EXPLANATIONS

We have included in this book, general information on the Gage Family, its name, its earliest known origin and a summary of information on the ancient English Family.

The principal genealogical work on the family is entitled "Notes on various branches of the Gage-Gaige families, also Biographical sketches" Sth edition 1943 compiled by the Rev.Walker Miller Gage. The Rev.Mr. Gage died at his home in Red Bluff, California in 1950. He spent nearly thirty years in getting the material together. A copy of this book which is a carbon copy of an original is on file in the New York Public Library, 5th Avenue and 42nd Street, New York City, their Class number APV plus sign GAGE. It is bound in hard covers. It is the only known copy on file in any library in the United States.

THE LARGER FAMILIES ARE REPRESENTED AS FOLLOWS:

1. John Gage of Ipswich, Mass 1604:1673. Appeared in America about 1630

2. Thomas Gage of Yarmouth, Mass ?1625:7/1695. Appeared in America about 1648

3. Thomas Gage of Freetown, Mass, born about 1675-80 dicd 1737-38. Represented the town of Freetown, Mass in the general court in 1722. He is the probable father of William Gage of the so-called William Gage of Freetown, Mass family.
4. Robert Gage of Weston, Mass 1685 Died in Watertown, Mass 1739

5. A Mr. Gage of a Canadian branch whose son was named William born 1744. The son lived in Stoney Croek, Ontario; , Canada.

6. A?Robert Gage from Coloraine, County Antrim, Ireland. He remained in Ireland. His sons Matthew, John and James came to America in 1780. A nephew John, son of Robert Gage, a brother of Matthew, John and James appeared in Union S.C. in July 1803. This is the so-colled "Gage Family of the South"

7. Robert Gage of Londonderry, Ireland. His son born 5/12/1808 died 1864. Appeared in Mauch Chunk, Carbon County Pa and later in Fort Wayne Indiana.

8. Thomas Gage of Woodbridge N.J. died 1703. He is shown as the founder of a separate family but has since been identified as a son of Jonathan Gage of the John Gage of Ipswich, Mass Family.

9. A North Carolina Family, first appearing in the census of 1790 in Rutherford County. The family and its descendants appeared in Tennessee, Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas. Very little of this family was known when Mr. Gage's book was put out. Much information has since been developed, but no proven connection with any of the preceding mentioned families has ever been determined. This compilation of records and studies is the first attempt to put any record of the North Carolina family into book form. Another volume is now in preparation . It will deal with all of the others on which proliminary studies are set forth herein and with many miscellaneous families as well. It is my hope that ultimately a definite connection can be established with one of the known carlier families.

TO ARRIVE AT A RECORD

The genealogical listings in this book, unless otherwise explained, start with the parents. Under that heading is a listing of the children. The father is given a number and that is known as a family number. Each child is also given a number. As the children establish families of their own, the childs number becomes its family number. The process keeps repeating itself.

To locate your individual record, check the index pages at the back of the book. There may be more than one listing of the name. However, if you are listed, you should be able to identify yourself. When you have established proper identification, proceed as follows:

Proceding generations are determined by reference to the individually numbered person--(Child and Parents)

Succeeding generations are determined by reference to the individually numbered person(Parents and child)

GAGE

The name Gage has its history. One authority claims the name is derived from an official position: "Gager or Gauger". His office was to attend to the King's revenue at the seaport and with the measurement of all liquids such as oil, wine and honey. Improbable that the name came from this source.

Another authority says Gage is a Scandanavian name which means a pledged warrior, one to fight. Normans were Scandanavians, hence the word might have become a name, as the word or name signifies pledged warrior, one to fight, and we must compare it with other things we know to be distinctivelly Gage. Take the motto "Courage without fear". Does this not confirm the Norman source? Then the crest is considered. It is not a mack harmless creature but the ram noted for its fighting qualities and proclivities. Norman in blood and Norman in name.

Still another authority claims Gage for Gaughy - Normandy. The first record found in 1180 and makes mention of Ralph de Gaughy. In 1165 Ralph de Gaughi or Gaugi held a fief in Northumberland which he acquired by marriage. Robert de Gaughi was Baron of Siesmouth, Northumberland 1165 and had a brother Roger de Gaughi to whom King John 1205 committed the custody of Argentan Castle and Forest. The name Gaughy is now held by the Viscount's Gage of Firle, Sussex and Baronet Gage of Hengreve, Suffolk. Lesire de Gaughi was at the bettle of Hastings 1066.

Coat of Arms

The coat-of-Arms of the Ancient Family of Gage - England - to which almost, if not all of the American Families of that name are related, is described as follows:

ARMS: "Quarterly, first and fourth, per saltire, azure and argent, A saltire gules for Gage: Second and Third, azure, the sun in splandor or for St. Clerc"

CREST: "A run, statentiar gentarmed and ungule" or SUPPORTERS: Two grey hounds, tenno, each gorged with a coronet,

composed of fleur-de-lis, or MOTTO: Courage sans pour "Courage without fear" Reference: Burkes Peerage and Baronetage)

Spelling

The name Gage is found in many forms of spelling-according to time and place, that is Gage-Gaige-Gauge-Gaughi-Gaige-Gach (German), the latter three being the earlier forms.

THE ENGLISH FAMILY OF GAGE

By the use of material found in a folder obtained in England in 1902 by Dr. W.B. Mayer an associate of Dr.Lucius Gaston Gager records set forth in "Burke's Pecrage and Baronetage" and from other reliable sources, we have prepared a summary which we believe will be of great value to those interested in the Gage Family.

The 6th Viscount Gage (Sir Henry Rainald Gage, K.C.V.O.) of Castle Island, County Kerry; Baron Gage of Castlebar, County Mayo in Ircland; Baron Gage of High Meadow, County Gloucester, in Great Britain and a Baronct; D.L. County Sussex, J.P. and C.C.E. Sussex(Chm 1955-58) Pres.Nat Fed of Housing Societies, a Lord-in-Waitaing to H.M.King George V 1924-29 and 1931-36 to H.M. King Edward VIII in 1936 and to H.M. King George VI from 1937-39.Parl.Priv. Sec(unpaid) to Sec. of State for India 1924-29.Capt.Res of Offrs., late Coldstream Guards, formerly 5th battalion Royal Sussex Regiment; served in World War 1 from 1914 (wounded) and in World War II 1939-45., Created K.C.V.O. 1939; born 30 December 1895: succeeded his father as 6th Viscount1912: M: 26 Feb.1931 Hon, Alexandra ImogeneClair Grenfell, younger daughter of 1st and kast Baron Desberough.

JOHN GAGE(only son of John Gage of Circnester) M: Joan, dau.and
co-heir of John Sudgrove of Sudgrove-in-Miserder, county Gloucester and died about 1440, when he was succeeded by his son:

SIR JOHN GAGE, Kt. of Burstowe, Surrey, who acquired that seat as well as Penshurst, in Kent, and considerable estates in Sussex and county Buckingham, with his wife Eleahor, daughter and co-heir of Thomas St. Clerc (only son of Sir Philip St. Clere, Knight of Igtham, by Margaret, sole heir of Sir Nicholas de Levayne, Knight of Burstowe, and grandson of Sir Philip St. Clere, Knight, M.P. Sussex in 1377). He died 30 Sept 1486, leaving two sons, of whom John was ancester of the Gages of Rushton, County Northampton, whilst the elder,

WILLIAM GAGE, succeeded to Burstowe, Penshurst, afterwards so celebrated as the property of the Sidney's, and the theme of Waller's verse, being sold this William formed a seat, where his heirs still reside, at West Firle, and the Manor of Heighton St. Clere, which had come to his mother's family by the marriage of John de St 'Clere(who died 1327) with Isolda, sole heir of Thomas de Aldhan, of Ightham and Aldham, in Kent. Mr. Gag married: Agnes, sister of John Bolney of Bolney in Sussex, M.P. for that county 1459 and died 1496, when he was succeeded at Firle by his son,

SPR JOHN GAGE, K.G. of Firle, Sussex, a distinguished soldier and atatesman whose services are thus detailed in an ancient manuscript by his third son Robert. "Sir John Gage, Knight, who was after his father's death, in ward to W. Stafford, Duke of Buckingham, and after his narriage to my mother, daughter of Sir, Richard Guldeford, was preferred by the said Duke to Henry VIII's

service, and distinguished himself at the siege of Terovene, was thereupon made Capt. of the Castle of Calais(usually called Guysnes), shortly after was sent for home and Knighted and made · of the Privy Council, Vice Chamberlain, and Captain of the Guards, few years after for services done on the borders of Scotland, at his return, was made Comptroller of the Household, and Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster in one day. In a few days after, he was made Constable of the Tower of London, and, the next St George's feast, Knight of the most noble Order of the Garter: at the winning of Bullogno (36th Henry VIII, he was in joint commission with Charles, Duke of Suffolk, Lord Lieutof his Majesty's camp; and for sundry services there with Sir Anthony Browne, Kt. Master of the Horse, was made Gen. Capt of the bands of horsemen. After the death of our Sovereign Lord Edward VI at the coming of Queen Mary, was made her Lord Chamberlain. Thus having served in all these rooms and offices truly, faithfully and painfully, from the 5th year of Queen Mary, untouched with any reproach or unfaithful'service, at this time being 77 years of age, he ended his life, in favor of his Prince, at his own house at Firle in Sussex" This eminent person married Phillippa, daughter of Sir Richard Gyldeford K.G, and had (with four daughters, Alice, M: Sir Anthony Brownc KG and Anne, M: John Thatcher of Priestshawe, in Sussex) four sons, namely:

2. John, of Bentley, in Sussex, whose son John of Wormley, Herts, M: Eleanor, widow of Sir. Thomas Baskerville, Knight and daughter of Richard Habingdon, and from this marriage descended:

Ducy who M: William Herick of Beaumanor, Co. Leicester.

John of Haling, fother of the celebrated Col.Sir Henry Gage, Knight, Governor of Oxford, so gallantly distinguished in the service of Charles I during the Civil War. He twice relieved Basing House but was slain at Cullum Bridge 7 January 1644. 4. William, died without issue.

Sir John Gage died in 1557 and was succeeded by his eldest son,

SIR EDWARD GAGE, M.B. of Firlo, Sussex. Married: Elizabeth, daughter of John Porker of Willingdon, in Sussex, and had (with six daugh, stors)

SIR THOMAS GAGE-2nd Baronet.

Here we will digress for a time to quote from the folder obtained in England in 1962 setting forth cortain facts concorning the Gage family, its seat at Firle in Sussex and conditions during the times mentioned.

FIRLE PLACE, SUSSEX, the home of Viscount and Viscountess Gage.

