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P R E F A C E

As there is a Hurlbut genealogy compiled by Henry Higgins Hurlbut that was published by Joel Munsell's Sons, Albany, N. Y., in the year 1888 that can be had by sending to them, I have not undertaken the repetition of all of the work done by him, but have given the line of connection from the beginning of his work down to William Hurlburt, who is known in his work as Number 197 and in this work as Number 27.

The work spoken of above is excellent down to William Hurlburt but is very incomplete as far as William Hurlburt and his posterity is concerned. So from William down to date I have given almost a complete record of our family and hope that all will take an interest in it and keep their records up so that in future it will be much less work to compile our family records.

Mr. Henry Higgins Hurlbut in his work mentions the fact that the spelling of our family name is uncertain and that it has suffered various mutations in form since the settlement of our early ancestor at Weathersfield, Conn., some 285 years ago. He spells the name HURLBUT. We have no knowledge of the antecedents of our ancestor Thomas Hurlbut across the Atlantic, and he wishes that none will change the mode of spelling the name from anything said in his work, nor is it desirable, on account of identity in the years to come.

In this work I have adopted the William Hurlburt way of spelling the name, namely Hurlburt.

As a matter to be proud of we need scarcely attempt to look after a lineage more noble than we have at home, beginning when our ancestor first placed foot upon American soil. It is true that it would be gratifying to our curiosity at least, could we be furnished with a series of photographic pictures, and a faithful description of our ancestors in the old world, running back to the days before the use of spinning wheel and loom when our forefathers were clad in skins.

I wish to thank everybody that has helped me and hope that they will appreciate my efforts in procuring what I have of our family records.

INTRODUCTION

The home of the parents of our emigrant ancestor, (whose Christian name was Thomas) whether in England, Scotland or Wales, has not been revealed to us; yet it is reasonably supposed that it was somewhere upon that island. Neither do we know the form in which those parents spelled their surname, nor indeed in what mode Thomas himself wrote the name, after his arrival on this side of the Atlantic. It cannot be proven by early records, and if there were such records, the scribes of that day were often rather careless in their orthography, or at least were quaint and peculiar. It would seem that the atmosphere of the new world gave freedom to their pens, and not unfrequently originality to their autographs. The above was taken from the Henry Higgins Hurlbut Genealogy. The plan of this genealogy will be readily understood without much explanation. Thomas Hurlbut is given as Number 1, and every descendant whose name was received in time to be marshalled in the regular line has a number, when further notice of any individual is continued, it is indicated by the star mark *. The number of generations preceding each head of the families of the eight in the William Hurlburt family are represented by the line of paternal progenitors beginning with the emigrant Thomas as No. 1.

In each family commencing with the emigrant Thomas down to William Hurlburt I have carried out our paternal progenitor only, as follows:

No. 2 in the emigrant's family, No. 10 in Thomas Jr's family and No. 24 in Nathaniel's family.

1—THOMAS HURLBURT, according to the Hurlbut genealogy gotten out in the year 1888, came across the Atlantic, it was supposed, in the year 1635, for he was a soldier under Lion Gardiner who built, and had command of the fort at Saybrook, Conn. Lion Gardiner, it is said, was an Englishman, and by profession an engineer, and had been in Holland in the service of the Prince or Orange, but was engaged by the proprietors of the Connecticut Patent, issued by Charles II to Lord Say and Seal, Lord Brooke and others, granting a large tract of territory on the banks of the Connecticut river, to erect a fortification at its mouth. Gardiner, said Judge Savage, embarked at London in the *Bachilor*, of only 25 tons, August 11, 1635, with his wife and female servant, and eleven male passengers, and after a long and tempestuous voyage, arrived at Boston November 28, 1635. It is believed, however, that Gov. Winthrop told that Gardiner sailed in a Norsey barque (a fishing vessel of the coast of Norway), July 10, 1635. It is supposed that Thomas Hurlbut was one of the eleven passengers above referred to; but who his parents were, or when or where he was born, we have not been able to learn. We may yet pretty confidently believe that his birth occurred as early as the year 1610, and I am more inclined to believe that he was a native of Scotland than I am able, perhaps, to show satisfactory evidence for such belief.

