INTRODUCTION

That the records which my son had of his forebears might be more nearly complete, I traced and added his maternal line of ancestors. In collecting this material so much data concerning other Grannis lines was obtained that I was induced to attempt a Grannis genealogy. I little realized the task I was undertaking, and which has been so aptly measured by Anthony Wood (1632-1695), English antiquary and biographer, who thus wrote:

"A painful work it is and more than difficult, wherein such toyle hath been taken as no man thinketh, so no man believeth but he that hath made the trial."

The gathering of this data has extended, as time permitted, over a period of some twenty years, and a serious effort has been made to record only such items as appear to be well-proved facts.

Nearly all the records of the early families were obtained by personal search of town, church and court records, and gravestone inscriptions, data covering the latter generations being from like sources supplemented by information from the census and pension records, local histories, and family records obtained through correspondence or personal interview, extending into many states.

Some records are incomplete, the number perhaps being greater because inferences and traditions, unless exceedingly well substantiated, were eschewed. Then there are the many cases where, presumedly through indifference, replies were not obtained to repeated letters of inquiry. Errors may have crept in, even members of the same family do-not always agree in their data, but all reasonable care has been exercised to avoid them.

Not one scrap of evidence has been found to indicate that there has been in America any person bearing the name Grannis who was not a descendant of Edward of New Haven, but there are a number that I have trace of and am unable to properly place, because of insufficient records. The names of these unattached members of the family, and such information concerning them as has been obtained, appear in the Appendix. It is hoped that some of them will be identified and additional records furnished me. I particularly desire to be advised of any errors that may be discovered.

I make grateful acknowledgment of the assistance of the late Mr. Sidney Smith Grannis, who kindly allowed me to use what I found available of the data he had gathered, in what was probably the first serious attempt to preserve a record of the Grannis family.

To others who have furnished data for this compilation, and to those through whose courtesy and aid examination of official records and documents was made possible, I express my appreciation and thanks.

EXPLANATION

Some members of the Grannis family refer to themselves as belonging to the "North Haven Branch," descendants of John, while others claim to be of the "East Haven Branch," descendants of Joseph.²

If there was any reason for separating the family into branches the above would be the logical division. John² continued to live in the North Haven section of New Haven, and Joseph² became a resident of what is now East Haven soon after his marriage. This geographical separation seems, however, insufficient to warrant a division of the family into two branches. Foxon, that part of the present East Haven where Joseph settled, is only about four miles from the section of North Haven where John lived, and both places were within the bounds of New Haven, Conn., until many years after the death of John and of Joseph. East Haven, Conn., became a separate incorporated town in 1785 and North Haven, Conn., in 1786. Neither was there the reason that sometimes exists, divided parentage, these two sons of Edward¹ having had the same mother.

As no good reason appears for separating the family into branches, the descendants of Edward Grannis, the progenitor of the family in America, are given by generations in regular order of succession, each child having the surname Grannis being given a record number in Arabic numerals, and a family number in Roman numerals.

Children of Grannis daughters, who of course bear the surname of their father, are given a family number in Arabic numerals.

The small superior number following a Christian name designates the number of the generation from and including the first ancestor, Edward¹ Grannis.

The asterisk (*) placed before the marginal number indicates that further record is given, under the same number in bold faced Arabic numerals, later on in the book.

There are also indicated such persons as by preference or heredity double the S in spelling the name Grannis. This has been done, when justified by any record or other information, by placing after the name the double S in parentheses, thus: THOMAS⁶ (SS).

GRANNIS

Granest, Granis, Grannis, Granniss. Graness, Grannes, and Grannice are some of the spellings of the name, found in the early New England records. These spellings do not of necessity indicate the exact way in which the persons referred to spelled their name, but were probably the conception of the recording clerk. Signatures to deeds or other official documents recorded, are presumably copied as written by the signatory. The earlier records of this class would, therefor, establish the form Grannis as the most authentic spelling. There now appear to be but two of the above forms in use, Grannis and Granniss, and they cover practically all spellings found in records not antedating 1725, the single S largely predominating. Just how the immigrant ancestor spelled his name cannot be positively known, but it was undoubtedly Grannis. In the first two records found that make mention of him the name is written Granest; when his death was recorded the clerk wrote Grannice. All records of him in Hartford, Conn., and Hadley, Mass., terminate the name with one S. This is also, in the main, true of the New Haven, Conn., records, though two deeds are recorded in which the double S appears. There is no evidence that the single or double S indicates any particular division of the family, as some have thought. The double S has evidently been adopted by any member of the family when his fancy so dictated, and his descendants have generally continued its use, though there are instances where a few have reverted to the single S.

The first person to bear the name Grannis in America appears to have been EDWARD of New Haven, Conn. At a court held there on October 2, 1649, "Edward Granest" was "fined 18 d., for want of Worme, Scourer and Flints." He was then probably less than twenty years old, but of sufficient age to be required to bear arms, having been fined for lacking proper implements for the care and operation of firearms. In 1639 the New Haven Colony, then called Quinnipiac, passed a law that "Every male from sixteen to sixty years of age who shall dwell or sojourn within this plantation or any of the bounds and limits of it for a month together" must bear arms and provide themselves with "a good serviceable gun * * * * and four or five good flints fitted for

every firelock piece, all in good order and ready for any sudden occasion, service or view." Muskets were provided by each person liable, "at his own cost."

