GORDON

The first Gordon of whom there is any distinct trace is Richard of Gordon, said to be the grandson of a famous knight who slew some monstrous animal in the Merse, in the time of Malcolm III.

That Richard was Lord of the Barony of Gordon, in the Merse, is undoubted as between 1150 and 1160 he granted from that estate a piece of land to the Monks of Saint Mary at Kelso, a grant confirmed by his son Thomas. Other Gordons figure in history about this time, apart from Bertram De Gordon whose arrow in 1199 wounded Richard of England at Chalons.

Alice IV of the Gordon family, an heiress, married her cousin Adam Gordon, who was a soldier amongst the 1000 auxiliaries whom Alexander III sent with Louis of France to Palestine where he was slain. From his grandson Sir Adam all the Gordons of Scotland are descended says Douglas, and the first appearance he makes in history was the assistance he gave Wallace in 1297 to recapture the Castle of Wigton of which he was made Governor. For his many faithful services Robert I, on the forfeiture of David, Earl of Athol, gave him a charter of the lands of Strathborgie (or Huntly). He was killed at Halidon Hill, but his son, Sir Alexander, escaped the slaughter and was the first designed of Huntly.

Sir Adam Gordon, in descent tenth of Gordon and Huntly, whose father was slain at Otterburn, lost his life in fighting for his country at the battle of Homildon in 1402, leaving only a daughter who married a second son of Seton of the Ilk. Their eldest son, Alexander, assumed the name of Gordon, and in consequence of his great public services to James I and James II he was created by the latter Earl of Huntly. He died some years later at a very great age. To trace all the great actions and deeds of the warlike line of Huntly would far exceed our space.

Alexander, third Earl, fell at Flodden. George, fourth Earl, was general of the forces on the Borders to oppose those of Henry VII under Norfolk, with whom he had many victorious encounters, but in an attempt to get the Queen out of the hands of the Earl of Moray, he was attacked by the Mackenzies, Munroes, Frazers, Macintoshes at Corrichie where he was slain in 1562. George, the sixth Earl of Huntly, whose father had been High Chancellor, with the other catholic nobles was suspected of having a secret correspondence with the Spaniards and troops were sent against them by James IV in 1594. The latter were defeated, but Huntly was pardoned, appointed Lieutenant of the North, and created a Marquis in 1599.

George, the second Marquis, was captain of the Scottish Guard of Louis XIII and was so strongly attached to the cause of Charles I that he was forfeited by the Scottish Parliament in 1645 and his property was seized. He lost his

head for his loyalty at Edinburg in 1649. Four years before this his eldest son perished in the Royal cause at Alford.

George, fourth Marquis, was created Duke, and his noble defense of the Castle of Edinburg for James VII is a stirring event in Scottish history.

On the death of George, fifth Duke, in 1736 the title became extinct, but the Marquisate at Huntly went to the Earl of Aboyne, lineally descended from George, fourth son of George, second Marquis of Huntly, who was raised to the peerage of Aboyne by Charles II for his many loyal services.

The fighting forces of the clan when in arms for King James in 1715 is given by General Wade as 1000 Claymores.

The Earls of Aberdeen, so created in 1682, are descended from Patrick Gordon of Methlic (Cousin of the Earl of Huntly) who fell in the battle of Abrath in 1445, they were afterwards designed as Lairds of Methlic and Haddo.

Ten generations of the clan were created Baronets, viz: Gordon of Gordons-town, Gordon of Gluny, Gordon of Lishmore in 1625, Gordon of Lechinvar, Gordon of Park in 1686, Gordon of Dolpholly in 1704, Gordon of Earlstown in 1706, Gordon of Embs in 1731, Gordon of Halkin (by succession) in 1813, Gordon of Niton in 1818.

Two regiments names "The Gordon Highlanders" have been raised from this clan. The first of these was the old 81st formed in 1777 by Hon. Colonel William Gordon, son of the Earl of Aberdeen, and disbanded in 1783. The second was the present regiment of Gordon Highlanders, raised by

the Marquis of Huntly in 1794, memorable for its high valor in every war since the.

The war cry of the clan is "A Gordon ! A Gordon !"

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Some writers affirm that the Gordons are descended from Bertram de Gordon, who in 1199 mortally wounded with an arrow Richard Coeur de Lyon, while he was besieging the castle of Chalons in the Limoges. But there can be no doubt that the Gordons were originally from Normandy, and that the founder of the Scottish branch of the family came into Scotland in the reign of David I (1124-53) from whom he received a grant of lands of Gordon, that the first of the name came from England in the days of Malcolm Canmore and as a reward for his services in killing a wild boar which infested the borders he assumed a boar's head for his armorial bearings, in commemoration of his exploit. In all probability the story was invented to account for the arms of the family, and its founder was much more likely to have styled himself de Gordon after his lands than to have given his name to the place where he settled.

