THE GORHAMS OF NORTH CAROLINA

It is the purpose of this article to present a genealogy of the Gorham family of North Carolina, a branch of the New England Gorhams whose immigrant ancestor was Capt. John¹ Gorham of the Plymouth Colony. Capt. John¹ Gorham was baptized at Benefield, Northamptonshire, England, 28 Jan. 1620/1, the son of Ralph Gorham and the grandson of James Gorham. He lived at Plymouth, Marshfield, Yarmouth, and Barnstable in the Plymouth Colony in New England, and died of fever at Swansea in the Plymouth Colony, while serving as a captain in King Philip's War. He was buried at Swansea 5 Feb. 1675/6. He married, in 1643, Desire Howland, eldest daughter of John Howland, the Pilgrim, who came to New England in the Mayflower in 1620, and his wife, Elizabeth (Tilley) Howland, who also came in the Mayflower with her father, John Tilley, and his wife. Desire (Howland) Gorham survived her husband and died at Barnstable 13 Oct. 1683.

The founder of the North Carolina branch of the New England Gorhams was Col. James Gorham, a great-great-grandson of Capt. John¹ and Desire (Howland) Gorham, from whom he was descended through James,² who was born at Marshfield 28 Apr. 1650, married at Barnstable, 24 Feb. 1673/4, Hannah Huckins (who survived her husband and died 13 Feb. 1727/8, aged 74, daughter of Thomas Huckins of Barnstable), and died at Barnstable between 4 Nov. 1707, when his will was dated, and 7 Jan. 1707/8, when it was proved, having been in 1703 the richest man in that town, James,³ who was born at Barnstable 6 Mar. 1676/7, married, 29 Sept. 1707, Mary Joyce (who was born at Yarmouth 19 Sept. 1680 and survived her husband, daughter of Hosea Joyce of Yarmouth and his second wife, Elizabeth (Chipman) Joyce*), and died 10 Sept. 1718, and Capt. Isaac,⁴ his father, who was baptized at Barnstable (by that time included, with the other towns of the Plymouth Colony, in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay) 17 Apr. 1715, married at Barnstable, 2 Sept. 1742, as his second wife, Mary Cobb, daughter of Gershom and Hannah (Davis) Cobb of Barnstable, and died in Scotland in Jan. 1753.† Mary Cobb, the mother of Col. James⁵ Gorham, was born at Barnstable 14 June 1721 and married secondly, 3 Feb. 1756/7, James Churchill. As the Widow Churchill she was living in the Gorham house at Barnstable as late as 1804, as is proved by the will of her son, Col. James Gorham of North Carolina. With this son, who is given as No. 1 in the following genealogy, the history of the North Carolina Gorhams begins. I

^{*}Elizabeth Chipman, second wife of Hosea Joyce, was born at Plymouth 24 June 1647 and was baptized at Barnstable 18 Aug. 1650, the eldest child of Elder John and Hope (Howland) Chipman. Her mother was a sister of Desire Howland, who married Capt. John Gorham. Elizabeth (Chipman) Joyce survived her husband, who died in Feb. 1712.

In the compilation of this article much information has been derived from the records found in two family Bibles, copies of which are given in the Addenda at the end of the genealogy. The first of these Bibles is the family Bible of Dr. John Churchille Gorham (vide infra, No. 2) of Pitt County, N. C., and the other is the family Bible of Maj. Augustus Marion Lewis, who married Sarah Matilda Gorham (vide infra, No. 2, vi), daughter of Dr. John Churchill Gorham. Both of these Bibles are now in the possession of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of North Carolina, having been presented to it by Mrs. Frances Jane (Lewis) Bassett (vide infra, No. 2, vi, 2), daughter of Mrs. Sarah Matilda (Gorham) Lewis. A few other records have been found in another family Bible, and a great amount of data has been secured from living members of the Gorham family. The destruction by fire of the public records of Pitt County prior to 1856 has made it impossible to present a complete history of the early Gorham families of that part of the State.

1. Col. James Gorham (Capt. Isaac, James, James, Capt. John), of Pitt County, N. C., baptized at Barnstable, Mass., Aug. 1745, died on or after 24 Dec. 1804, the date of his will. He married first, in Massachusetts, Mary Baker, widow, by whom he had no children. She died before he migrated to North Carolina. He married secondly, in North Carolina, about 1792, Mrs. Sarah (Davis) McClure, widow, born 4 Jan. 1757, died 15 Aug. 1820, daughter of James Davis of New Bern, who was known as the father of printing in North Carolina, having served thirty-three years as public printer there and having filled many Colonial, State, and town offices during his life.

By the will of his father, Capt. Isaac Gorham, made in 1751, James⁵ Gorham, then only about eight years old, was to receive the family homestead in Barnstable, Mass., when he became of age, subject to the life interest of his mother, Mrs. Mary (Cobb) Gorham, afterwards the wife and widow of James Churchill, in the premises.† The house in Barnstable was built about 1700.

In the Revolution James⁵ Gorham was active in North Carolina, both in military and in civil positions. In 1775 he was chairman of the Committee of Safety of Pitt County, and served on the committee for the relief of the town of Boston, Mass., and the committee appointed by Congress for the purchase of firearms. He was a member of the Provincial Congress at New Bern and at Hillsboro. In this same year Congress appointed him major, and he served during the Revolutionary War, attaining the rank of colonel. He was a member of the Great Congress in Halifax County, in 1776, and participated in framing the constitution of the State. He was appointed to various other committees, and served his county, State,

and country with honor and faithfulness. In 1778, 1779, 1781, and

1782 he was a member of the North Carolina Legislature.

After the War Colonel Gorham engaged in the shipping business at New Bern, his vessels sailing between England, Nassau in the Bahamas, and the ports of North Carolina, especially Washington. He exported lumber and pine products, and imported general merchandise. He built two ships of native material in eastern North Carolina, and used them in his trade. At the time of the troubles with France, in the administration of President John Adams, some of his vessels were captured by French privateers. He succeeded in acquiring considerable wealth, and owned large tracts of land and a number of slaves. All the records point to a life of plenty and lavishment in those early days.

In his will, dated 24 Dec. 1804, Col. James Gorham directs "That at the death of my mother now living in Barnstable, Mass. that my executors sell my property there and apply the money to the use of my children." He names his wife Sarah and his children John Churchill, Edwin, Penelope, and Franklyn Gorham; and he appoints as executors William Gorham and his son Franklyn.*

Colonel Gorham and his wife are buried at Strawberry Hill, his

old farm home, on the Tar River in Pitt County.