The architecture of Firls is of two main dates --early Tudor and Mid-18th century. At the time the 18th century extensions were made, the older part was so altered that the whole house now has a Georgian appearance. It is constructed of stone, believed to have been imported from Caen in France, and most of it is roofed in Horsham stone. A print of 1769 shows the house exactly as it is to-day; the stables were added in 1797 and the terraces at the end of the 19th century.

Firlo has been occupied continuously by the Gage family since it was originally built about 1487(probably the older part of the house was built during the lifetime of John Gage who married: Elinor StClere) It contains a number of family portraits and other relies, some of considerable American Interest.

The entrance, half a mile from the house is on the main Lewes-Eastbourne road. Transportation can be had from London, Brighton atc to Lewes station (5 miles) and Glynde Station (2 miles) with The xi Service available at Lewes station.

Of Sir Edward Gage who married Elizabeth, daughter of John Parker.

He became High Sheriff of the county during the reign of Queen Mary and, in that capacity, became the instrument of the ruthless persecution of Protestants in that county, including the burning of the Lewes Martyrs.

Sir Edwards son in 1557 became M.P. for Lewes, but with the death of Queen Mary, the counter persecution of the Roman Catholics began and the Gages were themselves fined, imprisoned and sent into exile.

They managed, nevertheless, to so on living at Firle and, with the coming of the Stuarts, they enjoyed some degree of Royal Favor. During the reign of James 1st, Sir John Gage was created a Baronet and he married Lady Penelope D'Arcy, heiress of Hengrave in Suffolk, thus starting a new branch of the family. (See Sir John Gage-1st Baronet)

Now to resume from "Burkes Peerage and Baronetage"

SIR THOMAS GAGE -- 2nd Baronet of Firle, married 1635 Mary, eldest doughter and co-heir of John Chamberlain of Sharborne Castle, County Oxford. He died 7/2/1654 and was succeeded by his eldest son

SIR THOMAS GAGE-3rd Boronut, died 11/22/1660 unmarried and was succeeded by his brother.

SIR JOHN GAGE, 4th Baronet, Sheriff of Sussex 1687-88
Married: 1st Mary, daughter and sole heir of Robert Middlemore of Edgbaston, County Warwick, by Hanroetta Maria, his wife, daughter of Sir Maurice Drummond,
Married: 2nd Mary, daughter of Sir William Stanley, 1st Baronet of Hooten. Sir John died 5/27/1699 and was succeeded by his eldest son.

SIR JOHN GAGE, 5th Baronet born 1692 diod 1/1700 and was succeeded by his brother,

SIR THOMAS GAGE, 6th Baronet, who died on his travels october 1713 and was succeeded by his only surviving brother,

SIR WILLIAM GAGE,7th Beronet, bern 1695 who, conforming to the Church of England was elected 1727 to the last Parliament of George I as representative of the Town of Seaford in Sussex for which place he served until his decease. Sir William was installed a Knight of the Bath 7/17/1725 and died unmarried 5/23/1744 when his sisters Lady Shelly and Viscountess Fouconberg, became his co-heirs while the Barenetcy reverted to his cousin Thomas 1st Viscount Gage.

To again digress and quote from the folder: The Act of Settlement in 1701 enabled Sir William Gage, owner of Firle from 1713 to 1744 to conform to the Church of England and therafter life for the family became a great deal easier. Sir Willjam himself became K.B. and member for Seaford, and his heir and Kinsman Thomas Gage MP for Tewksbury was created the first Viscount Gage. It is probable that he made the extensive additions and alterations which give Firle place its present distinctive appearance.

To again resume foor "Burkes Peerage and Baronatage"

THOMAS 1st VISCOURD GAGE, F.R.S., M.P. Minchead 1717-21 and for Towksbury 1721-54 was created Baron Gage of Castlebar, Mayo and Viscount Gage of Castle Island, Kerry 9/14/1720. He married 1st 1717 Benedicta Maria Theresa (who died 7/25,1749) only daughter and heir of Benedicta Hall of High Meadow, County Gloucester, He married 2nd: 12/26/1750 Jano (nee' Godfrey) (who died 10/8/1757) widow of Henry Jermyn Bond of Bury Stedmunds by whom he had no child.

Sir'Thomas Gage died 12/21/1754 and was succeeded by his elder son,

WILITAM HALL, 2nd Viscount Gage, MP Scaford 1744-80 born 1/1/1718 created a British Peor 10/17/1780 by the title of Baron Gage of Firle in the county of Sussex.Married:2/3/1757 Elizabeth (who died 7/1/1783) sister of Sampson, Lord Yardley by whom he had an only son who died in infancy. The Viscount, thus deprived of direct descendants obtained 11/1/1790 another British Peerage as Baron Gage of High Meadow, County Gloucester, with remainder to his heir presumptive and nephew Major-General Henry Gage. His Lordship died 10/11/1791 when the Barony of Gage of Firle became extinct, and the other honors accordingly evolved on this nephew

HENRY, 3rd VISCOUNT GAGE, Major General in the Army, born 3/4/1761.Married: 12 January 1789 his cousin Susannah Maria (who
died 4/9/1821) only daughter and heir of Lt.Gen William Skinner
(by Susan, dau and co-heir of Adm Sir Peter Werren, KB of Westbury
Hents, MP for Westminster. This Henry was the eldest son of Thomas
Gage, General in the Army, Governor and Commander in Chief of his
Majesty's forces in North America at the breaking out of the
American War, who married12/8/1758 Margaret (who died 2/9/1824)
daughter of Peter Kemble, President of the Council of New Jersey
by Margaret daughter of Right Honorable Stephen Van Cortlandt

and died 4/2/1787.

Again to Digress. From the Magazine "Country Life" published in Landon in 1955

"At Firle there is a full length portrait of General Thomas Gage and his wife Margaret Kemble. In addition to this portrait there is at Firle, the original document signed by the Mayor of New York, bestowing on him the freedom of the city in 1773; also John Montresor's, beautifully executed plan of New York, surveyed in 1775 and subsequently engraved which he dedicated to Gage. General Thomas Gage was the father of the Third Viscount. From New Jersey marriage Licenses page 152 Thomas Gage, the Honorable Brigadiar General and Margaret Kemble 12/7/1758.

General Thomas Gage had two other sons:

- 2. John of Rogate, Hants, born 12/23/1767 Married 5/20 /1793 Mary (who died11/9/1864) only daughter and heir of John Milbanks by Lady Mary Watson Wentworth.
- 3. William Hall(Sir) GCB GCH a distinguished Naval Officer, a Lord of the Admiralty and Admiral of the Fleet 20 May 1862. Born 10/2/1777 died without issue 1/5/1864.

Henry, 3rd Viscount died 1/29/1808 and was succeeded by his eldest son.

HENRY HALL, 4thVISCOUNT.born 12/14/1791 died 1/20/1877 succeeded by his grandson

HENRY CHARLES, 5th Viscount Gage, born 4/2/1854 died 4/18.1912 succeeded by his son

HENRY RAINALD, the 6th and Present VISCOUNT.

THE NORTH CAROLINA GAGE FAMILY

In this compilation of genealcgical records, we have considered the family of John William Gage (usually recorded as William Gage) bern 3/2/1782 in North Carolina and his wife Rhoda Boydersten, born 12/25/1780 in Kentucky. In a Warren county record of that State dated 9/1/1806, it is stated "that Sarah Boydston gave consent for William Gage to marry her daughter Rhoda". The marriage took place in Warren County 9/4/1806. The exact date of Rhoda's death is not known but she is shown in the census of 1860 as loving with her son 103 Jonathan. She is there shown as aged 76 which is evidently in error as she, having been born in 1780 would have been at least 80 years of age at the time. Records of births and marriage are from the GAGE FAMILY BIBLE.

In early correspondence concerning the origin of the North Carolina Family, the Rev. Walker Miller Gage stated that he had never been in communication with any member of that family.

An examination of the North Carolina Federal Census of 1790 reveals additions and differences, as follows:
Aaron's name is spelled "Aron". He is also listed as being in the 14th Company.
Daniel, the two Davids, James, Lucy and Reuben are listed as being in the 11th company.

The 11th and 14th companies listed in the 1790 census indicated Militia Companies. At the time this census was taken, the mountain counties were so remete that the militia rester was the means of obtaining as accurate a list as possible of the heads to households. That is the reason that in the schedule for Kutherford County, the names are listed by companies. Such a listing is not shown for any of the North Carolina counties except the mountain counties.

Mergan District, referred to was one of the eight judicial districts of North Carolina. It comprised Burke, Lincoln, Rutherford and Wilkes Counties.

Rutherford County, N.C. dates from 1779. It was formed from Tryon and Tryon from Mecklenburg and Burke in 1779.

On Rebert Gage of the Willington District, Onslow County, it has been developed that his mame was not GAGE but SAGE. The Onslow County Historical Society of Jacksonville NC advise that book 20 page 473 record of land grants from the State Archives of North Carolina give reference to a grant of 150 acres to Robert Sage May 4, 1769.

James Gage, one of those shown in the 1790 census stated in his application for a pension that he was born in York Government(New State of New York) in Woodberry Township about 15 miles from the North River and about 60 miles from the town of New Yerk 9/9/1754. Mrs. Emma McWhorter, Town Historian for Woodbury Township at Highland Mills, Orange County, N.Y. stated that she believed he must have been born in her township as from the description he gave of about 15 miles from the North River(which is the name given to the river on the west side of Manhattan Island) but is actually the Hudson River and distance of about 60 miles from the town of New York would be about right providing the North River was applied for the name Hudson River which it probably was. She replied further that early deeds called this area "Woodbury Cleve" a distance of about 5 miles in Jength The town of Woodbury has been divided three times since 1754. Much of the time James was in the area, it was known as the Precinct of Cornwall. Nrs. McWhorter found by further search that while she had located no deeds, she did find David Gage as "Overseer of Roads" District number 24 Town of New Cornwall in 1767 and in 1771, a Jeremiah Gage "Overseer of Roads" District number 25 Town of New Cornwall. Jeremiah Gage was not in Ruther ford County in the census of 1799. However it is a known fact that on 8/9/1787 David Gage received a grant of 100 acres of land on the head of Chestnut Log branch, grant 169 Book 65 page 297 and on the same day, Jeremiah Gage received a grant of land consisting of 100 acres on Sandy Run, grant 165, Book 65, Page 296 Jeremiah is thought to have been the husband of Lucy Gage who is shown in the cengus of 1700 but this has not been proven.

