### SOURCES OF INFORMATION

The first four generations are rearranged from Jackson's History of Newton, with the addition of the family name of the wife of James<sup>3</sup>—Mary *Utter*—taken from an article in the New England Historical Register and Genealogical Record, July, 1917; the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth generations are from Milton Calvin Hyde's compilation of 1887, reprinted by Tuttle & Co., Rutland, Vt., in 1931, revised from records in the family Bible of William H. Hyde, which also is the source of the data for the eighth generation. Members of families now living furnishd the information of the ninth and tenth generations.

## AN ABRIDGED GENEALOGY

JONATHAN HYDE, Senior, was born in England in 1626, and in 1647 joined his brother, Dea. Samuel Hyde, in Cambridge Village, that part of the Cambridge Settlement that was later set off as the town of Newton. He had twenty-one children: fourteen by his first wife Mary, dau. of William French, and seven by his second wife Mary Radiat of Marlboro. He and his first wife were admitted to the Cambridge church in 1661. Mary (French) d. May 27, 1672; Mary (Radiat) d. Sept. 17, 1708; he d. Oct. 11, 1711.
