SECTION 1.- INTRODUCTORY.

Not within my knowledge is there now in existence, any complete genealogy of the HARDING family descending to JAMES Sr., et.al., the scattered bits of our ancestral history and other records have been searched for and found in various out-of-the-way places, thus being of no benefit to our family as a whole, many of these hidden and forgotten records have now been reduced to a more desirable form, I having made this compilation during my incapacitation account of a permanent disability, assisted by the able and liberal co-operation of some of my kind and interested relatives.

This genealogical record is and shall so remain at all times strictly a NON-PROFIT enterprise, it having been designed and compiled for the exclusive benefit of our living relatives and their posterity, preserving our historical, ancestral and other family records for our future generations, the time and work so freely given by those interested in its completion, constitutes their contribution to the expressed desire for such a family record.

I desire to express my sincere gratitude and deep appreciation to all who assisted in this project, that required 32 months of daily work to complete (as far as was possible), this length of time was due for the greater part to waiting days and months for replies to my repeated pleas for relevant data from relatives who manifested but little or no interest in this undertaking, some of whom ignored my pleas entirely, which accounts for the numerous blank spaces throughout this history, which I leave for the convenience of anyone desiring to complete a record of their own volition.

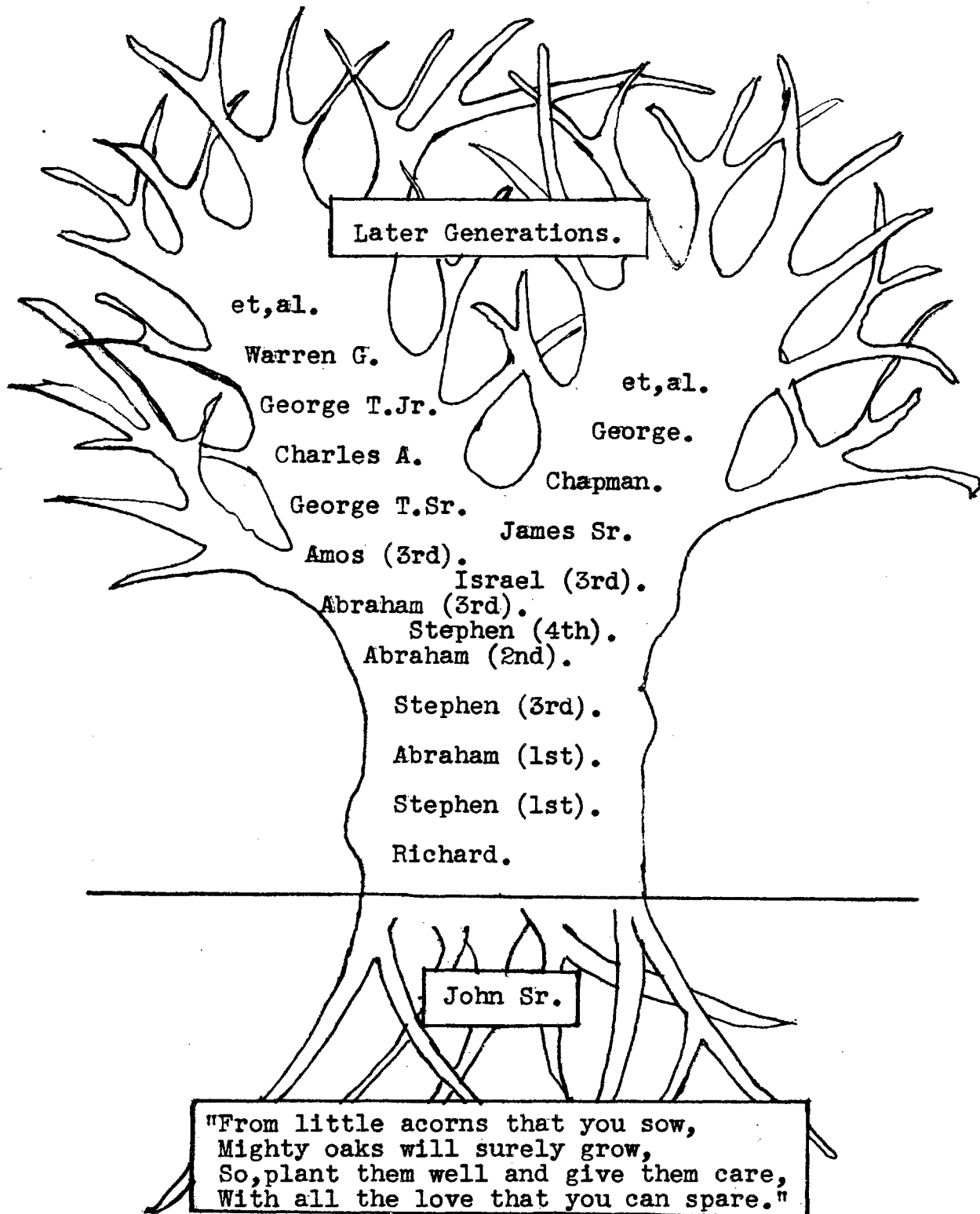

SECTION 4.- HISTORY OF THE NAME "HARDING".

The name "HARDING" has been traced by extensive research as far back as records could be found, farther by tradition, however the earlier traditional dates have not been used in the ancestral records of this genealogy, as they could not be verified by any bona-fide records available.