From the above, it can certainly be assumed that the origin of the North Carolina family is here traced back as far as Orange County, in New York State. Now couple this with the fact that Reuben Gage who is also snown in the 1790 listing made an afficavit in 1835 and stated that he was aged 55 at the time(born 1770) and a native of New York State and the record is fairly conclusive.

One other, Aarch Gage shown in the listing of 1790 stated that he was born in the State of New Jersey 6/15/1758 and that when very young, his father moved from the State of New Jersey and settled in Rutherford County NC. Aaron is further shown in the 1790 Consus record as being in the 14th Militia Company and all of the others in the 11th Militia Company. While the Rev. Mr. Gage indicates his belief that *David Gage was the father and the others children, it is doubtful that Aaron is of the David Family. Possibly he was related.

Gage Families were not native to the State of New York. There were two principal families who came out of the New England States and settled in and about Dutchess, Ulster and Orange Counties. They were the Themas Gage of Yarmouth, Mass family and the family of William Gage of Freetown, Mass. Ultimately it will probably be proven that the North Carolina family is from one of these two families.

We will now consider a continuation of one of the David Gage Sr family lines together with records of many of the related family ies. For further general detail on other members of the North Carolina group see pages 24 to 40 inclusive

DAVID GAGE, SR.

It will be noted that the earliest land grant was made to David Gage on 10/11/1783. We quote from the Rutherford County Registry Deed Book A-D Page 382.

No. 406 State of North Carolina No. 67.To all to whom these presents shall come, GREETING, know ye that we for and in consider ation of the sum of 50 shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted, paid into our treasury by David age have given, granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said David Gage, a tract of land containing two hundred acres, lying and being in our county of Rutherford on Sandy Run of Broad River joining land of Parmars or the place where Riggs now lives, including his own improvements. Beginning at a post oak in kiggs line in the west side of Sandy Run and runs south 35,Et 30 poles to a hickory, thence N55 E 120 poles to a black oak, thence So. 35 E 72 poles to a pest oak in Thomas Raynolds line, thence with said line south 170, poles to a hickory in Canadys line thence via said line So 60 W120 poles to a pine, thence No.30 W 190 poles to a pine thence to the beginning, together with all woods

waters, mines, minerals, hereditments and appurtenances to the said land belonging or appertaining. To hold to the said David Gage, his heirs and assigns forever, yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise as our general assembly from time to time may direct, provided always that the said David Gage shall cause this grant to be registered in the Registers office of our said county of Rutherford, within twelve months from the date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect Inc testimony whereof we have caused our letters to be made patton (Patent) and our great seal to be herewith affixed. Witness, Alexander Martin, Esquire, our Governor, Capt Gen, and Commander in Chief at Hillsborough, the 11th of October in the eighth year of our independence and in the year of our Lord 1783

Following this record and that of the census of 1790, we next find a record of David as follows: We quote a "Deed of Gift" from David Gage to son Jacob Gage dated March 2, 1805 No. 97 Book 22-23 at page 431 Rutherford County Registry:

Know all men by these presents that I, David Gage of Rutherford County in N.C., WITNESS that for and in consideration of the love and good will that I bear to my son acob Gage, and divers services done for me have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto Jacob Gage and to his heirs and assigns ferever, a certain piece or parcel of land in Rutherford County aforesaid lying on Sandy including the plantation where I now live. Beginning at a post oak in Riggs old line thence So 35 30 poles to a hickory, thence No.55 E to the creek, thence down the creek as it meanders to the original old line, thence So to a Hicory thence S60 West 120 peles to a pine thence north 39 W 190 poles to a pine thence to the beginning containing 100 acres be the same more or less with all the buildings, orehards, and improvements, hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging to or in any wise appertaining to have and to holdall the above granted land and premises to him the said Jacob Gage and to his heirs and assigns forever and that the said David Gage will and shall warrant, secure and ever defend from all the lawful claims or demands of all persons and manner of persons whatsoaver. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 28th of October 1805 Signed, sealed and delivered in presence of us.

David "age did not appear in any census after 1790. It will be noted in the "Deed of Gift" which he made to his son Jacob on March 2, 1805 that it included the plantation where I now live." No other conclusion can be reached but that David Gage Sr was a member of the household of his son Jacob even before the "Dead of gift"date. and the place of residence was the fathers own home plantation.

I think we can presume that Jacob did not come into Rutherford County with the others but was a late arrival. From the wording of the "Deed of Gift" "Witness that for and in consideration of the love and good will that I bear my son Jacob Gage and divers sarvices done for me", it is quite evident that the giving was not only out of graticude for what his son Jacob had done for his father, but also but of gratitude that Jacob had come once more into the home fold.

Jacob Gage first appears in the census of 1800 Rutherford County NC in the age group 26/45 which would place the year of his birth between 1755 and 1774. One says he was born in 1755. Rutherford County Deeds-Jacob Gage in 1803 bought for 75 Pounds, 120 acres of land on south side of Sandy Run from William Green.

FURTHER EXPLANATIONS ON NAMED MEMBERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GROUP

The development of their records as well as the records of other families known to be related to them in some manner will be left to a later volume. See Pages 47 to 111 inc

Early grants of land were made to North Carolina settlers. There is no record of affidavits made by the applicants for land grants giving information as to date and place of birth or the length of residence within the state. There are on file, the warrants of survey, the surveyors plats and copies of the grants but none of these papers give any information other than the location of the land and the calls by metes and bounds.

The following grants were made to members of the Gage family prior to 1800; 6

9/28/1785 James Gage 100 acres Millstone Fork of Sandy Run Grant 136 book 58 page 152

8/9/1787 Jeremian Gage 100 acres on Sandy Run. Grant 165 book 65 Page 296

8/9/1787 David Gage 100 acres on the head of Chestnut Lag branch Grant 169 Book 65 Page 297

7/9/1794 Aaron Gage 100 acres South Fork of Sandy Run Grant 832 book 82 Page 302

12/20/1796 James Gage 200 acres Millstone Fork of Sandy Run Grant 1231 Book 91 Page 492

Jeremiah Gage did not appear in the census of 1790. It is presumed that he might have died and quite possibly he might have been the husband of Lucy Gage who appeared as a widow in 1790. Herself, three sons under 16 and one other female.

From "Frontier Life or Fifty years in Texas History and incidents by Daniel Shipman, we learn that Daniel's grandfather on his father's side and one brother and a half brother a Mr. Gage (Reuben or David) were of Welsh descent and came together to this country. This was thought to have taken place about 1750. The great-grandfather settled in North Carolina, his brother in New Jarsey. The half-brother's whereabouts were not known, However, it is believed that the family listed in the census of 1790 is actually that of the Gage half-brother; in this case David Gage

Of the males, with the exception of Aaron Gage as heretofore explained, we reach the same conclusion as did the Rev. Walker Miller Gage that apparently David Gage was the father and the others children.

Lucy Gage was born Lucy Shipman. Her father was Daniel Shipman and her mother Elizabeth Burleson. Lucy was born probably during the period 1755:1760. It is possible that Jeremiah Gage might

have been her husband. Jeremiah was granted 100 acres on Sandy Run as mentioned previously and on 9/6/1795 Lucy acquired 150 acres also on Sandy Run, by purchase. Lucy appears in the census of 1860 Rutherford County as follows: 1 10/16 and 1 under 16 males, herself (45 and over) and two females in the group 10/16. This is a conflicting record as in 1790 there were four children, 3 sons and one daughter. Then in the census of 1836 Hardiman County, Tenn she is listed as 1 15/20 male and herself in the age group 60/70 No mention of a female child. In Hardiman County, Tenn at the same time were two Williams and a John Cage, Presumably two of these were her sons. Her third son appears to be still with her. It appears throughout the record that Lucy did not remarry. The only other reference that can be found is that in the will of Daniel Shipman, Sr where he refers to his daughter Lucy as ewing 20 Pounds to Daniel Burleson and we presume this is the Lucy Gage appearing in Rutherford County in 1790 and 1800

AARON GAGE

He appears in the census of 1790 Rutherford County, N.C. as being of the 14th militia company. That listing was one of those used in determining the population schedule. Rutherford County is a mountain county and at the time of the census it was the best means of obtaining as accurate list as possible of the heads of households. We are advised that there are on file no Rutherford County maps giving fourteen districts or one as early as 1790. It is therefore quite impossible to determine just how close to the other members of the group, Aaron actually lived. All the other members in Rutherford County were listed from the 11th militia company records

We then find Aaron Gage receiving a grant of land 7/9/1794 100 acres South Fork of Sandy Run Grant 169 book 82 page 302 David Sr's grant of 10/11/1783 was on Sandy Run also. Apparently the two grants were in proximity to one another, one being on Sandy Run and the other on a fork of Sandy Run. Then we find Aaron disposing of 150 acres on the scuth fork of Sandy Run under date of 7/18/1796

After the Revolutionary War, Aaron Gage went to Warren County, Ky He was there in 1800 along with a Daniel and a John Gage. While there, his daughter Hannah married a man called "one eyed" John Smith. He was in Warren County Ky. three or four years, then in Bedford County, Tenn. Lived there two years and then to Lincoln County, Tenn. He appeared there in the census of 1820, I under 10 I 10/16 and I 45 and up males and I 10/16 and I 45 and up females. In the same census and same location there also appeared a Samuel Gage shown as I 26/45 male and I 16/26 female. This Samuel was probably a son of Aaron and could have been born according to his census age as early as 1794 when Aaron would have been 36 years of age. He was in Lincoln County Tenn, census of 1830 as Aaron Gage, male group 70/80 and one female group 60/70

After living in Lincoln County, a number of years, Aaron moved

to Perry County, Tenn where he lived several years and then moved to McNairy County, Tenn where he was a resident in 1839 when his application for a pension was filed. He was in McHairy County and remained there until 1839 or 1840. On 2/18/1840, he filed an application through the court at Fayetteville, Lincoln County to have his pension transferred to Pulaski Tenn, pension agency, giving his reasons that he had lest his wife in McMairy County, Tenn and was coming to Jincoln county to be near his daughter.

