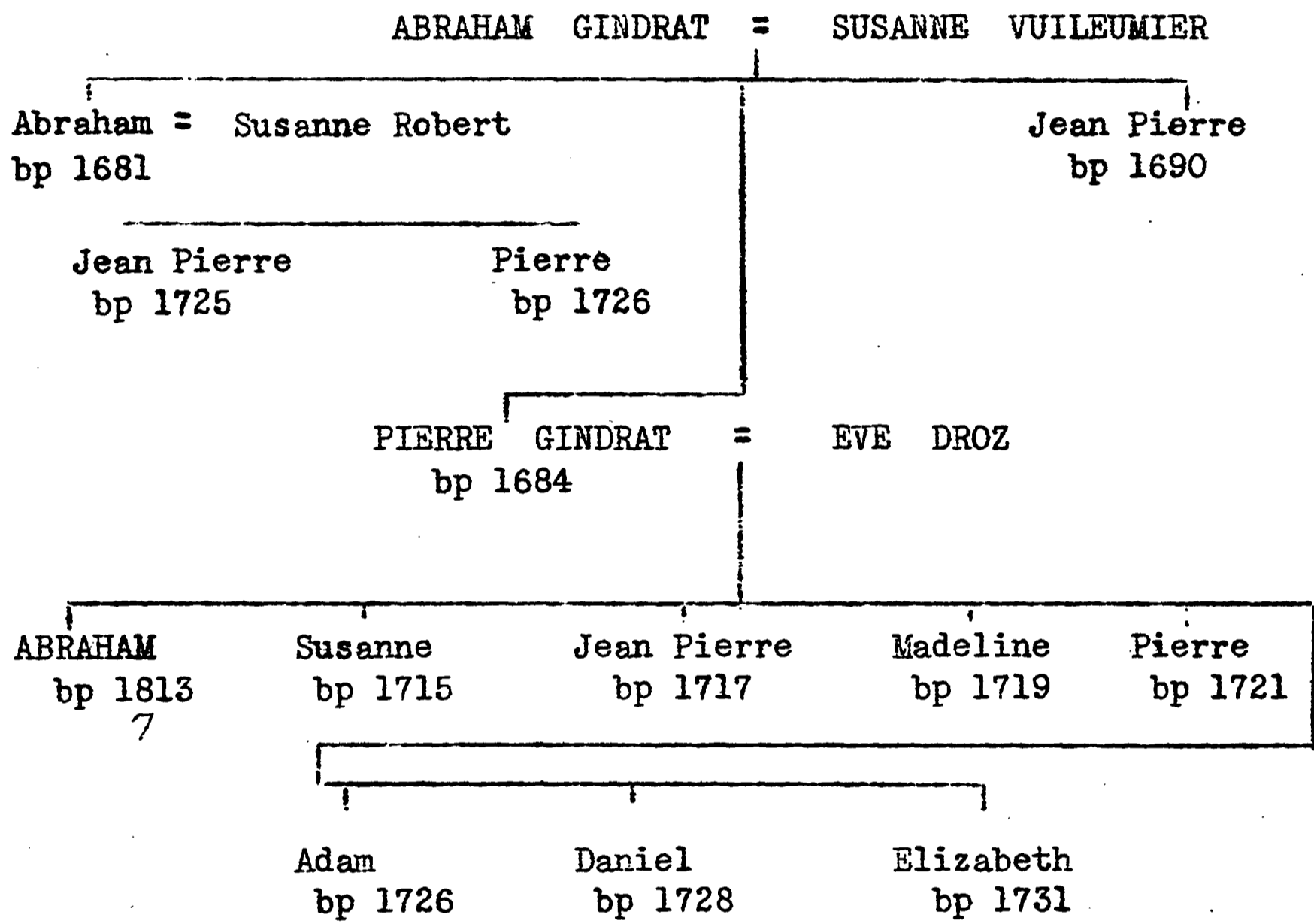

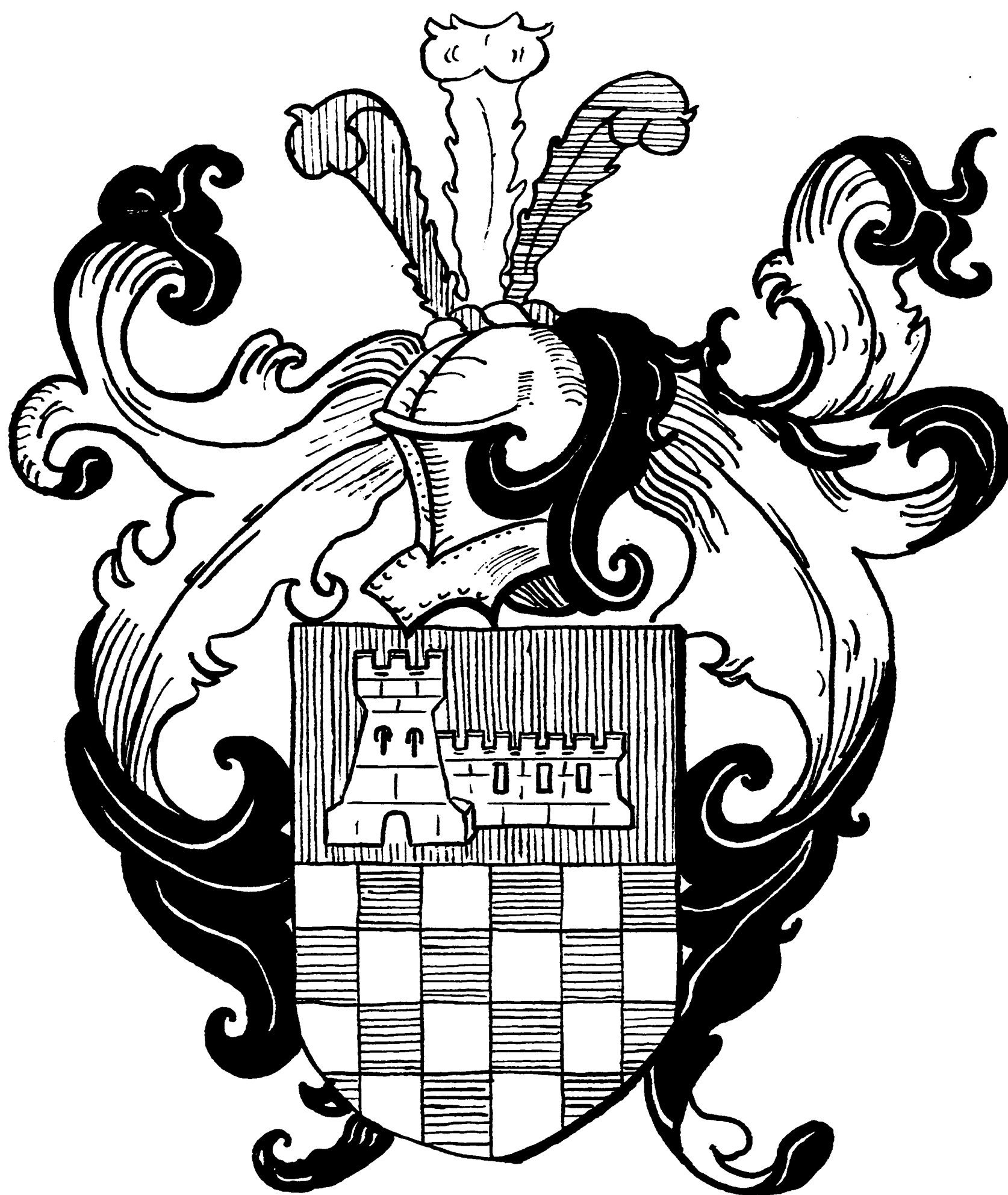

Born in the Canton of Berne, Switzerland, baptized in 1713. He was one of the immigrants of John Pury's colony and arrived in South Carolina in 1732-1735. There is some mention that he had a brother, Pierre, who also came to America at the same time. The records do not disclose any mention of any one of the name except Abraham in the early days and this tradition cannot be verified.

