

-INTRODUCTION-

GOODWIN FAMILIES OF NEW ENGLAND.

It may save confusion if brief mention is made of the immigrants who have left Goodwin families in New England. It is exceptionally difficult to keep the tribes separate in New Hampshire and Vermont, for in some instances three different families have had representatives in the same town. The "Three Brother Story", is of course long since discredited.

1632—William Goodwin and Ozias Goodwin, brothers, settled eventually in Hartford, Conn.

A Genealogy of this family has been published:—

The author of this book has copied from "The Goodwins of Kittery, Me.", the ancestry of Elisha (of the sixth generation from Daniel, the emigrant), who was the author's great grandfather on his mother's side. Thanks are due John Samuel Goodwin of Chicago, Ill., and his assistants who compiled "The Goodwins of Kittery, Me." The data collected by these gentlemen of five generations of the Goodwin family as published in "Goodwins of Kittery", is valuable to anyone of the Goodwin family descending from Daniel in tracing their family if they have not the early records.

The compiler understands there are ten volumes of Goodwin Records of Maine families in manuscript form and hopes sometime these records will be compiled to date, and a complete genealogy of the Goodwins of Maine printed, or that this manuscript will be deposited with some Genealogical and Historical Society where it can be referred to.

The compiler of descendants of Elisha Goodwin., the sixth, spent several years compiling the descendants of Nicholas Doe, being successful in the same except financially. No attempt is made in following pages to do more than to give in the briefest form the family records. The compiler of this work knowing that copies will go to Goodwins whom he visited forty-seven years ago with his mother and has never forgotten how he enjoyed the visit, and only a few of his distant relatives has he seen since, prints a cut of himself and one page of Doe Genealogy.

1633—Christopher Goodwin settled in Charlestown, Mass. His descendants were in Boston, Reading, and Marblehead, Mass., and York, Me.

1652—Daniel Goodwin settled in Kittery, Me.

1660—Richard Goodwin resided in Gloucester, Essex Co., Mass., marrying in 1666. His descendants resided principally in Newbury and Rowley, Mass., and in No. Yarmouth, Me., where the name is Gooding.

1660—Edward Goodwin resided in Amesbury, and his son Richard, in Salisbury, Essex Co., Mass. Family is widely scattered through New Hampshire and Vermont.

1712—John Goodwin settled in Boston—Descendants in Dresden, and Fairfield, Me.

1712-William Goodwin, brother of John, settled Marblehead, Mass.

Where did Daniel Goodwin, the Immigrant, come from, and who were his ancestors? John S. Goodwin, in "The Goodwins of Kittery" states his belief that Daniel of Kittery, and that Richard, who resided in Gloucester, Mass. in 1660, were brothers, and came from Plymouth, England. Possibly, someone has been able to trace Daniel Goodwin ancestry since John S. Goodwin published his records. If so it is not known to the compiler of these few pages. DANIEL GOODWIN, probably of Plymouth, England, was in Kittery, Me. in 1652. He m. first in Kittery, Margaret, dau. of Thomas and Patience Chadbourne Spencer. Patience was dau. of William Chadbourne. Daniel m. second after March, 1670, (Sarah Sanders,) widow of Peter Turbet. Resided in Kittery in 1711 at which time they conveyed to their son Thomas, of same parish, all their lands and cattle, reserving to themselves the use and an increase of one-half thereof during their lives. He d. about 1712. He was surveyor and innkeeper and large landed proprietor.

In 1689-90 Mehibtable was taken captive by the Indians together with her infant son, whom the Indians killed. She was kept a captive in Canada for five years and then returned to Berwick, Me.

Married second Mary Carr of Mariaville, Me. He was injured while falling a tree across a stream to keep his cows in the pasture, and d. Nov. 6th, 1839. Buried in Mariaville cemetery. After his death the widow, Mary Carr Goodwin, married——Billington, who was a widower and had several children. There was one child b., Lizzie, who m. Hiram Levenseller of Holden, Me. Mary Carr Goodwin Billington died about six years later.

Harvey, b. Mariaville, Me. After the death of his П. stepmother, Mary Carr Goodwin Billington, his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Silsby, made the trip to Maine in a sleigh in winter and carried Harvey and Henry back to Lunenburg, Vt. with them. Harvey married Annie Gamsby of North Stratford, N. H. He followed the lumber business, serving as manager for the J. B. Brown Lumber Co., for over twenty-five years. Retiring from the lumber business he managed a hotel in North Stratford, N. H. for about ten years. Leaving there he built the Groveton Tavern at Groveton, N. H., which he conducted for ten years. Selling his hotel on account of ill health he went to Portland Me. to reside with his only child, Lilla, who married first Geo. Davis, second Geo. Bride. He d. at her home. His wife, Annie, survived him about five years.

Later she was adopted by a family named Dunbar at Bangor, Me., where she lived until her marriage. She was awoma n of unusual strength of character and nobility of purpose. Possessed of a strong physique, she was for many years a notable helpmate to her husband, a wise and tender mother and a neighbor ready and capable to serve in times of sickness and sorrow. Her naturally robust health became undermined from caring for her husband during the long illness which preceded his death, and she died suddenly April 18, 1905."