Aaron Gage might have been the progenitor of the George Washington Gage family of McNairy County, tenn, in the census of 1790 in Rutherford County No. Marry is listed, as himself, two sons under 16, his wife and one daughter. It is known that one of the daughters-Hannah, married John Smith June 2, 1800, but the names of the two sons are not known unless the Samuel Gage who appeared in the Lincoln County Tenn census for 1820 as 1, 26/45 male and 1 16/26 female along with Aaron Gage was a son of Aaron. If this were true, Samuel, could have been the father of George Washington Gage. Aaron himself could hardly have been the parent of George Washington Gage for he would have been 68 years of age when George was born. But then again, the other son of Aaron whose name is not known could have been the parent instead of Samuel. But here again Aaron is listed in Lincoln County Tenn in 1820 showing 1 under 10, 1 10/16 males and 1 10/16 female. These three addition al children might have been the children of Aaron using the maximum age of 16 they would have been born by 1885 when Aaron was 46 years of age which of course, is not impossible. The addition a al daughter in the age group 10/16 could well be the daughter who is thought to have margied Easter Westerwood, Aaren's son-in-law at whose home Aaron died after 1840 in Lincoln County, Tenn

Aaron Gage, born 5/15/1758 in the State of New Jerswy, filed an application for a pension 5/23/1833 at Purdy, McNairy County, Tenn in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed the 7th day of June 1832. He was then a resident of McNairy County, Tenn, age 74. The papers were submitted by Mr. Maclin Cross, Clerk of McNairy County Circuit Court after having been submitted to Mr. William B. Turley, Judge of the 10th District, State of Tenn. The pension was granted 8/2/1833 at a rate of \$33.33 a year, payable at the ackson Tenn, pension agency. Later, on 11/29/1833, the Payment was raised to \$41.66 a year, also payable at the Jackson Tenn, pension agency. The record of this matter was recorded by Dan Boyd, Bock E volume 7 at page 79 McNairy county records. The court house at Purdy Tenn, one time county seat of McNairy County burned and no doubt the record no longer exists in the county, Adwers, we have obtained a copy of all papers from the General Ecryloes Administration in Washington, DC

Pension Application 52229 5/20/1833 of AARON GAGE

Declaration -- In order to obtain the benefit of the ACT OF CONGRESS passed the 7th day of June 1832.

State of Tennessee, McNairy County: On this 20th day of May in the year of our Lordone thousand eight hundred and thirty-three

personally appeared in open court before the Circuit Court of McNairy County now satting, Aaron Gage, a resident of McNairy County in the State of Tennessee, aged 74 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his eath make the collowing Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832, that he was born to the State of New Jersey day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty eight, When very young his father moved from the State of New Jersey and settled. In Rutherford County, State of North Carolina, Here he continued to reside until he entered the service of his country. That the first of the . .. month of November 1780 he left his father's house and went to Augusty in the State of Georgia at which pla ce, he reached yery early in the month of Wavember as well as he now recollects. Here he entered the service of the United States as a volunteer soldier in a troop of horse, which was then called "Draggoons" under Capt. Thomas Harvey and was astached to Colonel Samuel Harmon's regiment. (Listed in Stryker's register as a private in the New Jersey Continental Line", He volunteered for the term of ten months at Augusty and weem that place we remained for some considerable length of time, say until about the first of May 1781 we received orders to jain General Green's army at or near Ninety-Six in the State of South Carolina. Accordingly ,we took

up our line of march and joined General Green not far from Ninety-Six, our regiment was then praced under the command of General Pickens, and the whole army commenced the siege of it, but we failed, we then encamped not far from Ninety-Six and my Captain Thomas Harvey went out on a scouting party and was killed. I

was then placed under the command of Richard Johnson, Captain We then took up our line of march and went to the high hills of Santee. Here we remained for a short time, then understanding that the British had encemped at the Eutaw Springs we marched to that place which we reached in Sept 1781 when we had a severe battle with the Brit'sh, This engagement, I was in. The next morning after the battle all or the Deaggeons were ordered to march to a place called Munks corner and rout the British from there, but before we reached there we heard they had left there i for Charleston so we marched back to the Eutaw Springs where I remained a vary short time and was discharged having served my four of ten months out, the length of time, I volunteered for the day of the month, I entered the service. I do not now recollect, w nor do I recollect the day of the month I was discharged, but know that I served the full term of ten months, the time I voluntered for I rec aived a discharge from Col. Harmon and had it for a number of years after the war but it is now lost or destroy ed. He has no documentary evidence and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service. I can prove by Isaac Reed, a clargyman who has been acquainted with me for a great many years and also by William S. Wiedom that they believe me to be seventy-four years old and that I am respected and believed in my neighborhood to have been a soldier of the Revolution. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or amuity except the present and declares That his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State

He also states that directly after the Revolutionary War he moved to the State of Kentucky where he kived throw or four years. From Kentucky, he moved to Bedford County, Tenn where he lived two years, then he moved to Lincoln County, Tenn where he lived for a number of years, then he moved to Perry County, Tenn where he lived several years, From there to McMairy County where he now resides. Sworn to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid.

DANIEL GAGE

We have very little information on Daniel. He appears in Rutherford County, N.C. in the census of 1790, 1 male 16 and over, 2 male under 16 and four females. Inother words, he and his wife, two sons and 3 daughters. Next he appears according to a record furnished by the Kentucky Historical Society in the 2nd census of Kentucky 1890 along with an Aaron and a John Gage, As a matter of fact Daniel Gage acted as attorney in fact for Moses Gage, a son of Reuben Gage in selling a tract of land 11/6/1809 Warren County, Sinking Greek.

There is reason to believe that Daniel Gage might be the progenitor of the family of David Gage of Rusk County Texas

DAVID GAGE

It will be noted that on 8/9/1787 a David Gage was given a grant of land 100 acres on the head of Chestnut Log Branch Grant 169 Book 65 Page 297. It is believed that this grant to David Gage was to a son of the Elder David,

His record appears in the 1790 census, listed as a family consisting of 2 males over 16, 2 males under 16 and 3 females. The extra male child over 16 cannot be accounted for Otherwise the family of this David would have been made up of himself and wife, two sons and two daughters. We have no further information on him after the 1790 census

JAMES GAGE

He was a Revolutionary soldier. When Chest called into service, he was living in Rutherford County N.C. Also called into service while he lived in South Carolins and again while living in Rutherford County. He lived there 30 years, moved to Tennessee, then to Alabama, then back to Tennessee and from Tennessee to Washington County, ark territory and later in Madison Co. Ark We locate a record of a James tage Sr in Tipton County Tenn cersus of 1830 in the age group 70/80 but have failed to locate his places of residence in the other states.

He received two grants of land one of 100 and one of 200 acres Millstoner Fork of Sandy Run as has been shown previously. Dates of the grants 9/28/1785 and 12/20/1796. In addition, he bought 100 acres on Sandy Run under date of 11/15/1804

He applied for a pension 9/2/1837, application S32-262, father-in-law William Ross. Entered service of United States as volunter private of militia at the plantation of John Withers about June 1,1776 under Captain Robert Porter. He stated that he was born in York Government (now State of New York) in Woodberry township about 15 miles from the North River and about 60 miles from the town of New York 9/9/1754.

According to his application for a pension, he lived in North Carolina thirty years after the close of the Revolutionary War, moved to Tennessee, then to Alabama, then back to Tennessee and from Tennessee to Washington County, Ark territory and later is found in Madison County, Ark. We do not find him listed in the census years 1800-1810 or 1320 in North Carolina. The first record we do find of him is in Tipton County Tenn in 1830. There the family is listed as 1 15/20, 1 20/31 and 1 70/80 male and 1 5/10 and 1 70/80 Female. He is listed in the 1790 census Rutherford County as 1 over 16 and 3 female or himself and wife one son and two daughters. A James Gage Jr. also appears in the census of 1830 Tipton County Tenn 2 under 5 1 5/10 and 1 40/50 male and 1 under 5 2 5/10 and 1 20/30 female

Declaration -- in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th of June 1832.

State of Arkansas-County of Madison SS

On this 22nd day of September in the year 1837 personally appear ed before me John Austin, a Justice of the Peace, and of the county court(a court of record) in and for the county of Madison and State of Arkansas, James Gage, aged 83 years, a resident of the county and state aforesaid. The said Gage, by reason of bodily infirmity, being unable to appear in court, the place of holding court in said county being 17 miles from his residence, and said Gage, blind and very infirm, so much so, that he could not be conveyed to the court house of said county, even in a carriage without manifest hazard to his life, at his instance, the undersigned Justice as aforesaid attended at the dwelling house of said Gage in the county and state aforesaid and on the day aforesaid, and the said James Gage, being then and there duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7,1832.

This declarant, on his said oath states, that he entered into the service of the United States as a volunteer private of militia, at the plantation of John Withers, in the county of Rutherford, State of North Carolina where he then lived, under Captain Robert Porter and as is his best recollection on or about the 1st day of June 1776, Declarant states that at that time, the Indians had recently committed depradations on an adjacent settlement; that the inhabitants of Wither's neighborhood became alarmed for their safety. That a fort was built at Withers called McGaha's Fort for the security of the inhabitants of the surrounding country that a volunteer militia company was raised to guard said fort and the inhabitants of the country from Indian incursions; That on Captain Robert Porter, was conferred the command of the company thus raised, and in which declarant volunteered and served. That declarant and others

of said company made frequent excursions from the fort into the country, to watch the movements of the Indians, keep them incheck and prevent their depradations. That he performed service as a private, in said company, until on or about the 1st of November 1776 as is his best recollection and was discharged, verbally by Captain Robert Porter at that time and at said fort.

This declarant on his said oath, further states, that he again entered into the service of the United States on or about the 1st day of November 1778 as is his best recollection, at William Rosses, where he then lived, in the State of South Carolina, on the waters of Fair Forest Creek; (appears to rise in Spartan-burg County and empties into the Tiger river in Union County) the name of the county not recollected. He states that a party of Tories, a short time before had made an attack on the house of Colonel Thomas near said Rosses, and had killed a negro man belonging to Col Thomas: whereupon Captain John Thomas, his son and Captains Blasengame and Swearengen raised volunteer companies of mounted gunmen to pursue the Tories who fied in the direction to cross the Savannah river above Augusta. Captain Thomas and his company, declarant being one rendezvoused at Col Thomas' from whence they departed in pursuit of the Tories and were joined on their way by Captains Blasingame and Swearingen and they continued to pursue the Tories, crossing the rivers Tiger, Enoree and Saluda, until they arrived mear the Savannah River opposite: to Augusta when, receiving intelligence that the party of Tories pursued by them had been attacked, and with loss, defeated by the Whigs at Kittle Creek on the Georgia side of the river; Captain Thomas conducted his company back to Col Thomases and (verbally) discharged them, declarant being one of them, on or about the 15th day of November 1778 as is his best recollection.

