THE GULICK FAMILY

The author of the following is not known, but presumably it was Mr. Robert Bayles of New York City, President of the Market and Fulton National Bank, in 1901. He stated, in letters, that his records were taken from church and county records. After his death, his brother, W. Harrison Bayles, finished the work.

Evidently many copies have been made of these pages, and it was printed in "Gullick and Allied Families," written by Mrs. Eliza Haddon McClure Brevoort, and published in 1948.

James Harvey Gulick, the father of Helen Gulick Huntley (Mrs. W.M.) received (a) copy of these eight pages and additional items on the Gulick family from Robert Bayles in 1901.

The GULICK family, now quite widely numerous in New Jersey and elsewhere, is of Dutch or German origin. The ancestor of the family in this country was among the early emigrants from the Netherlands, and came over during the period when the tide of emigration to New Netherlands was probably the greatest, from 1650 to 1660. Amsterdam was the principal port of departure for the emigrants who were for the most part Dutch; but many came from other lands, seeking to better their condition in a new country. They came from Sweden, Norway, Denmark and the North German states. Not a few were English and French from among those who, a short time before, had taken refuge in Holland to escape religious persecution.

It was a common practice with the first Dutch settlers to write their names with the name of the place from which they came, as Van TILSBURG (from Tilsburg), VAN DEVENTER (from Deventer), and in the course of ^{time} these names were adopted as the family names of their children, in some cases dropping the Van, as SUTPHEN, which was formerly VAN SUTPHEN, BARKALO, formerly written Van Barkalo. It is probable that the name Gulick originates in the same way. On the passenger list of the ship "Hope" from Amsterdam in 1662 is the name ALBERT EUER VAN GULICK (from Gulick). See Doct. History of New York, page 59, Vol. III, and on the register of marriages in the Dutch Church of N.Y. several names are recorded as from the land of Gulick.

Gulick Family.

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The following was copied from an old Geography dated 1693.

"The Dukedom of Juliers lies between the Rivers Maes and Rhine, &c., &c. Juliers or Gulick as the inhabitants call it (Juliasum) the capital of the Dutchy, is an ancient city seated on the river Roer at the distance of 50 miles from Cleeve to the South, 25 from Cologne to the West, and 25 miles from Maestricht to the East. It is a small place, but neatly built; the houses are of brick, and the streets broad and even. The citadel is large and rendered as strong as the best engineers of Germany could make it. Notwithstanding which it has been often taken in the present age, but at last restored to the Duke of Newburg."

The name is found for the first time in this country early in the year 1653, in the records of the Dutch Church at New Amsterdam (New York) where the name HENDRICK GULICK is recorded as witness of the baptism of a child of LUCAS DIREKSEN (Probably a fellow passenger on the ship which brought him from the Netherlands.) Under date of Sept. 11, 1653, the marriage record of the church contains the following entry:

"Claes Claessen Smit Van Amersfoort en Geertruyt Willekens Van Hamburg wide Van Hendrick Gulick."

It appears from this that Hendrick was originally from the Dutchy of Gulick and his wife from Hamburg. It is possible that he may have married in Hamburg or he may have met his wife in the Netherlands. All that can be said about him is that he arrived at New Amsterdam in 1653 with wife and two children and died the same year.

In 1657 Claes Claessen Smit settled at New Utrecht, a town on Long Island adjoining Gravesend where he owned a farm of 48 acres and other property. A few years later his wife made a visit to the fatherland and returned in the ship "Faith", which sailed from the Netherlands Feb. 1659. Her name is entered on the list of passengers as "Geertruyt Jochems of Hamburg wife of Claes Claessen of Amersfoort, now in New ~~Netherlands~~ Netherlands and two children." This indicates that her

father's name was Jochem, for such was the custom of the Dutch at that time in writing their names to add that of the father, with the addition of "s" or "sen".

It was also a Dutch custom almost without exception to give to the oldest son and daughter the names of their grandparents on the father's side and to the second son and daughter the names of grandparents on the mother's side. In this way family names were perpetuated to a remarkable degree.

