1. SIMON HOYT, b. Jan. 20, 1590, Dorchester, Eng.  
mar. Deborah Stovers, at Parish Church, Upway,  
Eng. 1612. Died Sept. 1, 1667 at Stamford, Conn.  
Mar. 2nd Susanna about 1636. Susanna later  
married a Bates and died before 1674. Arrived in  
America 1628 (1629?). John and Ruth Hoyt, Dorchester,  
Eng. parents of Simon never came to America.

2. BENJAMIN HOYT, b. Feb. 2, 1644 at Windsor,  
Conn. Mar. 1st Hannah Weed (dau. of Jonas Weed)  
Jan. 5, 1670, and prob. 2nd, Abigail after 1711,  
lived in Stamford, D. Jan. 26, 1735-6 Aged 91.  
He is given as the 7th child of Simon.  
Wife Hannah died Nov. 9, 1711.



3. SAMUEL HOYT OR HAIT,<sup>3</sup> b.1679-84 (Capt. and  
Dea.) mar. 1st Mary Jagger (dau. Jeremiah Jagger)  
Mar.29,1704-6, and 2nd Elizabeth Clason (wid. of  
Jonathan Clason of Stamford,) Lived in Stamford  
and died about 1766-7. He was the fifth child  
of Benjamin.

4. SAMUEL HOYT or HAIT,<sup>4</sup> b.1709-18; mar.  
Abigail Bell, Mch. 8,1738-9, and 2nd Martha  
Blachley (dau. of Samuel Blachley) 1743-8; lived  
in Stamford, d. April 6, 1756. Samuel was  
the fourth child of Samuel and Mary.

5. JOHN,<sup>5</sup> b. Nov.24,1740, mar. Abigail Hait,  
Dec.31,1761 and 2nd Rebecca Jeffery, Nov. 12,  
1797, lived in Stamford, d. Mch.1,1825. Buried  
in Northfield Cemetery. He was the first  
child of Samuel<sup>4</sup> and Abigail.<sup>4</sup> He was the



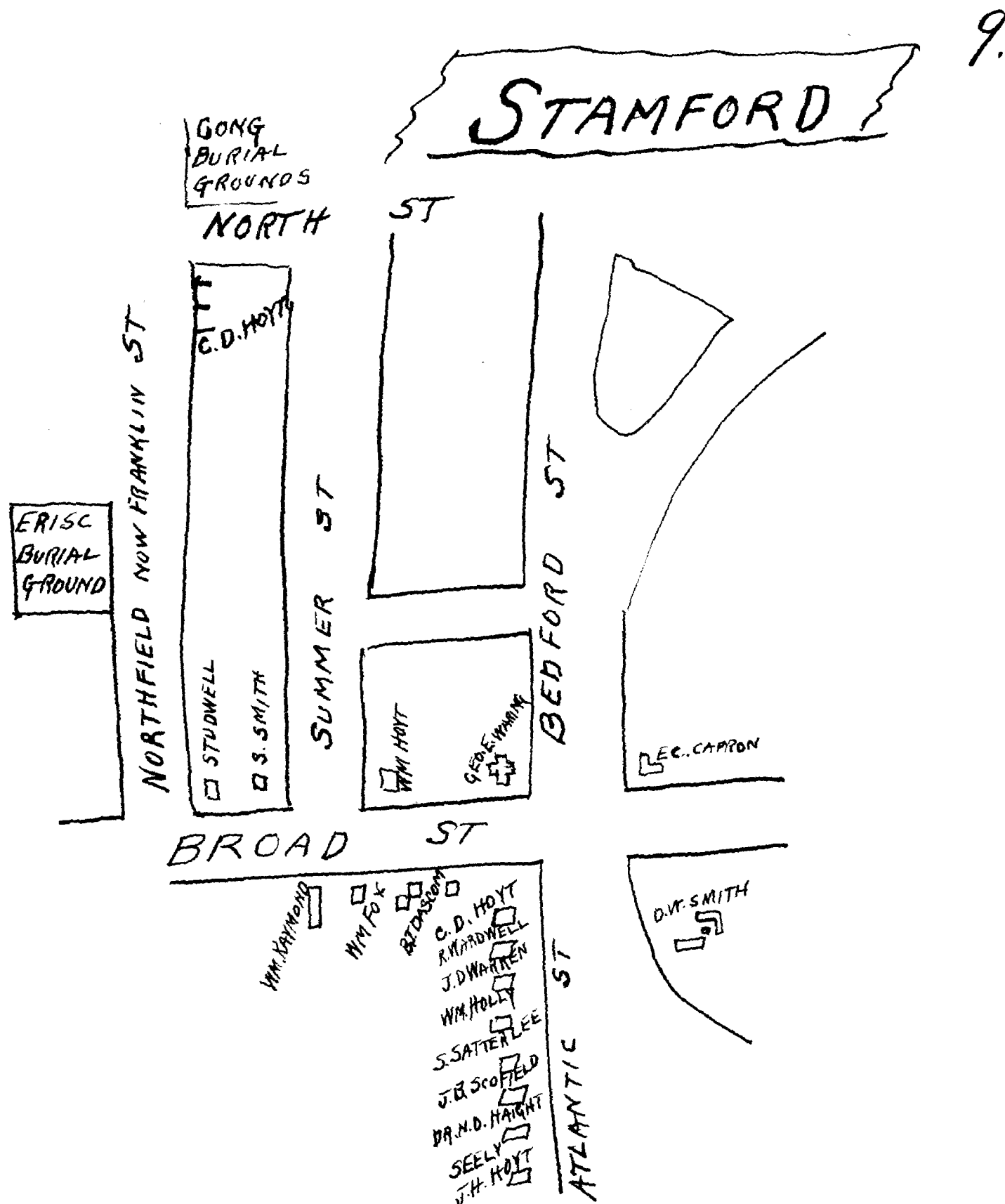
town clerk in Stamford 1775-1806, treasurer,  
1790- 1802, one of Com of Safety in S. 1775,  
represented Stamford in Conn. legislature 1777.  
Bought farm in Greensborough 1792.

