By a tradition which exists in different branches of the family, Reginald Foster, the first of the name, is reputed to have come to this country from Exeter, County Devon, England, and to have crossed the water in one of the ships embargoed by King Charles the First · but of this nothing certain is as yet known.

In the earlier records we find the name spelt indifferently Foster and Forster, — the former spelling being the more common. The "r" has now been entirely dropped, except by the descendants of Jacob Forster, Sen., of Charlestown, Mass., who was the first, I believe, to write the name always in the same manner.

1. REGINALD FOSTER¹ settled in Ipswich, Co. Essex, Massachusetts, about the year 1638, al-

though his name does not appear upon the town records until 1652, when it was "Granted Thomas Clark and Reginal Foster, that when they shall have cut through a passage from this river into Chebacco River of ten feet wide and soe deepe as a lighter may pass through laden, and to make a ford and footebridge over, that then the town have given unto them £10 towards said passage."

His estate is sworn to, 9 June, 1681, as being worth £744. sh. 16. His will, proved on the same date, mentions wife Sarah, the children given below, and shows him to have been the possessor of Plum and Hog Islands, which remained in the family for several generations.

2. REGINALD² (*Reginald*¹), of Chebacco, Ipswich, married Elizabeth, daughter of John Dane. He died 28 Dec., 1707, leaving an estate of about £350. His will was dated 11 July, 1704 and proved 10 January, 1708. His children were, —

3. ISAAC³ (*Reginald*,² *Reginald*¹), of Ipswich. Administration on his estate was granted to son Jonathan, 15 Dec., 1741. (Essex Probate Records, vol. xxiii., p. 41, Estate £124.15.) Jonathan was appointed administrator of the estate of his mother, Abigail, 30 Oct., 1749. (Essex Probate Records, vol. xxix., p. 28.) The signatures and other evidence show that these two

Jonathans are the same person, and consequently son of Isaac and Abigail. As I intend to trace through the son Jacob, it seems necessary that I should give my authority for considering him a son of Isaac, as there appears to be no record of his birth extant.

Among the early series of Middlesex Wills are preserved two letters, both addressed to the Honorable Samuel Danforth, Esq.,—the first dated 7 March, 1757, and signed Jonathan Foster, in which he speaks of his brother Jacob, of Holliston; the second, dated 18 April, 1757, is signed by Jacob Foster, of Holliston, and mentions his brother Jonathan, of Ipswich. The latter is indorsed "Capt. Jacob Foster's Letter, etc." Jonathan's signature agrees with those on the two letters of administration mentioned above. The children of Isaac and Abigail were, —

4. JACOB⁴ (*Isaac*,³ *Reginald*,² *Reginald*,¹), of Holliston, Mass. On various deeds, etc., he is styled "Captain," although of what, I have failed to discover. 5. JACOB⁵ (*Jacob*,⁴ *Isaac*,³ *Reginald*,² *Reginald*,¹) was born at Holliston, 10 March, 1732; graduated at Harvard University in 1754, in the same class with Governor John Hancock. He was ordained pastor of the church in Berwick, Maine, September, 1756, took his dismission in 1757; was appointed 3 May, 1775, chaplain

of Col. James Scammon's regiment, — served, however, but a short time. He was installed at Packersfield, afterwards called Nelson, New Hampshire, on the 31st Jan., 1781; took his dismissal 23 Nov., 1791, and died there 3 Dec., 1798.

He was married by the Rev. Mr. Cook, of Cambridge, to Hepzibah, sixth child of Deacon Henry and Elizabeth Prentice, 13 Oct., 1756. His wife died at Packersfield, Nov., 1811, æt.

6. JACOB⁶ (*Jacob*,⁵ *Jacob*,⁴ *Isaac*,³ *Reginald*, *Reginald*,¹) was born at Berwick, Maine, 23 June, 1764. He served his time as an apprentice in Watertown, Mass. He afterwards resided in Charlestown, Mass., at the corner of Main and

Union Streets, where he pursued his calling of a cabinet-maker, and originated the business which was afterwards successfully carried on by his son Charles and others, under the style of Forster, Lawrence & Co. Many stories are told of his eccentricities. He was married by the Rev. Mr. Robbins, of Milton, to Rebecca, daughter of David and Sarah Vose, of Milton, 3 Oct., 1786. He died at Charlestown, 1 Sept., 1838. His wife died 30 Aug., 1841.