Some years after the death of HENDRICK GULICK the names of JAN and JOCHEM GULICK appear for the first time. They were doubtless sons of Hendrick now grown to maturity. There is proof of this in the fact that Jochem came from the Netherlands in 1653 as appears by the Gravesend records of 1687, when he took the oath of allegiance, viz., that he had been in the country 34 years. See doc. Hist. of ~~the~~ New York, page 661, Vol. I. The names of his oldest son and daughter being Hendrick and Geertruyt is still stronger evidence of the relationship.

JAN was a mechanic. In 1656, ^{with} Nelis Matthuysen, he was employed by the inhabitants of Harlem to build the Dutch Church at that place. Matthuysen was a Swede, at one time an officer of the town and a land owner in Harlem.

There is no evidence that Jan Gulick owned land or lived there. He probably came over from Long ~~EX~~ Island for the special purpose of assisting Matthuysen in building the church. See Hist. of Harlem. On the town records of Gravesend, a deed is recorded, dated 1693, made by JOHANNES BROWER, by which he conveys to STOFFEL LONGSTREET, a "House and Garden Spot" which he "bought of JOHN GULICK." From this it would seem that he had some time prior to this date resided in Gravesend. There is no further trace of him and he probably died without children.

JOCHEM (having the name of his mother's father) was no doubt the second son of HENDRICK. He was among the early settlers of Gravesend and his name appears on the records as early as 1670; married about 1676 to JACOMINTIE VAN FELT; was one of the patentees of the town in 1670 and also in 1686, when a new patent was granted by Gov. Dongan. He was elected an overseer in 1680, and his name was on the assesment roll of 1683 as Jacum Goijoliffie and was assessed four shillings three pence, the total assesment of the town amounting to about 15 pounds. In 1687, SAMUEL EDSALL, JOHN EMANS, JOHN TENNISON and Jochem Gulick were selected as arbitrators to settle a difference between GARRITT CORNELISSEN and the town of Flatbush. The decision was that Cornelissen should pay to the town 600 Guilders and 100 skipples of wheat in three years, one-third each year, to be in full satisfaction, leaving him in full possession of the land in controversy. He took the oath of allegiance to Great Britain in 1687, as did others not of English birth and at the same time recorded the fact that he had been in the country 34 years, thus fixing the date of emigration as 1653. In 1689 was commissioned by Gov. Leisler as ensign in the Kings County Militia. June 8, 1691, CHARLES MARSHALL of Staten Island brought suit against him in the Court of Sessions in Gravesend for a half share of the profits in a whaling voyage which he made with the said JOCHEM, as per town records. May 6, 1696, a plot of 85 acres at Smoky Point on Staten Island and 9 acres at the mouth of Fresh Kil was surveyed for JOHN LAKE and JOCHEM GULICK, as per page 233 of Vol. II of Land Papers. August 28 1697 he bought a plot of 20 acres in Gravesend of John Griggs Jr., for 60 pounds. In 1698, JOCHEM GULICK, JOHN GRIGGS and Samuel GERRETSON sold to RENIER VAN SICKLEN for 198 pounds all their right in the mill standing on the Stroom Kil with the dam and the property and rights belonging to said mill. May 25, 1700, a portion of the salt meadows known as the Long Fly and Cedar Rock lots were laid out by PETER CORTELYOU into 30 lots, and No. 20 was assigned to

Jochem Gulick.

JACOMYNTIE, daughter of TEUNIS VAN PELT (or as he wrote his name, Tonis Jansen Lanen Van Pelt) from Buren, in the province of Gelderland, who emigrated from the Netherlands in 1663, in the ship "Rose-tree," with his wife and six children; his brother Thys or Matthys came in the same ship with four children, his wife having died on the passage. Some of the sons of Matthys wrote their names "Lanen Van Pelt" and later dropped "Van Pelt" and called themselves "LAAN" or "LANE". A large family of that name living in Monmouth County about 1750 were his descendants.

Jochem, in his will, which is dated Dec. 17, 1711, gives to his wife, JACOMYNTIE, all of his property during her life, and after her death to his youngest son JOHANNES (not then of age) conditioned upon the payment of certain legacies amounting to 655 pounds, makes his wife sole executrix and names his brother-in-law AERT VAN PELT, and his friends WILLIAM WILLIAMSON and SAMUEL GERRETSON guardians of his wife and children, to see the will properly executed. He probably died soon after making his will, being then "very sick". After the death of his wife, JACOMYNTIE, JOHANNES, having the greatest interest, and having to pay certain legacies out of his estate, was duly appointed administrator. Letter of administration, with the will attached, were granted by Gov. Burnet at New York, Sep. ~~1722~~ 4, 1723.