Declarant states that he again entered into the service of the United States in the State of South Carolina at the residence of his father-in-law William Ross, with whom he then lived, on the waters of Fair Forest Oreek, the county not recollected, on or about the 25th day of November 1778 as is his best recollection That he was then and there drafted and served as a private in the militia company , commanded by Captain John Thomas and in the regiment under the command of Col. Thomas and Major Branham. Declarant does not recollect the names of the Captains of the other companies composing the regiment, but supposes that Captains Blasengame and Swearengen and their companies were with them, but of this he is not positive. The regiment rendevoused at Colonel Thomases and from thence proceeded to join and cooperate with General or Colonel Williams or Williamson. He is not certain of the grade or name, and joined the troops under command of that officer, on an eminence, a short distance from the Savannah River opposite Augusta. That from thence, declarant and Lewis Taylor and a party of about 40 men were detached to conduct military stores and provisions in wagons to General Asha's ancampment at or near the mouth of Brier Creek; in pursuance of which declarant and the party crossed over to Augusta and proceeded down the Georgia side of the river to within ten or fifteen miles of the encampment when receiving intelligence

of the defeat of General Ash and surrender of his encampment _32 " to the British, declarant and Taylor and their party reconducted their charges to Augusta where they arrived in the evening and remained that night. Taylor and declarant crossed the river next morning and joined the troops not far from Augusta where they were encamped. From thence Col. Thomases regiment was detached and proceeded to guard the ford of the Savannah River at . Beach Island, where declarant remained and served for some time and was then regularly discharged from service on or about the 25th day of February 1779 as is his best recollection. His dischargewas written by Captain Thomas and signed by him, by Major Branham and by Colonel Thomas. Leaving Beach Island encampment, declarant reported to the encampment of General Williams or Williamson, he is not certain which is the name of the General and presented to him, for his approval and signature, his said discharge and the General approved and signed the same. Declarant then draw and obtained provisions to subsist him on his return to William Rosses, the place of his residence.

Declarant having removed with his family to Rutherford County, N.C. he was there and at the muster ground of Captain Jacob Vinzants therein, on 1st Broad River drafted out of the militia company commanded by said Vinzants. The object of the draft declar ant states was to obtain men to guard and protect Col. Earl's block house or fort on Pacolet river from expected attacks of British and Tories. After said draft, which was made on or about the 1st day of September 1789, as is his best recollection, declarant proceeded with others to said block house crossing second Broad River and main Broad River on their way. Declarant states, that he remained and performed duty as a private at said block house under command of Col Earle two months. He does not remember any other officer in command at the block house except Col Earle. By permission of Col Earle, declarant engaged as a volunteer private in a company of mounted gunmen on an expedition against the Cherokee towns on some of the head branches of the Tennessee River, to equip himself for which with permission of ColEarle, he departed from the blockhouse, returned home, and having prepared himself for the expedition, joined the party destined for that service at the place of rendevous, an old field in Rutherford County, N.C. on or about the 20th day of November 1780, as is his best recollection. He states that there were two regiments or parties engaged in this expedition, one commanded by Col. Charles McDowel of Burks County, the other by Major Singleton of Rutherford Co. and both of them of North Carolina. That they paraded at command of their respective officers, declarant being attached to Major Singleton's command and serving as a private in the company commanded by Capt. Robertson to the head waters of the Catauba River and through Swanens Cap of the Blue Ridge to the Cherokee towns. As the troops approached the towns, they were fired on by parties of Indians from the hills, but with little or no effect. The troops rapidly crossed the river, entered the towns, killed and took prisoners about twenty-seven Indians young and old and burned their own and huts. After remaining there several days their officers marched the troops back to the head of the

Catauba river and there dismissed and (verbally) discharged them on or about the 1st day of January 1781 as is his best recollection. Declarant states that he has no documentary evidence of his services, nor does he know nor can he procure the testimony of any witness to prove the same except Alexander Ross whose deposition he expects will be annexed hereto.

Declarant hereby relinquish s every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency of any state or territory.

Under the solemnity and responsibility of his said oath, he respectfully represents to the Commissioner of Pensions, that for the last six years he has resided in the late territory, now State of Arkansas in an obscure part of the country remote from the seat of justice or place of holding court, during all which time, he has been almost helpless from old age and bodily infirmity, and totally blind. That he has not been able to procure eny person to draft and have presented for him his application for a pension under the Act of Congress of 7th June 1832. That from his great age, the length of time since the service set forth were performed, the variety of incidents, scenes and changes which have occured to him, but above all the frailty of memory, attendant on old age, he has made the above declaration with much difficulty and after considerable thought and reflection. He is not certain that errors may not have been committed therein, particularly as to the periods at which his services are stated to have been performed, but if errors do exist therein, he declares that they are justly attributed to the imperfection of memory under the circumstances indicated and to no other cause. On his said oath, he states that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of memory, he cannot swear positivelly as to the precise length of his service but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below and in the grade of a private soldier.

1. (to wit) I served as a volunteer private under Captain Porter as before stated not less than 5 months

2. I served as a volunteer private under Captain Thomas after the Tories as stated before, not less than 15 days

3. I served as a private of drafted militia in Col Thomas regiment as before stated, not less than three m onths

4. I served as a private of drafted militia at Earle's block house on Pacolet as stated before not less than 2 months

5. I served as a volunteer private of mounted gunmen on the expedition against the Cherokees not less than 1 month and ten days.

And for such service, I claim a pension—Total service 11 months and 25 days,

And the said Justice then and there (to wit) at the time and place designated in the caption, propounded to the said declarant the questions following to which in their order, on his said oath, he answered as follows (to wit)

- lst:When and where were you born? I was born in York Government (Now State of New York) in Woodberry Township, about 15 miles from the North River and about 66 miles from the town of New York on the 9th day of September 1754 as informed by my father.
- 2nd: Have you any record of your age, and if so where is it?
 I have no record of my age.
- 3rd: Where were you living when called into service, where have you lived since the Revolutionary War and where do you now live? When first called into service, I lived in Rutherford County N.C. I was also called into service whilst I lived in South Carolina the name of the county, I have forgotten, I was also called into service whilst. I lived in North Carolina Rutherford County. At the close of the war, I was living in Putherford County, N.C.I lived there about 30 years, from thence, I moved to the State of Tennessee, thence to Alabama, thence to Tennessee again and from Tennessee to Washington County, Arkansas Territory, now state and I now live in Madison County in the State of Arkansas.
- 4th How were you called into service, were you drafted, did you volunteer or were you a substitute? and if a substitute for whom? I volunteered and was also drafted into service.
- State the names of some of the Regular Officers who were with the troops where you served such Continental and militia regiments as you can recollect and the general circumstances of your service? I know of no regular officer who was with the troops where I served unless General or Colonel Williams or Williamson was a regular officer, of which I cannot state positivelly.Col. Thomases regiment, Col.McDowell's regiment and the regiment or party under Col.Single-ton or rather Major Singleton are the only regiments I can now remember as having served when I served. I was not in any battle or engagement except that of the Cherokee Towns as mentioned in the preceding declaration and to which I refer for the circumstances of my service.
- 6th Did you ever receive a discharge from the service, and if so, by whom was it given and what has become of it? I have stated that all my discharges except were (verbal). That was written by Captain Thomas, signed by him, by Major Branham and Col. Thomas and given me by them. It was also signed by General or Col. Williams or Williamson. It got out of my possession many years ago. I know not how, nor where it is.
- 7th State the names of persons to whom you are known in your present neighborhood and who can testify as to your character for veracity and their belief of your services as a soldier of the Revolution. George Sanders, David Phillips, John Titsworth, Henry Pickens, Pleasant Johnson and I believe

all to whom I am known, would unhesitatingly depose that my character for veracity is good and that my services as a soldier of the Revolution have been ever unquestioned and by them confidently believed as by me stated.

Sworn to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid before me John Austin an acting justice of the peace and of the county court of Madison County and State of Arkansas.

This day, Alexander Ross, aged 60 years and a resident of the county and state aforestid personally appeared before me, the undersigned, a Justice of the Peach and of the county court of said county at the home of James Cage in said county and being first duly sworn according to law deposeth and saith, That the above declarant James Gage, on this day, in his presence signed and swore to the preceding declaration, the same being

distinctly read to and by him heard and understood.

This deponent positively cannot depose, as of his own knowledge, to the Revolutionary services of said Gage, but states that he has intamently known said Gage since his earliest knowledge of almost any person. That William Ross mentioned by declarant was the deponents father. That he has always understood that said Gage lived with his father in South Carolina on the waters of Fair Forest and whilst living there served as a soldier of the Revolution against the British and Tories, that with the exception of a few years only he has lived ever since in the neighborhood of said Gage, has often conversed with him and others reputed to have been Revolutionary Soldiers of and concerning the services of said Gage as a soldier of the Revolution, that he always understood from them all that said Gage was a Revolutionary Soldier, and that on the part of said Gage, that he served as set forth in his said declaration. So far as he can recollect and as he believes.

The deponent on this said oath further states that said Gage has been very infirm for many years and is now by reason of hodily infirmity unable to attend court. That said Gage has been totally blind for at least ten years last past. That said Gage's reputation for truth, piety and morality is good, and so far as this deponent hath ever known or heard, has always been considered unquestionable. That he is universally believed in the neighborhood where he resides to have been a Revolutionary Soldier of the United States and this deponent is confident of the correctness of that opinion and that said Gage served as by him stated.

We, Young Lamar, a clergyman, residing in the county of Washington and State of Arkansas and Allen T. Gillerland, David Phillips, and Henry Pickens residing in the county of Madison state aforesaid hereby certify that we are well acquainted with James Gage who has subscribed by making his mark and sworn to the above declaration, that we believe him to be sighty-three years of age that he is reputed and believed in the neighborhood where he resides to have been a soldier of the Revolution and unquestions able truth and that we concur in that opinion.

And I the said John Austin then and there being a justice of the Peace and of the county court of the county of Madison and State of Arkansas do hereby declare my opinion after the investigation of the matter and after putting the interrogatories prescribed by the War Department that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier and served as he states and I do further declare and certify that it is known to me that Young Lamar who has signed and sworn to the preceding certificate is a clergyman resident in the county of Washingtin and State of Arkansas and that Alexander Ross who has subscribed the preceding deposition and Henry Pickens, David Phillips, and Allen T. Gilliland who with said Lamar have signed and sworn to the foregoing certificate are residents in the county of Madison and State of Arkansas and that they and the applicant James Gage are all of them credible persons and their statements entitled to credit, and I do further certify that the applicant James Gage is well known to me, that he is and has been blind for the space of ten years last, that he is very infirm and unable to attend the court by reason of bodily infirmity, and I, the said Justice do hereby also certify, under my hand and private seal having no seal of office whilst acting separately and not in open court, that the foregoing pages from 1 to 16 both numbers inclusive contain the original proceedings had before me this 22nd day of September 1837 at the house of James Gage in the county of Madison and State of Arkansas in the matter of the application of James age for a pension.

