THE GOOGINS FAMILY IN AMERICA



APT. RICHARD BONYTHON was one of the first settlers of Scarborough and had a large patent of land four miles by the sea and eight miles inland in extent. His name first appears on the records in 1636. He was councilor in 1640, and present at the

last court held under the authority of Gorges, in 1646. His house was noted as the place where the first court in Maine was held, March 25, 1636. He was a faithful and impartial official, who spared not his own son, but entered complaint against him for using insulting language against Mr. Richard Vines. Captain Bonython was held in high respect by the community and his associates in the council. His name does not appear in the list of inhabitants in 1653, and he probably died before that year. His descendants are now numerous and respectable.

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Richard Foxwell married Winnefred, a daughter of Captain Bonython. He says (1640) that his father-in-law settled him on a part of his estate and gave him much freedom "for planting, fishing, fowling and the like," as by virtue of his patent he could, but was left on the Scarborough side of the town line. Mr. Foxwell was an enthusiastic and successful

farmer, who had one of the most valuable plantations in the colony.

Though not aspiring to worldly honors, he served as a member of the "General Assembly of Ligonia, in 1648"; also as commissioner and "clerk of the writs." He visited England before 1633, but came back that year. He died in 1676, aged 76.

Thomas Rogers was an inhabitant as early as 1638. He married Esther Foxwell, 1657. His house and plantation was at Goosefair, near the sea and the middle line of the patent. The early explorers of the coast mention his cultivated lands as the Rogers garden. He planted fruit trees and grape vines, and was probably "a gardener bred." From the remains of his orchard the town and famous watering place derives its name, "Old Orchard." Some of the trees were standing in 1770. The Indians made an attack on his house, and after a severe struggle, in which some of them were slain, they withdrew. Mr. Rogers immediately moved to Kittery with his family, and having left some goods in his house at Goosefair, his sons and others went to remove them, when they were all killed by the Indians, who then proceeded to burn the dwelling. The bodies of the slain were found upon the seashore and buried near the house lot. Thomas Rogers did not return to his plantation, but died in Kittery, leaving two sons.

Richard Rogers, son of Thomas, purchased a tract of land about half a mile square, lying between Goosefair and the middle line of the patent, in 1687, of James Gibbins; this he claimed, along with twelve acres of meadow given him by the town, lying on "the northeast side of Richard Cummings," in 1714, being then of Kittery. He made will in Kittery, Mar. 25, 1702, and mentions wife, Sarah, and children, Rebecca, John, Hannah, m. to John Tydie, and Thomas Hanson, son-in-law.

Richard Rogers, son of the preceding, made will in Kittery, July 10, 1737, in which he names wife, Eleanor, and children, Thomas, Esther, Dorothy, Lydia, Richard, Sarah, and Mary, wife of Patrick Googins, to whom he confirms land already given them in Saco, which his father had purchased of James Gibbins. (From Saco Valley Settlements and Families).

Patrick Googins, tradition says, came from Ireland at an early age, and was in the service of William Pepperrell, at Kittery. He was a woolen weaver by trade. It is said, through the influence of William Pepperrell, he obtained the hand of Mary, daughter of Richard Rogers, Jr., in marriage. He settled on the estate given him by his father-in-law at Pepperrellborough (now Old Orchard), what is now Ocean Park. He died there, Feb. 17, 1784, aged 84 years.

Tract or parcel of land situated in Pepperrellborough containing one hundred acres more or less of arable, wood, pasture and marsh land, bounded on the Southeasterly by the sea wall, Southwesterly by other land of the said Patrick, which he purchased. Northwesterly by land of John Dearing in part, William Jamerson in part and North easterly by a highway, being the same land and premises given by Richard Rogers to the said Patrick Googins and Mary his wife and their heirs lawfully begotten of their bodies, by his deed dated Mar. 24, 1736-7.