A copy of the above mentioned will^{with}/the original papers duly signed and sealed has been preserved and is now in the possession of one of Jochem Gulick's descendants.

Children of JOCHEM GULICK and his wife, JACOMYNTIE VAN PELT:

#5--SAMUEL GULICK, son of Jochem and Jacomyntie, born 1685, as per Bergen's "Early Settlers of Kings County," probably died early, as his name is not mentioned in his father's will.

(Note by H.G.H.--Mr. Bayles merely stated that Samuel died prior to 1711)

#3-- Teunis Gulick was living in Gravesend as late as 1715; served as a member of Capt. Thomas Stillwell's Company of militia in 1715, since which date there is no record of him. He probably had

no children. (Note by H.G.H.- In the Tax List of 1735 for Franklin Twp., Somerset County, N.J., a Teunes Gulick is listed as owning 30 acres, 3 cattle, and was taxed 5 shillings and 1 pence. See "Hunterdon & Somerset Counties, N.J." by James P. Snell, published by Evarts & Peck, Philadelphia, Pa., on p. 815.

No witnesses to this baptism were given.)

HENDRICK, JOCHEM, PIETER and JOHANNES all settled in New Jersey soon after their father's death, Hendrick first, about 1712, and the others soon after.

In recording here the data collected concerning the descendants of the four brothers, it will be more convenient to treat each family separately. They all had large families and their grand-

children were very numerous. Each had a son Jochem (the eldest) and they had grandchildren by that name without number. Hendrick, Jochem, Peter and Johannes were names carried down in the families for three or four generations, and the records of baptisms found in early Dutch churches in New Jersey are very confusing on account of the similarity of names occurring in the different Gulick families.

#1 HENDRICK GULICK, the eldest son of Jochem Gulick and Jacomyntie Van Pelt, was born about 1678. Nov. 15, 1698, he bought of Jacob Kiersted and George Rapalie, as per town records, a lot of land in Gravesend containing 24 acres, and Oct. 17, 1700, he bought wood lot No. 12 in the North Woods of Thomas Stillwell.

HENDRICK GULICK married about 1700, Cantie or Catharie, daughter of Derrick Amerman,
(Note by H.G.H.- in "Early Settlers of Kings County, N.J." page 11, "Catherine or Cantie Derckse, baptised Apr. 2, 1677, married Hendrick Gulick. She was the daughter of Janse Derick who emigrated in 1650.) and soon after that date settled in Monmouth County, N.J., They were both members of the old Dutch Church there in 1709 (near Middleton) where two of their children were baptised, 1711 and 1713.

In 1712 "HENDRICK GULICK and KATERINE his wife" of Middletown, Monmouth County, N.J., in consideration of 185 pounds gave to SAMUEL OSBORN of Hopewell a deed for 120 acres, being the same land which he bought of WILLIAM MERRITT in 1704, as per records of Freehold, N.J. HENDRICK removed about this time to Somerset County, and lived probably not far from Harlingen, as two or three of his sons attended the Dutch Church and had children baptised there as per church records, viz.,

Catherine, child of Derrick Gulick and his wife, Gitty, 1743
Joakim, child of Joackim Gulick and his wife, Marie, 1750
Daniel, child of Henry Gulick and his wife, Sarah, 1751.

HENDRICK GULICK died prior to 1758. His will is dated Oct. 1, 1747 in Somerset Co., N.J., and was recorded Jan. 13, 1758. His children (as named in the will and in the same order) were:

HENDRICK directs in his will that his property shall be sold and divided into eleven equal parts and that each of his children receive one part, or one-eleventh of the estate, except that Peter shall have the wagon and plough with the harness, and likewise the old mare. MARY and GERREBRECH, 20 pounds each, and Joachem, 2 pounds for his birth-right, which they are to have before the division is made. Executors of the will, JOCHEM, DERRICK and SAMUEL.