His revolutionary service to the colonies  
enable descendants to join the S.A.R., the S.R.,  
or the D.A.R.

6. SAMUEL<sup>6</sup>, b. Nov. 8, 1762; mar. Betsey  
Webb (dau. of Col. Chas Webb) Nov. 8, 1790,  
lived in Stamford and New York City; d. Sept. 22,  
1838 in Stamford. Studied at Yale two years.  
He was the first child of John and Abigail.  
Betsey died Dec. 1819 aged 45 years.

**CHARLES DAVENPORT HOYT #4633**

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Charles Davenport Hoyt<sup>7</sup> was born Oct. 2, 1804  
 mar. Nancy Ann Barnum (oldest child of David Barnum) and Betsey Hoyt) Sept. 4, 1836; died Sept. 13, 1873, buried with his wife in Northfield Cemetery. He was the fifth child of Samuel and Betsey. When about 32 years of age he had an operation for cataract which was said to be too soon, and he lost his sight. He had been assistant postmaster in Stamford and New Haven before he lost his sight. He taught music for twenty years and led a Church choir in Stamford after he became blind. He played the cornet.

He lived on the corner of Broad and Atlantic, as located in Map of Stamford, 1851..

The Map of 1858 shows his house on Franklin St., formerly Northfield St., three doors from North St.

The estate of Nancy Ann his wife who died 1848 was distributed Dec. 1, 1851. It had claims against it for \$2078.94. Her property is described as bounded north by Broad, east by Atlantic St., south by Rufus Wardwell, west by B.J. Daskam, and it sold for \$1985.70. This was part of the property on which now stands the First Stamford National Bank.



His family Bible, tuning fork and some other relics are now (1938) in the possession of his grand daughter Mrs. Wm.D.Baird, 29 Hoyt St. Stamford.

The death of his wife Nancy Ann was untimely, July 11, 1848. She died of pneumonia at the age of 36, having been bled according to the custom of the time when she was in already in frail health. Born March 5, 1812, she was married Sept. 4, 1836 and lived only twelve years longer.

This was indeed a tragedy as it left a blind man with five children and the youngest was a babe in arms not yet a year old. The ages of the children at the time of Nancy's death are as follows:

John Wm. about 11 years

Clivia C. " 7 "

Eliza E. about 6 "

Harriet E. " 4 "

Nancy B. " 11 mos.

(later Emma H. adopted by Dr. Bourne.)



# NANCY ANN HOYT

Nancy Ann Barnum<sup>6</sup> was born in Stamford  
March 5, 1812 (daug. of David Barnum and Betsey Hoyt)  
Her mother Betsey was the second child of Isaac  
Hoyt and Elizabeth Hoyt.

Nancy had two sisters, Charlotte E. Barnum  
(1808-1893) and Eliza Maria Barnum (1814-1853).

Nancy married Charles Davenport Hoyt, Sept. 4,  
1836 and had five children, John Wm., Olivia C.  
Eliza E. and Harriet E. and Nancy S. (adopted as  
Emma H. Bourne by Dr. Bourne of N.Y. City).

Charlotte married Silas Hoyt Ferris (descendant  
of Polly Hoyt) and had four children, David, Sarah  
E., Silas H. Jr., and Theodore Isaac (estate  
probated 1933-8).

Eliza Maria married John Henry Nichols of  
Troy, N.Y. Aug. 18, 1839 in N.Y. City. She had

Eliza's husband John H. Nichols married, 2nd, Eliza  
Blass, Troy, N.Y. and they had John D. (died at  
Milwaukee, ~~1894~~, 1925) and Lottie 1867-68.  
Nancy died June 11, 1848 and is buried in  
Northfield Cemetery. She was a direct descendant  
of Simon Hoyt in her own line. Chas. D. was of the  
7th generation, Nancy of the 8th generation.

In her will she bequeathed to Mrs. T. E. Taylor Jr., Mrs. Wm. D. Baird, Mrs. Jas. A. Deke and Rev. John W. Hoyt. She also was an heir of the Isaac Hoyt estate.

On these last two names the information includes data which is supplementary to the Hoyt Family Book.

No adequate research has yet been made on these names, and the writer believes a complete record may be recovered.

Capt. WILLIAM SMITH HOYT.

4632 Capt. Hoyt was born close to 1800. He married Maria Wetmore of New York City. He was on a 17th voyage to England and was drowned near Dover, Eng. The story is mere tradition, but has come down, that he took \$16,000 in a row boat with him, in the endeavor to reach shore. The boat was capsized, and the treasure lost, but worse than that, it was claimed that a man from Stamford jumped on his back to save his own life. This was about Oct. 28, 1847. Fourth child of Samuel.