Only one other record of Edward is found in New Haven previous to his return there in 1677. He appeared as a witness before a court held on the first of March, 1652, and the record shows that he was at that time employed by John Wakefield. One Thomas Langden was brought before the court for killing and using for food, three hogs owned by the Rev. Peter Prudden, of Milford, Conn. Langden's wife was taken to court because she had concealed the theft. "Edward Granest, Mr. Wakefield's man, testifyeth that Goodwife Langden told him that if her husband was whipt by her meanes, if he came to her again, she must not expect to live." "Edward Granest further saith that at one time in ye meddow at Paugaset, Goodman Langden beate his wife because she did not goe to weede corne."

The nativity of Edward is uncertain, as is also the date of his arrival in America. The name Grannis, or one from which it could have easily been evolved, does not appear in Hotten's "Original Lists of Persons who went from Great Britain to American Plantations between the years 1600 and 1700." There are traditions that the family was Norman-French. Col. G. W. Grannis (1825-1901), who made a considerable search in Great Britain and Ireland, failed to find the name recorded there. He was informed by an elderly clerk in the House of Records, London, Eng., that the name was Flemish and would be found in Flanders. If the family was from either Normandy or Flanders, it is evident that Edward had lived in England-previous to coming to America, for, on November 22, 1666, Edvard Grannis, William Pitkin, and four others called on Mr. Whiting (minister of the First Church— Congregational-of Hartford, Conn.) and "requested full privileges in all the ordinance of Christ, on account of a union they already had," referring to their church membership (Episcopal) in England. The eastern and southeastern counties of England furnished the main supply of early immigrants to New England, and it was in these counties that the artisans from Flanders had sought refuge when driven abroad by the Spanish Duke, Alva, and his Council of Blood. Possibly the ancestors of Edward Grannis were among these Flemish refugees.

It has been intimated that the immigrant Edward, because of

the troublous times in Church and State, may have assumed the name Grannis, concealing his real name. This appears somewhat improbable as concealment of his identity would more easily have been effected by the adoption of some very common surname, rather than one that would so distinctly mark him for attention. The tradition of French origin is so widespread in the family it would seem it must have some foundation in fact. A tradition that the family is of Scotch ancestry is traceable to an alliance with a family of Scotch descent, the maternal nativity becoming confused with the paternal in the transmission of the tradition.

Edward removed from New Haven to Hartford, Conn., where the record states "Edward Grannis of Hartford was married to Elizabeth Andrews of Farmington, the daughter of Will: Andrews of Hartford, May 3d. 1655." William Andrews was the schoolmaster of Hartford, and died in 1659, leaving a widow Abigail.

Edward and Elizabeth had one child, Joseph, born in Hartford, March 31, 1656, who died in 1676 or 1677. Elizabeth probably died soon after the birth of her son Joseph as there is no further record of her, or the birth of other children.

On October 4, 1656, Edward was appointed by "ye Courte" to be Leather Sealer for Hartford.

He married second, in 1662, Hannah Wakefield, daughter of John Wakefield of New Haven, the man in whose employ Edward was in 1652.

New Haven, Conn., was settled in 1638 by a group of colonists under the leadership of Theophilus Eaton and the Rev. John Davenport. They were mostly well-to-do merchants from London, England, or vicinity, and originally landed in Massachusetts where they remained for nearly a year. The Massachusetts Colony made strenuous efforts to keep such an opulent and desirable body of colonists, but they chose to settle where they could become self-governed. If John Wakefield came from England with these colonists he probably lingered in Massachusetts, or went elsewhere for a time, as his name does not appear in the first land division in New Haven. He was there, however, in 1640 and the record indicates he may have previously been in Wethersfield, Conn. In 1642, and again in 1648, he is referred to as "the miller." He was possessed of considerable property and his home lot and house was "on the other side of West Creek."

This was somewhere near the present (1923) Lafayette Street, "West Creek," long since filled in, running just southerly of Meadow Street. Wakefield died in 1660, his inventory, 116 pounds, 3 shillings, being presented December 4, 1660. There survived him a widow, Ann, and daughters Hannah, Mary and Martha. Ann married again, her second husband being James Clark, Sr., by whom she had a daughter, Mary Clark, who married William Chatterton. In Vol. 2, p. 332, of the old records of New Haven, it appears that on February 9, 1661, "Widdow Wakefield and two of her children, viz. Hannah and Mary came to Court to whom it was declared that there being no will left to guide the disposal of the Estate. It is by law determined that ½ belongs to the Widdow and ¾ to the three children, Hannah being about 18 yrs. of age was appointed to receive her portion. * * * The Widdow's jot is 38 £: 07 s: 8 d. — to each child 25 £: 11 s: 9 d."

Edward and Hannah had two sons and five daughters, all of whom married and had families. Three of their children, Hannah, Mabel, and Abigail, were born in Hartford.