This ancestor of the Gordons had two sons, Richard and Adam. Richard, the elder, who died in 1200, appears to have been a liberal benefactor to the monastery at Kelso. His son confirmed by charter his grants of land, and his

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grandson increased them, and gave lands also to the Monks of Coldstream. He died in 1285 without male issue, and his only daughter, Alice, married her cousin Adam de Gordon, the son of Adam, younger brother of Richard, and thus united the two branches of the family.

This Adam is said to have accompanied Louis of France in his crusade for the recovery of the Holy Sepulchre in 1270 and to have died during the expedition.

His son also was named Adam, and was a supporter of Balliol in his contest for the crown with Bruce, but he died before the commencement of the War of Independence.

GORDON DENEALOGY

The Gordon name is one of the most ancient in England and is now represented in the peerage by the Earl of Aberdeen.

The family is of Norman origin and dates back to very early times. In 1150 Richard de Gordon, Knight, Baronet, granted to the Monks at Kelso, land at Gordon, near Huntly Strather. Haddo House, the seat of the Earl of Aberdeen, is in the county of Aberdeenshire in the Highlands of Scotland. The Gordons of America are of various extractions. There were several stocks in New England previous to the Revolution; one in New York, two or three in New Jersey, four at least in Pennsylvania, two in Maryland, three or four in Virginia, three in North Carolina, five in South Carolina, and two in Georgia.

Alexander Gordon, the first of the name in New Hampshire was born in Aberdeen Scotland in 1635, of a Highland Scottish family which was loyal to the cause of the Stuarts. He died in Exeter, N.H. during the summer of 1697. Married in 1663, Mary, daughter of Nicholas and Alice Lysson of Exeter. He was a soldier in the Scottish army that supported the claim of King Charles II to the throne of England, and was taken a prisoner of war by Cromwell at the battle of Dunbar, England, September 3, 1650. (Some say battle of Worcester, Eng. which was a year later). He was taken to the prison camp at Tuthill Fields, London, and was released to Capt. John Allen of Charlestown, Mass. on the condition that he emigrate to America. Was taken to Mass. in 1651 and held at Watertown, Mass. until 1654 as a prisoner of war. The ship on which he came was named "Liberty" and commanded by Capt. John Allen and landed at Boston. As early as 1660 he was at Exeter, N.H. where he resided the rest of his life, and engaged in lumbering, his saw mill being located on Little River, a branch of Exeter, or Fresh River, at a point about one mile west of Exeter Village. Administration of his estate granted to his son John Gordon, August 25, 1697.

6 - Alexander - married Sarah Sewall, died in 1730. Have no record of his family except a daughter Anna. He probably lived in what is now Brentwood, as his widow signed various petitions pertaining to the forming of the parish and town of Brentwood.

7 - Thomas - died 1762. Married Nov. 22, 1699, Elizabeth, daughter of Mathew and Elizabeth (Swan) Harriman of Haverhill, Mass.

8 - Daniel - born 1682, died before 1736. Married Sept. 15, 1708, Margaret Harriman (sister to the above Elizabeth) of Haverhill, Mass. Resided in Kingston, N.H. and was a farmer and blacksmith. They had five children:

III. Abner, son of Daniel and Margaret (Harriman) Gordon resided in South Hampton, Suncook, and Hopkinton, N.H. His son Amos settled in Garland, Me., and had nine children. 1st Five sons and two daughters married. Two of his great grandsons reside in Calais, Me. Amos was a revolutionary soldier.

II. Thomas Gordon, the fifth son of Alexander and Mary Lysson Gordon was born in Exeter, N.H. 1678. He, in partnership with his younger brother Daniel, was for several years engaged in lumbering at the mill of Mathew Harriman of Haverhill, Mass. Nov. 22, 1699 he married his employer's daughter Elizabeth, who was born in Haverhill, Mass, Nov. 30 1675; she died in 1720. They lived in Haverhill until 1798 when they moved to Exeter, N.H. and settled on what has since been known as "Gordon Hill". He married a second time but the name of this wife is not known. His will was made Dec. 2, 1757 and probated May 27, 1761. They had eleven children, first five born in Haverhill, last six in Exeter by second wife. Nathaniel and Benjamin inherited the homestead on Gordon Hill.

V. Ithiel Gordon (4) oldest son of Daniel and Susanna Gordon, b. in Raymond N.H. about 1736, d. in Readfield, Maine Jan. 1828. He married Dec. 28, 1756 Mary Glidden of Brentwood, N.H. This marriage took place in the First Church of Kingston by Rev. Joseph Secomb. If the family were in Brentwood at that time, they must have moved soon after to Chester into that part of the town known as Freetown or North Woods. Chester, N.H. was incorporated in 1722 (Grant of 1700).

