HAZEN

The name Hazen is Teutonic, relating to the Ancient Germans. The name was originally Hayson, Hazzon, and Hazzen.

According to tradition the name in the fourth generation in America was spelled both Hazzon and Hazzen, and it was the fifth generation that decided on the present spelling. Records indicate that the family name in England is very Ancient.

As near as can be ascertained, the Hazens are a family of English Extraction who settled mainly in New England. Some drifted to New Jersey and Pennsylvania, while others went West. However, I find a family of Hazens residing near Newark, New Jersey who speak Holland Dutch fluently; their parents came from Holland.

The first known Ancestor to America was Edward Hazen, who came from England to America in 1649, and settled at Rowley, in Essex County, Massachusetts where he lived until his death. The records of many American Hazens are traced back to Edward Hazen of Rowley, (now Boxford) Massachusetts.

From Martin-Allerdyce, Terrell Wells, Texas: (Coat of Arms Supply House) "There is no Hazen Arms."

Rev. Silas McKeen in his history of Bradford, Vermont states: "In the early days many Hazens lived in the great meadow lands called "The Coos Country" in Vermont and New Hampshire. In 1760 Hazens were among the early settlers of Warren and Sussex Counties, in New Jersey; they had come from the meadow lands called the "Upper Coos" in Orange County, Vermont and Grafton County, New Hampshire. In 1763, one John Hazen obtained from New Hampshire a deed for land along the west side of the Connecticut River in the meadow lands called the "Upper Coos" and where was later Haverhill, Grafton County, Massachusetts.

Moses Hazen, Native of Hampsted, Rockingham County, New Hampshire was a hero in the French and Indian War. He was first Captain and afterwards General. Later in 1763 when in Moorstown, (now Bradford) Vermont, General Moses Hazen laid out four thousand acres of land on the western side of Bradford. This land was in Orange

County on the west side of the Connecticut River, in the great meadow lands called "The Coos" and was surveyed by John McDuffee, Esq."

Note: The above John McDuffee, great grandfather of the writer, was a native of Londonderry, New Hampshire, and was of Scotch-Irish descent. His Ancestors emigrated from Scotland to Ireland in 1612. The first McDuffee Ancestor to America emigrated from Colerian, Ireland in 1720, and settled at Londonderry, New Hampshire. John McDuffee was a celebrated surveyor. He taught the schools in Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire. In 1789 he went to Vermont and bought the farm of his Uncle, Samuel McDuffee, who was drowned in the Connecticut River while crossing the McDuffee Ferry, a noted crossing place over the Connecticut River. John McDuffee died at his home on Wright's Mountain, May 4, 1851. Dr. James McDuffee (son of John) went to New York; in 1831 he moved to Indiana and settled in Allen County where he was a prominent physician for many years. Caroline (McDuffee) McGuire, daughter of Dr. James McDuffee, was the mother of Cora (McGuire) Hazen, Oliver. (the writer)

The Hazen House

From History of Hartford, Vermont, Published in 1925 by Allen Hazen, Dobbs Ferry, New York:

"The old Hazen House on Christian Street, Hartford, Vermont was the first house south of the Norwich town line. It was known as "The Hazen House of the big red barn." This house was built by Thomas Hazen III and his son, Asa, in 1775. It was being shingled on June 17 while the battle of Bunker Hill was being fought; the men at work on the roof heard the cannon one hundred and twelve miles away. This old Hazen House was still standing in 1925; it had been changed in many ways, but the original old pine frame still stood one hundred and fifty years after it was built. Thomas Hazen III was a land owner and a few years before he went to Vermont he came into possession of twenty-five hundred acres of land extending across the entire north side of the town of Hartford. Later this land was owned by his sons. Thomas Hazen died 1782,

leaving deeds that showed purchases of land and land shares in Woodbury, Vermont; in all these old deeds his name was always spelled Hazzen."

Note: Thomas Hazen III was the son of Thomas II, and Sarah (Ayer)Hazen, and was of the fourth generation in America. He was born at Norwich, Connecticut 1719. From Tracy Hazen, writer of Hazen History, New York City, New York as follows:

September 14, 1935

"Dear Mrs. Oliver: I was very much interested in your letter of June 15, and am sorry it has been so long in reaching me. It was mailed on the day I left New York for France, and for some reason was not forwarded to me until late in August and I received it just as I was leaving Holland to sail for Glasglow. Now about the Hazen genealogy you are writing. I have the direct Ancestry of Samuel Hazen III who married Elizabeth DeWitt in New Jersey and will be glad to exchange it with you for data on your branch. I was in Indiana years ago and visited some of the Hazens there. My line of descent is as follows:

- (1) Edward Hazen of Rowley, Essex County, Massachusetts.
 - (2) Thomas Hazen, Boxford, Massachusetts-Norwich, Conn. married Mary Howlett.
 - (3) Thomas Hazen, Norwich, Connecticut married Sarah Ayer.
 - (4) Thomas Hazen, Woodbury, Connecticut-Hartford, Vermont married Ann Tenny.
 - (5) Asa Hazen, Hartford, Vermont married Susannah Tracy.
 - (6) Austin Hazen, Hartford-Berlin, Vermont married Lucia Washburn.
 - (7) Austin Hazen, Jerico-Richmond, Vermont married Mary J. Carleton.
 - (8) Tracy Elliot Hazen(myself) New York City, New York.
- Now Mrs. Oliver you will see that I am the fifth cousin to your former husband, William A. Hazen, and others of the ninth generation in his branch. I am a graduate of the University of Vermont, and Columbia University of New York. I have been working on the Hazen genealogy since 1900. I have been teaching in Columbia University since 1903."

Direct Ancestry of Samuel Hazen III, by Tracy Hazen 1935:

"(1) Edward Hazen born in England, married twice. Married (1) in England, name of wife unknown. They came to America in 1649 and settled at Rowley (now Boxford) Massachusetts. They were sold for their passage to the Priest of Boxford. Boxford, then a part of Rowley on the north shore below Newburyport. It is said the minister probably advanced the passage money for the young people and they were to work it out. No children. The young wife died September 18, 1649, the same year they came to America. Edward Hazen married (2) Hannah Grant, in Rowley, March 1650. Hannah, daughter of Thomas and Jane Grant. Edward Hazen soon became a prominent citizen holding various public offices and leaving an estate of over four hundred pounds sterling. He died July 22, 1683, at Rowley, Massachusetts. Hannah married (2) Lieutenant George Browne. No children. Hannah died, February 1715-16, at Haverhill, Massachusetts. Children of Edward and Hannah(Grant)Hazen:

Mary, daughter of Thomas and Lyda(Peabody)Howlett, born Ipswich, Massachusetts in 1664. They lived in Rowley (now Boxford) until 1711, when they moved to Norwich, Connecticut. They settled on the top of a high hill, ten miles northwest of the present city of Norwich, and in the present town of Franklin which was set off from Norwich at a later date. Mary(Howlett)Hazen born 1664, died October 24, 1727 at Norwich, Connecticut.

Thomas Hazen, born 1658, died April 12, 1735 at Norwich, New London County, Connecticut.

(3) John Hazen, son of Thomas I and Mary(Howlett)Hazen, born Boxford, Essex County, Massachusetts, March 23, 1688 married twice. Married (1) Mercy Bradstreet in 1710; Mercy, daughter of John and Sarah(Perkins) Bradstreet, born Topsfield, Essex County, Massachusetts, June 2, 1689. John and Mercy Hazen lived in Norwich and Lyme Connecticut. They were the parents of eight children. Mercy Hazen died 1725, and John married (2) Elizabeth Dart, May 31, 1726.

Mercy(Bradstreet)Hazen born June 2, 1689, died at Norwich, Connecticut, November 22, 1725. (36 years)
John Hazen born March 23, 1688, died Norwich, New London County, Connecticut 1772. (84 years)

(4) Samuel Hazen I, son of John and Mercy(Bradstreet) Hazen, born Norwich, Connecticut, May 1, 1713. Marriage unknown.

(5) Samuel Hazen II, son of Samuel I born Litchfield, Connecticut, April 5, 1749. Marriage unknown.

Children: Samuel, Hannah, Augustus, and others. According to tradition, Samuel II spelled his name Hazzen; it was in this, the fifth generation, that the name was first spelled Hazen. It is said that Samuel Hazen II may have served in the Revolutionary War, but nothing can be found of it in public records.

Samuel II went to Sussex County, New Jersey and died there after 1812.

(6) Samuel Hazen III, son of Samuel II, born Litchfield, Litchfield County, Connecticut April 1777. The family moved to New Jersey and settled in Sussex County. Samuel III married Elizabeth DeWitt of Sussex County, New Jersey."

Samuel and Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen
1802 to 1937

Samuel Hazen III, of the sixth generation in America, was born in Litchfield County, Connecticut 1777. As previously stated, the family moved to Sussex County, New Jersey; here Samuel Married Elizabeth DeWitt April 3, 1802. Elizabeth born in Sussex County, New Jersey May 8, 1775. Samuel and Elizabeth Hazen lived in Sussex County, New Jersey where their children were born; later, in 1819 they moved to Ohio and settled first in Clinton Township, Knox County, then known as the Jersey settlement. Many New Jersey families moved to Ohio as early as 1812-13. Samuel Hazen with his family lived in Knox County until 1829, when they moved to Marion (now Morrow) County, Ohio and settled on section 22 in Marvin(now Gilead) Township. They were among the early pioneer settlers of Marion (now Morrow) County, Ohio; here they lived for many years. Samuel Hazen was a farmer and gunsmith and did much of this work for the early settlers and Indians. In politics he was a democrat. Note: I was unable to find the ancestry of Elizabeth DeWitt Hazen, but among the early settlers of Knox County, Ohio were Isaac and John DeWitt, brothers, and natives of Sussex County, New Jersey, who married Mary and Lenore Washer, sisters, and natives of New Jersey. Isaac and John DeWitt, probably brothers or cousins, of Elizabeth Hazen moved their families from Sussex County, New Jersey to Ohio in 1818, the year before Samuel and Elizabeth Hazen moved to Ohio.