#6-- JOCHEM GULICK (Jochem, Hendrick), son of Jochhem Gulick and Jacomyntie Van Pelt, was born in 1687, baptised Feb. 6th; m. Geertie With his brothers, Hendrick, Peter and Johannes, he settled in New Jersey about 1720. The brothers mentioned above left wills which are recorded in the office of the Secretary of State, Trenton, NEW Jersey, in which are mentioned the names of their children.

In 1724, he, with his wife, Geertie, was a witness at the baptism of Jochem, son of his brother Johannes, in the Dutch Church at New Brunswick, N.J., and was one of the executors of his brother, who died in 1731. The date of his death is not known, and he evidently left no will. Fortunately his eldest son, Jochem, who died about 1784 without children, left a will, in which he mentions the names of his brothers, JOHN, JACOB and SAMUEL, and sisters, JACOMYNTIE HOAGLAND, CATALINTIE VAN ARSDALE, and MARIA QUICK, making a complete record of the sons and daughters of the four brothers. His children were:

JOCHEM probably settled in New Jersey. A deed is on record in the office of Secy. of State at Trenton, dated 1747, given by JOCHEM GULICK of New Windsor, Middlesex County, Province of New Jersey and Elenor his wife, to COERT VOORHEES of Ten-Mile-Run in the County of Somerset of a certain parcel of land lying between the ~~the~~ Millstone River and Assanpink Brook, - being a part of a 500 acre tract bought of NICOLAS STEVEN S in 1741, supposed to be this Jochem, but possibly may have been the oldest son of his brother Hendrick, of the same name

#7 PETER GULICK, son of Jochem Gulick and Jacomyntie Van Pelt, was born in Gravesend, Long Island, Sept. 4, 1689, baptized Sept. 22, 1689. He married EVA, Daughter of Fernandus Van Sicklen, whose sister, married his brother JOHANNES. (Another daughter of Fernandus Van Sicklen married Christopher Emans, who in his will, recorded in New York, Oct. 5, 1770 mentions the name of his brother-in-law, Peter Gulick, "and his "sister-in-law, Rense Gulick".) He left Gravesend and settled in New Jersey about 1720. His will is dated Somerset Co., N.J., Aug. 31, 1774. He died soon after that date, eighty five years of age. His will recorded Jan. 26, 1775. He had fourteen children, thirteen of whom were living at the time of his death.

His children were:

JOHANNES GULICK, youngest son of JOCKEM GULICK and JACOMYNTIE VAN FELT was born about 1695 in Gravesend on Long Island. At the date of his father's will (Dec. 17, 1711) he was not yet twenty years of age.

He married about 1722, RENSIE, daughter of Fernandus Van Sicklen. In his will, dated Rocky Hill, Somerset County, N.J., March 24, 1730/31, he mentions the names of wife RANSHA and five children, viz: Jochem, Jacomyntie, Fernandus, John and Minnah. He died prior to 1733, and his widow soon after married SAMUEL GULICK, a son of HENDRICK, and had a son, Hendrick, baptized Oct. 16, 1734, in New York, and who died in Hunterdon County in 1798, leaving a family of eight children. See will recorded May 2, 1798. A sister of RENSIE VAN SICKLEN married CHRISTOPHER EMANS, who in his will, recorded in New York Oct. 5, 1770, mentions the name of his sister-in-law "RANSE GULICK", leaving no doubt of the family connection.

He resided in Somerset Co., and in 1727 purchased of Henry Harrison a tract of land containing 220 acres, for which he paid 440 pounds, described as follows: "All that plantation and meadow which he, the said Henry Harrison, now dwelleth on in the County of Somerset, province of New Jersey, at a place called Rockihill, joining up on Millstone River, bounded west by Millstone River, North by W. Bradford's land, East by Williamson's land, and South by the land of John Stevens." At the time of this purchase he was a resident of Somerset County, as appears by the deed, which is recorded on page 113, Lib. 25 in office of Secy. of State. This deed was not put on record until July, 1753, when other deeds given by the heirs of Johannes were recorded.

At the time of his death, JOCHEM, the eldest son was but ten years of age, and the widow, after her marriage with SAMUEL GULICK? probably remained on the place for some time, and a few years

prior to 1751 removed to Hunterdon County, taking her children with her, except possibly JOCHEM, who may have remained on the farm in Somerset County. The estate seems to have been divided about 1751, as at that time the children were all of age, and a deed was made and recorded, signed by the several heirs. As the name of FERNANDUS does not appear on this deed, it is supposed that he was not then living.

