FINNEY

I. ROBERT FINNEY

Immigrant ancestor, was born 1667 in Ulster county, Ireland, and died March, 1755, age 87. Married Dorothea <u>French</u> who was born 1670 in the North of Ireland, and died May, 1752, age 82.

Robert Finney fought under the standard of William of Orange in Ireland in 1689 as one of the defenders of Londonderry, and in the Battle of the Boyne in 1690. In the latter encounter he was left on the field for dead, but during the night he regained consciousness, found a horse grazing nearby, and made his escape.

In 1722 Robert Finney purchased 900 acres in New London, Chester county, Pa., on the Maryland border, which he named Thunder Hill Farm. He and his wife are buried in the family plot there.

Walter Finney, who served with distinction in both the Revolutionary, and the French and Indian Wars, was breveted Major in 1776; a year later, at the Battle of Brandywine, he was severely wounded. (See footnote.)

- 5. Ann. Married into the Carmichael family of Germantown, Pa., prominent Founders and Carwheel manufacturers. The Ann Carmichael Memorial was a gift to the Third Presbyterian Church of Germantown.
- 6. Letitia. Died in 1742; married William McKean who was born in 1707, and died Nov. 18, 1769.

*Thomas McKean. Born New London township, Chester County, Pa., March 19, 1734; died at Philadelphia, Pa., June 24, 1817.

Thomas McKean, representing Delaware, at the age of 43, was the youngest signer of the Declaration of Independence. He did not sign the document until 1781, by special permission, having served in the Continental Army in the interim. Later in his career, he acted as president of Delaware, and chief justice of Pennsylvania at the same time.

7. Lazarus. Died 1740; married Catherine Simonton. Lazarus Finney was the first innkeeper at New London Crossroads, Pa.

DR. JOHN MILLER TURPIN FINNEY (Sixth generation), a descendant of Walter, son of William, grandson of Robert and Dorothea Finney, was born on a plantation near Natchez, Miss., June 20, 1863; married on April 20, 1892 Mary Elizabeth Gross of Harrisburg, Pa. who was born June 2, 1868; died May 20, 1942 at Baltimore, Md. He graduated from Princeton in 1884 and from Harvard Medical College four years later.

Dr. John Finney was one of the organizers of the American College of Surgeons and its first president. He was one of the group of surgeons who made John Hopkins Medical School known throughout the world. While professor of surgery at John Hopkins he was offered the presidency of Princeton in 1912. In 1940 he published his autobiography, "The Life of a Surgeon."

During World War I he was chief surgical consultant of the AEF in France, with the rank of brigadier-general, for which he was honored with the distinguished service medal. At the height of his career Dr. Finney was often sought as a last refuge in cases of desperate illness.

II. DR. JOHN FRENCH FINNEY



CHARLES GRANDISON FINNEY

Though Charles Finney (Sixth generation), a descendant of the John Finneys of Plymouth, Mass. and Bristol, R. I. who came from England almost a century before the Robert Finneys of New London, Pa., nevertheless his name is more familiar to the Ohio Finneys than many of their own clan, through his forty years association with Oberlin college.

He was born August 29, 1792 in Warren county, Conn. and died August 16, 1875 at Oberlin, Ohio. Married October 5, 1824, Lydia Root Andrews at Whitestone, N. Y. who was born March 8, 1804.

In 1794 his family moved to Oneida county, N. Y. and at the age of twenty he began teaching in New Jersey. Later he studied law in Jefferson county, N. Y. which he gave up for theology. He was licensed after two years study by the Presbyterian Church in 1824 and began his career as an evangelist, meeting with great success in Utica, Troy, Boston, Philadelphia and New York City. In 1832 the Chatham Street Theater was made into a church for him; two years later the Broadway Tabernacle was built for his fast growing congregation.

In 1835, before his New York Church was completed, he was called to the chair of theology at Oberlin college, Oberlin, Ohio which had been founded in 1833 by his New York friends. In 1851 he was elected president and held that post until 1865 when he was made President Emeritus which he held until the time of his death in 1875.

He was an ardent and forceful orator, a prolific writer and the author of a half dozen texts on theology. In 1849-1851 he toured Scotland and England as a revivalist, adding to his growing reputation as an evangelist. His "Lectures on Revivals" were translated into many languages, and up to 1890 had passed through fifteen editions. In those days books were set by hand. His lectures on "Systemic Theology," in two volumes, he abridged into one volume for the British public which was printed in England in 1851. He again visited England in 1858 to 1860.

While president of Oberlin, Charles Finney designed the Big Tent—a large circular tent, capable of holding nearly 3,000 people. This tent was a gift of his Broadway Tabernacle friends in New York. The Tent was used for commencement exercises, and also served the means of holding protracted meetings throughout the state in places where no suitable or large enough house of worship was available. This tent was the forerunner of our modern out-door tent church services.