The land records of Hartford contain the following items:

"Land in Hartford belonging to Edward Grannis and his heirs forever." "May 28, 1663, one parcell on which his dwelling standeth with the yardes and gardens thereunto belonging, containing one half acre, be it more or less, abbuting on ye highway South and West, on ye little river on ye North and on Mr. Andrews land on ye East. This land was given him by his father-in-lawe Mr. William Andrews." "Dec. 23, 1664, One parcell of land which he bought of William Callsey (Kelsey) which sometime was land of William Williams and containing by estimate two roodes, be it more or less, abutting the highway leading from the mill to the old oxpasture North, and the little river on the South." "One parcell more given him by the Towne, being an Island containing about two roods, and abutts Mr. Andrews lot on the south and is compassed about with the little river, commonly called Mill river."

"Attest by Sag'nt Thomas Watts and Robert Sanford."

March 18, 1671, he sold these three parcels of land to Samuel Burr and removed to Hadley, Mass., where he had a daughter, Sarah, and a son, John, born.

In March, 1674, his wife, Hannah, was fined ten shillings "for

wearing a silk hood and scarfe." These articles were exhibited in court and the record reads that "though somewhat worn, they had been of good silk." The General Court of Massachusetts had passed a law in 1651 making it an offence for persons whose estate did not exceed £200, or those depending on them, to wear "gold or silver lace, gold or silver buttons, bone lace above 2 s. value a yard, or silk hoods or scarfes."

At the March Court, 1676, nine men were charged with being actors in a riotous assembly in Hadley on February 15th "where there was a public affronting of authority in stopping and hindering of the execution of a sentence which was ordered by authority." The record does not tell what the sentence was nor against whom it was directed. Edward Grannis was a leader in the riotous assembly and said that the sentence should not be executed. He was adjudged to be whipped "twelve stripes, well laid on."

In the latter part of 1676 or early in 1677 he removed to New Haven, settling in that part then known as the "Muddy River District," now that part of North Haven called Montowese. Here a son was born on March 12, 1677, and as he was named Joseph, it is presumed that the Joseph by his first wife had died a short time before. The last record of the first Joseph is in the records of Hampshire County, Mass., where it appears that at the March Court in 1676, thirty-eight wives and maids, and thirty young men were fined, some "for wearing silk, and that in a flaunting manner," and others "for long hair" and other Puritan extravagances. Among the offending young men was Joseph Grannis of Hadley.

Edward and his family do not seem to have been in accord with some of the church-made laws of the Puritans and they did not hesitate to act in opposition to what they probably regarded as unreasonable restriction of personal liberty.

Besides the second Joseph, Edward and Hannah also had a daughter, Ann, born in New Haven.

In Volume I of the Proprietors Records (New Haven, Conn.) are items showing that Edward had land laid out to him in the sixth and seventh New Haven land divisions. Land was also laid out to him in the eighth and ninth divisions, "upon the North side of the Blue Hills" and "at Neck Rock," respectively. His grandson, John, sold three acres of the Blue Hills land in 1756 and part of the ninth division land in 1770. Edward's wife,

Hannah, also had some land from her father's estate, for on September 17, 1703, Edward and Hannah Grannis sold "John Wakefield's Meadow, called Hubbards." That Edward died possessed of some property is certain but there is no probate record of a will or of an inventory or distribution of his estate, neither has the exact location of his homestead been determined. Record boundaries of property were most indefinite, as witness this description in the land records of one piece of Edward's ninth division land: "Lying in Two Mile Swamp, bounded as follows;—begining at the N.E. corner, lying a heap of stones and a stake, thence running eastward to a chestnut pole marked with a stone at the Root, thence south to a stake and a heap of stones marked E. G., thence west to a heap of stones by the highway, Thence to the first station."

Bodily ills belong to no particular age or generation. Edward's wife Hannah, a woman of but thirty-six years, was so afflicted with rheumatism that in the fall of 1680 and again in the spring of 1681, she went to Stonington, Conn., for treatment. The exact words of the record, dated April 26, 1681, are, in part: "It was propounded concerning Goodwife Grannes shee was under infirmity and Lamesnes, shee had been before ye last winter in Stonington with a woman of skill to use means for her cure, and had som benefitt by her going, but was to (go) againe this Spring in order to (obtain) a cure."

In various deeds recorded in New Haven, Edward is styled "cordwainer," a tanner and worker of leather. He and his wife were admitted to membership in the First Church of New Haven, June 28, 1696. Hannah died in 1711 and Edward in 1719 and they were buried in the Montowese, Conn., cemetery. Their graves and that of one other member of the family are still (1920) marked by three small uncut slabs of red sand-stone, bearing only initials and dates.



These stones indicate the resting place of Edward Grannis, the progenitor of the family in America, Hannah (Wakefield) Grannis, his second wife, and Elizabeth (Brockett) Grannis, first wife of Edward's son John. The lettering on the stones is faint and in a very few years will be illegible. The meager markings convey no information except to one making a study of the family history. The dates on the stones correspond with records in the Vital Statistics of New Haven.

EDWARD,¹ born about 1630; was in New Haven, Conn., as early as 1649; died there Dec. 10, 1719; married first in Hartford, Conn., May 3, 1654, Elizabeth Andrews, daughter of William Andrews of Hartford and Farmington, Conn.; married second in 1662, Hannah Wakefield, daughter of John and Ann Wakefield of New Haven, Conn. Hannah died in New Haven in 1711.