The following DeWitt data from Morrow County, Ohio History published 1880 may be of interest:

John and Mary(Washer)DeWitt moved from New Jersey to Ohio in 1818, and settled first in Knox County; the next year they moved to Marion(now Morrow)County and bought one hundred acres of land in Chester Township, where John built a sawmill and later added a grist mill. Here he continued in business for many years. Children: Brice, Isaac, Peter, Henry, John V., Richard, Joseph, Lewis, Levi, William, Phoebe, Elizabeth, and Mary DeWitt. Elizabeth(daughter of John) born Sussex County, New Jersey, married Peter Washer, native of Sussex County, New Jersey. Peter, born December 5, 1812. He moved with his Uncle and cousins to Ohio in 1836, making the trip in a covered wagon. Peter and Elizabeth Washer lived in Chesterville and Mt. Gilead, Ohio. Children: Mary(Washer)Brockelsby, living in the old Washer Homestead in 1880, and Lenore Washer, who married Painter Gier.

John V. DeWitt(son of John) born Sussex County, New Jersey January 23, 1810, married Jane Dalrymple in 1835. Jane was the daughter of John and Jerusha(Sylvester) Dalrymple. They settled on their farm of one hundred forty acres where is now Morrow County, Ohio in 1835, and where they still lived in 1880. Milton DeWitt, a son, born April 22, 1844, married Nettie Philips June 12, 1876. Nettie, daughter of David and Eliza Philips, natives of Sussex County, New Jersey. Children: Nettie, Marjorie, Hugh, Nelson, Hattie, Frank, Daniel and Anna DeWitt.

Note: The above Jane Dalrymple DeWitt was a sister to James I. Dalrymple who married Eliza Hazen, and a half sister to Andrew Dalrymple who married Jerusha Hazen, sister to Eliza, daughters of Samuel and Elizabeth (DeWitt)Hazen. (see pages 43 and 104)

Isaac DeWitt, brother to John, native of Sussex County, New Jersey, married Lenore Washer and moved to Ohio in 1818. They entered forty acres of land on Owl Creek in Knox County. The next year they moved to where is now

Morrow County and bought eighty acres on section 3, on state road in Canaan Township, west of Mt. Gilead; this land was later owned by William Hazen, son of John Hazen born 1807. A daughter, Lucinda, born Sussex County, New Jersey April 6, 1814, married William Feigley in 1833. William, native of Maryland, born 1813. They lived where is now Morrow County, Ohio. Here they first built a round log house of one room; they had a bed, table, chairs, and cupboard, all made out of raw material with an ax. Their home was in a forest and the nights were made hideous by the howling of wolves. Later, they bought one hundred acres of land in Canaan Township, where they lived until their deaths. They were the parents of sixteen children: Isaac, Samuel, Mary, David, Lenore, Elizabeth, Lucinda, John, Daniel, and others. Daniel Feigley served in the war of 1864, and John Feigley was yardmaster on the B. and O. Railroad; he was killed by accident while on duty.

Samuel and Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen

Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen born Sussex County, New Jersey May 8, 1775, died at her home in Morrow County, Ohio August 26, 1850. (75 years) Interment at Mt. Gilead, Ohio in the Old Methodist Cemetery; this cemetery is a part of the New River Cliff Cemetery of sixteen acres which was added to the Old Methodist Cemetery in 1861. (Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen dates copied from her gravestone)
Samuel Hazen III born Litchfield County, Connecticut April 1777, died at Etna Green, in Kosciusko County, Indiana about 1853. Interment Clunette(formerly Galveston)Cemetery, Kosciusko County, Indiana.

Note: The correct date of Samuel Hazen's death is unknown; the dates on his gravestone in Clunette Cemetery are: Samuel Hazen born 1777-8, died about August 10, 1850. As stated above Elizabeth, his wife, died August 26, 1850, and Samuel is known to have lived several years after his wife died.

From Mrs. Richard Hazen, Etna Green, Indiana as follows:
 "Samuel Hazen's wife, Elizabeth, died in Ohio in 1850; soon after her death, Samuel moved to Indiana with his

daughter Eliza and family. (James and Eliza(Hazen) Dalrymple) They made the trip in a covered wagon; and after many weeks on the way, they arrived in Kosciusko County and settled near where is now the home of Mrs. Richard Hazen, at Etna Green. Here Samuel lived with his daughter, Eliza, until his death. Eliza's son, Andrew, was kicked by a horse and died August 10, 1853. (dates copied from Andrew's gravestone) Andrew is buried in the lot in Clunette Cemetery with his grandfather, Samuel Hazen, who died about the same time. James and Eliza Dalrymple moved to Kansas in 1859, and there was no marker put on the lot for Samuel Hazen until years after his death, when Ziba Hazen(son) put up a marker for his father and the correct date of his death was then unknown."

Ezra Hazen

Family No. 1

Ezra Hazen, son of Samuel and Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen, born Sussex County, New Jersey January 5, 1803. In 1819 the family moved to Ohio. Ezra Hazen married Sarah Belknap Clement, cousin, in 1825. Sarah, daughter of Joseph Jr. and Hannah(Hazen)Clement, (see Clement data) born Berrien County, Michigan October 8, 1807. Ezra and Sarah Hazen lived in Berrien County, Michigan, where they owned a farm one mile from Buchanan. They were the parents of thirteen children.

Sarah Belknap Clement

The history of the Clement family dates back to 1656. Daniel Thome Clement and his wife, Hannah, (great grandparents of Sarah Clement Hazen) were quakers and of English descent. A son, Joseph Thome Clement, born 1736, married Hannah Thome, cousin, June 24, 1761. They were the parents of eight children. A son, Joseph Thome

Note: The birthplace of Sarah(Clement)Hazen was first given as Berrien County Michigan and later as Pennsylvania. see note on page 136.

Clement, Jr. born January 28, 1766, married Hannah Hazen June 11, 1805. Hannah, daughter of Samuel Hazen II, and sister to Samuel Hazen III, who married Elizabeth DeWitt. Hannah, born in Litchfield County, Connecticut 1780. Joseph Thome Clement, Jr. born 1766 was a teacher. He served in the war of 1812. Children of Joseph Jr. and Hannah(Hazen)Clement: Gilbert Hecks Clement, born April 16, 1806, Sarah Belknap Clement, born October 8, 1807, Augustus Hazen Clement, born September 2, 1809, Thomas Thome Clement, born March 26, 1811, and Ira Thome Clement, born January 11, 1813.

Sarah Belknap Clement, born October 8, 1807, married Ezra Hazen, cousin, in 1825 and lived in Berrien County, Michigan. It is said that soon after 1850, Ezra and Sarah Hazen separated. Ezra lived in Ohio and died there in 1859. Sarah(Clement)Hazen married (2) Horace A. Woodbridge and resided in Buchanan, Michigan. Horace A. Woodbridge was the father of Sarah Ann Woodbridge who married (1) Ezra Hazen, Jr. (see Ezra Hazen, Jr. family)
Children of Ezra and Sarah(Clement)Hazen:

Sarah, John, Augustus, Hannah, Ezra Jr., Belinda, Malissa, Jerusha, Samuel, Elizabeth, Susan, Martha, and Sarah Ann Hazen.

Sarah Hazen

Sarah Hazen, daughter of Ezra and Sarah(Clement)Hazen, born Berrien County, Michigan February 8, 1826, died February 20, 1826. Interment Oak Ridge Cemetery, Buchanan, Michigan.

John Hazen

John Hazen, son of Ezra and Sarah(Clement)Hazen, born Berrien County, Michigan June 2, 1828, married Elizabeth Dagert March 23, 1847, and resided in Berrien County, Michigan. Children: Lester Hazen. (May be others) Lester Hazen, died of tuberculosis in Johnson County, Nebraska in 1896. Interment Tecumseh Cemetery, Tecumseh, Nebraska.
John Hazen, born June 2, 1828, died March 14, 1860. (32 years) Interment Oak Ridge Cemetery, Buchanan, Michigan.
 (Name and dates copied from gravestone)

Augustus Hazen

Augustus C. Hazen, son of Ezra and Sarah(Clement)Hazen,

born Berrien County, Michigan May 7, 1829, married Martha Jane Sherwood in 1857. Martha, daughter of James Lewis and Rebecca Sherwood, born in Ohio February 6, 1838. James L. Sherwood, native of New York, born May 30, 1804, died in Ohio September 25, 1842. Rebecca Sherwood, native of Massachusetts, born January 14, 1810, died in Minnesota February 28, 1880. Augustus and Martha Hazen lived in Berrien County, Michigan. Children: Martha Jane Hazen.

Martha Jane Hazen, daughter of Augustus and Martha Jane (Sherwood)Hazen, born Berrien County, Michigan April 22, 1860, married James Simpson June 24, 1877. James, son of Henry Green and Rachel(Lewis)Simpson, born December 9, 1855. James and Martha Simpson resided in Montgomery County, Kansas where he was a farmer. Children: Mina, Lola, Maude, Guy, Hugh, and Vivian Simpson.

Mina Love Simpson, daughter of James and Martha(Hazen) Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas June 5, 1875, married twice. Married (1) A. Perry Stillwell February 6, 1898. Children: Albert Leroy Stillwell, born March 4,-----, died April 7, 1932. Perry Stillwell died April 11, 1912. Mina(Simpson)Stillwell, married (2) N. R. Poole and resides at Talmage, California. No children.

