FOREWORD

Appreciation is expressed to our cousins and relatives whose patience and understanding made this book possible in relating family histories. We realize there are many families overlooked since we were unaware of many living relatives. Such is the case with the William Edward Holland descendants. The names of his children were obtained from census records of Paulding County, Georgia, however, later census records, marriage records, etc. did not reveal any of their names. And we were unable to locate living descendants. Our sources of information are census records of DeKalb and Paulding Counties, Paulding County wills, Marriages, tax records and cemetery records.

We had a conflict of information as to where Archibald Holland was born, however 1830-1860 census records all reveal he was born in Virginia. We have been unable to pinpoint the city or county in Virginia and are presently searching to this end. He reportedly had a brother affectionately referred to as "Uncle Billy" who, in his old age, travelled about, living with one relative after the other.

We located some deeds which are of record in Cobb County bearing dates of 1833. In 1830 Archibald was running a blacksmith shop in Marthasville (now Atlanta), DeKalb County (now Fulton), and apparently moved out about 1833 to Cobb County. Shortly thereafter he settled in Paulding County. He is on record in Clarke County, Georgia as having married Elizabeth Hagen in 1823, however, Samuel, his son, related in Memoirs of Georgia that his mother was Elizabeth Harding and was married in Clarke County, Georgia in 1824 or 1825. Between the time of his marriage and 1830, we have been unable to locate his whereabouts. There is no comparison in the present-day market value of the Marthasville property Archibald owned in 1830 and that which he settled as a farm in Paulding County. In the 1830's, however, the area was too swampy to establish a farm, and is now part of underground Atlanta in the vicinity of the terminal station.

There was a post office near the High Shoals Primitive (now Missionary) Baptist Church and the area was called Huntsville. The Holland children settled within the community, marrying women on neighboring farms. Some later Hollands went on to a nearby community called McPherson, and one in the New Hope Baptist Church community, where the famous Battle of New Hope Church occurred and a small number of

Confederate soldiers are buried. It was reported to us that six of the graves on the family burial grounds are that of Archibald's slaves, however, we have found no substantial evidence.

Samuel, in Memoirs of Georgia, related that his grandfather was William Holland. On two accounts, we learned that Archibald's family came to Clarke County, Georgia in the year 1812, and we, therefore, searched all Clarke County records, but were unable to find a trace of the family. They, no doubt, left the county. In 1820 there were only two William Holland's in Georgia, and the only one who could have possibly been the father of Archibald, resided in Chatham County.

William R. Holland, born 1775, had one male child age 16-18, one male child age 16-26, one female child age 16-18, and two female children age 26-45 in 1820. This means that Archibald was probably the male child between the age of 16-26. We know that he was still living with his father in 1820, since, according to Samuel, he married in 1824 or 1825. William R. Holland had a wife in 1820, about his age, whom we believe to be his second wife, since there is a marriage record in Chatham County between William R. Holland and Sophia Fell, January 3, 1820. (There might be some remote possibility that this was Archibald's brother, referred to as "Uncle Billy", however, Uncle Billy is reported as having been a bachelor. The child listed as between the age of 16 and 18 would be Uncle Billy, since he was no doubt a younger man than Archibald, having outlived him, and being remembered by the family). They had at least one child together, Jane Holland, substantiated by the will of Elizabeth Susannah Fell in 1823 in which she names her grandchild, Jane Elizabeth Holland. Jane Holland later bought and sold land in Chatham County, as did Henry Holland, and both are believed to be the children of William R. Holland. Family tradition has it that Archibald had half brothers and sisters, and these two children born to William R. Holland by his second wife, would account for same. William R. Holland died 1825 in Chatham County, with letters administration issued to Joseph R. Thompson January 10, 1825. No further records found.

The death of Archibald's father before 1830 accounts for our inability to locate him in DeKalb County at that time with Archibald, or in other counties searched.

1813-1814 William Holland was a Private in the Georgia Militia under Capt. James Barton in service of the State of Georgia on the frontier line of Morgan County at Ft. Defiance and in the edge of Jasper County at Ft. New Hope, from February 13, 1813 until the last muster on February 11, 1814.

ARCHIBALD HOLLAND (1800-1868)

Born in Virginia, Archibald and his family migrated to Clarke County, Georgia when he was twelve years old. In 1823 he is on record in Clarke County, Georgia as having married Elizabeth Hagen. In later years, after 1840, he married Miss Sally Elsberry (7/26/1822-5/29/1902), a girl twenty-two years younger. When Archibald died, having already divided his land among his sons and left no provision for Sally, Samuel constructed a house for his step-mother, which was called the "Sally House".