REUBEN GAGE

Reuben Gage first appears in Rutherford County N.C. census of 1790 as a male over 16.He also had a wife, age not shown.

In Rutherford County 1890 Census, his family was increased by three children, 2 sons and a daughter, each of the three being under ten years of age.

In an affidavit which he executed 9/16/1835 and which will be more fully explained later, he gave his age as 65 which would fix the year of his birth as 1770. He married Abigail Burleson a niece of Elizabeth Burleson, who as the wife of Daniel Shipman was the mother of Lucy Gage, a widow who is listed in the Rutherford County Census of 1790. Abigail was born 1772 and died 1865 Bastrop County, exas.

Reuben Gage Continued.

About 1785 a group of related families left Rutherford County and settled in Warren County, Ky. The families were Williams, Gage, McFadden, Shipman and Burleson, probably others. All were related to the Burleson family by marriage.

Reuben was in Rutherford County in 1799 and 1800. He appears to have gone to the same location in Kentucky as did the others at a later date for we find him receiving a grant of 200 acres of land in Warren County, Sinking Creek under date of 8/27/1799. His son Moses received a similar grant under date of 8/24/1799. On Reuben Gage-Land grant in Warren County Ky., this land grant is of record in "Kentucky Land Grants, page 316 by W.R. Jillson. By way of explanation: they are commonly called "headright" claims which were granted to any one who would settle and clear the land. They do not denote military service. The number of ' (· acres, water ourse and date are given. That is all there is to it and all that is to be found. Often these claims were not taken up but the record stands. The settlers were to settle in and improve the land and that was the only condition. As Reuben was still in Rutherford County in 1800 and Moses was not, it is quite evident that Moses settled on his property sometime in 1799 and looked out for his father's interest on his property until such time as he could arrange his departure from Rutherford County

From Page 2 of "Frontier Life or Fifty Years in Texas History and incidents" by Daniel Shipman (1879) we learn that the Shipman family left South Carolina 3/5/1814 and went to Buncombe County NC on the French Broad River. On 10/14/1814 they left Buncomb County for Tennessee.

From Page 4, we learn that the Burleson family were living there they being relatives of the Shipman family.

The Shipman family bought land in Franklin County, Tenn and settled there by January 8, 1815.

The Burleson family talked the Shipman family into moving to Howard County, Mo. (James Burleson and family moved to Howard County Mo. in the fall of 1815 because of Indian trouble in Franklin County, Tenn)

On the way, the families went through Eddy Grove, Ky. A brother of fathers lived there. Went through Old Centerville to Hopkinsville, Christian County, Ky and on to Golconda, Ill. Daniel Shipman, a cousin of fathers lived there. He was a son of Aunt Sarah Saling by her first husband. She also had a son Abraham Shipman. They all started to Missouri to.

-39-Reuben Gage continued

It is presumed that Reuben Gage and his family accompanied the Shipman family into Missouri, probably joining the party at some place in Kentucky. He no doubt disposed of his property in Warren County, Ky. before doing so. As a matter of fact, Daniel Gage, a brother of Reuben according to Warren County records acted as attorney in fact for Moses Gage and sold a tract of land 11/6/1809 Warren County, Sinking Creek. This transaction of course was previous to the time the families started their journays to Missouri by some six or seven years. There is no record of the non-residence of Moses or Reuben in Kentucky up to this point.

Now again quoting from the book "Frontier Life or Fifty Years of Texas History and Incidents" by Daniel Shipman"

"About this time, father and an old friend by the name of Reuben Gage took a notion to move to the State of Arkansas. They sold out and on the 5th day of June 1821, they started from Howard County, Mo. After about 25 miles, they crossed the Missouri River at Boonville, Cooper County, went down the river into Cole County. On the way it commenced raining and we had a wet spell. Father broke a wagon wheel. He and old cousin Reub en Gage managed to have it mended so that we got to a large creek called "Mori". Py this time the weather had become very warm and horse flies so numerous that it was almost impossible to travel and the old folks held a family caucus and decided to stop until fall which we did; and spent the balance of the summer there. (While there, his father heard tales of land on the Red and Sabine Rivers and of the generous offers made by the Spanish Government to American sttlers) His father was interested but it did not appear to take so well with our friend Gage.

Our friend Gage agreed to meet us at Mr. Harrel's (the informant on the free lands in Texas) where we all were to meet and hold a general consultation. The result was that Mr. Gage and his family were to go to Gasconade Sounty Mo. Mr. Harrel and family and father and our family to Arkansas. So in two or three days, we all made a general start on the 23rd of October 1821."

It is not clear where the Reuben Gage family first went from Gasconade County, Mo. It appears from the next record that they located in Fayette County, Tern which is in the aouthwestern corner of the state with Shelby county only separating it from the Mississippi River. They were in Fayette County, Tenn in the census of 1830.

In the abstracts of original Texas land grants on file in the Texas Archives, we find one of 4,428.80 acres(1 league) made to Reuben Gage 9/25/1835.

In connection with this land grant, in what was then a part of Mexico, he gave an affidavit in Spanish under date of 9/16/1835 Translated into English, it read:

"Reuben Gage, having given the due oath, according to the law and as responsible party under the contract of colonization of Benjamin R. Milam, has revealed his name, the gentleman above stated sixty-five years of age, married and occupation of farmer, native of the State of New York and with three persons of the family. In agreement of which has signed he with me in the Villa of Mina on the 16th day of September 1835.

Reuben Gage received \$1.20.40 for loan of wagon and team to the Texas Army forces under General Edward Burleson for 30 days and \$4.00 per day Voucher 11/25/1836

In addition to the grant of oncle ague of land, there is a record in the General Land Office, Austin, Texas of a first class grant for one labor of land (177.10) acres) issued to Reuben Gage on January 24, 1838. The certificate states that the said Reuben Gage emigrated to this country in the year 1834 and was therefore entitled to one labor of land, having previously received title to a league of land. The land located by virtue of this certificate is in Bastrop County, Texas and was patented to the original grantee on 9/10/1846 (after his death).

Of the children of Reuben Gage, Burleson arrived in Texas 2/24/1834 at the age of 25. Moses arrived there in September 1835 at the age of 39. He apparently accompanied his father in most of his travels.

We next find Reuben and three of his sons in Saline County Ark in the census of 1846. The sons were Burleson, George Washington and Jonas. It appears that Burleson and his father Reuben had returned to Arkansas due to that part of Texas where they had been located, being alive with unfriendly Indians and it may well be that their depradations caused many of Gages to go back east.

On 9/8/1840 Reuben bought 123 acres of land in Saline County Ark from Abijah Davis and on the same date 50 acres from John Lindley. On 1/6/1842 Reuben sold 80 acres back to Abijah Davis.

Reuben died on Halloween night 10/31/1844 Saline County, Ark.

ARTHUR BRAXTON GAGE - A citizen who will long be remembered for his effective work during the World War in the Liberty Loan drives in California, and in caring for the welfare of the troops and etherwise proving his loyalty to the government, is Arthur Braxton Gage, who was born in Coryell County, Texas on April 19, 1874, the son of G.W.S. and Salina (Roberts) Gage, the former from Tennessee, the latter a native of Texas. G.W.S. Gage was a graduate of Baylor University, at Waco, Texas. He had a cotton plantation of two hundred-sixty acres, and also raised stock and grain. He died while on a visit to California, in 1918, at the age of 68. His devoted wife is still alive at Gatesville, Texas. The couple had twelve children, seven sons and five daughters, of whom Arthur Braxton is the third in the order of birth.

Arthur Braxton Gage received his education in the public schools of Texas. He was associated with his father until he came to California in 1900. In the cotton fields his assistance was invaluable, he and his six brothers being regarded as the best cotton -pickers in the cantral portion of Texas. In 1900, he settled on the place where he lives to-day, a tract of four hundred twenty-two acres about seven miles to the northwest of Yuba City, the place formerly known as the Blevin homestead, and there engaged in general farming and the raising of rice. He leased the place for seventeen years, and in the autumn of 1919 he bought the property. Mr. Gage has been a member of the Democratic Central Committee in Sutter County; and he was chairman of the board that organized the Nuestro district school of Sutter County. Fraternally, he is a member of the Woodmen of the World, affiliated with the lodge in Yuba City.

affiliated with the lodge in Yuba City.

Mr. Gage was married at Lampasas, Texas, on January 26, 1898 to Miss Della Galbraith, the daughter of Thomas Arthur and Martha Ellen Galbraith, residing about seven miles to the north west of Yuba City. Her father came to California from Springfield, Mo. in 1852, and she was sent to the grammar school in Sutter County. When she was fourteen years old, her fathermoved to Texas. He made thirty-two trips across the country, from Missouri and Texas to California, and had a stock ranch of eight thousand acres on the Colorado River, west of Lampasas, which he sold in 1896.

For a couple of years after his marriage, Mr. Gage lived in Texas, and then he moved to California and settled on the old Galbraith place. Mrs. Gage inherited one hundred seventy-five of its five hundred eighty acres. They sold eighty acres and bought ten acres additionally, so that they now own about ninety-four acres of the Galbraith tract, a splendid ranch, which they have well improved and brought to a high state of cultivation; and besides they are still the owners of the Blevin Ranch of four hundred twenty-two acres.

Mr. and Mrs. Gage are the parents of five children. Thomas Peery married Lottle Minerva Tharp, of Yuba City; and they have two children: Thomas Peery, Jr and Betty Jean. He is now in the employ of the Standard Oil Company at Yuba City. The others are George Galbraith, still at home, and Myrl, Inez and Ladelle.

At that time there was open war with the Charokees for a sister of Joe and Hames Burleson (who afterwards lived in Lawrence County) was scalped by theseIndians Moved from East to Middle Tennessee. When the Creek War occured James became a volunteer and was made Captain of a company.

Joseph and James came into this county (Lawrence County Alabama) sometime before the Indians were removed. He moved to Brazos Co. Texas. Had a son Aaron who had a considerable reputation as an Indian fighter.

Jacob Shipman made a will in Nov 1794 in Rutherford County NC Will probated January 1795 named wife Sarah and the following children: 1John, 2 Elizabeth; who married James Burleson, Edward, 4 Abraham, 5 Daniel, 6 Isaac, 7 Jacob, 8 Simon, 9 James and 10 Matthew.

The FAMILY OF DAVID GAGE of Rusk Co. Texas.