Lola Amine Simpson, daughter of James and Martha(Hazen) Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas January 14, 1880, married Aaron Friley. Children: James, Virgil, Mildred, Ralph, Guy, Dorothy, Leonard, and Eugene Friley. Lola(Simpson)Friley, born January 14, 1880, died May 11, 1925. (45 years) Interment----- Note: I was unable to find the address of Lola's children for a better record of her family.

Maude M. Simpson, daughter of James and Martha(Hazen) Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas April 1, 1881, married Frank Henderson June 23, 1901. They reside at 603 East 4th Street, Cherryvale, Kansas. Children: Clerence, Clare, Mina, and Patrica Henderson. Clerence Henderson died when three years old, Clare Henderson, born June 23, 1906 resides at Kansas City,

Missouri. Mina Henderson, born January 26, 1908, married Willis Browne Wood December 25, 1928, and lives at Cherryvale, Kansas. Children: Franklin Henderson, Elizabeth King, and Willis Browne Wood, Jr., Patrica Henderson, born May 25, 1919, married Warren I. Staebler December 25, 1937; they live at Kansas City, Missouri.

Guy Simpson, son of James and Martha(Hazen)Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas January 27, 1885, married Pearl Tusing May 31, 1905. Children: Leonard, born May 31, 1906, and Donald Simpson, born-----1909. Donald deceased. Guy Simpson, born January 27, 1885, died July 20, 1926. (41 years)

Hugh Lee Simpson, son of James and Martha(Hazen)Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas September 28, 1887, married Hazel Fox August 22, 1917; they reside at Blackfoot, Idaho. Children: Naida Lee, born June 11, 1918, and Ward Alexander Simpson, born-----1922.

Vivian Pearl Simpson, daughter of James and Martha(Hazen) Simpson, born Montgomery County, Kansas August 11, 1895.

Vivian, single, resides at Los Angeles, California.

James Simpson, born December 9, 1855, died December 22, 1928. (73 years) Interment Cherryvale, Montgomery County, Kansas.

Martha(Hazen)Simpson, born April 22, 1860, died November 19, 1932. (72 years) Interment Cherryvale, Montgomery County, Kansas.

Augustus C. Hazen, born May 7, 1829, died September 14, 1859. (30 years) Interment Berrien County, Michigan.

Augustus Hazen died in September before his only child, Martha Jane, was born the next April 22, 1860.

Martha Jane(Sherwood)Hazen married (2) Patrick Haggerty in 1862; she was his third wife. Patrick, married (1)

Hannah C. Hazen, sister to Augustus C. Hazen; Hannah died in 1860. Patrick married (2) name unknown. No children. Patrick married (3) Martha Jane(Sherwood) Hazen, sister-in-law to his first wife, Hannah.

Martha Jane(Sherwood)Hazen Haggerty, born in Ohio February 6, 1838, died of typhoid fever at Burlington, Iowa October 21, 1872. (34 years) Interment Burlington,

Des Moines County, Iowa.

Hannah Hazen

Jerusha Sarah Hazen, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth (DeWitt)Hazen, born Sussex County, New Jersey April 7, 1805. In 1819 her parents moved to Ohio and settled in Knox County. Jerusha Hazen married Andrew Dalrymple in

1827. Andrew, son of John Dalrymple and first wife, were natives of New Jersey. Andrew, born Sussex County, New Jersey October 22, 1805. John Dalrymple married twice. Name of first wife unknown. John married (2) Jerusha Sylvester in New Jersey. Children: James I and Jane Dalrymple. (may be others) Andrew moved from New Jersey to Ohio with his father and second family in early days and settled in Knox County. In 1827 Andrew married Jerusha Hazen; later James I. Dalrymple, half brother to Andrew, married Eliza Hazen, sister to Jerusha. (see Family No. 7) From Morrow County, Ohio History Published 1880 as follows: "Andrew and Jerusha(Hazen)Dalrymple moved from Knox County to Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio in 1830, making the trip in a covered wagon drawn by oxen. They settled on the farm his Uncle had entered for him in 1823, on sections 23-35, in Marvin Township,(now Gilead)Marion(now Morrow)County, where they built a log cabin and cleared the farm. Many Indians were in the country in those days, and the wolves made the night hideous about the old cabin home. They had no stock at first only a yoke of oxen, but finally got two sheep and some horses. Andrew Dalrymple hauled wheat from Marion County to Cleveland, Ohio and sold it for fifty cents a bushel. Jerusha spun all the yarn and made all the clothing. Many old pioneer religionists preached in their home in early days. Jerusha(Hazen)Dalrymple attended the first preaching held in Mt. Gilead, Ohio; she carried one of her children five miles to the meeting. Children: John, Mary, Elisabeth, William, Ziba, and Allen Dalrymple, three children died in infancy."(The above from Morrow County, Ohio History.)

Elizabeth, daughter of George and Rebecca(Rogers)Miller, born in Cardington, Ohio in 1850. Allen and Elizabeth Dalrymple resided in the Andrew and Jerusha(Hazen)Dalrymple Old Homestead in Morrow County, Ohio. Children: Anna M., Mary M., and John M. Dalrymple.

Allen Dalrymple, born April 1, 1847, died 1917. (70 years) Interment Mt. Gilead, Ohio.

Mary E.(Miller)Dalrymple resides Route, Edison, Ohio.

Andrew Dalrymple, born October 22, 1805, died November 10,

1879. (74 years) Interment Mt. Gilead Cemetery, Morrow County, Ohio.

After the death of her husband, Jerusha lived on the Homestead; she was in good health and memory at the age of seventy-five years. At the time of her death in 1889, she had been a member of the Methodist Church for over sixty years.

"Charles Dalrymple, born Sussex County, New Jersey 1795, married Nancy Hance, February 1, 1821. Nancy, born Sussex County, New Jersey July 10, 1800. They were of English descent. They moved to Ohio in early days and settled where is now Chesterville, Chester Township, Morrow County, and bought one hundred and sixteen acres of land; they cleared the farm and lived there the rest of their lives. Charles Dalrymple was a member of the Old School Baptist Church. He was a soldier in the war of 1812. He was Justice of the Peace for eighteen years and tax collector for many years. Nancy Hance Dalrymple was a Quaker. Children: Mary, Thomas, Martha, Hannah, H. M., C. H., W. H., and J. W. Dalrymple. The son, W. H., lived on the old homestead in 1880. Charles Dalrymple, born 1795, died February 22, 1875. (80 years) Interment Morrow County, Ohio. One Thomas Dalrymple was Mayor of Whetstone, (now Mt. Gilead) Ohio in 1812.

James Dalrymple, married Esther Lacia. They were natives of Sussex County, New Jersey. He was of English descent and she was of Irish descent. Children: Samuel, born January 15, 1803, Rachel, born February 25, 1811, married Samuel McClenathan, and Mary Dalrymple, who married Blair McClenathan, a son, Richard McClenathan, married Zenas Mills in 1865.

One Thomas Dalrymple was an Attorney at Law over thirty years in Mt. Gilead, Ohio."

John Hazen
Family No. 3

John Hazen, son of Samuel and Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen, born Sussex County, New Jersey June 16, 1807. In 1819 the family moved to Ohio; first, they settled in Knox County, and in 1829 they moved to where is now Morrow County, Ohio. John Hazen married Catherine Harshner in 1831. Catherine, daughter of John and Catherine(Rule) Harshner, born in Maryland May--, 1812. The Harshner family moved from Maryland to Ohio in 1818 and lived in Knox County until 1829, when they moved to Marion (now Morrow)County and settled on section 23, in Marvin Township; this was the same year that Samuel and Elizabeth Hazen moved from Knox County and settled on section 22, in the same township. John and Catherine Hazen lived where is now Morrow County, Ohio. Children: John, William, Jerusha, Mary, Elizabeth, and Catherine Hazen.

John Hazen, Jr.

John M. Hazen, son of John and Catherine(Harshner)Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio 1832, died in infancy. (8 months & 24 days) Interment River Cliff Cemetery, Mt. Gilead, Ohio.

William Hazen

William Hazen, son of John and Catherine(Harshner)Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio March 4, 1833, married Sarah(Hammond)Folk September 26, 1867. Sarah, born where is now Morrow County, Ohio March 27, 1839. William Hazen was the owner of the farm known as the Isaac DeWitt old homestead, on State Road out of Mt. Gilead, Ohio. He was a successful farmer and stockman. No children. Bertha Christman lived in the home of William Hazen; in 1886 five years after the death of her husband, Mrs. Hazen adopted Bertha and her name was changed to Bertha Hazen. She is now Mrs. O. G. Bensley living at 536 East Church Street, Marion, Ohio. William Hazen, born March 4, 1833, died November 21, 1881. (48 years) Interment River Cliff Cemetery, Mt. Gilead, Ohio. Sarah(Hammond)Folk Hazen, born March 27, 1839, died at the home of her adopted daughter, Mrs. Bensley, in Marion,

Ohio. Mrs. Hazen was an invalid for two years; she died December 13, 1915. (76 years) Interment River Cliff Cemetery, Mt. Gilead, Ohio.

Jerusha Hazen

Jerusha Hazen, daughter of John and Catherine(Harshner) Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio July 3, 1835, married Ashur Sams. Ashur, born January 26, 1832. They resided in Ohio and at Bourbon, Indiana. Children: Charles Sams, born July 31, 1864 married three times. Married (1) Tama Lozier. Children: Tama Sams. Tama(Lozier)Sams and daughter, Tama, both deceased. Interments Etna Green, Indiana. Charles Sams married (2) Mary Lytle. Children: two daughters. Mary(Lytle)Sams and both daughters deceased. Interment Etna Green, Indiana. Charles Sams married (3) Mary Ann Cole. No children. Mary(Cole)Sams deceased. Charles Sams, born July 31, 1864, died May 26, 1933 at Plymouth, Indiana Hospital following an operation. (69 years) Interment Etna Green Cemetery, Etna Green, Indiana.