In 1830 Archibald owned land in DeKalb County (now Fulton County) in the present vicinity of the terminal station in Atlanta. At that time, the area was swampy and known as a "cow mire", and properly fenced to prevent the cows from bogging down in the mud.

In 1833 Archibald moved to Cobb County, searching for suitable farm land. He then moved to Paulding County as a pioneer settler at a time when the Cherokee Indians were still in the county. The original house was of logs and later reconstructed by his son, Samuel, who added rooms and porches. In 1850 Archibald valued his land at \$4500.00 and in 1860 he declared himself as owning \$70.51 worth of real estate. Many of the old buildings on the farm still stand.

In 1860 Archibald is on record as having owned five slaves, however, he shared a view that many southerners of his time expressed, openly declaring his ideas. He was resolute in his convictions that the only feasible solution to the slave situation was to free the slaves, and to avoid a costly war and ultimate hardship, he told his friends that he would be the first to free his slaves!

Archibald and his first wife, Elizabeth (1809-12/22/1840) are buried on the old homeplace cemetery. The only marker in the cemetery is that of his son, Harrison. A homemade slate marker is at the head and a marker erected by the Confederate States of America is at the foot. There are reportedly twelve grave sites, and family tradition has it that six of these graves belonged to Archibald's slaves.

SAMUEL DONSEL HOLLAND (10/15/1829-11/11/1907)

Born Marthasville, DeKalb County, Georgia.
He grew to manhood in Paulding County, receiving a limited education incident to pioneer life. Son of Archibald Holland. Married Miss Annis Lee (4/8/1833-10/28/1899), daughter of Elizabeth Anderson and Hartwell Lee.

In 1862, Samuel was notified by the Provost Marshall's Office to report to Virginia for service in the Confederate Army by order of General Robert E. Lee. He enlisted May 10, 1862, Company "A", 14th Regiment, Georgia Volunteer Infantry Army. After two weeks' service, he was discharged at Seven Pines, Virginia for enlargement of veins in the leg. After the war, Samuel sought to collect for damages to his farm from the Federal Government. Friends and relatives testified that he had always been known to be loyal to the Union. However, after pending for twenty-five years, the claim was refused because of Samuel's service in the Confederate Army.

Samuel stood about six feet tall, was black-haired, and his portrait shows him with a full beard, his piercing eyes dominating his face. He was a man of affairs and meticulous in his dealings. At his father's death, he acquired the Holland farm, adding onto the log house he had grown up in, and had moved log houses on the farm to make his new kitchen. On the Holland farm there was a cotton gin where long lines of farmers waited at sunrise to have their cotton ginned. Food was prepared from early morning at the house to feed those who were still there at dinner. In the family there is still a plate, yellowed from being placed in the oven to keep steaks warm.

After Annis Lee died, Samuel married Miss Emma Fricks, a teacher, and moved to Dallas, Georgia where he lived until his death November 11, 1907.

(After the death of Samuel's father-in-law, Hartwell Lee, the property was advertised and exposed for sale to the highest bidder. Samuel then purchased the property for \$400.00. The Administrators of Estate of hartwell Lee were Elizabeth Lee, Wyatt Lee and W. J. Lee).

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

I, S. D. HOLLAND, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

ITEM I: I wish my Executor as soon as possible after my death to pay my debts. If a sale of property be necessary, I wish him to select for sale that which can most advantageously be used for said purpose out of the property hereinafter bequeathed to him, and I authorize him to sell the same at public or private sale as he may see fit and without obtaining any further leave to sell.

ITEM II: I give to my son T. W. HOLLAND all my personal property of every description whatsoever, including machinery, livestock, money notes and accounts, etc.

ITEM III: I give and bequeath to my said son T. W. HOLLAND the whole of what is known as my homeplace on Raccoon Creek and more particularly described in a deed made by myself as the Administrator of my father, ARCH HOLLAND, deceased, to myself as an individual under date of September 27, 1869, and recorded in Book O of Deeds in the Clerk's Office of the Superior Court of said County, Page 197, and a deed from G. P. Matthews to me under date of November the 5th, 1869 and recorded said Clerk's Office in Deed Book O, Page 265, and a Deed from Sarah A. Camp to myself under date of 29th of August, 1889 and recorded in said Clerk's Office, Book AA of Deeds, Page 562. My said homeplace comprising the whole of the lands described in said three deeds, except that portion heretofore deeded by me to Sarah A. Camp. Said property is given in fee simple without any limitation whatsoever.