8, 1706, and the gravestone adjoining that of this Moses Brockett in the Montowese (Conn.) Cemetery bears the inscription: Lydia, wife of Moses Brockett died Apr. 6, 1742, ae. 53. This could have been a second wife but thorough search fails to disclose the death of Anne or of a second marriage of Moses. Although double names were yet very uncommon, it is quite possible that the youngest child of Edward and Hannah Grannis was named Lydia Ann. Moses' wife evidently died suddenly, as on her footstone appears "Here we may see how soon death may surprise, Though well at Evening, dead as the sun doth rise."

JOHN² (Edward¹), born in Hadley, Mass., Dec. 5, 1674, removed with his parents about 1677 to that part of New Haven, Conn., now called Montowese, situated in the town of North Haven. He married first at Wallingford, Conn., Oct. 12, 1704, Elizabeth Brockett, born in New Haven, Nov. 26, 1677, and died in North Haven, Nov. 30, 1711. She was the daughter of Dr. John and Elizabeth (Doolittle) Brockett. Dr. Brockett was born in New Haven in 1642, educated at Oxford, England, and returning to New Haven, became the first resident physician of that Colony.

John Grannis joined the First Church of New Haven, Dec. 29, 1706. He became a man of importance in North Haven in its church, military and civic affairs. In January, 1716, he was moderator of the Ecclesiastical Society and, in following years, chairman or member of its committees. In 1739 he appeared before the General Assembly, presenting a petition of the Society, "for authority to procure a meeting-house" for "New Haven North Parish," now North Haven.

In October, 1718, he was chosen Lieutenant of the first military company in North Haven, being made Captain in 1733. He was Tythingman in 1727. In numerous deeds recorded in New Haven, he is variously styled "Husbandman" or "Landplanter" and is also called "Taylor" in 1713.

On Feb. 14, 1728, a license was granted "Unto John Granniss of New Haven to set up and practice the art and mystery of a

Tanner." He had probably acquired knowledge of this trade from his father. He was a large land owner.

In Vol. I of the Proprietors Records, under date of 1733, is this item, "Lieut. John Grannis have his own and his father Grannis' sixth division land." He also had 7th division land.

Feb. 9, 1734, for the sum of £50, he conveyed two tracts of land to "The Governor and Company of His Majesty's English Colony of Connecticut in New England in America."

He married second, in New Haven, Jan. 10, 1717, Mrs. Mary (Chubb) Sanford, born in Beverly, Mass., in April, 1682, and died in North Haven, Dec. 17, 1781, ae. 99 years, 8 months (North Haven Church Records). She was the daughter of Thomas and Mercy (Plumbe) Chubb and the widow of Thomas Sanford, Jr., of New Haven, whom she had married Jan. 13, 1704.

John died Sept. 10, 1740, in Northford, Conn., at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Israel Frisbie. Before his death he had distributed much of his property. His inventory, taken Oct. 30, 1740, was £182, 9s, 2d.

His homestead lot was a thirty acre tract in "North Haven or Muddy River, so-called, bounded East on the Country road, South on Samuel Potter, West on Tim Barnes and North on Samuel Brockett, Timothy Barnes and the heirs of Israel Barnes."

His widow Mary continued to live there until after Oct. 16, 1771, when she gave a quit-claim deed to Jonathan Mix of New Haven, of "all rights in lands whereon I dwell and buildings thereon, which my son Enos hath conveyed to said Mix, my right being a right of dower."

JOSEPH² (Edward¹), born at New Haven, Conn., Mch. 12, 1677; married Nov. 11, 1702 (recorded in New Haven), Hannah Russell, daughter of John and Hannah Russell. She was born in 1670 and was living as late as 1733, but as she is not mentioned in Joseph's will, or in the distribution of his estate, it is presumed she died before 1751.

It is probable that soon after his marriage he became a resident of that part of New Haven known as East Haven. In 1702 he had eight acres of land there, in the tax list at £8. In 1703 he bought "three acres of meadow in New Haven" from the widow of Caleb Merriman of Wallingford.

He was evidently a resident of East Haven as early as 1708. In 1707 the General Assembly granted a petition ordering that East Haven "Should be a villiage distinct from the town of New Haven" and free "from paying taxes to the town of New Haven." At a village meeting held in East Haven, Oct. 25, 1708, to consider articles of agreement under this act, Joseph Grannis was one of a number who entered their protest against any propositions "That may be a wrong to our old grants."

Robert Dawson, Sr., who had married Mrs. Hannah Russell, widow of John Russell and the mother of Joseph Grannis' wife Hannah, in March, 1709, conveyed to Joseph a small tract of land. That his stepdaughter and her husband were well liked by Dawson is expressed in the following quotations from the deed: "for ye love I beare my son-in-law Joseph Grannis and to his present wife Hannah, as also ye grate afection I beare to their oldest son Joseph, I doe make over a certain trackt of upland lying in ye bounds of East Haven, aforesaid, at a place called Foxon's, by estimate two acres * * * to Joseph Grannis and Hannah, his wife during their life and at their death to their oldest child Joseph and if he die, to the next of my son Joseph Grannis' children."