From a record furnished by Thomas Clyde Gage of 916 North GaillardBaytown, Texas, a descendant; a record furnished by Mr. Carey O'Lee Brazil of 1511 West Phillips, Alvin, Texas, one who has done considerable research on the Gage family in Texas and from a History of Rusk County, Texas, by Dorman H.Winfrey, B.A. Thesis, University of Texas June 1951 we arrive at the following:

David Gage, according to the "Handbook of Texas" was born in Kentucky in 1796, however in his redord for service rendered in the War of 1812, it is stated that he was born in White Co. Tenn and that he died 4/26/1854 Minden, Rusk County, Texas.

He had considerable property (land) in Wills Valley, Alabama (extreme northeast corner) He was paid for this land by the United States Government when the Indians were removed in 1836-1838. He came to Texas from Alabama in 1839 and on 5/21/1839 bought one quarter of the Leonard Williams league and settled in Williams settlement in southern Rusk County, near Mount Enterprise. A few months later, he organized a company of Minute Men for protection against the Indians. He served with the company during 1840-1841. He was elected representative to the 8th and 9th congresses of the Republic of Texas 12/4/1843, 6/28/1845 and in 1845 was elected senator of the 4th district and delegate to the convention of 1845. After the annexation, he served three terms in the Texas Legislature 1847-48-49 and 50 and 53 and 54. He died at his home near Mount Enterprise 4/26/1854 or as one other states, at Minden, Rusk County, Texas.

An Aaron and a Daniel Gage of the North Carolina group of Gage families left Rutherford County, N.C. sometime after the census of 1790 apparently attracted by offers of land which would be given to prospective settlers, in the State of Kentucky. These grants were commonly called "headright claims" which were granted to anyone who would settle and clear the land. The settlers were to settle on and improve the land and that was the only condition.

We locate a record of such grants in the Warren County, Sinking Creek area of Kentucky. A Reuben Gage received a grant of 200 acres 8/27/1799. His son Moses a similar grant under date of 8/24/1799 and a John Gage, not identified at present, but apparent ly of the North Carolina group, received a grant of 100 acres 7/30/1799. Reuben was of the North Carolina group. He, however was still in North Carolina in the census of 1800

Aaron Gage, who according to his own statement, was in Warren County, Ky only three or four years, also Daniel Gage and John Gage appear in the 2nd census of Kentucky taken in 1800. When they left North Carolina is not known, nor is the route they traveled known.

Now, it will be noted that David Gage, the subject of this sketch was born in Kontucky in 1796 according to each of three recorded versions concerning him. There is an exception to this record, however, for Mr. Thomas Clyde Gage, a descendant of David, states that he has David's 1812 War record and it states that David was born in White County, Tenn.

Aaron, Daniel and John Gage were in Warren County, Ky in 1800 and they probably stopped along the way after leaving North Carolina onroute to Warren County and this might have been at some place in Tennessee.

White County, Tenn was formed in 1806 from Smith County; Smith County was formed from Sumner County and Sumner County was formed in 1786 from Davidson County.

Now returning to Daniel Gage, we find that he acted as attorney for Moses Gage, son of Reuben in selling a tract of land 11/6/1809 in Warren County, Ky. He could have been a resident of Warren County at least as late as that date. Next we find Daniel Gage as a resident of White County. Tenn in the census of 1820. His family record is recorded as follows in that census:

1 16/18, 1.16/26 and 1 45 and up males
2 under 10, 1.10/16, 1 16/26 and 2 45 and up females. One
was his wife, the other has not been identified.

Daniel was married at least as early as 1780 for in 1790 in Rutherford County, his family was comprised of 1 male 16 and over, 2 males under 16 and 4 females.

White White County was not actually formed until 1806, it was in existence at the time of the war of 1812. It is difficult to reconcile the two states of birth. The evidence indicates it could be either with the possibility of his being born in Tennessee as the more correct. At any rate the fact that Daniel was actually a resident of White County Tenn in 1820' gives credence to the fact that he was the father of David, born in 1796.

David is known to have had a brother, Samuel Patterson Gage, born in Tennessee in 1801 according to the 1860 census of Rusk County Texas. It is difficult to reconcile this record with the other records unless Daniel left Warren County Ky after the 1800 census and came to what was then Smith County Tenn in 1799 and became White County in 1806.

J.C.Gage, came to New Mexico in the spring of 1887, location—Sacramento mountains, with post office at Lower Penasco. He came from Texas for the benefit of his wife's health, but shortly afterward was put in charge of church work as a circuit rider, preaching from White Oaks to ElPaso in various school houses and churches throughout the mountainous district. He has travelled altogether for fifteen years in the territory. He spent four years at James Canyon, one year at Weed and in 1892 located at Hope, where he continued his ministerial work as a preacher of the Methodist Church for ten years. — In 1992 he purchased a farm seven miles south of Artesia, N.M. and in 1904 removed to the town. In 1905 he engaged in ministerial work there and at the same time became a factor in its business activity, purchasing the Artesia Hotel, which he conducted for some time. He was also one of the organizers of the Bank of Artesia N.M.

Among the pioneers of that section is Rev. Mr. Gage, who came from Texas some thirty-five years ago and here in the solitudes founded a home... A splendid oulogy on his life was delivered in the House but the other day by Representative Regers when the House voted to name a new county to be formed of this Penasco country in his honor. Such was the innate modesty of the aged Divine that he immediately telegraphed a message asking that the county be named Hinkle and not Gage.

One of the brood of children that grew up in that household, was Hugh M.Gage, who represents Eddy County in the House of Representatives and does so worthily.Mr.Gage, while born in Texas, came with his parents to New Mexico while he was an infant and grew to boyhood in the Penasco country. He attended the first military school a tRoswell, the predecessor of the present Military Institute. He engaged in ranching and in a merchantile business. Since 1905, he has been a banker. Hope, the metropolis of the Penasco country, although a comparativelly small town, is progressive and has incorporated and Mr. Gage is its mayor.

From 1913 Blue Book Hugh M.Gage (Democrat) born at Belton, Texas 5/26/1875 (another record says 5/16/1875) came to New Mexico 1886 educated in public schools and military school at Roswell; was postmaster at Hope for 5 years, Mayor, three years and now President Commercial Club; engaged in live stock, mercantile and banking busiess; elected member of House of Representatives of the first State Legislature of New Mexico 11/7/1911. from the --District.Resides at Hope, Eddy County.

Howell Gage has made an enviable record in the office of Sheriff of Eddy County, the duties of which he assumed on the first of January 1939.

Howell Gage was born in Roswell, New Mexico on the 22nd day of January 1902 and is a son of Hugh M.Gage, a pioneer rancher of Eddy County and who organized the first bank in Hope., and Carey M: (Roberts) Gage.Mr Gage obtained his early education in the public schools at Hope, later attending New Mexico Military Institute at Roswell., and after completing his studies went to work immediately on his father's ranch where he had owned a few cattle of his own since his early boyhood days. In 1920 Mr. Gage started in the cattle business for himself and now has large ranching interests in Eddy County along the New Mexico Texas border, also a large ranch situated near Hope. Mr.Gage was married to Miss Essie McDonald 4/24/1942.

THE FAMILY OF BENJAMIN GAGE OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS AND RELATED FAMILIES

Benjamin Gage came to Texas from Indiana. He traveled through Kentucky, on to Tennessee and from Tennessee to Texas camping along and scouting about. He was one of the old "Trail Blazers", helped build bridges etc. He camped at the Filips Springs three miles north of Gladowater, Texas but the location did not suit him. so he scouted around a few days and located on Little White Oak Creek about 12 miles northwest of the springs. There he established a gristmill and tan yard.

Upshur County was unorganized at that time. The Governor of Toxas appointed Benjamin Guge, Benjamin Fuller and M.M. Robertson commissioners (confirmed by the logislature in 1849) to select a site for the county seat of the newly created county. They selected and bought the present site of Gilmer from Matthew Cartwright, famed trader and early Texas Land Owner.

When the Gage home was built along White Oak Creek, his nearest neighbors were several miles away. The area rapidly filled with settlers in the first few years after Texas became a State.

Two men were paid \$1.00 in gold for each log they hand howed for the Gage home. They were Alec Marsh and Billy Green whose descendants reside in and around Upshur County to day (1960)

When the men had finished hawing the logs which were hauled from Jefferson, the neighbors joined in a house raising. They used wooden pegs to fasten the logs together and constructed a two story house 17½x 30 feet. It had a large fireplace at one end and one large porch on the front with another on the back.

This house is still standing and in the 115 year old structure are members of the same family, William Alton Guge, a great

-70grandson of the builder and his daughter Mrs. Judy Holden, the fifth generation to reside in the house. This is probably the oldest house in Upshur County still being used by the same family. Since the house was originally built four more rooms have been added. One of the porches has been rebuilt, electricity and gas has been installed and the house now has an imitation

Benjamin, as an heir of James Standifer, a large land owner in this area inherited 640 acres of Texas land.

Benjamin Gage was born about 1802-04 South Carolina by one record and in Kentucky by another record. He died near Gilmer Texas January 1858. He was married in 1827 or 1828, probably in Alabama to Sarah Elizabeth Harrell. She was born about 1802 or 1804 in Georgia. She appeared in the census of 1860 but did not appear in the census of 1880.

Pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved on the 27th day of September 1850, entitled An Act to Create the office of the Surveyor General of the Public Lands of Oregon and to provide for the survey and make denations to settlers of the said Public Lands" Joseph Gage of Douglas County in the territory of Oregon gave notification number 3425 to the Surveyor General of Oregonon the settlement of Public Land'in Township 28 South; Range West. Notification dated Winchester Oregon' Territory Nov. 8, 1853. The award was 640.32 acres in sections 19,20,29 and 30 of Township 28 South Range 6 West of the Willamette Meridian to Joseph Gage and Wife, with his wife to have the west half.

Accompanying the notification was an affidavit made by Joseph Gage, reading as follows:

Joseph Gage of Douglas County in the territory of Oregon being first duly sworn says that he is a white male settler on the Public Lands in Oregon, and that he arrived in Oregon on the first day of January 1844 and was above the age of 18 years on the first day of December 1850, that he is a native born citizen of the United States and that he was born, not known county, North Carolina in the year 1799 and that he has personally resided upon and cultivated that part of the Public Land of Oregon, particularly described in notification number 3425 hereunto annexed continuously from the 31st day of May 1853 to the 8th day of October 1853 and he further says that he is intermarried with Frances Gage his wife and that he was legally married on the—day of unknown 18— in Howard County, Mo.

THE WAGON TRAIN COMMANDED BY GENERAL CORNELIUS GILLIAM

Of which train, members of the Gage family were a part.

There are many books written upon this wagon train which Neil Gilliam commanded. Each book made mention of Neil Gilliam and his lovely wife Mary, with all of their children and their families.