ITEM IV: It is my desire that my Executor have this my Last Will and Testament probated in terms of the law and after this that he be exempt from making any further returns or accounting in any way to the Ordinary for his acts and doings in the premises.

ITEM V: I do hereby appoint my said son, T. W. HOLLAND, Executor of this my will.

GEORGE WASHINGTON HOLLAND (7/15/1839-6/10/1896)

Born Paulding County, Georgia, where he grew to manhood. Last child born to Archibald Holland. Married (1) 2/4/1864 Lydia Camp (12/26/1849-8/27/1883), daughter of Burrell Marion Camp and Mary E. Stegall, and (2) Mrs. Mary Jane Handerson Elsberry. Wash Holland was blue-eyed, black-haired and heavysset, approximately 5' 9" tall. His Spencorian script on his pension records indicates an agreeable reception to the education he obtained in Paulding County, Georgia. When already a grown man, he observed the lovely Lydia Camp, still a little girl, and declared that he would wait for her to grow to womanhood so that he could marry her.

With the onset of the War Between the States, Wash Holland enlisted in the Confederate Army August 31, 1861 under the command of Capt. J. A. K. Hanks at Camp McDonald for the duration of the war.

May 31, 1862, Wash Holland was admitted to Chimporazo Hospital No. 4 at Richmond, Virginia, for acute diarrhea - a disease which enslaved a major portion of the Army. June 8, 1862, he returned to duty.

Wash Holland served under General Lee, and at the second Battle of Manassas (August 29-30, 1862) on the last day of that battle, he was wounded. Surgeons probed for the ball, deep in his hip, but were unable to remove it.

At the Battle of South Mountain and Antietam, he was captured, and later paroled at Warrenton, Virginia, September 29, 1862.

Because of wounds received, Wash Holland was sent home to Paulding County on furlough and was paid commutations of rations from October 11 to December 11, 1862. Furlough and commutations were extended because of continued disability for 72 additional days. He received \$23.76. Beginning February 22, 1863, he was paid further commutations of rations for 30 days, upon Certificate of the Surgeon General, stating he was still unable to return to duty.

By mid-March, Wash Holland had returned to General Lee's Army in Virginia, and on May 1, 1863, the Battle of Chancellorsville began. May 3rd, he was wounded the second time. He then proceeded on with General Lee's campaign at Gettysburg, July 1-3, 1863.

Although there is no official record, Wash Holland returned home early 1864, long enough to wed the brown-haired daughter of Burrell Camp, Lydia, on February 4, 1864.

When General Sherman defeated Johnston at Bentonville, N. C., Wash Holland was captured March 31, 1865 and sent to Newborn, North Carolina, being received there by Capt. Perkins on April 10, 1865. The war ended soon thereafter, and Wash Holland was released June 15, 1865, having achieved rank of 3rd Sgt. and receiving a shell wound in his right arm and ball in his leg. In later years, when the State of Georgia at long last declared a pension available to Confederate veterans, he received a meager pension of \$50.00 per month.

The farm of his father-in-law, one mile southeast of McPherson, Georgia, was heavily wooded, and Burrell Camp, having no sons to clear the area, swapped farms with Wash Holland who did have sons coming along.

Because of wounds received during the war, Wash Holland suffered disability in performing his duties on the farm. As his sons grew, he sent them to work plowing, while he hoed. He could only plow in the fields for short periods of time, and therefore, spent most of his time reading the Bible, local paper, and the Cincinnati paper. The latter paper was subscribed to primarily because it was the most available source for receiving Republican news. The Hollands of that era were reportedly Republicans and well-informed of political news.

When Lydia was dying in 1883, two years after the birth of their last child, she was like many other women of that time who died while still quite young, and facing the prospect that her husband would have to remarry, and in order to have someone to care for her children, she selected Wash Holland's second wife!

The children attended High Shoals and Mt. Olivet schools. This journey was about three miles to walk, causing Wash Holland some concern, and he solved the problem by donating land at Ganly Ridge for a school, helped to build the school, and boarded the teachers.

Wash Holland had suffered the hardships of war and of coming home to a farm without laborers. Unable to perform in good health, he scarcely earned enough to support his family, and realizing death was near for him, told his wife to go live with her daughter, his youngest child to live with her grandfather, Burrell Camp, and his sons to stay and work the farm.