In 1709 he was allotted eight acres in the East Haven land division and it was probably the land referred to under date of Mch. 28, 1728, in the New Haven Proprietors Records, Vol. I, as "That laid out for Serg't. Joseph Grannis, 8 acres of fifth division land." He also acquired land at Foxon, Jan. 3 and July 23, 1712, and on Mch. 4, 1714, he bought eight acres, with a small dwelling, adjoining his other land at Foxon. This was purchased from Robert Dawson, Sr.

In Foxon, which is in the north part of East Haven, was situated an old homestead, occupied for several generations by the Grannis family. Just when and by whom it was built, and by what Grannis it was first occupied is not known, but it seems quite probable it was Joseph's homestead. It was of the type of dwelling known as "salt-box house" and was torn down in 1860. Again in the New Haven records it appears that on Oct. 5, 1714, John Morris deeded to "Joseph Grannis, husbandman of the Villiage called East Haven in the County of New Haven" land

"lying in a place or farms called Foxon's, being about 15 acres." His will, dated Dec. 4, 1751, thus opens: "I, Joseph Grannis of East Haven, being now under the afflicting hand of God thro Blindness and the Infirmaties of Body thro age and having reached the time when I must set my house in order * * * *." He died in the latter part of 1754, his inventory being taken Dec. 6, 1754, and the estate distributed in May, 1755. His son, Stephen, was named as Executor.

JOHN³ (John,² Edward¹), born at North Haven, Conn., Nov. 26, 1710; married in New Haven, Conn., Dec. 8, 1738, Mary Bradley, daughter of Samuel³ (Joseph,² William¹) and Abigail (Atwater) Bradley of New Haven, born Oct. 8, 1717, died at Claremont, N. H., Feb. 22, 1812. The Connecticut French and Indian War records show that one John Grannis served seven days in defence of Fort William Henry in the 2d Reg't., 3d Company, Capt. Amos Hitchcock, enlisting in August, 1757; also enlisted in the same company Apr. 10, 1758, and was discharged Nov. 5 of that year.

By the will of his grandfather, John Brockett, he received a large tract of land in Wallingford, Conn., when he became of age. The purchase and sale of property by him appears in numerous entries in the New Haven land records in years 1742 to 1778, inclusive. Some of it was in Wallingford and Mt. Carmel, but the larger part in the "Parish of North Haven," New Haven. He deeded land to the Town for a highway. In one of his transactions he sold to John Sanford, Jr., 1000 acres of "Division Land" which had belonged to his father, Capt. John Grannis. His wife also possessed considerable property, devised to her by her

father in his will dated Apr. 5, 1757, as follows: "I give to Mary Grannis one half of all my right in lands of my father (Joseph Bradley) and one half of all my 5th., 6th. and 7th. Divisions, with one half of my undivided lands that is yet to be laid out to me in New Haven, and 35 shillings in money." Some of this land was in Mt. Carmel, Conn. He was living as late as Dec. 30, 1780, when "John and Mary Grannis of New Haven" deeded "land in the Parish of Mt. Carmel in the seventh division, likewise in South Side the Mill Rock set out to Silence (Mary's grandmother) and Samuel Bradley." John probably died in 1781. He had been guardian for his grandchildren, Abigail and Joanna Ives, and the Probate Court makes no mention of his removal but on June 18, 1781, appointed Joseph Gilbert, Jr., their guardian. It is certain he died before May 27, 1799, as on that date Mary gave a deed for land in Hamden, Conn., in which she styles herself "of Claremont, N. H., widow." After his death, his widow, Mary, removed to Claremont, N. H., whither her daughter, Elizabeth Ives, had gone in 1767, and her son Timothy in 1768. A family tradition has it that the year before she died, being in her ninetyfifth year, she spun and wove a web of flannel for a son living in New Haven, who, she said, was not as well off as the others.

JAMES³ (John,² Edward¹), born at North Haven, Conn., Oct. 21, 1717; died at Naugatuck, Conn., in 1801; married by Rev. Isaac Stiles of North Haven, Jan. 8, 1739, Mabel Potter, daughter of Daniel and Mary (Ray) Potter, b. in New Haven, Nov. 9, 1720. It is recorded that "Moses Brockett and James Grannis hath taken possession of a fishing place in New Haven East River against the south end of that island called Painter's Island." On Jan. 6, 1742, he was deeded 17 acres of "land in North Parish of New Haven, on the East Side of the Country Road" by his brother, John. The latter says in the deed, "In consideration of the natural right my brother James Grannis hath to the Estate of my Honored father, Capt. CALEB³ (John,² Edward¹), born at North Haven, Conn., Jan. 25, 1723; died at Cheshire, Conn., Mch. 20, 1794; married at Wallingford, Conn., Nov. 27, 1745, Patience Bunnell, daughter of Nathaniel and Mary (Brooks) Bunnell of Cheshire, born at Wallingford, Nov. 28, 1726, died at Cheshire, Aug. 26, 1788. On Apr. 4, 1745, perhaps in anticipation of his marriage, Caleb purchased from his brother, John, for £180, 14 acres of land with dwelling and barn thereon, in the Parish of North Haven on the east side of New Haven East River, bounded East and South on the highway, North by James Heaton and West by Enos Grannis. His name appears in the records as of New Haven until 1756 and he probably removed within the then bounds of Wallingford about 1757, living in that part of the Parish of Cheshire which is now in the town of Hamden. In Amasa Hotchkiss' Record, written in his 83d year, he includes Caleb Grannis in the "Names of inhabitants annexed to Cheshire lying within the bounds of what is now (1823) Hamden who constantly attended meeting at Cheshire." In 1748 he owned a considerable tract of land in Northbury (now Plymouth), Conn., and in 1759, land at "Compound's Pond," Southington, Conn., all of which he had sold in 1760. He served in the French and Indian War, campaign of 1759, enlisting May 23d in the Eleventh Company, Second Regt., Capt. Thomas Wilmot. His wife, Patience, was admitted to the Cheshire Church Feb. 25, 1770, and on Apr. 8th following, six of their children were baptized in the same church.