Ashur Sams, born January 26, 1832, died January 9, 1913. (81 years) Interment Etna Green, Indiana.

Jerusha(Hazen)Sams, born in Ohio July 3, 1835, died at her home in Bourbon, Indiana June 17, 1910. (75 years) Interment Etna Green, Indiana.

Mary Hazen

Mary Frances Hazen, daughter of John and Catherine(Harshner) Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio February 20, 1838 married twice. Married (1) James Appleman Jr. in 1866. James, son of James and Nancy(Irwin)Appleman, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio August 2, 1833. James Jr. married twice. Married (1)----- Children: Ida Appleman. James Jr. and Mary(Hazen)Appleman resided on their farm in Morrow County, Ohio. Children: George and William Appleman. James Jr. died in 1873; Mary, with her sons and stepdaughter, Ida, remained on the farm. Mary married (2) Andrew Cummings March 18, 1877. Andrew was a widower with three sons and a small daughter. They moved with their family to Jasper County, Iowa; later they moved to California where they lived until their deaths. George Mitchel Appleman, son of James Jr. and Mary(Hazen)

Appleman, born Morrow County, Ohio July 31, 1868, married Margaret S. Brown May 6, 1890. They reside in Multnomah County, 854 North East 73rd Avenue, Portland, Oregon, where he is a mechanic. Children: Lillian, Florence, Lloyd, and Elma Appleman.

Lillian Gertrude Appleman, born July 5, 1891, married Clark Livingston May 6, 1917. They reside at Portland, Oregon. Children: George William, John Clark, and Robert Stanley Livingston.

Appleman Data from Morrow County, Ohio History as follows:

"James Appleman Sr., the pioneer, was born in Washington County, Pennsylvania in 1798. He emigrated to Ohio when he was eighteen years old and settled in Starke County. When he was twenty-three years old, he entered eighty acres of government land where is now Morrow County, Ohio; then he returned to Starke County and in 1821 married Nancy Irwin. They brought all their worldly effects in a cart and began housekeeping in a cabin that had no upper floor or chinking. They had no bedstead, but slept on the floor until James made a bed from scantling. Their cooking vessel was a small kettle; here, they lived for two years, when they moved to another log cabin, one-half mile northeast of their first cabin. Here they lived until their deaths. James would make over two hundred rails a day, and in time they were the owners of three hundred and twenty acres of valuable land in Morrow County, Ohio. Children: Franklin, Merritt, Abigail, Mary, Stephen, Jennie, James Jr., and Vesta Appleman."

From Joseph S. Appleman, Galion, Ohio and Mrs. Ida(Irwin) Hunter, Retsil, Washington as follows:

"James Jr. Appleman, married twice. Married (1)-----
Children: Ida Appleman. James Jr. married (2) Mary Hazen, daughter of John and Catherine(Harshner)Hazen.

Vesta Appleman, married George W. Irwin, cousin, and lived at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania until their deaths. Children: Ida(Irwin)Hunter, J. Logan, Hattie, and Charles Irwin.

Stephen Byron Appleman, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio November 4, 1837, married twice. Married (1) Julia Ann Waldrof March 24, 1859. Julia, daughter of Joseph and Martha Waldrof, born November 15, 1837. Children: Joseph, and Alma J. Appleman. Julia(Waldrof)Appleman, died January 15, 1874. Stephen married (2) Anna Waldrof, cousin to his first wife, July 2, 1875. Anna, daughter of William and Elizabeth(Hensel)Waldrof, born October 11, 1843. Stephen Appleman lived with his father on the Homestead for many years. The father, James Appleman the pioneer, was still living in 1880 when the Morrow County History was published. He said, it was then almost sixty years since he pulled off his coat and began clearing his farm."

Joseph Seymore Appleman, son of Stephen and (1) wife, Julia Waldrof)Appleman, born near Blooming Grove, in Morrow County, Ohio July 2, 1866, married Ida Cole, daughter of William and Margaret(Mitchell)Cole. Ida, born July 30, 1870. They reside Route 1, Galion, Crawford County, Ohio. Children: Clarence C. of Detroit, Michigan, and Ford K. Appleman. In 1936 Joseph S. Appleman is the owner of the first eighty acres of land his grandfather, James Appleman the pioneer, entered in 1821. He has the government deed for the land. The corner stones, 10 x 10, of the first cabin built on the land are still in position.

James Appleman Jr., born August 2, 1833, died January 25, 1873. (40 years) Interment Galion, Crawford County, Ohio.

Mary(Hazen)Appleman: It is said that Mary Hazen Appleman lived a useful life. She was a woman of unusual business judgement, and was held in high esteem in the community in which she lived. Her every act made for her an exalted citizenship. She was very religious, and did much good work. She was ever ready to help in time of need; her greatest joy was in sacrificing for others. Mrs. Appleman was a devoted wife and mother and made her home and family her life.

Mary(Hazen)Appleman Cummings, born in Marion(now Morrow) County, Ohio February 20, 1838, died at her home in Los Angeles, California May 4, 1896. (58 years) Interment Pomona Cemetery, Pomona, Los Angeles County, California."

Elizabeth Hazen

Elizabeth Hazen, daughter of John and Catherine(Hershner) Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio September 16, 1840, married Henry Cole. They resided in Ohio and Etna Green, Indiana. Children: William, Franklin Cole, and three sons died in infancy.

William Cole, son of Henry and Elizabeth(Hazen)Cole, married twice. Married (1) Nancy(Wilkins)Mallet, former wife of Isaac Mallet.(Cousin) Isaac, son of Elizabeth (Hazen)Mallet, daughter of Isaac and Rachel(LeFevre) Hazen. (see family No. 4) Children: George Cole. Nancy died when her son, George, was two months old. William married (2) ----, widow. They lived in Ohio.

They were the parents of several children. William Cole deceased. Interment Etna Green, Indiana.

Franklin Cole, son of Henry and Elizabeth(Hazen)Cole, married Rena Shingleberger. Children: Ethel Cole, who married Clerence Irwin and resides at 4012 West Main Street, Warsaw, Indiana. Children: Edna, deceased, and Emogene Irwin at home. Rona(Shingleberger)Cole deceased. Frank Cole lives with his daughter, Mrs. Irwin, at Warsaw, Indiana.

Note: the writer's letters to Frank Cole and his daughter for a better record of the Elizabeth Hazen family were not answered.

From Mrs. William Hess, Etna Green, Indiana as follows:

Dear Mrs. Oliver:

August 8, 1935.

Your letter to probate Court regarding the Cole family has been referred to me. I am glad to tell you that my memory goes back to the long ago when the Coles were prominent figures helping to make the pioneer history of this community. I remember distinctly the day Elizabeth Cole died, on October 10, 1884. It was the day my brother was ten years old. Elizabeth died in this town less than a block from my present home. Henry and Elizabeth Cole were very religious; they were of the United Brethren faith. They lived in a period when shouting was extensively practiced. I recall the scenes when I saw the Coles active with other members. I have two years of Sunday School papers, almost a complete file, that were given to me by Elizabeth Cole in the period of the seventies, when I was a member of the childrens' Sunday School Class taught by Elizabeth Cole for several years. Memories of those days are pleasant and sacred memories. Typhoid fever caused the death of Elizabeth Cole. Henry survived her several years. At one time when they were in health, they maintained a small restaurant in Etna Green, in the building now occupied by the Melick Filling Station. For the most part Henry Cole was a day laborer.

Isaac Hazen, son of Samuel and Elizabeth(DeWitt)Hazen, born Sussex County, New Jersey February 8, 1810. His parents moved to Ohio in 1819. They settled first in Knox County, and in 1829 they moved to Marvin Township, Marion County, (now Gilead Township, Morrow County)Ohio where they lived for many years. Isaac married Rachel LeFevre in 1833.

Rachel, daughter of Isaac and Joanna(Wells)LeFevre, born Ohio County, Virginia(now West Virginia)February 8, 1813. Isaac and Rachel Hazen lived in Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio until 1851, when they moved to Indiana; they made the trip in a covered wagon. They settled near Collins Station, in Whitley County where they lived until their deaths. They were members of the Methodist Church. Isaac Hazen was a farmer, and in Politics a democrat. Children: Elizabeth,

Joanna, Henry, Mary, George, Jerusha, Martha, Lyda, Sarah, Martin, Malinda, and Emma Hazen. The first eight children were born in Marvin Township, Marion County, (now Gilead Township, Morrow County) Ohio. Sarah and Martin born in Morrow County. Sarah born 1848, the same year Morrow County was organized, and Martin born 1849. Malinda and Emma Hazen born in Whitley County, Indiana.