The earliest definite record of Abraham is that of a grant of land containing fifty acres located in Purysburg, Granville County, South Carolina and dated 16 September 1738 and under the name of ABRAHAM JINDRA. ( Land Records, Columbia, S.C., also South Carolina Historical

& Genealogical Magazine, x, 215) This is the date of recording and the land may have been awarded him at an earlier date. As he was only granted fifty acres it would appear that he was not married at that date. He married prior to 1739 Susanne Marguerite, the daughter of Abraham TALLET. The said Abraham Tallet had a daughter, Marianne, who married one Stephen Vegneur, and also a daughter, Catherine, who married one Morigin and was a widow in 1759.

There follows this deed a Release in Full ..... Received the day & year written of the within secured John Bourquin the sum of Fifteen shillings current money of South Carolina in being the full consideration money within mentioned and I the said John Bourquin oblige myself to pay 40 pounds ..... that the said lands one to the King for Quit Rents, etc. ( Book ZZ, fol. 198) He made his will as follows:

In the name of God Amen- I Abraham Gindra, Inhabitant of St. Peters parish being sickly and weak, but of Good sound mind Memory and understanding thanks be to almighty God, but considering with myself the uncertainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, do publish & declare my Last Will and Testament in the manner and form following, viz.:

My soul I commit in the hands of Almighty God My body I commit to the Earth to be interred therein.

Primo: I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Susanna Marguerite



He died before June 1767 and his will was probated 4 June 1767.  
Susanne Marguerite was living in 1767 and date of her death is not known.

Subsequent records do not show any mention of the three daughters nor son Louis.

2 DANIEL HENRY (2) GINDRAT

(Abraham l.) Born Purysburg, South Carolina circa 1739. (This date is based on his land grant 1764 when he was 21 years or more.)

While he is called Daniel Henry in his father's will he appears to have discarded the "Daniel" and is hence forward recorded as "Henry Gindrat."

He applied for land and a Certificate of Survey dated 13 September 1764 was issued to him and grant issued 18 January 1765. He entered abstract of title to one hundred acres of land 27 February 1765, Saint Peters Parish, Granville County. ( Land Records Memo Bk 6, fol. 382)

He married (1) Mary May, she died prior to 1780 and he married (2) Dorcas Williams, widow, a daughter of William Stafford and said to be cousins. The following records are herewith inserted to show that he had changed his name, etc.

Henry Gindrat furnished provisions to Continental and Militia 1778-1779 and 1782. ( Stub Entries to Indents, Q, 483.)

Henry Gindrat, Lieutenant in Militia. ( Stub Entries ti Indents, U, 641)

He was a Justice of the Peace in 1783, see deed under Abraham Gindrat.

They moved to Bryan County, Georgia in 1790's where he owned a plantation near Sister's Ferry and where he died January or February, 1801.

Dorcas did not survive him. Both are buried on this plantation. Three children died in infancy.

3 ABRAHAM HENRY (2) GINDRAT

( Abraham 1.) Born Purysburg, South Carolina circa 1741. He is called "Abraham Henry" in his father's will, he discarded the Henry and is subsequently recorded as "Abraham Gindrat." He applied for land and a Certificate of Survey dated 12 October 1764 was issued to him, grant issued 18 January 1765, he entered abstract of title to 250 acres of land near Purysburg, Granville County 18 January 1765. ( Land Records Memo bk. 6,382.) The following deeds are recorded in order to show some of the names therein.