The name "HARDING" is of English origin, it signifies strong, robust, energetic and brave, the name is also found among the Saxon and German tribes of the eighth century, moreover it is found in practically all sections of Northern Europe as far back as 1068 A.D., e.g.-

all of the above names are derivations of the name "HARDING", other derivations have been found in general use, such as HARDIN, HARDEN, HARDINGE, HARDYNGE, HARDWICH, HARDINGHAM, HARDINGTON, HARDINGDALE, et. al., all having the same significations.

The name "HARDING" was originally derived from the Gothic words "HARD" (meaning bold and courageous), and the word "ING" (meaning "son of").

The Saxons at one time regarded the name as a "nickname" for an imaginary descendant of THOR (the God of strength and thunder) in Norse mythology.

About the year 469 A.D., the name adopted in derivative form, became the name of some English towns, e.g., HARDINTONE, HARDINGSTORP, HARDINGTONA, et, al.

SECTION 5.- FAMILY'S HISTORICAL BACKGROUND.

IN ENGLAND: (see note "1" in section 11).

Editor's Note:

The following brief review of early English history, has been written herein to afford the reader some idea of the difficult conditions then existing, in which many of our kin were compelled to live, the many difficult problems they were forced to meet, how well they acquitted themselves and progressed during their lives, despite the many disheartening handicaps to which they were subjected.

Wherever the word "shire" appears at the end of a name of a locality, it means "county", this being characteristic of England.

Throughout the historical part of this genealogy, the names of those who were our ancestors in direct lineage descending to JAMES(p) HARDING Sr., et, al., are shown in CAPITAL letters.

It was found by extensive research of the history of England since the year 790 A.D., to be the uniform opinion among historical students, that the HARDINGS had established themselves in England long before the conquest of that country by the Danes from Denmark, which occurred in the year 1013 A.D., that raid being led by King Sweyn of Denmark, that horde of men were then known as the "rovers" from the Scandinavian countries, who raided England frequently in search of plunder during the period from 790 A.D., to 851 A.D., doing great damage upon each occasion. They began to settle in England in 851 A.D., they again resumed their ravaging practices, soon "Ethelred the Unready" raised sufficient money to buy them off, later instigating a massacre as punishment.

Canute (son of the Danish King Sweyn) reigned as King of England from 1016 A.D. to 1035 A.D., afterward his brothers Harold and Hardicanute reigned successively from 1035 A.D. to 1042 A.D., at which time the Danish rule over England ended.

A tradition exists in England indicating that a man named Alvin (last name unknown) of earlier existence than JOHN(p)HARDING Sr., (our oldest ancestor of record) was actually the original forbear of the HARDINGS, at one time he was the Saxon Earl of Warwick, during the reign of "Edward the Confessor", which was from 1041 A.D. to 1066 A.D., this man Alvin had a son named "Turketil", the latter being deprived of his title of "Earl" by action of "William the Conqueror" who reigned from 1066 A.D. to 1087 A.D., the title was then given to a Norman, all of which disheartened "Turketil" to the extent that he retired permanently to the "Forest of Arden", a large area of land north of Warwickshire, about 80 miles north-west of London.

Quite some time later, another member of Alvin's family came from Manor Arden, at Longcroft in Stratfordshire, claiming to be a direct descendant of Siward de Arden, and established his residence in an old English house named "Baraset", located at Stratford-on-Avon, at which time he arbitrarily adopted the name of HARDING, this story of Alvin and his sons being entirely traditional, has not been taken into this record as being an ancestor in the line descending to JAMES(p)HARDING Sr., et, al.

English history clearly establishes the fact that the HARDINGS had become well established in that country, by the time the "Normans" had conquered England in 1066 A.D., these invaders first settled in Italy and Sicily, where they developed a remarkable civilization, also in France where they founded "Normandy", they afterward took over England under the leadership of "William the Duke of Normandy", who was later known as "William the Conqueror", these Normans brought a new language, new laws, new customs and ideas of their own into England.

During the reigns of (a) King Henry VII from 1485 A.D. to 1509 A.D., (b) King Henry VIII from 1509 A.D. to 1553 A.D., (c) Queen Mary 1st from 1553 A.D. to 1558 A.D., and (d) Queen Elizabeth from 1558 A.D. to 1603 A.D., a total period of 118 years, quite a number of HARDINGS held important positions and assignments in the Governmental affairs of England, and according to history discharged their duties in a satisfactory and distinguished manner, their eminence was not only outstanding as statesmen, but in numerous cases they distinguished themselves in the fields of science, literature, education, religion, journalism and medicine.

A very interesting account was found concerning one Thomas Harding, D.D. the Reformer, who came from Bascoton in Devonshire, a large county in the southern part of England, then having an area of 2612 square miles and a population of 773,000 people, where he was born in 1512, he attended Cambridge University where the degree of A.B. (Bachelor of Arts) was conferred upon him in 1536, he later received the degree of A.M. (Master of Arts, the latin name being "Artium Magister") in 1542 A.D. He later became Professor of Hebrew in that college, his writings regarding the "Reformation" were extensive and widely published, as far away as Antwerp (Anvers) Belgium. He afterward became Chaplain to the Marquis of Dorchester, and still later in the same capacity to the Duke of Suffolk. He died in Louvain, Belgium on Sept. 16. 1572 at the age of 60 years.

There also exists in England the claim that the HARDINGS were related by marriage to King Henry III, who ruled over that country from 1216 A.D. to 1272 A.D., a period of 56 years, he being but 9 years of age when he became

King.