Mr. Hurlbut while at Saybrook, in an encounter with the Pequot Indians in 1637, was wounded by an arrow. This appears in a letter of Lion Gardiner, written in June 1660, some 23 years after the skirmish with the Indians, addressed to Robert Chapman and Thomas Hurlbut, detailing incidents regarding the Pequot war, as far as came within his personal knowledge. Capt. Gardiner, in the communication named, says that Mr. Robert Chapman, Thomas Hurlbut and Major Mason urged him to do it, "and having rumaged and found some old papers then written it was a great help to my memory." The document laid in manuscript until 1833 (173 years) when it was printed in vol. 3, 3d Sec. of Mass. Historical Soc. Colls. The following is an extract:

"In the 22nd of February, I went out with ten men and three dogs, half a mile from the house (fort), to burn the weeds, leaves and reeds upon the Neck of Land, because we had felled twenty timber trees, which we were to rol' to the water-side to bring home. every man carrying a length of match with brimstone-matches with him to kindle the fire withal. But when we came to the small of the Neck, the weeds burning, I having before this set two sentinels on the small of the Neck, I called to the men that were burning the reeds to come away, but they would not until they had burnt up the rest of their matches. Presently there starts up four Indians out of the fiery reeds, but they ran away. I called to the rest of our men to come away out of the marsh.

"Then Robert Chapman and Thomas Hurlbut, being sentinels, called to me, saying there came a number of Indians out of the other side of the marsh. Then I went to stop them, that they should not get the woodland; but Thomas Hurlbut cried out to me that some of the men did not follow me, for Thomas Rumble and Arthur Branch threw down their two guns and ran away; then the Indians shot two of them that were in the reeds, and sought to get between us and home, but durst not come before us, but kept us in a half moon, we retreating and exchanging many a shot, so that

Thomas Hurlbut was shot almost through the thigh, John Spencer in the back into his kidneys, myself into the thigh, two more shot dead. But in our retreat, I kept Hurlbut and Spencer still before us, we defending ourselves with our naked swords, or else they had taken us all alive, so that the two sore wounded men, by our slow retreat, got home with our guns, when our two sound men ran away and left their guns behind them."

Gardiner does not mention his estimate of the number of the assailants, but Underwood, in his history, says there were "a hundred or more."

Mr. Hurlbut was by trade a blacksmith, and after the war with the Pequots, he located and established himself in business at Wethersfield, Conn., and was one of the early settlers of that place, as well as first blacksmith. A single extract from the colonial record would seem to indicate that he was a good workman and charged a good price for his work: "March 2, 1642 Thomas Hallibut was fined 40 shillings for encouraging others in taking excessive rates for work and ware." But this fine appears to have been "respired" February 5, 1643, upon Peter Bassaker's trial to make "nayles" with less loss and cheaper rates.

He seems to have been a man of good standing in the place; he was Clerk of the "Train Band" in 1640, Deputy to the General Court, Grand Juror and also Constable in 1644. It appears on the records that he received various tracts of land in the several divisions of the town, which were recorded together in 1647. In 1660 the town of Weathersfield granted Thomas Hurlbut Lot 39, one of the "four score acre lots)) (in Naubuc, east side of the river), which he afterward sold to Thomas Hollister. For his services in the Indian wars, the Assembly voted him a grant of 120 acres of land October 12, 1671. It is supposed that Mr. Hurlbut died soon after the last named date, as no evidence appears that the land was set off to him during his life. In that early day of the colony, land was plenty and cheap, and no attempt appears to have been made to avail himself of the bounty, nor even by his sons. it was not until 1694, on the petition of John Hurlbut, Jr., of Middletown, a grandson of the settler and soldier, that it was set off.

It is told, and the tradition is not an unreasonable one to credit, that the house in Weathersfield, Conn., where Miss Harriet Mitchell resides in 1888, stands upon the site of the dwelling of the first Hurlbut who lived in the settlement. (Miss M. is said to be the sixth generation from the ancestor Thomas Hurlbut). The house of the early settler, as tradition gives, had peculiar attractions for the Indians, whether with the purpose to inspect the architecture of the edifice, or else to get a view of the proprietor of the mansion, for he had been an Indian fighter formerly, I cannot say; but often, when in the village, they were to be seen looking curiously in at the windows.