LeFevre

From History of New Platz, New York by LeFevre as follows: "The first LeFevre in America was Peter LeFevre, in New Amsterdam in 1653, who later went to New Jersey. In 1683 one Isaac LeFevre located in New Jersey. In the sixteenth century, there were LeFevres in New Platz, Ulster County, New York, New Rochelle, Westchester County, New York, in New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. The LeFevres of Rochelle, Westchester County, New York are descendants of John LeFevre, of San Domingo, whose son, John, came to New Rochelle, New York. Isaac LeFevre, born in France 1669, married Catherine Farree. Simon LeFevre was one of the French Huguenots, who fled from France on account of religious persecutions. Simon and Andries LeFevre represented the family prominent in the French reformation, which endured and suffered much for religion. James LeFevre, born Calias, France, with Simon and Andries, came to Kingston, New York in 1665. They had been at Manhiem in the Palatinate. (Germany) Simon LeFevre married Elizabeth Deyo, daughter of Christian Deyo, of New Platz, New York. Their home stood in the village of New Platz. The present Reformed Dutch Church stands upon a portion of the land belonging to the old Homestead. Neither Simon nor Andries lived long after the settlement at New Platz. On Simon's gravestone are the words: "One of the Huguenots who fled from France soon after the Revocation of the Nantes." Quoting from LeFevre: "It is said the LeFevres lacked energy, did not work hard, were not so noted for book learning, could not talk well, but knew when to keep the mouth shut, a most important quality, showing prudence. On the other hand no feuds or quarrels were reported among the LeFevres in early days. They contributed their

full share to the churches, and served in the war. None sold whiskey. In 1708 one Dr. LeFevre came from France and settled in Boston, Massachusetts; he was one of the famous Huguenots, who fled from religious persecutions to find refuge in the new world. Many LeFevres were among the early settlers in Clinton Township, Knox County, Ohio. The LeFevres have three "Coats of Arms."

From Morrow County, Ohio History as follows:

"Isaac LeFevre, father of Rachel(LeFevre)Hazen, born Butler County, Pennsylvania in 1787 was of French origin. He married Joanna Wells in 1803. Joanna, born in Ohio County, Virginia(now West Virginia) 1789 was of English origin. Joanna's father was a native of England, and came to America as an English soldier during the Revolutionary War, he remained in the country thereafter. Isaac LeFevre, born 1787 was captured by the Indians in Kentucky and sold to the British at Montreal. He refused to take the oath and was incarcerated in prison, but finally with others succeeded in escaping by digging their way out. Isaac and Joanna (Wells)LeFevre were the parents of sixteen children, ten sons and six daughters. They came with their family from Virginia to Ohio in 1822. They stopped one year in Belmont County, Ohio; then moved on to Knox County where they lived until 1829 when they moved to Marvin Township, on State Road in Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio and entered eighty acres of land, three miles north of the present Mt. Gilead. In 1835 they sold this place and moved to Canaan Township, where they bought one hundred and seventy acres of land. Here Isaac LeFevre died in 1864. (77 years) Interment North Canaan Cemetery, Morrow County, Ohio.

Joanna(Wells)LeFevre died in Illinois while on a visit with her children in 1866. (77 years) Interment in Illinois." The following data of Isaac and Joanna(Wells)LeFevre family by Mrs. John J. Hickson, granddaughter:" Children: Josiah, Jackson, Joan, Rachel, Eli, George, John, Wells, Isaac Jr., Robert, Clarrisa, William, Minard, and Mary LeFevre. Names of two daughters unknown. George LeFevre, 6th child born in Ohio County, Virginia, born January 19, 1816 married twice. Married (1) Julia Geller, daughter of Solomon and Sarah(Walker)Geller in 1842. Children: William LeFevre,

who lives in Rossville, Illinois. Julia died February 1851. George married (2) Catherine Moody August 7, 1851. Catherine, daughter of Abraham and Catherine(Bender) Moody, born Cumberland County, Pennsylvania August 24, 1828. Children: Frank, born May 20, 1852 married Mary Lyons 1874. Mary, daughter of Jacob and Esther(Johnson) Lyons, born Sussex County, New Jersey September 28, 1855. Children: Grace, born October 8, 1875, died July 24, 1879, John Edwin, born October 25, 1878, Frank, Ross, Clark, and M. B. all deceased, and Wilson T. who died May 25, 1932. Maggie, daughter of George LeFevre, born Canaan Township March 1859 married Merritt W. Shaw in 1875. Merritt, born Denmark, Ohio November 11, 1852. Children: Inez Shaw, born September 22, 1876 married John J. Hickson; she resides 104 Oak Hill Avenue, Delaware, Ohio. No children.

Maggie(LeFevre)Shaw, died March 1933. Ella LeFevre, single. Ella is the only living member of the George LeFevre family in 1936; she resides at Mt. Gilead, Ohio."

Elizabeth Hazen, daughter of Isaac and Rachel(LeFevre) Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio May 29, 1834. Betty was seventeen years old when her parents moved to Indiana. She married twice. Married (1) Isaac Mallett. Children: Isaac Jr., Sarah, and Mary Ann Mallett. Isaac Mallet Jr., married Nancy Wilkins. They separated. Isaac went to Missouri where he was a physician in Kansas City. Nancy Mallett lived in the home of Jerusha(Hazen) Sams; later she married William Cole, son of Henry and Elizabeth(Hazen)Cole. Children: George Cole. Nancy died when her son, George, was two months old. Sarah and Mary Ann Mallott both married and lived in Washington State. Sarah and Mary both doceased. Isaac Mallett Sr. was a Civil War soldier; he was killed in battle and was not sent home for burial.

Elizabeth(Hazen)Mallett married (2) -----Johnson. No children. Elizabeth(Hazen)Mallett Johnson, born in Ohio May 29, 1834, died at the home of her son, Isaac, in Kansas City, Missouri. Interment Kansas City, Missouri.

Henry Hazen, son of Isaac and Rachel(LeFevre)Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio April 19, 1837. In 1851 the family moved to Indiana. Henry Hazen married three times. Married (1) Elizabeth Jones in 1856. Elizabeth, daughter of Hiram and Catherine(Davis)Jones. They were among the first settlers of Smith Township when it was organized in 1838. Hiram Jones died 1879. Amos Hazen, (twin to Amon) son of Henry and Elizabeth(Jones)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana December 1, 1857 married Alice Markwalder, daughter of John and Mary(Hamlet)Markwalder. Alice, born July 28, 1853. Alice is a twin to Alfred Markwalder, who married Malinda Hazen, sister to Henry Hazen, father of Amos. Amos and Alice Hazen reside in Colorado. Children: Henry Roy, born 1890 married and has four children. Charles Erwin, married-----. Children: Tracy Hazen, born 1911 lives in Colorado.

Note: I was unable to locate the Amos Hazen family or to

find more of their record.

Ella R. Hazen, daughter of Henry and Elizabeth(Jones)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana 1863 married Hiram Hedges in 1882. Hiram, son of William and Phylinda(Nott)Davis Hedges, born 1858. They resided in Whitley County, Indiana. Children: Floyd, Ethel, Herman, William Hedges and a daughter, who died in infancy May 23, 1883.

Floyd Hedges, born Whitley County, Indiana 1885, married Ella Claxton, daughter of Richard and Elizabeth(Harter) Claxton. Children: Philip and Louise Hedges. Floyd Hedges is Pastor of First Church of God. They reside Route 3, Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Ethel Hedges, born Whitley County, Indiana September 6, 1887, married Walter Harrold, son of Gideon and Naomi(Fulk) Harrold. No Children. Ethel(Hedges)Harrold, born September 6, 1887, died December 13, 1908. (21 years) Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

Herman Hedges, born 1889, married twice. Married (1)Daisy K. Jackson. Children: Helen, Esther, Hilda, and Earl Hedges. Daisy(Jackson)Hedges, born 1891, died 1920. Herman married (2) Sadie McIntyre. No children. They reside at Auburn, Indiana where he is Pastor of First Church of God.

William Hedges, born Whitley County, Indiana 1891. Willie, single, resides at Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Hiram Hedges born 1858, died at Lutheran Hospital, in Fort Wayne, Indiana November 20, 1924. (66 years) Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

Ella(Hazen)Hedges, born 1863, died at her home in Smith Township October 31, 1936. (73 years) Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

From Whitley County History published 1882 as follows:

"William Hedges, (father of Hiram) son of James and Nancy Hedges, were natives of Virginia, and of English origin. William, born Belmont County, Ohio 1812. His parents moved to Richland County, Ohio in 1819, where they lived for many years. In 1836 William came West to inspect some land his father had bought at a land sale at Fort Wayne, Indiana, but was seized with ague and returned home. He came back to Indiana on horseback in the Spring of 1837, and began to clear up his farm of one hundred and sixty

acres in Smith Township, which he succeeded in literally redeeming from the wilderness. In 1859 he married the widow of Evan Davis. First, they built a log cabin and later a frame house near the cabin. William Hedges underwent all the privations and hardships of pioneer life. He was one of the first settlers in Smith Township, and was present at its organization in 1838. He has ever been forward in all enterprises tending toward its advancements. Mr. and Mrs. Hedges were members of the Church of God."

Funeral Services at Blue River Methodist Church; Rev. Sheldon officiated. Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

George Hazen

George Hazen, son of Isaac and Rachel(LeFevre)Hazen, born Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio August 5, 1840. He was but eleven years old when his parents moved to Indiana in 1851. They settled on a farm in Whitley County where they lived for many years. On January 15, 1864, George enlisted with Company G. 129 Indiana and served until the end of the war, when he was honorably discharged. He engaged in several important campaigns of the Civil War, and conducted himself as a brave soldier until discharged. He returned to Whitley County and purchased a small tract of land in Smith Township; he added to this during his life and followed the vocation of a farmer. George Hazen, married Lucinda Pence January 6, 1866. Lucinda, daughter of Henry and Mary(Young) Pence, born December 25, 1847. They resided in Whitley County, Indiana. Children: William, Eldora, Elnora, Austin, Cora Hazen, and one child died in infancy.

William Arvina Hazen, son of George and Lucinda(Pence) Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana October 18, 1867, married Cora Alta McGuire December 12, 1889. Cora, daughter of William and Caroline(McDuffee)McGuire, born June 9, 1872. Cora McGuire was a musician; she was a piano player in the Ped Shoaff Orchestra at Churubusco, Indiana. She

attended the Churubusco Schools and was active in Sunday School work at the United Brethren Church. William Hazen was a farmer; in 1893 he began as a well driller and repairman, and was known as a skilled mechanic. William and Cora Hazen lived in Noble and Whitley Counties until 1900, when they moved to Columbia City where he was engaged in the well business for many years. Children: Alta, Marie, and Carl Hazen. William and Cora Hazen divorced December 18, 1902.