Several accounts were also found in English history of other outstanding HARDINGS, e.g.:-

- (a) One Samuel Harding was educated at Exeter College, where he received his A.B. degree, later in 1640 he is said to have instigated a tragedy, however the record does not reveal any details thereof.
- (b) There was also found a very interesting record of one Rev. Stephen Harding, who was the Rector of Trinity Church at Stratford-on-Avon, in the borough and market-town of Warwickshire, about 40 miles from Northampton (where our oldest ancestor of record JOHN HARDING Sr., was born, lived his life and died), the town of Stratford is about 103 miles north-west of London, located on the Avon river, he was the Rector of that Church at the time William Shakespeare (noted poet) died in that town on April 23, 1616, conducted his funeral and buried the body underneath the stone floor of that Church, where it still lies, such being customary in England in those days.

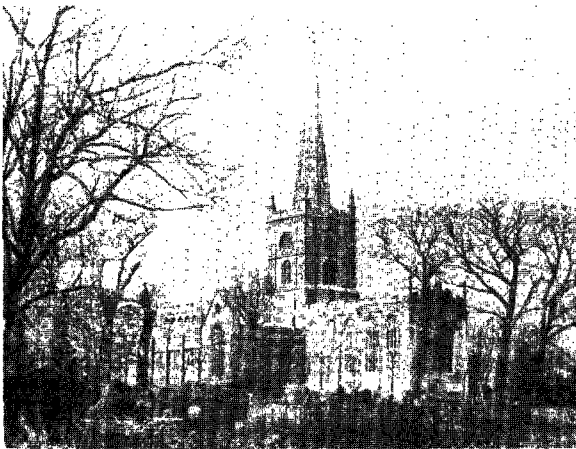
Incident to this last related account, your editor had a most pleasing and unexpected experience of value to this history, upon the occasion of a visit by Mr. and Mrs. Leonard G. Ormerod (friends of long standing) to his home, becoming interested in the compilation of this genealogy, whereupon to our great surprise, they gave me a detailed account of their personal observations of all the things enumerated in paragraph "b" above, which they had visited during a tour of England, their description being so complete and authentic, that I feel particularly fortunate in being able to include their descriptions in this genealogy, as follows:-

- (1) The town of Stratford-on-Avon is particularly attractive to American tourists, because of its ancient buildings, quaint architecture, early-day customs and being the birthplace of the noted poet William Shakespeare.
- (2) Trinity Church is of stone construction, of elaborate design (illustrated in this section), its religious denomination was then the "Church of England", there then being no recognized division of faiths such as Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, etc., as is the case in America today, their churches and the Government of England were then considered as one unit, being so established and constituted by King Henry VIII, who reigned from 1509 A.D. to 1553 A.D. (44 years), the country then being under Protestant predomination, but when Queen Mary Ist came into power and reigned from 1553 A.D. to 1558 A.D. (5 years), she tried to return the country to Catholicism, during her efforts in that direction she caused more than 300 opposing people to be executed, in consequence of which she became known as "Bloody Mary". Queen Elizabeth succeeded her in power and reigned for the following 45 years, from 1558 A.D. to her death in 1603 A.D., during her regime she restored and greatly strengthened the Protestant religion throughout England.
- (3) Oddly enough, there hangs on the front door of Trinity Church, a metal ring 7" in diameter, known as the "Sanctuary Ring" (illustrated in this section), it being religiously regarded as a means of saving a person from harm by attack, if the intended

victim could reach this ring and hold it in their grasp, the belief being that it would provide immunity from any harm for at least 48 hours, a strange custom to an American, but a common belief and practice among English churches in those medieval days.

- (4) William Shakespeare's grave differs greatly from modern custom, in that it is located underneath the stone floor of Trinity Church (illustrated below), on the slab of stone covering his grave there has been carved the following inscription:-

"Good friend, for Jesus sake forbear,
To dig the dust enclosed here,
Blest be the man who spares these stones,
And curst be he, who moves my bones".

It is also recorded that the author of a widely circulated publication named "Harding's Chronicles", was one John Harding, who at one time was Dean of the School of Rochester (named Durobrivae in more ancient times) located in Kent County on the Thames river, about 35 miles southwest of London, this being during the reign of King Charles II, later he became the President of Magdalene College (a part of Cambridge University) located at Cambridge, a borough and market-town of Cambridgeshire on the Great Ouse river, about 56 miles north of London.

A record was also found of another line of HARDINGS, who at one time lived in Comb Martin in Devonshire, they later moved to Upcott, near Barnstable, on the Bristol Channell about 165 miles southwest of London, that line of HARDINGS is thought to be related to us, as the earliest forbear of that line was named Fitz Harding, who is also thought to be an ancestor of JOHN HARDING Sr.

JOHN HARDING Sr., (our oldest ancestor of record) was from Northampton, in Northamptonshire, England, where he was born in 1567 and died on Jan. 14, 1637, he was an older brother of William Harding who lived at Dursley, in Gloucestershire, England both brothers were believed to be direct descendants of Fitz Harding, our lineage descends via RICHARD HARDING, the oldest son of JOHN HARDING Sr., therefor William Harding was not any ancestor of our line descending to JAMES HARDING Sr., et, al.

JOHN HARDING Sr., also had a niece named Mary (daughter of William Harding), who married Capt. Sir Robert Gorges, he being appointed Governor General of the Plymouth Colony in 1623, in recognition of his outstanding service to England during the Venetian wars in Italy, and under whose patronage together with that of his father Sir Ferdinando Gorges, fitted a ship at Harwich on the English Channell, from where they sailed the first party to include a Harding (who was Mary) to America, at the end of that voyage they landed at Weymouth Landing (formerly known as Wassagusset) in Massachusetts, some time later another party of about 1000 immigrants including 13 HARDINGS, landed on American shores at Salem, Mass., that second party being conducted by one Governor Endicott.