The Christian name of the wife of Mr. Hurlbut was Sarah, but nothing further is known; no date of birth, marriage, nor death. The dates of birth of five of their six sons are missing; whether there were any daughters or not, is not known. During the contention that existed in the church of Wethersfield, the early records of both the town and church, it is understood, disappeared.

2—THOMAS HURLBURT, JR., (Thomas) was probably born in Wethersfield, Conn., but the date not ascertained. He learned the blacksmith's trade of his father and succeeded him in the business. He married twice, first Lydia, second Elizabeth The town of Wethersfield, March 11, 1662, voted him a piece of land to set a shop upon. By the inventory of the estate of Thomas Hurlburt, Jr., of Wethersfield dated March 6, 1689 (Probate Court Records, Hartford), it appears that he died September 1689. Appended to the inventory are the names of his wife and three children. He left widow Elizabeth, and sons Timothy 9 years, Nathaniel 7 years and Ebenezer 4 years, besides an older son Thomas. His brother Stephen was appointed administrator. His estate £57,19s, including blacksmith tools, household furniture, etc., and "eight shillings due from Thomas, Jr." (meaning his son no doubt) was declared non-solvent. I could not fall in with the suggestion of the late Hon. Edwin Stearns, that Thomas (son of the emigrant) did not enter into family estate until middle life, and that his first wife was the mother of all his children. Thomas was about fifty years old probably at his death; my belief is that the first wife was the mother of the son Thomas third (called "Thomas Jr.") in the inventory, who became a resident of Woodbury, Conn., and that the three other children were those of the second wife. I venture to so record them here:

10—NATHANIEL HURLBURT 3. (Thomas, Jr., 2, Thomas 1), was born in Weathersfield, Conn., in or about 1682, being seven years old at the time of his father's death in September, 1698. It is told probably with truth, that after his father's death he was taken by his Uncle Joseph Hurlburt of Woodbury, Conn., where he lived until manhood. His name appears upon the list of freemen, and he was taxed in Woodbury in 1712. He married twice, first Sarah Jenner October 19, 1708. Mr. Cothren gives from the records of Woodbury, the death of Sarah, the widow of Nathan Hurlbut, June 10, 1722. I am inclined to think she was the first wife of Nathaniel

instead of Nathan. Sarah, widow of Nathaniel, was admitted to the Congregational church of Woodbury, July 26, 1713, she having owned the Covenant July 25, 1708. I learned from Mr. Stearns, that Nathaniel settled in Simsbury, Conn., (Turkey Hills) not later than 1725. He married the second time to Mary Halliday in Suffield, Conn., January 9, 1727. He died in Simsbury, June 1, 1756. Administration was granted on his estate to his widow Mary and Reuben Hurlburt, son of deceased. Inventory dated July 23, 1756; Estate 89 s. 11; January 3, 1758, the Probate Court ordered that the 10 acres of land in Woodbury, on petition of Mary the widow, be sold to pay the debts. May 9, 1759, the widow Mary then of Farmington (probably her native place), presented the administrator's account when the land at Woodbury and Turkey Hills had been sold.

24—THADDEUS HURLBURT 4. (Nathaniel 3, Thomas, Jr., 2,

Thomas 1) was baptized in Woodbury, Conn., September 21, 1746. He married Eleanor Chapman in Dalton, Mass., and served in the Revolutionary army. The date of her birth, nor the dates of death of either Mr. or Mrs. Hurlburt is not learned.

25—THADDEUS HURLBURT, JR., drifted away from the rest of the family and was never heard from. We have no record of him.

26—DANIEL HURLBURT, never married. He was a shoemaker and went from house to house mending shoes and boarding with the people he worked for. He had very little of this world's goods and seemed to care nothing about the accumulation of wealth. It is related that he was at his brother William's who was a farmer and quite well to do, and a big snow storm came. William had been out all the morning looking after his stock and came in feeling troubled because several of his sheep were missing. Daniel was sitting in a rocking chair by the fire smoking his pipe and after his brother had related his troubles, said, blessed be nothing, he that has nothing has nothing to lose. And kept on with his rocking and smoking.