Alta Louella Hazen, daughter of William and Cora(McGuire) Hazen, born Noble County, Indiana August 17, 1890. From 1902 Alta and her brother, Carl, lived with their grandparents, George and Lucinda Hazen, in Smith Township. In 1907 Alta moved to Fort Wayne with her mother. She was employed as a clerk for two years; from 1909 to 1913, she was a telephone operator in the main office of the Fort Wayne Telephone and Telegraph Company, in Fort Wayne. Alta married William Clyde Chapman November 13, 1913. William, son of Hugh and Rhea (Finch)Chapman, born in Ohio October 10, 1888. They resided in Fort Wayne, Indiana; he was a mechanic. No children. William and Alta Chapman divorced in 1918 and her name Hazen restored. Alta Lou has followed a business career. She has been associated with the Anthony Wayne Institute in Fort Wayne since 1916. Alta resides with her mother in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Roma Marie Hazen, daughter of William and Cora(McGuire) Hazen, born Churubusco, Indiana July 11, 1895, died September 3, 1895. Interment Blue River Cemetery, Lot 64, Thorncreek Township, Whitley County, Indiana.

Carl Waldo Hazen, son of William and Cora(McGuire)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana September 26, 1896. From 1902 Carl lived with his grandparents, George and Lucinda Hazen, in Smith Township. In 1915 the grandfather died, and Carl, with his grandmother, moved to Columbia City, where she bought a home. On October 16, 1917, Carl and twenty-seven others registered at Columbia City for services in the World War. He and others were to be trained as mechanics at Rolling Prairie, LaPorte County, Indiana; when Carl and Glenn Coolman took sick with influenza, an epidemic prevalent in the country at that time. Other men were chosen to take the place of Hazen and Coolman. An attempt

was made through state authorities to have the order for Whitley County cancelled on account of influenza, but orders were received to send out all men capable of going. In 1919 Carl Hazen, Guy Mullendore, Ralph Cupp, and Herbert Huffman, all of Columbia City, made a tour of the West; they visited many points of interest. In 1920 Carl went to Oklahoma. He came back to Indiana in 1922, and on October 18, 1922 he went to California. He married Mae Hamilton August 1, 1926. William A. Hazen, born October 18, 1867, died June 29, 1934. (66 years) William Hazen was killed by a fall from a windmill he was repairing on the McConnell farm, near Loon Lake, in Noble County, Indiana. Funeral services at Blue River Church; Rev. McCoy of Fort Wayne officiated. Interment Blue River Cemetery, Lot 64, Thorncreek Township, Whitley County, Indiana.

Eldora Hazen, (twin to Elnora) daughter of George and Lucinda (Pence)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana August 13, 1870, died 1871. Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

Elnora Hazen, (twin to Eldora) daughter of George and Lucinda (Pence)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana August 13, 1870, died 1871. Interment Blue River Cemetery, Whitley County, Indiana.

John Austin Hazen, son of George and Lucinda(Pence)Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana March 28, 1872, married Ruhama Davis February 24, 1893. Ruhama, (Hama)daughter of

Isaac and Martha(Turnbull)Davis, born Whitley County, Indiana September 26, 1875. They lived in Whitley County, Indiana; he is a farmer. Children: Franklin, Wilma, and Lawrence Hazen. One son and one daughter died in infancy. John Franklin Hazen, born Whitley County, Indiana October 16, 1894. Frank enlisted in the World War in 1917.

Eliza Kansas Hazen, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth (DeWitt)Hazen, born Sussex County, New Jersey June 1, 1819. Later in the same year, 1819, her parents moved to Ohio and settled in Knox County where they lived until 1829, when they moved to Marion(now Morrow) County; here they lived until 1850. Eliza Hazen married James Isaac Dalrymple July 23, 1837. James, son of John and Jerusha(Sylvester)Dalrymple, born Sussex County, New Jersey March 6, 1815. John Dalrymple, native of Sussex County, New Jersey, married twice. Name of first wife unknown. Children: Andrew Dalrymple, (may have been others) born in Sussex County, New Jersey. John married (2) Jerusha Sylvester in Sussex County, New Jersey. Children: James Isaac, and Jane Dalrymple, (may have been others) born in Sussex County, New Jersey. John and Jerusha Dalrymple moved with their family to Ohio in early days. They settled in Knox County, but later moved to Marion(now Morrow)County. Andrew Dalrymple, son of John and first wife, married Jerusha Hazen, sister to Eliza. (see family No. 2) Jane Dalrymple, daughter of John and second wife, married John V. DeWitt. (see page 7) James and Eliza(Hazen) Dalrymple lived in Marion(now Morrow)County, Ohio; here five of their eight children, Andrew, Mary, Brice, Ward, and Nancy Dalrymple, were born. After the death of Eliza's mother in 1850, James and Eliza with their family and Eliza's father, Samuel Hazen, moved to Indiana. They made the trip in a covered wagon drawn by oxen; and after many weeks on the way, they arrived in Kosciusco County and

settled near Etna Green. Here they lived for several years, and this is where their three children, Clara, Naomi, and William Dalrymple, were born. In 1853 the oldest son, Andrew, was killed by a horse and Eliza's father, Samuel Hazen, died about the same time.

In 1858 James and Eliza with their family went to California; this trip was made in a covered wagon drawn by oxen. The next year they came back East as far as Kansas; arriving there in June 1859, they settled in northern Kansas, in Washington County near what was then Ballard Falls, and near the Little Blue River, seven miles south of what is now Hanover, Kansas. The first rural school in Washington County was held in a log cabin on the farm owned by James and Eliza Dalrymple.

The following letter from Naomi(Dalrymple)Trefethen (daughter) may be of interest:

Dear Mrs. Oliver:

January 15, 1936.

"I am the daughter of James and Eliza(Hazen)Dalrymple. I was born in Kosciusco County, Indiana February 2, 1856, and will be eighty years old February 2, 1936. I was but two years old when my parents left Indiana and started west to California. They came back to Kansas the next year, 1859. I have heard them tell many times about our trip to Kansas. They said we had no trouble with the Indians on our way here; but soon after we were settled here, the Indians made a raid and took two white men and a woman. Other white men were so close on them that they turned the two men loose, but killed the woman. Later when we went across the plains to the mountains in Montana in search of gold, our men had a fight with the Indians; this was July 6, 1864, and four white men were killed. When we came back to Kansas two years later, we came down the Yellowstone and Missouri rivers in a flat boat, made like a wagon box. I was then but eight years old, but I remember about our trip to the mountains and our journey back home to Kansas in 1866."

Dear Mrs. Oliver:

October 10, 1935

"My grandmother, Eliza(Hazen)Dalrymple, was a wonderful woman. I so loved to be with her. I was sixteen years old when she passed away, and I remember her good work and kindness to every one. Grandmother was a midwife, and a good one. No night was too dark or too cold but that she would ride for miles to get to the bedside of a sick friend or neighbor and do what she could to help them, and then care for the babes for days afterward. In so doing she saved many little ones. Her ambition was for me to be a doctor of medicine, and she taught me many of her specials; and in my work it has helped me all through life while I have been a midwife and nurse. I had my certificate in the states of Kansas and Oklahoma while I was in that kind of work."

Brice Dalrymple. A memorial for Brice Dalrymple, published in the "Barnes Chief" at the time of his death, was compiled by Mrs. John Hood, granddaughter, as follows: "Our little city was saddened Sunday afternoon to learn of the death of one of our most honored and respected citizens, Brice Dalrymple. Mr. Dalrymple was for the year and a half Mayor of Barnes. He was born at Mt. Gilead, Ohio October 24, 1843, and died August 23, 1908. His parents moved to Indiana when he was six years old, and in 1859, they moved to Kansas. Brice, married Octavia Trefethen May 11, 1864, and on May 16 they started on a long and eventful trip to Montana. He returned to Kansas in the fall of 1866, homesteading land on the banks of Little Blue River which is now a part of his estate. Thus briefly the facts and dates, but what can be said of happenings and experiences between the dates would fill volumes. Only those who have been on the frontier, who have traveled by the slow and torturous Ox wagon caravan, only those who have seen the Indian in his brilliant war paint and feathers in his murderous ambition to kill and devastate, and only those who have gone through the hardships of draught and grasshoppers can draw a picture of what it really means. Only old settlers can appreciate what it has cost to make Kansas what it is today. Brice Dalrymple, born of Scotch lineage whose name yet ranks high in the mother country possessed an unusual amount of ambition and pluck, which coupled with honesty and determination had made a place in the world for himself. He possessed rare business accumen, and many there are who owe their present condition to his advice and financial help. He did not preach, but he practiced. He left an influence that revibrates among a wide circle of friends who join heartily in this memorial of his useful life. His death marks an epoch in the progress of civilization in Washington County. His name will go down in history as one of the most staunch supporters linked with those who braved the hardships fraught with dangors of bringing Kansas out from the haunts of those who were skoptic of the fertile plains, who thought only of Indians and draught to one of the best states in the union.

Brice Dalrymple now gives up his body to the dust of Kansas of which he loved so well."

Octavia(Trefethen)Dalrymple, daughter of Sebastian and Hannah Trefethen, born Rye, Rockingham County, New Hampshire November 17, 1846 married Brice Dalrymple in Washington County, Kansas May 11, 1864. They were the parents of nine children. Octavia's brothers were David, Alfred, Hubbard, and Albert Trefethen. David, married Clara Dalrymple, Alfred married Naomi Dalrymple. Clara and Naomi Dalrymple were sisters to Brice Dalrymple, who married Octavia.