Governor now state on Oct. 12, 1770 did obtain Grant now duly Recorded for 150 acres of Land Butting to the South Westward on land then laid out for the said John Grimball ( but lost by a prior grant of Francis Pelot late Minister decsd containing 700 acres which also included about 50 acres of sd tract of 150 acres so granted to the said George Sanders so that the remainder thereof is about 100 acres) and also on vacant ..... And whereas John Harvey under the hand of the said Hon. Wm Bull 3d Nov. 1770 did obtain a grant for 3000 acres adjoining the said tract of 150 acres and bounded on the North West and South Eastwardly on land formerly granted to Hugh Bryan, now said to belong to Dr. James Cuthbert ..... sides on the said 700 acres of Land of the sd Rev. Francis Pelot decsd- and whereas the sd Geo. Sanders & the said John Harvey did release for the consideration of therein mentioned two tracts of 150 acres & 300 acres to Elias Robert his heirs ..... did bargain, sell, etc. the said lands unto John Grimball ..... the said John Grimball & Elizabeth his wife for the sum of 600 pounds current money... delivering of these presents by him Abm Gindrat well & truly paid.....

He served as a soldier in the Revolution. " 21 June 1785 to Mr. Abra-  
Gindrat for 16-14-3 pounds for 133 days duty 1781-1782. ( Stub Entries to  
Indents, S, 561.)

18 Aug. 1785 to Mr. Abraham Gindrat 20 pounds sterling for a mare im-  
pressed in the service of the State in 1781. ( Stub Entries to Indents  
V, 489.)

He was deceased prior to 21 June 1785 as the above accounts for his  
service, etc. was receipted for in Full by John Cook, Executor.

There is no evidence he ever married.

## 4 ABRAHAM (3) GINDRAT

( Henry 2, Abraham 1.) Born Purysburg, South Carolina in 1764. He moved to Bryan County, Georgia prior to 1786. Records of Bryan County, Georgia show "Sept. 1786 Abraham Gindrat of Bryan County in a suit against Paul H. Wilkins." He married 17 March 1803 Barbara, daughter of William Clark and Barbara McKay, born Georgia circa 1772 and widow of William Clark, not related. She was owner of a plantation given her by her grandfather Captain James McKay. In March 1807 there is another suit "Abraham Gindrat, executor of William Clark versus Rebecca and Henry Wood, executors of estate of Henry Wood, Senior." He was a Justice of the Inferior Court. In 1810 Samuel Dows and his wife Harriet petition the Court for a part of 100 acres of land, estate of Rebecca, widow of Thomas Day, and sister to said Harriet, witnessed by Luke Mann and signed by

A. GINDRAT

Justice Inferior Court

There is a tradition that there were thirteen children in this family, but from the date of marriage and date of death of Abraham Gindrat it is quite evident some of the thirteen are Clark and not Gindrat children.

There were some four or five Gindrat children all of whom died in infancy except as given below. Abraham Gindrat died in 1811 and was buried on his plantation, Barbara survived him some years but appears to have been deceased before 1820. No record of Clark children.

## 5 JOHN (3) GINDRAT

(Henry 2, Abraham 1.) Born Purysburg, South Carolina, 29 May 1777. Moved to Bryan County, Georgia with his parents where he married (1) prior to 1804 Margaret ....., they resided some years in Chat-ham County, Georgia where she died about 1808, he then moved to Rich-mond County, Georgia where he married (2) at Augusta, Georgia, Sarah, the daughter of Captain Ezekiel Stallings and Ann L., his wife, born Georgia 9 June 1794.

On 24 January 1812 the estate of Ezekiel Stallings was administered in Columbia County, Georgia. On 7th September 1812 the estate of Ann L. Stallings was administered by Isabella Clarke and John H. Mann. Returns 1812 show bill for board for Henrietta Stallings. On 22 September 1813 is division of estates of Captain Ezekiel Stallings and Ann L. Stallings, widow of said Ezekiel, viz.: Isabella Clarke one fifth in her mother's portion; John H. Mann in right of his wife; John Gindrat in right of his wife; Charlotte and Henrietta Stallings, both under age. On 7th December 1818 he was administrator to estate of Rhoda Gilliland, deceased; on the back of this instrument is written; " See Susan R. Gilliland's Receipt to administrator." Minutes of the Court June 1819 he was authorized to sell two slaves of estate of Rhoda Gilliland. All records in Richmond County, Ga.