27—WILLIAM HURLBURT, 5 (Thaddeus 4, Nathaniel 3, Thomas, Jr. 2, Thomas 1), was born in Dalton, Mass., October 4, 1773 and died at Harpersville, N. Y., July 23, 1849. His wife, Elis Austin, was born February 6, 1782 and died at Harpersville, N. Y., May 19, 1868.

They were married about the year 1798. He was a local preacher in the M. E. church and formerly lived at Warren, N. Y. He afterwards resided in Harpersville, Broom County, N. Y., where he was a prosperous farmer the remainder of his life.

William Hurlburt's mother's maiden name was Eleanor Chapman.

Elis Austin's mother's maiden name was Esther Russell.

George F. Hurlburt was born October 26, 1829. Died June 2, 1915.

Nancy Elizabeth Saxton. Born November 18, 1832, Died August 7, 1877. They were married at Northampton, Peoria County, Ill., on September 28, 1857.

George F. Hurlburt was born at Harpersville, Broom County, N. Y. and died at Utica, Seward County, Nebraska, at the age of 85 years, 7 months and 7 days.

Nancy Elizabeth Saxton was born in Madison County, Brookfield Township, N. Y. and died on the old Homestead five and one-half miles south of Utica, Seward County, Nebraska, at the age of 44 years, 8 months and 19 days.

George F. Hurlburt spent his boyhood days on a farm near Harpersville, N. Y., attended a country school and at the age of 17 years he taught school, first at Harpersville, then in Pennsylvania and from there, when about 21 years old, went to Ohio and then to Illinois, where he put in about seven years teaching. He and Nancy E. Saxton were married at Northampton, Illinois, on September 22, 1857. They purchased and moved on to a small farm near Northampton, Ill. The years 1858 and 1859 were very bad crop years, 1858 having frost every month in the year. This exhausted what little they had and the farm depreciated in value so they turned it back to the original owner for what they owed on it, losing about \$1500, which was all that he had saved up from teaching school for several years. In the winter of 1860 they moved with their two children by team to Coal Hollow (now Bartonville) about three miles west of the City of Peoria, Ill. Here he started from the bottom. The first year he dug coal by the bushel and then got a good position in the coal office weighing and settling with the miners and customers. He also put a man to hauling coal to Peoria for him by the bushel. In 1864 he joined Company G, 14th Regiment of Illinois infantry and served to the end of the war. In 1870 and 1871 he farmed about 40 acres in addition to his office work, making good use of his two oldest boys. The land he farmed was on the old Kickapoo creek bottoms and he had good crops both years.

In 1872 with their family of four boys and one girl, the oldest boy thirteen and the girl less than a year old, and their savings amounting to about \$1500 in horses, wagons, household goods and money they decided to go west. Mr. Hurlburt with the three oldest boys moved overland by teams and wagons, settling on a homestead in Seward County, Nebraska. Mrs. Hurlburt and the two youngest children not coming until he had a house built. Success crowned their efforts here in a small way, notwithstanding the grass-hoppers and other new country hardships. We hauled our first crop of wheat to Lincoln, Neb., a distance of about 40 miles. In 1877 Mrs. Hurlburt died, leaving a family of four boys and two girls, the youngest only one month old. Mother's two sisters, Emily and Eliza came out from Illinois and stayed with us for about a year. In 1881 he went into the grain business and in January, 1882, he was joined by his son, C. G. Hurlburt, in the grain and mercantile business and later the banking business was added. They remained in partnership and prospered so that all of his children received a good inheritance at his death.

He was active in business and public life, always in favor of consistent public improvements; was County Commissioner of Seward County for two three-year terms and was a member of the village board and school board for several years. He believed there was more danger of rusting out than of wearing out and he did business as long as he was able. His life was one of straight-forward, honest dealing with everybody.