From Memorial Reminiscences Published by L. A. Bryant, at Waterville, Kansas, compiled by Margurito(Viers)Dalrymple as follows: "Albert Trefethen, born Rye, Rockingham County, New Hampshire in 1835. He enlisted in the Civil War Decombor 1861, in Company C., 46th Rogiment Volunteers Infantry under Captain Marsh. He participated in the capture of Fort Henry, the assault upon Fort Donaldson, a three days' battle. He also assisted in the capture of Jackson, Mississippi, and the first attack upon Vicksburg. He was then sent by water to southern Texas, and was in the siege of Mobile and other battles. He served the entire war and was honorably discharged by H. L. Mitchell, at Baton Rouge, Louisiana January 2, 1866. Albert Trefethen homesteaded east of Patrick Casey's farm, on Fawn Creek, in Washington County, Kansas. He is buried at Lucas, Kansas.

David Trefethen, born Rye, Rockingham County, New Hampshire was a veteran of the Civil War. He homesteaded two miles north of Beaver School House, in Washington County, Kansas. Hubbard Trefethen, born Rye, Rockingham County, New Hampshire in 1836 moved to Illinois. He enlisted in the first of the Civil War in Company I., 75th Illinois Volunteers Infantry, and served under J. C. Davis, under Rosecrans. His first battle was

October 8, 1862, at Perrysville, Kentucky. He was also in the battle of Stone River under Davis and McCook. They won a two days' battle, one of the most desperate of the war. Later he went with Sherman to the Sea, and was in many of these battles. He was honorably discharged at Quincy, Illinois June 6, 1865. Hubbard lived at Barnes, Kansas with his sister, Mrs. Brice Dalrymple, until he went to Oshkosh, Wisconsin, where he died in 1905. He is buried there."

Greenleaf, Kansas
November 5, 1935

"Dear Readers and Relatives:

I am the eldest son of Ward and Mary Dalrymple.

Ward Dalrymple, my father, was the third son of James Isaac, and Eliza(Hazen)Dalrymple, who with their own children and son-in-law, came from Indiana to what is now Washington County, Kansas in the first part of June 1859. They settled near the Little Blue River, seven miles south of the present town of Hanover, Kansas. At that time their nearest Post Office was at Marysville, Kansas, a distance of sixteen miles; their nearest neighbor lived seven miles down the river to the southeast, his name was William Bruce. Many times I have heard my father tell the following story about their trip from Kansas to the mountains in Montana, which may be of interest. Having heard of the big gold strike at Virginia City, Montana, James and Eliza Dalrymple on May 16, 1864, with two of their daughters, Clara and Naomi, (Naomi being the only survivor of the party at this time that we know of) their sons, Ward, William, and Brice(Brice who only a few days before had been married to Octavia Trefothan, she accompanied them) took two wagons drawn by Ox teams, one loaded with flour and provisions, and fifteen miles north of their home, they took as their route the Old Oregon Trail, which by the way, at that place in later years there has been erected a monument by two counties of Nebraska, and one of Kansas, in memory of the pioneers who traveled that trail. There was also a third wagon went from here, a neighbor, William Lillibridge Sr. and his son, William Jr. After traveling a few days west, they caught up with the main immigrant train which altogether made one hundred and sixty wagons, all pulled by oxen, and a few men rode horses. There were two Indian guides, one of which had been over the trail before and know the best camping places; they were paid ten dollars by each wagon owner. It took them all of one day to cross the South Platte River as there was no bridge, and the river was up some. They hitched from six to twelve Ox teams on a wagon and then would go back for another. Some of the oxen would be wading while others would have to swim. They drove from there for about four hours and reached the North Platte River which was

crossed on a bridge. From here they started over the sand hills of Nebraska, which was ninety miles of hard traveling, water being very scarce, and alkali in it making it unfit to drink for man or beast. After leaving the sand hills a short distance, the foremost wagons had started into a canyon in the mountains when someone saw an Indian. All the wagons were stopped and when the Indians knew they had been seen, quite a number came out of hiding, one of the Indian guides went and talked to them. They were Cheyenne Warriors and said they were fighting the Crow Indians, but the guide said not to believe them for they were all warriors. About seventy-five came down to camp, which was about half of them, and were fed by the whites. As soon as the Indians were seen, the wagons were formed into a corral, one back of the other with the cattle and horses inside. While the Indians, who had come down to camp, were eating, six men on horses went to look for one of their men who was back a ways bringing a fresh cow. When these men had just started, the Indians gave a war whoop and then the fight started. These six men were cut off three times before they could reach the corral without being seriously injured. The man who stayed back with the cow was never seen again. The Indians set fire to the timber trying to burn and smoke them out. Four hundred and sixty men rushed up a hill so the Indians could not shoot down on the camp; the battle lasted for about six hours. Had the entire caravan got into the canyon, it would have been a terrible massacre. Four white men were killed and several wounded. One man was brought in with an arrow in his back, four men held him while two doctors removed the arrow; he was very ill afterwards but lived. It was estimated that about half of the Indians were either dead or wounded, as they lay over their ponies, for they were tied on their horses. One man had the hammer shot off his gun; Ward Dalrymple and William Lillibridge Jr. had a very narrow escape when they went to get a buffalo robe and blanket dropped by the Indians. After this battle, the train was not molested for the rest of the journey, but

thereafter they were more on the lookout and prepared. The party reached Virginia City, Montana in September after over three months of travel and hardships to find to their great disappointment that all the gold claims around there had been taken up the year before. For seven miles up and down the gulch they were taking out lots of gold. Wages were high and the men had no trouble getting work, there being no railroad everything had to be freighted in by wagons over the high mountains. All groceries were high, coffee \$1.25 per pound, flour \$25.00 to \$50.00 per hundred pound sack and other things accordingly. One winter while they were there, the snow became so deep that no wagons could get in or out for provisions for a long time, and for three weeks no one had any flour. Some people would have given almost any amount of money for a little flour of some kind. Wild game was very plentiful; therefore they had lots of meat, but father said after one week the meat did not go down good with no bread to go with it. After they had been there for two years, the mines were all worked over and the people starting to leave; a number of years later these mines were reworked with modern machinery. Today there are only a few log houses and a few people there searching for rubies. Their homeward trip was started in the fall of 1866. They paid fifty dollars each to be taken overland to not far below the falls, on the Yellowstone River, a distance of about fifty miles where they got a flat boat, six feet wide and sixteen feet long. There were fifty-six other boats of different sizes leaving at the same time. They were to go through Indian country, so all kept together until they reached Fort Buford where the Yellowstone River empties into the Missouri River; there the party broke up going in different directions. Three boats came on down the Missouri River to Nebraska City, where they landed on October 23, 1866, a distance of almost two thousand miles from Virginia City, Montana. After reaching Nebraska City, Brice and Ward Dalrymple walked back to their old home on Little Blue River, which was about one hundred and

fifty miles; they got an Ox team and wagon and drove back for their folks who were very glad to see them and that they could start on the last stretch of their homeward journey, even though some were compelled to walk most of the way, ending a never forgotten trip. While they were at Virginia City, Montana, there was one death, that of William Lillibridge Sr. and one birth, that of Alonzo J. born to Brice and Octavia Dalrymple. When James and Eliza Dalrymple returned from their trip, they went to their old home that they still owned, the one which they had settled on in 1859. Here they spent the rest of their lives. They were laid to rest in the Pine Hill Cemetery, one and one-half miles east of their home. In this cemetery, there are three of their children, and their wives and some of their children making twenty-nine that are related."

Barnes, Kansas

"In 1925, Grandmother, Octavia Dalrymple, had printed in the "Barnes Chief" the following article:
The date July 6, 1925, recalls to the mind of one of our residents an event occurring on that date sixty-one years ago. It was during the gold rush after the finding of gold near Virginia City, Montana, that several families of the neighborhood that is now (1925) known as Ballard Falls, decided to cross the plains to Montana. The party included the following people, William Lillibridge and his father, James and Eliza (Hazen) Dalrymple and their family, Clara, Naomi, Ward, William, Brice, and Octavia Trefethen who was married to Brice Dalrymple just a few days before the start was made. They were married May 11, 1864, and the party started on May 16, in wagons pulled by oxen. They drove to the main trail to join the big train, but found it had started some time before. They started on at once hoping to catch the train before they reached the Indian

country. The train made up of one hundred and sixty wagons was overtaken July 4, just as they were nearing the Indian Country. The guides were then paid ten dollars for each wagon and as their oxen were tired out the train was halted and they rested over all day July 5. The guides were anxious to get out in a more open country where they would be safer, and they ordered a drive of several miles before breakfast on July 6; they then halted to make camp and before they had the oxen all un-yoked the Indians attacked them. There were hills close to camp and another range a little farther back and while the women corraled the stock the men fought the Indians back to the second row of hills which kept them from shooting down into camp. The fighting lasted until four o'clock in the afternoon. It is not known how many Indians were killed. One man had gone to hunt a cow that had strayed off; when he did not come back, a searching party started out to look for him and had gone but a short distance when the Indians cut them off from the train. They had to run back through the Indian lines, while none were killed, one man came in with an arrow sticking in his back. The man who was hunting the cow was never seen again. During the day one Indian kept trying to shoot over into the camp, finally one man undertook to creep upon him, but the Indian caught sight of him and shot him. The Indian also shot the hammer off of the gun of a man who went out to carry the wounded man back to camp.

Ward Dalrymple and William Lillibridge had a narrow escape when they went after a buffalo robe and an Indian blanket the Indians had dropped; just as they reached them the Indians opened fire, but the white men fired on the Indians and they hid again. The train was not molested again. One full day was taken to ford the Platte River. Ropes were tied to the horns of the head oxen of each wagon, and they were led up stream by men riding on horses. Virginia City, Montana was reached in September. During their stay of nearly two years there was one death, that of William Lillibridge Sr. and one birth, Alonzo Dalrymple.