No record has been found of the baptism of Ithiel Gordon. Ithiel was about 21 years old at the time of his marriage. Ithiel Gordon's name is listed among the soldiers of the French and Indian War. 1754-1760. If the family lived in Brentwood, they must have moved to Chester before 1764. They lived in the part of Chester that became Raymond in 1764. In 1769 Widow Jenkins was paid twelve shillings for teaching a term of four weeks of school in Raymond, N.H. Fifteen shilling was paid Ithiel Gordon for going after her, boarding her, and carrying her home again.

Ithiel Gordon was tax collector for the town of Raymond in 1769-70-71-73 and selectman in 1778-79. On Sept 13, 1777 the rebuilding of the Dudley Bridge in Raymond was bid off to Ithiel for \$104.00. The list of soldiers of the Revolutionary war from Raymond includes Eliphlet Gordon, Thomas Gordon, Ithiel Gordon, Daniel Gordon, Jr.

Two of Ithiel Gordon's sons were in the Rev. war also, Josiah (5) and Ithiel, Jr. (5). Ithiel Gordon and his family moved from Raymond, N. H. to Winthrop, Me. about the year 1783. This is indicated by his signature to deeds. In the year 1782, he signed as Raymond, N. H. and in 1783 as Winthrop, Me. This last deed was a conveyance of property in Raymond, N. H. In an old account book of Samuel Gilman of Washington Plantation (later Mt. Vernon, Me.) a tailor by trade, there is a credit item under the date of June 17, 1785, to Ithiel Gordon.

At the time of the first U.S. Census in 1790, Ithiel Gordon, his wife, four daughters and two sons, one over sixteen and the other under sixteen were living in Winthrop, Me. (Probably in that part of the town that became Readfield in 1797. He died Jan. 1828 in Readfield, his wife died Sept. 1819, Readfield. That place of her burial is not known to the writer.

V Daniel Gordon, 4th son of Ichiel and Mary Glidden Gordon b. in Raymond, N.H. July 30, 1772. About the year 1783 when eleven years old his parents moved from Raymond to Maine. They settled in the Northeastern part of Winthrop. At the time of the first U.S. Census in 1790 Daniel was about 16 years old living at home. His brothers Josiah and Jonathan were married and living in Winthrop. The next year 1791 the Northern four ninths of Winthrop was incorporated as the town of Readfield. Daniel m. Apr. 28, 1796 Relief Savage she was b. Apr. 8, 1769 the dau. of Daniel Savage of Hallowell Me. and a half-sister to Martha who married Jonathan, older brother of Daniel. Daniel Savage was a prominent citizen of Hallowell and had a large family.

The war of 1812 was the cause of considerable excitement throughout New England. The county of Kennebec was constantly on the alert and many companies of men enlisted during the latter part of the war. During the year 1814 the British fleet continually hovered along the coast of Maine and during the summer months Eastport was seized and the British ships ascended the Penobscot River and captured Bangor, and other places. "The Adams" a U.S. vessel of war was burned near Bangor by the commander to prevent her from falling into the hands of the enemy. Her crew retired into the woods and crossed the country from the Penobscot to the Kennebec spreading the alarm that the enemy were approaching. On Sat. Sept. 10 a special town meeting was held at Augusta to consider the safety of the towns. A committee was appointed who reported that the selectmen be directed to procure 200 lbs. of powder at once, a quantity of material for tents, camp kettles, etc. Sunday, the next day, while at church service Gen. Sewell received a dispatch from the com. of safety at Wiscasset asking for a thousand men, as the enemy threatened a landing. Colonel Stones' and Col. Sweet's regiments with Hallowell Artillery marched at once in company for Wiscasset. On Sept. 15, Gen. Sewell went to assume command of the troops. In Lieut. Col. Sweet's reg. there were two companies raised at Mt. Vernon, Me. Later of Co. of Militia was drafted from Readfield and attached to Col. Sweet's reg. Among the commissioned officers were John Smith, captain; Samuel Benjamin, Lieut.; Joseph Gilman, Sergeant. The records of the Mass. volunteer militia give the following Capt. Geo. Laugh's Co., Lieut. Col. Ellis Sweet's reg. from Sept. 25, to Nov. 8, 1814, raised at Readfield, service at Beth. Daniel Gordon, Private, Luther Gordon, Private.

