## FELTON FAMILY.

---

NATHANIEL FELTON came to Salem in 1633, when 17 years of age; he made a voyage to England in 1634, and returned in 1635; he settled near Felton Hill, Salem, about 1645, the part afterwards called Danvers—now, 1876, Peabody. He was juryman in 1655, and a constable in 1657; was chosen Ensign in 1679, and Lieut. in 1681. He became a member of the church in 1648, and his two oldest children were baptized that year. Rev. Dr. Felt, author of *Annals of Salem*, says, "He was a man of good faith and judgment. He was frequently called to give his testimony about litigated estates." In 1676, he was appointed appraiser of the estate of his brother-in-law, Christopher Waller. In 1684, was appointed overseer and appraiser of Zerubbabel Endicott's estate. Nathaniel Felton's deposition of April 6, 1705, signed by his own hand, says he has been in Salem 72 years. The same time he testified that North River in Salem was called Naumkeag by the Indians.

He married Mary Skelton, daughter of Rev. Samuel Skelton, an early minister of Salem: they had nine children. Mrs. Felton died May 8, 1701, aged about 75 years. Lt. Nathaniel Felton died July 30, 1705, aged 90 years. His will dated October, 1703, proved May, 1706, mentions sons John and Nathaniel, daughters Elizabeth (a widow), Ruth and Hannah.

BENJAMIN FELTON, a brother of Nathaniel, came to America in 1635, when he was 22 years of age. He took the oath of freeman, May, 1636. He lived in Salem, near the meeting-house, and in 1651 he was chosen to take care of the meeting-house. In 1659, he purchased a dwelling-house and one-quarter of an acre of land, of the agent and attorney of the Rev. and famous Hugh Peters, a former pastor of the Church in Salem. June 29, 1669, he was appointed to keep the Salem prison. June 19, 1676, "Agreed with John Marston to move the prison into Benjamin Felton's Garden." He kept the prison till about 1684. His wife was Mary. He died near the year 1689, aged about 76 years. They had several children:

JOHN, bapt. Jan. 26, 1640; he lived in Salem, part of the time, up to about 1684.

REMEMBER, bapt. May 28, 1643; m. in 1654, George Samon. Had 4 children.

EXERCISE, perhaps his daughter, m. in 1664, Joseph Miles; had five children.

BENJAMIN, bapt. Feb. 18, 1645-6; suppose he was one of the Selectmen of Salem in 1720.

Mrs. ELEANOR FELTON, mother of Benjamin and Nathaniel Felton, was early in this country; she was a member of the Salem Church before 1637. In Jan. 1652, she sold a dwelling-house and 20 rods of land in Salem to William Marston.

William Lord, sen., of Salem, in 1673 left Mrs. Felton, a widow, a legacy of £20.

JUDITH FELTON, daughter of Nathaniel Felton, supposed of England, and supposed sister of Benjamin and Nathaniel Felton named above, of Salem, Mass., married about 1644, John Ingersoll, and had eight children.

Thorndike Proctor, Sen., was b. July 15, 1672, the youngest child, by the first wife of John Proctor, who was executed for witchcraft in Salem, Aug. 19, 1692.

(2.) i. JOHN FELTON<sup>2</sup> (*Nathaniel*<sup>1</sup>), b. about 1645; m. in 1670, Mary Tompkins, bapt. April 29, 1649, daughter of John Tompkins of Salem. She died Dec. 12, 1688, aged 40 years. He m. 2d, Hannah.

They resided near Felton Hill, Salem. June 25, 1713, John Felton, Hannah Felton, with 38 other persons, were dismissed from the church in Salem, so as to become a church at the Middle Precinct, afterwards South Danvers, now (1876) Peabody. He died Feb. 19, 1717-18, in his 73d year. His will, dated Oct. 1715, proved March, 1718, names three sons and four daughters.

John Horn's descendants took the surname of Orne. Nathaniel<sup>3</sup> Felton lived near Felton Hill, Salem. His will dated July 6, 1731, proved Feb. 1733-4, his eldest son Skelton executor, mentions wife Ann, sister Elizabeth Watkins, sons Skelton, Jonathan, Ebenezer, John, Daniel; daughters Margaret Sheldon, Sarah Marsh, and Mary who had £40. The six oldest children were bapt. in 1691.

weaver by trade, and lived on Felton Hill. He died at the same place Oct. 5, 1772, aged 90 years. His will dated June 10, 1754, then in the new town called Danvers, proved Nov. 2, 1772, mentions wife Sarah, sons Jacob, David, Samuel, Zachariah, his son Stephen's two children, Stephen and Sarah Felton, and three daughters, Sarah Webber, Hannah Howe, and Elizabeth Daland. Samuel and Zachariah, the two executors, had the home place.