IN AMERICA.

Lady Gorges (nee Mary Harding) was according to history, the first Harding to land in America, she was joined later in 1623 by her cousins John Jr., Joseph and RICHARD, who landed at and first settled in Weymouth Landing (about 20 miles south of Boston), soon moving to Braintree, Mass., that became the geographical center of the HARDING clan and remained so for many years.

RICHARD HARDING came to America from England in 1623, he had one son named STEPHEN 1st., who became known as the "blacksmith of Providence, RICHARD'S brother John Jr., later moved to Redstone, Pa., where he married one Jane Davies, afterward moving to Nelson county (now named Washington county) Ky., about 40 miles south-east of Louisville, it being he who first dropped the "g" from his name, he was the original forbear of the now noted Hardins of Kentucky, most of whom settled in the city of Washington in Beaufort county of that state, which is near the junction of the Tar and Pamlico rivers, the early history of this branch of the Hardings is not available.

STEPHEN HARDING 4th., was born in Warwick, Rhode Island, in 1723 and died in Exeter, Pa., on Oct. 11, 1787 at the age of 64 years, he settled early in life at Colchester, Conn., where in 1748 he married Amy Gardner, daughter of Stephen and Francis Gardner, all of their 13 children were born in Colchester, which is located about 25 miles north of Long Island Sound and 12 miles east of the Connecticut river. Among their children the eighth child born was a boy named ISRAEL 3rd., he being a direct ancestor of the HARDINGS descending to JAMES HARDING Sr., et, al.,.

STEPHEN HARDING 4th., was the forbear of our branch of the family in the sixth generation, he was an army man, he had four brothers named Abraham 2nd, John 5th, Thomas 2nd and Israel 2nd, all of whom first moved to Wyoming Valley Pa., in 1769, that locality then being under very favorable circumstances, free from disturbance by either the Indians or the Pennamites, none of them made a permanent settlement there however until 1774, when STEPHEN 4th located with his family above the valley on the west side of the Susquehanna river, near "falling spring", the place was then named "Harding Settlement", later the village of Harding, whose history appears in section 6 hereof.

STEPHEN HARDING 4th., was first a private in the 12th Co., of the 2nd Conn., regiment, became Captain of the 7th Co., of the 24th regiment of the Conn., militia at its organization on Oct. 17, 1775, giving great aid with maximum loyalty to the cause for which he fought, that of American Independence, four of his sons Stephen 5th, Micajah, Thomas 3rd and ISRAEL 3rd were also in the army, his oldest son Stephen 5th also became a Captain, as did Micajah, the other sons enlisted in Sept. 1776 remaining in the service until the close of the war in 1778.

From 1774 to 1777 the new settlement at Exeter, Pa., had an uninterrupted prosperity and an increasing population, during which time Capt. STEPHEN 4th and his wife Amy were quite free to plan their future under the guidance of God, in whom they steadfastly trusted, then early in 1778 their bright outlook became darkened by war in all of its terrible fury, whereupon Capt. STEPHEN 4th moved his family to Fort Jenkins (so named because of being built around the home of John Jenkins) near West Pittston, Pa., doing so for the safety of his family, at that time he was placed in command of the Fort.

Several battles occurred in 1778 between the Indians (Senecas, Iroquois and Delawares) supported by a band of British Tories, who together made up a hostile group of about 1200 men, under the leadership of Col. John Butler and Queen Esther (an Iroquois Indian) on one side, who battled a force of about 300 settlers under the leadership of Col. Zebulon Butler with the assistance of Col. Denison and Lt. Col. Dorrance from Forty-Fort, Pa., (about 15 miles away), 160 settlers were killed in these battles, their bodies lying where they fell for about four months, then being buried in one grave (like a pit), which was dug on that battlefield.

The principal battle of that campaign was fought on July 3, 1778, when the settlers were attacked by the Indians and Tories, enduring many

gruesome experiences during the historical "Wyoming Massacre", the 168th anniversary of which was on July 3, 1946. After that battle Capt. STEPHEN 4th took his family back to Connecticut, all of whom returned to Exeter, Pa., in 1784.

During this terrible battle, some of the settlers escaped and trudged their way to safety at Stroudsburg, Pa., some of the HARDINGS killed in that battle were taken into Fort Jenkins under orders for immediate burial, to which Mrs. Amy Harding (wife of Capt. STEPHEN 4th) most emphatically objected, demanding that those bodies be washed and properly prepared for decent burial, performing that work herself, allowing no one to interfere, on the following day those men were buried under a flag of protection (witnessed by the Indians and Tories) in the Jenkins-Harding cemetery, located but a short distance from Fort Jenkins, where Elisha Harding caused an appropriate gravestone to be erected, on which appears the inscription, reading:-

"SWEET BE THE SLEEP OF THOSE WHO PREFER LIBERTY TO SLAVERY".

Both Capt. STEPHEN 4th and his wife are buried beside their sons Stukely and Benjamin 2nd, who were scalped and mutilated by the Indians on June 30, 1778, the boys were buried from Fort Jenkins on July 2, 1778 in the Jenkins-Harding cemetery, located at the corner of Wyoming Ave., and Linden St., in West Pittston, Pa.