JOSEPH³ (Joseph,² Edward¹), born in 1703, probably at North Haven, Conn.; married in 1728, Bathsheba Thompson, daughter of John and Mercy (Mansfield) Thompson, born Jan. 24, 1707, died in 1761. Joseph was lost at sea, the date being a little uncertain. In the records of East Haven families, compiled about 1850, by the Rev. Stephen B. Dodd, Congregational minister in East Haven, from family records, traditions and other sources, it is given that Joseph was lost at sea in 1738, aged 35 years. There are two entries in the New Haven probate records, the first of which states that an inventory of Joseph's estate was filed June 12, 1735, and an agreement entered into by his brothers that his land be divided into six parts, Russell to take two parts and the other brothers one part each. The second entry states that Joseph's inventory was taken May 1, 1738, his brother Russell being Administrator. It may be that Joseph failed to return from a voyage in 1735 but actual proof of death being lacking, his

estate was not probated until 1738. Russell made settlement with Joseph's widow, Mch. 27, 1740, after which date she married Abraham Chidsey, as his third wife.

STEPHEN⁸ (Joseph,² Edward¹), born at East Haven, Conn., in 1714; died at Southington, Conn., June 11, 1786; married at East Haven in 1738, Hannah Dawson, daughter of Thomas and Hannah (Robinson) Dawson, born at East Haven, in 1717, and died at Southington, Conn., Oct. 11, 1797. They were cousins, his mother, Hannah (Russell) Grannis, and her father, Thomas Dawson, having had the same mother, the latter having first married John Russell and second, Robert Dawson. Stephen and his family removed from East Haven to Southington some time after May 28, 1755, on which date, being still "of East Haven," he purchased eighty acres of land in the Parish of Southington, town of Farmington, Conn. JOHN⁴ (John,³ John,² Edward¹), born in North Haven, Conn., Sept. 18, 1739. He was in the French and Indian War, enlisting in April, 1761, as Sergeant in the Seventh Company, Capt. Amos Hitchcock, Second Regiment (Col. Whiting's). A John Grannis enlisted in this same company in August, 1757, serving seven days, and again on Apr. 10, 1758, serving seven months from that date. It is uncertain if the enlistments of 1757 and 8 were by John⁴ or his father, John.³

John⁴ was a fisherman and sailor and drifted to the Massachusetts coast where, on June 25, 1775, he enlisted in the Revolution, serving 6 months and 22 days; Jan. 1, 1776, he was commissioned Captain of the third company for sea coast defence, stationed at Elizabeth Islands and Martha's Vineyard, serving seven months and four days. In February, 1777, he was a witness in the Naval investigation of the conduct of Capt. Esek Hopkins, commander of the "Warren." The History of Earnstable states that "Capt. John Grannis raised a company of thirty men in or about Falmouth," Mass., "in 1777."

Family tradition says he went South and the census of 1790 places him in the Edenton District, Currituck County, N. C., there being in his household, including himself, three males over sixteen years of age, two females and two slaves.

TIMOTHY⁴ (John,³ John,² Edward¹), born at North Haven, Conn., May 14, 1750; died May 7, 1827, at Claremont, N. H.; married there first, Jan. 1, 1771, Sarah Sumner, daughter of Dr. William Sumner, born at Hebron, Conn., June 4, 1749. She died June 25, 1789, and he married second, Jan. 27, 1790, Sarah Nye, born at Tolland, Conn., in 1759. She died at Claremont, N. H., Jan. 23, 1815.

In 1769, Timothy removed from North Haven, Conn., and settled in Claremont, N. H., whither his sister, Elizabeth, had gone with her husband, Joseph Ives, in 1767.

Though Timothy was at first opposed to the separation of the Colonies from the mother country and, with thirty others, refused, on May 30, 1776, to sign allegiance to the cause of liberty, he appears to have later changed his views as the New Hampshire State Records show that he contributed nine pounds to aid in carrying on the war. Because of his earlier attitude regarding separation, the Rev. Augustine Hibbard, minister of the Claremont Congregational Church, refused to baptize Timothy's daughter, Margaret. This act turned him from the Congregational Church and in 1779 his family was one of sixteen who united to form the Union Church Society (Episcopal). All of his children, and many of his later descendants, continued in the Episcopal faith. He was vestryman in this church in 1787 and several years thereafter, and was a prominent man in the business and civil affairs of the town, being for a long period a member of the "Committee of Corporations."

All of his eleven children were born in Claremont and ten of them married and had families. He had fifty grandchildren.

