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PREFACE

Y father, Horace E. Horton, during the last ten years of his life was interested in tracing the ancestry of himself and my mother, Emma Babcock Horton. 



HORTON ANCESTRY

1. BARNABAS¹ HORTON, born at Mousely, Lancashire, Eng., July 13, 1600. In 1635 with his wife Mary and two children immigrated to America in the ship Swallow, Capt. Jeremiah Horton, master and owner. Landed at Hampton, Mass. Moved to New Haven in 1640. On the 21st day of October, 1640, he, together with twelve others, Rev. John Youngs, William Wells, Peter Hallock, John Tuthill, Richard Terry, Thomas Mapes, Mathias Corbin, Robert Ackerly, Jacob Corey, John Conklin, Isaac Arnold and John Budd, organized a Congregational Church and sailed to Long Island where is now Southold. All had families with them except Peter Hallock.

Barnabas Horton was several times a member of the General Court of New Haven and Hartford. He built the first frame house ever erected on East Long Island, and said house was standing and occupied until 1880. His children were all born in Southold with the exception of Joseph and Benjamin, who were born in England.

Four years, 1837–1841, at Byron, Ill. 17 years, 1841–1858, in his native town in Herkimer Co., N. Y., and for 42 years 1858–1900, he resided at Rochester, Minn. Am a civil engineer by profession and president of the Chicago Bridge & Iron Company, past president of the Western Society of Engineers, member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, member of Union League and Technical Clubs of Chicago, also a member of the 'Sons of the American Revolution.'

Believe I am respectable in character, but am short in politics and religion.

JOHN² HURD, son of Adam and Hannah (Bertram) Hurd, married Mrs. Johanna Judson, Widow, Dec. 10, 1662, and removed from Stratford to Woodbury, having secured a grant from the Indians of a large tract of land lying along the Shepaug. This first settlement of Woodbury did not long remain in peace. The Indians became unfriendly and there were long weary months of devastations, conflagrations and massacres until the death of King Philip, when they were enabled to settle down and turn their attention toward improvements.

They grew corn but had to grind it by means of a pestle and mortar which required much time. John Hurd then became the builder and owner of the first mill to grind corn in the State of Connecticut. The millstones, 24 inches in diameter and 6 inches thick he secured at Stratford, and carried them on horseback, through the forests to Woodbury. It ground a bushel and a half per day. In 1681, the population having increased, he replaced the old mill by a larger one of sufficient capacity to do all the grinding required by the townspeople. The original millstones have been preserved; one is at the foot of a monument in the center of the town of Woodbury, and the other has found a place in the Capitol at Hartford.

John Hurd owned considerable land. In an agreement in settling his estate after his death his widow Ann and children signed the paper (Probate Rec. B., 1689-1701, p. 148).

There is a tradition in the family that during the Revolution the quick wit of Sarah (——) Reeves, mother of Sarah Reeves, saved not only her property but that of a merchant in the Long Island town near which she lived.

She, with her children and invalid husband, lived on the outskirts of the town. The merchant, knowing that a British raid was expected, concealed in Mrs. Reeves' cellar several cases of fine wine. Previous to this the firearms of the family had been concealed in a neighboring swamp—supported on crotched sticks to keep them from the ground.

When the soldiers entered Mrs. Reeves' home and began their search, nothing of value was discovered. The brick oven was full of new bread, which they took, leaving in its place some hardtack, with the remark: "This is good enough for the rebel's brats."

Not satisfied with their search, they asked her if she had any arms. Sarah Reeves then threw up first one arm and then the other, saying, "Oh, yes! This is one and here is the other." The officer, turning to his men, said, "Poor fool, she does not know what we mean."

The soldiers decided it would be a useless waste of time to search the cellar and so the wine was saved, the British taking only the bread. After the close of the war the merchant rewarded her by presenting each child with a bottle of wine. One of these bottles is still in the possession of one of her descendants, Mrs. J. B. Root, great-grand-daughter.

BABCOCK ANCESTRY

1. JAMES¹ BABCOCK, born 1612 in England, probably in Essex County; died at Portsmouth, R. I., June 12, 1679; married Sarah ——, who died 1665.

His residence for the first twenty years was in Portsmouth, R. I. He moved to Westerly, R. I., in March, 1662. A tract of land twenty miles by ten miles, known as Misquamicut, afterwards Westerly, was purchased from the Indian Chief Sosoa, June 29th, 1661-62, by a Company numbering sixty or more, headed by William Vaughan, and it was in the following March that they made their first permanent settlement in Westerly.

The records of Westerly show that James Babcock was a man of sterling integrity and of strong convictions. He was honored and trusted as a citizen and ready to serve the community in whatever capacity he was appointed.

John settled in Westerly on the banks of the Pawcatuck River, and his eldest son, James, inherited the homestead. Some of this homestead land has never passed from the ownership of the descendants of John. When he died, the inventory of his personal property amounted to £790, 3s, the largest amount recorded in the town of Westerly for many years.

ary War. His name appears on a muster roll of the company covering the period from June 28th, to Oct. 3, 1775, and bearing the latter date at Camp at Ticonderoga, which shows that he enlisted July 13 (year not stated). Nothing additional has been found of record relative to this soldier.

The records also show that David Babcock served as a private in Captain Caleb Bentley's Company. Colonel Cornelius Humphrey's (4th) Regiment, New York Militia, Revolutionary War. His name first appears on a muster roll dated at Ft. Constitution, Sept. 3, 1776, and is borne on a pay-roll covering the period from Oct. 1 to Nov. 1, 1776. Horton, by Mrs. Rose Knickerbocker Bradford, 490 St. Nicholas Ave., New York City, August 1, 1904, we find a statement that the John Beardsley born Nov. 22, 1725, was the son of Samuel, son of Daniel, son of William and Mary who came in the ship Planter, 1635 or thereabouts.

KNICKERBOCKER FAMILY

I. HARMEN JANSE¹ KNICKERBOCKER, head of the family in America, was the son of Van Wye Harman Janse Van Berghen Knickerbocker and his wife Juliana Van Marnix, dau. of Rutger Van Marnix, Lord of Botselaer. The name "Knickerbocker" is variously spelled and is supposed to mean marble-baker and to have been assumed by Harmen Janse Van Berghen after his arrival in America. (Smith's Hist. of Rhinberts.)

Harmen Janse Knickerbocker was born in Friesland in 1648, entered the Dutch Navy at an early age and served during that period when Holland was so remarkable for its naval victories. He was severely wounded at the battle of Solebay off the coast of England, July 25, 1665, where the Dutch ships engaged the combined English and French Fleets. On his recovery, he resigned his commission and came to America, where he soon after married (before 1688), at Albany, Elizabeth Van de Bogaart, dau. of Myndert Hermanse Van de Bogaart, well known surgeon of the Dutch ship Endraaght, and subsequently commissary of Ft. Orange.

In 1690, Harman Janse Knickerbocker removed from Albany to Schaghticoke, and later to Pine Plains, Dutchess Co., N. Y.