In 1912, Dial Rock Chapter of the D.A.R. of West Pittston erected a memorial to these two boys, it was a bronze tablet placed on a large boulder bearing an inscription, reading:-

"ON JUNE 30, 1778 IN OR NEAR THE RAVINE LEADING TO THE RIVER,
NOT FAR FROM THIS SPOT, BENJAMIN AND STUKELY HARDING WERE
KILLED BY THE INDIANS, BEING AMONG THE FIRST THAT LOST THEIR
LIVES IN THE DAYS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE MASSACRE OF JULY 3rd".

In May 1778 Capt. STEPHEN HARDING 4th was elected and commissioned "Justice of the Peace" in Westmoreland County, Pa., his term of office expired in the following year, at which time he was re-elected to succeed himself in that office.

The general trend of migration of the HARDINGS has been westward from their native country (England) to America, first locating in Massachusetts, going on from there in various directions to numerous parts of the United States (see section 16 hereof), the ancestors descending to JAMES HARDING Sr., et. al, migrated principally to Connecticut, New York and Pennsylvania, then on into Ohio and finally into states west of the Mississippi river, our branch of the family is probably more interested in those who went into Pennsylvania, where at least 25 HARDINGS have lived at or in the vicinity of Clifford some part of their lives, to wit:-

The HARDINGS while living at Clifford, were prominently active with the delegates from the Abington Baptist Association in establishing the first Baptist Church in that town, which was done on Oct. 20, 1817, it being held in the first school-house that was built in that town (then a village.)

The HARDINGS were also instrumental in establishing the second Baptist Church in America, which was built at Swanzy (now named Swansea) Mass., in 1663 A.D., where many of our kin held membership for a number of years, throughout the history of the HARDINGS the predominating faith has been Baptist.

Our deceased ancestors and relatives who pioneered and died in Clifford were taken up from their original burial places and interred in the "old" cemetery named "Willow View" about the year 1816, other relatives are buried in the "new" cemetery named "Valley", both cemeteries being located in Clifford. See section 12 for the record of individuals buried in both of these cemeteries.

In the Susquehanna County court-house at Montrose, Pa., there is a large bronze tablet in commemoration of 185 men from that county who were heroes in the Continental Army of the United States, among those names are the names of several HARDINGS, who lived and died in that county, they having fought valiantly for their country, as is reflected in Federal records.

From a brief review of English and American history, it is observed that there were numerous notable HARDINGS in both countries, who in the course of their lives had distinguished themselves in various fields, that brought them into prominence among their peoples, of which the few following cases are illustrative:-

was born in Sherborne in Dorsetshire, England, educated in a monastery, after which he spent some time in Scotland, Paris and Rome, he returned to and settled in Champagne, France, where he affiliated with another monastery, then being given the name of St. Stephen, he founded the Reformed Benedictine Order in 1098 A.D, soon afterward he became the Abbot (Arch-Bishop) of Citeaux in Burgundy, remaining as such for a period of 23 years, from 1110 A.D, to 1133 A.D, he died Mar. 28, 1134, without returning to England.

9. HENRY HARDINGE, (b1785-d1856).
fought through the Peninsular war, during which he lost a hand at Lidny on June 16, 1815, he succeeded Lord Ellenborough in 1844 as Governor General of India, during his life he held a number of other positions and titles, such as:-

Prominent landscape artist.

IN AMERICA.

11. CHESTER HARDING (b1792-d1866).
son of Abiel and Olive (Smith) Harding, was born in Conway, Mass., on Sept. 1, 1792, was a soldier in the war of 1812, was a turner by trade, but became a self-taught artist, being called to London, England, to paint portraits of Royalty and Nobility, among his best known works are his portraits of Daniel Webster, now owned by the New York Bar Association, and one of John Randolph, now in the Corcoran Art Gallery at Washington, D.C.
12. ADNER CLARK HARDING (b1807-d1874).
United States Congressman from the state of Illinois during the years 1864-1868, also a prominent financier.

13. STEPHEN SELWYN HARDING (b1808-d1893).
 Practiced law at Versailles, Ind., was appointed by President Lincoln on Mar. 31, 1862 to be Governor of Utah (then a territory), which office he held but eleven months, being in disfavor with the Mormons, he was then made Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Colorado, filling the latter office during the years 1863-1865..
14. CHARLES HENRY HARDIN (b1820-d1892).
 Was Governor of Missouri 1872-1874, founded and endowed the Hardin College and Conservatory of Music for young women in 1873, that institution being located at Mexico, Missouri.
15. BENJAMIN FRANKLIN HARDING (b1823-d1899).
 Was U.S. District Attorney in Oregon in 1853, being made Territorial Secretary in 1855, became U.S. Senator from that state in 1862.
16. WILLIAM LLOYD HARDING (b1877-d1934).
 Was the second native-born Governor of Iowa in 1916, at the age of 39 years, he being the youngest Governor of that state since 1863, he continued in that office through 1920. He graduated from the Law College of the South Dakota University at Vermillion, So. Dakota in 1905 with the degree of L.L.B.
17. WARREN GAMALIEL HARDING (b1865-d1923).
 He became President of the United States in 1921, see his biography on page 14 hereof.
18. GEORGE TRYON HARDING 3rd. (b1904-still living, b).
 Attended and graduated from the College of Medical Evangelists at Los Angeles, Cal., in 1927, receiving his M.D. degree, he followed his profession to such a successful extent that in 1934 he became the Chief Executive Officer of the Harding Sanitarium at Columbus, Ohio, succeeding his father (who founded this institution-see ancestral 29), this sanitarium has a capacity of 50 patients. He is also Professor of Psychiatry at the Ohio State University.

