers have confounded him. In 1734 his brother John in his will appointed him one of his executors. In 1745 a marriage contract was drawn and recorded between Harman Fishback and Mary Noe his intended second wife. In 1759 his deposition was taken in the famous law suit of Spillman *vs.* Gent. In 1762 he deeded a tract of land to his daughter Elizabeth Taylor for "love and affection."

In addition to the foregoing official milestones that mark the life's journey of this worthy but quiet-living patriarch, there remain two other court records, one in Fauquier and the other in Culpeper County, Virginia. Either one of these would have confirmed the data already in hand but the two together furnish cumulative evidence so conclusive as to banish doubt.

In Deed Book No. 6, page 178, of Fauquier County, Virginia, we find Harman, the elder, Harman his son and Christena, the son's wife, deeding a parcel of land to John Shank. We know that Harman, the son, married Christena Hoffman, daughter of John Hoffman, from family records of John Fishback, son of Harman, the son, now in the writer's possession. (The above is not John Hoffman of the Germanna Colony, 1714.)

In Will Book "C," page 23, of Culpeper County, Virginia, Harman Fishback appoints his son Harman as executor of his last will and testament. Harman the elder died during the summer of 1783, having passed his ninetieth birthday in the preceding March. Like Moses of old, no one knows his sepulcher unto this day.

THE WILL OF HARMAN FISHBACK, "THE EMIGRANT."

Just as it appears on the Records of Culpeper County, Virginia.

"In the name of God Amen."

The 25th day of February, 1776,—I, Harman Fishback, being of sound good and perfect memory, thank be to God for it, calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this life and that all flesh must yield to Death, when it shall please God to call—I do constitute and devise this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, revoking all other wills *hereafter* made. Then I give and bequeath to my son Harman Fishback seventy-seven pounds currant money, which I sold my land for in Fauquier Co. I give the said money to my said son forever.

Then: I give and bequeath to my grandson Jacob Fishback, fifty acres of land, that I bought of Jeremiah Darnell and four pounds cash, when he shall come to the age of twenty-one years. I give the said land and money to my grandson, Jacob and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever. And if my grandson, Jacob should die without heirs, that the land shall fall to my daughter, Mary Wilhoit and her heirs forever.

Then: I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Roberson one pot and table and *Coberd*.

Then: I give to my daughter, Alse Huffman one bed and furniture, then, I give to my daughter Mary Wilhoit one maer and increase, loom and all the gear that belongs to the loom.

And lastly: I do nominate and appoint my son Harman Fishback and John Huffman Executors of this my last will and testament.

in the year of our Lord God 1776,

At a court held for Culpeper County the 18th day of August, 1783; this last will and testament of Harman Fishback Decd. was exhibited to the court by Harman Fishback one of the executors therein named and was proved by the oaths of John Wilhoit and Moses Wilhoit two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said executors certificate is granted to him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form, he having made oath thereto and given bond and security according to law. Liberty being reserved to the other executor to qualify when he shall think fit.

WILL OF HARMAN FISHBACK, "THE SON."

In the name of God Amen: I, Harmon Fishback of the County of Madison, knowing the uncertainty of human life, think proper to dispose of the property God has pleased to bless me with in the manner and form following, to-wit: My desire is that my beloved wife Christena and my son John shall if they think proper dispose of the land I die possessed of to the best advantage, and the money arising from the sale thereof to be laid out in lands when they think proper, and the said land to be for the sole use of my said wife and children hereinafter named . . . I give unto my children Agatha, Rosanna, James, Frances, Sarah, Elizabeth, Benjamin, Thomas, & Lucy, an equal part of my estate after my just

debts being paid, with this reserve, that is to say; My son, John, is to have ten pounds more than the above named children, which sum is to be raised out of my estate, as a consideration I think due him, exclusive of his equal part, and Leanna & Mary to have five pounds more than the rest of my children, to be raised out of my estate exclusive of this equal part, and that my daughter Susanna, having had a proportion of my estate already, my desire is that when my estate is divided that she shall have ten pounds less than those of my children above mentioned that are to have an equal proportion of it. My desire is that if any of my said children should die without lawful issue, that this part of my estate, shall return to my surviving children, equally. I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Christena and my son John Executrix and Executor to this my last will and testament—revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me—As witness my hand and seal this 20th day of January, 1804.

The writer has a copy of quite a lengthy marriage contract entered into between Harman Fishback and Mary Noe under date of the 24th Feb., 1745. It cannot be given here for want of space, but may be seen among the court records at Manassas, Va., in Deed Book I, page 12.

New data from Siegen, August 10, 1926, states:

That Johan and his wife Lisbeth (Ehelt) Fischbach had in addition to Johan b. 1631 and d. 1682; Joseph b. 5 Dec., 1624, Jost b. 16 Aug., 1637, Margaret b. 28 March, 1644. Johan (1631) and Cathrina Fischbach had besides Phillip b. on the 5th Sunday in Lent 1661; Jacob b. 2d Sunday in Trinity 1656, Jost b. post nabia 1658, Gerlach b. 26th Trinity 1662. Phillip Fischbach of Trupbach and Elizabeth Heimbach were mar. 30 May, 1683, and had, besides John and Herman, Clara b. 1 post Epiph., 1684, Ann Elsie b. Palmarum 1685, Marie Els. b. Quadragesima 1687, Agnes b. 11 post Trinity 1689, Marie b. 7 April, 1696. Jacob Fischbach (1656), brother of Phillip, mar. (1) Clara Beckers, first Sun. after Easter, 1682. (2) in 1702 Anna Catherine Sitzer. He had a son Phillip b. 13 Sept., 1692, 8 P.M., who mar. 4 Feb., 1716, Anna Gela, dau. of Tilman Solms from Obershelton. These Fischbachs lived at Iserfelt, Niederschelt and Sohelt.

During a recent visit to Virginia the author found that the terraces of the Spotswood mansion are still known; two chimneys stand in old Germanna; the mill race, dam and site of the mill are yet traceable. It is proposed to erect a tablet at the end of the bridge in Orange Co. near the old ford and use the two mill-stones now in the river as a basis for the inscriptions.

The homes of James and Benjamin Fishback and James L. Kemper are still familiar in Madison Co., Virginia.