EBENEZER FELTON,<sup>3</sup> the father, resided in Salem till about 1740, when he removed to what was afterwards called New Salem, Franklin County, Mass.; he was a house carpenter by trade, and was one of the selectmen of New Salem the year it was incorporated, 1753. He was deacon of the church, and died about 1776, aged 90 years. His will dated New Salem, Nov. 24, 1762, proved Sept. 1776, mentions wife Jehoadan, sons David, Ebenezer, Jr., Amos, Benjamin, Nathaniel, and grandchildren Benjamin, Mehitable, and Sarah Southwick; Nathaniel, the executor. Dea. Ebenezer and Jehoadan Felton's children were:

His estate was settled the same year by Dea. Joshua Felton, the oldest son then living, and Jesse Daggett. Children named, Joshua, William, Edward Jackson, Abigail Richardson, and Mary Pond. Nathaniel Felton and family resided at Marlborough, Mass., several years during the revolutionary war. Their children were :

Jacob Felton<sup>4</sup> was a cordwainer by trade, and came to Marlborough about 1738, where he was chosen a sealer of leather for more than 30 years. He was constable and lieutenant in 1762, a

selectman in 1777. He died Nov. 20, 1789, aged 76 years 8 months. Widow Hzediah Felton died Feb. 25, 1819, aged 94. Lt. Jacob Felton's children—one by first wife, six by second wife :

Lt. Jacob Felton died the day his oldest son was 48 years of age, and Mrs. Felton just 68 years after her oldest daughter was born.

(54.) vii. SKELTON FELTON<sup>a</sup> (*Joseph,<sup>a</sup> Skelton,<sup>a</sup> Nathaniel,<sup>a</sup> Nathaniel<sup>1</sup>*), b. Dec. 21, 1750; m. Aug. 1775, Silence Hale, b. Feb. 2, 1756, in Bolton, Mass.; they had 10 children. He settled at Barre, where he d. July 9, 1822, aged 71 years. Mrs. Felton d. Sept. 27, 1830, aged 74 years.

Anne Prince, granddaughter of Dr. Jonathan Prince, late of Danvers; no issue; she d. and he m. 2d, Miss Hannah Felton, dau. of Timothy Felton (22). They resided on Mt. Pleasant, in Peabody, where he d. May 20, 1836, aged 75 years 9 months. Their children were:

- v. MARY PRINCE, b. June 30, 1799; m. James Marsh; 7 children.

(58.) i. THOMAS FELTON<sup>5</sup> (*Thomas*,<sup>4</sup> *Daniel*,<sup>3</sup> *Nathaniel*,<sup>2</sup> *Nathaniel*<sup>1</sup>), m. July 20, 1780, Martha Conway, dau. of Cornelius Conway, of Marblehead; he d. about 1804. Mrs. Martha Felton was a widow, living in Marblehead, in 1804. They had three or more children, viz.: Cornelius Conway,<sup>6</sup> Thomas<sup>6</sup> and Hannah<sup>6</sup> Felton.

CORNELIUS C., b. about 1784, m. Anna Morse and had 6 children; m. 2d, Mrs. Lucy Boynton, had 3 children. He was a chaise-maker by trade. After the war of 1812, a toll-keeper at Chelsea; he helped to build Warren Bridge, and was one of the toll-keepers; he contracted for all the wood used on the Fitchburg Railroad; purchased a place in Littleton, Mass., where he d. July 23, 1849, aged 65 years.

His oldest son, of the same name, b. Nov. 6, 1807, graduated at Harvard College in 1827, and was connected with the same college as Tutor, Professor, and President for the term of about one-third of a century. For several years he was a member of the Massachusetts Board of Education, and a Regent of the Smithsonian Institution at Washington, D. C. President Felton died, greatly lamented, Feb. 26, 1862, aged 54 years 3 months.

C. C. Felton's second son, Samuel M. Felton, b. July 17, 1809, graduated at Harvard College in 1834; he was Civil Engineer and Superintendent of the Fitchburg Railroad until he was appointed, February, 1851, President of the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore Railroad, and served until after the close of the late civil war; he is now, 1877, President of the Pennsylvania Steel Co. for manufacturing hammered steel rails, &c.

C. C. Felton's third son, John B. Felton, graduated at Harvard College in 1847; and his fourth son, Franklin E. Felton, in 1851.

Hon. John Brooks Felton, the above-named, died in California, May 2, 1877, aged 50 years. He was a tutor in Harvard College in 1849-50, and grad. in the law school there in 1853; his legal attainments were of the highest character, says a California paper, and he was probably the leading member of the San Francisco bar. It is said he was a fine scholar in both the French and Spanish languages. He was a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California. "As a Supreme Court practitioner he had no superior; and before this tribunal he had always a very large practice, and was generally successful in his cases." Mr. Felton was a resident of Oakland, and served one term as mayor of the city.

(59.) STEPHEN FELTON<sup>5</sup> (*Ebenezer*,<sup>4</sup> No. 26, *Ebenezer*,<sup>3</sup> *Nathaniel*,<sup>2</sup> *Nathaniel*<sup>1</sup>), b. Oct. 22, 1756; m. in 1777, Sally Daland, b. May 27, 1762; they lived in New Salem, Mass. He died April 8, 1841, aged 84 years; she d. March, 1848, aged 86 years.