From a check of the records in 18 of the foremost Colleges in America, it was found that 76 HARDINGS (descendants of JOHN HARDING Sr.,) had graduated therefrom during the years 1745 to 1929 inc., as follows:-

SECTION 6.- HISTORY OF THE TOWN OF "HARDING" PENN'A. (Founded and settled by Hardings.)

On preceding pages hereof, is given the story of the general trend of migration of the HARDINGS (see section 16), they first came to Wyoming Valley, Pa., in 1769, they later established a small settlement in 1774 on the west bank of the Susquehanna river, about four miles up-stream from Pittston Pa., which they then called "Harding Settlement", now a village, the landmark of the tragic "Wyoming Massacre" in 1778, during which many of our relatives fought valiantly, in fact at least two of them were killed on June 30, 1778, they being the sons (Benjamin and Stukely) of Capt. Stephen Harding 4th,

(see page 10 hereof). After that war was ended in 1778, Capt. STEPHEN HARDING 4th and his family returned to their former home in Colchester, Conn., coming back to Wyoming Valley in 1784, making their original settlement now their new permanent home, it has since retained the name HARDING, having a population of 1176 according to the census of 1940. Since 1784 it has been a "village", it has a grade school attended by about 200 pupils from the village and adjoining country districts, taught by 6 teachers, it has a cemetery named "Mt. Vernon", it has no churches nor industries, but has a volunteer fire department, it has no local post-office, their mailing address being "Pittston, Pa., RFD Exeter Township", it has no railroad, but a bus line provides transportation, there is a small town directly across the river (reached by ferry) named Ransom, it is served by the Lehigh Valley R.R.

SECTION 7.- ANCESTORS AND BIOGRAPHY OF WARREN G. HARDING.

Editor's Note:

The review of that branch of the HARDING family descending to our late ex-President of the U.S., is given in section 12 hereof for the reasons that (1) several relatives requested it, (2) it gives a vividly interesting description of the early days of Clifford, Pa., (originally named Clifford Springs) where many of our relatives have lived at one time or another, and (3) our justified pride in the man of our family who attained the highest federal office in our country.

For a detailed record of "ancestors" of this branch of the HARDING family see section 12, our ancestors were the same for both branches of the family during the first five generations prior to 1720 A.D. at which time these branches diverged after STEPHEN HARDING 3rd., as shown on the "family tree" illustrated in section 3.

BIOGRAPHY.

Warren G. Harding was the oldest of eight children, he was named for the Rev. Warren Gamaliel Bancroft (an uncle by marriage), he was born in the same farm-house as was his father, near Blooming Grove (Corsica) Ohio, where he began his career by chopping wood, splitting rails, and general menial work characteristic of life on a farm, working in a local brick-yard, then as a section-hand on the Toledo and Ohio Central Railroad, in which occupations he acquired the habit of industry the hard way and early in life.

He attended local grade schools, later he attended the Ohio Central College at Iberia, Ohio., (seven miles from home) walking the distance twice each week, doing this when he was only 14 years of age, he graduated from that College when he was 17 years of age, with his B.S. degree. He soon took up teaching in the District School, graduating later from the Northern Ohio University in 1910 with his degree of Doctor of Law, that finished his schooling.

He soon started in the newspaper printing business at Caledonia, Ohio, where he became associated with the "Caledonia Argus", he later moved to Marion, Ohio, with his father and family in 1884, where his first job was that of an insurance agent, and his first customer was a banker named Amos Kling, who later became Warren's father-in-law. The newspaper business was foremost in Warren's ambition and he began publishing "The Star", a local newspaper later sold by court order, whereupon he got a job as a reporter for the "Marion Mirror" at \$7.00 per week, that paper was Democratic while Warren was a Republican, because of which fact he was soon fired, he then

established a joint ownership of the "Marion Star",organizing and developing the Harding Publishing Co.

He was a trustee of the Trinity Baptist Church at Marion,when he became State Senator from the 13th senatorial district of Ohio in 1899,which office he held until 1904,then becoming Lieutenant Governor of Ohio for two terms (1904-1906),following which he was elected to the United States Senate in 1914,while in the Senate he served as a member of the following committees:-

he being elected as the 29th President of the United States on his 55th birthday,Nov.2.1920.

In delivering his first annual message to Congress,he broadcasted it over the radio to the nation,which was the first time that was ever done by a President.

In 1923 he made an official business trip to Alaska,while returning from that trip he became very ill and died suddenly in San Francisco,Cal., on Aug.2.1923,he being the sixth U.S.President to die while holding that office