In Eva Emery Dye's book "Soul of America" she states General Gilliam's wagon train consisted of 682 persons, 136 wagons, 119 horses, 41 mules and 1,351 cattle(a small city traveling west.)

From Oregon Historical Quarterly, volume 2 page 136 year 1901 The Oregon trail in 1844 Chapter 1 by John Minto.

The whole story very interesting mostly about getting down to Missouri and getting the wagon train lined up and the unrest amongst the people because of delay.

Chapter 3

Neil Gilliam, an intrepid and well known soldier of the south had been elected General, and the whole company had been divided in three bands with a captain for each. Morrison being one of the three. In referring back to Rev.E.E. Parrish's journal on May 31, we find the following entry. "The first birth occured in our camp. Much lightning, wind and rain is noted. The extreme south branch of the Nimahan River is bridged and next day the wagon train passed over but camped for two days—out of respect for "motherhood". On this train was Henry Sager. He had sold all of his possessions to come west. It was their little girl baby that was born, that the train stopped two days for. Mrs. Sagar died from childbirth a few days later.

June 6th. We are on the Burnett Trail of 1843 which started from near Independence. There were hints of dissatisfaction at our delays for what was deemed insufficient reasons. Somewhat cloudy this morning. Camp remains stationary on account of Mrs. Gage, the General's daughter. Yesterday, we were much cheered and reviewed on striking the Burnett trail.

June 16th.A clear sunrise, but soon became cloudy and looks like rain. It cleared off and we had a brisk wind, with a cool please ant day. We got along finely to-day. Three hunters gone out to kill buffalo. We are now camped near a small pond at the foot of a bluff, with no wood except what we brought with us, and the buffalo chips, which made goodfire. The General, his son-in-law Grant, and his son-in-law Gage with their families are in his company. We are in all seventeen wagons and a carriage. The hunters, Captain Saunders and two others came in late this afternoon, having killed two buffalo and brought as much meat as they could carry. This evening a thunder gust passed over us with a little rain, then cleared off, but did not stay clear until daylight.

by Fred Lockley. My father was General Cornelius Gilliam, though
he was generally called "Uncle Ncil" He was born at Mount Pisgah
Florida. My mother was Mary Crawford, born Tennessee: I was born
the day before the 4th of July in Andrew County Mo. 1839.
Missouri was the jumping off place in those days. They didn't have
courts and court records and licenses like they do now-a-days.

Now-a-days, a man most generally has only one job, like being a lawyer or a preacher, or a politician, or a farmer but when father was a young man the men folks had to do whatever was at hand. When the Black Hawk War broke out, he enlisted and fought through it. When the Seminole War broke out in Florida, where father was born, they made him Captain and he fought through that war. He was the elected to the legislature in Missouri. He later got interested in religion and was an ordained preacher.

He was of the old testament style of preachers. He wasn't very 'strong in turning the other cheek. He would be hit on one cheek, then the one who hit) him would think he was struck by an earth quake or a cyclone before he got time to hit father on the other cheek.

In the spring of 1843, the first party of emigrants started from Missouri for the Willamette Valley In Oregon.

They orgainized like a regular military expedition. Father was made General and Michael T. Simpson was made Colonel and four captains were elected. R.W. Morrison, Elijah Buntan, W. Shaw and Richard Woodcock. Ben Nichols was chosen to act as judge and Joseph Gage and Theophilus Magruder were to serve as judge with him. Charley Saxton was Secretary. Later on in this narrative it is written:

My brother-in-law Alec Gage and wife stopped by the house, the day Wimple killed his wife. Frank Nichols, husband of Sarah Gilliam my sister was appointed the next sheriff. It was the job of Frank Nichols to hang Wimple. There was no jail and Wimple escaped but by posse, he was caught and brought back to Dallas and hanged October 1852.

In Volume 17 also Mertha E.Collins (Martha Elizabeth Gilliam, born 7/3/1839, Andrew County Mo.) writes: two other wagon trains came across the plains the same season, one commanded by Nathaniel Ford, the other by Jim Thorpe. She adds that we stayed on Malatin Plains while father travelled around the valley to find a suitable land claim. Father found a place that suited him near what is now the city of Dallas, Ore. In fact the western part of Dallas is built on our claim. There were-six girls and two boys in the Gilliam family, only one beingalive in 1916.

On this train was Henry Sagar who had sold all his possessions to come west. Mrs Sagar died in childbirth. It was their little girl baby that was born that the train stopped two days for out of respect for motherhood.

As they came to Dr. Marcus Whitman's mission, they left the little children with Mrs. Narcissus Whitman to come on down to get located. Then the Indians came in and massacred them all. The father nearly went mad when he learned of it. General Gilliam then took 50 men and I am sure the Gages were with them. They formed an army to punish the Indians. Mr Gilliam had always told his men to never put a loaded gun in the wagons for safety sake, but one of them did and when Mr. Gilliam went for a picket rope to tie his horse, the rope caught on a gun that discharged and shot Mr. Gilliam through the forchead and he was killed. He was brought back to Dallas and all Masons from Oregon came to the funeral.

They had taken 320 acres of land for each Mrs. Gilliam and the General but when they came to prove up the claim, the government wouldn't let her hold his share because he wasn't alive to prove up an his 320 acres. So with all this work in helping settle up Oregon and lost his life in the causethay were cheated out of all he worked for. But, Gilliam County was named for him and that is where he lost his life cor Oregon.

THE GILLIAM LINEAGE AND ARMS---

The Gilliam Family of Virginia, North Carolina and Ohib, is here presented with the coat of arms, as granted their ancestor. Count de Guillaume, by William the Conqueror, at the battle of Hastings, A.D. 1066

After coming to England; the name was changed from Guillaume to Gilliam, Gillam, William.

John, Devereux and William Gilliam, sons of Sir Richard Devereux Gilliam, came to America in 1635 aboard the "Constance" with the Royal Commission from England, to survey and map the Dominion of Virginia.

From these three brothers; the Gilliams of this country are descended; Henning, Hotten, Bishop E.C. Meade and other early writers have made honorable mention of them. They were prominent during the Colonial and Revolutionary Periods.

Ensign James Gilliam of Lunenburg was killed during the Revolution of 1778. Lieutenant John Gilliam served with great valor in Captain Nathaniel Mason's Company of the 14th Virginia Regt. 1776

William and Mary's xl pg 84 "Bacon's Rebellion" speaks of John Gilliam, James Ellis, Thomas Jarrett, 1684; Captain James Gilliam served.

Sir Richard Devereux Gilliam married Lady Dorothy, daughter of the Earl of Pembroke, who was beheaded by the Lancastrians, July 27th 1469. Sir Richard was the eldest son of Walter, Viscount Hereford and the ancestor of Robert Jarratt Jr, Joseph, Devereux and Mary Jarrett, who married William Gilliam.

Children of William and Mary (Jarrett)Gilliam were Devereux, who married Edith Ellis, born in Henrico County Va in 1743

Sarah Gilliam, who married George Raulstone, a direct descendant of Kord Elgin and his wife Lady Margaret Creighton.

Governor John Floyd of Virginia (1831) was related to the Gilliams through the Davis line. Chief Justice John Marshall and Joseph Rucker LaMar were also related. The Gilliams have been prominent in both civil and military affairs in this country. John Gilliam was sent as Minister from the United States to Mexico, Colonel William Addison Gilliam and Major T.Y. (Stonewall) Jackson represented R.E. Colston to the Governor of Virginia April 27, 1861.

Dr William Addison Gilliam, son of William and Mary (Jarratt) Gilliam, married Eliza Davis of Kentucky, first cousin of President Jefferson Davis. Issue (1) William Addison Gilliam, served with valor as Colonel of the 60th regiment, during the Civil War. (2) Elizabeth Davis Gilliam (3) Theodosia Devereux Gilliam.

The Gilliam family may well be proud of their lineage, for authenticated facts, prove that step by step and link by link, they have descended in a clear and unbroken line to those who built up the foundation of our mighty country, and united by blood to the first families of the land.

The progenitor of the North Carolina line was Epaphroditus Gilliam who was born near Williamsburg Va and removed with his family to North Carolina. He was a descendant of William Gilliam, one of the three Gilliam Brothers who came to Virginia in 1635 aboard the Constance.

The progenitor of the Ohio line of this family was William Gilliam born near Yorktown Va. He was a descendant of Devereux Gill a iam who came to Virginia in 1635. Prominent among the Ohio descendants are Dr. David Todd Gilliam of Columbia. He was born 4/3/1844 served in 2nd West Va cavalry during the Civil War, married Lucinda Eleen daughter of Judge Thomas L. Minton, graduated in Medicine in 1871 occupied six different chairs in Medical Colleges; Made Professor Emeritus of Gynecology; and author of many textbooks and novels. Dr Charles Frederic Gilliam, Supt of the State Hospital at Columbus, Ohio. (compiled by E. C. Meade)

MISSISSIPPI

The Territorial Papers of the United States, compiled and edited by Clarence Edwin Carter. These volumes were gotten out for all of the States that were originally territories, drawn principally from the archives of the Departments of State, Treasury, War, Interior and Post Office and Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress and the Senate and House files in Washington, D.C.

Volumes V and VI are for Mississippi.

At page 733 to and including page 736 is found a petition of sundry inhabitants of the District East of Pearl River in the Mississippi Territory to the Honorable the Congress of the United States dated May 1809 complaining about the territory being so large and too far between settlements for them to get any advantage from their taxes etc. They were asking that the territory be divided. This later was effected in 1817 when Mississippi became a State and the other half of the territory remained Alabama Territory until 1819.

The following Gage men signed the petition-Joshua 73rd on the list, Jeremiah 174th on the list, Daniel 207th on the list and Moses 209th on the list.

None of them appeared in the 1816 census and must therefore not have stayed in the territory.

MISSISSIPPI

The Daniel who signed 207th on the list is believed to have been Daniel Gage, a Revolutionary Soldier born 9/8/1745 Pelham, NH married: 5/27/1779 Elizabeth Greenough and had children: Daniel born 1785 died 12/18/1852 and a daughter Elizabeth who married Joseph Kittredge (1775:1832) The record of the marriage of Elizabeth Carallel Total Carallel Car abeth Gage to Joseph Kittredge was sent to the Evans Memorial Library, Aberdeen Miss by Mr. Edward Henry Kittredge Baldwin of Ulupalakua, Hawaii. Island of Maui. A printed record of this is found in Compendium of American Genealogy by Virkus, Vol 7 P39.

Moses Gage, the 209th signer is believed to be the one found in what is now the southwestern part of what is now the State of Alebama.

The others have not been identified.