In the fall of 1866, the start home was made and for the payment of fifty dollars each for the grown ups, and twenty-five for the baby, they were taken overland to the Yellowstone River. Here they were given a flat boat, and along with about fifty other boats they drifted down the river; this river flows swiftly and some exciting times were had. They then entered the Missouri River and landing was made at Nebraska City, October 23, 1866. The women and part of the men stayed there while Ward and Brice Dalrymple walked to their home. They broke a team of steers and then drove back for the rest of the family. The steers were young and were tired out and could not haul all of the luggage and women too, so Mrs. Brice Dalrymple and one other woman walked all the way home, a distance of about seventy-five miles. This journey was not so easily forgotten by those who participated in it."

(page 9) Later the Clement data gave it as Sarah Clement, born in Pennsylvania October 7, 1807; however, names and dates copied by the Woodbridge family from gravestone gave it as follows: Sarah Clement Hazen Woodbridge, born November 8, 1807, died March 18, 1874. 66 years, 4 months, 10 days. On page 43 the year of birth should be 1807 and not 1808. (printer's error)

The following letter from Mr. Roy may be of interest.

Lincoln, Nebraska
June 4, 1934.

Dear Madam:

"Your letter received, asking me to explain "Old Hardwick and Yellow Frame." A large section of lower Sussex and North Warren Counties, in New Jersey was at an early day called Hardwick,(never called Hardwick now but often alluded to as ancient Hardwick)

hence "Old Hardwick" Sussex County was called Upper Hardwick, and Warren County was called Lower Hardwick. There was no county Hardwick, but in northern Warren County there was a Hardwick Township which bordered Sussex County. The name Hardwick comes from one John Hardwick, who in early days owned a large tract of land in both Sussex and Warren Counties. He died in 1830. There was also a certain section near the Blue Ridge Mountains, where there was a Post Office, called Center Hardwick. Now as to "Yellow Frame." There was a Presbyterian Church near Hackettstown, in Warren County in early days called Hardwick Church; this church dates back to 1823. Many of the folks had to go fifteen miles or more to this church; people in the upper section wanted a church nearer so they started a church at "Dark Moon," a woods place where there was a Hotel with a moon sign on it. "Dark Moon" was fifteen miles north of Hackettstown; here they built a log church, this church was called Upper Hardwick, and the Hackettstown Church was called Lower Hardwick. The new church was also called Dark Moon Church. In 1786 the folks further north (my ancestors, Roy, Handkinson, and Hazons) lived in this farther north section. The old log church needed repairs and a vote was taken, if to build there or go farther north. The upper folks carried and the site removed farther northwest to "Shaws Lane," and a big church 40 by 60 built in 1786. This was long known as Hardwick Presbyterian Church. My grandparents, great, and great great grandparents attended church there. I was born in 1858, and also attended church there until 1886 when the old church was condemned; in 1887 they built a new church across the road from where the old church stood. In 1840, the old church built in 1786 was painted yellow, hence the name "Yellow Frame." The name holds good to this day "Old Hardwick Yellow Frame Presbyterian Church." I joined this church in 1887, and still belong there. This old Yellow Frame church 40 by 60 had a gallery on both the east and west sides and the south end, and a pulpit at the north end, also a large vestibule

at the north end, and a stairway to the gallery. We had a melodian and later an organ in the south end of the gallery, and a choir when I was a lad. The new church built in 1887 was always kept painted yellow. Arron Hazen, who married a Vaught, was Elder of the Old Yellow Frame Church; he was a fine preacher. His home burned down and a son burned to death, and all of the old church records were burned. This was before my day, but I knew all his family. The first Sussex County Hazens were buried in the Dark Moon Cemetery. My parents, Charles and Elizabeth(Handkinson)Roy, grandparents, William and Nancy(Handkinson)Roy, great grandparents, James and Elizabeth(Hazon)Handkinson, great, great, grandparents, William and Susan(DeWitt)Handkinson, also great grandparents, Ensley and Isabelle(Rhoads)Roy, great, great, grandparents, George and Anna(Roy)Gable, all are buried in the cemetery at Old Yellow Frame Church. Over one hundred Roys are buried there.

My old home at Fredon, Sussex County, New Jersey, sixty miles northwest of New York City, has been in our family since 1856; there are eight bedrooms, three old fire-places, bake oven, lintern, to keep wash tubs in, pond barrels, benches, and boilers in a shed against the house. In 1900, I had every house in all Fredon district photographed, some over seventy, and have all in a book; they are fine. In 1887, when the new yellow frame church was built, I had both the old 1786 and new 1887 churches photographed on white silk and made into a banner; they are still fine. I used to paint a lot of paintings, and drawings, did pen and fancy work. I made maps of nine or ten old graveyards, showing the location of every visible grave with names and dates of every stone in all the old yards, Yellow Frame 1786, Dark Moon, Newton old and new, and many others. I have much data of other old yards, Field yards, Hunts Field 1752, a map of "Ye old time Gardens," also have notes of all my ancestors. I have the Roy Coat of Arms, motto on a Tendi, came to America 1711, Handkinson Coat of Arms, motto Viet Animo, came to America 1683.

I have spent over one-half century in historical work, and have written histories of the Roy and Handkinson families, histories of the Old Yellow Frame Presbyterian Church, history of my Old Home at Fredon, New Jersey from 1760. In my home I have a museum; I have many old dishes, and books printed before 1603, many of which are Bibles. The largest Bible is the Bibliorum, an extra large volume in two parts, printed in 1609, two large family Bibles 1817-1818, another Bible, an old heirloom of 1803 which belonged to a great Aunt, my mother's Bible 1854, a Japanese Bible used by W. J. Arling, when he first went to Japan given to me in 1908, a Chinese New Testament, and an old Korean Volume. Also other Bibles. I have quilts my mother made in 1834, when she was nine years old, also old samplers mother made in 1834. I have mother's hair braid when she was a girl and Dad's stove-pipe wedding hat of 1854. I have a strip of the first paper printed in Sussex County, New Jersey, "The Farm Journal 1796," an election ticket from the year Lincoln was a candidate, a 4th of July program of Branchville, New Jersey 1835. I have two volumes of the "Saints Everlasting Rest" by Richard Baxter printed in 1669, also books dating from my mother's school days, a New England Primer 1836, Copy Book 1834. In addition to mother's books, I have McGuffey's Volumes, Daballs Arithmetic, The Columbian Orator, and Parleys Geography texts, more familiar to children of long ago than to those of today. I have a copy of Koran, a very fine one, sent to me from Constantinople. I prize very highly a book of the Famils Dravidian people of Hindustan and Ceylon on papyrus, an old book of the deeds of the "Hero Rama." I have several Hymnals published 1804 on through the Civil War, and a book of Chinese Gospel Hymns; there are many other specimens found in my museum. Visitors are always welcome. I am a member of New Jersey Genealogical Society, a member of New Jersey Historical Society, and a member of Sussex County Historical Society, of Newton, New Jersey. I am sending you data I have on the Hazens, see if

you can fit your crowd in somewhere. I imagine your Hazen line came from some of my ancestors, as my line are from Hazens away back who came from Massachusetts. I will be glad to assist you in any way I can, but you will see I have only my line of Hazens."

From History of Bradford, Vermont as follows:

"Moses Hazen, native of Hampstead, Rockingham County, New Hampshire. (see page 1) Moses Hazen was a hero in the French and Indian War; he was first captain and later General. Robert Hankins, a young man seventeen years of age, who lived in the Hazen home, at Hampstead went with Captain Hazen and his company into what is now called the Old French and Indian War, then fiercely raging between the French and Indians on one side, and the English North Americans and British Government on the other. Captain Hazen and his men were sent to strengthen the force at Fort William Henry, on the northern shore of Lake George. This Fort, after brave defense, was taken by the French Commander, Montcalm, in 1757. The English who survived the slaughter were carried by the French and Indians into Canada as prisoners and were treated with great severity. Young Hankins saw two Indians dragging his friend, Captain Hazen, away; Hankins and a fellow soldier ran up behind them and gave the Indians

so violent a push as to break their hold on Hazen. Captain Hazen escaped , but the Indians took young Hankins and his friend captive. They were carried off instead of Hazen, and taken into the enemies country but to what place or how long they were held prisoners is not known, but believed to be about six months. The Indians took away most of Hankin's and his friend's clothes, and at night would tie their hands behind them and require them to lie down between some two of the Indians who were charged with their safe keeping. One night Hankins succeeded in getting his hands loose, and was not long in untying the hands of his friend. They softly crept away, ran down to the shore and got into a birch-bark canoe and pushed off to some other point so as not to be tracked. They came to a landing place, broke a hole in the canoe and sank it; then hid in some hollow logs nearby, but they were pursued by the Indians and several times next day the Indians came to the very logs in which they were hid, but did not find them. That night they started again and got beyond the reach of the Indians. They had no hats or shoes, in fact no clothes, but their shirts with one sleeve missing. They had only what they found in the woods to eat, but finally they reached a dutch settlement where a kind woman gave them buttermilk to drink, and some old hats without brims. Pressing on through difficulties and humiliations by having no clothes, they finally reached in safety their friends at home.

No further notice is given Captain Hazen until 1763, when at Moorestown, (now Bradford) Vermont (see page 1) General Moses Hazen, of Hampstead, Rockingham County, New Hampshire had laid out four thousand acres of land on the western side of Bradford. This land was in Orange County, on the west side of the Connecticut River, in the great meadow lands called "The Coos" and was known as the Hazen tract. This land was surveyed by John McDuffee, Esq., in 1791." (see page 2)