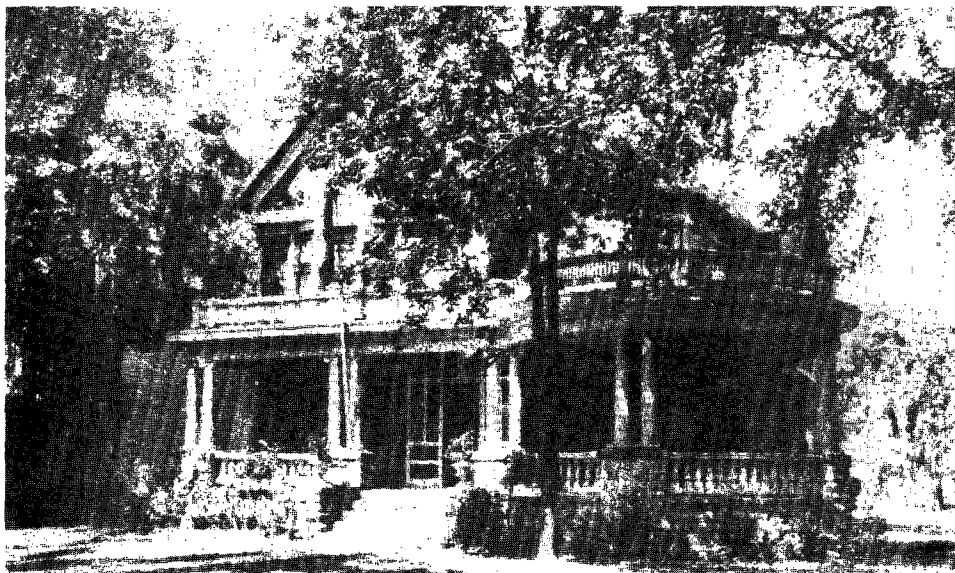
His fraternal affiliations were with (1) Shriners,(2) Knight Templars,(3) Masons,(4) Loyal Order of Moose,and (5) Knights of Pythias.

Mr.and Mrs."W.G" (as he was fondly known by his friends in Marion) were members of the Calvary Baptist Church in Washington,D.C.,he being the first President of the United States to be of the Baptist denomination.

On Aug.4.1923 his successor in office,Calvin Coolidge,issued a proclamation designating Aug.10.1923 as a day of National mourning for the beloved late President Harding,which was quickly and unanimously approved by Congress,upon this sad occasion there were 55 messages of condolence recieved by Mrs.Harding,from rulers and high-ranking officers of this and the majority of the foreign countries.

Warren G.Harding's home on Mt.Vernon Ave.,in Marion,Ohio (illustrated on page 16),from the front porch of which he made many of his political campaign speeches for the Presidency of the United States is un-pretentious and home-like.

"Lives of great men all remind us

SECTION 8.- BIOGRAPHY OF LUKE (p) HARDING.

Luke Harding was born on a farm in Benton Township, Pa., on Dec. 19, 1826, some time later he cleared another farm in Lenox, Pa., upon which he built and occupied a log cabin, until he migrated to Montana, shortly after the death of his wife Louisa on Nov. 11, 1867.

In going to Montana he was accompanied by his sons John F., James M., Judson M., and William N., all of whom manifested a characteristic "Harding" ambition, to go to new lands and pioneer in the development of new country, possibly being influenced to some extent in their venture by the then universal American slogan "Go West young man".

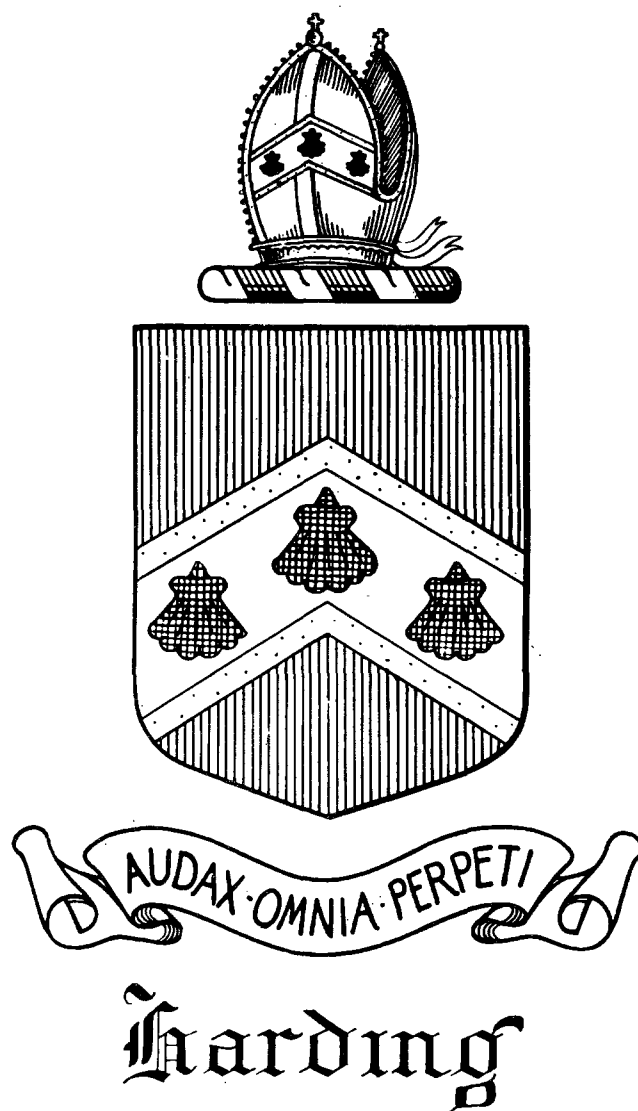
Upon their arrival in Montana, the father (Luke) settled near Butte, first becoming a woodsman, which occupation he followed the greater part of his life, his sons located in various parts of Montana, one of them (William) became connected with a silver mine at Anaconda, Mont.

Luke Harding remained in Montana about 20 years, eventually building and occupying (alone most of the time) a cabin on the slope of a mountain near Butte, where he remained until his untimely death in Oct. 1891, at which time he was murdered by unknown assassins as he was kneeling by his bed-side in prayer, after the crime the murderers set fire to his cabin, for the obvious purpose of hiding their fiendish deed, when the cabin had burned the hill-side caved in, covering and partially saving his body from complete destruction.