I look back upon my boyhood days in old Coal Hollow, Illinois, where we lived until I was thirteen years old, and think what a carefree time we boys had. Father and mother were in very moderate circumstances; father was an excellent father and a good provider, and mother was a real mother and a most excellent cook. Then in 1872 we moved overland by teams to Nebraska on to the old homestead, where we stayed for ten years. The country was new and a wonderful place for boys. We worked hard, but played just as hard. We lived near where beaver creek and blue river came together, and fishing, hunting and swimming was where we got busy when work was done. Father was a good general with his boys and never told them but once how to do anything, but was very careful to not give them more than they could do if they applied themselves as they should. To my knowledge I had never disappointed him in making good on what he gave me to accomplish. I will here relate an instance that showed what he expected and how miserable I would have been if I had disappointed him. In 1882 I went into business with him and Mr. Liggett. I handled a general store for a year and three months. Then father and I with three others formed a co-partnership to conduct a bank, mercantile and grain business. When the little store was invoiced it was found that it had netted \$4000. My record was considered exceptionally good, I not having had any previous experience or education in the mercantile business. I bought and sold the goods, kept the store in shape and locked up to go to my meals.

In the co-partnership the five of us formed, I was selected to take charge of the bank. We knew nothing about a bank or banking, not even to keeping a checking account with a bank. Father stated to the members of the co-partnership that I could go to Lincoln, Nebraska, and stay in a bank two weeks and learn the business. The three partners thought he was expecting far too much, but he heeded them not and when the time came to go to Lincoln, not only father and the partners went with me, but a Mr. O. C. Ragan went along to see how father was going to start me out.

We went to the Lincoln National Bank and father introduced the bunch to the cashier, J. J. Kelly and proceeded to tell him that we were about to start a bank and that I was to stay there two weeks to learn the business.

The old banker did not say it could not be done in so short a time, but proceeded to show us some of the things to be learned and accomplished to run a bank, thinking by this method to change father's mind about what I could do. After the banker got through showing the different books and the system he was using, Mr. Ragan said to me, "What do you think about learning all of that in two weeks?" Father did not seem to pay any attention to what the others said, but told the cashier the boy would stay with him two weeks and learn how to run a bank. So off they went and left it up to the cashier and me. The cashier without telling me seemed to give up the idea of teaching me the business in two weeks and gave me one of the books of the bank to keep, which I did, but toward the last of the first week began to wonder what I was learning about the business just taking care of the one book, and Saturday evening began to be very uneasy about it, wondering what father would say if I went home without knowing how to start the bank. Saturday evening I walked up and down the street in front of the hotel and after going to bed rolled and tumbled trying to think of some way to make good and not disappoint father. All day Sunday I walked around by myself and Sunday night went to bed very much troubled. I could not sleep and the problem kept coming up until finally it came to me that if I just had a copy of everything they done in the bank I might use it as a reference. Then the idea of why not a blank book of the right size and shape to rule pages of the different books used in the bank and make entries under each heading and take copies of other things that I knew nothing about. By morning I was all rought up about it and went straight to the cashier and told him that I had been there a week and it looked like I might stay another week and know practically nothing about the business. He said you can't expect to learn but very little about the banking business in two weeks. This was very discouraging. Now we will see how the young man's earnest desire comes out in a battle with knowledge and experience. I braced up and told him how bad I would feel if I had to disappoint father and went right on and laid by ideas before him as they had come to me Sunday night and by the time I got through he was all attention and very much interested, and said: "A capital idea, young man, a capital idea." Then I said will you come with me and help select a book to make the copies in and he said sure.

Needless to say, we soon had a copy of pages with entries made of every book that was needed to start a bank. We also did a day's business, striking a balance all in said book. Then he said now you make credits and debits and do a day's business and balance it up. So I did and got a balance the

first time. Then we took checks, drafts, pass books, certificates of deposit and everything they used and filled them out for me to take along. At the end of two weeks I told the cashier that I believed I could go home and start the bank. He placed his hand on my shoulder and said, young man I believe you can. And I did, but many's the time I got out the old book and copies to help me out. As soon as we got started up I received a wonderful letter from the old banker which I have in my files yet. Father and I prospered and bought out our partners one at a time until father and I were the sole owners and we stayed in business together as long as he lived. In November, 1916, after settling up father's estate and selling the bank that I had successfully conducted for thirty-three years, I moved with my son, Ralph E. Hurlburt and family, to San Diego, California, where I am investing in securities and enjoying this splendid southern country.