They moved to Montgomery County, Alabama in 1822-23 where he was grant-ed land on Norman Bridge and Woodly Roads where he built a home. He af-terwards built the first brick house in Montgomery at the intersection

of Jefferson and Court Streets. He was one of the organizers and the first President of the State bank. The first Sunday School was opened in March 1824 and was held in the school house of Cornelius Buck, situated on the present site of the Court Street Methodist church, John Gindrat was superintendant.

In 1825 on the visit of General Lafayette we learn from newspaper of the date ..... " The reunion between him ( Lafayette) and John Caffey, Sr., Isaac Landale, John Griffin, Robert Ware, Sr., and other revolutionary soldiers was truly affecting ..... General Lafayette retired from the ball room at 11 o'clock and spent his last hour in the town at the residence of John Gindrat."

In 1828 he executed a deed of trust to Andrew Murray, of New York City conveying all his real estate, slaves, etc. for the benefit of his wife and her children. Murray died in 1836 and this trust was transferred to John H. Gindrat and Philip Raiford.

He was a prime factor in the organization of the Baptist church in Montgomery, giving part of the lot on which the old First Baptist church was built. He served sometime as " Intendant of Montgomery." (Mayor). He was one of the owners of the Winter Iron Works and owned large farming interests in Macon County, Alabama where he retired to spend his last years.

He died at Franklin, Alabama 29 March 1851, Sarah survived him a short time and died 16 June 1854, both buried Oakwood cemetery Montgomery.

Forney, on 26 May 1862 endorsed by General Forney for appointment as second in command of William Boyles Battallion, appointment NOT made. On 27 August 1864 in a letter he writes to General Forney he states he has labored two years in the Engineer Department, he is Colonel and Aide de camp to Governor Watts. He signed this letter as "Superintendent." He took the Oath of Allegiance 8 May 1865 as Colonel and Aide de camp, Alabama Militia. A note on his papers on file in the War Department, Washington, is as follows: " He never held commission in Confederate States Army."

He was five feet ten inches in height, gray hair, and gray eyes, fair complexion. He died 16 October 1874, Mary was living in Montgomery in 1880 and died 3 July 1890. Both buried in Oakwood cemetery, Montgomery, Ala. They had no children,

6 LOUISA CAROLINE (4) GINDRAT

( Abraham 3, Henry 2, Abraham 1.) Born Bryan County, Georgia,  
8 April 1804. After the death of her parents she was taken to Boston,  
Massachusetts by her guardian one William B. Gray where she completed  
her education and was married 22 May 1823 to Richard James Arnold, born  
Providence, Rhode Island 5 October 1796, youngest sone of Welcome Arnold.  
They returned to the plantation at White Hall, Bryan County, Georgia  
where they resided until the outbreak of the Civil War when they went to  
Rhode Island, returning after the war when she died 15 October 1871. He  
survived her a few years and died 10 March 1873.

#### 7 HENRY (4) GINDRAT

( John 3, Henry 2, Abraham 1.) Born Bryan County, Georgia in 1804 near Sister's Ferry. Resided in Chatham County Georgia and moved to Richmond County, Georgia with his father about 1808. He married prior to 1829 Martha ..... ( Scott?) born Georgia in 1811. They moved to Baldwin County, Georgia where they resided November 1831 and believed to have moved to Bryan County, Georgia, before 1833 where he died in 1834.

She married (2) George Tyler Wood, born Georgia in 1812, they moved to Texas where he was a Colonel in Texas Militia 1836-1838. He was elected Governor of Texas in 1847 and served one term, the second Governor of the State. He is listed in 1850 census as " Ex governor and Farmer." Resided in Polk County where he died in 1859. Martha was living in 1860 and no subsequent record of her.

He was commissioned Surgeon in Confederate Army 17 February 1862, accepted 11 March 1862. He resigned 11 September 1862. It appears from meager records extant he was assigned to duty with a senior officer who unjustly criticized him and resigned rather than serve with him. He was appointed a Contract Surgeon March 1863 to examine recruits. After the war he continued his practice and resided in Montgomery where he died 21 October 1884, his wife died 3 January 1886. Both buried in Oakwood cemetery, Montgomery, Alabama.