The motive behind this crime seems to have been robbery, for as he was making a substantial withdrawal of money from a bank in Butte on the previous day, preparatory to making a trip back East to visit his relatives in Lenox, Pa., he was evidently "spotted" by some one or a gang, who made the attack upon his life in quest of his money at any cost.

There then followed the customary police investigation, in fact a posse was formed to avenge his brutal death, but the bandits had left their horses and vanished, never being apprehended.

His remains were brought home to West Lenox, Pa., in a sealed casket for burial from the home of his daughter "Lib" Lawrence, interment being made in the Tower cemetery without the casket being opened, thus sparing his relatives et. al., from what otherwise would have been a shocking gruesome sight.

SECTION 9.- FAMILY CREST AND COAT-of-ARMS,
THEIR ORIGIN AND HERALDRY.

The history of "Armorial Bearings" (Crest and Coat-of-Arms) is far-reaching, interesting, and definitely establishes the fact that practically in all ages, in all quarters of the world, symbols have been extensively adopted by Nations, families, tribes and their chieftains, to distinguish each from another, e.g., the Indian totem-pole is one of the true fore-runners of modern heraldry.

"Crests" have not always been a part of "Armorial Bearings", in fact they came into use in England very slowly, not being used in that country to any great extent prior to 1250 A.D.

Armorial Bearings have long been used in many lands, as Heraldic devices by Knights in battle, adorning his defensive armour, surcoat or saddle etc., these bearings soon became hereditary and their use among families increased rapidly, they being considered as a distinguishing designation to their owners, indicating them to be people of a better class in civilian and social life, possessing a greater degree of intelligence and refinement, the use of these bearings thus encouraged "gentry".

The awarding or granting and wearing of these Armorial Bearings did in numerous instances manifest their influence upon their owners in a very unmistakable manner, e.g., William Shakespeare himself was thereby changed from the status of a "vagabond" to that of a "gentleman" (a classification or title now obsolete).

Heraldry began to develop in England early in the ninth century, the first English Sovereign to have a Coat-of-Arms was King Richard I, in 1189 A.D. Since that time there have been recorded at least fourteen different designs of Armorial Bearings awarded and granted to the family of HARDING, the changes in design are changed from time to time predicated upon (a) marriages, (b) family separations, (c) commission of crime, (d) illegitimacy, or (e) in some cases the differentiating interpretations or preference of different generations of the family.

The different designs are developed and issued by the incorporated "College of Arms" (also known as "Heralds College") located in London, issuance being by (a) mandate of the King, usually done as a "reward" in recognition of some intrepid or meritorious service, and (b) upon the request of a family, after being fully investigated as to eligibility and merit, in which case it is known as a "grant", if issued. This College operates under Crown supervision.

Of greater antiquity than the Coat-of-Arms, was a symbol they called the Badge, which was used for the same purpose.

To the branch of the family of HARDING, that descended to JAMES HARDING Sr., et. al., was awarded the Crest, Coat-of-Arms and Motto (shown on page 18 hereof) on July 3, 1711, or 144 years after the origin of our branch of the family.

To determine the correctness of the actual issue in our case, of the Bearings shown on page 18 hereof, there was conducted an exhaustive research of historical records, finding no evidence of any bearings being issued to the branch of any family prior to its existence, the origin of our branch of the HARDING family was in 1567 A.D., therefor it was obvious that the Bearings shown on page 18 hereof are the ones actually awarded to our branch of the family, by official sanction and action.

The reliable Heraldic analysis of our Crest and Coat-of-Arms is as follows, it having been made authoritatively in London:-

- CREST----- (a) The escallop shell attached to the hat, suggests extraordinary pilgrimage, in fact it is the pilgrims' emblem during his expeditions to Holy places, it was such a distinguished ensign, that Pope Alexander IV allowed none to wear it but the truly noble.
- (b) The two small crosses at the top of the hat, represents religious faith.

COAT-OF-ARMS:--(a) The dots within the triangular lines,denotes generosity and elevation of mind.

(b) The white space in triangular form,between the lines, signifies Peace and Sincerety.

(c) The perpendicular lines,denote military fortitude and magnanimity.

(d) The three objects within the triangle,also on the escallop shell,having closely crossed limes,denote constancy.

(e) The Chevron formed by the triangular lines,signifies protection,it being granted upon occasion,as a reward to one who has achieved some notable enterprise,such as the building of churches or forts,or to one who has completed a faithful service.

MOTTO:----- (a) The latin motto assigned with these Bearings is greatly significant,it reads "AUDAX OMNIA PERPETI",the English translation of which is "BRAVE TO ENDURE ALL FOREVER".

COLORS:----- If and when a reproduction in color might be desired of our Coat-of-Arms,only the following colors should be used they having been officially assigned the Coat-of-Arms when awarded:-

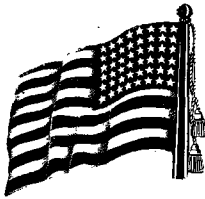
(1) YELLOW OR GOLD,for the dots described in note (a) above.

(4) BLACK,on the closely crossed lines described in note (d).

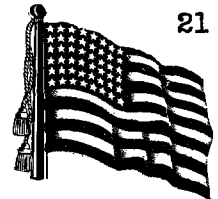

cumstances and hardships, was truly a demonstration of the ruggedness of