GOOGINS TO CUTTS

To all christian people to whom these Present shall come Greetings know ve that I Patrick Googins of Kittery in the county of York (and in the province of Massachusetts Bay in New England) Weaver. For and Consideration of sum of Fifteen pounds current money of province aforesaid to me in hand before ensealing himself to Richard Cutts Jr aforesaid Esq the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge & myself feel Satisfied Contented & paid, Have given granted bargained sold aphended released conveyed & confirmed & by these Present do freely clearly & absolutely give grant bargain sell aliens release convey & confirm unto him the said Richard Cutts Jr his heirs & assigns forever all my right & title which I have to land or lands formerly belonging to Christopher Mitchell late of Kittery aforesaid, deceased. Lying & being in the town of Kittery aforesaid To have and to hold the future granted premises, With the Appurces & Privileges to him said Richard Cutts Jr. his Heirs Exec'rs Admr's & assigns forever To his & his own proper use benefit & baliof forevermore. And I, said Patrick Googins for myself & my heirs Exe'rs & Admr'rs do covenant prove & grant unto & with the said Richard Cutts his Heirs & Assigns forever that before & until the ensealing hereof I am the true sole proper and lawful owner & possessor of the before granted Premises with the Appurces & have in myself good right Full power & lawful Authority to give grant bargain sell alien release & confirm the same as aforesaid & that Free and clear and freely and clearly Executed Acquitted & Discharged of and all former & other Gifts Grants Bargains Sales Mortgages Wills Entails Jointures Dowers Thirds Executions & Incumbrances whatsoever and furthermore & ye said Patrick Googin for myself & for Heirs Exec'rs & Adm'rs do Hereby Covenant promise & engage the Before Granted Premises with Appurces unto him the said Richard Cutts his Heirs & Assigns forever to warrant secure & defend against the lawful claims & demands of any person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof I the said Patrick Googins have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-fourth day of April Anno Domino 1736

The name in old records is spelled in many different ways, such as Googins, Googin, Gowen, Guggins, Googkins and Gookin. The last is found in many of the earlier records, as Capt. Daniel Gookin was in Virginia, also in Massachusetts Bay Colony, as early as 1631. Records show that he came from England and in this country they are a separate family.

In early times Biddeford and Saco was under the name of Pepperrellborough, and Old Orchard was a part of Saco until 1886.

The records of the family of Thomas Googins, who settled on the east bank of Skillins River, were given me by Mr. H. T. Fernald, of Amherst, Mass. He was not sure as to how exact they were. His uncle, the late Rev. O. H. Fernald, investigated the Googins families in that part of the State somewhat. His data was from members of the family almost entirely, having little opportunity to consult town, church, or public records. I have used them as they were, as the town records of Sullivan were destroyed by fire. They have nothing back of 1892.

I have given the descendants of each son by themselves, and they can be traced by the names at the head of each family.

FIRST GENERATION.

DAVID GOOGINS³, (Patrick¹), (John²), b. May 29, 1760; m. Mary Jaquish Littlefield, of Wells, June 3, 1789, b. Aug. 3, 1763, d. Feb. 18, 1842. He d. June 14, 1830. Revolutionary soldier. Private in Capt. Josiah Davis' Co., Col. Joseph Prime's Regt.; joined May 4, 1780; discharged Dec. 8, 1780; service seven months and five days. He lived on the farm bought by him of William King, in Saco (Old Orchard), at the corner of the Ross and Milliken's Mill road.

Know all men by these present, That I William King of Bath in the Co. of Lincoln & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Esquire, In consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirteen dollars paid by David Googins of Saco in the County of York, Yeoman. The receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant bargain sell and convey unto said David, his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situated at Old Orchard, so called in said Saco, adjoining the land of Jonathan Bachelor on the Southeast & of Joseph Googins on North west, being the third lot from the marsh, containing sixty acres more or less — agreebly to my contract with him dated the second of November A D 1790

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforegranted and bargained premises, with all privileges and appurtenances thereof, to the said David his heirs and assigns, to his & their use and behoof forever. And I do covenant with the said David & with his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the premises; that they are free of all incumbrances; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said David to hold as aforesaid. And that I will warrant and defend the same to

said David His heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons

center of Pavia Avenue, According to the plan of lots of said Association made by W. S. Dennett and adopted by said Association.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging to said association their successors and assigns forever, And I do covenant with the said Grantee their successors and assigns that I will warrant and forever defend the premises to the said Grantee their successors and Assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming through or under me

Mr. Googin lives at 232 Webster Street.