Mary Lysson who married Alexander Gordon was the third dau. of Nicholas and Alice Lysson of Exeter, N.H. Nicholas Lysson was a Scotsman and first appears in Salem, Mass. 1637 a proprietor at Marblehead. He is named as creditor in the inventory of Geo. Pollard of Marblehead, Apr. 30, 1648. Nov. 13, 1648 he was granted at Exeter, N.H. ten acres from which to cut fire wood, this land was later given him by the town. Feb. 22, 1649 liberty was granted him with others to set up a mill on Lempertall River. Sept. 24, 1650 he was granted twenty acres near Fresh River. May 16, 1650 he was granted privilege for a saw mill above the one already erected. Mar. 20, 1650 forty acres were granted to Nicholas Lysson at Lempertall. Dec. 15, 1653 he was granted power to still the mills to account. Apr. 1664 he purchased a house and lot on the water site at Exeter by a deed to which John Barnes was witness. He was one of the selectmen of Exeter the years 1654-55-56-57-58-59-60-61. In 1656 he bought half the new saw mills, John Gilman a quarter, John Cutt, Edward Hilton, John Warren, Thomas King et al. a half. In 1661 he conveyed "to my son-in-law Henry Magoon for life" remained to his son land in Exeter. Oct. 10, 1664 forty acres were granted to Nicholas Lysson near the great playne. Mar. 15, 1670 Nicholas Lysson of Exeter, Planter, for three hundred pounds, conveyed one quarter of six hundred and forty acres on Lempertall River. July 10, 1671 he was chosen one of the men to run lyne between Dover and Exeter. Apr. 2, 1675 granted to Goodman Lysson three hundred acres of the Pascassack River. Administration on his estate was granted to Alexander Magoon and Nicholas Gordon, both of Exeter, Dec. 8, 1714. Inventory Sept. 1, 1716 was 110 pounds. Warrant July 27, 1743 authorizing Edward Gilman, Carter Gilman, Joseph Lovering, Benj. Thing, and Robert Light, all of Exeter, to make a division among the three dais. of the deceased, or their representatives, of forty acres. He had no sons as far as records show so he was the last of his name. He was a hustler and accumulated quite a fortune for those days, but by unfortunate investments lost all when he was nearly seventy years of age, turning all of his property over to his creditors. He, then at the age, when most men lay aside all work, started anew in business and paid all his debts, and his inventory at the time of his death, when nearly 100 years old in 1714, showed property to the amount of 100 lbs.

Glidden

Mary Glidden who married Ishiel Gordon (4) at Kingston, N.H. Dec. 28, 1756 was a granddaughter of Charles Glidden who lived in Exeter N.H. and had seven sons. Charles Glidden came to New England as early as 1656 and settled at Portsmouth, N.H. He afterward moved to Exeter where in 1672 he took the oath of allegiance. Died there leaving a large family. Charles Glidden is the first of whom we have any record in N.H. coming thither under Mason, who was Governor of Portsmouth, in Hampshire County, England. In this county lies the town of Glidden.

Stephen Gordon (5) m. Sept. 18, 1838 Lovina Sherborn of Readfield. They lived at the Gordon Homestead for a number of years, then traded it with his oldest bro for a place where he was living, which later became known as the Harrison Gordon place. This farm is near the Dudley Plains. Stephen d. Apr. 19, 1854, age 40, had the measles, partly recovered, got cold and had congestion of the lungs. His wife continued to live on the farm which passed into the hands of the eldest son, Thomas Harrison Gordon, she reserved rooms in the house for her personal use. This is a description of Stephen by his son Albion S. Gordon was a tall muscular man of about six feet in height, broad shoulders, weighing about 180 lbs. black hair and dark blue eyes, always shaved the upper part of his face leaving well-trimmed chin whiskers. He was a quiet temperate man, firm in his decisions, a singer and regular attendant of the Baptist Church.

After trading places with his bro. Wm. he enlarged the barn, built a blacksmith shop where he did a great deal of work shoeing horses, etc. making the shoes and nails himself. He next built a dwelling house, corn barn and shed, doing most of the work himself, his bro. Daniel helping on the cellar as he was a stone mason. On this farm he usually kept 12 or 15 head of cattle a horse, and 25 sheep. These he traded many times and was a very successful trader. In the last years of his life he took the contract to build the road from his house to the place now owned by Nelson Luce (1911) this job was bid on and he bid it off for \$212.00 With the help of his sons Harrison and Albion 10 and 12 years old who rode the scraper, he did most of the work. When it was completed he had paid out just \$12 for help leaving him \$200. (The man he hired worked for 4 shillings a day.) In the last twelve years of his life he paid a debt of \$900 with the help of a smart active wife, built the afore mentioned buildings, cared for nine children and left real estate and personal property valued at \$3000.

Daniel while working in Mass. was taken sick and came home. This sickness proved to be small pox and nearly all the family were exposed to it. During the epidemic which followed Harrison lost his wife and dau. Laura E.

Several years later the John Brown place which consisted of a few acres of rough land was added to the farm. He was very fond of music and played the violin. He d. Mar. 26, 1909, his wife d. Nov. 25, 1909. He and both wives are buried in the cemetery on Dudley Plains.