The following extract is from a deed dated Nov. 1, 1751.

"JOCHEM GULICK, eldest son and heir at law of JOHANNES GULICK late of Griggstown, County of Somerset, province of New Jersey, deceased. JOHN and MINNE, other sons of the said JOHANNES, deceased, of the first part, and MARTIN ARMSTRONG of Griggstown in the said county of the other part." For 350 pounds the party of the first part conveys to the party of the second part 100 acres "being a tract of land which the said JOHANNES, father of said JOCHEM, JOHN and MINNE did purchase of Henry Harrison."

The following is from a deed dated Oct. 5, 1752.

SAMUEL GULICK and RANTSHA, his wife, JOHN GULICK and MAGDALEN, his wife, and MINNAH GULICK, all of the Township of Amwell, County of Hunterdon, province of New Jersey, for a good and valuable consideration "convey to JOHN STEVENS, all that tract of land (with certain reservations) in the County of Somerset on the westerly side of Millstone River which JOHANNES GULICK, deceased, the former husband of the said RANSHA, and father of the said JOHN and MINNAH GULICK, purchased of Henry Harrison by deed of Feb. 1727."

From a deed dated Oct. 12, 1752. "JOCHEM GULICK of the Corporation of North Brunswick, County of Middle sex, province of N.J. and Rebecca his wife, of the first part, and JOHN STEVENS of the city

New York, party of the second part, in consideration of the payment of £ 450.3.4, the party of the first part conveys to the party of the second part, all that certain tract or parcel of land (here follows description, reserving certain parts already sold) which JOHANNES GULICK, deceased father of the said JOCHEM GULICK formerly purchased of Henry Harrison, deceased, lying near Rocky Hill." John Stevens, the purchaser of this tract of land, was the grandfather of Edwin A. Stevens, late of Hoboken. He resided at one time in Hunterdon Co., and owned large tracts of land in that part of New Jersey.

FERNANDUS VAN SICKLEN, the father-in-law of Johannes Gulick, was the son of FERNANDUS, the emigrant, whose wife EVE was the daughter of ANTHONY JANSEN VAN SALEE, who before coming to this country, lived for a time at Salee or Fez, a seaport town under Turkish rule, on the coast of Africa, and at that time said to be a resort for pirate vessels. Anthony Jansen was known at Gravesend as the "Turk" and the farm on which he lived was referred to on the records of Gravesend as "Turk's Plantation".

A few years since (about 1886) at a sale of the household goods of JOACHIM RULE, deceased, a descendant of Johannes Gulick, a lot of old books was sold for a trifling sum, one of which attracted the buyer's attention by the strange characters it contained. On submitting it to an expert, it was declared to be the Koran in the Arabic language, and of quite an old date. It is said that the purchaser ~~XXXXX~~ (Richard Johnson of Kingston, N.J.) sold it to a book collector in Philadelphia for \$100. A tradition (for a long time unexplained) to the effect that one of the ancestors of the JOHANNES GULICK branch of the family was

a Turk seems now to be accounted for by the fact that that ancestor Anthony Jansen Van Salee, a Dutchman of Long Island known there as the "Turk". At this sale was a brass pan and other odd things said at the time by an aged member of the family to have been carefully kept and handed down as family relics, were sold for a trifling sum. The pan appeared to be a brazier of a peculiar pattern, unlike anything made in this country or Holland. No trace can be found of the Koran sold to the book collector; the brass pan is in the possession of Robert Bayles, the compiler of this family history.

Snell, it states that Joachim Gulick lived not far from Kingston, N.J., and that he married a lady named Ben Ami of Turkish origin, and a Mohammedan, - at least they once had a copy of the Koran in the house. From another source the story goes that the Sultan wanted Ben Ami for his harem, and her father gave her to Joachim Gulick for his wife, if he would bring her to America. Mr. Robert Bayles' version ~~XXXXXX~~ is on doubt the correct one, of Turkish articles found in the Gulick family.)

About the year 1932 a copy of the same work was filed with the Institute of American Genealogy at Chicago, Ill., by Lena G. Hewitt, later Mrs. R. R. Barrett, of Santa Ana, Calif.