EDWARD4 (John, John, Edward1), born at North Haven, Conn., Nov. 14, 1752; died at Saratoga, N. Y., Apr. 10, 1798. He is supposed to have gone with his brother Timothy when the latter removed to Claremont, N. H., in 1769, though his marriage to his first wife, Hannah Wells, daughter of Joseph, in 1772, is recorded in the Hebron, Conn., Congregational Church records. If he did go to New Hampshire with Timothy, as family tradition has it, and was married at Claremont or vicinity, the record of it at Hebron may be explained by the fact that there was no settled minister at Claremont for a time, a preacher from Hebron, Conn., serving somewhat as a missionary, visiting there. The records of Weathersfield, Vt., show that Edward resided there between the years 1770 and 1780. Hannah died there Aug. 6, 1775, and he married second Jan. 18, 1776, Elizabeth Bellamy. He was a Revolutionary soldier and was among the first at Weathersfield to declare for liberty and independence. His name appears in the New Hampshire rolls, July 21 to Sept. 23, 1777, as serving in Capt. Abel Walker's Company, General Stark's Brigade, which marched from Charlestown, N. H., to Saratoga, N. Y., to join the northern Continental Army. He reënlisted in Capt. Hazen's Company, Col. Peter Olcutt, Vermont troops. In 1778 he was again with the New Hampshire troops, Col. Timothy Bedel commanding, for the expedition to Canada. Oct. 17, 1780, he again entered service in the Vermont troops and was appointed Lieutenant in Capt. William Upham's Company. A Vermont record dated July 18, 1781, shows that £2, 13s, 3d., was "paid Captain Grannis for collecting prisoners." There seems none other than

DAVID⁴ (John,³ John,² Edward¹), born at North Haven, Conn., Apr. 9, 1755; died at Gowanda, N. Y., Jan. 7, 1834; married in 1780, Clarissa Martin, born in Meriden, Conn., in 1763 and died at LeRoy, N. Y., Mch. 4, 1852. David was probably a miller as he, at one time and another, owned a grist mill. He seems to have frequently moved about, buying and selling mills, mill sites and other realty. SIMEON⁴ (Caleb, John, Edward), probably born at North Haven about 1754; died at East Farms, town of Waterbury, Conn., the latter part of 1821; married his cousin, Priscilla Brockett, daughter of Moses and Priscilla (Grannis) Brockett of "Muddy River District," (Montowese) New Haven, Apr. 18, 1776. The marriage was recorded in Wallingford, Conn. He lived in that part of Wallingford then called "New Cheshire Parish," now Cheshire, where he took the freeman's oath in 1777. He was a Revolutionary soldier, enlisting July 14, 1775, in the Second Company, Captain Street Hall, Seventh Continental Regiment, Col. Webb commanding, and was discharged Oct. 23, 1775. He also enlisted again on May 26, 1777, in the Fifth Company, Capt. Miles Hull, Tenth Regiment. The number of deeds recorded in Cheshire, Conn., in which his name appears as grantee or grantor indicates that he dealt largely in real estate. He was a resident of Cheshire as late as 1805. ENOS4 (Enos,3 John,2 Edward1), born at North Haven, in 1754, baptized, with sister Lucy and brother Benjamin, May 3, 1761; died in 1824; married first at Plymouth, Conn., Feb. 10, 1784, Elizabeth Royce, born in Waterbury, Conn., Feb. 5, 1759, daughter of Phineas Royce and his third wife, Elizabeth (Palmer) The latter was a daughter of Daniel Palmer of Branford, Conn., and widow of Daniel Lord of Lyme, Conn. Enos married second, previous to 1794, Margaret ——. He was a Revolutionary soldier, enlisting at Watertown, Conn., Apr. 19, 1776, holding a Lieutenant's commission, Nov. 27, 1779, and was a revolutionary pensioner residing in Westmoreland County, Penn., May, 1818, when he stated he was aged sixty-four years and up-The Pension Office records show that he was in the battle of the Brandwine, Del., Sept. 11, 1777, at Germantown, Penn., Oct. 4, 1777, and at Monmouth, N. J., June 28, 1778. In the latter part of 1780, his company was sent to the "Southern Army," then in command of General Greene, and he remained South to the end of the war, going to Philadelphia, Nov. 3, 1783,

where his company was disbanded. This "heddle" has gone into general use both in this and foreign countries. In 1857, he removed to Red Wing, Minn., one year before Minnesota became a State, and engaged in the lumber business.

He held several public offices, being County Commissioner of Goodhue County and a member of the State Legislature.

He spent several years in the compilation of a genealogy of the

Grannis family which he published in 1901. His research was all conducted by correspondence and his book is made up largely of family traditions and recollections or as he is pleased to term it "tea table talk." While his book is small and incomplete, and does not always agree with items of record, it is the first attempt to trace and preserve the Grannis lineage. It represents several years of patient effort and study and confers upon him the title of First Historian of the Grannis Family in America.



"My grandparents came to Warren County, Penn., from out Buffalo way and later went West, my father remaining here (Corydon, Penn.).

"Father had an uncle John Grannis who lived about a day's drive from Randolph,—I think it was Lodi—and he had several sons. My oldest sister says that my grandmother named me after some member of my father's family."

Note. The compiler is strongly of the opinion that the father of this William Henry Grannis was a son of Robert⁵ (No. 176), but of whom no record has been found.

Anson's first wife and her two children were buried at Rocky Hill, Conn., and he and his second wife, at South Glastonbury, Conn.

The Strong Genealogy, Vol. 2, page 1067, states that Rachel Shannon Gramiss of Wheeling, W. Va., m. in 1833, Henry Laurens Strong. He was born May 7, 1801, probably at Westhampton, Mass. In 1870 he was a wood carver living in San Francisco, Cal, and had previously lived in Boston, Mass., Wheeling, W. Va., and St. Louis, Mo.

STRONG

The Strongs of England were originally located in county Shropshire (Salop), England. One of them married an heiress of Griffith, county of Caernarvon, Wales, and was living there in 1545. Richard Strong was of this branch, born at Caernarvon in 1561. In 1590 he moved to Taunton, Somersetshire, England, where he died in 1613, leaving a son, John, then eight years old, and a daughter, Eleanor.

JOHN,¹ the immigrant ancestor of nearly all bearing the name Strong in America, was born in Taunton, England, in 1605. He moved to London and then to Plymouth. Having Puritan sympathies he sailed for America, Mch. 20, 1630, in the ship Mary and John, Capt. Squeb master, with a company of 140 persons among whom were the Rev. John Warham, Rev. John Maverick, and Messrs. John Mason, John Gallup and Roger Clapp. It was their intention to land at Charlestown, Mass., but a dispute having arisen with Captain Squeb, they were summarily put ashore at Nantasket (Hull), about twelve miles southeast of Boston. Looking about for a place to form a settlement they selected a spot which they named Dorchester.

Eleanor came with her brother and later married Walter Deane of Taunton, Mass., previously of Taunton, England.

In 1636 John moved to Hingham, Mass., and on Mch. 9, 1636, took the freeman's oath at Boston. Dec. 4, 1638, he is found in Taunton, Mass., then called Cohannet, when he was made a freeman of Plymouth Colony and sworn in as constable the same day. In the years 1641 to 1644 he was Deputy to the General Court. He remained in Taunton until 1645 when he removed to Windsor, Conn., where he was appointed, with four others, Capt. John Mason, Roger Ludlow, Israel Stoughton and Henry Walcott, to superintend bringing forward the settlement of Windsor, at first called Dorchester. In 1659 he removed to Northampton, Mass., of which he was one of the first and most active founders, as he had previously been of Dorchester, Hingham, Taunton and Windsor. He lived in Northampton for forty years and was a leading man in the affairs of the town and of the church. He was a tanner and very prosperous in his business, his tannery being located on what is now the southwest corner of

Market and Main Streets, near the railroad station. Records in the county clerk's office show that he owned at different times several hundred acres of land in and around Northampton. How he obtained the office and title of Elder will appear from the following quotation from the church records: "After solemn and extraordinary seeking to God for his direction and blessing, the church chose John Strong ruling elder and William Holton deacon."

He married his first wife in England, name and family not ascertained. She either died on the passage to America or immediately after landing. In December, 1630, he married second, Abigail Ford, born in England in 1608. She came to America with her parents, Thomas Ford and his first wife, in the same ship with John, and they lived together 58 years. She died July 6, 1688, aged 80 years, the mother of sixteen children. He died Apr. 14, 1609, aged 94 years.

At the time of his decease he had 160 descendants, viz.: 18 children, fifteen of whom had families, 114 grandchildren, and 33 great-grandchildren, at least. He made over his lands to his children in his lifetime, taking bills from those whom he had helped beyond their share. It is interesting to note that his funeral expenses amounted to forty shillings, probate of will and inventory 7s., 6d., recording of same 5 shillings. When he went to Northampton his son John, born in England in 1626, only surviving child by his first wife, did not accompany him but remained a resident of Windsor.

JOSEPH⁸ (Thomas, John¹), born at Northampton, Mass., Dec. 2, 1672; died at Coventry, Conn., Dec. 23, 1763, aged ninetyone years; married first in 1694, Sarah Allen, daughter of Nehemiah and Sarah (Woodford) Allen, born Aug. 22, 1672; married second, Sept. 15, 1724, Ruth ———. He removed from Northampton to Coventry in March, 1716, seven years after the first settlement of that town. He was a farmer and a man of property and consideration. He held various town offices of importance, as town treasurer in 1716; selectman for six years; justice of peace from 1723 onwards. In 1721, the first year that Coventry was represented in the Colonial Legislature, he was sent to it as the representative of the town. There were two sessions yearly of the legislature, May and October, until 1819. Justice Joseph Strong was for fifty-two times elected a member and, including extra sessions, attended sixty-five sessions of the General Assembly. He was moderator of the first town meeting, held Apr. 24, 1718, and often afterwards, holding that office the last time Apr. 11, 1763, when he was ninety. He was a member of the legislature for the last time when in May, 1762, being then aged eighty-nine, his son Phinehas was the other representative from Coventry. He must have been a man of remarkable vitality and there seems to have been a good deal of town pride taken in sending such a venerable man to the Assembly.

His children were all by his first marriage and, with the exception of Phinehas, were born at Northampton, Mass. His widow, Ruth, died at Glastonbury, Conn., Feb. 14, 1768.