The above two copies were chart-like in form and did not contain much needed information, and no references as to source of information.

The work of Helen Gulick Huntley has added many dates, places of ~~residence~~ habitation, war records and in many instances have carried the line on down to date, and has given references.

None of this was compiled by Hattie or Olive Gulick or Sadie or Alice Gulick.

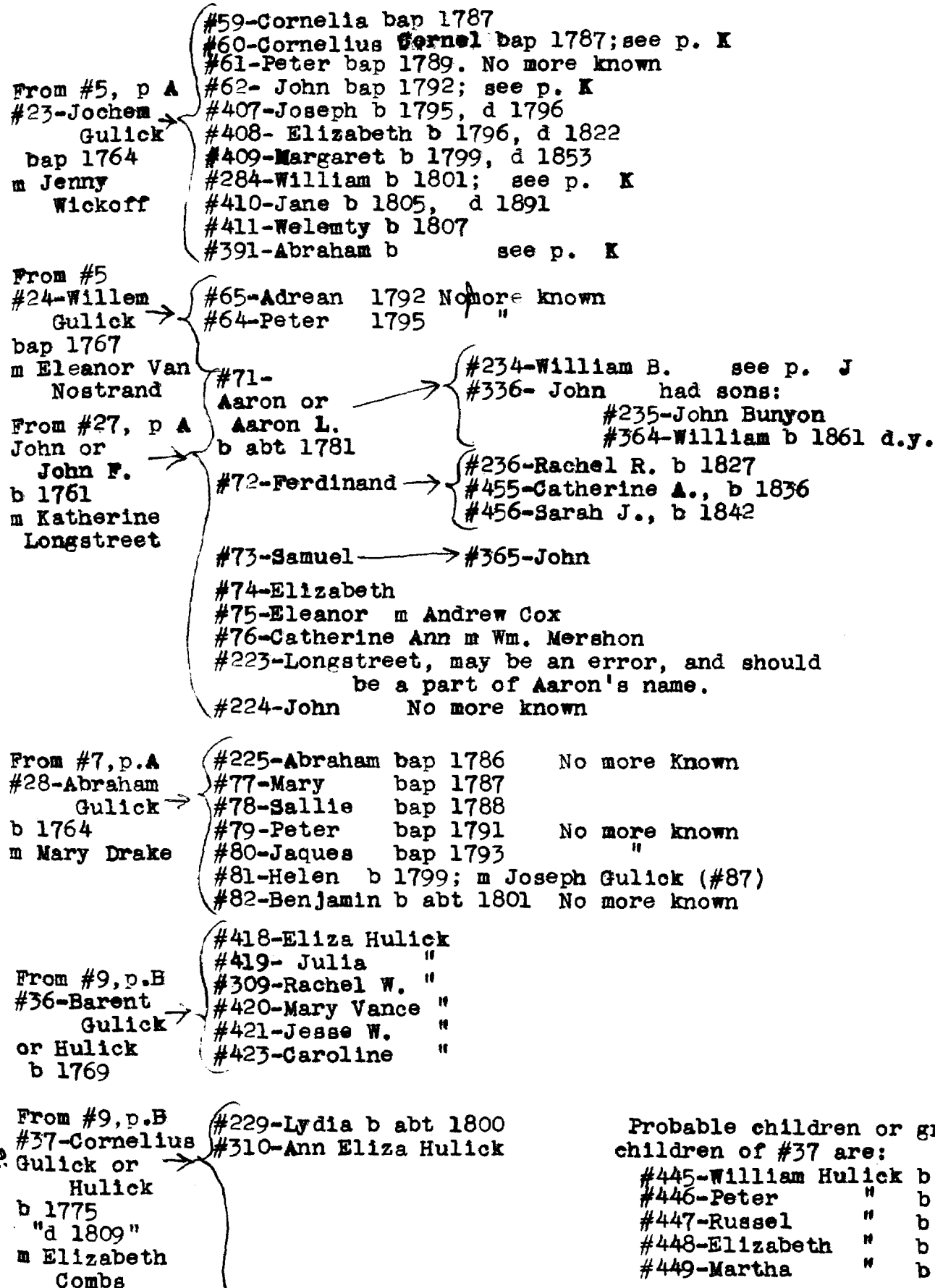
